Through nine matches, two Tigers have found a way to stand out among the nation's best players in the country.

• After being named the MVP of the Big Orange Bash and earning a nod to the Carolina Classic All-Tournament Team, Leah Perri has continued to be one of the top point scorers in the nation. The Richland, Michigan native currently ranks 12th in kills (170), 15th in attacks (440) and 13th in points (195.5). Her kill total and kills per set average (4.25) are both conference-bests.

Perri has truly taken her game to another level as she recorded five matches with 20 kills or more in 2015. This season, the senior already has five matches with 20+ kills through nine matches. Her 26-kill effort at South Carolina and her 25-kill match against ETSU are currently the top two offensive performances in the ACC.

• Since transferring from Louisiana Lafayette in the spring, Keely Hayes has registered 411 total assists, ranking her 16th in the nation and second in the ACC. Her 10.27 assists per set average is the fourth best in the conference. Her career-best 66 assists against Wofford is the highest total recorded by an ACC setter this season and the fourth highest total in the nation.

RANKING AMONG THE ACC'S BEST

The Tigers currently rank second in the ACC in aces (59), aces per set (1.48), kills (487) and are third in total blocks (88).

• Sydney Moseley owns the third most aces in the conference with 13 while Leah Perri and Ally Gamble are both in double-figures as well with 12 and 10 aces respectively.

• Megan McGinley ranks third in total blocks with 44 this season.

LETHAL LEAH

Richland, Michigan native, Leah Perri is back in 2016 for her senior season after carrying the offensive load for the Tigers as a junior.

• Perri carried the offensive load for the Tigers in 2015 for the first time in her career and she did not disappoint. As a junior, Perri enjoyed a career-best season in kills (412), kills/set (3.68), aces (17) and digs (213) while also registering her 1,000th career kill in Clemson's victory over Georgia Tech on November 11.

• She started all 32 matches and finished with double-digit kills in 24 of them, including five matches with 20 kills or more and six matches where she recorded double-doubles.

• After the season she traveled with former Tiger, Keelie Arneson to tryout for Team USA.

AC/DC IS BACK... IN ORANGE & WHITE

Of Clemson's seven freshmen, two are redshirt freshmen as Annie Carter and Dejhana Cotton are back and healthy for the 2016 season.

- Both, Carter and Cotton, were projected starters before they went down with season-ending injuries early in 2015.
- Carter's injury opened the door for Sydney Moseley's break-through season as she set career best season totals in kills, kills/set, aces, digs, blocks and points.
- Cotton was able to see some time on the floor in 2015, killing eight balls and denying opponents seven times in just seven sets. Her best match came against Winthrop as she tallied a .545 hitting percentage (7 kills, 1 error, 11 attempts) and four blocks in the three-set victory.

CLEMSON CUBS

With 11 of Clemson's 15 student-athletes being underclassmen, including seven freshmen, the Tigers are still one of the youngest teams in the conference.

- Clemson, Pittsburgh and Syracuse are the only three schools in the conference with underclassmen taking up 70% of their rosters.

BATTLE TESTED

2015 truly was baptism by fire as the youngest team in the ACC was tested with one of the most difficult schedules in the conference.

- Clemson's nine matches against the top five teams in the ACC last season are more than any other team in the country. The only team the Tigers did not see twice in 2015 was this year's preseason favorite to win the ACC, North Carolina. Duke, Georgia Tech, Notre Dame and Wake Forest all saw the top five ACC teams a total of eight times.

- Clemson's schedule in 2015 featured 11 matches against eight teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament, three of which advanced to the second round. In total, the ACC sent four teams to the NCAA Tournament last season with Syracuse and Pittsburgh just missing the cut.

- Of the 32 matches in 2015, 14 were against top-60 RPI teams and 10 featured a team ranked in the top 35 in the nation in blocks per set. Of those 10, seven were played against five of the top 10 blocking teams in the nation.

HUGH HERNESMAN

HEAD COACH

Hugh Hernesman, who won a conference title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament at Northwestern State in 2014, was hired on March 5, 2015 to be the ninth head coach in Clemson volleyball program history. Hernesman spent five seasons at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, La., before leading the Tigers in 2015.

Prior to Hernesman's arrival in Natchitoches in January of 2010, the Demon program averaged 10 wins per season, and five per year in Southland Conference play. In 2012 and 2013, his third and fourth years with the program, the Demons recorded back-to-back 20-win seasons. In 2013, Hernesman guided the team to the most overall wins (21), most conference wins (15) and highest final RPI (98) in the program's 32 years of NCAA Division 1 history.



STEPHANIE HERNESMAN

ASSISTANT COACH

Hernesman has served as the co-head coach, along with her husband Hugh, at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, La. for the last five years before coming to Clemson in 2015. Hugh Hernesman was named Clemson's head coach in March of 2015.



NICOLE MILLER

ASSISTANT COACH

Miller served as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Charlotte, where she helped the 49ers earn 17 wins (for the first time since 2006) and a berth in the Conference USA tournament (the program's first appearance in a conference tournament in four years). She worked primarily with Charlotte's middle hitters and also developed the team's system for blocking which led to improved numbers in solo blocks, block assists and total blocks.



ALEXA RAND

DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS

Rand is entering her second season as the director of volleyball operations. She played one season as a professional, from Aug. 2013 to May 2014, for EVS in Angelholm, which plays in the top volleyball league in Sweden. That season, her team placed third in the league, and Rand was named Most Efficient Attacker after recording the best hitting percentage among all players in the league.

The native of Mentor, Ohio was a star middle blocker for the Tigers from 2009-12. She earned All-ACC and AVCA All-Region honors as a junior in 2011 and ACC All-Freshman honors as a rookie in 2009, and was a three-time member of the All-ACC Academic team from 2010-12. Rand concluded her Clemson career with 822 kills and 614 total blocks. The 614 blocks rank second in Clemson history, and she also ranks second in block assists (517) and blocks per set (1.34) and third in career hitting percentage (.334). She recorded 157 blocks as a freshman in 2009, breaking the school record for blocks in a single season by a freshman.



KEELIE ARNESON

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

Keelie Arneson is in her first season as a volunteer assistant for the Tigers and will earn her master's degree in December. Arneson transferred to Clemson from Northwestern State for her fifth season and to continue playing for the Hernesman's. In her first and only season competing in the ACC, she was the statistical champion on digs (576) and digs per set (5.24) as Clemson's libero. She finished her career with the fifth most digs in NCAA history (2,707) and the 30th best digs per set average in NCAA history (5.24).

Prior to her season at Clemson, Arneson leading the country at Northwestern State with a 6.82 digs per set average before suffering a torn Achilles in practice prior to her 11th match of the season. If the injury occurred one day later, she would not have been eligible for a medical redshirt and her collegiate career would have been over.
