- · Tuesday's game is part of the campus round of games for the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off Tournament.
- The Lopes dropped their season opening game to No. 1 Duke, 96-61, on Saturday night.
- Shag Carr started and made his GCU debut, leading the Lopes in scoring (18 points) and assists (8). Carr was 8-of-17 from the field and added 3 rebounds in 38 minutes.
- Penn State is the second Big Ten team GCU has faced in the Division I era, having traveled to visit Indiana on Dec. 13, 2014. The took that game 94-66.
- Four players made their GCU debut on Saturday night: Carr, Darion Clark, Oscar Frayer and Fiifi Aidoo.
- · The Lopes will be without senior DeWayne Russell for one more game due to an NCAA ruling following his transfer from NAU in 2013-14. Russell led the WAC in assists in 2015-16, averaging 5.3 per game.
- Penn State head coach Pat Champbers is in his sixth season at the helm, compiling a 73-92 record, including threestraight season with at least 16 wins.
- The Nittany Lions return three of its top four scorers from a year ago: Shep Garner (14.8 ppg), Payton Banks (9.4 ppg), and Josh Reaves (6.4 ppg).
- Penn State was 11-4 at the Bryce Jordan Center in 2015-16.
- Freshmen Tony Carr. Lamar Stevens and Mike Watkins accounted for 72 percent of their team's 82 points against Duquesne on Sunday night.
- Penn State is 1-1 all-time against WAC opponents, having most recently defeating UMKC 75-71 on Dec. 7, 2005.

GRAND CANYON TEAM NOTES

HOME SWEET HOME

The Lopes have enjoyed playing their home games at Grand Canyon Univesity Arena. Since the arena opened prior to the 2011-12 season, GCU has recorded a 69-16 (.812) record, proving to be quite the home-court advantage.



GCU continued their dominance at home last season, where they compiled an 18-2 record at GCU Arena for the 2015-16 season, including two victories in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. The Lopes' 18 wins at home tied for the second most in the entire country.

An intimidating factor for opponents, the large Havocs student section has proven to be one of the best in the Western Athletic Conference. The Havocs create an imposing backdrop for visiting teams as they fill the bleachers with energy and enthusiasm.

"It's unbelievable," head coach Dan Majerle said. "We love our crowd, our student section, our overall crowd, our atmosphere here. We have a true home-court advantage and it's a pleasure to play here every night and our guys don't take it for granted."

Following their second place finish in the WAC standings a year ago, Grand Canyon was picked to finish second in both the coaches' and media WAC Preseason Polls for the second consecutive year.



New Mexico State received four first-place votes in the coaches' poll and 45 total points, while earning nine first-place votes in the media poll and 167 points overall. GCU received three first-place votes in the coaches' poll and eight first-place votes in the media poll.

IN GOOD COMPANY

At 27-7 in 2015-16, the Lopes solidified their place at the top with the program's best season in Division I history, recording more wins than the previous high-mark of 17-15 in 2014-15. With their 19th win vs. CSU Bakersfield on Jan. 28, 2016, the Lopes became the first team in the nation to reach 19 wins last season.

Their success was notable not only at the institutional level or the conference level, but also at the national level. In 2015-16, Grand Canyon had the 14th-best winning percentage in the entire country.

BATTLE OF THE BOARDS

Coach Dan Majerle stressed the importance of improving the Lopes' rebounding efforts prior to last season. The Lopes took the message to heart, ending the season with the fourth-highest year-over-year rebound margin improvement in the country.

For the 2014-15 season, the Lopes were outrebounded by an average of 3.5 rebounds per game. Just one year later, Grand Canyon's was outrebounding its opponents by an average of 3.9 rebounds per game. The +7.4 improvement in rebounding margin ranked fourth among Division I schools. Majerle's squad was 16-1 in 2015-16 when they outrebounded their opponent.

THE GCU IO IN 2 EFFECT

As part of its \$1 billion campus expansion, Grand Canyon University announced on Aug. 16, 2016 that it will complete construction of 10 new athletic facilities within the next two years as it continues its transition to NCAA Division I athletics.

