NEED TO KNOW

LIONS VS. TIGERS

The No. 8/9 Penn State women's hockey takes on RIT on home ice at Pegula Ice Arena to begin four-straight games against the Tigers, all of which were rescheduled from Jan. 15-16 and Jan. 23-24 early this season.

THE MATCHUP

- Penn State leads the all-time matchup 22-16-3, including a win in the most recent game 4-1 in the 2020 CHA Tournament in Buffalo, N.Y.
- The Nittany Lions are 11-3-0 under head coach Jeff Kampersal against RIT since the start of the 2017-18 season. This matchup will be the first series against Penn State for Kampersal's former assistant coach Celeste Brown as head coach of her alma mater.

IMPORTANT NUMBERS

Penn State is riding a program-best eight game unbeaten streak (7-0-1) that dates back to their Jan. 8 at Robert Morris. Its previous high was seven games (3-0-4) back in 2017-18.

Three Nittany Lions - junior Julie Gough (Player of the Month), Josie Bothun (Goalie). and Kiara Zanon (Rookie) - swept the CHA monthly awards for January .

Freshman forward Olivia Wallin ranks first in the CHA and leads all rookie skaters in the nation with eight goals scored this season.

Four of the top ten point scorers in the CHA are Nittany Lions: Kiara Zanon (1st, 17 pts), Natalie Heising (2nd, 15), Julie Gough and Lyndie Lobdell (T6, 10).

RECOGNIZED NATIONALLY

- Penn State received its first-ever national ranking in the USCHO.com women's division I hockey poll Jan. 11 when the Nittany Lions were ranked 10th overall. They were also ranked 10th the next day in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll, also a program first.
- In this week's version of the polls, Penn State is ranked 8th in the USCHO.com version and 9th in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll, marking the fifthstraight week the Nittany Lions have been ranked in the top ten.
- The Nittany Lions had received votes in the two national polls before breaking through as a ranked squad Jan. 11-12. They had received votes in both polls just two times in program history previous to this season (Oct. 1-2, 2018 after upset at #5 Colgate and Dec. 15, 2014 after sweep of #6 Mercyhurst)

LAST TIME OUT: ROBERT MORRIS

- Penn State set a new program record reaching eight games unbeaten after completing a home series sweep of Robert Morris Feb. 5-6, also completing the regular-season sweep of the Colonials in the process.
- Penn State won a tight first game, 2-1, thanks to a third-period score by Kiara Zanon. she followed up Olivia'a gametying goal in the second period with her third game-winning goal of the season.
- In game two, Robert Morris took the initial lead once again but the NIttany Lions stormed back to take the lead. Julie Gough and Amy Dobson scored back-toback in the second period to take the lead before RMU responded to tie the game 2-2. With 12 seconds left in the 2nd, Wallin netted the go-ahead and eventual gamewinning goal. Josie Bothun was great in net with 36 saves, including seven on an extended PK in the third period before Natalie Heising put away an empty-net goal.

JANUARY 8-9 AT ROBERT MORRIS

- Julie Gough, Josie Bothun and Kiara Zanon were the latest CHA award winners for Penn State as the trio swept the January monthly awards (Player, Goalie and Rookie).
- Zanon became the first Nittany Lion to win an individual national award from the HCA when she received National Rookie of the Month for December. She became the second Nittany Lion to win two CHA Rookie of the Month awards since Natalie Heising in 2017-18.
- Outside of Heising, who has won a total of 12 CHA monthly and weekly awards in her career, every Nittany Lion on the list above won their first CHA honor in their career this season.
- Bothun continues a string of great Penn State goaltending being recognized by the conference, as PSU goalies have won 14 weekly and month accoldes since the 2018-19 season.
- Penn State has 10 players on its current roster that have won CHA Rookie of the Week at least once in their career.

FROZEN FOUR IN HOCKEY VALLEY

- The NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be hosted twice by Penn State at Pegula Ice Arena this decade; 2022 and 2026.
- First, the Nittany Lions will host the tournament at Pegula Ice Arena for the first time in school history March 18-20, 2022. This will include two NCAA semifinals along with the National Championship game.
- The announcement was made by the NCAA on April 18, 2017. The Nittany Lions are currently in just their ninth season as a varsity program in 2020-21.
- A second announcement from the on October 14, 2020 granted Penn State a second hosting opportunity for the Frozen Four in 2026.

