KICKIN' IT

- Fifth-ranked and second-seeded Penn State women's soccer opens its 29th-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance on Friday, Nov. 10, as the Nittany Lions play host to the Northeast Conference champion Central Connecticut State Blue Devils in a 6 p.m. start on Jeffrey Field. The match will stream live to a worldwide audience of authenticated subscribers via ESPN+ and the ESPN app.
- The Blue & White return to the pitch after an eight-day hiatus from play following a narrow 1-0 overtime loss to the eventual B1G Tournament champion Iowa Hawkeyes last Thursday in Columbus, Ohio. PSU and Iowa battled to a scoreless tie through regulation, but Iowa managed a match-winner in the 95th minute to advance to the league final.
- In the Nittany Lion B1G semifinal defeat to Iowa, senior+ midfielder and team captain Cori Dyke became the Penn State all-time career record holder for matches started and moved into a tie for first in total appearances following her 104th.
- Penn State's streak of 29 consecutive NCAA Tournament berths stands as the second-longest active streak across all Division I women's soccer programs. PSU booked its first postseason berth in 1995 and has appeared in every tournament since.

BATTLING THE BLUE DEVILS

- Central Connecticut State arrives in Happy Valley as the automatic qualifier representing the Northeast Conference, earning the league's bid after securing their 13th conference tournament crown in program history. The Blue Devils are 10-4-5 overall this season and booked a 7-0-3 ledger against conference foes. CCSU will make its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance since the 2018 campaign on Friday in University Park.
- The Blue Devils are led by 24-year head coach Mick D'Arcy and are directed on the pitch by NEC Offensive Player of the Year Giavanna Inzerillo. The star striker owns 36 points and 15 goals this season, while Abbie Burgess leads the squad in assists with eight. Goalkeeper Melina Ford paces the squad with 43 assists this year.

AGAINST THE NEC

- Penn State and Central Connecticut State get set for their first all-time meeting in women's soccer on Friday evening. PSU will square off against a current member of the Northeast Conference for just the third time in the program's 30 varsity seasons. The match will also be the second all-time postseason meeting against an NEC challenger.
- En route to its first NCAA Women's College Cup appearance of the Erica Dambach era, PSU faced off against LIU in the opening round of the 2012 tournament on Jeffrey Field, logging a 4-0 result. PSU faced Saint Francis in a 2001 regular season meeting on Oct. 23 of that year, booking a 5-0 victory.

2022 NCAA TOURNAMENT IN REVIEW

- Penn State returns to the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship for the 29th season in a row and is fresh off a run to the Sweet 16 a year ago. PSU has reached the third round, or Sweet 16, in every season since 2017 when the Blue & White
- The 2022 Tournament began for Penn State with a dominant opening-round showing against the Quinnipiac Bobcats on Jeffrey Field. PSU faced off against then-national scoring leader and current Nittany Lion forward Rebecca Cooke, with the Blue & White picking up a strong 4-1 victory to advance to the second round.
- Faced with a snow squall in the opening moments of the match, PSU persevered through the elements and booked its second-consecutive match with four goals scored as the Nittany Lions recorded a 4-0 rout of the border-rival West Virginia Mountaineers. Penn State's 2022 postseason run came to an end in University Park later that week-end, as Virginia advanced to the National Quarterfinals with a 3-2 overtime result.

THE STANDARD IS THE STANDARD

- Penn State enters its 29th consecutive NCAA Tournament as the only program from the Big Ten Conference to appear in every postseason event since 1995. The Nittany Lions boast one of the strongest postseason resumes across all of Division I women's soccer, winning the 2015 National Championship, appearing in two National Championship matches (2012, 2015) and earning five Women's College Cup showings (1999, 2002, 2005, 2012, 2015).
- Penn State has advanced to the quarterfinals 13 times with a 5-8 mark in those matches. In NCAA Tournament action at home, the Nittany Lions have amassed an impressive record of 43-7-1 at Jeffrey Field, outscoring opponents 155-38.
- Penn State has hosted the first round in each of the last 11 seasons excluding the 2020-21 spring slate, a streak dating to the 2011 campaign. The entire 2020-21 NCAA Tournament was held in Cary, North Carolina, for precautionary reasons during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Nittany Lions are 22-3 in first-round matches (PSU received byes from the first round in 1998, 1999 & 2000) and PSU is in the midst of a 13-match first-round winning streak.