One of these 10 faciliies is a brand new practice facility for the men's and women's basketball teams. Adjacent to Grand Canyon University Arena, the practice facility will feature one main practice court with two side practice courts, coaches offices, a player's lounge, meeting spaces, a film room for both men's and women's basketball programs.





Additionaly, the practice facility will feature a museum of artifacts from Phoenix sports icon Jerry Colangelo, who has strong ties to the university. The facility is expected to open in January 2017.

Other facilities part of #GCU10in2 are: GCU Stadium, baseball stadium, softball stadium. student-athlete development center, tennis facility, beach volleyball stadium, equipment room, GCU Golf Course practice facility, and an expansion to the Lopes Performance Center.











GRAND CANYON PLAYER NOTES

JOSHUA SHOWING SOME BRAWN

Following a 2014-15 season that saw him named to the WAC All-Newcomer Team. Joshua Braun emereged as one of the top players in the conference and one of the best talents among mid-major schools, leading the Lopes in scoring, averaging 16.6 points per game was recognized by being named to the Preseason All-WAC Second Team. The sophomore from Anthem, Ariz. has shown that both the coaches and media that selected him were on to



In 33 games, Braun led the Lopes in scoring, averaging 16.9 points per game. For the season, he is shooting 44.3 percent from the field, including a 40.8 percent clip from three-point range, the second-best mark in the WAC. Since conference-play began, Braun averaged 18.8 points and 5.9 rebounds in 14 WAC games.

Braun's accomplishments in January did not go unnoticed either. He was named the Lou Henson Award National Player of the Week as well as the American Sports Network Player of the Week after recording two double-doubles in wins over Chicago State and UMKC on Jan. 21 and 23. Braun scored 19 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in only 27 minutes of action vs. Chicago State and then tied his career best with six three pointers en route to 31 points and 10 rebounds at UMKC.

BRAINS AND BRAUN

Joshua Braun was named to the 2015-16 CoSIDA firstteam Academic All-America Division I men's basketball team by the College Sports Information Directors of American (CoSIDA).

A native of Anthem, Ariz., Braun carried a 3.83 GPA in business management last year. He was Grand Canvon's first-ever first team selection in men's basketball and the first since Kevin Warren earned second team honors in 1986.



Braun was joined on the first team by graduate student Jarrod Uthoff of Iowa, senior Marcus Paige of the University of North Carolina, senior Shavon Shields of the University of Nebraska and junior Canyon Barry of the College of Charleston. The five members of the CoSIDA Academic All-America Division I men's basketball first team had an average GPA of 3.68.

The Lopes now have 28 Academic All-Americans in school history and Braun was the ninth student-athlete to be named to the first team. Additionally, Braun became just the 23rd firstteam Academic All-American in men's basketball from the WAC and the first since Eric Castro of SMU in 2005.

Braun graduated with his bachelors degree in May and has started working towards his Masters of Business Administration.

JB FOR THREE

Entering his third year of play, Joshua Braun has steadily climbed up the ranks in the GCU record books. After draining 57 3-pointers his freshman season, Braun followed that up with 73 treys during the 2015-16 season, bringing his total to 131 career 3-pointers.

With two years of eligibility remaining, Braun needs to make 67 3-pointers over the next two seasons to surpass Richard Davis as the school's all-time leading 3-point shooter. Davis hit 197 career 3-pointers for the Lopes from 2005-07, including a school-record 107 3-pointers during the 2005-06 season.

PUT HIM ON THE LINE

Joshua Braun was fantastic from the free throw line in 2015-16, shooting a WAC-best 86.8 percent from the charity stripe on the season. His 203 free throws made ranked him 12th overall in the country.

The most impressive thing to consider with Braun's free throw percentage was the number of free throw attemps he had throughout the season. If you factor that in, Braun had the third best free throw percentage in the country among players that had at least 200 attempts last season.

HIGHLY RATED

Part of what makes Joshua Braun so difficult to guard is his ability to shoot from the outside as well as play in the paint, after a year of playing the power forward position for the Lopes in 2014-15. Mix that in with his 86.8 free throw percentage, and its evident Braun can score any way head coach Dan Majerle needs him to.

