AGGIES AT ESPN EVENTS INV.

The No. 12 Texas A&M men's basketball team opens the ESPN Events Invitational with an 11 a.m. matchup with Penn State on Thursday at the State Farm Field House at the ESPN Wide World of Sports in Orlando, Fla.

- Texas A&M faces either No. 19 FAU or Butler on Friday, depending on Thursday's results.
- The first-round game between the Aggies and Nittany Lions is a rematch of last season's first-round contest in the NCAA Tournament that saw 10th-seeded Penn State defeat 7th-seeded Texas A&M, 76-59.
- On the other side of the bracket are Boise State, Iowa State, VCU and Virginia Tech.

RACE TO 1,000 POINTS

In their third seasons in Aggieland, Wade Taylor IV and Tyrece Radford are both closing in on the 1,000-point plateau.

- Adding in his 50 games at Virginia Tech, Radford has already surpassed the 1,500-point plateau with 1,505 for his 129 game career.

TRENDS AND NOTABLES

- Henry Coleman III has posted a double-double in points and rebounds in three straight games. He is tied for No. 4 nationally with three double-doubles. His 11.0 rebounds/game are tied for No. 15 nationally.
- SEC Preseason POY Wade Taylor IV is the lone Power 5 player averaging 15.0+ points while accumulating at least 15 assists and free throws and 10+ steals. Taylor has scored 10 or more points in 16 consecutive games.
- Andersson Garcia's 29 rebounds are tied for No. 21 nationally among bench players, while his 15 offensive boards rank No. 3 nationally
- The Maroon & White average just 13.8 personal fouls/game, which ranks No. 23 nationally.
- Texas A&M is averaging just 7.3 turnovers/game (29 total), which ranks No. 3 nationally. After four games in 2022-23, the Aggies had lost 55 turnovers (13.8).
- Over the past two games, the Aggies have hit 82.4% of their free throws (42-of-51) as a team. For the season, the Aggies are hitting at a .758 rate from the charity stripe, which is tNo. 28 nationally among teams with a minimum of 90 FT attempts.
- Boosted by the 28/53 offensive/total rebound effort vs. ORU, the Aggies rank No. 2 nationally in offensive boards/G (19.3) and rank tNo. 11 in total rebounds/G (47.0).

AGGIES AT MULTIPLE-TEAM EVENTS

Texas A&M has won 18 titles at multiple-team events, most recently at the 2017 Legends Classic in Brooklyn, N.Y. when the Aggies beat Oklahoma State (72-55) and Penn State (98-87) for the championship.

ABOUT THAT GUARD TANDEM:

Texas A&M's Wade Taylor IV and Tyrece Radford are the only pair of guards averaging over 15.0 points each in the ESPN Events Invitational field.

- Entering Thanksgiving week, Taylor is the Aggies' top scorer at 17.0 points/game followed closely by Radford at 15.5.
- Taylor and Radford have combined for three 20-point games and seven double-figure efforts in the team's first four games.
- Last year, Taylor and Radford were the SEC's top guard scoring tandem with a combined 1,012 points for the full season. Among league guards, Taylor led the way with 16.5 points per game, while Radford was SEC's No. 9 guard scorer at 13.3 points per contest.

ONE OF A KIND RADFORD

Tycece Radford is the nation's lone 6-foot-3 or shorter player with 1,500+ points and 750+ rebounds for his career.

- He is one of three 1,500/750 guards nationally and one of eight 1,500/750 players of any size.

CONTROLLING IN THE GLASS

Texas A&M ranks No. 2 nationally in offensive rebounding and is one of just two teams (the other is Longwood) with a pair of players ranked in the top 40 nationally in offensive rebounds per game.

- Henry Coleman III averages 4.3 offensive rebounds (tNo. 19) while Andersson Garcia pulls down 3.8 per game (tNo. 34).
- Through four games, the Aggies average 19.3 offensive rebounds. Texas A&M has posted 16 or more offensive rebounds in every game, including a gaudy 28 vs. Oral Roberts.
- The 28 offensive rebounds vs. ORU were the most by a NCAA Division I team since San Jose State had 29 against New Mexico on Feb. 17, 2023.
- The Aggies are tied for No. 11 nationally in rebounds per game at 47.0 and have grabbed at least 43 caroms in every game this season.

FILLING THE BOX SCORE:

Junior guard Wade Taylor IV is one of six players nationally and the lone Power 5 player averaging more than 15.0 points while also compiling 15+ assists and free throws and 10+ steals.

