NEXT UP: Penn State will open its 117th season of men's basketball on Friday, Nov. 9 vs. Saint Francis. It will be the first meeting between the schools since 2007. Penn State owns an 8-2 lead in the series and has won the last four meetings. Saint Francis' last win came in overtime, 68-63, in 1978 in State College. Penn State has won its last seven season openers, dating to 2005, and is 86-30 overall in season openers and 76-10 in home season openers.

STORYLINES:

- Preseason All-Big Ten pick Tim Frazier is Big Ten's top returner in scoring and assists, lone first-team All-Big Ten returner.

117 YEARS OF HOOPS: Penn State will embark on its 117th season of playing basketball in the 2012-13 campaign, having begun play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule this year for the first time since 2006. Penn State has made 12 post-season appearances in the last 24 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT) and a total of 19 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT) overall. Since 2009, Penn State has won the program's first national tournament title (2009 NIT), made the program's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament Championship game (2011) and played in the NCAA Tournament (2011).

THE GAME: Penn State will see its first action of the season with an exhibition contest vs. coach Patrick Chambers' alma mater, Philadelphia University. Chambers graduated from the University in 1994 with a degree in marketing and a minor in finance. He played four seasons at the NCAA Division II university, starting as a walk-on in 1990 before becoming the team's starting point-guard and earning first-team All-ECAC honors. Chambers left as the school's all-time career assists record holder (709) and helped lead the Rams to four NCAA Division II Sweet 16 appearances and two Elite Eight appearances. Chambers played for current Philadelphia head coach Herb Magee, at what was then Philadelphia Textil. Magee is in his 46th season leading the Rams. The all-time winningest coach in NCAA history with 941 victories, Magee was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2011. Penn State and Philadelphia have met four times previously on the basketball court with Penn State holding a 4-0 series lead. The teams last met in 1984 with the Lions taking a 92-77 victory.

EXHIBITION ACTION: Penn State posted a 64-47 victory in exhibition action last year vs. Slippery Rock. Tim Frazier led the way with 19 points, while Billy Oliver had 16. Sasa Borovnjak (6), Nick Colella (4) and Ross Travis (4) were the only other returners other than Frazier that scored in that game.

FRAZIER PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN: Senior guard Tim Frazier was named to the Pre-season All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was joined on the preseason team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was also named the preseason Player of the Year.

FRAZIER SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE: Tim Frazier was one of 30 Division I men's basketball players selected as candidates for the 2012-13 Senior CLASS Award presented to a senior student-athlete with notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. The award will be trimmed to 10 finalists midway through the season with the winner announced at the 2013 NCAA Final Four in Atlanta.

LIONS TO HONOR MAGEE: Penn State's coaching and support staff will all wear sweats for Saturday's exhibition game in homage to legendary Philadelphia U coach Herb Magee and his preferred mode of dress for games.

OUTLET PASSES PLAYERS

■ **TIM FRAZIER** was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. He was joined on the team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was selected the preseason Big Ten Player of the Year. Frazier was named a first-team All-Big Ten selection last year, the sixth Lion to earn first-team selection, after leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4).

■ **TIM FRAZIER** stands 7th on the Penn State career assist charts (444) after posting a Penn State record 198 last year and will enter the season 157 assists shy of breaking the all-time career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992.

■ **TIM FRAZIER** scored 208 field goals and had 198 assists to lead the nation being involved in 58.4% of Penn State's field goals last year. Only two other players in Division I were involved in 50% or more of their teams scoring on the season.

■ **TIM FRAZIER** was the ONLY player in NCAA Division I to post at least 17 points and 6 rebounds a game last year.

■ **TIM FRAZIER** brings a string of 22-straight double-figure scoring games (12 of those with 20+ points) and 38 consecutive starts into the 2012-13 season.

■ **TIM FRAZIER** raised his scoring average by 12.5 ppg from 2010-11 to 2011-12 (6.3 -18.8), the most in the Big Ten on the season and second-most in the Big Ten since 1996-97.

■ **TIM FRAZIER** went 77-83 (92.7%) at the foul line in his final 16 games of 2011-12. Frazier ranked 3rd (87.4%) in the conference at the line in Big Ten games.

■ **TIM FRAZIER** led Penn State in scoring in 25 games last year, including 15 of 19 games vs. Big Ten opponents, and had 17 20-point games (5th among Big Six Conference players). He scored 20 or more points in 7 of the last 10 games.

