STORYLINES

- Penn State (11-11, 2-9 BIG) faces No. 5/7 Iowa (17-4, 8-1 BIG) for the first time in the span of 14 days when it travels to Iowa City for a 7 p.m. ET/6 CT matchup on ESPNU. The teams will meet in exactly two weeks with a 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 17 matchup in the Bryce Jordan Center.
- Three of the Nittany Lions' next four games are vs. ranked foes, including both games this week.
- This is Penn State's 13th game away from home this season and seventh in the first 10 Big Ten games.
- The Nittany Lions are coming off a neutral-site loss to Michigan, 79-72, Saturday as part of the first Big Ten Super Saturday Hoops & Hockey Doubleheader at Madison Square Garden Saturday.
- Three Nittany Lions are scoring in double-figures: Brandon Taylor (16.3 ppg), Shep Garner (13.9) and Payton Banks (10.7) with Taylor controlling the boards (6.0) and Garner also leading in assists (3.1).
- Brandon Taylor produced his fourth double-double of the season Saturday vs. Michigan, tallying a Big Ten career-high 24 points and 10 rebounds. He is one of 11 league players with at least four d-ds.

CHAMBERS AVAILABILITY

All interview requests for head coach Patrick Chambers should be directed to Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office. Coach Chambers will hold weekly press conferences and teleconferences during the season. A schedule will be emailed out every Monday. Coach Chambers will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be arranged through Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will generally be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Patrick Chambers' weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off. Player phone numbers will not be released. Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the postgame media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

CREDENTIALS

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Alissa Clendenen. Please submit requests for game credentials at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, near Parking Lot 8. Penn State is a member of the Big Ten Conference and all press box and game day policies will conform to Big Ten guidelines.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

A photo pass must be issued to gain access courtside in the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Alissa Clendenen one week in advance for photo passes. Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and the stands. Photographers must remain seated at all times.

The Penn State Sports Network originates from the first row of Booth C23 in the press area. Visiting radio stations are located on the first row of Booth C22 in the press area. Visiting radio is provided one phone line and one ISDN line.

SCOUTING IOWA

Ranked No. 5 in the AP Top 25 and No. 7 in the USA Today poll this week, the Hawkeyes dropped their first conference game of the season last week, falling to Maryland, 74-68, Jan. 28 in College Park. They had won their previous nine games, including each of the first seven league contests. Iowa defeated Northwestern at home Sunday, 85-71, with 23 points from Big Ten leading scorer Jared Uthoff (18.6 ppg). Iowa ranks third in the nation with a 1.71 assist-to-turnover ratio, averaging 17.0 assists per game with 58.6 percent of field goals coming off an assist. Mike Gesell ranks 14th in Division I with 6.5 apg. Iowa has won each of its last 14 home games, dating back to last February. In five Big Ten home games, the Hawkeyes average 82.0 ppg with a scoring margin of +12.2.

SERIES HISTORY

- » Iowa holds a 27-14 advantage in the series vs. Penn State and has won seven of the last 10 meetings. Nine of the last 12 matchups have been decided by single-digits, including both last season.
- » The Nittany Lions were victorious in the last meeting of the series, a 67-58 win in the second round of the 2015 Big Ten Tournament.
- » The Hawkeyes took the lone meeting of regular season last year, an 81-77 overtime decision Feb. 28 in the BJC.
- » Penn State's last win in Carver-Hawkeye Arena was March 1, 2001, a 78-73 victory.
- » Penn State is 5-8 all-time vs. teams ranked No. 7 in the USA Today poll at the time of meeting.

CURRENT ROSTER VS. IOWA

LAST TIME VS. THE HAWKEYES

CHICAGO (March 12, 2015) - The Nittany Lions knocked off fifth-seeded Iowa, 67-58, in second-round action of the 2015 Big Ten tournament. Penn State outscored Iowa 48-31 in the second half, shooting 54 percent in the period compared to Iowa's 22 percent showing. The Lions opened the second half with a 17-7 run to take 36-34 lead with 11:01 to play and did not trail for the remainder of the game. D.J. Newbill finished with 18 points and Ross Travis scored a season-high 17 points on 6-for-9 shooting for the 13th-seeded Nittany Lions.

NOTABLE GAMES IN THE SERIES

Feb. 16, 2012 (PSU, 69-64): Having reduced a 16-point Penn State lead to three with 24 seconds to play, Iowa intentionally put redshirt freshman Jon Graham on the foul line. He hit both to effectively ice a 69-64 victory for the Nittany Lions.

Jan. 26, 2011 (PSU, 65-51): One of the two home games in the last eight not separated by five or fewer points was decided by Talor Battle's 23-point outing that gave Penn State its third-consecutive Big Ten home win.

March 27, 1995 (PSU, 67-64): Pete Lisicky nailed a 3-pointer with 2.1 seconds left to send the Nittany Lions to the semifinals of the NIT.

