 Penn State takes last shot at a road victory this season, looks to post first in two seasons in the Big Ten.

**THE GAME:** Penn State will continue a two-game road swing at Northwestern on Thursday. Northwestern is the only Big Ten series Penn State leads (26-15) and only Big Ten opponent it has a winning record at (10-9). The Wildcats have won the last three meetings, including a 70-54 win in State College in early January. Northwestern posted a 68-56 win in Evanston last year, ending a string of six straight Lion wins in the series. Penn State will look to end a 19-game road losing skid, dating to a victory at Boston College in November 2011, and a 17-game Big Ten road losing skid dating to a victory at Minnesota on March 6, 2011.

**ALUMNI WEEKEND:** Penn State will close out the regular season on Sunday vs. Wisconsin in the BJC and is expecting a large number of Nittany Lion basketball alumni to return for Alumni Weekend events, which begin Saturday. Among those expected to return are two members of the 1954 NCAA Final Four team (David Edwards and Ruddy Marisa) and five of the Lions Top 10 all-time scorers, including Joe Crispin (No. 3, 1,986), Pete Lisicky (No. 4, 1,605), Geary Claxton (No. 7, 1,542), Jarrett Stephens (No. 9, 1,372) and Titus Ivory (No. 10, 1,369). Ivory, who is recovering from a stroke suffered in October, will be the honored alumni for this year's events.

#### NOTES TO KNOW:

• Penn State has played five games vs. AP Top 10 teams this season. The Lions' schedule is ranked No. 3 nationally in the Sagarin Ratings with PSU facing 13 Top 50 opponents and nine in the Top 25 of the Sagarin Ratings.

• Three Lions are shooting better than 45% from three over the last five games (Marshall, Newbill and Colella) after no Lion (with more than five attempts) shot better than 30% from the arc over the first 11 Big Ten games.

• Ross Travis ranks 5th in the Big Ten in rebounding (7.1) on pace for the highest B1G finish and average by a PSU player and since Geary Claxton finished 2nd (8.0) in 2007. It will mark the seventh time in the last eight seasons a player 6-6 or under has led the Lions in rebounding.

• PSU shot better than 43% in the final four games of February, its longest such string since doing so in four straight games Dec. 5-Dec. 23.

• PSU posted a season-best 10 threes & 50% shooting (10-20) from the arc vs. Michigan. The Lions posted their three best marks for number of threes and shooting percentage from the arc in three of the last five games. Penn State has 35 threes on 39.8% shooting in the last five games after posting 41 threes on 23.6% in the first 11 Big Ten games.

• PSU's 84 points vs. Michigan equaled its most ever under coach Patrick Chambers, tying the 84 scored vs. Duquesne in Dec. It was the most points in a Big Ten game since an 85-76 victory over No. 8/7 Michigan State on Feb. 2, 2008.

• Penn State is posting 66.0 ppg while shooting 41% from the floor over the last five games. The Lions averaged 54.8 ppg and 35.3% in its first 11 Big Ten.

• PSU has out-scored its last two opponents at the foul line after being out-scored at the line in the first 14 Big Ten games. PSU has had seven B1G opponents record 30+ attempts at the foul line and 11 record 25+.

Jermaine Marshall posted back-to-back 20-point games vs. Michigan (25) and Illinois (20), logging a career-best in threes in two straight games including six (6-10) vs. Michigan.
D.J. Newbill ranks third in assists and fourth in scoring in B1G conference games and is the ONLY Big Ten player to appear in the conference's overall statistical rankings in scoring (5th), rebounding (19th) and assists (4th).

Sasa Borovnjak is posting 12.8 ppg while shooting 63.4% from the floor in his last five.
D.J. Newbill ranks third in the Big Ten with 190 free throw attempts trailing only Aaron

White (212) and Cody Zeller (212).

 Newbill (4th, 15.9 ppg) and Marshall (5th, 15.6 ppg) are the 2nd highest scoring tandem in Big Ten games (31.5 ppg) behind Michigan's Trey Burke and Tim Hardaway Jr. (34.0).

## LAST TIME OUT

### **MINNESOTA 73, PENN STATE 44** March 2, 2013 • Minneapolis, Minn.

Emotionally and physically drained after a huge upset of No. 4 Michigan in the previous game, Penn State missed its first 11 shots and didn't score until a D.J. Newbill jumper at the 8:42 mark of the first half as Minnesota took a 16-0 lead and never looked back. The Gophers led 34-12 at the half and extended the margin to as much as 35 in the second half as Penn State's offense never got on track. The Lions shot 27 percent from the floor and 3-of-14 from three, while being out-rebounded 46-30. Minnesota had five players reach double-figures and shot 50 percent. Newbill led Penn State with 15 points, but shot just 2-of-16. Jermaine Marshall, who drew his third foul early in the first half and had foul trouble all day, scored 10. Trevor Mbakwe led the Gophers with 13 points and 13 rebounds and Andre Hollins added 11 on 3-of-4 from three. Penn State trailed by double-digits for 33 minutes and by 20 or more the entire second half.

SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN: The Wildcats have suffered huge personnel losses the season most recently losing Jared Swopshire, their leading rebounder and fourth leading scorer (9.7) to a knee injury. Swopshire had 17 points in NU's win in State College. Leading scorer Drew Crawford (shoulder) and one of the team's top returners Jer-Shon Cobb (suspended before the season) have also been lost. The Wildcats have won four Big Ten games, but have lost their last six since downing Purdue 75-60 in Evanston to fall to 13-16 on the season. Former walk-on Reggie Hearn leads the team posting 13.5 ppg, he had 14 in the first meeting. Dave Sobolewski led NU with 18 in the win in State College and leads the team with 44 threes. NU makes 7.6 per game and is scoring 55.2 ppg in Big Ten play to rank last.