■ **JERMAINE MARSHALL** scored a career-high 27 points on a career-best four threes vs. Michigan in the Lions' last regular season game last year. He posted 20 double-digit scoring games on the year and led the team with 43 threes (28 in Big Ten) and had 13 double-digit scoring games in Big Ten play to average 11.8 ppg in the Big Ten.

■ **JERMAINE MARSHALL** greatly improved his defense last year and finished second on the team with 32 steals and 16 blocks. Marshall's 27.1 minutes per game and 10.8 ppg were second only to Tim Frazier last year.

■ **D.J. NEWBILL** trimmed his weight from 225 to 205 in the off-season following his red-shirt campaign after transferring from Southern Mississippi. Newbill missed nearly two months of practice early last season after injuring his left shoulder in practice. He returned to full practice in January and excelled, becoming a team-leader despite not playing.

■ **ROSS TRAVIS** scored a career-high 15 points vs. Michigan in the Lions' final regular season game of 2011-12 and had a career-best 9 rebounds to go with 10 points vs. Northwestern on Feb. 25. He posted 7.2 ppg, 5.2 rpg while shooting 63% in the final five games of 2011-12. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year, five in Big Ten play.

■ **ROSS TRAVIS** shot just 4-of-24 (.167) from three last year, but worked hard on his shot during the off-season improving his arch and touch and has shown an effective perimeter jumper in the preseason.

■ **JON GRAHAM** posted three-straight games with a career-high totals in points (10 vs. Iowa & Northwestern) or rebounds (10 at Wisconsin) at the end of last February and averaged 9.7 ppg and 6.3 rpg over those outings.

■ **JON GRAHAM** trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for his sophomore season and added four inches to his vertical. He still maintains a team-best 24 reps on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best. Graham missed five games in November and December last year with illness before coming on late in the year.

■ **SASA BOROVNJAK** has shown much greater mobility and explosiveness in his second season after returning from a season-ending ACL tear prior to the 2010-11 campaign. He cut his weight from 242 pounds to 230 for the 2012-13 campaign.

■ **SASA BOROVNJAK** led Penn State shooting 56.5 percent from the floor in 32 games last year. He is one of four Penn State players that can bench press more than 300 pounds.

■ Former walk-on **NICK COLELLA** was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started six-straight games in the Big Ten and played more than 24 minutes in five of those. He posted his second double-digit scoring game in Big Ten play at Iowa (11 pts) and averaged 20.8 mpg in Big Ten play, including a career-best 37 at MSU (2/8), while making 16 threes.

■ **NICK COLELLA** added six inches to his vertical leap in the off-season and tied the Penn State best with a pro-lane agility time of 10.0. He is one of four Lions that can bench press more than 300 pounds.

■ Freshman **AKOSA MADUEGBUNAM** recorded a team-best 35 inch vertical and has impressed the coaching staff with his strength and athleticism.

■ Freshman **BRANDON TAYLOR** arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds, but sculpted his body in the summer and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the pre-season.

■ Freshman **DONOVON JACK** was a three-time Pennsylvania All-State selection, twice earning first-team honors, as well as a standout volleyball player. The left-hander brings tremendous athleticism and a highly developed basketball skill set to the Nittany Lions. His high school teams never won less than 23 games and three times topped 27 wins.

OUTLET PASSES TEAM

■ Penn State returns 70 percent of its scoring and 60 percent of its rebounding from last season as well as four starters that logged 16 or more starts last year and six players that averaged 16 minutes or more of action in Big Ten play.

■ Penn State went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year. The Lions had just one home loss come by more than six points while dropping four Big Ten home contests by six points or less, including games with No. 12 Indiana (88-82) and No. 13 Michigan (71-65).

■ Penn State defeated No. 22 Illinois (54-52) last year for coach Patrick Chambers' first coaching victory over a Top 25 team (in his eighth ever meeting). Chambers became the third PSU coach to defeat a Top 25 team in his first season.

■ Penn State knocked off Purdue by 20 points (65-45), the Lions' most lopsided Big Ten win in six seasons, in coach Patrick Chambers' first-ever Big Ten home game.

■ Penn State won the rebounding battle in 19 games last year and ranked first in offensive rebounds in the Big Ten with 12.4 per game.

■ Penn State fielded on of the nation's most inexperienced squads last year with eight of 10 primary contributors last season in their first or second season of Division I play. The Lions had 84 starts between three freshmen and three sophomores. The Lions entered the 2011-12 campaign looking to replace 80 percent of their scoring.