UP NEXT

The Nittany Lions will play their first game since Jan. 21 when it hosts No. 22/21 Indiana at 8 p.m. Saturday in the Bryce Jordan Center. The game is the highlight of the program's Alumni Weekend. Nearly 40 alumni are expected to return to University Park, headlined by honorary captain John Amaechi.

THIS & THAT

LAST TIME OUT » Zak Irvin scored 20 points and Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman added 15 as Michigan swept the season series from Penn State with a 79-72 victory at Madison Square Garden on Saturday. The game was part of the inaugural Big Ten Super Saturday Hoops & Hockey Doubleheader in the World's Most Famous Arena. Brandon Taylor had 24 points and 10 rebounds for the Nittany Lions. [BOX/NOTES: Page 42]

HOOPS & HOCKEY » The matchup Saturday vs. Michigan was part of the inaugural Big Ten Super Saturday Hoops & Hockey Doubleheader in Madison Square Garden with the men's hockey programs from both schools facing off later in the evening. This was the first of four annual events at "The World's Most Famous Arena," which also will host the 2018 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament Feb. 28-March 4 of that year. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games at Madison Square Garden in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

WITHOUT REAVES » Penn State has been playing without freshman standout Josh Reaves for the last five games (1-4) as he recovers from mono. There is no specific timetable for this return. Reaves saw action in the first 17 games of the season, starting 14 and averaging 6.4 ppg. He is second on the team in both steals (22) and blocks (17).

SOS » According to ESPN RPI figures, Penn State's conference strength of schedule is third in the league, trailing Iowa and Rutgers. The Nittany Lions played three ranked teams within the first five games of the Big Ten season and now have three games vs. ranked opponents in the next four contests.

ROAD WARRIORS » The Nittany Lions are playing their 13th game of the year away from University Park Wednesday at Iowa, wrapping up a stretch of seven of their first 10 league games away from home, including back-to-back road or neutral games four times in that stretch. Only Illinois has played as many road/neutral site games with their first six "home" games played prior to the opening of State Farm Center.

1,000-POINT SCORER » Brandon Taylor became the 32nd Penn State player all-time to pass the 1,000-point mark when he scored 18 against Michigan Jan. 2. He has 1,128 career points and is ranked No. 22 on the Penn State all-time scoring chart. [Page 28]

TAYLOR TRANSFORMATION » Brandon Taylor has nearly twice as many 2-point buckets (99) this season than all of last year (55) and has converted on more than twice as many free throws (74) than were even attempted (30) last season. He is shooting 73 percent from charity stripe, as opposed to 63percent as a junior.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES » Brandon Taylor tallied his fourth double-double of the year against Michigan Saturday, tallying a Big Ten career-high 24 points to go with 10 rebounds. He previously tallied double-doubles vs. Maryland (15 points/10 rebounds), Eastern Michigan (27/12 -- both career highs) and Bucknell (19/11).

BANK ON IT » Payton Banks is third on the team in scoring with 10.7 ppg, showing the biggest increase in scoring among members of the team last year (+9.0 ppg). He has produced double-figure scoring in all but seven games this season after tallying career-high point (24), field goal (8), free throw (6) and steal (3) totals against Minnesota (1/5).

FOSTER-ING PROGRESS » Devin Foster has produced 7.8 points and 1.8 assists per game over the last six games, with a career-high 12 points against Michigan State (1/10). He also reached double-figures vs. Wisconsin, finishing night with 10 points. He is the team's fourth-leading scorer over the last five games.

VS. RANKED TEAMS » The Nittany Lions are 0-3 vs. teams ranked in the Top 25 at the time of meeting this season, falling to No. 4 Maryland and No. 5 Michigan State and No. 24 Purdue within the first five Big Ten games. With three games vs. ranked opponents coming up in a span of four contests, the Lions have nine games scheduled against teams ranked in the Top 25 or receiving votes in the current polls.

LESS THAN 70 » The Nittany Lions are 9-2 when holding their opponents below 70 points this season. The two losses came in the last two weeks, vs. Wisconsin and Ohio State, who both tallied 66 points.

SINGLE-DIGIT SEPARATION » Penn State is 8-4 this season in games separated by nine or fewer points. The first two losses came within a span of three games, vs. Colorado (-1) and at Maryland (-6), followed setbacks to Wisconsin (-6) and Michigan (-7). Last season, the Nittany Lions had 24 of 34 games decided by single-digits with the team going 13-11 in those contests (8-1 in non-conference play).

UNDER 40 PERCENT » Eight of Penn State's 11 wins this season have come when holding opponents below 40 percent shooting. Foes are shooting at a 38 percent clip in PSU victories with the Nittany Lions hitting 43 percent of shots in the same games. Penn State holds a 44-17 record under head coach Patrick Chambers when limiting opponents to a sub-40 percent field-goal percentage, and an 8-2 mark this season, after the losses to Colorado and Maryland.

REMEMBERING JOHN BACH » John Bach, former Penn State men's basketball head coach and NBA coaching veteran, died Monday, Jan. 18. He was 91. Bach led the Nittany Lions to a 122-121 record over 10 seasons, from 1969-78. His PSU teams were renowned for their pressure man-to-man defense with four squads ranked in the nation's top 20 in scoring defense. His teams posted back-to-back records of 17-8 and 15-8 in 1972 and 1973 respectively.