According to College Basketball Reference, Braun ranked no. 5 in the country with an offensive rating of 132.79 in 2015-16. Braun's total was the 24th best total in the NCAA since the 2009-10 seaon. Offensive rating is calculated by the number of points produced per 100 possessions.

GCU was not ready to say goodbye to its floor leader last season. When DeWayne Russell transferred to Grand Canyon from Northern Arizona University in December 2013, it was thought that he would lose that season of eligibility, despite only playing in a single exhibition game for NAU vs. Arizona Christian in the 2013-14 season.

With the last home game of the regular season only three days away last February, Russell and the Lopes received word from the NCAA that Russell's season-of-competition waiver was approved, giving him eligibility for the

VICTORY IN VEGAS


Despite not being eligible for the NCAA tournament for another two years, the Lopes made some noise last year in their first tournament appearance of the season. Coming off an upset of San Diego State on the road, the Lopes moved on to Las Vegas to take part in final two rounds of the Global Sports Classic on Dec. 21 and 22.

In the semifinal round, the Lopes erased a nine-point second half deficit to defeat the Houston Cougars 78-69 behind DeWayne Russell's 20 points and 6 assists to move onto the tournament championship game against Marshall.

The following day, the Lopes once again came from behind to win their fourth game in a row. Braun was named the tournament MVP after scoring 20 points in the championship game.

TERRIFIC TRANSFERS

GCU's Grandy Glaze was the recipient of the 2016 Riley Wallace Award, given annually to the top transfer in Division I college basketball. The transfer from Saint Louis made an immediate impact with the Lopes, leading the WAC in field goal percentage (59.6), ranked second in rebounding (8.8) and eighth in scoring (14.0).






Clark missed the last eight games of the 2015-16 season due to injury and USC struggled in his absence. The Trojans were 19-7 in 26 games with Clark in the lineup, but just 2-6 in the eight games he was out, including a season-ending first round loss in the NCAA tournament

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Head coach Dan Majerle and his staff have covered the country looking for the best talent to recruit to play for the Lopes. For the 2016-17 season, they've extended into international borders as well. Six of the 16 players on the roster hail from countries outside of the United States.



AUSTRALIAN CONNECTION

The Lopes' duo of Matt Jackson and Gerard Martin are united by the fact that they traveled over 8,000 miles to attend GCU from Australia. But home country isn't the only thing uniting the two Lopes.

While Jackson's hometown of Greensborough and Martin's hometown of Manly are nearly nine hours apart, the two were teammates prior to joining Majerle's squad. They joined forces in 2012 at the FIBA U17 World





Championship, leading Australia to a silver medal. Along with Jackson and Martin, Team Australia was led by the likes of Ben Simmons (2016, 1st Overall Pick, Philadelphia 76ers) and Dante Exum (2014, 5th Overall Pick, Utah Jazz).

"We're lucky we have the means to be able to go to Australia and recruit," Majerle told Sports360AZ. "Matt has really gotten better. He can stretch the floor and shoot. I'm proud of Gerard. He's worked extremely hard. You can just throw him on the floor and he can guard any position out there."

MIDNIGHT MADNESS: THE APOCO-LOPES!

The Grand Canyon men's and women's basketball programs hosted their annual Midnight Madness event to tip off the season on Oct. 8, as over 7,000 fans piled into GCU Arena to welcome their Lopes for the 2016-17

"I cannot thank our university enough for all the work they put into Midnight Madness," head coach Dan Ma-



jerle said. "To have 7,200 students rock the place makes it a special night for our players and staff. This is what we show our recruits and this is just a preview of what we will play in front of this season. This is as good of a Midnight Madness as there is in the country."

The support for GCU basketball was evident on campus as students began lining up at 4 p.m. Friday afternoon. Once the doors opened for the fans to enter GCU Arena, the show began as Thunder welcomed the crowd followed up by the Havocs starting the party.

