The Kick Off

- The No. 6-ranked West Virginia University women's soccer team plays host to No. 1 Penn State at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 2, at 7 p.m.
 - Preseason-ranked No. 1, the Mountaineers retained the position in the United Soccer Coaches NCAA Division I Women's National Poll for one week before dropping to No. 6 this week.
 - The Nittany Lions are the first No. 1-ranked team to visit Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium. WVU last faced a No. 1 squad in Morgantown in 2000, when the Mountaineers fell 2-1 to top-ranked Notre Dame on Sept. 22, at the Mountaineer Soccer Complex.
 - Dating back to 2005, WVU is 1-2 against No. 1-ranked teams. WVU's last match vs. a No. 1 opponent was in 2013, a 4-2 loss to North Carolina in Durham, North Carolina, on Sept. 8.
 - Dating back to Sept. 16, 2016, the WVU defense has posted a shutout in 40 of 46 halves played in regulation, allowing only seven goals in that span.
 - Senior forward All-American Michaela Abam ranks No. 6 in WVU history with 33 career goals and No. 9 with 79 career points.
 - More than 3,500 fans came out to Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium for the Mountaineers' home season-opening weekend Aug. 24-27. There were 2,421 fans in attendance for the home opener against No. 10 Virginia on Aug. 24.
- The mark is the third-best in program history and the top regular-season attendance total.

Did You Know?

More than 60 percent of junior forward Hannah Abraham's career goals have been game-winners (6-of-9 goals). Dating back to the 2016 season, each of her last five goals have been GWGs.

West Virginia vs. Penn State

- WVU is 6-7-2 all-time against the Nittany Lions.
 - The teams have played in four overtime matches, including the last meeting, a 1-1 (2OT) draw in University Park, Pennsylvania, on Aug. 19, 2016. Laura Freigang put the Nittany Lions on the board in the 51st minute, and Michaela Abam earned the equalizer in the 77th minute. Making her first career start, Rylee Foster finished with a career-best nine saves.
- WVU is 0-2-2 in extra time against PSU.

The Last Meeting in Morgantown

- No. 11 WVU earned a 1-0 win over No. 5 Penn State on Sept. 4, 2015, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.
- In a match delayed multiple times due to weather, midfielder Amanda Hill tallied the game-winner in the eighth minute. WVU finished with a 14-8 edge in shots, a 6-2 advantage in shots on-goal and a 5-4 edge in corner kicks.

A Look at the Nittany Lions

- After Arkansas netted the first goal 90 seconds into the contest, PSU came back to earn a 4-2 win at Razorback Field on Aug. 25. Junior midfielder Marissa Sheva tallied two goals, including the game-winner in the 55th minute. Junior Rose Chandler made two saves. Both teams finished with 11 shots, five each on-goal.
- PSU has scored at least three goals in each match this season, with seven coming in the second half.
- The 2015 NCAA National Champion, PSU opened its 2017 slate with a 3-1 win over BYU on Aug. 18.

Mountaineers Hit No. 1 in 2016
The Mountaineers earned the No. 1 ranking in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) NCAA Division I Poll on Oct. 11, 2016. It was the team's first-ever No. 1 ranking in the national poll.

The Mountaineers were the first Big 12 Conference program to earn the No. 1 ranking in the NSCAA Poll.

WVU sat atop the three major polls for the first time in program history on Oct. 11, 2016. On Oct. 18, the Mountaineers ranked No. 1 in all three major polls, as well as the NCAA RPI, for the first time in program history.

The Mountaineers are 13-2-1 when ranked No. 1 in the NSCAA/United Soccer Coaches Poll.

Picked to Win Again

The Mountaineers were unanimously picked No. 1 by the league coaches in the 2017 Big 12 Conference Soccer Preseason Poll. It marks the third time in four seasons WVU was the unanimous No. 1 pick and the fifth straight year the Big 12 coaches tabbed the Mountaineers as No. 1; the team was not chosen in 2012, its first season in the league. WVU is the only team in conference history to earn multiple unanimous selections.