### LAST TIME at Northwestern, Jan. 1, 2012, L, 68-56

Penn State led 26-23 at the half despite shooting just 26% in the first 20 minutes, but saw Northwestern hit 10 of its first 11 in the second half and torch the nets at 71% in the second 20 minutes to run away with a 68-56 victory. The win snapped a six-game Lion win streak over Northwestern. The game was tied at 40 with 13:13 to play when NU went on an 8-0 run sparked by a pair of threes. The Wildcats would out-score Penn State 23-10 over the next 10 minutes to take a 63-50 lead with 4:51 to play. The game had seen nine ties and nine lead changes to that point. Penn State got no closer than nine the rest of the way. Tim Frazier led Penn State with 16 points. The Lions shot 34% and had 15 turnovers. Drew Crawford (21) and Dave Sobolewski (20) paced NU.

### **OUTLET PASSES (PLAYERS)**

■ JERMAINE MARSHALL posted his 8th career 20-point game (4th of the season) with 25 vs. Michigan. He had a career high 29 points & 10 rebounds vs. Michigan State, for his first career double-double. He posted his second with 14 points and career-best 10 assists vs. Iowa. He has led the Lions in scoring in 12 games on the year. He leads the team with 53 threes, 43 steals and 94 deflections and is second with 69 assists.

■ D.J. NEWBILL posted his first double-double at Penn State with a career high 23 points and 12 rebounds vs. Duquesne. He has scored in double-digits in 25 of 28 games on the year, including a career high 27 vs. MSU. His EIGHT 20-point games on the year rank third in the Big Ten and his seven career double-doubles (six at Southern Miss.) are tied for fourth-most among active Big Ten players.

■ ROSS TRAVIS has led the team in rebounding in 17 games and has seven double-digit rebounding games on the year, including a career-best tying 13 at Nebraska, 11 at Wisconsin, 10 at Michigan and 12 vs. Michigan. He is fifth in the Big Ten posting 7.1 rpg. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year as a freshman.

■ ROSS TRAVIS posted his fourth double-double on the year with a career high tying 15 points and 12 rebounds vs. Michigan, his second double-double vs. Michigan on the year. He led Penn State with 10 rebounds and added 11 points vs. Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off for his first career double-double.

■ JON GRAHAM posted two blocks in three straight Big Ten games and leads the team with 24 on the season. He blocked a total of 19 shots last year to lead the team.

■ JON GRAHAM trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for the season and added four inches to his vertical. He maintains a team-best 24 reps on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best.

■ Former walk-on NICK COLELLA was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started sixstraight games in the Big Ten. He has started 10 straight Big Ten games this year for 16 total career starts in Big Ten play. He posted a career-best 15 points on 5-of-7 from three vs. Duquesne.

■ Freshman **BRANDON TAYLOR** arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds. He sculpted his body in the late summer and preseason and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the season.

### **OUTLET PASSES (TEAM)**

■ DEFICIT REDUCTION: Penn State came from 15 down with 10:39 to play to beat No. 4 Michigan, its largest comeback to post a win since trailing Seton Hall by 15 in the first half on Dec. 8, 2007.

Penn State was whistled for 31 fouls in its loss at Illinois, the most in two seasons under coach Patrick Chambers. PSU has been whistled for 90 more fouls than opponents in Big Ten games.

■ D.J. Newbill and Jermaine Marshall have each posted double-figure scoring in 14-of-16 B1G games, Newbill in the last 12 straight. Sasa Borovnjak joined Newbill and Marshall in double-digits vs. Iowa (2/14) for the first B1G game with more than two players in double-figures on the season. The Lions followed that game with four players in double-digits at Michigan (2/17) and had three or more in four straight prior to the loss at Minnesota.

PSU has posted 20 games with double-digit offensive boards.

■ Penn State is averaging 65.9 ppg at home, eclipsing 70 seven times, and 54.7 ppg on the road this season, with highs of 67 at lowa and 71 at Michigan.

Penn State held Purdue without a three (0-10) and is now

allowing just 5.6 threes per game in Big Ten play. The Lions gave up 7.9 per game in Big Ten play last year.

■ D.J. Newbill ranks second (36.3) and Jermaine Marshall seventh (34.3) in minutes played in the Big Ten.

■ Penn State's 10 threes vs. Michigan marked season highs. Penn State has posted eight or more threes in three of the last four games. The Lions previous season high was 8 vs. Duquesne on Dec. 29. The Lions have eclipsed five threes Big Ten play just five times. The Lions average 4.8 per game in B1G games.

■ Penn State has posted its three best shooting games from three on the year in three of its last four games, including a 50% (10-20) effort vs. Michigan, 47.1% (8-17) vs. Iowa and 42.1% (8-19) at Illinois, eclipsing 40% from three for just the fourth time on the season. The Lions are shooting 29.0% from the arc in conference games. The Lions have shot less than 40% from the arc in 24 games and less than 30% in 13 on the year.

Penn State is 5-3 in games decided by seven points or less on the year, including two overtime wins. The Lions went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year, having just one home loss come by more than six points.

■ Penn State has allowed 16 opponents to eclipse 70 points, winning four of those games, and having 12 losses on the year come to opponents scoring 70+. Penn State is 5-25 under Patrick Chambers when opponents break 70 points.

