FAST START

Orange freshman Rayla Clemons has scored at least one point in all three games of her Syracuse career. In the Orange win against RIT, she had an assist on freshman Sarah Thompson's goal. In the series against Colgate, she scored a pair of goals in her collegiate debut and had an assist in the second game.

With two goals in her Syracuse debut, she became the just the second player in Syracuse history to accomplish that feat. She scored on the very first shift of her college career when she put a shot past Colgate goalie Kayle Osborne 72 seconds in to the game. The Franklin, Mich. native tallied her second goal with 4:31 left in the first period.

The last freshman to score a pair of goals in her debut was Janelle Malcolm. She tallied two goals in her first game in 2008-09, the Syracuse ice hockey season. The Orange played Colgate.

ON THE RECORD LIST

Senior goalie Allison Small ranks sixth in Syracuse history in saves. She has 679 saves in 27 career games. The Syracuse record is 2,161 by Katie Billadeau in 81 games from 2010-11 through 2013-14.

2019-20 SYRACUSE-PSU **GAME SUMMARIES**

Nov. 23, 2019 (University Park, Pa.) - PSU 1, SYR 1 Reigning CHA Player of the Week Victoria Klimek provided the lone goal for the Orange five minutes into the opening period off assists from Shelby Calof and Anna Leschyshyn. PSU tied the game with just more than four minutes remaining in the first period and neither team scored again resulting in the 1-1 tie.

Nov. 24, 2019 (University Park, Pa.) – SYR 3, PSU 1 Syracuse extended its unbeaten streak against PSU to 20 games with a 3-1 victory. Savannah Rennie opened scoring less than five minutes into the game. Jessica DiGirolamo scored the game-winner and Abby Moloughney tallied her first goal of the year. Allison Small recorded 21 saves and Ady Cohen added six.

Jan. 24, 2020 (Syracuse, N.Y.) - PSU 1, SYR 0 A late third period Penn State tally broke the tie and lifted the Nittany Lions to a 1-0 win. The teams played 54:56 of scoreless hockey before PSU's Brooke Madsen scored the lone goal of the game.

Jan. 25, 2020 (Syracuse, N.Y.) - SYR 3, PSU 1 The Orange took a 2-1 lead in the second period and added an insurance goal in the third for the victory. Syracuse's Victoria Klimek, Kelli Rowswell, and Savannah Rennie scored for the Orange. Allison Small had 39 saves for SU.

ROOKIE STANDOUT

Sophomore Mae Batherson tallied an assist against RIT to get in the points column. As a freshman in 2019-20, Batherson recorded 23 points, the most of any freshmen on the roster. She earned the College Hockey America (CHA) Rookie of the Year honor and became the first Orange player to earn United States College Hockey Online (USCHO) postseason honors with her selection to the All-USCHO Rookie Team.

In her first season, Batherson had a five-point weekend in December against Lindenwood, a four-point weekend against Mercyhurst in January, and another five point weekend against Lindenwood in March. She recorded 2+ points on five occasions in 2019-20.

THE 50 POINT CLUB

Three Orange skaters are members of the 50-point club, including senior Jessica DiGirolamo (55 points – 17G-38A), senior Emma Polaski (57 pts-28G-29A) and junior Abby Moloughney (50 pts - 21G-29A).

Junior Lauren Bellefontaine (42 pts – 17G-25A) and senior Victoria Klimek (39 pts - 22G-17A) are next in line for the 50 point club.

A FAMILY AFFAIR

Sophomore Anna Leschyshyn (Grasswood, Saskatchewan) is the daughter of former NHL defenseman Curtis Leschyshyn and sister of current Vegas Golden Knights prospect Jake Leschyshyn. Jake plays in the Vegas Golden Knights system (Chicago Wolves, AHL) while Curtis played in the NHL from 1988-2004 (1,033 games) for the Quebec Nordiques, Colorado Avalanche, Washington Capitals, Hartford Whalers, Carolina Hurricanes, Minnesota Wild, and Ottawa Senators.

Sophomore Mae Batherson also has a connection to the NHL as her older brother Drake Batherson plays within the Ottawa Senators organization. Drake played in the 2019 AHL All-Star Game where he scored five goals for the North Division and was named MVP.

'CUSE COACHES

Head Coach: Paul Flanagan Alma Mater: St. Lawrence '80

Record at Syracuse: 178-207-42 (13th season) Career Record: 408-290-66 (22nd season)

The only head coach in Syracuse ice hockey history, Paul Flanagan has built the program from an upstart to a perennial contender in College Hockey America. He came to Syracuse in March 2008 when the University launched the program.

One of the winningest coaches in the history of collegiate women's hockey, Flanagan guided the 2018 Orange to the CHA championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament bid.

The three-time CHA Coach of the Year, Flanagan has mentored one CHA Player of the Year, four CHA Rookies of the Year, five CHA Best Defenseman Award winners, four CHA Best Defensive Forwards, four CHA Individual Sportsmanship Award winners, two CHA Goaltending Trophy Award winners, two CHA Scoring Trophy Award winners and 17 CHA All-Tournament Team selections. Two Orange standouts have achieved 100-point Club status in Melissa Piacentini (53-59-112) and Stephanie Grossi (45-72-117).

BRENDON KNIGHT, ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH POTSDAM '01

Knight joined the SU program prior to the 2012-13 season after a six-year appointment as the head coach of the Hamilton College women's ice hockey team.

In his time at Hamilton, Knight guided the team to 57 wins and six postseason appearances. In 2011-12, Knight coached a 2012 NESCAC women's ice hockey all-conference team selection, as well as a four NESCAC Winter All-Academic Team members and a NESCAC winter all-sportsmanship honoree.

In 2010-11, Knight coached the team to 11 victories, which was Hamilton's highest total since 2002-03. Knight coached the 2009-10 NESCAC Rookie of the Year, and Hamilton ranked third in the conference in combined special teams. Knight mentored the program's first All-American and its first NESCAC Player of the Year in 2008-09. That year, Hamilton players led the NESCAC in goals, points and powerplay goals.

2020-21 CAPTAINS

Syracuse veterans Kristen Siermachesky, Jessica DiGirolamo and Emma Polaski are the 2020-21 team captains. Siermachesky, who was an alternate captain last season, is a co-captain alongside DiGirolamo, and Polaski wears the "A" as an alternate captain.

A defender, Siermachesky scored a goal against Colgate (11/21) and has 11 points (5G-6A) in 106 career games. The New Liskeard, Ontario native is the president of Syracuse's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), and a three-time Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) Academic Honor Roll selection.

A native of Mississauga, Ontario, DiGirolamo had an assist against RIT (11/27). She has 55 points (17G-38A) in 112 career game. She started last year in Hockey Canada's Senior National Camp. The 2018-19 CHA All-Tournament Team selection and 2017-18 CHA All-Rookie Team honoree is a three-time ACC Academic Honor Roll selection.

Polaski, a forward who had two goals and an assist against RIT (11/27), has 57 points in 112 career games. The native of Morristown, N.J. had five multi-point games last season and her nine goals was the second-best total on the team. Polaski is also a three-time ACC Academic Honor Roll selection.
