28 - Drew Astorino, Saf

A starter in a team-high 40 career games, co-captain Drew Astorino started every game during the 2011 season at Hero (strong safety). An honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection, he ranked second on the team in total tackles (86), including 5.0 tackles for loss. His 257 career tackles rank 10th on Penn State's all-time list. The senior recorded five career interceptions, 7.0 TFL, and two fumble recoveries as a Nittany Lion. Astorino's achievements resulted in an invitation to the 2012 Casino Del Sol All-Star Game. He grabbed one interception and was second on the squad with six pass break-ups. Astorino graduated in August, 2011 and garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors. He earned the team's Ridge Riley Award, presented to a senior for "sportsmanship, scholarship, leadership and friendship." Astorino finished the regular season by setting a career-high with 12 tackles (10 solos) at No. 12 Wisconsin. In the season opening 41-3 win over Indiana State, Astorino had two pass break-ups and recorded his fifth career interception in the first quarter, returning it 33 yards. Versus No. 2 Alabama, he made four tackles (two solos). In the road win over Temple, Astorino helped the defense limit the Owls to just 123 passing yards, recording five tackles and breaking up one pass. Astorino registered five tackles, including one for a loss, in the 34-6 win over Eastern Michigan. In the Big Ten opener at Indiana, Astorino made five tackles, including one for a loss of two yards, and had one pass break-up. Astorino helped lead a dominating defensive performance in the 13-3 win over Iowa, helping to hold the Hawkeyes to their fewest points in a Big Ten game since 2000. He made a then-career-high 11 tackles, including a team-best six solos. Astorino tied for the team lead with eight tackles in the 23-18 Homecoming win over Purdue, helping to hold the Boilermakers 14 points below their season average. In the road victory over Northwestern, Astorino registered three tackles and one pass break-up, factoring heavily in a defensive effort that held the Wildcats scoreless in the second half. In the win over Illinois, Astorino had seven tackles, including two for a total loss (minus-8), as part of a defensive effort that limited the Illini to just 94 yards passing and held them 21 points below their season average. On Senior Day vs. Nebraska, Astorino recorded eight tackles, including a team-high seven solos, as Penn State limited the Cornhuskers to just 143 yards passing. In the 20-14 win at Ohio State, Astorino led all defensive backs and tied for second on the team with eight tackles (5 solos). Astorino's nine tackles in the TicketCity Bowl against Houston was second-highest on the team.

67 - Quinn Barham, DT

Co-captain Quinn Barham started all 26 games the past two seasons and earned 2011 honorable-mention All-Big Ten notice. Barham played in the 2012 Casino Del Sol All-Star Game. He was instrumental in the Nittany Lions leading the Big Ten in fewest sacks allowed (14), with neither

Ohio State or Wisconsin recording a sack in the last two games. Barham has played a vital role in helping clear paths for tailback Silas Redd (1,241 yards), giving Penn State a 1,000-yard rusher for the seventh consecutive season. He and the offensive line lifted Penn State to an improvement of 41 rushing yards per game in Big Ten games (178.1 ypg) compared to the initial four non-conference tilts (137.0 ypg). Barham was co-recipient of the Richard Maginnis Memorial Award, presented to the team's top offensive lineman. He graduated last May and earned Academic All-Big Ten honors. In the 20-14 win at Ohio State, the Nittany Lions had their most productive rushing attack of the season, gaining 239 yards, averaging a season-best 6.1 yards on 39 attempts. Penn State delivered three of its four longest runs of the season vs. the Buckeyes, by three players: Silas Redd (42 yards), Stephfon Green (39-yard TD run) and Curtis Drake (38 yards). In the 13-3 win over Iowa, Barham helped pave the way as Penn State rushed for 231 yards, including a then-career-high 142 from Silas Redd. One a pivotal fourth quarter drive, Penn State ran the ball 10 times, gaining four first downs, to set-up the Lions' lone touchdown vs. the Hawkeyes. In the season opening victory over Indiana State, Barham was part of an offensive line that paved the way for 245 yards on the ground. Against No. 2 Alabama, the offense totaled 16 first downs and 251 yards and did not allow a sack against one of the nation's top defenses. In the win over Eastern Michigan, Barham helped the offense amass a season-high 468 total yards, including 364 through the air, and was part of an offensive line effort that did not allow a sack. Barham was on the front line as Penn State compiled 464 yards of offense (193 rushing, 271 passing) and ran a season-high 86 plays in the win at Indiana. In his eighth straight start at left tackle, Barham was a key part of one of Penn State's top offensive performances of the season in its 34-24 road win over Northwestern. The Nittany Lions rolled up 386 yards of total offense, including a career-high 164 yards rushing from Silas Redd. In the 10-7 home win over Illinois, Barham helped clear paths for Redd, as he eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth straight game (30-137) and eclipsed the 1,000-yard barrier for the season. Barham and the Penn State offense amassed 375 yards of offense on Senior Day against Nebraska.

