

Student Docent Program: Information for Applicants

Docents are a special kind of volunteer; they serve an important role in fulfillment of our museum's educational mission. They possess deep knowledge of the multifaceted history and legacy of Penn State's athletics programs, covering more than 30 different sports teams across 140+ years, and are thoroughly trained to guide visitors through the museum galleries and Beaver Stadium environment. The requirements to become a docent of the PSASM are as follows:

- Students from all academic concentrations are encouraged to apply; no background in history, sports, or museum studies is required.
- All applicants must pass a background check prior to beginning docent training classes, as well as annual mandatory reporter training.
- All applicants must successfully complete the student docent training course.
- Applicants accepted into the student docent corps must abide by the Penn State and ICA diversity and inclusion initiatives by giving guided tours to any and all museum visitors regardless of age, ability, race, ethnicity, religion, gender, gender expression, sexual orientation, or fan affiliation.
- Student docent corps members will meet together for an hour once a month throughout the academic year. They are also encouraged (but not required) to attend the regular docent corps meetings (held once a month, usually at 9am on the third Monday).
- Upon acceptance into the student docent corps, members are expected to commit
 to a seven-month term of service, at a minimum of 12 service hours per year. Service
 opportunities include guided tours, promotional events, and educational
 programming, both on campus and in the community. Service events average 60-90
 minutes but can be longer or shorter.
- Student docent corps members will serve in partnership with members of the museum's regular docents.
- Student docent corps members are encouraged to create original thematic tour experiences to add to the museum's program offerings.