The GCU cheer and dance team put on a show for the fans and after the GCU drumline pumped up the crowd, the basketball teams were introduced for the first time. Majerle and women's head coach Trent May arrived in style as May roared in on an ATV and Majerle shook the arena coming in on a motorcycle.

TOURNAMENT TEAM TESTED

The Lopes schedule picked up significantly in their third year of transition to Division I play last season, having a number of teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament and the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) the previous year. On Nov. 30, Grand Canyon took down Hampton University 63-51 at GCU Arena. Three nights later, the Lopes took down head coach Dan Majerle's alma mater, Central Michigan, 75-72 to avenge their loss at Mount Pleasant a year prior.

Grand Canyon was unable to keep their winning strike alive with a quick turnaround in traveling to Louisville, Ky. for their first road game of the season against the No. 24 Cardinals, falling 111-63. The Lopes picked up arguably their biggest win in program history though when they went into Viejas Arena at San Diego State and knocked off the Aztecs 52-45. In a defensive battle that saw numerous lead changes down the stretch, the Lopes scored the game's final 7 points to pull off the upset win. The Aztecs had qualified for the NCAA Tournament for six consecutive seasons.

The Lopes took down WAC foe New Mexico State for the first time in program history on Jan. 9, 2016, fighting back from a first-half deficit to beat the Aggies 79-75. New Mexico State got the best of the Lopes in the matchup in Las Cruces, taking advantage of a poor-shooting second-half as the Aggies took home a 70-50 win.

The Lopes' final game against 2015 tournament teams came March 1 in a road matchup at No. 24 Saint Mary's. GCU battled to within two points with five minutes to go in the game, but fell 73-64 to the Gaels at McKeon Pavilion.

RUSSELL GIVETH AND TAKETH AWAY

DeWayne Russell's scoring numbers in 2015-16 might not have been be where they were in 2014-15, but the guard from Peoria, Ariz. did exactly what his head coach was asking of him. With a more balanced team, Russell was able to control the floor and distribute the ball to teammates. As good as was giving the ball up, he was just as good at taking it away.

Last season, Russell led the WAC in assists and was third in steals, averaging 5.4 assists and 1.3 steals per game on the season. In the Dec. 28 win over SIUE, Russell recorded his second double-double of the season with 11 points and 10 assists. Russell has also added five double-figure assist games this season. Russell had the 11th most double-digit assist games in the entire country in 2015-16. Only three of the 10 ahead of him return in 2016-17.




MEN'S BASKETBALL 2016-17 GAME NOTES

SHAQ ATTACK

The Lopes were excited about the addition of Shag Carr for the 2016-17 season. The junior from North Las Vegas, Nev. joined the Lopes from the College of Southern Idaho, where he played alongside Keonta Vernon in 2014-15.

Carr made his GCU debut on Saturday at Cameron Indoor Stadium against No. 1 Duke and stepped up to the challenge. He led all GCU players with 18 points and 8 assists in 38 minutes of play.





WATCH PARTY (PART II)

Following a 2015-16 season that saw him named to the Lou Henson All-America Team, Joshua Braun was one of three WAC men's basketball players to be named to the Lou Henson Preseason Watch List, an award given to the nation's top Division I mid-major player.

Lou Henson coached for 41 years. When he left the game in 2005, he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779. He is the winningest coach at both Illinois and NM State and is one of only 12 coaches in the history of the game to take two schools to the Final Four.

The recipient of the 2017 Lou Henson Award will be announced at the CollegeInsider.com awards banquet on April 31 in Phoenix, site of the men's Division I Basketball Championship. New Mexico State's Ian Baker and CSU Bakersfield's Dedrick Basile were other WAC players added to the list.

MILSTEAD SIGNS NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT

On Wednesday, Nov. 9, GCU received a National Letter of Intent from Bay Area point guard Damari Milstead to join the Lopes next season.

Milstead, a 6-2, 160-pounder from Moreau Catholic High School in Hayward, Calif., averaged 19.1 points, 5.4 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 3.3 steals last year for a Mariner team that went 25-5, and included current GCU freshman, Oscar Frayer.

"[Oscar and I] are best friends and always talked about going to college together," Milstead told the Arizona Republic last month. "He made me feel comfortable on my visit and the other guys made me feel a part of the family."