■ Five of Penn State's eight primary contributors (following the loss of Tim Frazier) are freshmen or sophomores, including three of the top five scorers and rebounders.

■ Penn State has fielded one of the nation's youngest squads the last two years. This year, two sophomores and a freshman have been in the starting line-up acounting for 72 of 125 starts on the year. Last year eight of 10 primary contributors were in their first or second season of Division | play.

**HEATING UP FROM THREE:** Penn State has posted season-bests in number of threes and its best three, threepoint percentages in three of the last five games. The Lions 10 threes vs. Michigan marked a season-best as did their 50% (10-20) from the arc, equaling the best ever under Patrick Chambers. The Lions 47.1% (8-17) vs. lowa and 42.1% (8-19) at Illinois are the second-best marks on the season in percentage and number of threes. Three Lions are shooting 45% or better from three over the last five games: D.J. Newbill (45%, 9-20), Nick Colella (6-13, 46.2%) and Jermaine Marshall (15-33, 45.5%). No Lion with more than five attempts was shooting better than 30% over the first 11 Big Ten games. The Lions have outscored five opponents and equaled one from the arc in the last eight games.

FOUR GAME OFFENSIVE SURGE: Penn State experienced an offensive surge to close out February with three or more players scoring in double-figures in four straight games after having no more than two in the first 11 Big Ten games • PSU scored at 71.5 ppg, well above its average of 54.8 ppg in the first 11 Big Ten games • The Lions out-shoot opponents 43% to 28% from three, and shot well above their season average of 29% from the arc. • PSU shot 44% from the floor vs. 35% in the first 11 Big Ten • PSU posted season bests of 17, 15 and 15 assists in the stretch and 14.5 assists vs. 11.0 turnovers in the games for an assist to turnover ratio of 1.3 vs. 0.6 in the first 11 • Three Lions posted better than 14 pts per game over the span: Jermaine Marshall (19.0), D.J. Newbill (16.5) and Sasa Borovnjak (14.3).

**LIONS DOWN NO. 4 MICHIGAN:** Penn State's victory over No. 4 Michigan on Feb. 27 in the Bryce Jordan Center marked the highest ranked opponent Penn State has ever beaten at home. For the second-straight season, coach Patrick Chambers' team defeated a ranked opponent in the BJC after downing No. 22/25 Illinois, 54-52, last year. Michigan marked the highest ranked team Penn State has beaten since downing No. 2/3 Michigan State, 65-63, in the 2001 Big Ten Tournament and just the program's third ever victory against a team ranked in the top four of the AP poll. All have occurred since 2000, with Penn State downing AP No. 4 Ohio State, 71-66, in the 2000 Big Ten Tournament.

**MARSHALLING RESOURCES:** Junior Jermaine Marshall snapped out of an early February shooting slump to play some of the best basketball of his career posting back-to-back 20-point games for the first time in his career with 20 at Illinois and 27 vs. Michigan while shooting a combined 10of-18 (55.5%) from three and posting career-best three-point totals (4 & 6) in back-to-back games. He made his 100th career three vs. Michigan to tie Tony Ward for 13th all-time at Penn State. Marshall was the Lions leading scorer over its four game offensive surge to end February, posting 19.0 ppg while tying for the team lead with 17 assists, leading the team with seven steals and ranking second with 5.0 rebounds. Marshall went 13-28 (46.4%) from three over the stretch.

**CLOSE LOSSES:** Eight of Penn State's 15 Big Ten losses have been by single digits. Fve of the Lions last seven losses have been by single digits. The Lions have lost three games by 20 points or more in the Big Ten. Three teams have more 20+ point losses in Big Ten play.

**70+ POINTS:** Penn State's four 70-point games in Big Ten play are its most since posting four in 2010. The Lions have eight 70+ point outings on the year, more than the seven posted last year (with one in Big Ten play) and the team's most since posting eight in 2009-10. The Lions' streak of four straight games of 70+ points to end the non-con season was their longest since posting seven in November and December of 2008.

FOUL LINE DEFICIT: Penn State is being outscored 19.9 to 12.9 ppg at the foul line by Big Ten foes, having been outscored at the foul line in every Big Ten game before besting No. 4 Michigan (20-13) and Minnesota (15-14). Big Ten opponents have made more free throws (318) than PSU has taken (292) and have 171 more attempts. Seven Big Ten foes have shot 30 or more free throws and 11 have attempted 25 or more.

**POTENT TRIO OF GUARDS TO RETURN:** Penn State's high scoring guard trio will all return for the 2013-14 season. With Jermaine Marshall and D.J. Newbill on pace to finish the 2012-13 campaign with around 800 career points each, they could give the Lions three 1,000-point scorers that have combined to produce 37 20-point games on the floor during the 2014 Big Ten season. What will be a combination of two seniors and a junior with more than 250 games played and 170 career starts under their belts prior to the 2013-14 campaign, they could bring combined career totals of more than 3,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 800 assists to the floor during the 2014 Big Ten season.

He leads the team in scoring, assists, minutes, free throws and free throw attempts.

■ He ranks second in rebounding and steals and is the team's top defender often assigned to corral an opponent's top threat, including match-ups such as guarding 6-8 Iowa forward Aaron White.

He is a strong and vocal leader on and off the floor.