81 - Jack Crawford, DE

Senior defensive end Jack Crawford recorded 40 tackles and a team-high 6.5 sacks (minus-39) during the 2011 season, serving as a leader on a strong defense that ranked in the top 10 nationally in several statistical categories. His strong efforts landed him invitations to both the 2012 Senior Bowl and 2012 NFL Combine. He was tied for sixth in the Big Ten with his 6.5 sacks and was tied for third on the team with six pass break-ups. Crawford accumulated a total of 14.0 sacks during his career at Penn State to go along with 89 career tackles, 26.5 TFL, and three fumble recoveries. He totaled 7.5 TFL and one fumble recovery this season. Crawford was selected second-team All-Big Ten and earned a State College Quarterback Club Special Award as the team's senior banquet. Crawford made 34 career starts, including every game this season, the fourth-highest total on the team. In the season opener against Indiana State, Crawford earned a key third down sack with the help from Jordan Hill to force a punt. He assisted in four tackles in the clash with Alabama. Crawford had a productive game against Eastern Michigan, where he recorded a sack and a fumble recovery. In the matchup with Iowa, Crawford and the defensive line had a stout effort, as they applied pressure to quarterback James Vandenberg all game. Iowa came into the game averaging 37.8 ppg and was held to three points. Crawford earned two tackles and two pass breakups in the victory. Crawford had a strong defensive game as he made seven stops against Northwestern and recorded one sack. He also made four stops against Illinois. In a close 17-14 loss to Nebraska, he made five tackles and recorded one sack in a sound defensive effort, as the Nittany Lions held the Cornhuskers to half its season average of 34.7 ppg. He came up big making six tackles and two sacks in a key 20-14 victory over Ohio State. The two sacks were a single game career-high for Crawford. His sack in the third quarter against Wisconsin gave him a team-high 6.5 sacks for the season.

21 - Stephfon Green, TB

Running back Stephfon Green became the 38th Nittany Lion to surpass 1,000 career rushing yards during the 2010 season. Green ended his collegiate career with 1,351 rushing yards and 14 touchdowns, to rank 27th on Penn State's all-time rushing list. During his senior season, Green played in eight games, rushing for 266 yards and six touchdowns. His achievements on the field this season led him to an invitation to the 2012 Casino Del Sol All-Star Game. Green rushed for 39 yards on nine carries and a touchdown in a 34-24 victory over Northwestern. He led the team in rushing in a 17-14 loss to Nebraska with 17 carries for 71 yards and two touchdowns. In a crucial conference game against Ohio State, Green again led the team in rushing with 94 yards on 16 attempts and two scores in the victory. In his final game as a Nittany Lion in the TicketCity Bowl, Green led the rushing attack with 65 yards on 15 rushes and one touchdown. During his time at Penn State, Green has also was productive as a kickoff return specialist.