■ Penn State had four major contributors miss significant action last season. All ranked in the top seven in scoring and three in the top seven of rebounding.

■ Penn State started 14 different line-ups last season, nine in Big Ten play.

■ Penn State won the scoring in the paint in 11 Big Ten games last year. Penn State won four of those games and lost by six points or less in four others.

■ Penn State was out-scored at the arc by 132 points (7.3 ppg) in the Big Ten season and by 168 (5.2 ppg) on the year in 2011-12. The Lions shot 31 percent from three.

■ Penn State scored 67.3 ppg and shot 42% at home (10-7) last year, while posting 55 ppg and shooting 35% in 15 games away from home (2-13). Penn State scored more than 60 points just twice (62 at B.C. and 64 at Iowa) away from the BJC last season.

■ Penn State ranked 325th in NCAA Division I in field goal percentage (39.3 percent) last year and shot a combined 37% from the floor and 27% from three in its 20 losses last year, while shooting 43% from the floor and 37% from three in 12 wins.

RETURNING FOR 2012-13: Penn State returns 70 percent of its scoring, 60 percent of its rebounding and 78 percent of its assists for head coach Patrick Chambers' second season at the helm. Leading the way will be first-team All-Big Ten guard **Tim Frazier**, a preseason All-Big Ten selection and the conference's only returning first-team selection from last year. The senior leads four returners that started at least 16 games last year. Frazier had a spectacular campaign in 2011-12 leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4). He led the nation accounting for 58 percent of the Lions offense (scoring and assists) and was still able to set Penn State's season assist record logging 198. Junior guard **Jermaine Marshall** also had the best year of his career finishing second on the team in scoring (10.8) and leading the team with 43 threes (1.4 per game) while posting four 20-point games. Sophomore forward **Jon Graham** (3.9 ppg, 3.7 rpg) started 17 games last year and surged in late February, averaging 9.7 ppg and 6.3 rpg over a three-game Big Ten stretch. Sophomore forward **Ross Travis** (4.4, 4.2) started 16 games last year and saw a similar late season surge posting 7.2 points and 5.2 rebounds per game over the final five contests. Travis finished second to Frazier (4.7 rpg) on the team in rebounding. Also seeing significant playing time last year were junior forward **Sasa Borovnjak** and senior guard **Nick Colella**. Borovnjak (4.3, 3.1) played in 32 games while starting seven and led the team shooting 56.6 percent from the floor. Colella (2.7, 1.3), a former walk-on, played in 26 games and started six while seeing significant action in Big Ten play, making 16 threes in those games, and earning a scholarship. Also returning are 6-11 sophomore forward Pat Ackerman, who saw limited action in 12 games last year, and walk-ons **Kevin Montminy**, a sophomore, and **Alan Wisniewski**, a junior.

SCOUTING THE RAMS: Philadelphia U posted a 19-10 record last year, 13-4 in the CACC, and averaged 69.3 ppg. They were led in scoring by guard Jim Connolly (16.8 ppg) who is the team's captain in his senior season. The Rams fell at James Madison (77-69) in exhibition action on Sunday. Connolly led the Rams with 19 points in that game. Sophomore guard Nick Schlitzer, who averaged 14.0 ppg in his freshman campaign, and junior guard Nick Christian, 9.4 ppg last year, also return. Schlitzer had 15 points vs. JMU. The Rams graduated two of their top four leading scorers. Connolly is the team's top returning three-point shooter hitting 38.6 percent from the arc and 3.3 threes per game last year. Schlitzer shot 45 percent from three and made 2.3 threes per game last year. Penn State transfer forward Peter Alexis is a freshman in eligibility at Philadelphia U and posted 13 points on 6-of-9 shooting in the exhibition game at JMU.

ALEXIS RETURNS TO BJC: Philadelphia U forward Peter Alexis spent his first collegiate season at Penn State in 2011-12 and transferred to Philadelphia at the end of the 2012 spring semester. The 6-10, 255-pound forward did not see action at Penn State and is a freshman in eligibility at Philadelphia.

FRAZIER EYES 1,000 POINTS/ASSIST RECORD: Tim Frazier enters his senior campaign with 970 points, needing just 30 to become the 30th 1,000-point scorer in Penn State history. He is on pace to finish his career among the top five Nittany Lion history in scoring, assists and steals. He needs 157 assists to eclipse the career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992.

