Lamar Stevens has five-straight 20-plus point games in 2018-19 with six consecutive overall dating back to the 2018 NIT championship game. The last Nittany Lion with a longer streak was Joe Crispin with eight straight (Dec. 2000-Jan. 2001).

The Nittany Lions will don new Nike uniforms in the original school colors of black and pink for Tuesday's game vs. Virginia Tech.

Stevens and Josh Reaves now rank No. 30 (459) and No. 32 (411), respectively, on Penn State's career rebounds list. Mike Watkins is 25th (525).

The Penn State chapter of Coaches vs. Cancer announced it has eclipsed the \$3 million milestone for funds raised. One of the most successful chapters in the nation, CVC-Penn State was established in 1995 by then-Penn State head coach and State College, Pennsylvania, native Bruce Parkhill.

Freshmen guards Rasir Bolton and Myles Dread averaged 13.0 and 10.0 points per game, respectively, in the four Cancun Challenge tournament games.

LAST TIME - PSU FALLS IN CANCUN FINAL

The final shot for the Penn State men's basketball team just... wouldn't... quite... fall... in... and the Nittany Lions' rally fell short in the Cancun Challenge championship game as Bradley took the win, 59-56. Junior forward Lamar Stevens recorded his fifth-straight 20-plus point game of the season with 27 and set the Cancun Challenge scoring record with 99 points over the four tournament games.

"I was proud of the way we fought and competed and came back and cut it to a one or two possession game," said Penn State men's basketball coach Patrick Chambers. "We had some good looks. Sometimes the ball doesn't go your way and it doesn't go in, but yet, we were still in the game, we were still right there, we were still within striking distance. I can't say that we didn't play hard or compete, I thought we did. They made one more play than us."

The Nittany Lions took a one-point lead into halftime, 33-32, but struggled after the break, starting 1-10 from the field. Near the mid-point of the period, Bradley had built an 11-point lead.

Penn State cut into the deficit with Rasir Bolton connecting on the first of his two treys and four free throws by Stevens. Bolton's second 3-pointer would cut Bradley's lead to only two, 57-55 with 4:09 to play. Turnovers by the Braves gave the Nittany Lions a few more possessions, but they didn't convert to points for Penn State.

Bolton had eight of his 10 points in the second period as the only other Nittany Lion in double figures. Josh Reaves had a game-high nine rebounds while John Harrar and Jamari Wheeler each had seven boards as Penn State had 45 rebounds, 19 on the offensive side. For Wheeler, his seven rebounds matched a career-high total.

Both Stevens and Reaves were named to the Cancun Challenge All-Tournament team with Bradley's Darrell Brown, MVP Childs, Loudon Love of Wright State and Jahmal McMurray of SMU.

STEVENS NAMED TO ERVING WATCH LIST

Penn State junior Lamar Stevens was named to the watch list for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award as announced in October by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Stevens, from North Wales, Pa., is one of the 20 student-athletes selected for the watch list for the 2019 award.

Named after Class of 1993 Hall of Famer and 16-year professional basketball player Julius Erving, the annual honor in its fifth year recognizes the top small forwards in Division I men's college basketball. A national committee comprised of top college basketball personnel determined the watch list of 20 candidates.

Stevens was voted the Most Outstanding Player of the 2018 National Invitation Tournament as he helped lead Penn State to its second NIT title this past March. He scored a game-high 28 points in the championship game and with that total, eclipsed the 1,000 career point mark, becoming only the second Penn State sophomore to achieve that milestone. An All-Big Ten Conference honorable mention, Stevens recorded double figures in 33 games in 2017-18 and with 10 games of 20 points or more, including two 30-point games.

BACK IN BLACK (& PINK)

Penn State will be wearing new Nike black and pink uniforms Tuesday vs. Virginia Tech, paying homage to the University's original school colors.

In October of 1887, a three-member committee representing the sophomore, junior and senior classes was appointed to develop color options from which the student body would select the school's official colors. Dark pink and black was the unanimous choice of the student body after considering other combinations presented.