8 - D'Anton Lynn, CB

Three-year starting cornerback D'Anton Lynn again was a significant force all over the field for the Nittany Lions in 2011. He played in the 2012 Senior Bowl as a member of the North squad and showcased his talents at the 2012 NFL Combine. Lynn made his 37th career start, second-highest on the team, in the TicketCity Bowl near his hometown of Celina, Texas. He finished his career by making four tackles (three solo) and breaking up two passes vs. Houston. Lynn was eighth on the team with 49 tackles (32 solo) and tied for the team lead with eight pass break-ups. He was tied for No. 7 in the Big Ten in passes defended. Lynn recorded 162 career tackles, seven TFL, and four interceptions with the Nittany Lions. A three-time honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection, Lynn made a crucial interception in the win over Illinois and added two tackles. Lynn missed two games due to a neck injury suffered against Eastern Michigan in the final non-conference game, but returned to post seven stops in the win over Purdue. He made a season-high nine tackles in the win at Northwestern. Lynn collected six tackles and two pass break-ups on Senior Day versus Nebraska. Against Ohio State, Lynn recorded five tackles, including one TFL. Lynn finished the regular season with five tackles against Wisconsin in the battle for the Big Ten Leaders Division title.

6 - Derek Moyer, WR

Derek Moyer finished his outstanding career by ranking in the top five on Penn State's career receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns. He made 35 career starts, the third-highest total on the team and was invited to showcase his skills at the 2012 NFL Combine. He also played for the North squad in the 2012 Players All-Star Classic in January. Moyer graduated in December 2011 and received a Special Award from the State College Quarterback Club. Moyer ranks fifth all-time on Penn State's career reception chart with 144 and is tied for fifth all-time at Penn State in career 100-yard receiving games with six. Moyer ranks third on both the program's career receiving touchdowns list (18) and in career receiving yards (2,395) and is among only six Nittany Lions all-time with at least 2,000 career yards. Moyer opened the season by catching four balls for 57 yards in the win over Indiana State. Versus No. 3 Alabama, Moyer had three receptions for 51 yards. At Temple, Moyer made a

career-high seven catches for 112 yards; his fifth career 100-yard receiving game. In the fourth quarter, he made a clutch 11-yard catch on fourth-and-two to keep the game winning drive alive. Moyer also returned two punts for 39 yards, including a career-high 31-yard effort, to accumulate a career-high 161 all-purpose yards. In the 34-6 win over Eastern Michigan, Moyer caught six passes for 65 yards and had two touchdowns, hauling in scoring tosses of five and 20 yards. In the win at Indiana, Moyer posted a career-high 158 receiving yards on six catches, including a 74-yard touchdown reception from Matt McGloin in the third quarter. His yardage total was PSU's highest since Deon Butler's school record 216 versus Northwestern in 2006. Moyer caught two passes for 42 yards in the 13-3 win over Iowa. Moyer suffered a foot injury in the week leading up to the Purdue game and missed the match-up with the Boilermakers and the following week's road contest with Northwestern. Moyer made his return to the field in the second half against Illinois, catching two clutch passes for 29 yards late in the game, helping Penn State come from behind for the win. On Senior Day versus Nebraska, Moyer led Penn State in receptions (4) and receiving yards (78). Moyer led all PSU receivers with three receptions for 40 yards in the road victory over Ohio State. Moyer led the team in receptions in 8 of the 11 games he played in during the 2011 season.

52 - Chima Okoli, T

Chima Okoli was a significant contributor to the Penn State offensive line, starting 21 games the past two seasons, including all 13 in 2011. He was instrumental in the Nittany Lions leading the Big Ten in fewest sacks allowed (14), with neither Ohio State or Wisconsin recording a sack in the last two regular season games. Okoli played a vital role in helping clear paths for tailback Silas Redd (1,241 yards), giving Penn State a 1,000-yard rusher for the seventh consecutive season. He and the offensive line lifted Penn State to an improvement of 41 rushing yards per game in Big Ten games (178.1 ypg) compared to the initial four non-conference tilts (137.0 ypg). 2 - Chaz Powell, CB