UP ON HEISING

- Senior forward Natalie Heising became the second Nittany Lion to score 50 career goals after her first-period score Nov. 30 against Lindenwood. (Laura Bowman, '17, 61 goals). She currently has 51 career goals.
- Heising surpassed Shannon Yoxheimer ('16) for third on the all-time PSU scoring list with her 81st point Nov. 30. Among Penn State players with at least 50 career games played, she ranks first in program history with 0.75 points per game (86 pts, 114 GP) and goals per game at 0.47 (51G).
- Heising tops the PSU record book with 19 power play goals. Her 10 PPG in 17-18 tied the NCAA lead and set a program single-season record. Her 11 gamewinning scores total also tops the PSU all-time list.
- Heising was named the 2017-18 CHA Rookie of the Year, becoming the first Nittany Lion to win the award. In her freshman year, she set the all-time single-season PSU goals record (19).

D IT UP WITH THE CREW

- Junior defender Rene Gangarosa set the PSU all-time season mark for points by a defender with 18 (6G, 12A). She led the 2019-20 Nittany Lions with five power-play scores. She netted her first goal of the season Jan. 24 against Mercyhurst.
- Junior defender Izzy Heminger was named to the All-CHA Second Team after her 16-point season (4G, 12A). Her 37 career points ranks third among all program defenders.
- Sophomore defender Mallory Uihlein became the second Nittany Lion defender in the last two seasons to be named to the All-CHA Rookie Team. She tied the team high with nine assists and had 11 total points and netted her first goal of the season Jan. 29 at Lindenwood.
- Junior defender and 2018-19 All-Rookie team performer Jessica Adolfsson returns to the lineup after missing most of 2019-20 with an injury. She adds another threat on the power play with her six career PP goals, with her most recent being Jan. 9 at RMU.

ELECTRIC FRESHMEN SKATERS

- Penn State has already seen the impact its freshmen class can bring to the team in 2020-21 as the rookie class has accounted for 45.6 percent of Penn State's offense through 12 games (53 points).
- Forward Kiara Zanon leads the CHA in points with 17 (7G, 10A), a mark that ranks sixth nationally and leads all rookies in the country.
- Forward Forwards Olivia Wallin leads the CHA and all rookies in the country with 8 goals.
- Defender Lyndie Lobdell tops all conference defenders with 10 points on 10 helpers.
- Maeve Connolly (5 pts) and Jess Ciarrocchi (5 pts) have formed a tough duo to deal with. Carrie Byrnes added three assists in the RMU series. Forward Alyssa Machado made her PSU debut Jan. 23-24 and scored her first career goal Jan. 29 at LU.

COOL CALM AND COLLECTED

- Freshman goaltender Josie Bothun holds a stellar 11-1-2 record through her first 14 starts for Penn State, including setting a record for the longest unbeaten streak to start a career in goal for Penn State at five games (4-0-1).
- Bothun became the first Nittany Lion ever to both win her first start and post a shutout in her first start.
- Despite the loss to Syracuse Dec. 12, Bothun set a season-high with 42 saves. She recently had 36 saves in the win over RMU Feb. 6.

EXPERIENCED FORWARDS

- Junior Amy Dobson notched her first career multi-point game Jan. 23 and currently 8 points (5G, 3A), including a team-best 3 PPG.
- Sophomore Julie Gough has been an excellent playmaker and finisher this season with 10 points (3G, 9A) and is adept at winning puck battles on the wall and in front of the net.
- Sophomore Rachel Weiss has used her game-breaking speed to score three goals this season, including drawing and scoring on a penalty shot in her two-goal/three-point game Jan. 29.

2020-21 CAPTAINS

- Senior forward Natalie Heising was named captain by her peers for the 2020-21 campaign alongside althernate captains Rene Gangarosa and Anna Promersberger.
- Heising scored a team-best 13 goals in 2019-20 and served as the team's alternate captain the past two seasons.
- Gangarosa set a new program best with 18 points as a defender in 2019-20.
- Promersberger scored five points and played valuable minutes on the team's penalty-killing unit for the 2019-20 season.

THE HEART OF HOCKEY VALLEY

- Pegula Ice Arena is a state-of-the-art college hockey facility built not only to house the Penn State varsity and club hockey programs, but to serve as a central hub to local hockey enthusiasts in central Pennsylvania.
- The 5,782-capacity arena rink, which also boasts the 1,000-seat "Roar Zone" student section, is among the best collegiate hockey facilities in the country. It has hosted multiple events outside of Penn State hockey contests, including NHL Preseason contests, most recently featuring the Buffalo Sabres and the Pittsburgh Penguins Sept. 16, 2019. A second community ice rink has also enabled the facility to host youth hockey tournaments, figure skating programs, ice shows, and community open skates.
- The facility was brought to fruition by an initial \$88 million donation - the largest in University history - from Terry and Kim Pegula, who, through their gift, helped Penn State realize its goal of Division I hockey. At the ceremonial groundbreaking on April 20, 2012, the Pegulas added \$14 million to the project to lift the total donation to \$102 million. The first Penn State women's hockey contest in Pegula was played Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Union.