Soon many students and the baseball team were sporting pink and black striped blazers and caps. However, problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new color choices was made on March 18, 1890.

THE "NEXT" OPENER

Each Big Ten team will play two early league games in December for the second consecutive year. Penn State defeated Iowa for its first conference-opening win on the road since 2010-11 (69-60 W at Indiana, 12/27/2010) and first win in Iowa City since 2001.

Penn State opens its Big Ten Conference season at Maryland on Saturday, Dec. 1.

Since 2011-12, Penn State has had 62 games with nine or more 3-point field goals. Three of the top four totals in the Chambers' era occurred in 2017-18: Coppin State (14), Northwestern (BTT-13, Penn State BTT record) and at Iowa (12).

REAVES' PASSING ATTACK

Senior guard Josh Reaves has proved himself to be quite the passer -- recording a career-best eight assists at DePaul -- to move him into the leader spot for the Nittany Lions so far this season with 17 total (3.4 app).

With 233 career assists, he moves into Penn State's top 20 in that category. Reaves had 107 assists in 2017-18, second to Tony Carr's 186.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

In preseason previews of the 2018-19 Big Ten Conference field and individual honors, senior guard Josh Reaves rises to the top as the pick for the league's top defensive player. Athlon Sports' superlatives tab Reaves and Lindy's also picks the league's two-time steals leader as its top defender.

REAVES, PRINCE OF THIEVES

Senior Josh Reaves currently sits 13th individually in the NCAA rankings for steals per game (13th-3.33) and 18th for total steals (10).

In addition to moving up on Penn State's career chart, Reaves snatched a spot on the single-season list with his 73 total (t-8th) in 2017-18.

Reaves had 60 steals in 2016-17, a total, which, at the time, was just on the outside of Penn State's single-season chart at 11th, quite an accomplishment since Reaves missed six games to start the season.

COUNTING 500 & MORE

Mike Watkins became only the second sophomore in Penn State basketball history to achieve 500 career rebounds, and in the Purdue game (2/18/18), tied Nittany Lion great Jesse Arnelle with 525 rebounds.

Arnelle, who played both football and basketball for Penn State, still holds the PSU career record for rebounds with 1,238.

Six newcomers join the Nittany Lions for the 2018-19 season with four freshmen: guards Rasir Bolton, Myles Dread, Myreon Jones and Daniil Kasatkin and two transfers in guards Izaiah Brockington (St. Bonaventure) and Kyle McCloskey (Villanova-FB). McCloskey will have four years to play basketball and Brockington will have three years of eligibility remaining.

NEW PLACES

Penn State guard and alumnus Tim Frazier (2009-14) recently signed a contract to join the NBA's New Orleans Pelicans. Shep Garner (2014-18) inked a deal with the Grand Rapids Drive of the G League during the fall while Donovan Jack (2012-16) signed with KD Hopsi Polzela in Slovenia. In June 2018, D.J. Newbill (2012-15) agreed to a new contract to play for NBL's Cairns Taipans.

Tony Carr, drafted by the New Orleans Pelicans in June 2018, is currently playing for Fiat Torino in the Italian Lega Basket Serie A. Brandon Taylor tipped off the 2018-19 season in October with his new team, Salon Vilpas, in Finland's Korisliiga.

GOOD COMPANY

Penn State was one of only six NCAA Division I teams that had not lost a game by more than 12 points in 2017-18. Other teams in its company included Duke and Villanova.

POINTS RISING

Just one of the indicators of Penn State's increase in its offensive output was the setting of the program's record for points scored overall (2,833) and in the Big Ten (1,297) in 2017-18, with the Nittany Lions' breaking their own league scoring record from a year ago.

The 2017-18 points per game average of 74.6 was the highest since the 2000-01 season, highest under Chambers, and a 12.8-point difference from Chambers' first season in 2011-12.