Senior Chaz Powell was an important contributor on offense, defense and special teams throughout his career as a Nittany Lion. Powell earned an invitation to the 2012 NFL Combine and was selected the 2011 John Bruno, Jr. Memorial Award recipient as the squad's top special teams performer. Powell etched his name in the Penn State records book, setting school season and career marks for kickoff returns (27 and 73) as well as season and career kickoff return yardage (733 and 1,886 yds). He averaged 25.6 yards per kickoff return in his career with two touchdowns. The honorable-mention All-Big Ten honoree started 10 games at cornerback in 2011 and collected 41 stops (29 solo), including 2.5 TFL. Powell was tied for second on the team with two interceptions this past season and broke school marks with 27 kickoffs for 733 yards, including a 95-yard touchdown return. He finished his Penn State career with 54 tackles and two interceptions on the defensive side of the ball. On the offensive side, Powell grabbed 30 career receptions for 403 yards and three scores. He opened his senior season with a 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on the season opening kickoff against Indiana State and added one solo tackle. Against No. 3 Alabama, Powell collected a career-high five tackles (four solo). He matched his career-high with five stops, including four solo tackles, in the win at Temple. Powell added his first career interception early in the fourth quarter and returned it 26 yards vs. the Owls. He started at left cornerback against Indiana and collected five solo stops and one interception. In the win over Iowa, he started at cornerback and accumulated four tackles (one solo). Against Purdue, he returned a fourth-quarter kickoff 92 yards to help set up Penn State's final score. Powell also started at cornerback and recorded one pass breakup. Against Northwestern, he returned four kickoffs for 114 yards and made four stops (two solo), including 0.5 for a loss. Powell recorded three solo tackles, including one stop for a loss, and returned one kickoff for 28 yards against Illinois. Against Nebraska, Powell returned three kickoffs for 61 yards and registered three tackles (one solo). At Wisconsin, Powell matched a career-high with five stops (four solo) and collected one tackle for loss. He returned three kickoffs for a game-high 87 yards. In the TicketCity Bowl, Powell recorded five tackles to again tie his career-high and had one pass break-up.

71 - Devon Still, DT

Dominating defensive tackle Devon Still was selected Penn State's 96th first-team All-American, earning a spot on 10 All-America teams in

2011. He was selected a first-team All-American by: Associated Press, Walter Camp Football Foundation, Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), Sporting News, ESPN.com, CBSsports.com, SI.com, Yahoo! Sports, FoxSportsNext.com and Pro Football Weekly. His accolades continued with invitations to the 2012 Senior Bowl and NFL Combine. A starter in 25 games the past two seasons, senior co-captain Still was the Nittany Lions' 22nd first team All-American since starting Big Ten Conference competition in 1993 (26 total selections). Also among Still's abundant list of accolades was his selection as the 2011 Big Ten Nagurski-Woodson Defensive Player of the Year and Smith- Brown Defensive Lineman of the Year. Still is the fifth Nittany Lion to be selected Big Ten Defensive Player of Year since 1998. Still and former teammate Jared Odrick (2009) are the only defensive tackles who have earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year since 1994. Still joined an elite group of former Nittany Lions, all of whom were first-team All-Americans, to earn Big Ten Defensive Player of Year: linebacker LaVar Arrington (1998), defensive end Courtney Brown (1999), defensive end Michael Haynes (2002) and defensive tackle Jared Odrick (2009). Still suffered turf toe just days before Penn State met Houston in the TicketCity Bowl which limited his productivity. Still was named Penn State's Most Outstanding Senior player, becoming just the third defensive lineman to earn the award since its inception in 1978. He graduated in December. Still recorded 113 tackles, 10.5 sacks, 32.5 TFL and one forced fumble throughout his Nittany Lion career. For the season, Still was second in the Big Ten in solo tackles for loss (15.0) and tied for fifth in overall TFL (17.0-minus 77), leading a Penn State defense that ranked in the Top 10 nationally in scoring, total, pass and pass efficiency defense. Still was among the conference leaders with 4.5 sacks (minus-36) and recorded 55 tackles, with one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and a pass break-up. The 6-5, 310-pound Still anchored a Penn State defense that held nine opponents to 18 points or less this season, as well as seven opponents to less than 100 rushing yards.

