Prior to Sunday's match, the Nittany Lions will honor three senior members of the Penn State women's soccer program. The Nittany Lions will honor, Nickolette Driesse, Angela Widlacki and Erika Wollman.

The B1G Student reward program continues this weekend. Penn State students should bring their punch card to the marketing table during halftime of both games.

LOOKING AT RUTGERS

Following a 2-2 double overtime draw at Indiana on Oct. 9, the Rutgers Scarlet Knights have tallied an overall record of 9-2-3 and a record of 4-1-2 in Big Ten play. Rutgers is currently fifth in the Big Ten regular season standings with 14 points.

As a team, Rutgers leads the conference with 259 shot attempts, is tied for second in goals (28) and assists (25) and ranks second in points with 81.

Individually, Madison Tiernan leads the conference in shot attempts with 69, while Nicole Whitley leads the league in assists with nine.

Tiernan and Whitley lead the Scarlet Knight offense in 2016 with 19 and 15 points, respectively. Junior Colby Ciarrocca has also tallied 13 points on the year for the Scarlet Knights.

With 2015 NSCAA Second Team All-American goalkeeper Casey Murphy pursuing a spot with U.S. U-20 Women's National Team this fall, redshirt senior Alana Jimenez has taken over in goal for the Scarlet Knights. On the year, Jimenez has started all 14 matches, played 1333:35 minutes, allowed 11 goals, tallied a goals against average of .74, made 42 saves, posted a save percentage of .792 and recorded six solo shutouts.

THE 2015 RUTGERS TRILOGY

The 2015 women's soccer season featured the Penn State Nittany Lions and Rutgers Scarlet Knights playing each other three times at three different locations within a two month span.

The Scarlet Knights picked up their thirdstraight 1-0 win over the Nittany Lions in Piscataway, N.J., on Oct. 18, 2015. Following the 1-0 loss to Rutgers on Oct. 18 the Nittany Lions won the next 11 matches, including two over Rutgers, to secure their first NCAA title in program history.

The Nittany Lions and Scarlet Knights met for the second time in 2015 on Nov. 8, this time in Happy Valley. The two programs met in the Big Ten Women's Soccer Tournament Championship game. In the Big Ten Women's Soccer Tournament Title game, the Nittany Lions downed Rutgers, 2-0, to capture their sixth Big Ten Tournament title.

The 2015 Penn State-Rutgers trilogy came to a close on Dec. 4 in Cary, N.C., with a spot in the national title game on the line. Behind her 11th goal of the season, Frannie Crouse put the Nittany Lions up 1-0 in the 24th minute and then Kaleigh Riehl netted her first goal as a Nittany Lion in the 79th minute to secure Penn State's 2-0 win in the College Cup semifinal.

LOOKING AT PURDUE

Before heading Happy Valley, the Purdue Boilermakers host Maryland Thursday night. Heading into the weekend, Purdue has tallied a record of 3-10-0 overall and a record of 1-6-0 in Big Ten play.

Hannah Leinert and Andrea Petrina lead the Boilermaker offense with seven points and six points, respectively. Leinert has netted two goals and three assists on the year, while Petrina has netted two goals and two assists.

In net for Purdue, a pair of goalkeepers have split time during the 2016 season. Jordan Ginther has started eight games, played 685:05 minutes, allowed 18 goals, tallied a goals against average of 2.36, made 42 saves and recorded a save percentage of .700. In 2016, Erika Yohn has started five games, played 501:22 minutes, allowed 10 goals, posted a goals against average of 1.80, made 30 saves, tallied a save percentage of .750 and recorded one shutout.

WEEKEND REWIND

The Nittany Lions are coming off a 1-0-1 weekend at Indiana and Maryland. Penn State and Indiana battled to a double overtime 1-1 draw Thursday night at Bill Armstrong Stadium before the Nittany Lions topped Maryland, 3-0, Sunday afternoon at Ludwig Field.

In the 1-1 draw at Indiana, Frannie Crouse scored her team-leading ninth goal of the season in the eighth minute of play. With her goal Thursday night, Crouse moves into a tie for 14th all-time in goals scored with 30.

In Penn State's 3-0 victory at Maryland, Penn State scored all three goals via corner kicks. On Sunday, defender Brittany Basinger recorded a career-best two goals to pace the Nittany Lion offense. In the closing minutes of

the match, defender Elizabeth Ball tallied her second goal of the season in the 84th minute.