The Best of the Big 12

A conference-record six Mountaineers were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Soccer Team: unanimous selection Michaela Abam, repeat honoree Carla Portillo, Amandine Pierre-Louis, Sh'Nia Gordon, Bianca St. Georges and Rylee Foster.

Home Points

Big 12 or Big East, one fact has remained constant for the Mountaineers since 2009 - they do not lose home conference matches. WVU shows a 34-match unbeaten streak in conference games at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium and has not dropped a league contest since losing 3-2 in overtime to No. 8 Notre Dame on Oct. 2, 2009. The streak ranks third nationally. WVU is 19-0-1 all-time in home Big 12 matches.

We Are the Champions! (x5)

With its 3-0 win at TCU on Oct. 21, 2016, the Mountaineers earned the Big 12 Conference regular-season title, their fifth straight crown. WVU has won the title each season since joining the Big 12 in 2012, and the team is the first program in Big 12 history to win five straight outright championships. Also the 2016 Big 12 preseason favorite, WVU's accomplishment marked the 10th time in Big 12 history the preseason favorite in the coaches poll also won the title. WVU owns a 35-1-3 all-time record in Big 12 play and is unbeaten at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

The Mountaineers swept the conference's titles three weeks later, as WVU claimed its third Big 12 Soccer Championship crown in four seasons with a come-from-behind, 3-2 overtime win against TCU on Nov. 6, 2016, at Swope Soccer Village, in Kansas City, Missouri. The program has claimed six conference championship titles since winning its first in the Big East Conference in 2007.

Dating back to its days in the Big East Conference, WVU has won six straight conference regular-season crowns and 10 since its first title in 2002. WVU has won 11 regular season and championship conference titles in seven seasons and 16 since 2002.

Last Time Out

The top-ranked Mountaineers bounced back from their first defeat of the 2017 season with a 3-0 win over Duquesne on Aug. 27, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium. WVU received scores from three different players in its first multi-goal match of the season, with junior Hannah Abraham netting the game-winner in the 10th minute. Senior Carla Portillo and junior Bianca St. Georges added insurance goals in the second half; the score was the first career tally for St. Georges.

The WVU defense held Duquesne to three shots, all in the first half, and Rylee Foster made one save for her second clean sheet of the season. WVU finished with a 27-3 edge in shots and a 6-0 advantage in corner kicks.

Challenges Await

The Mountaineers will face one of the most difficult schedules in the program's 22-year history this fall, as nine of the team's opponents qualified for the 2016 NCAA Tournament. Included in the schedule are matches against top-25 opponents in each of the first four weeks.

Through three matches, WVU is 1-1 against teams who qualified for the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

Big-Time Offensive Threats Return

Paced by three-time reigning leading team scorer Michaela Abam, the Mountaineer offense returned an incredible 85 percent of the 52 goals scored in 2016.

Abam led WVU last year with a career-best 12 scores. A member of the 2016 NSCAA All-America Second Team and the co-Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, she finished the season with a team-best and career single-season high 33 points (12 G, 9 A). Her assist total, also a career single-season best, ranked No. 2 on the team. Abam ranked tops in the Big 12 Conference in points, goals and game-winners (5) and No. 2 in assists. She also ranked No. 24 nationally in points and No. 25 in game-winning goals.

Senior midfielder Carla Portillo, a 2016 NSCAA All-Central Region Second Team and All-Big 12 First Team honoree, and junior forward Sh'Nia Gordon also returned this year. The duo ranked No. 3 on the team last season with 17 points each. The mark was a career single-season best for both. Gordon finished second on the team with seven goals, while Portillo chipped in five. Senior forward Heather Kaleiohi and junior forward Hannah Abraham also finished with double-digit point totals in 2016. Kaleiohi tallied 14 points (6 G, 2 A), while Abraham finished with 10 (4 G, 2 A). All four of Abraham's scores were game-winners.

Awesome Abam Starts Hot

Senior forward Michaela Abam scored the first goal of the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer season, connecting on a cross from junior Sh'Nia Gordon 10:26 in the team's season-opening match at No. 5 Georgetown on Aug. 18. Abam's goal would stand, giving WVU a 1-0 victory over the Hoyas.

