# FIGHTING ILLINI WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

## QUICK HITS

- THURSDAY'S GAME:** Illinois (7-7, 0-1) hosts No. 14/15 Penn State on Thursday night, looking for its first Big Ten victory. The Illini dropped a 76-64 overtime decision to Wisconsin on Friday, then had their Monday game at Northwestern postponed because of severe weather. Penn State earned a 16-point win at Iowa on Sunday, 87-71, in its conference opener. The game is the first of two straight for the Illini against top-20 foes as Illinois hosts No. 16/14 Nebraska on Sunday.
- TAKING ADVANTAGE OF TURNOVERS:** The Illini have regularly out-scored opponents off turnovers this season, averaging 24.1 points off turnovers per game, an 8.9-point per game advantage over their foes. Illinois has posted 29 points off miscues in each of its last two games and UI has scored over 20 points off turnovers eight times this season.
- CRAWFORD TAKES CENTER STAGE:** After serving as Illinois' second scoring threat through much of the non-conference slate, junior Ivory Crawford has asserted herself more on the offensive end of late. Crawford posted a game-high 23 points at No. 19 Georgia on Dec. 28 and scored 20 against Wisconsin on Jan. 3, the first back-to-back 20-point games in her career. She is averaging 13.9 points per game and has scored in double digits 11 times, with a season high of 24 against Bradley on Nov. 8. She also is averaging 5.3 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.9 steals in 29.1 minutes per game.
- SENIOR CONTINUES TO #SCOREMOORE:** Senior Amber Moore was recognized by the Big Ten for the second-straight week on Dec. 23, earning mention on the weekly Honor Roll thanks to her 26-point performance that led Illinois to a 15-point win over UT Martin on Dec. 21. Moore was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Dec. 16 after serving as catalyst of the come-from-behind win over Seton Hall on Dec. 9. The senior scored 22 of her 24 points in the second half, including shooting 7-of-11 from the field and 4-of-7 from three-point range. With 43 seconds remaining, Moore made the game-tying trey to cap a 25-5 Illinois run. Her 11 rebounds resulted in her second double-double of the season and third in her career. It was Moore's second player of the week honor this season.
- 70 THE MAGIC NUMBER:** The 70-point threshold has been a determining factor for the Illini defense this season, as Illinois is 7-0 when holding its opponent to 70 or fewer points. Both Seton Hall and Mississippi Valley State reached 70 points, but Illinois won both of those games. Illinois has been almost as predictable when it scores 70 or more points, holding a 7-1 mark when topping 70, with the only loss a 98-92 barn-burner against Bradley in the season-opener.
- MOORE AN ALL-AROUND THREAT:** Senior Amber Moore has 48 three-pointers on the season and is averaging 3.43 per game, which ranks sixth nationally. She has 54.5 percent of the Illini's total treys and no other player has more than 11 triples this season. But Moore isn't just a long-range gunner. She also has the second-most free throws on the team, making 31-of-35 (.886) from the line, and leads the team with 6.3 rebounds per game. She also shares the team lead with 2.0 steals and is fourth with 2.1 assists per game.
- STARTERS CARRY SCORING LOAD:** Illinois has three starters averaging double figures and two more over 8.9 ppg. With the squad averaging 74.3 points per game, the starters are scoring 83.9 percent of the points.



**HEAD COACH**  
**MATT BOLLANT**  
 26-21 // SECOND SEASON

In his second season as head coach at the University of Illinois in 2013-14, Matt Bollant has begun to revive a dormant Illini program. He led the Orange and Blue to the postseason for the first time in three years in 2013 and Illinois finished with a winning Big Ten record for the first time in 10 seasons. He also has spearheaded the signing of consecutive top-25 recruiting classes in his first two years in Champaign.

In 2012-13, the Illini reached the Women's NIT quarterfinals and saw attendance at the Assembly Hall increase 80 percent from 2011-12 to an average of 1,926, the third-highest average attendance increase in Division I women's basketball. Illinois also defeated three ranked opponents: No. 6 Georgia, No. 24 Iowa and No. 24 Ohio State, with the win over the Buckeyes snapping their 31-game home winning streak. The win over the Hawkeyes also broke an eight-game skid against Iowa.

The Illini shattered the Big Ten record for steals, steals per game and turnovers forced in a conference season, and also broke school records for steals, turnovers forced and three-pointers made in a season. Senior forward Karisma Penn became one of the country's most dominant post players, averaging 19.2 points, 9.6 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.2 blocked shots per game with 50.6 percent field-goal shooting, all of which ranked in the top five in the Big Ten. She was named an Associated Press honorable mention All-American and also earned two national player of the week honors. Senior guard Adrienne GodBold earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year honors after posting 55 steals in 16 conference games and routinely guarding opponents' top offensive players.