WALK-ON MINUTES: Three players that joined Penn State as walk-ons have seen significant action in Big Ten play. Nick Colella (now on scholarship), Kevin Montminy and Alan Wisniewski all have played significant first half minutes, and in fact were all on the floor at once in the first half at No. 4 Michigan. Colella has started 10 straight games and is averaging 25.6 mpg while playing in every Big Ten game. Montminy has seen action in 13 Big Ten games while playing 3.0 mpg, including a career high 12 vs. Northwestern and first half minutes in 10 games. Wisniewski joined the rotation at Nebraska (2/9) and posted six points and eight rebounds. He has played first half minutes in five games.

#### **NEWBILL LONE PLAYER TO APPEAR IN THREE**

**BIG TEN RANKINGS:** D.J. Newbill is riding a career best double-digit scoring string of 12 straight games and now stands third in Big Ten games posting 4.2 assists per game. He stands fifth in the Big Ten in scoring (15.9), fourth in assists (4.1) and 19th in rebounding (5.3) making him THE ONLY BIG TEN PLAYER to appear in the rankings of those three categories in the conference. During his 12-game double-digit scoring run he has three of his eight 20-point games on the year (including season highs of 27 points vs. Michigan State and 26 vs. Iowa) and posted a career-best 3-of-5 (60%) from three vs. Iowa.

**NEWBILL ON POINT:** D.J. Newbill, a natural off-guard, has taken over point guard duties since the injury to Tim Frazier in the fourth game of the season. He is logging big minutes at the position playing 36.2 per game to rank second in the Big Ten.

Is shooting 9-20 (45%) from three the last five games.

 He posted his best floor game with just one turnover and six assists to go with 15 points in 39 minutes vs. Ohio State's Aaron Craft (1/26).

 He has posted double-digit points in 25 of 28 games, including a current career-best string of 12 straight, with EIGHT 20-point outings, including a career high 27 vs. Michigan State (1/16) and 26 vs. Iowa (2/14).

 He has led the Lions in scoring 11 times since Frazier's injury with career highs on four occasions, 23 points and 12 rebounds vs. Duquesne for his first double-double at PSU and seventh career.

· Penn State was scoreless for more than 11 minutes to start the game, finally getting on the board with a D.J. Newbill jumper at 8:42. . The Lions 12 first half points marked the fewest scored in a half this sea-

son, and the 44 for the game were the second fewest. . Minnesota's 46 rebounds were the most by a PSU opponent on the year.

 Penn State shot just 27% from the floor and 3-14 from three • D.J. Newbill posted his career-best 12th straight double-figure scoring

game and led PSU in scoring for the 11th time. Penn State fell to 4-12 on the year when an opponent scores more than 70 points.

The 29-point loss marked the largest suffered in two seasons under coach Patrick Chambers and the largest since a 36-point loss (77-41) at No. 10 Wisconsin in 2008.

#### NOTES FROM VICTORY OVER NO. 4 MICHIGAN (2/27):

. The win marked the highest ranked opponent Penn State has ever be at home and the highest ranked opponent beaten since the Lions downed No. 2/3 Michigan State in the 2001 Big Ten Tournament.

· Penn State's 84 points equaled the most ever scored under coach Patrick Chambers tying the 84 vs. Duquesne in December and were the most scored in a Big Ten game since 2008.

• The Lions' 10 threes and 50% (10-20) from three were both season highs and the most since making 10 vs. Purdue on Jan. 5, 2012. The 50% tied the best mark ever under Chambers equaling the 11-of-22 posted vs. Youngstown State last year.

 Penn State posted nine steals and force 15 turnovers from Michigan wich entered the game 2nd in the nation with just 9.5 turnovers per game. PSU's 20 points off turnovers marked its most in Big Ten play and second most on the season.

 Penn State out-scored Michigan 20-13 at the foul line, marking the first Big Ten opponent out-scored at the foul line.

· Penn State closed the game on a 33-12 run after trailing by 15 and held Michigan without a field goal the final 6:30.

· At least three Penn State players scored in double-digits for the fourth straight game after no more than two did for the first 11 Big Ten games

. Jermaine Marshall posted his second straight 20-point game with a gamehigh 25. He had a career high six threes on a career best equaling 60% (6-10) from the arc, leading the team in scoring for the 12th time.

· Ross Travis recorded fourth double-double of the year, and second straight vs. Michigan. He tied a career high with 15 points, set career highs with four assists and four steals and posted 12 rebounds in the best allaround game of his young career.

• D.J. Newbill posted 17 points while playing all 40 minutes for his careerbest 11th straight double-figure scoring game and 24th on the year

A NEW MARSHALL IN TOWN: Junior Jermaine Marshall has emerged as not only one of Penn State's main offensive weapons, ranking 5th in Big Ten games scoring 15.6 ppg, but a primary ball handler, sharing duties at the point with D.J. Newbill, and a generator of turnovers, leading the team with 43 steals (6th in the Big Ten, 1.6 spg) and 91 deflections.

· Posted his fourth 20-point game of the year and first career back-to-back with a game high 25 points in the win over No. 5 Michigan following 20 at Illinois.

· Posted career high three-point totals in back-to-back games first going 4-of-8 at Illinois and then 6-of-10 vs. Michigan.

· He has led Penn State is scoring 12 times on the year while posting 23 double-digit outings.

· He has two double-doubles on the year, posting his first with career highs of 29 points and 10 rebounds vs. Michigan State (1/16). His combined point and rebound total (39) were the most by a Nittany Lion since Talor Battle posted 28 points and 13 rebounds (41) in a 69-61 win over Michigan in 2008.