LINEUPS » Penn State has used six different starting lineup combinations this season and over 70 in-game combinations. The lineup of Shep Garner, Josh Reaves, Payton Banks, Brandon Taylor and Jordan Dickerson started in nine games this season. [Page 11]

BOSTON THREE PARTY » Shep Garner's performance at Boston College Dec. 2 produced eight 3-pointers, the second-most in a single game for a Nittany Lion in program history, trailing just Pete Lisicky's nine tallied vs. Penn in 1996. The effort tied the Conte Forum record, set previously by two players.

COMEBACK » Penn State battled back from a 17-point deficit against Drexel Dec. 19 in Philadelphia, its largest comeback for a win in at least 15 years. Since the 2000-01 season, the Nittany Lions have come back from at least 14 points down to win 10 times, three under head coach Patrick Chambers.

CENTURY MARK » Brandon Taylor played in his 100th career game against Bucknell Nov. 28 and has now seen action in 118. He has started 95 games, the most of any current Nittany Lion, and is averaging 9.2 points per game over his four-year career. Donovan Jack saw action in his 100th career game against Michigan Jan. 2 (107). He has 42 career starts over his four-year career with a scoring average of 4.3 ppg.

CLOSE CALLS » Penn State's four-point win over Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 12 was the eighth-consecutive win in non-conference play decided by five points or fewer, dating back to last season. The Nittany Lions had six non-conference games separated by 1-5 points in 2014-15, winning each of them, and are 2-0 so far this season, also winning vs. Bucknell (62-58). The loss to Colorado ended that streak.

B1G OPENERS » Penn State is 7-17 in conference lidlifters with the last opener win coming Dec. 27, 2010 at Indiana, 69-60. This was the sixth time in the last seven years the Nittany Lions have opened the conference slate on the road and the second-consecutive season they have done so vs. the No. 4 team in the country.

EARLY-SEASON TOURNEYS » Penn State is 76-89 in early-season tournaments after going 3-1 in the Las Vegas Classic to finish in third. The Lions have participated in at least one each season since 1981 and have captured 10 tournament championships, 12 second-place and 27 third-place finishes.

IN THE CHALLENGE » With the win over Boston College Dec. 2, Penn State moves to 6-3 in its last nine Big Ten/ACC Challenge games and has won four of its last five Big Ten/ACC Challenge road games. The Lions hold a 7-8 record in 15 Challenge appearances.

SEASON NOTES

CHAMBERS TAKES ON YEAR FIVE

The 2015-16 season marks the fifth year at the helm of the Nittany Lions for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native is coming off his best season in University Park after posting a win total (18) that had been topped just twice in the last decade and four times since 2000. Chambers has seen his overall win total climb each of the last three years and has continued to make waves in Big Ten play.

SUITS AND SNEAKERS

Head coach Patrick Chambers will don suits and sneakers for every game during the 2015-16, in honor of the 20th season of Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State. The school's chapter of CVC is consistently ranks among the Top 10 CVC organizations in the nation. It was started in 1995 under then head coach Bruce Parkhill and raises funds to support the American Cancer Society as well as the Bob Perks Fund (BPF), a local initiative that provides direct support for community members and families fighting cancer. Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State has raised nearly \$2.5 million to date through a series of year-round events. To get involved please visit CVCPENNSTATE.ORG or call 814-234-1023.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The Penn State basketball program recently moved into new training table and video room facilities in the Bryce Jordan Center. The \$1.2 million project was propelled by a generous gift from Peter and Ann Tombros and allows the Nittany Lions to utilize state of the art technologies. The concourse of the BJC also got a makeover in the offseason, and features Nittany and Lady Lion basketball graphics surrounding the circumference, as well as at the main entrances.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

A pair of four-year players – Brandon Taylor and Donovan Jack - were selected team captains for the season by a player vote. Combined with Jordan Dickerson, who has played a year and a half in Happy Valley, and Devin Foster, who joined the Lions last year, the group makes up the 2015-16 senior class. Taylor and Jack have been a part of 44 wins in their first three years, the most since the 2011-12 class entered its final year with 57 victories.

ROOKIE RECOGNITION

The freshman class of Josh Reeves, Mike Watkins and Deividas Zemgulis make up the most heralded group to sign at Penn State to date. The trio was rated as the No. 28 class in the nation by 247 Sports, marking the first Top 30 group to join the Nittany Lions. Both four-star players, Reeves and Watkins were each ranked among the Top 100 players in the country by ESPN with Reeves holding the No. 81 spot and Watkins coming in at No. 89 at the time of their signing. Zemgulis was a three-star recruit and a Top 12 prospect from Maryland.