- Led Illinois to its first postseason berth in three years in 2012-13 and a winning Big Ten record for the first time in 10 years
- Guided the Illini to the quarterfinals of the Women's NIT and five wins over teams who were ranked or receiving votes, with two of those wins coming on the road.
- Helped Karisma Penn become an honorable mention All-American and Adrienne GodBold become the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year in 2012-13.
- Illinois broke the Big Ten record for steals, steals per game, and turnovers forced in a conference season, and also shattered school records for steals, turnovers forced and three-pointers made in a season.
- The Illini generated the third largest average attendance increase in Division-I in 2012-13, jumping 80% from the prior season.
- Led Illinois to a win over No. 6 Georgia on Dec. 28, 2012, marking the highest-ranked team that the Illini have beaten since 2000.
- Has a 308-75 (.804) record in 12 seasons as a head coach and has led his team to the postseason in all 11 years.

## FIGHTING ILLINI WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

• **FEARSOME FOURSOME LEADS THE WAY:** Amber Moore registered double figures in the Illini's first 13 games and has six 20-point efforts. Ivory Crawford has posted double figures 11 times and Jacqui Grant has done it 10 times, with Sarah Hartwell accomplishing it seven times. Moore is fifth in the Big Ten in scoring average (17.9 ppg), Crawford is 17th (13.9) and Grant is 27th (12.4).

• **GRANT WILL NOT SURRENDER:** Freshman forward Jacqui Grant has started her Illini career on a strong note, averaging 12.4 points and 6.2 rebounds per game over the first 14 games, including double-doubles against Georgia Tech and Bradley. The Park Ridge, Ill., native scored 12 points and pulled down 14 boards, including 10 offensive rebounds, in 27 minutes against the Braves. Her 10 offensive boards are tied for fourth-most in a game in school history. She had 14 points and 11 rebounds at Georgia Tech and went for 20 points (including 15 in the first half) and seven boards at No. 11 Colorado. Grant is replacing Karisma Penn in the middle, who finished second in school history with 42 career double-doubles and had 14 last season.

• **MOORE BIG POW:** Senior guard/forward Amber Moore was named Big Ten Player of the Week for the first time on Nov. 18 after averaging 25.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 2.7 steals per game in three Illini wins the previous week. She dominated against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 14, scoring 27 and pulling down a career-high 19 rebounds, scored 23 and hauled in seven boards against Valparaiso on Nov. 12, and capped the week with a 25-point performance in only 23 minutes against Alcorn State on Nov. 21.

• **RECORDS FALL AGAINST ALCORN STATE:** Illinois broke the school record for margin of victory with its 84-point win over Alcorn State on Nov. 17, and the Lady Braves' 10-point second-half output also broke the State Farm Center mark for fewest points in a half. ASU's 15.21 field-goal percentage was the worst by an Illini opponent in school history and the Braves' seven field goals were the second-fewest by an Illini opponent.

• **MOORE BREAKS CAREER TREYS MARK:** With four treys on Nov. 12, Amber Moore broke the school record for career three-point field goals made. Moore now sits in first place with 255 career treys, surpassing Lori Bjork's 214. She also ranks sixth in Big Ten history, seven behind Iowa's Lindsey Meder (261, 1999-02). Last year, Moore broke school records for three-pointers made in a season and three-pointers attempted in a season and a career. She ranked fifth nationally through games of Jan. 2 and leads the Big Ten with 3.4 treys per game, and is hitting them at a 37.5-percent clip, above her career 35.1 percentage heading into this season.

### SCOUTING THE LADY LIONS

• No. 14/15 Penn State is 10-3 on the season and 1-0 in the Big Ten after beating Iowa 87-71 in Iowa City on Sunday. The Lady Lions have been ranked in the top 20 of both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls all year.

• Penn State is 2-1 in true road games this season, with wins over Iowa and Georgetown, and a loss to South Dakota State. The Lady Lions also beat Oregon State and Illinois State in the Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas over Thanksgiving.

• Senior Maggie Lucas leads PSU, averaging 21.1 points per game. She also is shooting an NCAA-best 97.4 percent from the free-throw line and Penn State ranks third nationally in free-throw percentage. The Lions also rank 11th nationally in blocked shots per game at 5.8.

