FIRST SERVE

- » Penn State opens the first of a four-year series in the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge this weekend, taking on No. 2 Stanford and UCLA in Palo Alto, Calif. The Lions face the Cardinal Friday, Sept. 5 at 9 p.m. ET before squaring off against the Bruins Saturday, Sept. 6 at 8 p.m. ET.
- » The Nittany Lions went 3-0 last weekend to capture the Penn State Classic title with wins against TCU, Iona and William & Mary. With the trio of victories, PSU has stretched its current winning streak to 28 consecutive matches, dating back to Sept. 28, 2013.
- » Freshman Ali Frantti earned Penn State Classic Most Outstanding Player honors, while senior Micha Hancock and junior Megan Courtney joined her on the All-Tournament team.
- » The 3-0 start in 2014 marks the third consecutive season that Penn State has kicked off a new campaign with three wins in the opening weekend.
- » Freshman Ali Frantti earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors following her debut performance in the Blue and White. Frantti highlighted the Nittany Lions' 3-0 weekend with back-to-back double-digit kill performances in her first two collegiate appearances.
- » Penn State was voted No. 1 overall for the second consecutive week in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. The Nittany Lions received 35 of a possible 60 first-place votes.
- » PSU presently has matchups set for 11 teams represented in the AVCA preseason poll, including seven matches against teams in the top 25 and four receiving votes.
- » The Nittany Lions are among seven teams from the Big Ten to be ranked within the AVCA preseason top 25 and one of four within the top 10.
- » The last time Penn State and Stanford met, the Nittany Lions battled to a thrilling 3-2 (22-25, 25-22, 28-26, 18-25, 15-11) victory against the Cardinal in the 2013 Lexington NCAA regional finals to advance to the national semifinals.
- » In the most recent clash between Penn State and UCLA, the Bruins knocked off the Nittany Lions in straight sets in the 2011 Lexington NCAA regional semifinals on their way to an eventual national championship title.
- » Penn State was voted No. 1 in the Big Ten Preseason Coaches' Poll for the second consecutive year, with three Nittany Lions earning preseason All-Big Ten honors.
- » Penn State improved to 30-6 all-time in season-openers, having swept TCU in the first match of the Penn State Classic last weekend. The win against the Horned Frogs marked the Nittany Lions' third consecutive season-opening victory.
- » In his 36th season at the helm of the program, five-time AVCA DI National Coach of the Year Russ Rose returns four starters and 11 letterwinners from last year's NCAA national championship squad.
- » The Nittany Lions welcome a highly talented class of eight newcomers in 2014, featuring four state Gatorade Player of the Year honorees. PrepVolleyball.com tabbed PSU's incoming class No. 1 nationally.

ITS A WRAP: PENN STATE CLASSIC IN REVIEW

Penn State women's volleyball improved to 3-0 on the year after claiming the Penn State Classic crown last weekend. The Nittany Lions cruised past TCU, Iona and William & Mary all by way of straight set victories. Led by returning first team AVCA All-American Micha Hancock, the senior setter paced the Nittany Lions to a .436 hitting clip on the week, which ranks first in the Big Ten. Penn State also limited its opponents to a conference best .009 hitting clip last weekend, holding both Iona and William & Mary to negative efficiency in back-to-back matches.

Penn State powered past the three teams with a balanced performance from both veteran leaders as well as powerful newcomers. Heading into the week, junior Megan Courtney and freshman Ali Frantti are both ranked within the Big Ten's top 10 in hitting percentage.

WEEK 2: AVCA TOP 25 COACHES POLL UPDATE

Following a 3-0 opening weekend at home, Penn State earned the No. 1 overall ranking in the latest AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll for the second consecutive week. The Nittany Lions earned 35 of a possible 60 first place votes, which is three more than PSU earned in the preseason poll.

TRIO EARN PENN STATE CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM HONORS

Following back-to-back double-digit kill performances in her first two collegiate matches, freshman Ali Frantti earned Penn State Classic Most Outstanding Player honors. Senior Micha Hancock and junior Megan Courtney each earned spots on the All-Tournament team for their performances during the undefeated weekend.

Hancock directed the Nittany Lions to a conference-high .436 hitting clip during the week, while also pacing Frantti (.482) and Courtney (.500) to a pair of Big Ten top-five hitting clips. Hancock's 11.33 assists per set ranks third in the league. Frantti finished the week averaging 3.44 kills per set, while Courtney closed out the slate ranked second on the team with 3.11 kills per frame.

FORCE OF THE FROSH

Four freshman made their collegiate debuts for Penn State last weekend, including Ali Frantti, Heidi Thelen, Simone Lee and Lainy Pierce. Frantti led the team in kills in back-to-back matches against TCU and Iona, while also tying for first on the team in blocks against William & Mary. Thelen made her debut against the Gaels, leading the team in blocks (3), while also tallying six kills. Lee saw action against TCU and William & Mary, posting a team-high 10 kills against the Tribe to mark her first collegiate double-digit kill performance. She also notched four digs and one solo stuff.