B1G STANDINGS AND RANKINGS

With four games remaining in the 2016 Big Ten regular season, the Nittany Lions currently lead the league with 17 points (5-0-2). Northwestern and Minnesota are tied for second in the conference standings with 16 points, Michigan ranks fourth with 15 points and Rutgers is fifth with 14 points.

Heading into the weekend against Rutgers and Purdue, Crouse is tied for second in the Big Ten with nine goals, is tied for fifth in points with 19 and she is also tied for the Big Ten lead in game-winning goals with four. Also among the Big Ten leaders, Nickolette Driesse is tied for third in assists with six.

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

Heading into the weekend, the Nittany Lions have posted a record of 8-1-2 over the past 11 games. Over that span, the Nittany Lion defense has allowed one goal or less in each game, which includes six shutouts.

THE 2016 PSU BIG TEN SLATE

Penn State opens the 2016 Big Ten regular season at No. 10 Minnesota (Sept. 16) and the 2015 Big Ten regular season co-champion Wisconsin Badgers (Sept. 18). Following the trip to Minnesota and Wisconsin, Penn State returns home to host Iowa (Sept. 23), Nebraska (Sept. 25) and Illinois (Sept. 30).

Penn State then travels to Indiana (Oct. 6) and Maryland (Oct. 9) before returning home to Happy Valley to host Rutgers on BTN (Oct. 13) and Purdue (Oct. 16).

The Blue and White close out the 2016 Big Ten regular season at Michigan State (Oct. 22) and host Ohio State (Oct. 26) for the regular season finale.

Due to a rotating schedule, Penn State does not play Northwestern or Michigan during the regular season in 2016.

FOR CLUB AND COUNTRY

The 2016 Penn State women's soccer team will be without the services of five Nittany Lions as they pursue a spot on the United States U-20 Women's National Team that will compete in the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup, Nov. 13-Dec. 3.

Maddie Elliston, Ellie Jean, Emily Ogle and Kaleigh Riehl will not be on the roster this fall, while Rose Chandler will continue to train with the Nittany Lions during the fall semester.

B1G HONORS

Four Nittany Lions have garnered weekly honors from the Big Ten during the 2016 regular season. Laura Freigang received Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors on Aug. 23, Frannie Crouse was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 13, Laura Suero garnered Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week honors on Sept. 20 and Amanda Dennis was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Sept. 27.

BIG TEN SUCCESS

Since joining the Big Ten conference in 1994, the Nittany Lions have amassed a record of 185-26-12 in Big Ten play, including a record of 100-6-4 at Jeffrey Field. Under Coach Dambach, the Nittany Lions have a tallied a Big Ten record of 85-14-5.

PACING THE PRIDE

In 2016, junior Frannie Crouse leads the team in points (19), goals (nine) and has recorded one assist. Crouse ranks second on the team in shots (37) and shots on goal (19).

Among the leaders in the NCAA, Crouse is tied for 16th in game-winning goals (four) and she is tied for 28th in goals scored with nine.

STANDOUT SOPHOMORE

On the year, sophomore Charlotte Williams has tallied nine points on three goals and three assists. During her freshman season in 2015, Williams netted 13 points on three goals and seven assists.

SHUTOUT SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED

Penn State closed out the 2015 season with eight-straight shutouts, which spanned 733:32 of play. During the season opener against No. 6 West Virginia, the Nittany Lions kept the Mountaineers off the board until the 76:59 mark. The WVU goal at 76:59 snapped Penn State's shutout scoreless streak of 810:31, which was the second-best span in program history (1032:33, 2004).

HOME SWEET HOME

The Penn State women's soccer team has a record of 61-5-5 at Jeffrey Field since the start of the 2011 season.

Over the past six seasons, Penn State has not lost twice at home in a single season.

All-time at Jeffrey Field the Penn State women's soccer team has an overall record of 221-25-11.

Penn State kicked off the 2016 campaign setting an attendance record against No. 6 WVU. A Penn State women's soccer record 5,791 fans made their way to Jeffrey Field to watch the Nittany Lions and Mountaineers play to a 1-1 draw. The previous mark of 5,117 was set in 2012 against the top-ranked Stanford Cardinal.

As of Oct. 10, the Nittany Lions rank seventh in the nation in average attendance with 1,648 fans per game.