HEAD COACH JEFF KAMPERSAL

One of the winningest and well-respected coaches in women's ice hockey history, Jeff Kampersal enters his fourth season at the helm of the Penn State program in 2020-21. His coaching excellence at both the collegiate level and the international level with USA Hockey has brought a steadying veteran leadership to the up-and-coming Nittany Lions.

Heading into the 2020-21 season, Kampersal ranks sixth in career victories among active Division I women's hockey coaches with 363, a total that also ranks seventh all-time.

Penn State has reached the College Hockey America semifinals for three-straight seasons for the first time in its history under Kampersal's direction.

Kampersal's team has showcased defensive excellence since his arrival, highlighted in the 2019-20 season by seven total shutout victories, a single-season program high. Penn State's increased competitiveness has resulted in marquee program victories of late, including a win over fifth-ranked Colgate, 4-2, in 2018-19, the highest-ranked win in program history.

The 2019-20 Nittany Lions added three more All-CHA award recipients for now 11 honorees over the past three seasons. That total is tied for the most conference honorees in any three-year stretch.

Kampersal's arrival impacted Penn state immediately on the ice in his first season in 2017-18, when Penn State allowed a CHA-best 1.92 goals per game, an improvement of more than a goal per game from the previous season.

In addition to his on-ice guidance, Kampersal has built and sustained a program culture of excellence both in the classroom and in the community. Since Kampersal's arrival in Hockey Valley, Penn State women's hockey recorded back-to-back perfect academic progress rates according to the latest NCAA APR reports, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation of the program's student-athletes. The Nittany Lions have also had 66 All-CHA Academic team honorees and 61 Academic All-Big Ten winners during his tenure.

The 2018-19 team captain Kelsey Crow was the recipient of Penn State's prestigious Eric A. Walker Award, an award given to a graduating Penn State senior who has best represented the university through extracurricular activities and community service.

Kampersal was named Penn State head coach on June 1, 2017. The head coach of the Princeton Tigers for 21 seasons, Kampersal garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors three times and Ivy League Coach of the Year accolades twice. He guided the Tigers to two Ivy League Championships (2005-06 & 2015-16) and two NCAA Tournament appearances (2005-06 & 2015-16).

Kampersal's student-athletes earned 68 All-Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Hockey honors, 54 All-Ivy League selections, five Patty Kazmaier Award nominees and two American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) All-America plaudits. During his final two seasons at Princeton, Kampersal guided the Tigers to a 42-19-5 cumulative record that included the 2016 Ivy League Championship and an NCAA Tournament at-large berth.

The 2016-17 campaign saw Princeton compile an overall record of 20-10-3, falling to eventual national champion Clarkson in the ECAC Tournament semifinals. During the season, the Tigers recorded seven wins over ranked teams, had a Patty Kazmaier top-10 finalist, the USCHO.com National Rookie of the Year, six All-Ivy League members and four All-ECAC members, including the Goalie and Rookie of the Year. Princeton was ranked No. 9 in the final 2016-17 USCHO.com poll.

In 2015-16, Kampersal directed Princeton to its winningest season in program history to date. The Tigers compiled a 22-9-2 record, won the Ivy League title, had an NCAA Tournament bid and Kampersal earned Ivy League and ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors.

Kampersal's experience as a coach with USA Hockey includes guiding the USA Women's Hockey Under-18 Team to silver medals at the 2013 and 2014 International Ice Hockey Federation (IIHF) World Women's U18 Championships. He also served on the coaching staff of the USA Women's Select Festival from 2004-06.

A 1992 Princeton graduate with a degree in psychology, Kampersal served as the men's hockey team's captain as a senior. An All-Ivy League and All-ECAC selection, Kampersal was awarded the 1941 Championship Trophy, given to the Princeton player who best represents the winning spirit of the 1941 championship team.

From Beverly, Massachusetts, Kampersal played high school hockey at St. John's Prep in Danvers, Massachusetts, and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 2009.

A 10th-round selection of the National Hockey League's New York Islanders in the 1988 entry draft, Kampersal played for the ECHL's Richmond Renegades and the AHL's Capital District Islanders.

Kampersal and his wife, Eileen, have a daughter, Keira, and a son, Jack.


