

2016 NCAA Division I Lacrosse Championship Semifinal

#11 Penn State vs. #3 North Carolina May 27, 2016 – Talen Energy Stadium

Penn State Notes

- Friday's NCAA Semifinal appearance was Penn State's 10th overall appearance in the NCAA Semifinals and first since 1999.
- Senior Madison Cyr became the 12th Penn State student-athlete to reach 200 career points, achieving the mark with a goal with 24:13 remaining in the first half.
- Cyr finished her career with 202 points, tying her sister Mackenzie (2011-14) for ninth and finished fourth overall in goals (156).
- Cyr capped the season with a team-best 59 goals and 83 points.
- Cyr's five ground balls matched both a season and career-high previously set at Johns Hopkins on March 2.
- Senior Jenna Mosketti's three goals on Friday matched her total from her three previous 2016 NCAA Tournament games.
- Junior Natalie Schmitt's three draw controls matched her season and career-highs, previously set twice with the latest coming against Vanderbilt on March 12.
- Junior Steph Lazo finished the season as Penn State's leader in assists (37) and finished second in points (71).
- With the loss, Penn State falls to 9-2 all-time versus North Carolina.
- Penn State scored five straight to come back from a 3-0 deficit to take a 5-3 lead on a goal by Kelly Dagget with 21:47 left in the first half.
- Penn State finishes the season with a 14-7 overall record, going 7-2 at home, 6-4 away and 1-1 at neutral sites.
- The Nittany Lions are now 21-20 all-time in NCAA Tournament games.

North Carolina Post Game Notes

- North Carolina has won 16 straight games. It is the longest winning streak in program history. Its last loss was on February 27 to Maryland, 8-7.
- The Tar Heels advance to the NCAA Championship game for the third time in the last four years. It is their fourth overall NCAA Championship game appearance (2009, 2013, 2015, 2016).
- This is Carolina's sixth trip to the Final Four in the past eight years. It is the ninth overall.
- The Tar Heels have set a new school record with 19 victories. The 2013 and 2015 teams each won 18 games.
- Seven players from the 2013 UNC team that won the national championship are still active, including five who played in the title game vs. Maryland (Mallory Frysinger, Aly Messinger, Megan Ward, Kelly Devlin, and Sammy Jo Tracy).
- UNC is 12-1 when scoring first and 17-1 when scoring 10+ goals.
- UNC is 16-0 when leading at the half.
- UNC is 16-0 when collecting more ground balls.
- Marie McCool has scored a point in 31 straight games; Sammy Jo Tracy has done the same in 21 straight.
- Tracy has scored a goal in 21 straight games, while McCool has scored a goal in 13 straight.
- UNC is 11-3 all-time versus Penn State, including 6-2 in neutral site games.
- UNC is 12-2 versus ranked opponents this season and has won 12 straight.
- Goalkeeper Caylee Waters entered the game in the ninth minute and held Penn State scoreless for the next 19 minutes.
- Carly Reed's five goals ties a career-high set as a freshman vs. Canisius (Feb. 19, 2014) & Notre Dame (Feb. 27, 2014). She has 16 goals in last six games.
- North Carolina is 7-2 in one-goal games and has won the last seven.