29TH TIME'S THE CHARM

- After landing their 29th-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament on Monday, Nov. 6, the Nittany Lions officially cemented themselves in second place for the longest active NCAA Tournament streak in Division I.
- Penn State previously trailed longtime tournament participant and ACC-rival Virginia, but after the Cavaliers failed to reach the 2023 Tournament following an 8-3-6 overall season, PSU moved into sole possession of second place. Virginia had appeared in every tournament from 1994, Penn State's inaugural campaign, through a quarterfinal appearance in the 2022 season.
- Non-conference rival and 21-time NCAA Champion North Carolina is the only program in the nation with a longer Tournament selection streak than Penn State, appearing in all 42 NCAA Tournaments since the highest governing body in collegiate athletics adopted the sport in the fall of 1982.

BIG TIME POSTSEASON

- The Big Ten Conference made history during the 2023 NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Selection Show, landing Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Michigan State, Nebraska, Ohio State, Penn State, Rutgers and Wisconsin in the 64-team national tournament field.
- The nine NCAA Tournament selections set the Big Ten Conference record for the most postseason selections in a given season for women's soccer in league history. Five of the nine Big Ten programs earned top-six seeds in their respective quadrants of the bracket and will play host to first-round matches. As the No. 2 seed in the Clemson regional, Penn State would also serve as the host for second-and-third round matches on Nov. 17 & 19, should the Nittany Lions advance this weekend. With the announcement, the Big Ten has now had at least four of its current women's soccer programs advance to the NCAA Tournament every year for 29 consecutive seasons.

LAST TIME OUT: IOWA

- Fourth-seeded and fifth-ranked Penn State dropped a heart-wrenching 1-0 overtime decision to the eighth-seeded Iowa Hawkeyes in Big Ten Tournament semifinal action from Lower.com Field in Columbus, Ohio, on Thursday, Nov. 2. The squads played 90 minutes of scoreless soccer before Iowa tallied in the 95th.
- In a chippy, back-and-forth affair, the Hawkeyes battled for a narrow 14-11 differential in total shot attempts, with a 5-4 tally in shots on goal. Penn State utilized a strong second half to work up a 4-2 differential in the corner kick battle, picking up its 11th win in the statistical category this season.

KEYSTONE STATS

- Penn State ranks inside the top three in the B1G in fewest fouls per match (1st, 7.32), goals-against average (1st, 0.520), save percentage (1st, 0.880), winning percentage (1st, 0.789), goal differential (2nd, +29), assists per match (3rd, 2.00), shutout percentage (3rd, 0.526), total assists (3rd, 38), total goals scored (3rd, 39) and total points scored (3rd, 116).
- The Nittany Lions rank inside the top-25 in all of Division I women's soccer in multiple statistical categories, including save percentage (6th, 0.880), goals-against average (12th, 0.520), winning percentage (14th, 0.789), goal differential (20th, +29) and fewest fouls per match (25th, 7.32).

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Penn State boasts one of the most dominant back lines in all of Division I women's soccer, leading the Big Ten Conference while ranking 12th nationally in goals-against average. PSU's backline and goalkeepers have allowed a mere 10 scores through this point in the 2023 campaign, and has surrendered multiple goals in a match only once. PSU was shorthanded after a first-half red card at Northwestern, with the Wildcats tallying a pair of goals in what became a 2-2 draw in Evanston.
- Nittany Lion goalkeepers have dominated all opponents in the 2023 campaign, highlighted by starting shot-stopper and team captain Katherine Asman. The Roswell, Georgia, native ranks 12th in the nation and first in the B1G with an individual GAA of 0.498, while simultaneously leading the league in save percentage and ranking seventh nationally with a 0.889 mark. Penn State's trio of keepers have combined for a 0.880 save percentage, leading the B1G and ranking sixth nationally as a group.

STARTIN' STRONG

- The Blue & White published one of the strongest regular season finishes in program history in 2023, logging the fourth regular season campaign at PSU all-time that featured one loss or fewer. Penn State finished both the 2020-21 and 2004 regular seasons with just one loss, while the 2005 squad went unbeaten on the year at 23-0-2.
- Following the team's win over Princeton on Sept. 7, PSU's 30th varsity squad became just the second team in school history to complete the non-conference slate undefeated.
- Penn State's 6-1-3 finish in Big Ten Conference competition this season marked the 17th B1G season in program history with one loss or fewer. The Nittany Lions finished fourth in the league with 21 points, their best league finish since winning the conference title in 2020-21.
- PSU is one of just 24 NCAA Division I teams to record two losses or fewer through this point in the year, ranking 14th nationally in winning percentage with a 0.789 mark.