HANCOCK NOMINATED FOR 2014 ESPY AWARD

Penn State's Micha Hancock was one of two PSU student-athletes to be nominated for a 2014 ESPY Award, presented by ESPN. Hancock was nominated for Best Female Collegiate Athlete. Hancock's nomination marks the third time a PSU women's volleyball student-athlete has been up for an ESPY. Megan Hodge earned a nomination in 2010, following the '09 season, while Blair Brown was selected in 2011 following the '10 season.

PENN STATE TABBED BIG TEN PRESEASON FAVORITE

Penn State earned the No. 1 ranking in the 2014 Big Ten Preseason Coaches' Poll, which is decided by the league's 14 head coaches. The top-ranking marks the ninth time in the last 10 years that the 16-time defending Big Ten champion Nittany Lions have been voted No. 1 the preseason standings.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN NITTANY LIONS

PSU is also well represented on the All-Big Ten Preseason Team, with more honorees than any other conference team in the league for the second consecutive year. Senior setter Micha Hancock highlights a trio of 2014 honorees as a unanimous selection. She's joined by senior middle Nia Grant and junior outside Megan Courtney. The nod is the second consecutive for both Hancock and Courtney and the first career for Grant.

ROSE APPROACHING A HISTORIC MARK

In 2013, head coach Russ Rose earned his 1,107th victory with a straight-set win at Northwestern, moving him into sole possession of second place on the NCAA DI career wins list. With the triumph, he passed former UCLA head coach Andy Banachowski, who previously owned the record.

With 1,128 wins, Rose is presently two wins shy of tying current Hawaii head coach Dave Shoji for first on the all-time list with 1,130 victories. Rose currently owns the all-time record for NCAA DI career winning percentage, having posted a career clip of .864 in the past 35 seasons. Both Rose and Shoji are the only two NCAA DI head coaches to have more than 1,000 career wins. The two are also one of just three active NCAA head coaches in all three divisions to have more than 1,100 career wins.

HANCOCK ATOP THE SERVING ALL-TIME LIST

Averaging 0.65 aces per set in 2013, Micha Hancock finished last year ranked second nationally in aces per set. Her mark also ranked first in the Big Ten. The impressive serving also set a new program record. With four aces against Eastern Kentucky, Hancock notched her 200th career service ace. Building on the mark throughout the season she moved into sole possession of first place on the Penn State all-time list with 254 aces on the year to surpass Ellen Hensler, who set the record in 1986.

With three aces in 2014, Hancock has improved her mark to 257 aces all-time to keep a firm hold on her all-time record.

WHO'S BACK

Two-time first team AVCA All-American Micha Hancock leads a solid group of four starters from last year's NCAA national championship squad. Hancock directed the Nittany Lion offense to a .305 hitting clip in 2013, which concluded the season ranked fifth nationally.

AVCA Honorable Mention All-America Nia Grant and starting outside Megan Courtney are two of Hancock's top attackers who return to the court. Having ranked within the top of the Big Ten and national standings throughout the season, Grant's .350 hitting clip closed out the year ranked second best on the team and fifth in the final conference standings. Courtney, who picked up 2014 Preseason All-Big Ten honors, finished the year with 297 kills, averaging 2.47 per set on .272 hitting. Her 2.51 digs per frame and 0.73 blocks per set ranked third on the squad.

Defensively, the Nittany Lions also return two-year starting libero Dominique Gonzalez, who has proved to be a steady leader in the back row. Averaging 3.28 digs per set in 2014, she amassed 416 digs on the year, posting double-digit digs in 23-of-36 matches in 2013.

EXPERIENCED SENIOR CORE

Comprised of four, this year's senior class features Lacey Fuller, Dominique Gonzalez, Nia Grant and Micha Hancock. Together, the four have a combined record of 92-13 (.876), and a 54-6 mark in Big Ten matches. Along with back-to-back Big Ten titles in 2012 and 2013, the veteran class holds a 12-2 (.857) mark in post season play, with two consecutive NCAA national semifinal appearances in 2012-13 as well as the 2013 NCAA national title.

SPOTS TO FILL

Penn State has entered the 2014 season without a trio of standout student-athletes who were instrumental in the Nittany Lions' fifth national crown in the last seven years. 2013 Graduating seniors Deja McClendon, Katie Slay and Ariel Scott combined for 10 AVCA All-America honors during their four-year careers on the court, guiding both the 2010 and 2013 teams to a pair of NCAA national titles.