Last season, the Nittany Lions finished sixth in overall attendance in the nation with 21,856 fans, which was a program-best. The 2015 season featured two of the top-10 home field crowds in program history.

Penn State opened the 2015 season with a crowd of 3,175 against Hofstra and 4,207 fans packed into Jeffrey Field to watch the Nittany Lions host Duke.

NITTANY LIONS WELCOME NINE

Head coach Erica Dambach welcomed nine freshmen to the Penn State women's soccer family for the class of 2020.

Amanda Dennis and Emma Hasco enrolled early to Penn State during the spring of 2016.

Becca Hamilton, Madison Moroi, Bristol Pizzuto, Laura Suero and Sarafina Valenti joined the Nittany Lions back on signing day in February.

Grace Fisk and Laura Freigang were the last to join the Penn State women's soccer family as they joined the program in August.

NITTANY LION CAPTAINS

Brittany Basinger, Nickolette Driesse and Megan Schafer will captain the Nittany Lions for the 2016 season.

MILESTONE VICTORIES

The 2016 season marks the 23rd year of varsity women's soccer for Penn State. The Nittany Lions captured their 400th program victory with a 3-1 win over the Hofstra Pride on Aug. 21. Overall, the Nittany Lions boast a record of 408-105-32.

Coach Dambach captured her 200th win on Sept. 9 in a 3-0 victory against San Diego State. During her time as a head coach at Dartmouth (2000-02), Harvard (2006) and Penn State (2007-Present), Coach Dambach has tallied a record of 206-80-16.

MIDSEASON HONORS

Seven Nittany Lions were named to TopDrawerSoccer's Top 100 Midseason Lists. Amanda Dennis, Grace Fisk and Laura Freigang were named to the TopDrawerSoccer Freshmen Top 100 List. Dennis checks in at 15, followed by Freigang at 35 and Fisk at 74.

TopDrawerSoccer also released its midseason top 100 list featuring upperclassmen. Frannie Crouse leads a quartet of Nittany Lions at 43, followed by Megan Schafer (49), Nickolette Driesse (58) and Brittany Basinger (74).

PICKED TO DEFEND THE B1G

According to the 2016 Big Ten preseason coaches' poll, the Penn State women's soccer team was selected to defend its 2015 Big Ten regular season championship. Since the preseason poll started in 2003, the Nittany Lions have been named the preseason favorites every time.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The 2016 Penn State women's soccer roster is comprised of nine freshmen, one redshirt freshman, five sophomores, one redshirt sophomore, six juniors, three redshirt juniors and one senior.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

Junior forward Megan Schafer was named to the 2016 MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List prior to the start of the 2016 campaign.

During her 2015 season, Schafer led the Nittany Lions in goals (13) and points (30). Six of her 13 goals during 2015 captured a victory for the Blue & White.

As a sophomore, she started 24 of 27 matches and netted at least one point in 11 of the final 17 matches on the year.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Heading into the weekend, Frannie Crouse ranks 19th all-time at PSU in points with 70 (30g, 10a), while Megan Schafer ranks 21st with 57 (23g, 11a). All-time in goals scored at PSU, Crouse is tied for 14th with 30 and Schafer is tied for 19th with 23.

The 2016 season marks the 10th season for Erica Dambach at the helm of the Penn State women's soccer program. As the head coach of the Nittany Lions, Coach Dambach has an overall record of 166-52-13 and 85-14-5 in Big Ten play.

NITTANY LIONS ON BTN

The Penn State women's soccer team will be featured three times during the regular season on the Big Ten Network.

The BTN regular season matches for the Nittany Lions will be West Virginia (Aug. 19 - 7:30 p.m. EDT), Minnesota (Sept. 16 - 8 p.m. EDT) and Rutgers (Oct. 13 - 7:30 p.m. EDT).

2012 & 2015 NSCAA NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR THREE-TIME BIG TEN COACH OF THE YEAR (2009, 2012, 2014)

Head coach Erica (Walsh) Dambach enters her 10th season at the helm of the Penn State women's soccer program in 2016.

Dambach and the Nittany Lions are coming off their best season in program history in 2015. During the fall of 2015, the Penn State women's soccer team recorded a 3.49 GPA in the classroom to go along with the program's first NCAA title and a pair of Big Ten titles.

In program history, the Nittany Lions have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of the past 21 seasons, won 17 of the last 18 Big Ten regular season titles and own six Big Ten Tournament titles.