BALLIN' WITH BALANCE

- Penn State women's soccer boasts one of the most balanced attacks in the nation, with 18 different student-athletes logging at least one point through the first 18 matches of the season. In total, 26 members of the Nittany Lions' 30-woman roster have appeared in at least one match, with 17 earning starts.
- On the offensive end, 14 different Nittany Lions have amassed a total of 39 goals on the season. PSU's balanced offensive front has allowed 10 student-athletes to score at least twice, with sophomore midfielder Olivia Borgen and redshirt junior forward Kaitlyn MacBean leading the team with six goals apiece on the year. Senior+ forward Payton Linnehan ranks second on the 2023 roster with five goals scored.

TOPDRAWER TALENT

- TopDrawerSoccer announced its midseason rankings of the top-100 players in women's college soccer, with a trio of Nittany Lions earning appearances on the list. Senior+ midfielder Cori Dyke led the way for the Blue & White, earning the No. 32 ranking, with junior defender Mieke Schiemann (No. 70) and graduate goalkeeper Katherine Asman (No. 72) rounding out the Penn State appearances.
- Dyke has been instrumental in PSU's success throughout the season, earning starts at both the centerback and holding midfield positions. Schiemann has served as a crucial set-piece target while holding down the back line as a centerback for PSU.
- Asman has carved out a reputation for herself as one of the strongest individual goalkeepers in the nation, ranking seventh nationally in save percentage with a 0.889 mark.

UNITED, WE RANKED

- Penn State debuted at the No. 10 position in the inaugural United Soccer Coaches poll of the 2023 season maintained a top-10 ranking in every subsequent release. The Nittany Lions earned the No. 5 ranking in the final regular season release after holding the No. 4 spot for five weeks earlier this season. The No. 4 mark was the program's highest ranking since the 2020-21 spring campaign. Prior to the organization's Sept. 19 release, PSU owned the No. 6 spot for three consecutive weeks, matching the program's highest ranking from last year.
- The Blue & White stand as the highest-ranked team in the B1G at the end of the conference tournament season, leading a group of five programs that were either ranked or receiving votes. The Wisconsin Badgers improved four spots following their B1G quarterfinal advancement over Rutgers, while the Nebraska Cornhuskers also saw a four-spot improvement by rising to No. 15. The B1G co-champion Michigan State Spartans fell eight spots following their upset loss against Iowa two weeks ago, while Indiana fell into the receiving votes category after their loss to PSU. Penn State non-conference opponent North Carolina (13) rounds out the five Nittany Lion challengers in and around the final United Soccer Coaches top-25.

AWARD-WINNING WORK

- Penn State racked up a litany of individual weekly accolades over the course of the 2023 regular season. Graduate goalkeeper Katherine Asman most recently hauled in her third Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week distinction in 2023 and her second in a row, garnering recognition following her shutout against Purdue as well as her career-high-tying 11-save effort at Northwestern in the conference's Oct. 17 release.
- Senior defender Eva Alonso, redshirt junior forward Kaitlyn MacBean and junior defender Mieke Schiemann have each landed individual placements on the TopDrawerSoccer National Team of the Week, with Alonso earning a spot on Sept. 19, Schiemann garnering a placement on Sept. 12 and MacBean appearing on Aug. 29.
- Senior defender Ellie Wheeler, senior+ midfielder Cori Dyke and sophomore midfielder Olivia Borgen have each hauled in TopDrawerSoccer Honorable Mention National Team of the Week accolades this season, earning those honors on Aug. 22, Sept. 26, and most recently Oct. 17, respectively.
- In addition to Asman's back-to-back accolades on Oct. 10 and Oct. 17, Penn State hauled in three additional B1G weekly accolades through the conclusion of the 2023 regular season campaign. In the B1G's first release on Aug. 22, Dyke, as well as Asman brought home Defensive Player of the Week and Co-Goalkeeper of the Week, respectively. Senior+ defender Kate Wiesner landed B1G Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors on Tuesday, Sept. 19.