BAHAMAS SUMMER TOUR:

Texas A&M had its once-every-four-years international tour last summer with a week-long tour of the Bahamas from Aug. 6-12.

- While in Nassau and Paradise Island, the Aggies played a trio of FIBA rules exhibitions at the Atlantis Resort. The Aggies came away with a sweep of Raw Talent Elite (100-49), BC Zalgiris Kaunas (89-59) and the Puerto Rico National Team (83-70).

EXHIBITION SZN:

Texas A&M played a pair of exhibition contests in the pre-season -- vs. Baylor at home and a neutral site contest vs. Texas Tech in Denton, Texas.

- On 10/20, the Aggies beat Baylor, 78-73, at Reed Arena with **Wade Taylor IV** and **Tycece Radford** leading the way with 20 points each.
- On 10/29, the Aggies fell to Texas Tech, 89-84, at the **Compete 4 Cause Classic** with proceeds benefitting families impacted by the Maui wildfires. Taylor IV poured in 25 points while **Henry Coleman III** and **Andersson Garcia** both pulled down a game-high nine rebounds.

ROSTER CONSTRUCTION:

- The Aggies lost just a single player that exhausted his collegiate eligibility in 2022-23 (Dexter Dennis). All told, the team's 2022-23 individual leaders in minutes, points, rebounds, assists, steals, 3-pointers and free throws are back in action for the Aggies.
- Texas A&M added five new players to its roster: graduate transfers **Eli Lawrence** (Middle Tennessee) and **Wildens Leveque** (UMass), junior transfer **Jace Carter** (Illinois-Chicago) and freshmen **Bryce Lindsay** and **Rob Dockery**.

PLAYER STORYLINES A-TO-Z

- Jace Carter** was one of four players nationally and the lone MVC player to average more than 16.0 points while also totaling more than 50 steals and 200 rebounds last season for Illinois-Chicago.
- Rob Dockery** is the first player in school history to wear jersey #9 after the NCAA adjusted its mandate on jerseys allow players to wear 0-99 last summer.
- Henry Coleman** was recently named the SEC BKB Leadership Council Chair for the second straight year.
- Andersson Garcia** was the Aggies' bench leader in points (105), offensive, defensive and total rebounds, steals (20) and FTs made and attempted (35-of-49)
- Hayden Hefner** had a team-best 17 3-pointers among the Aggies' bench players last season and poured in a career-high 19 points in the 2023-24 season-opener vs. TAMU-Commerce.
- Eli Lawrence** led MTSU to a 74-70 win over Final Four participant FAU last season with 13 points, including scoring the game's final three points on free throws.
- Wildens Leveque** set a tournament record with five blocks vs. Colorado at the Myrtle Beach Invitational. While at South Carolina, Leveque helped the Gamecocks to a 4-0 mark against the Aggies.
- Among SEC bench players that averaged less than 15 minutes per game last year, **Manny Obaseki** ranked as the No. 2 scorer with 5.2 points per game.
- Dating back to his redshirt freshman season at Virginia Tech, **Tyrece Radford** has started 109 consecutive games. For his collegiate career, Radford has started 126 of 129 possible games. Only South Carolina's Talon Cooper (131) has played more games than Radford among active SEC players.
- Preseason SEC Player of the Year **Wade Taylor IV** was one of three NCAA DI players with 500+ points, 125+ assists and 50+ steals while making 85% or better on free throw attempts last season. From his freshman to sophomore season, he improved his scoring average from 8.2 to 16.5.
- No one brings more energy and defense off the bench than sparkplug **Solomon Washington**. Among SEC bench players last season, "Solo" ranked No. 7 with 33 offensive rebounds, tNo. 12 with 14 blocked shots and No. 14 with 75 total rebounds. He played 10+ minutes in 22 of 35 games but only more 19 minutes twice.

ABOUT LAST YEAR (TEAM):

- The Aggies earned an invitation to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2018.
- The 2022-23 Aggies won 15 SEC games, which broke the previous high of 13 conference wins by the 2015-16 SEC Championship team.
- It was the most conference wins for the Aggies in any league in exactly 100 years, matching the 1922-23 cagers that were led by all-conference selection, E. King Gill, who is also known as the original 12th Man.
- The Aggies were undefeated at home in conference play (9-0) for the first time since the 1979-80 squad went 8-0 at G. Rollie White Coliseum.
- Led the nation in total free throws made and FTM/G at 662 and 18.9, while ranking No. 2 nationally in total free throws attempts and FTA/G at 872 and 24.9.
- The Aggies led the SEC in free throws attempted and made, as well as FT percentage (.759).