· He logged his second double-double with 14 points and a career high 10 assists vs. Iowa (2/14), the most assists for a Lion since Tim Frazier posted 11 in a game in Novermber of 2011.

He is one of four players in the Big Ten to post 10 or more assists in a game on the season.

· Marshall is the Lions' leading active career scorer (discounting the injured Tim Frazier) with 831 points and three-point shooter with 102 career threes (13th all-time).

■ The guard combination of Junior Jermaine Marshall (23) and sophomore D.J. Newbill (26) has combined to record 48 of the Lions 71 double-digit scoring games this season.

### 2012-13 PENN STATE BASKETBALL

**CHAMBERS DONATES \$14,200 TO THON:** Penn State coach Patrick Chambers presented a check for \$14,200 at Penn State Dance Marathon 2013 shortly before the team departed to take on No. 4 Michigan in February. Chambers had pledged to donate \$10 for every Penn State student that attended a Feb. 14 home contest with Iowa. THON 2013 was held Feb. 15-17 in the Jordan Center with over 700 dancers and thousands of student volunteers taking part in the 46-hour event. The world's largest student run philanthropy, THON raised a record of more than \$12.3 million this year and has raised more than \$100 million since its inception in 1977 to support the Four Diamonds Fund at Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital.

 Patrick Chambers, D.J. Newbill, Jon Graham, Kevin Montminy, Patrick Ackerman and on-campus recruiting coordinator David Caporaletti shaved their heads as part of the No Hair, Don't Care campaign supporting THON.

#### tandem combined to shoot 18-30 (60%) from the floor.

■ They scored 29 of the Lions' 48 in the second half, the highest scoring PSU half in coach Patrick Chambers two seasons, in the win vs. No. 4 Michigan. Scored 18 of 21 during a 21-8 run as PSU turned a 10-point deficit into a three-point lead.

They scored 40 of the Lions' 47 second half points vs. MSU, accounting for 18 straight at one point and 30 of the final 32 as PSU sliced a 16-point lead to five with 2:06 to play.
 Their 56 points vs. MSU were the most by two Lions in a game since Geary Claxton (31) and Jamelle Cornley (25) combined for 56 in a 129-111 victory over VMI in 2006. It marked the second time this season they both scored 20 points in a game.

**BOROVNJAK BREAKS OUT IN FINAL CAMPAIGN:** Senior Sasa Borovnjak has broken out with the best basketball of his career in February off his final season.

Averaging 1.7 ppg and 2.4 rpg in the first seven games of the season prior to declaring this his final season, he has raised his averages to 8.3 ppg and 3.3 rpg in Big Ten games.
Posted the best stretch of his career over three games with a career-best equaling three straight-double digit outings and back-to-back career-best 17-point outings while shooting 74% (20-27) from the floor and scoring 16.0 ppg over the stretch of games vs. Iowa and at Michigan and Illinois.

• Tied a career high with 17 points on 7-of-10 (70%) shooting at Illinois, including scoring the Lions' first six points of the game.

His 17 points on 7-of-9 shooting (77.8%) and three assists at No. 4 Michigan were both career highs and his first ever back-to-back double-digit scoring games in Big Ten play.
His 14 points on 6-of-8 shooting (75%) vs. Iowa (2/14) in the previous game, had previously marked his most ever in a Big Ten game.

· He had nine points vs. No. 14 Ohio State.

 In his fourth year in the program, having redshirted the 2010-11 campaign due to a knee injury suffered prior to the season, he is eligible for a fifth season of eligibility, but made the decision to make this his final season of collegiate competition and plans to graduate in May. Since discussing the decision with coach Patrick Chambers, he has played the best basketball of his career and started 17 straight games.

• He posted three-straight double-digit scoring games to close out the non-conference season, culminating with 14 vs. Duquesne on 7-of-9 shooting.

• He tied a career high with eight rebounds for the second time in three games vs. Delaware State and added 14 points for the best statistical game of his career. He followed with 11 points vs. New Hampshire for his first back-to-back double-digit scoring games.

**TRAVIS GETS TO THE GLASS:** Sophomore Ross Travis has staked a claim as one of the top rebounders in the Big Ten posting SEVEN double-digit rebounding games on the season, including a career high tying 13 at Nebraska, 11 at Wisconsin, 10 at No. 4 Michigan and 12 vs. No. 4 Michigan. He has led PSU in rebounding 16 times.

• He ranks FIFTH in the Big Ten posting 7.1 rpg and his seven double-digit rebounding games on the year rank third among Big Ten players.

• He is on pace for the highest finish in the Big Ten rebounding rankings since Geary Claxton finished fifth (8.0) in 2007.

• Is posting 8.0 rpg over his last six games with three double-digit rebounding outings.

• He posted his FOURTH DOUBLE-DOUBLE of the season with a career high tying 15 points and 12 rebounds in a win vs. No. 4 Michigan. Added career highs with 4 assists and 4 steals.

Posted first ever double-double in Big Ten play, with 11 points and 10 rebounds at No.
 4 Michigan (2/17).

Having worked hard on his jump shot in the off-season, he has also asserted himself offensively posting back-to-back double-digit scoring outings for the first time in his career (12 at La Salle and 14 vs. Army) and has six double-digit scoring games on the year.
He led Penn State in scoring for the first time on his career with 14 points vs. Indiana

while taking a career high 17 field goal attempts. • Travis scored eight of the Lions first 14 points at La Salle and seven of Penn State's first

nine vs. Army while shooting 11-of-22 (50%) combined in the games.