Dambach's squad finished the 2015 season with a 22-3-2 record, its eighth 20-win season, by defeating No. 20 Duke 1-0 in the College Cup Final on Dec. 6, 2015, in Cary, N.C. The NCAA title was the first in program history and the first by a Big Ten women's soccer program.

The Nittany Lions outscored the opposition 20-0 during their 2015 NCAA Tournament run and the Nittany Lions did not allow a goal over the final 733:32 of the season.

Raquel Rodriguez capped off her historic Penn State career by scoring the lone goal in the NCAA title match in the 72nd minute. Rodriguez followed up her game-winner in the title match by claiming the second MAC Hermann Trophy in program history in January 2016 (Welsh - 2001).

To go along with the MAC Hermann Trophy, Rodriguez garnered NSCAA Scholar Player of the Year honors, the Honda Sport Award winner for women's soccer and was named a NSCAA First Team All-American.

Following the 2015 season, Dambach received NSCAA Coach of the Year honors for the second time in her Nittany Lion career (2012).

In January 2016, all three Nittany Lion captains were selected in the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) draft. Rodriguez was selected with the No. 2 pick by Sky Blue FC, Mallory Weber went to the Western New York Flash at No. 14 and Britt Eckerstrom was the first goalkeeper selected at No. 26 by the Western New York Flash.

In 2014, Dambach led the Blue and White to its 10th NCAA Tournament semifinal appearance and the seventh 20-win season in program history. Penn State, which had an 11-member freshman class, earned its third outright conference title in four years, maintaining a top-11 national ranking throughout the season and defeating five top-25 opponents.

Under Dambach's direction, who picked up her third Big Ten Coach of the Year award, Penn State collected three of four Player of the Year awards. Whitney Church, the conference's Defender of the Year, was named a M.A.C. Hermann Trophy semifinalist and an NSCAA All-America first team selection before she became the 30th overall pick in the NWSL draft by the Washington Spirit. Also earning individual Big Ten awards were Raquel Rodriguez, who bagged Midfielder of the Year honors and Emily Ogle, the Freshman of the Year.

The Nittany Lions appeared in their 19th-straight NCAA Tournament in 2013, due in part to the success of senior Maya Hayes. The sixth-overall selection in the WPSL draft, Hayes set Penn State's single season record for points (79) and finished her career ranked third in goals scored (71) and points (163), sixth in game-winning goals (17) and seventh in shots (291). Hayes also became the seventh M.A.C. Hermann Award Trophy semifinalist in program history.

Dambach's 2012 Nittany Lions were the most successful team in program history after advancing to their first-ever national title game. The Nittany Lions won 21 of 27 games and were unbeaten in Big Ten action with a 10-0-1 record. The Lions registered their 15th consecutive Big Ten title and 18th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. The 15-title mark stands as the most consecutive Big Ten Championships by a women's program, along with the present Northwestern tennis team.

Senior Christine Nairn became just the seventh Nittany Lion to finish as a finalist for the prestigious Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy in 2012 under Dambach's tutelage while junior Maya Hayes was named a semifinalist for the award

Dambach's success was recognized at the conference and national level as she earned Big Ten Coach of the Year and NSCAA National Coach of the Year honors

Her 2011 team was a dominant force, winning 21 of 26 matches, while outscoring opponents 70-24. The Nittany Lions were 10-1-0 in Big Ten action and posted the seventh undefeated season at Jeffrey Field (9-0). Dambach helped guide the Lions to their 14th-straight Big Ten title and a spot to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 2007.

With Dambach's guidance, sophomore Maya Hayes became the nation's most prolific scorer in soccer in 2011 and was a finalist for the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy. Hayes led the nation with 31 goals and 70 points, breaking the Penn State single-season record for points.

During the 2011 summer, Dambach had an extraordinary experience of being one of the top assistants to Pia Sundhage and the 2011 United State women's national team at the FIFA World Cup in Germany. The U.S. made a sparkling run through knockout play to the final, falling to eventual champion Japan.

During the 2010 season, Dambach's young club made a remarkable turnaround mid-season, overcoming a two-game deficit in the league standings over the final weeks to capture a share of its 13th straight Big Ten title.

After a tough 2-4 start to the 2009 season, Dambach led the Nittany Lions to a remarkable turnaround, going 10-1-2 in the last 13 games of the regular season, earning her the 2009 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award for her efforts.