ABOUT LAST YEAR (INDIVIDUAL):

- Wade Taylor IV led the SEC in free throws (173) and FT percentage (.878) and was third in the league in free throw attempts (197).
- Additionally, Taylor IV finished in the SEC top five in scoring average (16.3), points (572), field goals (160), assists (137), steals (61) and 3-pointers (79).
- Taylor IV was one of four players nationally with more than 500 points, 50 steals, 125 assists and 150 free throws made (Others were Markquis Nowell of Kansas State, Tyree Appleby of Wake Forest and Phillip Russell of SEMO).
- Tyrece Radford ranked No. 4 in FTM (148), No. 7 FTA (186) and No. 7 in FT% (.796).
- Taylor IV and Radford were the top guard scoring tandem for the full season (1,012) and SEC play (556).
- Taylor IV set a school record with a .878 free throw percentage (previous record: .865 by Mike Floyd, 1974-75).
- Radford was one of 10 players in the SEC to average more than 13 points and five rebounds per game, and he was the only player under 6-foot-7 to do it.

ABOUT LAST YEAR (BUZZ):

- Buzz Williams became the first Texas A&M head coach to lead the Aggies to back-to-back seasons with 25 or more wins.
- Williams took his third different program to the NCAA Tournament in 2022-23. He also took Marquette (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013) and Virginia Tech (2017, 2018, 2019) to the NCAA Tournament.
- The 2022-23 Aggies were Williams' ninth team advancing to the NCAA Tournament.
- Williams earned SEC Coach of the Year honors from the Associated Press for the second time in four seasons at Texas A&M.
- Williams also received SEC Co-Coach of the Year honors by a vote of his peers in 2022-23.
- Williams collected District 20 Coach of the Year honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and coached the victorious West team in the NABC Reese's College All-Star Game during Final Four weekend in Houston, Texas.

IN THE RANKINGS

Texas A&M was ranked No. 12 and No. 13 in the most recent editions of the Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today Coaches Poll, respectively.

- In the preseason editions of the AP Top 25 and Coaches polls, Texas A&M was ranked No. 15 and No. 19. It was the seventh time in program history that the Aggies were ranked in the AP preseason poll.
- It was the Aggies' first preseason ranking since starting the 2018 season at No. 25. Only twice have the Aggies been ranked higher in the preseason poll: No. 13 in 2007 and No. 14 in 1980.
- The Aggies have been ranked in the last seven editions of the AP Top 25 dating back to Feb. 20, 2023.

Texas A&M head basketball coach Buzz Williams recorded a "Guest DJ" segment for Kenny Chesney's No Shoe Radio channel in late October and it will air at various times throughout Thanksgiving Week 2023 on SiriusXM satellite radio.

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS:

Texas A&M was picked to finish second in the SEC race in the league's preseason media poll and the Aggies' standout guard tandem of Wade Taylor IV and Tyrece Radford have received their share of preseason acclaim.

- The projected second-place finish was the Aggies' highest preseason predicted finish since joining the SEC in 2012-13.
- Taylor became Texas A&M's first-ever preseason SEC Player of the Year (media poll), and he was a unanimous first-team All-SEC selection.
- Taylor was named to the 2024 Bob Cousy Award and NABC Division I Player of the Year watch lists, and he was mentioned on preseason All-America teams from Dick Vitale of ESPN, CBSsports.com, Foxsports.com and Jon Rothstein of CollegeHoops.com.

- Radford, a second-team All-SEC pick by the league coaches a year ago, was a second-team selection by the coaches again in 2023-24.

SIGNING DAY UPDATE:

The Texas A&M men's basketball team announced the addition of a pair of prep standouts, Andre Mills Jr. and George Turkson, who will join the Aggies for the 2024-25 season.

- Mills Jr. earned All-New England Prep School honors as a junior at Brimmer and May School (Mass.) after averaging 22.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists as a junior in 2022-23.
- Turkson is a consensus National Top 100 prospect after averaging a double-double in points and rebounds for Bradford Christian Academy (Mass.) last season.

- On player or staff member's birthdays, Williams honors the occasion with an emoji-filled tweet that always includes a wrong number of birthdays for the celebrator.

GETTING THE JUICE

- Prior to practices, the team draws into a huddle at midcourt and Buzz Williams distributes "The Juice" to the team, which is actually simply hand sanitizer. Williams has been distributing "The Juice" prior to practices since his days at Marquette to ward off the spread of germs in the winter months.