He logged his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 boards vs. Army.
Posted first career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds vs. Akron.

**TAYLOR A THREE-POINT THREAT:** Freshman Brandon Taylor has proven to be an effective offensive performer early in his career when he can avoid early foul trouble. • A pick and pop, stretch four, he led Penn State in scoring for the first time on his career

with 11 at Purdue (1/13) and has six double-digit scoring outings on the year.
He shot a team-best 37.8% from the arc during the non-conference season, but has

seen that dip to 23% (15-64) in conference play.

• His 32 threes rank second on the team.

 He posted back-to-back double-digit outings vs. Akron (10) and Bucknell (16), hitting 62.5% (6-12) from three in the two games.

Taylor scored 14 points vs. Army and 10 vs. New Hampshire

**COLELLA LEADS LIONS IN CHARGES TAKEN & DIVES:** Among the team leaders in overall "Attitude Points" on the season, senior Nick Colella leads the team with 16 charges taken and 62 dives on the year emblematic of the grit and hustle of a former walk-on.

• A team-best 6-of-13 from three over the last five games and 35% in Big Ten play.

Posted the best all-around game of his career at No. 4 Michigan (2/17) posting a career high four assists, tying a career high with six rebounds and posting nine points, his most in a Big Ten game since February of 2012.

• Found his shot in the final four non-conference games going a team-best 11-of-20 (55%) from three to average 9.0 ppg. Included in that effort was a career high 15 points on a career-best 5-of-7 from three and a career-best four boards in the win vs. Duquesne. His five threes marked the most by a PSU player on the season.

• Third on the team with 28 threes on the year and has a team-leading three-point percentage of 34.7%.

• The senior captain has started the last nine games. He made six straight starts in Big Ten play last year.

WHAT A WONDERFUL WIZ HE WAS: Junior walk-on Alan Wisniewski (6-9) saw the first significant action of his career at Nebraska (2/9) and delivered with six points and eight rebounds in 17 minutes of play. It marked his first career points and rebounds in a game for the Michigan native who is an Industrial Engineering major and holds a job making sandwiches at a downtown Quiznos. Wisniewski is the fourth current or former walk-on to play first half minutes for Penn State this season joining Nick Colella, Kevin Montminy and Kevin Onyeaka.

**GET HIM A CUT MAN:** Sophomore walk-on **Kevin Montminy** has earned a reputation as one of the toughest and hardest working Nittany Lions with a history of playing with all out abandon in practice and in games. Twice this season he has required stitches following a diving play in practice. He suffered a two-inch gash in his his right shin after flying into the arena stands in mid-January. He played in a game two days after the injury and still wears a wrap on the leg to protect the injury. In practice on Feb. 13 he again went flying and suffered a cut to his head that required stitches. The following day in a game vs. Iowa (Feb. 14) he suffered a cut above his eye which was glued together. • Montminy has played first half minutes in TEN Big Ten games this season.

· He posted a career day vs. Iowa scoring five points on 2-of-2 shooting (one three).

• He has scored in five Big Ten games, making a three in three of them.

• He played a career high 12 minutes vs. Northwestern and six at No. 4 Michigan.

• Montminy grew up and went to school in Penns Valley, just 20 minutes from the Bryce Jordan Center. He was valedictorian (4.0) at Penns Valley HS and the schoo's all-time leding scorer (1,498).

· He is a Dean's List student in the Smeal College of Business.

**LIONS FIND OFFENSIVE BALANCE/POST 70 IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES:** Penn State posted two of its best efforts of the season in close losses to lowa (74-72) and at No. 4 Michigan (79-71), logging 70 points in back-to-back Big Ten games for the first time since the 2006 season. The 71 points at Michigan marked the most in a Big Ten road game since an 81-70 win at Northwestern on Feb. 17, 2010. After playing the first 11 Big Ten games with no more than two players reaching double-figure scoring in a game and averaging 54.8 ppg, the Lions have had three or more reach the mark in the last three games. PSU's four at Michigan were the Lions' most since four scored in double-digits vs. New Hampshire on Dec. 23.

**DEFENDING THE THREE:** Penn State has made considerable improvement in limiting opponent's threes, including an 0-10 effort by Purdue (2/5) for the first opponent shutout from the arc since November of 2006. Penn State is giving up just 5.6 threes per game to Big Ten opponents, a big improvement over the 7.9 per game allowed last season to Big Ten foes and 8.0 per game allowed in the non-conference season this year. The Lions have held NINE Big Ten foes to five threes or less.

**72 VS. MSU ENDS BIG TEN SCORING DROUGHT:** Penn State's 47 points against Michigan State in the second half were then a high for a half in two seasons under Coach Chambers. The Lions eclipsed 70 points for the fifth time on the season and fifth in a stretch of seven home game. The 72 points and 48% shooting marked a PSU high in Big Ten play on the year. MSU entered the game ranked second in the Big Ten is scoring defense (57.7 ppg) and defensive shooting percentage (37.6%) and had allowed just one opponent to reach 70, a 74-70 win over Boise State. PSU posted 78.5 ppg in its final four non-conference games, but failed to eclipse 54 points in its first four Big Ten games, posting 49.5 ppg over that stretch. The Lions had logged three straight games with season lows in shooting (31.7% vs. Indiana, 31.6% vs. Northwestern in the Jordan Center and 25.9% (the lowest mark under Patrick Chambers) at Purdue) prior to the MSU game. The Lions 42 points in the loss at Purdue marked the fewest scored in two seasons under head coach Patrick Chambers.