• PSU ranks third in the Big Ten in scoring offense (77.2 ppg) but is ninth in scoring defense (65.3 ppg). The Lions are ninth in field-goal percentage (.421) but second in field-goal defense (.346). Penn State is shooting a league-worst .273 from the arc and has the ninth-best three-point defense (.302), but counters that with the second-most blocked shots (5.8 per game) and fourth-best rebounding margin (+6.2) in the conference. PSU also ranks third in steals (9.3 pg), first in offensive rebounds (14.7 pg) and second in defensive rebounds (31.1 pg).

# FIGHTING ILLINI WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

## SERIES HISTORY AGAINST PENN STATE

Penn State leads the all-time series with the Illini 29-14 but Illinois actually holds a 10-9 margin in games played in Champaign. PSU has won three of the last four meetings at State Farm Center, with the Illini's lone win during that stretch a 69-60 victory in 2009. Illinois won five straight home games against PSU from 1997-2002.

## UI POSTS HISTORIC COMEBACK AGAINST HALL

Illinois staged one of the biggest comebacks in school history Dec. 9 at State Farm Center, coming back from a 20-point deficit with 8:45 remaining in the game to beat Seton Hall 71-70 and snap a three-game losing streak. Nia Oden made 1-of-2 free throws to push Illinois ahead by a point and Seton Hall's Ka-Deidre Simmons' running three-pointer banged off the backboard and the front of the rim before bouncing away, giving the Illini the heart-pounding victory and marking their seventh-straight home win. The Illini finished the game on a 28-7 run over the final 8:45.

## HOME SWEET HOME

The Illini are riding a wave of momentum at home, as they are 6-1 this season inside State Farm Center. They had won eight straight home games before falling to Wisconsin in overtime on Jan. 3. This year, the Illini are averaging 83.1 points per game at home while holding opponents to just 58.3 points per game. Last season, the Illini went 11-7 under Bollant at home and won six of their last seven home games, meaning Illinois now has won 12 of its last 14 home games.

## MOORE DEADLY FROM THE STRIPE

While Amber Moore is more widely known as a three-point shooter, she is even better from 15 feet. The senior was the last player in the Big Ten to remain perfect from the free-throw line this season before missing one at Georgia Tech on Dec. 4. She is 31-of-35 from the stripe and currently stands first on Illinois' career free-throw percentage record list at 86.4 percent (153-177).

## MOORE THAN JUST A SHOOTER

On Nov. 14, Amber Moore proved that she not only can be a major scoring threat for the illini, but also can dictate the rebounding battle as well. The senior captured a career-high 19 rebounds, blowing by her previous best of 10. In fact, her 19 rebounds tied the eighth-highest single-game total in Illinois history. The last Illini to accomplish 19 rebounds in a game was Karisma Penn vs. Georgia on Dec. 28, 2012, which also marked Penn's career high.

## MOORE HISTORY TO BE MADE

Last season, Amber Moore put her name in the Illini record book when she broke the school record for three-point field goals made in a season with 86, besting the original mark of 84 made by Lori Bjork (2006-07). Through 14 games this season, Moore already has 48 total treys, good for a 3.42 average per game, which ranked fifth nationally as of Jan. 2 and leads the Big Ten. At that rate, Moore is on pace to surpass her own record with 103 three-pointers. Heading into the season, Moore already held UI records for career and season three-pointers attempted, and season three-pointers made.

## MOORE JOINS 1,000 POINT CLUB

With 251 points through 14 games, Moore is the 26th player in Illinois history to cross the 1,000 point barrier. Moore's 26 points against UT Martin on Dec. 21 pushed her past Krista Reinking for 16th place and she now has 1,235 career points. Moore needs 84 points to pass Lynnette Robinson for 15th place.

# FIGHTING ILLINI WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

The Orange and Blue are creating 22.5 turnovers per game while only making 16.2 of their own, good for a turnover margin of +6.3, which leads the Big Ten by 2.5 turnovers per game.

## ILLINI BOMB SQUAD BACK AT IT

After breaking school records for three-pointers made (184) and attempted (634) in a season in 2012-13, the Illini picked up where they left off. So far, Illinois is averaging 6.3 treys per game and has hit 10 or more threes four times. Illinois drained 12-of-27 three-pointers at Bradley on Nov. 9, tying the single-game school record and marking the Illini's most three-pointers made in a loss in school history. They nearly tied that mark again on Nov. 14 against Mississippi Valley State, converting 11 threes on 26 attempts, then hit 10-of-22 against Alcorn State on Nov. 17 and 10-of-19 against UT Martin on Dec. 21.