TURKEYS AND SOCKS

- In Aggie Basketball vernacular, a "turkey" is when an opponent is held scoreless on three straight possessions. When the team has posted consecutive stops, the Aggie bench calls out "turkey, turkey" to implore the five on the floor to get another stop.
- Taking charges** on defense is valued by Aggie Basketball, and the team rewards a charge taken by presenting a pair of socks to the charge taker.

CULTURE WALL

- After road game shoot-arounds, everyone on the trip gets on the court for a fun photo. If the Aggies win, the photo is posted on @teamcoachbuzz and added to the "Culture Wall" in the locker room.

PROFESSOR BUZZ

- Always seeking to connect to young people, Williams has guest-lectured for the **School of Military Science (SOMS)** class at Texas A&M the past two fall semesters. His lectures, originating from Rudder Forum inside the Rudder Theatre Complex, have featured topics such as "Learning How You Learn," "Leading Through Change," "The Birthday Paradox," "The Principal-Agent Problem" and "Never Assume Anything." Williams also taught similar classes at Virginia Tech.



#GETBETTER EXPLAINED

- #getBETTER** is the mantra for Buzz Williams and his teams. It refers to *"the continual improvement in all facets of life. Always finding something to work on, to make progress on. Never being satisfied. Always looking for ways to grow."*

READING IS FUN

- Buzz Williams is a voracious reader, generally completing 4-5 books every month. On Oct. 2, 2023, he tweeted from @TeamCoachBuzz his "3rd Quarter 2023 Reads" with a list of the 39 books he consumed in the first nine months of 2023. For the last 11 years, Williams has selected and gifted a book to every player, staff member and their family on the initial road trip of the season. Describing his commitment to reading, Williams said, *"Who you are today and who you will be five years from today are the people you meet and the books that you read. Regardless of the genre of book that you read, they say it's worth five years of experience."* (Source: @AggieMBK/Dec. 16, 2023)

QUOTE SHIRTS

During the course of a season, Williams distributes 12 "Quote Shirts" to his players and staff that carry a life lesson or story behind its design for which the people within the men's basketball family can relate. Here are 2023-24's Quote Shirts so far:

'Time Either Promotes or Exposes Who You Are'

BEING THANKFUL

- A staple of every road trip are the Aggies' Thank You letters. Each coach/player/staff member on the trip writes a Thank You letter to someone in their life at the first team meal of the roadie.

BUZZ'S BUNCH

"Buzz's Bunch" connects young people with special needs to the game of basketball with an invitation to a game in the fall and a summer clinic. Originally founded during William's time in Milwaukee, Wisconsin at Marquette, Buzz's Bunch continued during his time in Blacksburg, Virginia at Virginia Tech and now at Texas A&M. Every player, coach and staff member has been lucky to develop a relationship, learn and grown from these children as Buzz's Bunch has grown to more than 500 members spanning all three cities.

SHOOTING WITH BUZZ

- "Shooting with Buzz" is a staple of the Aggies' practice regimen. As described by the Bryan-College Station Eagle: *"Each player must move their way through 18 shooting spots – some straight catch and shoot and some off of movement – and make 7 of 10 shots. The clock starts after the player's first make and stops once the whole circuit is done. Managers rebound the shots and pass a ball to Williams, who stands near the player, handing the ball off for each shot. On the sideline, a manager stands in front of a giant white board, keeping tallies of the players score at each position. On the other side, a record book of times it took to complete the course are logged."*

Williams told the Eagle the impetus for "Shooting with Buzz" was, *"I wanted to try to figure out a way, coming off of COVID and all the protocols and having, in essence, a completely revamped roster – how could I find some time working, while at the same time not screaming, while, in an unspoken way, they know I'm trying to invest in their life and in their game."*