LIONS GAIN UCONN TRANSFER

Terrence Samuel joined the Nittany Lions in July after playing two years at the University of Connecticut. He will have two seasons of eligibility remaining after sitting out the 2015-16 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. A member of the Huskies' 2014 NCAA Championship team, Samuel saw action in 65 career games with eight starts as a sophomore. He averaged 3.6 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in his second season in Storrs with career averages of 3.0 ppg and 1.7 rpg.

BLOCK PARTY

The Nittany Lions have a total of three players in the Penn State Top 10 in the blocks category. Donovan Jack and Jordan Dickerson entered the season tied at No. 8 with 82 career blocks, while Brandon Taylor was 10th with 74. Jack and Dickerson also share the No. 8 position in single-season blocks with 53 after putting up the total in 2013-14 and 2014-15, respectively. It was the first time Penn State had a player produce more than 50 blocks in back-to-back seasons since 1998 and 1999 when Calvin Booth did so.

RETURN TO REC ... TIMES TWO

Penn State's non-conference schedule is highlighted by two games to be played in historic Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions will take on Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 10 and 12, respectively, as part of the second Return to Rec. Penn State last played in Rec Hall during the 2013-14 season in a Return to Rec event that marked the first men's basketball game played there since the Nittany Lions defeated Wisconsin, 79-50, in the building on Jan. 7, 1996. From 1926-96, the Lions compiled a stellar 514-183 (73.7%) record in Rec Hall, including a 45-game win streak from 1951-55.

PSU TAKES NYC

The Nittany Lion basketball and men's hockey programs will take over Madison Square Garden Jan. 30 in the first Big Ten Super Saturday - Hoops and Hockey doubleheader. The teams will both take on Michigan with tip slated for noon and puck drop scheduled for 7 p.m., both on Big Ten Network. This is the first of four annual events at "The World's Most Famous Arena," which also will host the 2018 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament Feb. 28-March 4 of that year. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games at Madison Square Garden in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

LAS VEGAS CLASSIC

Penn State took part in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic Dec. 22-23 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas, falling to Colorado by one, 71-70, before defeating Kent State, 75-69, in the consolation game. Each team played four games in the Classic – the first two at on-campus sites and the final two rounds at the Orleans Arena. Penn State's two games are vs. Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe in the Return to Rec series. The Lions finished the tourney 3-1.

STAFF CHANGES

Head coach Patrick Chambers announced a series of staff changes in the offseason, beginning with the move by Ross Condon from director of operations to assistant coach in wake of the departure of Brian Daly. David Caporaletti, who previously spent four seasons as the director of on-campus recruiting, filled Condon's former post. Nicholas Colella then moved into the recruiting role and graduate managers Evann Baker and Kevin Hacke were added to the mix.

TWENTY SEASONS IN THE BJC

The 2015-16 campaign will be the 20th season in the Bryce Jordan Center. Since opening its doors to basketball Jan. 7, 1996, with a 79-50 win over Wisconsin, the BJC has hosted 316 Nittany Lion games with the team holding a winning percentage of 61.1 in those contests. Penn State has won at least 10 home games in four of the last five seasons.

120TH SEASON PENN STATE BASKETBALL

The Nittany Lions embark on the 120th season of basketball at Penn State and their 25th as a member of the Big Ten in 2015-16. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, who they will face for the fourth-consecutive season and the 102nd time overall. Penn State has made 13 postseason appearances in the last 27 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

SEASON OPENERS

Penn State has won its last 11 season openers dating to 2005, including all five under Patrick Chambers. The Lions are 89-30 overall in season openers and 79-10 in home season openers.

Penn State men's basketball coach Patrick Chambers inked the highest-rated recruiting class in program history, signing four standout players to NCAA Letters of Intent to play for the Nittany Lions on Nov. 11.

Nazeer Bostick, Tony Carr and Lamar Stevens, all products of Philadelphia's Roman Catholic and AAU Team Final, along with Oak Hill/DC Premier export Joe Hampton will join the Penn State squad for the 2016-17 season. The group is touted as the sixth-ranked class in the country according to ESPN at the start of the day, which also ranked three of the individuals among their Top 100 players.

"Today marks the culmination of three years of hard work and dedication by this coaching staff to building relationships with these players and their families," Chambers said. Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

- Has 3 of 11 siblings who graduated from Penn State.
- Spent 10 years as a highly-successful salesman and part owner of his family's printing business in Philadelphia.
- Was in collegiate coaching just five years before earning his first head coaching position at Boston University.
- Played in college for 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, also known as "The Shot Doctor."
- Helped lead Villanova to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2009 Final Four.
- Was instrumental in recruiting the No. 3 ranked recruiting class in the nation according to ESPN.com to Villanova in 2009.
- Has an older brother, Tim, who was the 1984 Ivy League Player of the Year in football and led Penn to three-straight Ivy League titles. He is now a writer, producer and director and released the film "Mighty Macs" about the Immaculata women's 1972 NCAA championship team.
- Has an older brother, Paul, who was a three-year starter at point guard for the Penn Quakers.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Helped out by double figure scoring from four Nittany Lions, Penn State men's basketball (2-0) took down DePaul (1-1) 68-62 Tuesday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. After picking up two fouls early, Brandon Taylor scored 19 of his 22 points in the second half and Penn State led DePaul whistle to whistle in the Gavitt Tipoff Series.