LIVIN' LIKE 'LIV

- Sophomore midfielder Olivia Borgen is in the midst of a breakout campaign for the Blue & White, pacing the Nittany Lions in total goals scored this season with six. Her performance in the regular season against Northwestern on the road featured her first collegiate brace, as well as a career-high tying two shots on goal. Borgen added her first collegiate assist in PSU's B1G quarterfinal win over Indiana two weeks ago.
- The Hanson, Massachusetts, native secured the first national accolade of her collegiate career on Oct. 17, as TopDrawerSoccer named her to the Honorable Mention National Team of the Week. The award made her the sixth different Nittany Lion to land weekly national honors this year.

PAYTON'S PLACES

- Senior+ forward Payton Linnehan continues her strong 2023 campaign, ranking tied for second on the Nittany Lion roster in total scoring this season while simultaneously ranking third on the roster in goals scored. The Douglas, Massachusetts, native has published five goals and 13 total points through 15 matches started this year.
- Linnehan currently stands as the highest-scoring active player on the Penn State roster, leading the squad in career scoring with 81 points split between 29 career goals and 23 assists. Her 11 match-winning goals over the past five seasons also stand as an active career high at PSU. The FC Stars product has started 73 matches and played in 86 since the 2019 campaign.

ASTOUNDING ASMAN

- Graduate captain and goalkeeper Katherine Asman maintains the best statistical season by a goalkeeper in the B1G this year, boasting 19 starts with the conference's best goals-against average (0.498) and the 12th-best GAA in all of Division I women's soccer. She also leads the B1G and ranks seventh nationally in save percentage with a 0.889 mark. Asman hauled in a trio of B1G Goalkeeper of the Week accolades this season in addition to being crowned as the All-B1G Second Team goalkeeper following the conference office's release on Friday, Oct. 27.
- Asman made history in PSU's win over Ohio State on Oct. 8, as she became the fourth goalkeeper in program history to crack the 50-win club all-time. Asman joins Nittany Lion legends Emily Oleksiuk, Britt Eckerstrom and Alyssa Naeher on the list.
- Asman ranks prominently in the Penn State record book in multiple career goalkeeping statistical categories. The Roswell, Georgia, native has recorded the third-most shut-outs in program history (26), ranks third in career saves (312), third in career minutes played (7,234) and owns the fourth-most GK wins in program history with 52.

BEANY BALL

- Redshirt junior forward Kaitlyn MacBean has carved out a reputation for herself as one of the premier clutch players in the Big Ten Conference. The Excelsior, Minnesota, native has notched a quartet of match-winning goals for the Blue & White this season, booking the decisive score against West Virginia, TCU, Michigan State and Ohio State.
- MacBean's propensity for logging match-winning goals places her as the third-best clutch performer in the Big Ten Conference while ranking 31st nationally. She trails Nebraska star Eleanor Dale for the league lead in match-winners, with the Cornhusker leading all of Division I in the category with eight this season.
- MacBean's breakout redshirt junior season was rewarded by the conference office at the conclusion of the regular season, landing her as an All-B1G Third Team selection.

EVA'S EMERGENCE

- Senior defender Eva Alonso's return to Penn State's starting XI in the 2023 season has coincided with the team's resurgence to the top of the national conversation. The Madrid, Spain, native has started in 18 of 19 Nittany Lion contests this year and has already significantly surpassed her total minutes played from the 2022 campaign.
- Alonso notched the 15th instance of a Nittany Lion passing for three assists all-time in Penn State's rout of Maryland and became the first to accomplish that feat since Kate Wiesner did so in the second round of last year's NCAA Tournament.
- The senior owns seven total assists, the fifth-most in the conference and 57th-most nationally, while notching 0.39 assists per match, the sixth-best mark in the B1G and 59th-highest tally across Division I.

CORI'S CORNER

- Senior+ midfielder Cori Dyke took home Big Ten Defender of the Year accolades, in addition to All-Big Ten First Team recognition following a release from the conference office on Friday, Oct. 27. She became the ninth recipient and seventh woman in program history to book the league's highest defensive honor. Dyke also hauled in B1G Defensive Player of the Week honors on Aug. 22, followed by TopDrawerSoccer National Team of the Week Honorable Mention laurels six weeks ago following her match-winning goal against Nebraska.
- Dyke is in the midst of her fifth and final season in Happy Valley coming off her most successful campaign with the Nittany Lions a year ago. The Littleton, Colorado, native set the Penn State program record for matches started while tying the school record for appearances after booking her 104th in both categories in the Big Ten Semifinal matchup with Iowa.
- Dyke ranks fourth on Penn State's roster in goals scored this season with four, matching her total from a year ago in four fewer matches. Dyke has scored goals in every on-target shot she has attempted this year, highlighted by a pair of penalty kick goals against Monmouth and Michigan State as well as run-of-play or set piece scores against West Chester and Nebraska. Dyke has added a trio of assists in the 2023 season, moving her into fourth place on the team roster with 11 points scored this season.