BUZZ WILLIAMS AT A GLANCE

- Buzz Williams is in his fifth season as the head coach at Texas A&M and his 17th year as a collegiate head coach.
- Prior to being named head coach of the Aggies on April 3, 2019, Williams served as head coach at Virginia Tech (5 years, 2014-19), Marquette (6 years, 2008-14) and New Orleans (1 year, 2006-07).
- Last summer, the Texas A&M University System Board of Regents approved a contract extension for Williams through the 2028 season. Director of Athletics Ross Bjork said, "Buzz Williams is a tremendous leader and role model for our student-athletes, and he's a great example of Texas A&M's core values. He's taken our men's basketball team to new heights over the past two seasons with even brighter days ahead. It was an easy decision to ensure that Buzz is here in Aggieland for many years to come as we continue our mission of creating opportunities through championship athletics."
- With the Aggies' invitation to the 2023 NCAA Tournament, Williams has become one of a handful of Div. I head coaches to take three different programs to the "Big Dance." He's coached in 19 NCAA Tournament games and produced 10 victories, which rank No. 22 in both categories among active Div. I head coaches. For his age (51) and his number of years as a head coach (16), Williams is the active leader in total victories, NCAA Tournament games and NCAA Tournament victories.
- He received the nickname "Buzz" while working as an energetic student assistant for longtime Navarro Junior College coach and mentor Lewis Orr. Williams was inducted into the Navarro College Bulldog Hall of Fame in 2021 as the school honored Williams' climb from "floor maintenance manager" to head coach.
- Brent Langdon Williams or "Buzz" was born in Greenville, Texas and grew up in the small Texas town of Van Alstyne (population 4,369), which is located 50 miles north of the Cotton Bowl in Dallas, Texas. Van Alstyne is pronounced *Van ALL-steen*.
- This is Williams' second stint at Texas A&M - he also served as assistant coach/recruiting coordinator on Billy Gillispie's first staff at Texas A&M from 2004-06.
- Williams is one of the few NCAA Div. I head coaches that did not play college basketball. Instead, he was a student/graduate assistant at Navarro JC, Oklahoma City University and TAMU-Kingsville.
- Perhaps the most impactful initiative by Williams was the founding of "Buzz's Bunch," which connects young people with special needs to the game of basketball with an annual Buzz's Bunch game in the fall and a summer clinic. Originally founded during William's time at Marquette, Buzz's Bunch continued at Virginia Tech and now at Texas A&M. Buzz's Bunch has grown to more than 500 members spanning all three cities.
- Williams was named the Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year in 2019-20 and again in 2022-23.
- He has nine NCAA Tournament appearances in 16 postseason opportunities as a head coach, including four career Sweet 16 appearances (3 at Marquette, 1 at Virginia Tech) and one Elite Eight appearance (2013 Marquette)
- He has won 20-or-more games in 11 of his 16 seasons as a head coach.
- His 52 wins over the past two seasons were a program record and he became the first Texas A&M head coach to win 25 or more games in back-to-back seasons in school history.
- He's coached, recruited or developed 16 NBA players over the course of his career, totaling over \$400 million in total salaries and nearly 3,000 games played.





MOLDING YOUNG MINDS:

Buzz Williams has presented a series of lectures to the SOMS (School of Military Science) 380: Workshop in Leadership Education class for the past two fall semesters in a collaboration with Texas A&M's Corps of Cadets and the Hollingsworth Center for Ethical Leadership.

- Dr. Dave Keller, Director of the Hollingsworth Center, said, "The Hollingsworth Center works primarily with students who are not going into the military upon graduation, although we certainly have several that do. Our SOMS [School of Military Science] program of study begins during the spring semester of their sophomore year, where we focus on helping cadets find their strengths and lead from a perspective of authenticity."
- Keller added, "SOMS 380 is the second course for our students. It focuses heavily on finding their leadership constraints and blind spots, and then developing an action plan to intentionally improve in these critical areas. In later semesters, students learn more about the science of leadership, along with how to lead teams and organizations more effectively."
- Dr. Darin Paine, Associate Director for the Hollingsworth Center, said, "Whenever cadets can learn from a presenter such as Coach Buzz Williams, there are many opportunities for personal and professional gain. It could reinforce what they are already learning in SOMS, or present a new concept, or allow them to hear something that applies to their life right now. There are countless opportunities to benefit from an experience like this. Coach Williams is a high achiever, lifelong learner, and very enthusiastic about teaching. He has so much to offer and we are thrilled with this partnership."
- One of the class attendees, junior Luke White, told the Bryan-College Station Eagle: "I think it's really cool that he's doing this. He's going beyond being just a coach. He's really trying to connect with us as students."
- Among the featured topics for series have been: "Learning How You Learn," "Leading Through Change," "The Birthday Paradox," "The Principal-Agent Problem" and "Never Assume Anything." Williams also taught similar classes during his time as the head coach at Virginia Tech.