**FRAZIER REHAB GOING VERY WELL 14 WEEKS IN:** Tim Frazier had successful surgery to repair his ruptured left Achilles tendon on Nov. 20. and has since focused on two-week incremental goals set by team trainer Jon Salazer. He hit week 14 on Feb. 25 and ran for the first time using an Alter G anti-gravity treadmill which uses air to suspend him at 1/2 his body weight while he runs. He ran or 10 minutes. He will begin jumping rope in weeks 14 to 18 post surgery. Frazier was in a cast for about three weeks before moving to a walking boot that gradually flattened his foot as the tendon stretched. He removed the walking boot on Jan. 15. He is expected to have about a six-month recovery period and, at the completion of the 2012-13 campaign, will apply for an NCAA Hardship Waiver to return for the 2013-14 season.

**CHAMBERS & THE POST-SEASON:** Coach Patrick Chambers missed having a team play in the post-season for the first time in his collegiate coaching career last season and has been a part of the post-season in seven of his eight seasons as a collegiate coach. In his previous five seasons as a member of the Villanova coaching staff and two as head coach at Boston University, all of his teams reached post-season play including six NCAA Tournament appearances and one CBI appearance. Chambers has been a part of 17 NCAA Tournament games, helping Villanova advance to the tournament every year and make four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and reach the 2009 NCAA Final Four. In his first season at BU, he guided the Terriers to their first post-season win since 1959 with a victory in the CBI and the following year led BU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2002.

WE CAN RELATE: Penn State coach Patrick Chambers can relate to star guard Tim Frazier's recent injury, in fact Frazier is using the exact same motorized scooter Chambers used this summer after he underwent arthroplastic surgery to repair the knee joint on his left leg and was limited to riding the scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and the use of crutches for two months. Chambers has said the insertion of a wedge and six screws to re-align his knee joint was one of the toughest things he's had to deal with and will use the recent experience to help guide Frazier through his rehabilitation. Frazier's sister, Krystal, also suffered a ruptured Achilles, during a standout basketball career at Rice that saw her earn All-Conference USA honors. She returned from the injury to post 10 ppg in her senior season.

**FRAZIER REMAINS ACTIVE LEADER:** Since his season-ending Achilles injury, Tim Frazier has remained a vocal and active presence on the team attending every practice and shouting instructions and pulling teammates aside during breaks in the action. He is a virtual assistant coach in games, even delivering the pre-game scout in the locker room prior to the win over Delaware State. He has been particularly active in helping to guide D.J. Newbill in his transition to the point guard position. The pair room together on road trips and often watch film of previous games against the upcoming opponent the night before the game in their room, with Frazier helping to point out tendencies and opportunities for Newbill to attack.

**FRAZIER SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY:** Senior guard Tim Frazier, a preseason candidate for both the Wooden and Naismith national player of the year awards, will miss the remainder of the 2012-13 season due to an injury suffered in the Nittany Lions' third game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in Bayamon, Puerto Rico. Frazier had played in every game (101) the last three plus seasons. He suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon in his left leg and the 2012 first-team All-Big Ten guard underwent surgery to repair the injury on Nov. 20. A preseason All-Big Ten selection, Frazier was leading Penn State with 21.7 ppg and 5.0 apg per game and was second with 6.0 rebounds per game through three games. He suffered the injury in the Nittany Lions' fourth game, a Nov. 18 contest vs. Akron in Puerto Rico, leaving the floor at the 14:30 mark of the first half. Frazier, a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection on schedule to graduate in May with a degree in Supply Chain and Information Systems from the Smeal College of Business, is eligible to apply for an NCAA medical Hardship Waiver after the completion of the 2012-13 campaign. He had posted 25 straight double-digit scoring game, 14 of which were 20+ point outings, and had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, scoring 20+ points in nine of his last 13, prior to the Akron game.

**BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER:** Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

**TIM FRAZIER:** Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine bests...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State.

JON GRAHAM: Added four inches to his vertical leap...added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20..increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

**ROSS TRAVIS:** In the past year, Travis has increased his bench press max from 245 to 310 and his reps on the 185-pound bench from 10 to 22. He increased his leg press max from 325 to 615 and added 2.5 inches to his vertical (31.5). He increased his weight from 203 to 220 while maintaining his body fat and can touch a team-best 16 inches above the rim.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Out his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent...Improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

**CHAMBERS HAS AN EVENTFUL OFF-SEASON:** It was an eventful off-season for head coach Patrick Chambers as he and wife, Courtney, welcomed their third child, Caitlin, to the family on March 23, he underwent reconstructive knee surgery on his left leg on May 11 and his father, John "Rube", passed away on June 11 after a long battle with Alzheimers. Chambers underwent arthroplastic surgery, which involved resetting the top of the tibla below the knee to change the angle of the joint. The energetic coach was limited to riding a scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and was on crutches for two months. He began walking short distances without crutches on July 6 and after months of rehab returned to normal mobility in August.

**STAFF TIES:** Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

**GET ON THE FLOOR:** Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices and games to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points" during every practice and game and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor, screen assists, shot contests, tap backs, deflections, etc.

### GAME NOTES

### CHAMBERS A VERY ACTIVE & VISIBLE PRESENCE IN THE COMMUNITY:

Since arriving on campus in June of 2011, Penn State coach Patrick Chambers has made a tremendous effort to form a bond with the Penn State community and has been a very active and visible presence throughout his two seasons leading the Nittany Lion program. Some of the hilghights:

■ Donated \$14,200 to THON 2013 after pleding \$10 for every Penn State student that attended the Nittany Lions game with Iowa on Feb. 14, 2013. Presented the check to a packed Jordan Center prior to event kickoff.