Shep Garner added 7 of his 16 points in the final two minutes to keep the Blue Demons at bay. Penn State jumped out to an early lead when Josh Reaves and Garner turned back-to-back steals into easy layups. The Nittany Lion guards combined to score the next eight points, giving Penn State its largest lead of the half 11-2.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State never trailed on the way to a 68-62 victory against DePaul Tuesday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. It was the first time since Nov. 28, 2014, that the Nittany Lions did not relinquish a lead.
- Four Nittany Lions fueled the offense with double-digit scoring, led by a 22-point performance from senior Brandon Taylor. Sophomore Shep Garner finished with 16 points, while junior Payton Banks and freshman Josh Reaves totaled 10 points each.
- With the win against DePaul, Penn State has won each of its last 12 regular-season non-conference games. The win also stretches the Penn State Bryce Jordan Center home winning streak to 13 in a row against non-league foes.
- Penn State shot a season-high 48 percent (10-21) from 3-point range in the win against DePaul, helped out by multiple treys from three different Nittany Lions. Taylor knocked down a team-high four triples, while Garner added three and Banks had two.
- Penn State limited the Blue Demons to a season-low 38 percent shooting from the field (20-53), after holding DePaul to 27 percent (7-26) in the first half. PSU also limited the Blue Demons to just 18 percent shooting from three-point range (2-11).
- Head coach Patrick Chambers earned his 100th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory against DePaul. Chambers has led the Nittany Lions to a 2-0 start for the third time in his PSU career and each of the last two seasons.
- The Nittany Lions earned their first program victory against DePaul, to move to 1-6 in the all-time series against the Blue Demons ...PSU also moves to 36-41 all-time against current teams in the Big East conference, having played its first Big East conference opponent since 2013.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Despite double figure scoring from five Nittany Lions, Penn State (2-2) fell short in an 86-54 decision to Radford (4-2) Tuesday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. There were four ties and 17 lead changes in the game. Jones and Anderson scored eight points apiece during a 22-9 run the Highlanders used to take control with 8:03 to play. Penn State chipped away and made it a two-possession game with 3:36 left but Davis hit his second 3-pointer with 3:17 remaining to put it out of reach. Julian Moore led a group of five Nittany Lion double digit scorers with a career-high 16 points. Brandon Taylor finished with 15 points, including a 2-for-3 mark from three point range. Shep Garner tallied 11 points to go along with a career-high eight assists.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Five Nittany Lions turned in double figure scoring performances, marking the first time Penn State has had five reach double figures in a non-conference outing since Dec. 22, 2013 against Mount St. Mary's. Penn State had at least five in double figures most recently in a Big Ten conference game at Indiana January 13, 2015 (6).
- The group of double digit scorers marks the ninth-consecutive game (dating back to last season) that at least two Nittany Lions have scored 10 or more points.
- Junior Julian Moore led the team with a career-high 16 points, while senior Brandon Taylor finished with 15 points, including a 2-for-3 mark from three-point range. Sophomore Shep Garner tallied 11 points, while senior Devin Foster and junior Payton Banks posted 10 points each.
- Sophomore Shep Garner dished out a career-high eight assists, marking the most for a Nittany Lion since Tim Frazier passed out eight against Minnesota at home January 8, 2014.
- Junior Payton Banks recorded a team-high eight rebounds, marking the third game he's led the Nittany Lions in the category. Senior Brandon Taylor finished second on the team with a season-high seven boards.
- Penn State scored a season-high 42 points in the paint, the most since producing 46 against Indiana last season on January 13, 2015.
- The Nittany Lions committed a season-low five turnovers, marking the first time the Nittany Lions have had five or fewer turnovers in a regular season game since playing Nebraska at home January 23, 2014.