With the impressive end to the season, Dambach and her charges captured the program's 12th-straight Big Ten Championship. By winning the Big Ten, the Nittany Lions continued their string of NCAA Tournament berths, making their 15th-straight appearance in the 64-team field in 2009. For the second time in three years, Penn State hosted the first and second rounds of tournament play.

Dambach also orchestrated one of the finest awards seasons in Penn State history when Katie Schoepfer, Alyssa Naeher and Christine Nairn swept the year-end Big Ten Player of the Year awards. Schoepfer was named the Offensive Player of the Year, Naeher the Defensive Player of the Year and Nairn the Freshman of the Year. Danielle Toney was named to the All-Big Ten first team, while Lexi Marton garnered second team mention. Dambach has now coached two players of the year to three awards as Naeher was also the 2007 recipient of the Defensive Player of the Year honors in Dambach's first year in Happy Valley.

Dambach continued her success from the 2007 campaign into a 16-8-0 record that saw Penn State capture its 11th-straight Big Ten Championship and the 2008 Big Ten Tournament crown.

Her transition to Penn State was quite smooth as the 2007 team finished 18-4-2, including a 9-1-0 mark in conference play, and was ranked 12th in the final NSCAA poll of the season.

When she came to Penn State, Dambach brought with her a wealth of experience at both the international and collegiate levels. She already has coached at six different universities, including three stints as head coach as well as serving as an assistant for the U.S. U-19 team in 2004. Dambach served as head coach of the U-17 team from December 2004 until her hire at Penn State in February 2007.

As of January 2009, Dambach was appointed as a member of the Panel of Instructors and Lecturers for FIFA Courses. In addition, she was appointed as the Chairman of the Women's Technical Committee for the period of January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2011.

In January of 2008, Dambach was named as the assistant coach by Pia Sundhage for the U.S. National Team. With Dambach's help and guidance the U.S. team completed its historic run with a gold medal at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China. Even sweeter was that Dambach's main responsibility was the U.S. Team's defense, which held fellow world power Brazil scoreless in the gold medal game.

The head coach at Harvard University as well as the U.S. Under-17 team prior to her hiring at Penn State, Dambach has consistently been active among the coaching ranks both at the Division I level and the U.S. Youth National Team program for nearly a decade. Prior to her time with the Crimson, she was part of a Florida State staff that led the Seminoles to one of its most successful year to date. FSU joined Penn State in the 2005 Women's Soccer College Cup, with both programs reaching the national semifinals.

Dambach's coaching path began in 1997 as a graduate assistant with Bucknell University. In 1998, she accepted a position at Dartmouth, where she was an assistant coach for two seasons. After helping the team to a final NSCAA ranking of No. 8 at the conclusion of the team's 1998 NCAA quarterfinal run as well as an Ivy League championship in 1999, Dambach assumed head coaching duties before the 2000 season.

As head coach, Dambach led the Big Green to back-to-back Ivy League cochampionships in 2000 and 2001. Her squad was ranked in the NSCAA's top 25 each year, rising as high as No. 13 in 2001. In her three seasons as head coach, Dartmouth was invited to the NCAA Tournament each season and reached the round of 16 twice. All three of her teams earned the NSCAA's Academic Team Award

Dambach left Dartmouth to earn her Master's in business administration at Lehigh University where she served as a graduate assistant from 2003-04.

Beginning in the spring of 2004, Dambach joined the United States Under-19 team as an assistant coach where she helped with preparations for the Under-19 World Cup. The U.S. finished with the bronze medal in Thailand after defeating Brazil in the third place match. After the World Cup, Dambach was appointed the U.S. National Team's U-17 head coach, a position which she held for three years.

As a player, Dambach was an NSCAA All-Region selection at William & Mary. A two-time first team All-CAA pick, she propelled her team to four NCAA Tournament appearances as well as two CAA regular season and two CAA league championships. In March of 2010, Dambach's alma mater, William & Mary, honored her by inducting her into the W&M Athletics Hall of Fame.

A high school All-American at Lower Moreland, she was also a member of the U.S. Under-17 National Team.

Dambach earned her Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in biology from William & Mary in 1997. The Huntingdon Valley, Pennsylvania, native holds an NSCAA Advanced National Degree and a USSF "A" Coaching License.

The former Erica Walsh married Jason Dambach in January 2016 and they currently reside in State College, Pa.
