Opening Statement

Tomic: I just told the team, I met quickly in the locker room with them, and I said not many teams who make their first trip to the NCAAs win their first match and I'm just so very proud of our group. This wasn't the prettiest volleyball we've seen all season long, but we willed ourselves to win it. There's something about us playing five-set matches. I was hoping this was not going to be the end of our streak in the NCAA, so it was nice to continue us winning five-set matches. I just want to say Yale was a tough team to beat. We knew we were going to have our hands full. They're a well-coached team, very smart team. We just feel very fortunate to come out with a win.

Q: What did you tell the team heading into the fifth set knowing you haven't lost a fifth set yet this season?

A: I just told them we need to play better. We've been here before, what nine times? Eight times? There's nothing new that I can tell them going into the fifth set. I think I've said everything this season going into that fifth set. We just said we need to play harder. We made too many errors, unforced errors, in the fourth set and we knew it was going to be the team that plays the hardest and the team that makes the least amount of unforced errors. It kind of didn't start like that, we made two serving errors I believe in the fifth set. Again it was those few points and it mattered that we won. I told them, "This is all on you. You know how to handle this situation, let's just go out there and play hard."

Q: What was it like getting this win?

A: At the beginning of the season we talked about leaving a legacy. That's something coming into this tournament knowing that no BGSU team has won a set. So we said let's win this match, your names, this team, BGSU Volleyball 2012 is going to always be in the record books as a team that won the first NCAA match and they did it so all the credit goes to them.

Q: What helped you pull away right at the last two points of the fifth set?

A: I also reminded them that they gave me a pinky promise yesterday. We treated them with ice cream, so I said, "You better keep the promise." In the fifth set I think that was part of my timeout talk, so that was a smart thing for me to do. Usually we treat them after we win. Yesterday was the first time we did it before the game so I said, "You better promise we will win."

Q: How were you able to overcome the 33 attack errors?

A: I think the difference here, I'm looking at the box score, was our blocking. There was a difference a little bit. We started blocking in the fifth set. In the fourth set they out blocked us, I believe. I'm actually surprised we had two more digs than them because it felt they were picking up every ball that we put over on their side. I told them in the fifth set defense was going to win this match because defensively we struggled. We made so many errors. This is a really untypical hitting percentage. We usual are in the .200s and to end with this hitting percentage it tells you that our defense had to be better.

Q: What do you think you will need to improve on going into the game tomorrow?

A: We'll have to play our best volleyball. This is a great opportunity. As an athlete you want to play against the best teams available and Penn State is the number one team in the nation. I think our team is competitive and we've watcedh them on video and we will watch them tonight here. I just want our team to go there and be fearless and play the best they can play and be the best team they can be and then whatever happens, happens. I don't think anybody expects us to win. I expect us to compete because I believe in sports anything is possible and any given day things can happen. I've seen many upsets and we are not coming tomorrow to say, "Here, Penn State take it." We are going to go out and fight and represent BGSU and our conference in the best possible way and we definitely have to be better offensively and defensively against Penn State, but we are not coming out there scared or anything like that. That is not us. That is not how we play.

Q: What was it like getting this win?

A: It feels good, I'm totally excited. This is the beginning so hopefully we can keep this streak up and take it as far as it can go. We all have heart and it's just a great experience to be here and just see how far it goes.

Q: What helped you pull away right at the last two points of the fifth set?

A: Just looking at each other, it gives us the energy. And also just defense, I mean keeping the ball up is going to give us an opportunity for a kill, so just being relentless all of the time is how we can to do that.

Q: What do you think you will need to improve on going into the game tomorrow?

A: Definitely serving. I think we made a lot of serving errors. Hopefully we can get that back on track and not have as many. And also serve-receive, it's such a big part of our game and it doesn't matter, it doesn't have to be a perfect pass, but just having the availability that we can have our pin hitters and middles involved. I think that was a big part tonight when we were winning. Our middles were involved and serve receive was a big key.

Opening Statement

Appleman: I thought my team played really hard. It was nice to see them go out and play the last couple sets really fighting hard and doing the things we've been working on all year.

Q: How tough is it being 10-10 in the fifth set and losing it?

A: It's pretty frustrating. It's the first time we've gone five games all year and I don't think we were really thinking about that. At the same it happened so much faster than we're used to. We're pretty comfortable in coming-frombehind and gaining a win, but in a fifth set you just don't have that time to do that. I think that was kind of a tough thing here.

Q: You've never been in a fifth set this season, and coming into today Bowling Green was 8-0 in the fifth set. Do you wish you had that kind of preparation for the team?

A: Well, I'm happy that we didn't have to go five sets all year. That was nice. I mean, it is a good lesson to be competitive early on and have those matches. But, it was also really nice not being able to have to have that fifth set all season.

Opening Statement

Rose: I thought it was a match that kind of got away from Binghamton. Micha's (Hancock) serve in the second game it just kind of tailed off at that point and time. She was in a good rhythm and they were struggling with that. I don't think you take a lot out of a match like that. It was nice that I thought we controlled the ball well and it was a big crowd. We are appreciative of the fans that came and we're always appreciative of Penn State putting in a bid to get an opportunity to host. I know Binghamton is better than how they played. It was just one of those matches that I think kind of got away from them a little bit.

Q: With a match as one-sided as that is it hard to keep the team focused?

A: Well I thought the crowd did a nice job keeping everybody focused, but it's the NCAAs. Some of the players have won six matches in a row and some of them lost the last NCAA match they played. They know the importance of being ready to play. I didn't have to say anything to them about that. I think they know what you're dealing with. We'll have another match tomorrow and it'll be a far different opponent that I thought competed very highly. I thought both Yale and Bowling Green competed very hard tonight. That's what the NCAA tournament is about. Sometimes you might be overmatched, but you can make up for it with heart and playing hard. That's what we'll have to do as well.

Q: On the Division I level have you ever seen a 21-0 score before?

A: Yeah, I mean you don't like to be a part of it whether you're doing it or you're receiving it. You don't want to be a part of it because it's not good for the winning team either. Obviously, it's disappointing for the other team. It's the NCAAs – they earned their right to be here and we played them two other times. Again, this was just a situation that kind of got away.

Q: Is there such a thing as playing a perfect set in volleyball?

A: A perfect set as in the team didn't make any errors? Yeah, I had a team that used to do that a couple years ago. They didn't make very many errors in matches. But these guys didn't make very many errors tonight. They had eight errors tonight. Eight errors isn't very bad in three games. USC had nine last night in their win.

Q: After cruising through tonight, is there anything different that you guys have to do to refocus yourselves for tomorrow? Or do you try to carry this into it?

A: You have to be ready to play. The other team played a five game match and they're excited to be here. They played well in a tough situation. Opening Statement