GLAZE, ALEXANDER EARN D-LEAGUE ROSTER SPOTS

After an impressive year with the Grand Canyon men's basketball program, Grandy Glaze was selected with the seventh pick in the third round by the Delaware 87ers in the 2016 NBA D-League Players Draft.

Glaze ade quite the impression on the Philadelphia 76ers organization as he participated in their pre-draft workout, leading up to the NBA Draft. Glaze is the first player from GCU to be selected in the NBA D-League Draft under Maierle and the first since GCU made the jump to Division I.

Glaze made the most of his final year of eligibility, earning national headlines as the 2016 Riley Wallace award winner, given to the top transfer in Division I college basketball after averaging 14.0 points and 8.8 rebounds while shooting just under 60 percent from the field for the 2015-16 season under Majerle. He was a consistent force in the paint, leading the Lopes with 14 double-doubles, including single-game highs of 29 points and 15 rebounds.

"We want to continue to bring in better players that have the chance to develop and play at the next level," Majerle added. "The sad thing about Grandy is we only had him for a year. We will always work hard for our players that want to put in the effort and play on the professional level.

GCU is starting to make some noise in the D-League as Glaze was selected by the 87ers and former GCU standout, Daniel Alexander, made the Northern Arizona Suns roster, Alexander averaged 10.1 points and 5.2 rebounds in 52 career games over two season with the Lopes from 2013-2015.

DAN MAJERLE POSTGAME QUOTES:

(on team's quickness giving Duke problems early) "I don't think we ever did what we wanted to. This is a brand new season for our team. We had two of our starters out in DeWayne Russell and Matt Jackson. Darion Clark, our five man, was hurt right before the game. I didn't even know if he was going to go. We had three guys in our starting lineup that had never played for me before. We were trying to figure each other out. To be honest, I didn't know what to expect. I was happy with the way we started off. We played well. I thought we played hard and did a good job. For our first game, obviously I'm not happy with the result, we kind of lost it there. But I thought maybe the first 12 or 13 minutes we played really good. We are just going to learn about our team as we go along. These first 10 games are the hardest stretch. We play four top-30 or top-35 teams with a lot of guys injured. We had eight scholarship guys dressed today. We just have to keep our heads up and keep working. I have to learn about my players and see what they can do."

(on Shaq Carr filling in for DeWayne Russell) "I was happy with Shaq, (but) eight turnovers and eight assists -- he's got to get tighter with the ball. We talked about that and we've talked about that during practice. That's something he's going to have to learn. I knew he was a real good passer with quickness and a good athlete. He has to learn to finish a little bit better around the basket. But overall, I thought he did really well for his first game, especially filling in for a guy like DeWayne, who we missed obviously. I was happy with Shaq, he just has to do a better job with not being so careless and loose with the basketball. Overall, pretty happy with him."

(on Oscar Frayer's collegiate debut) "Oscar doesn't play with any fear. I mean, he's got a long way to go. But I just told him to be an athlete and fly around and do what he does. He just loves playing basketball, and I think Oscar is going to be a really, really good player for us. I've just got to learn about him too, and he's going to be thrown into the fire right away. Playing in this atmosphere for his first college game, I thought he was really good."

ABOUT THE NAISMITH MEMORIAL BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME TIP-OFF TOURNAMENT

The Basketball Hall of Fame hosts the annual Tip-Off Tournament each November. The Tip-Off Tournament is an NCAA exempt men's basketball tournament sponsored by the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC). Each year, top teams and conferences will compete in the Basketball Hall of Fame's event showcasing its talents in New England's only exempt Division I college basketball tournament. The original Tip-Off was held in Springfield for more than 25 years. The format has changed, but the name has remained the same.

Teams scheduled to participate in this year's Tip-Off tournament are: University at Albany (American East Conference), Brown University (Ivy League), University of Cincinnati (American Athletic Conference), Duke University (Atlantic Coast Conference), Grand Canyon University (Western Athletic Conference), Marist College (Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference), Penn State (Big Ten Conference) and University of Rhode Island (Atlantic 10 Conference).