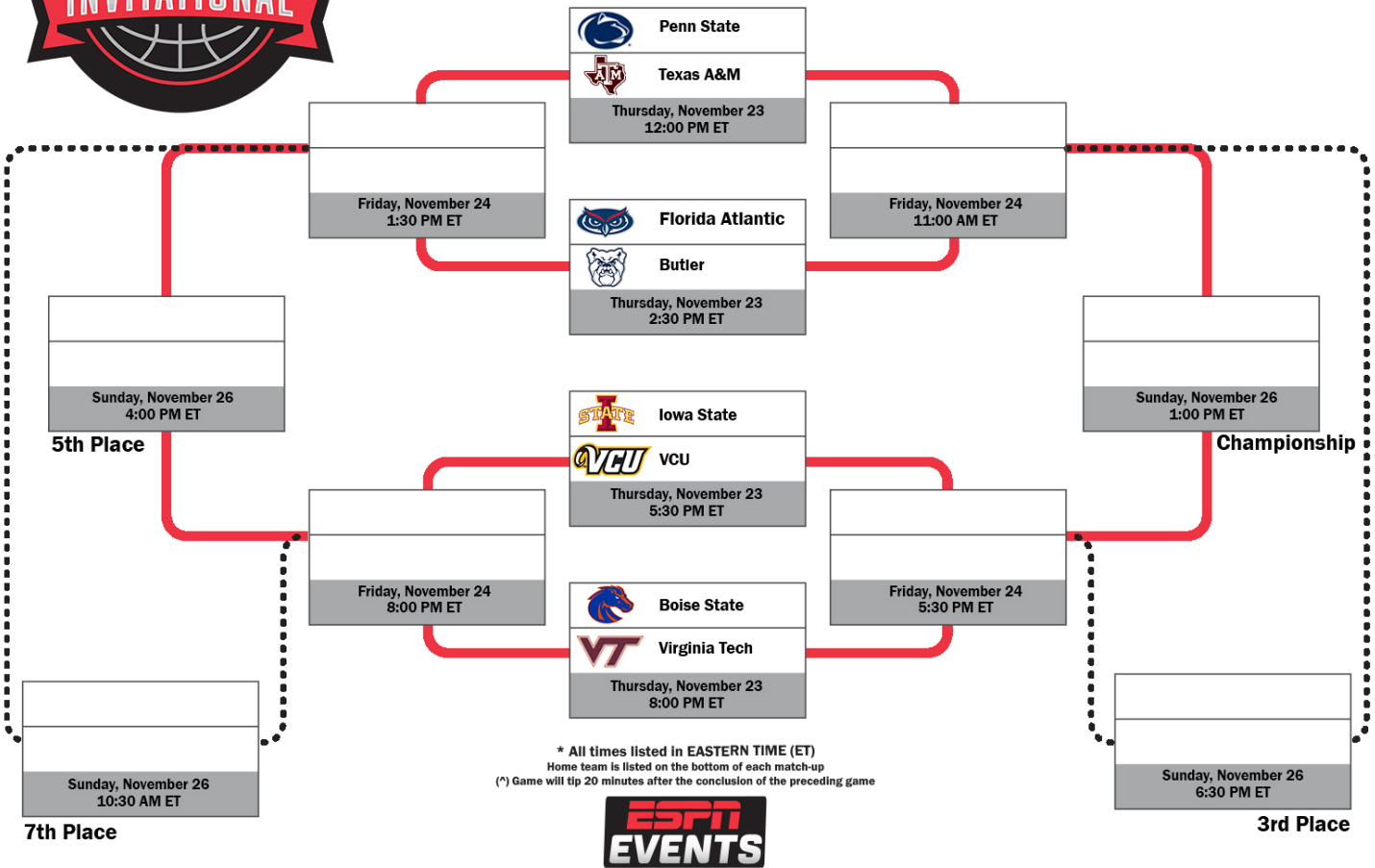

EVENT FEATURES SIX NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

- The eight-team tournament will be held at Walt Disney World Resort Thanksgiving weekend – Thursday, Nov. 23, Friday, Nov. 24 and Sunday, Nov. 26 – at State Farm Field House at ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex near Orlando, Fla.
- Six of the eight participating teams played in the 2023 NCAA Tournament: Florida Atlantic (Final Four), Penn State (second round) as well as Boise State, Iowa State, Texas A&M and VCU. Three schools in the field – Butler (2010 and 2011), Florida Atlantic (2023) and VCU (2011) – have made Final Four appearances since 2010.

MATCHUP HIGHLIGHTS

- Florida Atlantic, the first ESPN Events Invitational team coming off a Final Four appearance since Villanova in 2018, opens their first invitational against the Big East's Butler.