Abam ranks No. 6 all-time in program history with 33 career goals and needs 20 to match the school record. She also ranks No. 9 all-time with 79 career points and needs 46 to match the WVU record.

Hermann Hopeful

Senior forward Michaela Abam was named to the 2017 Missouri Athletic Club (MAC) Hermann Trophy Watch List. At least one Mountaineer has been named to the initial watch list in each of the last seven years, including 2016 Hermann Trophy winner Kadeisha Buchanan. WVU has had eight semifinalists, including Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence in 2015 and 2016. Buchanan was the first-ever Mountaineer to claim the award.

Backline Tough to Break

For the second straight season, the WVU defense rewrote the record book, recording a nation-best 18 shutouts in 2016. Included in the total were eight clean sheets in Big 12 Conference regular-season play, and the Mountaineers became the first team in league history to post a shutout season.

Returning for the back line this season are senior defender Amandine Pierre-Louis, junior defenders Easter Mayi Kith and Bianca St. Georges and sophomore goalkeeper Rylee Foster. A 2016 NSCAA All-Central Region Second Team honoree, as well as an All-Big 12 Second Team and Freshman Team member, Foster was available for 17 matches last season and was credited with eight of the team's shutouts. She finished with a 0.42 goals-against average (GAA), the best single-season total in program history. Her GAA ranked No. 1 in the conference and No. 7 nationally.

Foster Key to First Win

Sophomore goalkeeper Rylee Foster stood tall in the Mountaineers' 1-0 season-opening win at No. 5 Georgetown on Aug. 18, stopping seven shots, her second-best single-game showing, and defending nine corner kicks. For her efforts, she was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week and landed on the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week.

Through three matches, Foster shows two shutouts, 10 for her career, and a 0.63 GAA.

Taking Names

With its 1-0 win at No. 5 Georgetown in its 2017 season opener on Aug. 18, WVU has defeated at least one top-10 team in each of the last 13 seasons. WVU is 1-2 against top-ranked teams, 18-13-3 against top-10 teams and 29-29-10 against all ranked opponents since 2005.

Junior forward Hannah Abraham tallied her first game-winning goal of the season with a score in the 10th minute in WVU's 3-0 victory over Duquesne on Aug. 27. The tally was her ninth career score and her sixth career GWG. All four of Abraham's goals in 2016 were game-winners.

Double the Fun

Since 2010, WVU has had 24 instances where one Mountaineer has netted at least two goals in one game, including seven two-goal performances in 2014, the program's best single-season total in that time frame. The WVU single-game goal record is four, hit by senior forward Michaela Abam in the Mountaineers' record-setting 8-0 win vs. Villanova on Sept. 6, 2015.

Quick Feet

Senior Heather Kaleiohi has scored the two fastest goals in WVU program history. She set the record at Richmond on Sept. 23, 2016, finding the back of the net just 47 seconds into the match. She then scored the team's fastest goal in an NCAA Tournament match when she put a shot behind the Northern Kentucky goalkeeper at the 0:49 mark on Nov. 12, 2016, in Morgantown.

The Mountaineers have developed a true home field advantage, going 120-19-14 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium since its opening in August 2004.

WVU shows a 34-match unbeaten streak in conference games in Morgantown and has not dropped a league contest since losing 3-2 in overtime to No. 8 Notre Dame on Oct. 2, 2009. The streak ranks No. 3 nationally. WVU is 19-0-1 all-time in home Big 12 matches.

The Mountaineers opened their 2017 home season in front of 2,421 on Aug. 24. The crowd was the third-largest women's attendance mark in stadium history and the best regular-season total. WVU set seven top-10 attendance marks in 2016 and finished the year ranked No. 4 nationally in accumulate attendance (23,131) and No. 7 in average attendance (1,652).

Seniors' Last Stand

WVU's 2017 regular-season schedule features just one first-time opponent in Kansas State. The Mountaineers will face the Wildcats in Manhattan, Kansas, on Friday, Sept. 29. This is KSU's first season competing in the Big 12 Conference. In the program's 21-year history, WVU has faced 109 different teams.