"The Hall of Fame Tip-Off Tournament at Mohegan Sun has become one of the most competitive collegiate events in the month of November," said John L. Doleva, President and CEO of the Basketball Hall of Fame. "With the combination of elite talent and schools in close proximity to the venue, we're sure to have a great crowd and tremendous atmosphere for the fans."

The Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference will continue to serve as the host conference for the annual event. The MAAC has developed a strong partnership with the Basketball Hall of Fame, including the addition of a MAAC exhibit in the Hall of Fame museum in Springfield, Massachusetts.



HEAD COACH DAN MAJERLE

(on his initial thoughts on participating in 2016 Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off Tournament) "Obviously we're very excited. Anytime we get to play in a tournament of this stature is great for Grand Canyon and for our kids. This being our fourth and final year of transition from Division II, we've been able to play in some fantastic arenas. We've played at Kentucky, at Louisville, at Indiana, at San Diego State, and now to be able start this off and opening at Duke, again a great place and one of the hallowed places to play, and it will be a great experience for our kids. Then playing at Penn State and the two games at Mohegan Sun, we're looking forward to the start of the season and being challenged by the No. 1 team in the NCAA."

(on GCU Arena earning the reputation for a tremendous atmosphere and how he expects his players to react to playing at Cameron Indoor Stadium) "It will be interesting. As you said, we have one of the finest student sections in all of college basketball. We sold out our exhibition game the other night—we had 7,200 people. We had 7,200 students for our Midnight Madness. Our kids enjoy playing there, but it's always different when you play in an atmosphere that's not for you. I'm looking forward to it, myself. I've never been in Cameron. I've heard about the Duke student section and what they do. I think it will be a really good experience, not only for the kids but for myself. I've played in some of the greatest arenas in the world as a player. I always enjoyed playing on the road against a hostile crowd. I'm anxious to see how our guys react to that. As I said, it will only make us a better team and stronger from playing in an environment like that. I know I'm looking forward to it and our kids can't wait.'

(on his coaching focuses and priorities so far this season) "Right now, we're trying to stay healthy. We've had a rash of injuries that is really hitting us hard here as of late. We're going to be opening the season without all our players. We're going to be missing our starting point guard. We may be missing our four-man. We've had two guys go down with season injuries. We've got some new kids, some young freshmen and some transfers. I think it's going to take a little bit of time for our team to round into shape, but nobody really cares about that. We just have to go out and play as hard as we can and do the best we can. Right now, I just want to keep us healthy. Our biggest goal, all the time, is to be playing our best basketball when our conference season opens up and having a chance to win the Western Athletic Conference. With the schedule we have this year, it's going to be really tough. Opening up, we play a lot of games on the road, some really good teams. We play four teams in the top-35 in our first 10 games. It will be a great test for our guys. We just have to weather the storm and get better and hopefully get guys back healthy and be playing our best basketball when the WAC season opens up."

(on who has taken on a leadership role on the team and who he expects big seasons from) "Our top two players are returning guys. DeWayne Russell, who is our point guard and won't be playing in the first two games—he's a fifth year guy who is a tremendous leader. He had a great year last year. Josh Braun, who was an Academic All-American last year, he's a junior shooting guard. He was Preseason WAC Player of the Year this year. He's been tremendous as far as his leadership and what he does for this campus and our team, and he's a local kid. Those are two guys that we always rely on heavily and show up every day to work hard. Those two guys are the guys that are going to lead us all year long.'

(on how he defines a successful season for his team in the fourth and final year of transition) "Last year, we went 27-7 and really made a name for ourselves and continued to get better. We had

some huge wins on the road and at neutral sites. We finished second in the WAC and so this year, we have to continue to build on that. It's probably not going to be another 27 win season due to injuries and a tougher schedule. We just need to get better and get our guys better and then after this year, like I said hopefully win the WAC or be in the conversation, so when this transition period is over this year, next year we'll just be a little bit better. As I said, it's always been my goal since I've been here is that first year, to win the WAC and the WAC Tournament and get ourselves into the NCAA Tournament. That's what we push for every day when we practice, to continue to get better and develop our guys.