- Penn State logged a season-high 47 percent shooting from the field, finishing 28-for-60 on the night.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Brandon Taylor scored 19 points, Payton Banks added nine and Penn State overcame an 8-point deficit over the final 5:30 to beat Bucknell 62-58 on Saturday. Banks was quiet in the second half but drilled a 3-pointer with 23 seconds to play. It broke a 58-58 tie and secured the win for Penn State (3-2). Chris Haas led Bucknell (3-3) with 18 points. Nine of them came over a 1:24 span that gave Bucknell its 8-point lead, the largest for either team, with 5:37 to play. But Haas missed what would've been the tying 3-pointer with 2.9 seconds left. Taylor came down with the rebound, drew a foul and made a free throw to seal it.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State closed the game on a 13-1 run to overcome an eight-point deficit at 5:30 and defeat Bucknell 62-58.
 - Payton Banks knocked a 3-pointer with 23 seconds to play to break a 58-58 tie. Brandon Taylor hit 1-of-2 free throws with :03 on clock to make it a two-possession game and secure the win.
 - Penn State finished with nine turnovers, the third time this season it has made single-digit miscues.
 - Bucknell shot 29.8 percent for the game, a season-low by a PSU opponent this season. The last opponent held below 30 percent shooting was Iowa in the Big Ten tournament last season (26.3%, 3/12/15).
 - The Bison came in to the game averaging 86.2 points per game and shooting 49.8 percent from field/37.9 percent from behind the arc. They were limited to 58 points, 29.8 percent shooting and 30.0 percent from 3-point range. The last time Bucknell was held under 60 points was Feb. 11, 2015 in a 52-51 win over Navy.
 - This was the 103rd meeting between Penn State and Bucknell, dating back to 1897. Bucknell is one of four opponents Penn State has faced over 100 times, trailing only Pittsburgh (147), West Virginia (119) and Syracuse (105).
 - The Nittany Lions hold a 78-25 advantage in the all-time series with the Bison, including wins in 14 of the last 15 meetings.
 - Brandon Taylor finished with 19 points and 11 rebounds for his second career double-double and a tie for his career high in boards. His previous double-double was vs. Drexel last season (12/20/14) with 14 points and 11 rebounds.
 - Jordan Dickerson had a career-high eight points vs. Bucknell, topping his previous high of 6 set four times.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Brandon Taylor scored 14 of his 27 points in the second half and Penn State beat Eastern Michigan 81-70 on Saturday. Taylor found his shot midway through the first half when he made his first of four 3-pointers to tie it 19-19. He drilled his second moments later to spark a 15-5 run the Nittany Lions (5-2) used to take a 34-24 halftime lead. Penn State led the entire second half and built a 23-point lead with 11:47 to play. Payton Banks added 17 points and Shep Garner finished with 16 for the Nittany Lions who won their third straight. James Thompson led Eastern Michigan with 18 points. Willie Mangum added 15 for the Eagles (5-3) who had a three-game winning streak snapped.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Led by three double figure scorers, Penn State downed Eastern Michigan, 81-70, in front of a season-high crowd of 10,303 fans at the Bryce Jordan Center. Penn State improves to 5-2 on the year, having won each of its last three games.
- Brandon Taylor led the way with his third career and second double-double in the last three games. He finished with a career-high 27 points for his second 20-point performance of the season, while also leading the team with a career-high 12 rebounds.
- Payton Banks tallied a career-high 17 points, while Shep Garner added 16 to mark the fifth time the Nittany Lions have had at least three post double figures in scoring this season.
- Penn State shot 43 percent from 3-point range, helped out by triples from four Nittany Lions. Penn State has totaled at least nine triples in each of the last two games.
- Penn State grabbed a season-high 49 rebounds, including 5-outbounding Eastern Michigan 49-32, including a 19-6 advantage on the offensive glass. The board total is the most since grabbing 50 on Dec. 29, 2012, vs. Duquesne.
- Ten of 11 Nittany Lions to see the court tallied at least two rebounds, with Julian Moore finishing second on the team with eight.
- The Nittany Lions out-scored the Eagles in the paint, putting up a 34-24 advantage.
- The Penn State bench totaled double digit points for the fourth consecutive outing, out-scoring the EMU bench, 16-12. On the year, the Nittany Lion bench is averaging 13.7 points per game.
- The Nittany Lions shot a season-high 74 percent (28-38) from the free throw line, helped out by perfect performance at the charity stripe from both Taylor (5-5) and Garner (8-8).
- Penn State's season-high attendance of 10,303 marks the largest Nittany Lion crowd for a non-conference matchup since PSU drew 11,237 to the Bryce Jordan Center against Virginia Tech Dec. 12, 2009.