McClendon highlighted the 2013 All-America class as the only player to be honored as a four-time All-American. A true multi-faceted student-athlete, The Nittany Lions will have to replace McClendon's ability to pass, block, defend and attack. PSU will also need to replace Scott, a three-time AVCA All-American opposite who consistently served as the Nittany Lions' go-to hitter. Defensively, Slay departs Penn State as one of the most prolific blockers in program history, having earned three consecutive All-America honors to go along with her 627 career blocks, which ranks sixth all-time.

FRESHMAN INFLUENCE

Regarded by PrepVolleyball.com as "a class that rivals the best ever," Penn State's incoming freshman class features eight newcomers who will all be competing for spots on the court in 2014. Along with four state Gatorade Player of the Year honorees, five Nittany Lion newcomers were ranked within PrepVolleyball's top 15 in the nation, while three ranked among the top three.

NITTANY LIONS MONTH - BY- MONTH

Penn State is 40-5 (.889) all-time during the month of August, after notching a trio of victories against TCU, Iona and William & Mary last weekend. The Nittany Lions' first two losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 when Nebraska swept PSU, and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State, 3-2, in the opening round. The Nittany Lions have not dropped a season opening match since losing to Oregon in 2011.

Penn State is 358-56-4 (.856) all-time during the month of September. The Lions are 183-17 (.915) during September dating back to the 1995 season and 41-8 (.837) within the last five years.

PSU is 386-67 (.852) all-time during the month of October. Penn State has posted an 86-11 (.887) mark in October across the last 10 seasons, and a record of 50 -3 (.943) in the last five years and did not lose a match during the month from 2007 to 2010.

Penn State is 285-57 (.833) all-time during the month of November, including a 87-8 (.916) mark across the last 10 seasons. The Nittany Lions posted a six-year streak from 1995-2000 where they did not lose a match in the month, and in the last five seasons, Penn State has a 45-3 (.938) mark in November.

In 2013, the Nittany posted unblemished records in three months, going 2-0 in August, 8-0 in October and 10-0 in November. Despite registering an 8-2 mark in the month of September, Penn State has lost a match since dropping a close five-setter to Michigan State on Sept. 27th.

QUICK SETS

From Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten in 1991, Penn State has played in 770 total matches, winning 714. Across the last seven years, Penn State has earned 155 of its 203 victories in three sets (76%), including 37-of-38 (98%) in 2008 and 32-of-38 in 2009 (84%).

In the last 15 years, the Lions have lost only 58 matches. And of those 22 teams that defeated the Lions – BYU, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Long Beach State, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Oregon State, Purdue, USC, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin – only nine of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota, Michigan State and Florida) have been able to beat Penn State a third time. The Lions have compiled a 277-56 mark in the last 15 years versus these teams.

NITTANY LIONS EARN TOP RANKING IN AVCA PRESEASON POLL

Penn State women's volleyball earned the No. 1 overall ranking in the 2014 AVCA Preseason Coaches' Poll. This year's poll features more Big Ten teams than any other conference in the country, with the Nittany Lions among seven other league teams to be ranked within the top 25 and one of four to be within the top 10. Since 2004, Penn State has been ranked within the top five in every AVCA preseason poll, having earned a top-ranking five times (2008-11 & 2014).

Earning 32 of a possible 60 first-place votes, PSU claimed the top spot ahead of No. 2 Texas, No. 3 Stanford, No. 4 Washington and No. 5 USC. The Big Ten is also well represented in the lower half of the top 10 rankings with Wisconsin, Nebraska and Purdue in spots six through eight, consecutively. BYU and Florida rounded out the last spots at No. 9 and No. 10.

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE AVCA PRESEASON POLL

Penn State will square off against a total of 11 teams that debuted in the 2014 AVCA preseason poll, including nine teams ranked within the top 25 and two who are receiving votes. First up, the Nittany Lions meet third-ranked Stanford in the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge Friday, Sept. 5, before taking on UCLA (RV) the next evening. The Bruins received 23 votes. PSU also meets No. 22 Kansas and No. 24 American in non-conference action at the Villanova Classic, Sept. 12-13 at Villanova.

PACKING REC HALL ONCE AGAIN

Penn State was among the national leaders in attendance in 2013, ranking sixth in the country with an average of 2,952 fans per match on the year behind Nebraska, Hawaii, Missouri, Minnesota and Wisconsin. (Figures provided by the NCAA.)

STREAKING!

Penn State holds the top three winning streaks in Big Ten history. Penn State's most recent streak of 65 consecutive matches began on Nov. 11, 2006 and ended on Sept. 24, 2010 at Illinois. It is the longest streak in league history. Penn State's other two conference winning streaks were 49 matches and 41. Illinois owns the fourth (40) and fifth (25) longest conference winning streaks.

The Nittany Lions are presently on a 27-match winning streak, which dates back to Sept. 28, when PSU started the streak with a 3-1 win against Michigan. The stretch is the longest streak in a single season since PSU posted back-to-back 38-0 records in 2008 and 2009.