WEEZY BREEZY

- Senior+ defender Kate Wiesner continues her fifth year in Happy Valley and her fourth season of on-field competition in 2023. The Monrovia, California, native was dominant in her first full season as a routine starter a year ago, finishing with two goals, 11 assists and 15 total points in 2022. Wiesner ranked at the top of the Big Ten Conference in both total assists (11) and assists per match (0.48) last year.
- The Nittany Lions' starting left back ranks tied for second on the 2023 roster alongside redshirt sophomore midfielder Riley Gleason with four assists through 18 matches played this year. Wiesner set a season high against West Chester with a pair of dishes in the contest, in addition to assists against Princeton and Nebraska.
- The veteran Nittany Lion outside back has also tallied a pair of goals through this point in her fifth year, notching match-winning goals in the run of play against Maryland and Indiana during the regular season.

WHAT 2 WATCH 4

- In addition to Penn State's trio of Big Ten Players to Watch, the Nittany Lions also saw multiple student-athletes land recognition on a variety of preseason watch lists. Senior forward Rebecca Cooke led the way, garnering an appearance on the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List in addition to garnering recognition as a United Soccer Coaches Forward to Watch. Cooke was also named the No. 19 preseason player in Division I by TopDrawerSoccer, who released their list of top-100 preseason players on Aug. 16.
- Senior+ defender Kate Wiesner also hauled in recognition from TopDrawerSoccer in the preseason, landing the national No. 86 ranking on the preseason top-100 players list.

POWER OF THE PORTAL

- Penn State welcomed a trio of transfer athletes out of the portal prior to the start of the 2023 campaign, with all three individuals immediately eligible to play for the Blue & White this season. PSU signed the nation's returning scoring leader in forward Rebecca Cooke from Quinnipiac, All-B1G Second Team midfielder Rowan Lapi out of Northwestern and defender Michela Agresti, a two-time team captain from Boston College.
- PSU's trio of transfers amassed a combined 160 starts in their collegiate careers prior to arriving at PSU, adding a variety of depth and experience to the Nittany Lion field position groups. The newest crop of Nittany Lions played a combined 13,862 minutes before arriving in Happy Valley.

RECRUITING ROUNDUP

- The 2023 Nittany Lion recruiting class ranked as the No. 9 squad in the nation according to TopDrawerSoccer, the organization announced on Monday, August 14. PSU welcomed a quintet of incoming freshmen student-athletes and bolstered its class with three Division I transfer performers.
- Penn State features a trio of incoming freshmen who were ranked inside the national top-150 by TopDrawerSoccer, highlighted by the No. 10 recruit in the country in Worcester, Massachusetts, native forward Nicollette Kiorpes. PSU also welcomed the nation's No. 20 prospect in Bolingbrook, Illinois, native defender Keegan Schmeiser as well as No. 148-ranked defender Kaelyn Wolfe out of West Chester, Pennsylvania. The Nittany Lion recruiting class also featured Chesterfield, Ohio, native forward Frankee Fleisher in addition to Downingtown, Pennsylvania, native defender Ava Rightmire.

THE B1G LEAGUES

- For the 21st year in a row, the Penn State women's soccer program was selected as the preseason favorite to win the Big Ten Conference regular season championship following a preseason poll of the league's coaches, the B1G announced on Tuesday, August 15.
- Northwestern took the No. 2 spot behind the Nittany Lions, with Rutgers and Michigan State rounding out the top four slots. Wisconsin, Nebraska, Ohio State and Michigan were selected as preseason favorites to complete the eight-team Big Ten Tournament field. Additionally, each school saw three players selected as Big Ten Players to Watch in 2023, with Cori Dyke, Payton Linnehan and Kate Wiesner earning the nods from PSU.
- Penn State has been selected as the preseason favorite by the Big Ten Conference's women's soccer coaches in every season since 2003. Since that inaugural selection in the early 2000s, the Nittany Lions have hauled in 15 Big Ten Regular Season Championships in addition to six Big Ten Tournament titles.