WASHINGTON (AP) - Shep Garner led Penn State (5-3) with 22 points as the Nittany Lions fell to George Washington 76-66 Tuesday night. Penn State could get no closer than 71-62 in the second half on 3-pointer by Brandon Taylor with 4:09 remaining. The Colonials (8-1) led by 18 after two Joe McDonald free throws made it 56-38 early in the second half. After trading lead changes over the first six minutes, George Washington took the lead for good at 13-12 on Alex Mitola's 3-pointer with 13:24 left. George Washington hit on 7 of 14 first-half 3-pointers in taking a 40-33 advantage into halftime.

POSTGAME NOTES

- After trailing by as many as 18, Penn State trimmed the deficit to single digits but could not complete the comeback, falling to George Washington 76-66 on the road at the Smith Center.
- Three Nittany Lions finished with double figure scoring, marking the sixth time this season Penn State has had at least three in double digits.
- Shep Garner led the group of double digit performers with his second 20-point game of the season, recording a game-high 22 points. Brandon Taylor tallied 15 points, while Payton Banks added 10.
- Five Nittany Lions knocked down at least one 3-pointer against George Washington, led by three from Garner. Penn State sunk five triples in the first half alone, marking the fifth straight game Penn State has put up at least four treys in the first half.
- The Nittany Lions held GW leading scorer Patricio Garino to just two points, including a 1-for-5 showing from the field and an 0-for-2 mark from 3-point range.
- All 10 Nittany Lions to see the court grabbed at least one rebound as Penn State out-rebounded George Washington 37-34. Taylor and Garner led the way with six boards each, while Banks chipped in five.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Brandon Taylor scored 16 points and Penn State beat Louisiana-Monroe 54-50 on Saturday. Taylor sparked Penn State's comeback when he made a second-chance layup with 11:10 to play. It started a 22-13 run the Nittany Lions (7-3) used to take the lead for good after their 25-24 halftime advantage disappeared quickly. Travis Munnings led Louisiana-Monroe (4-4) with 22 points and 10 rebounds. Jamaal Samuel added 11 for the Warhawks, who took a six-point lead with 16:13 to play despite missing top scorer Majok Deng, who sat out with a lower leg injury. Taylor made two free throws and Donovan Jack added another in the final minute to seal the win. Jordan Dickerson had seven blocks for Penn State, who outscored the Warhawks 30-20 in the paint and 16-4 in points off of turnovers.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Led by double figure scoring from Brandon Taylor and Payton Banks, Penn State pushed past Louisiana-Monroe, 54-50, to close out its two-game Return to Rec series. With the victory, Penn State improves to 516-184 all-time when playing at Rec Hall and 2-1 since moving to the Bryce Jordan Center in 1996.
- Taylor posted 16 points, while also leading the team in rebounds (7) and assists (3). Payton Banks tallied 10 points, while also adding four rebounds and two assists.
- Penn State held Louisiana-Monroe well below its season scoring average, as the Warhawks totaled 50 points, having entered the game averaging 70.7 on the year.

- The Nittany Lions out-scored Louisiana-Monroe in the paint, 30-20, marking the second consecutive game Penn State has scored at least 30 points in the paint.

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Payton Banks scored 20 points and keyed a second-half rally as Penn State overcame a 17-point deficit to beat Drexel 63-57 Saturday night at the Palestra. Brandon Taylor and Shep Garner added 11 points apiece for the Nittany Lions (8-3), who have won three straight and six of their last seven. Terrell Allen scored 18 points and Tavon Allen had 16 for Drexel (1-8), which shot just 23.1 percent from the field in the second half. Penn State took its first lead of the game with five minutes remaining on Taylor's spinning drive. Moments later, Garner hit a transition layup and Banks followed with a 3-point play with 4:06 left to cap a 15-3 run and put the Nittany Lions ahead 53-47. Banks scored the next six points for his team, including an acrobatic drive with 50 seconds left, to help the Nittany Lions close it out.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State rallied from down by as many as 17 points to top Drexel 63-57 on the road at the Palestra Saturday evening. The comeback victory marks the largest comeback for the Nittany Lions in at least 15 years.
- Payton Banks, Brandon Taylor and Shep Garner all reached double figures in scoring, powered by a career-high 20 points from Banks. Taylor and Garner finished tied for second with 11 points each.
- After trailing by as many as 17 in the first half, Penn State cut the deficit back to seven, 34-27, at halftime, holding the Dragons without a field goal for the final 5:53 of the frame while going on a 12-0 run. The Nittany Lions took their first lead of the game, following a layup from Taylor with 5:07 remaining in the second half and did not relinquish the advantage.
- The Nittany Lions held Drexel to its second-lowest scoring clip of the season, as the Dragons finished 30.2 percent from the field. Drexel shot just 23.1 percent (6-26) in the second half.
- Seven of Penn State's eight wins this season have come when holding opponents below 40% shooting. The Nittany Lions improve to 43-15 under head coach Patrick Chambers when keeping opponents to a sub-40% FG percentage and a 7-0 this year.
- Penn State was helped out by 19 points from the bench, marking the ninth outing of the season the Nittany Lion bench has contributed at least 12 points. The Drexel bench produced five points, making Penn State 6-0 on the year with the higher-scoring reserves.
- The Nittany Lions out-scored Drexel 32-14 in total points in the paint. They now average 29.8 point points per game.
- PSU also led 40-32 on the boards, led by seven rebounds from Josh Reaves. Penn State moved to 5-1 on the year when out-rebounding its opponent. In the last five games, the Nittany Lions are averaging 39.4 rebounds per game.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Payton Banks scored 24 points and Penn State beat Minnesota 86-77. The Nittany Lions (10-6, 1-2 Big Ten) used a 23-6 run to earn their earliest Big Ten win since 2012 and spoiled a hot-shooting night for the Golden Gophers (6-9, 0-3 Big Ten), who made 11 3-pointers and led for most of the game. Shep Garner finished with 20 points and Brandon Taylor added 18 for Penn State. Garner drained a go-ahead 3-pointer to spark Penn State's late run after the Nittany Lions trailed for 28:10. Banks added five points during the run and was 3 of 3 from the free-throw line to close. The Gophers built a 36-32 halftime lead and made 7 of 12 3-pointers in the first half. Mason scored 11 points in the first while Banks added 13 to keep Penn State within reach.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Trailing by as many as eight in the second half, 71-63, Penn State rallied and closed out the game on a 23-6 run, holding Minnesota scoreless for 5:10 during the stretch to secure the win.
- Penn State's 86 points in the win against the Golden Gophers mark the highest single game total for the Nittany Lions in a Big Ten conference game since scoring 87 vs. Ohio State March 3, 2001.
- The Nittany Lion victory marks Penn State's earliest conference win since the 2011-12 season when it defeated Purdue in its third Big Ten game of the season, 65-45, in the BJC January 5, 2012.
- Payton Banks and Shep Garner led a group of three double-digit scorers, posting 24 and 20 points, respectively. It was the first time two Nittany Lion players had 20-plus points since Tim Frazier and D.J. Newbill each tallied 24 against Princeton Dec. 14, 2013.
- As a team, Penn State shot 51 percent from the field (28-55), marking the first time the Nittany Lions have shot above 50 percent in a conference game by shooting 50.9 percent against Rutgers January 24, 2015.
- The Nittany Lions shot 61.5 percent in the second half, its highest second-half field goal percentage in a Big Ten game since converting on 66.7 percent of its shots (18-27) vs. Ohio State March 1, 2011.
- Penn State outscored the Golden Gophers 34-14 in the paint. The Nittany Lions have scored at least 30 points in the paint in each of the last nine games. On the year, Penn State is averaging 30.7 points per game in the paint.
- The Nittany Lions also recorded a season-high eight steals, led by three from Banks and two from Josh Reaves. Penn State has recorded at least five steals in all three Big Ten conference outings.
- Penn State also celebrated its 20th anniversary in the Bryce Jordan Center this evening. The Nittany Lions captured a 76-61 win against Minnesota in the first Nittany Lion basketball game in the BJC January 11, 1996.