Before Matt Bollant arrived in Champaign, Illinois had hit 10 or more threes in a game seven times. During his 47-game tenure with the Illini, they have already topped that, hitting 10+ three-pointers eight times.

## BOLLANT SIGNS SECOND TOP-25 CLASS

Head coach Matt Bollant announced the addition of three players to the Illini squad for the 2014-15 season on Nov. 13. Chatrice White, Amarah Coleman and Brooke Kissinger all signed their national letters of intent with the Illini today.

The Collegiate Girls Basketball Report has the class ranked 23rd overall in the NCAA, with two top-100 recruits. The class is also ranked third in the Big Ten, only behind Ohio State (1) and Nebraska (2).

White is ESPN HoopGurlz' No. 27 player nationally in the class of 2014 and the No. 4 post player. Coleman is ranked No. 81 overall and is the No. 19 point guard in the class, while Kissinger is the No. 18 guard nationally. White and Kissinger – who both hail from Nebraska – play for the same AAU team, the Cornhusker Shooting Stars, while Coleman is a native of Bolingbrook, Ill., and currently attends Homewood-Flossmoor High School. Coleman is the sister-step of Fighting Illini men's basketball freshman point guard Jaylon Tate.

## NEWCOMERS HELP FILL VOID DOWN LOW

With Penn exhausting her eligibility in 2012-13 and signing with an Italian professional team and career-ending injuries to forwards Kersten Magrum and Kierra Morris, the Illini were left with sophomore McKenzie Piper as their only returning post player. But freshmen forwards Jacqui Grant and Sarah Livingston have stepped in admirably, averaging a combined 19.5 points and 11.1 rebounds through nine games, with four double-doubles between them.

## ILLINI NEED NEW SCORING THREATS TO EMERGE

The Illini will look to fill a major void in the scoring column this year, as they lost 45.9 percent of their total points from 2012-13, largely as a result of the departure of Karisma Penn and Adrienne GodBold. The Illini ranked ninth in the Big Ten in percentage of points returning from last season at 54.1. But senior Amber Moore showed late last season that she can shoulder more of the scoring load, averaging 16.8 points and 3.5 three-pointers in four Women's NIT games, over four points better than her season average. Junior Ivory Crawford also flashed potential last season, scoring in double figures in 21 of 33 games and leading Illinois in scoring four times – including a 32-point outburst against Cleveland State on Nov. 18.

# FIGHTING ILLINI WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

## PLENTY OF NEW FACES IN ILLINI PROGRAM

Illinois has a number of new faces in the gym this season, with seven newcomers joining seven returning players on the roster. Freshmen Kennedy Cattenhead, Taylor Gleason, Jacqui Grant, Sarah Livingston, Ashley McConnell and Mikaala Shackelford have joined the squad, as has junior Kiley Simmons, who transferred from Missouri. Simmons must sit out 2013-14 because of NCAA transfer rules. And Sarah Hartwell, who sat out last season after transferring from Georgia Tech, is part of the active roster this season and has taken over as Illinois' starting point guard.

## CRAWFORD, SMITH READY FOR LARGER ROLES

With much of the preseason discussion about the Illini focusing on Amber Moore and Sarah Hartwell, junior guards Ivory Crawford and Alexis Smith are in position to take on larger roles in 2013-14. Crawford showed the ability to score in bunches with her 32-point performance against Cleveland State and a 25-point outburst at Michigan, and should thrive after being in head coach Matt Bollant's system for another year. Smith nearly broke the school record for assists in a season – about as quietly as one can do that – falling 10 shy of Michele Vossen's record of 173. While that load of distributing will be spread out more with Sarah Hartwell joining the backcourt, Smith can play an integral part in a successful season.

## ILLINI GO THROUGH SEAL TEAM TRAINING

During the offseason, the Illini took part in a unique form of team-building as they worked with SEAL Team Physical Training, a company founded by former Navy SEAL John McGuire. Players and coaches took part in workouts that included races, push-ups, sit-ups, water workouts and relays. The course is designed to foster team unity, mental toughness and togetherness, and is especially useful to groups like the Illini who have a large number of newcomers.

## UI, STATE FARM ANNOUNCE NAMING AGREEMENT

In April, it was announced that the Illini's home arena now will be called State Farm Center after being named Assembly Hall for its first 50 years. The University of Illinois and State Farm announced a 30-year, \$60 million naming rights agreement that is the largest in the nation for a college-only facility. The agreement is one of the cornerstones of a projected \$165 million renovation of the storied arena dubbed the "Illinois Renaissance" that will begin in earnest in spring 2014 and is expected to be completed in the fall of 2016.