30 FOR 30

- The Penn State women's soccer program celebrates its 30th varsity season in the 2023 campaign. PSU began as a club team in the 1970s and blossomed, ultimately reaching varsity status for the first time in 1994, publishing a winning record in the squad's inaugural campaign. The following season in 1995, Penn State began its 29-year NCAA Tournament streak that survives to the present day while simultaneously managing a 30-year streak of overall winning seasons.
- Penn State has won 20 Big Ten Regular Season Championships, nine Big Ten Tournament Titles, participated in five NCAA Women's College Cups and took home the 2015 National Championship. The Blue & White have combined for 513 all-time victories, and look to build on that rich tradition in 2023.

UP NEXT

- The winner of Friday's NCAA Tournament first round matchup between Penn State and Central Connecticut State will continue action in the second round against either seventh-seeded Santa Clara or Arizona State at the venue of the higher-seeded team. The second round will take place on Friday, November 17, with kickoff times to be announced when available.

PSU has alumnae on nine different franchises, including a program-best three former Nittany Lions with the Chicago Red Stars. The Penn State program's dominance within the Big Ten Conference also extends to its development of professional caliber student-athletes, as the Nittany Lions lead all Big Ten programs with 17 alumnae selected in NWSL Drafts since the inception of the practice in 2013. The Penn State women's soccer program saw five program alumnae participate in the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup in Australia and New Zealand. Those five individuals represented five different national teams, signifying the diverse array of talent that the Penn State program attracts. Canada's Olivia Smith, Costa Rica's Raquel Rodriguez, Germany's Laura Freigang, Ireland's Marissa Sheva and American Alyssa Naeher rounded out the five Nittany Lions to appear on senior women's national teams at the event.

Five selections to the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup stands as a tie for the fourth most among all collegiate programs, and the most in the Big Ten Conference. The Nittany Lions have a long track record of preparing student-athletes for success on the international level, with Head Coach Erica Dambach having previously served as an assistant coach for the four-time World Cup Champion and reigning Olympic Bronze Medalist United States Women's National Team. Multiple program alumnae have made history at the event, including Alyssa Naeher's groundbreaking score in a Round of 16 PK shootout in 2023 that marked the first instance of a goalkeeper converting on a penalty kick attempt in ANY FIFA World Cup, men's or women's.

THE HOME OF THE NITTANY LIONS



Jeffrey Field, the home of Nittany Lion soccer, was dedicated on Sept. 29, 1972. Located in the heart of the Penn State athletic facilities complex with a picturesque view of Mount Nittany, the stadium was named in honor of the late Bill Jeffrey, legendary head coach of the soccer program from 1926-52. Jeffrey Field has been the host site for numerous NCAA and conference contests in men's and women's soccer. Games are frequently televised from Jeffrey Field, allowing a nationwide audience to view Penn State in action. Widely regarded as one of the finest grass surfaces in the country, Jeffrey Field was honored as the 2006 Collegiate Soccer Field of the Year by the SportsTurf Managers Association.

The leadership of Penn State women's soccer Head Coach Erica Dambach continues to produce incredible success season after season. While trophies, academic awards and international achievements line the walls as evidence of a championship program, her impact on Nittany Lion student-athletes stands as the truest testament to her teams' culture of excellence. Dambach enters her 17th season at the helm in University Park heading into the 2023 campaign, Penn State's 30th varsity season.

The numbers that document PSU's success are staggering. The Nittany Lions have accumulated 20 Big Ten championships, with 11 coming under Dambach's watch, in addition to five Big Ten Tournament crowns in the Dambach era.

A two-time National Coach of the Year and five-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, Dambach has led her teams to 17 NCAA Tournaments, 11 Big Ten titles, five Big Ten Tournament titles and the 2015 NCAA National Championship.

In 21 years as a head coach and 17 seasons leading the Nittany Lions, Dambach has accumulated 311 career wins with a .708 winning percentage, one of the most dominant marks in all of college athletics.

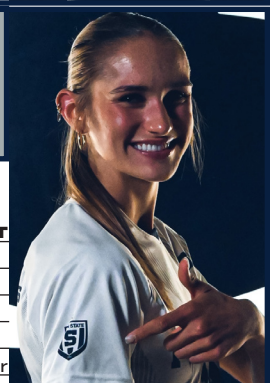