- Eight of nine Nittany Lions to see the court grabbed at least one rebound, led by a career-high 10 boards from Julian Moore. Banks finished second on the team with six, while Taylor added four.
- Penn State shot 40 percent (6-15) from 3-point range for the second consecutive outing, helped out by multiple treys from Banks and Foster. Banks and Foster both matched career-high marks knocking down three and two triples, respectively. Five of the Lions' six 3-pointers came in the final 6:20 of the game.
- Penn State returns to the road next week, traveling to Ohio State to square off against the Buckeyes Monday, Jan. 25 at 7 p.m. on Big Ten Network.
- Ten of the last 11 meetings against Wisconsin have been decided by 10 or fewer points.
- Penn State moves to 10-34 in the all-time series against the Badgers and 8-17 when playing at home in the Bryce Jordan Center.

NEW YORK (AP) - Zak Irvin scored 20 points and Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman added 15 as Michigan swept the season series from Penn State with a 79-72 victory at Madison Square Garden on Saturday. The game was part of the inaugural Big Ten Super Saturday Hoops & Hockey Doubleheader in the World's Most Famous Arena. Derrick Walton Jr. had 13 points, 10 rebounds and seven assists for the Wolverines (17-5, 7-2 Big Ten), who won for the fifth time in six games. The Wolverines led throughout the game and looked to be putting it away until Penn State managed one last drive to keep it close. Brandon Taylor had 24 points and 10 rebounds for the Nittany Lions (11-11, 2-7), who have lost five of six.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State men's basketball's late rally fell short as Michigan defeated the Nittany Lions, 79-72, in the first game of the 2016 Super Saturday College Hoops and Hockey doubleheader at Madison Square Garden.
- Shep Garner and Brandon Taylor led the team with a pair of 20-point performances, while Payton Banks added 11 points. The trio of double figure scorers marks the 14th game this season that at least three Nittany Lions have reached double digits in scoring.
- Taylor also dominated on the boards, grabbing a team-high 10 rebounds for his fourth double-double of the year and second in a Big Ten conference game.
- Penn State trailed by as many as 17 in the second half before using a 29-18 stretch featuring three triples from Shep Garner to trim the gap to six, 78-72, with 12 seconds remaining.
- The Nittany Lions and the Wolverines scored an even 34 points in the paint apiece. Penn State has produced at least 30 points in the paint in four Big Ten conference games this season, including each of the last two outings.
- Penn State limited Michigan's Duncan Robinson to just two triples and a 2-6 mark from 3-point range. Robinson entered the afternoon ranked third nationally, shooting 51% from behind the arc.
- The Nittany Lions move to 8-4 on the year in games separated by nine or fewer points, as this afternoon's outing marks Penn State's third Big Ten game decided by less than nine points.
- The matchup against Michigan marked Penn State's 12th game of the year away from University Park. After the Iowa trip next week, the Nittany Lions will have played seven of their 10 league games away from home, including back-to-back road or neutral games four times in that stretch.
- Making its 17th appearance in the current Madison Square Garden, Penn State moved to 10-7 all-time in games played in the historic building.

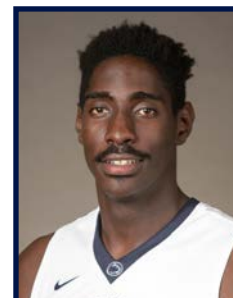