■ Went behind the counter to serve 200 free Big Macs, at a personal cost of \$800, at a downtown State College Mc-Donald's after a Lions 67-51 home victory over Nebraska in 2012 in which PSU held the ball instead of shoot in the final minutes. A Penn State promotion promises free Big Macs to all ticket holders when the Lions score 70.

■ Kicked off the "No Hair, Don't Care" fund raising effort in support of THON 2013, by being the first to shave his head after being e-mailed by a Penn State freshman student.

Paid for several student's season tickets on the spot during several appearances at the student union during a week-long student season basketball ticket sale prior to the 2012-13 season.

Dressed as standout out Nittany Lion linebacker Michael Mauti and made a flying tackle of a tackling dumby to kickoff a 2012 Rally In The Valley event in Rec Hall prior to Penn State's clash with Ohio State. Also addressed Penn State's Nittanyville student section outside the gates of Beaver Stadium dressed in football gear and eye black just prior to the Lions 2011 clash with Alabama. He regularly delivers pizzas to Nittanyville during football season.

Served as co-chairman of the 2012 Toys For Tots campaign and participated with Penn State players in wrapping gifts during the holiday season.

Has served as honorary starter/host for numerous events around State College including: The Resolution 5K (New Year's eve), Alzheimer's Walk, Autism Speaks 5K and CVC 5K among many.

Traveled with five players to visit the Hershey Cancer Institute, a two-hour drive from State College, and deliver presents and encouragement to both adult and pediatric cancer patients.

Ordered two Nittany Lion Basketball golf carts and makes regular spur-of-the-moment trips on campus distributing Tshirts and his infectious energy.

Has kept a full calendar speaking to numerous Penn State classes and student organizations as well as community leaders and business groups and alumni groups and Nittany Lion clubs around the state.

■ Distributes "Attitude" wrist bands to students and supporters he meets around campus and in the community.

■ Hosts a year-round slate of Coaches vs. Cancer events in the community as the chairman of CVC-Penn State.

**FRAZIER NAMED TO WOODEN TOP 50:** Tim Frazier was named to the Wooden Award Men's Preseason Top 50. He is the second Nittany Lion in the last three years to be named to the preseason list joining Talor Battle who was named prior to the 2010-11 season. Frazier was among nine Big Ten players named to the list.

FRAZIER PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN: Senior guard Tim Frazier was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was joined on the preseason team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was also named the preseason POY.

### **21st BIG TEN SEASON**

Penn State opened its 21st season of Big Ten Conference play with a road game at Wisconsin (Jan. 3). It marked the fourth straight season Penn State opened the Big Ten with a road game. Penn State posted a 4-14 mark during the Big Ten regular season in 2011-12 to finish in a tie for 11th place. Penn State hast posted a .500 or better record in Big Ten play five times. Penn State has finished fourth in the Big Ten regular season twice in the last four seasons. Penn State's best Big Ten finish came in 1996 as the Lions went 12-6 to finish second in the conference.

### **GREAT GRAD RATE**

Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent, 24 percent higher than the national average (68%), according to statistical information released by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). The NCAA's annual study of institutions nationwide revealed that Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a GSR of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2002-03 through 2005-06. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (97) and IIlinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park student-athletes was 78 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.

■ Following completion of the fall semester, two Nittany Lions (Kevin Montminy & Tim Frazier) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.5 GPA or higher and seven Lions posted a 3.0 GPA or higher. Montminy posted a 4.0 GPA.

#### CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State, now embarking on its 18th year, when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

• CVC-Penn State has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 17 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.

• The organization raised a record \$215,000 in 2011-12, eclipsing \$200,000 for the third straight year, and ranks among the top 10 CVC organizations in the nation.

• CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a yearround schedule of seven events, which includes the the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk and State College Brew Expo.

 CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last five years and more than \$225,000 total. Funds are also donated to the American Cancer Society.

Penn State shot 56 percent in the first half to build a 40-28 halftime lead and then held off an Army charge that got the Black Knights within two mid-way through the second half. The Lions posted season highs shooting 50.9% and scoring 78 points while winning the rebounding battle 41-27. Four Lions scored in double-digits lead by 19 points from D.J. Penn State capitalized on its hot shooting and UNH's offensive struggles to jump ahead early and never look back putting together runs of 10-0, 12-0 and 10-0 in the opening minutes to seize a 34-8 lead. UNH hit 1-of-11 in the opening minutes while PSU was shooting at a clip over 60 percent. The Wildcats ended the game hitting just 22.6%, the lowest for a PSU opponent in the last 15 years, while PSU hit 55 percent in the first half and 46 percent for the game. Jermaine Marshall's 15 points led four Lions in double-figures and 10 Lions that scored. He added a career high five steals as Penn State held a 23-2 lead in points of turnovers. No UNH player reached double-figures. The Lions lead 39-14 at the half and built as much as a 34-point second half lead. The 27-point margin of victory marke the largest under coach Patrick Chambers and the most since a 47-point win over Gardner-Webb in 2009.

Penn State suffered its worst offensive performance in a month and committed a season-high 19 turnovers to help fuel an Indiana team that shot 52 percent and hit 8-of-16 from three. PSU won the rebounding battle, 35-33, and pulled 17 offensive boards, but couldn't convert enough to keep pace.