FRAZIER'S BIG SUMMER: Tim Frazier had a big summer playing against the nation's top collegiate players as he was invited to attend the Deron Williams Skills Academy in June in Chicago and the LeBron James Skills Academy in Las Vegas in July. Both events were conducted by Nike. One of just two Big Ten guards and 16 top collegiate guards overall invited to attend the Williams camp, Frazier was a standout while competing amongst guards such as Missouri's Phil Pressey, Arkansas' BJ Young, Murray State's Isaiah Canaan and Michigan's Trey Burke. He excelled at the camp to earn an invitation to the James Academy which featured 25 top collegiate players (guards, wings and posts) that advance from the earlier Williams, Kevin Durant and Amare Stoudemire Skills Academies as well as 80 high school players.

D.J. EYES RETURN TO COMPETITION: Sophomore guard D.J. Newbill (6-4) has his eyes set on Nov. 9 as his first return to official collegiate competition in 20 months. Newbill sat out the 2011-12 season after transferring from Southern Mississippi in late August of 2011. He started all 32 games as freshman at Southern Miss, posting 9.2 ppg and 6.2 rpg to be named to the 2011 Conference USA All-Freshman Team. The 2010 Pennsylvania Class AA Player of the Year (24.2 ppg, 9.0 rpg, 5.0 apg) out of Philadelphia's Strawberry Mansion HS, he recorded six double-doubles and 15 double-digit scoring games at Southern Miss and led team in rebounding 11 times.

BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

TIM FRAZIER: Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine best...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State.

JON GRAHAM: Added four inches to his vertical leap...added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20...increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

ROSS TRAVIS: In the past year, Travis has increased his bench press max from 245 to 310 and his reps on the 185-pound bench from 10 to 22. He increased his leg press max from 325 to 615 and added 2.5 inches to his vertical (31.5). He increased his weight from 203 to 220 while maintaining his body fat and can touch a team-best 16 inches above the rim.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Cut his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent...improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

Penn State employed 14 different starting line-ups on the 2011-12 season, nine in Big Ten play.

MARSHALL BECOMES SOLID SCORER POSTS 20 DOUBLE-DIGIT GAMES:

Jermaine Marshall returns for his junior campaign after establishing himself as a solid scorer in his sophomore campaign. He posted 20 double-digit scoring games on the year, 19 in the final 25 games of the season, and put together a career-best string of seven-straight double-digit outings during Big Ten play. Marshall recorded four 20-point games on the year, including a career-best 27 in the Lions' final regular season game vs. Michigan. He ranked second on the team posting 10.8 ppg and saw his scoring average increase to 11.8 ppg in Big Ten games. Marshall led Penn State with 43 threes on the year, including a career-best four vs. Michigan, after making just six threes in 28 games in 2010-11. Marshall also finished second on the team getting to the foul line 87 times on the year.

OLIVER SERVES AS UNDERGRADUATE COACH:

Billy Oliver announced on Feb. 11 of last season, following the Lions' victory over Nebraska, that he was ending his Penn State playing career due to recurring symptoms stemming from his history of concussions and migraine headaches. Oliver, who would be a senior in eligibility in 2012-13, is serving as an undergraduate assistant coach as he completes degrees in finance and economics and begins masters classes in accounting. He remains on scholarship as an NCAA medical non-counter. Oliver was leading the Lions with 35 threes on the year prior ending his career last season. He played in 58 career games with 20 career starts and scored a total of 220 points while downing 46 career threes. He is an Academic All-Big Ten honoree who carries over a 3.2 grade-point average in Penn State's Smeal College of Business.



CHAMBERS & THE POST-SEASON: Coach Patrick Chambers missed having a team play in the post-season for the first time in his collegiate coaching career last season and has been a part of the post-season in seven of his eight seasons as a collegiate coach. In his previous five seasons as a member of the Villanova coaching staff and two as head coach at Boston University, all of his teams reached post-season play including six NCAA Tournament appearances and one CBI appearance. Chambers has been a part of 17 NCAA Tournament games, helping Villanova advance to the tournament every year and make four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and reach the 2009 NCAA Final Four. In his first season at BU, he guided the Terriers to their first post-season win since 1959 with a victory in the CBI and the following year led BU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2002.

- Older brother, Tim, was the 1984 Ivy League Player of the Year in football and led Penn to three-straight Ivy League titles. He is now a writer, producer and director and just released the film “Mighty Macs.”
- Older brother, Paul, was a three-year starter at point guard for the Penn Quakers.