When Stevens and Tony Carr recorded their 20-plus points in the game against Duquesne (11/13/16), it marked the first time since March 15, 1989 that two Penn State freshmen posted 20 or more points in the same game (Freddie Barnes-24 & Monroe Brown-32 vs. Murray State in the opening round of the NIT).

FIRST 20-WIN SEASON SINCE 2008-09

Coach Chambers and the Nittany Lions posted the first 20-win season since 2008-09 and Penn State's 10th season with 20 or more wins, fifth in its Big Ten era. The 26-win total is the second-highest all-time.

EARLIEST TO 21 WINS

When Penn State recorded its 21st win of the 2017-18 season, a thrilling 69-68 win over No. 13 Ohio State in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament on March 2, it marked the earliest, by date, that Penn State achieved 21 wins.

NATIONAL NOTICE

Penn State earned 19 votes in the final USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll, fifth among the other teams receiving votes. It was the first time since the 2008-09 season the Nittany Lions had been recognized. In the February 19 Associated Press poll, Penn State received six votes, the first time the program had received votes since December 29, 2014, and the most votes received since a total of 14 on January 31, 2011.

POWER RANKINGS

At the end of the 2017-18 season, Penn State had climbed to its highest rankings of the season in kenpom.com (19), the ESPN Basketball Power Index (20) and Sagarin (27).

RECORDS BROKEN

More than 50 Penn State records fell during the 2017-18 season with 31 individual and 21 team records being replaced. One Big Ten record, the individual single-season mark for 3-point field goals, a 23-year-old record, was broken by senior guard Shep Garner (120).

AH-MAZING MARCH

March was amazing for the Nittany Lions as they won seven games during the month, tied for the most by a Penn State team. The 2017-18 squad also posted the highest-ever win percentage in conference and postseason games in March 2018, at 87.5 percent (7-1 record).

THE WINS

Penn State has achieved 15 or more wins in five straight years – a first for the Nittany Lion program. Prior to the 2013-17* seasons under Chambers, the Nittany Lions had not previously reached at least 15 wins in four consecutive seasons since joining the Big Ten.

The Lions also have at least eight regular-season, nonconference wins in each of Chambers' seven seasons with 10 in 2017-18.

TOP HALF

Penn State finished in a tie for sixth in the 2017-18 Big Ten standings, earning the No. 7 seed in the 2018 Big Ten Tournament. The sixth-place finish is only the third time in history the Nittany Lions finished in the top half of the standings and sixth time finishing above .500 at 9-9.

BIG STATEMENT

The Nittany Lions won games in consecutive years in the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since the 2000 and 2001 tournaments. In its last four Big Ten Tournament appearances, Penn State posted five wins, most in any four-year span since the tournament began in 1998.

HEAD COACH PATRICK CHAMBERS



“DETERMINED.”

The new sign in the reception area of the Penn State men's basketball office in the Bryce Jordan Center is impossible to overlook. The word defines both the Nittany Lion program and Patrick Chambers, the coach who is determined to lead the program to its next level of success.

Chambers is determined to establish the Penn State program with a culture of teamwork and excellence, built on pillars of accountability, faith, humility, gratitude and passion. He's determined to set and achieve high expectations for Nittany Lion basketball. He's determined to challenge his student-athletes to get better each and every day and develop young men into leaders with the goal of competing for championships.

In 2017-18, Chambers had the Penn State basketball program poised to take the next step in its pursuit of consistent, sustainable success.

By the end of December, the Nittany Lions reached double-digits in wins and in January, the Nittany Lions stepped into the spotlight, defeating No. 13 Ohio State at Value City Arena, one of only two teams in the nation to accomplish that feat in 2017-18.

By the end of February 2018, the Nittany Lions racked up nine Big Ten Conference wins, the most, to date, in the Chambers era. A week later, Penn State picked up its 20th and 21st wins, the latter coming at the earliest point ever for the Nittany Lions.