(on how basketball has taken off on the campus of Grand Canyon) "I came here three years ago and there were 4,000 students. There are now 17,500 students here. Our arena held 5,000 people. We sold out a lot of games our first year, pretty much just as a Division II team. Our president took the roof off the building and added another 2,200 seats. Now we hold 7,200. We sell out every game when the students are here. We have a 4.000-seat Havocs section, which is our student section. that go absolutely bananas. The support that we've had here, not only from Mr. Colangelo, but our President, has been overwhelming. It's been unbelievable what we've been able to do in our first three years as far as aour growth and the growth of this campus. The facilities, they're building us a brand-new practice facility, which will be done in January. This place went from 100 acres to 300 acres as a campus and it just continues to grow every day. It's just a pleasure to work here with such great people. This is truly a really special place. To grow this fast and to have the success we've had in three years is pretty amazing."

(on if he has been able to share a similar hard-nosed defensive mentality with his team as he had when he was a player) "We're going to try. I think a sign of a good coach is if your team plays like you played or plays as your personality, and I think our guys have that personality. They play hard every game. They play hard for 40 minutes; they realy get after it--they overachieve. And that's really all I can ask from them, we're still a work in process. As we get through the transition period, we're going to get better and better players. It's our job to make these guys as good as we can. One of the things I tell our guys all the time is that if I ask them to do something, it's not impossible and it's not too hard because its something that I did as a player. I think that goes a long way with our guys because I was able to come from a Mid-American school at Central Michigan, which was a midmajor and make it to the pros. It's no secret that all these guys, all college athletes, want to go and play at the next level, whether its oversees or in the NBA. I always tell them that here is the formula for you to do it and this is how hard you have to work both mentally and physically. I'm lucky enough that I have guys that will run through a wall for me and work extremely hard every day. I think we've done a great job of developing our guys. I couldn't be happier with the type of players that we have and how hard they work every day.









GRAND CANYON UNIVERSITY ARENA



Grand Canyon University Arena has provided the Lopes a definitive home-court advantage since opening its doors before the 2011-12 basketball season. With a seating capacity of 7.200 and a prime location on campus, the venue is regularly packed to the rafters with students and fans, providing an electric atmosphere ripe for success.

During the past four years, the GCU men's team has been dominant in the arena, posting an overall record of 69-16, including a pair of 15-1 seasons before starting the transition to Division I. The Lopes' record playing a regular complement of Division I guests has been impressive as well, as GCU owns a 39-14 mark since 2013-14. The success on the court helped GCU to a pair of postseason tournament appearances in its first two years transitioning to the NCAA's highest

An intimidating factor for opponents, the large Havocs student section has proven to be one of the best in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). The Havocs create an imposing backdrop for visiting teams as they fill the bleachers with energy and enthusiasm.

With a push from the Havocs, a packed house is becoming a regular occurrence and has led to an incredible rise in attendance for the men's team in the first four years since the GCU Arena opened. Home attendance has more than doubled since the arrival of the arena, with a pergame average of nearly 5,500 fans coming through the doors last year. Among that mark were three contests with raucous crowds of more than 7,000 fans while another upstart crowd of more than 6,500 witnessed the top highlight reel moment in the arena to date: a 68-65 upset of New Mexico on Dec. 23, 2014.

Student-athletes love the atmosphere while also enjoying first-class amenities. The facilities on the GCU campus are among the best in the conference and feature everything student-athletes need to be successful right at their fingertips. From an on-site medical facility to the strength and conditioning area and locker room with a players' lounge and study area, the Lopes have all the comforts of home just a short walk from student housing.

The facility originally broke ground in the summer of 2010 and was completed before the start of the following basketball season. It is owned and operated by the university.



COACHING LEDGER

2013-17 Grand Canyon (Head Coach) 2008-13Phoenix Suns (Assistant Coach)

Former NBA All-Star, Olympian and World Team member Dan Maierle took over the Grand Canyon men's basketball program on March 18, 2013 when he was named the 13th head coach in school history.