34 - Nate Stupar, LB

Linebacker Nate Stupar was one of seven Nittany Lion's that received invitations to the 2012 NFL Combine. Stupar received a Special Award from the State College Quarterback Club at the team's senior banquet. He was also selected one of the final 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Stupar graduated in May, 2011 and earned Academic All-Big Ten honors this past fall. Stupar stepped up when Michael Mauti was lost for the season and started the final nine games of the campaign. Stupar recorded 205 career tackles, 14.5 TFL, five sacks, and four interceptions as a member of Linebacker U. He appeared in all 13 games for the Lions this past year, making 80 total tackles and 5.5 TFL. He ranked third on the team in total tackles. He assisted in making three stops against Indiana State. Stupar led the team against Eastern Michigan with seven takedowns and recorded a sack and a team-high three TFL. Stupar made a tackle and recovered a fumble in the 13-3 victory over Iowa. In the matchup with Purdue, Stupar had one of his best games of the season, recording seven tackles and picking off a career-best two Purdue passes. He made nine tackles and recovered a fumble in the win over Illinois. Stupar made a career-high 13 tackles against Nebraska and became the fourth different Penn State linebacker with double figure tackles in a game during the 2011 season. The Nittany Lions held Nebraska to half its season average of 34.7 ppg entering game and to 331 yards, nearly 80 yards below its season average (412.2). Stupar made five stops against Wisconsin. In his final game in blue and white at the TicketCity Bowl, Stupar led the defense with 12 tackles (7 solo).

37 - Joe Suhey, RB

Fullback Joe Suhey was a tenacious blocker out of the backfield and a productive threat in the passing and running games. This past season, Suhey created holes for tailbacks Silas Redd and Stephfon Green, with Redd rushing for 1,241 yards, the 10th-highest total in Penn State season history. Suhey finished the season with 51 rushing yards on 14 carries and one touchdown from the fullback position. He also caught 12 passes for 101 yards and a score. He finished his Penn State career with 477 receiving yards with three touchdowns and 160 rushing yards and one score. Suhey started 18 games with the Nittany Lions, including nine this past season. He graduated in May, 2011 and earned Academic All-Big Ten honors last fall. In the season opening win over Indiana State, Suhey rushed for a career-high 29 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown, plunging into the end zone from one yard out in the third quarter. In the victory over Eastern Michigan, Suhey caught two passes for 32 yards, including a 27-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter. He ran for seven yards on two carries in the 16-10 win over Indiana in the Big Ten opener. Suhey tied for the team lead in receptions with three, totaling 33 yards, in the home win over Iowa. He carried the ball once for three yards and caught a nine-yard pass in the 23-18 win over Purdue. Suhey started at fullback in the road win over Northwestern, helping to pave the way for Silas Redd as he rushed for a career-high 164 yards. Suhey did not play versus Illinois due to injury. Suhey rushed once for one yard and caught one pass for three yards in the win over Ohio State.