Playing their best basketball in March, Chambers' squad registered seven wins against only one loss and won the National Invitation Tournament title. Penn State defeated teams from the Atlantic Coast, Atlantic 10, Big East, Pac-12 and Southeastern conferences with an average scoring margin of 10.4 points per game in NIT contests.

Dozens of records were broken and the increase in offensive production saw Penn State score 70 points or more in 29 games, while the stalwart defense, a Chambers' hallmark, frustrated opponents. Fourteen teams in 2017-18 failed to score more than 60 points against the Nittany Lions.

Individual records were rewritten as well, as Shep Garner broke the 23-year-old Big Ten single-season record for 3-pointers with 120 and etched his name in the Penn State yearbook for both the single-season and career mark. Tony Carr became the first Penn State men's sophomore to reach the 1,000-point career mark with Lamar Stevens becoming the second to achieve that milestone.

A Philly native, Chambers was introduced as the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, and has poured his passion and energy into building the Nittany Lion program.

Signing the top two recruiting classes in program history in back-to-back years, the 2016 group was ranked in the top 25 and the 2015 class in the top 30. A trio of players with freshmen eligibility started the 2016-17 season opener and would combine for 90 starts, with 23 more from a sophomore, giving the young Nittany Lions a birth by fire, but positioning them for success.

The impressive performances of the rookies earned them several honors during the course of their initial campaigns with Carr selected to the Big Ten All-Freshman team. Carr would become the first Penn State basketball player to earn Big Ten All-Tournament honors as a sophomore in 2018.

With Carr selected as a first-team All-Big Ten Conference pick by both the coaches and media following the 2017-18 season, junior Josh Reaves and redshirt sophomore Mike Watkins produced another program first – two Nittany Lions on the All-Defensive Team.

Chambers has sent Carr, Garner, Frazier, Newbill and numerous other players into the professional ranks. Garner inked a deal with the Grand Rapids Drive in fall of

2018 while Carr is playing for Fiat Torino in Italy's premier league. Frazier (2009-14) recently joined the New Orleans Pelicans organization and Newbill (2013-15) signed a new contract to play for the National Basketball League's Cairns Taipans. Over the summer months, Donovan Jack (2012-16) signed with KD Hopsi Polzela in Slovenia

AT BOSTON UNIVERSITY

Chambers came to Penn State after two years at Boston University, where in 2010-11 he led the Terriers to the America East Conference Championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament berth in more than a decade. He posted a 42-28 record, becoming the only coach in BU history to earn 20 wins in each of his first two seasons and the fastest in program history to win a conference championship.

AT VILLANOVA

A native of Newtown Square, Pa., Chambers previously played for and coached with two of the nation's most successful college coaches. From 2004-09, he was a member of Wright's staff at Villanova, serving as associate head coach in 2008-09. He helped the Wildcats earn four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and advance to the 2009 NCAA Final Four. Chambers played for Magee at Philadelphia University (formerly Philadelphia Textile), helping Magee become college basketball's all-time victories leader (941) and a 2011 Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame inductee.

During Chambers' five seasons on Wright's Villanova staff, he was instrumental in helping lead the Wildcats to a 126-45 record (.737), including the then-single-season win record of 30-8 in 2008-09. In 2008, Chambers helped lead the Wildcats to the 2009 NCAA Final Four, a first in 24 years, and saw Villanova advance to the Sweet 16 for the fourth time in its five NCAA Tournament appearances.

AT PHILADELPHIA

Chambers joined the NCAA Division II Philadelphia University's basketball team as a walk-on in 1990 and went on to have an outstanding career under Magee. He became the team's starting point guard, earning first-team All-ECAC honors, and helped lead the Rams to four NCAA Division II Sweet 16 appearances and two Elite Eight appearances. He still holds the school record for career assists with 709.

THE CHAMBERS FAMILY

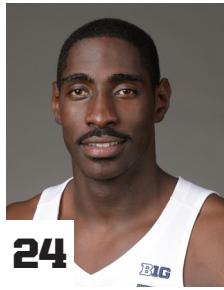