It's been quite an impressive run in the Valley for the former Phoenix Suns star. In his first three years, he amassed 59 wins and three postseason berths on the sideline.

Majerle guickly made his mark, guiding the Lopes to a second-place finishes in the Western Athletic Conference in 2014-15 and 2015-16. For the third year in a row under Majerle, the CollegeInsider.com postseason tournament picked the Lopes to play in the postseason as GCU finished an overall mark of 27-7, including 11-3 in conference play. Among the highlights of the season was a road win over San Diego State, 52-45, on Dec. 18, 2015. The Lopes followed that up with victories over Houston and Marshall to win the Global Sports Classic in Las Vegas, Nev. GCU broke the GCU Arena attendance record when the broke New Mexico State's 14-game winning streak in WAC play. On the season, GCU won 18 games at home, ranking them second in the country.

Behind Majerle's presence and a rising team, GCU averaged 5,413 fans over 21 home games in 2014-15, when they finished with an overall mark of 17-15. It was an increase in average attendance from the previous season of 1,030 fans per game, the 24th-highest increase in the NCAA last year. Among its 13 wins at home was a keystone victory against New Mexico, 68-65, on Dec. 23, 2014.

Majerle completed his first year at GCU in 2013-14 by being named a finalist for the Joe B. Hall award, which is given to the most outstanding first-year Division I head coach. Being nominated for such an honor came after guiding the team to a 15-15 overall record in its first year of reclassification to Division I. The Lopes, originally tabbed to finish eighth in the Western Athletic Conference, used a 10-6 conference mark to claim third place among the nine teams. GCU also received a bid to the CollegeInsider.com postseason tournament, its first at the Division I level.

Before starting his tenure at Grand Canyon, Majerle spent five years as an assistant coach with the NBA's Phoenix Suns from 2008-13. He is one of the most popular figures in Suns history, having also played eight seasons

with the team from 1988 to 1995 and 2001-02.

In all, Majerle played 14 seasons in the NBA and averaged 11.4 points over 955 career games. He made three All-Star appearances and also was named to the 1990-91 and 1992-93 NBA All-Defensive second team. He led the league in 3-pointers made (192) in 1993-94.

Majerle, the 14th overall selection in the 1988 NBA Draft by the Suns, was runner-up by one vote to the Indiana Pacers' Detlef Schrempf for the league's Sixth Man Award in 1990-91 with averages of 13.6 points and 5.4 rebounds per game. He averaged a career-best 17.3 points during the 1991-92 season, the same year that he was selected for his first NBA All-Star Game.

Majerle made his second consecutive trip to the All-Star Game in 1992-93 and finished tied for the league lead in 3-point field goals with 167. He set a Suns record with eight 3-pointers made on Jan. 30, 1993, and did it once more in Game 5 of the Western Conference finals against the Seattle SuperSonics.

Following the 1993-94 season, Majerle was named one of the members of Dream Team II, the U.S. basketball squad that won gold at the 1994 World Championship of Basketball in Ontario, Canada. This was Majerle's second time representing his country, the first coming with the U.S. Olympic basketball team that won the bronze medal at the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, South Korea, where he played under iconic basketball coach John Thompson. That same year, he was named the Olympic Athlete of the Year.

He was chosen as a starter for his third All-Star Game in 1994-95 as he averaged 17.4 points in the first half of the season, becoming the first reserve to be voted an All-Star starter since fan balloting began in 1975.

Majerle, originally from Traverse City, Mich., played college basketball at Central Michigan, where he averaged more than 20 points in three of his four seasons and was an All-Mid-American Conference selection each year of his career. During his senior season, he averaged 23.7 points and 10.8 rebounds while hitting 52.2 percent from the field. He completed his career at CMU ranked second all-time in scoring, steals and field-goal percentage.

In 2003, Majerle's outstanding playing career was recognized by the Phoenix Sun when they placed him in the prestigious Ring of Honor. Each year since then, the Suns organization has handed out the Dan Majerle Hustle Award, given to the player who most personifies the same hustle and determination displayed by Majerle in his playing career.