1 - Nick Sukay, Saf

Free safety Nick Sukay finished his Nittany Lion career with an outstanding senior season. The safety tallied 59 tackles, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and three interceptions this past season. Sukay was named ESPN.com first-team All-Big Ten and earned second-team all-conference honors from the media and coaches. Sukay tied for the Big Ten lead with 11 passes defended, having grabbed three interceptions, with eight pass break-ups. He received a Quarterback Club Special Award at the senior banquet and participated in the 2012 East-West Shrine Game. Sukay graduated in May 2011 and earned Academic All-Big Ten honors last fall. He recorded 136 career tackles, eight interceptions, four fumble recoveries, and two forced fumbles as a Nittany Lion. He made 32 career starts for the Nittany Lions, including every game this past season, which tied for fifth-highest total on the team. The senior recorded six total tackles in the second week against Alabama. Sukay recovered his third career fumble recovery and tallied five total tackles in the win against Temple. He grabbed his first interception of the season and the sixth of his career in the second quarter versus Eastern Michigan while also recording six tackles in the win. Against Indiana, Sukay recorded five tackles and one pass break-up. He intercepted his second pass of the season in a victory over Iowa to go along with four tackles. The following week versus Purdue, Sukay intercepted yet another pass, his third of the season. He also made seven stops in the win over the Boilermakers. At Northwestern, he recorded seven tackles and one pass break-up. His forced fumble and three tackles helped the Nittany Lions survive a defensive battle against Illinois. After being recognized for Senior Day against Nebraska, Sukay notched six tackles and one pass break-up in the hard-fought loss. At Ohio State, the safety recorded a fumble recovery, two pass break-ups, and two tackles in the win. Sukay recorded eight tackles in the regular season finale at Wisconsin. In his final game at Penn State, Sukay registered seven tackles and one pass break-up in the TicketCity Bowl versus Houston.

74 - Johnnie Troutman, G

Senior Johnnie Troutman started every game at left guard in 2011 and was tied for fifth on the team with 32 career starts. His performance this past season resulted in invitations to the 2012 Senior Bowl and 2012 NFL Combine. Troutman was instrumental in the Nittany Lions leading the Big Ten in fewest sacks allowed (14), with neither Ohio State or Wisconsin recording a sack in the last two regular season games. Troutman played a vital role in helping clear paths for tailback Silas Redd (1,241 yards), giving Penn State a 1,000-yard rusher for the seventh consecutive season. Redd's rushing total ranks No. 10 in Penn State season records book. Troutman and the offensive line lifted Penn State to an improvement of 41 rushing yards per game in Big Ten games (178.1 ypg) compared to the initial four non-conference tilts (137.0 ypg). Troutman was selected an honorable-mention All-Big Ten member and shared the Richard Maginnis Memorial Award, presented to the outstanding offensive lineman, at the team's senior banquet. He also was selected the Brooks-Irvine Football Club New Jersey Division I College Player of the Year. In the 20-14 win at Ohio State, the Nittany Lions had their most productive rushing attack of the season, gaining 239 yards, averaging a season-best 6.1 yards on 39 attempts. Penn State delivered three of its four longest runs of the season vs. the Buckeyes, by three players: Silas Redd (42 yards), Stephfon Green (39-yard TD run) and Curtis Drake (38 yards). In the 13-3 win over Iowa, Troutman helped pave the way as Penn State rushed for 231 yards, including a then-career-high 142 from Silas Redd. One a pivotal fourth quarter drive, Penn State ran the ball 10 times, gaining four first downs, to set-up the Lions' lone touchdown vs. the Hawkeyes. In the season opening victory over Indiana State, Troutman was part of an offensive line that paved the way for 245 yards on the ground. Against No. 2 Alabama, the offense totaled 16 first downs and 251 yards and did not allow a sack against one of the nation's top defenses. In the win over Eastern Michigan, Troutman helped the offense amass a season-high 468 total yards, including 364 through the air, and was part of an offensive line effort that did not allow a sack. Troutman was on the front line as Penn State compiled 464 yards of offense (193 rushing, 271 passing) and ran a season-high 86 plays in the win at Indiana. Troutman was a key part of one of Penn State's top offensive performances of the season in its 34-24 road win over Northwestern. The Nittany Lions rolled up 386 yards of total offense, including a career-high 164 yards rushing from Silas Redd. In the win over Illinois, Troutman helped clear paths for Redd, as he eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth straight game (30-137) and over the 1,000-yard barrier for the season. Troutman and the Nittany Lions amassed 375 yards of offense on Senior Day against Nebraska.
