No. 4 Ohio State Hosts Penn State Saturday in Primetime

Kickoff set for 8 p.m. ET; Orlando Pace, 1968 National Championship to be honored at the game

FIRST AND 10

- Ohio State enters the game with the nation's longest winning streak at 19 games.
- The Buckeyes are ranked No. 4 in the initial Bowl Championship Series (BCS) poll released Sunday.
- Ohio State ranks seventh nationally in rushing defense (92.4 ypg). The unit has not allowed a run of 20 or more yards this season.
- Ohio State is one of six FBS schools to not allow a 100-yard rusher in 2013.
- Ohio State leads the Big Ten and ranks seventh in the NCAA in scoring with 45.0 ppg.
- Ohio State is outscoring teams 129-38 in the first quarter this season.
- Ohio State is outscoring teams 58-27 after half-time in Big Ten play, two vs. ranked opponents.
- Junior QB Braxton Miller passed Joe Germaine for first place with his seventh career game with at least 300 yards of total offense vs. Iowa.
- Senior RB Carlos Hyde has rushed for 402 yards and five TDs in three B1G games, good for second in the Big Ten with 134.0 yards per game.
- Junior LB Ryan Shazier is third in the B1G with 8.0 TFL.

A GLANCE AT THE BUCKEYES

Ohio State, 7-0 overall and 3-0 in the Big Ten, is ranked No. 4 in the initial BCS standings after its 34-24 win vs. Iowa Saturday.

The Buckeye offense, averaging a Big Ten-best 45.0 points per game, is third in the Big Ten and 20th nationally with 493.1 yards per game. Their rushing attack is one of the best in the nation, ranking third in the Big Ten and 11th in the NCAA with 279.6 yards per game on the ground.

Seniors Carlos Hyde (443 yards, 5 TDs in four games) and Jordan Hall (438 yards, 8 TDs) are Ohio State's most experienced rushers. Junior QB Braxton Miller -- Ohio State's all-time leading rusher among QBs (2,321 yards) -- has rushed for 335 yards in a little more than four games. He returned from a knee injury Sept. 28 vs. Wisconsin, completing 17 of 25 passes for 198 yards and a career-high tying four TDs. He also rushed for 83 yards on 22 carries. He then passed for 203 yards in a 40-30 win at No. 15 Northwestern Oct. 5 and totaled 324 yards (222 passing, 102 rushing) in the win over Iowa. Senior Corey "Philly" Brown (33 rec., 453 yds, 6 TDs) and junior Devin Smith (30 rec., 434 yds, 6 TDs) are Ohio State's leading receivers.

The Silver Bullet defense is led by All-Big Ten junior linebacker Ryan Shazier, who is third in the Big Ten with 8.0 TFL to go along with 56.0 total tackles. This young group is among the best in the Big Ten and the nation, allowing just 92.4 yards per game on the ground -- seventh best in the NCAA. Ohio State's defense held Wisconsin to 104 yards rushing, nearly 250 yards below its season average, while the Buckeye secondary, led by junior All-American Bradley Roby (2 INTs), ranks fifth in the Big Ten with eight interceptions this season.

ORLANDO PACE, 1968 TEAM TO BE HONORED

Former Buckeye All-American Orlando Pace and Ohio State's 1968 National Championship team will be honored at Saturday's game.

Pace, who will be recognized at the end of the first quarter, will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame on Dec. 10 in New York City. He is the 24th Buckeye player to receive the honor.

The 1968 Buckeyes were one of the best teams in program history, going 10-0 and defeating No. 2 USC in the 1969 Rose Bowl to capture Ohio State's fifth national championship -- the fourth of five under legendary head coach Woody Hayes. They will be honored during a second quarter timeout.

STREAKING

Ohio State carries the nation's longest winning streak into Saturday at 19 games. The streak is tied for the second-longest in school history with 22 consecutive wins the longest.

MEYER: A THIRD 20-GAME WINNING STREAK

Urban Meyer is one of 41 known head coaches at the highest level of the collegiate coaching ranks (major college, university, FBS and FCS) to guide a team to a winning streak of at least 20 games.

Before the Iowa game, those 41 coaches have led teams to 20-game winning streaks 50 times, with Meyer one of nine coaches to have two such win streaks of at least 20 games. The others: Walter Camp, George Woodruff, Fielding Yost, Robert Neyland, Bud Wilkinson, Barry Switzer, Joe Paterno and Tom Osborne.

With Ohio State's 34-24 win over Iowa Oct. 19, Meyer became the first to win at least 20 consecutive games three times in a career.

Meyer won his last game as coach at Florida (a 37-24 win over Penn State in the 2011 Outback Bowl) and he is 19-0 at Ohio State. He has an overall record of 123-23 as a head coach for an .842 winning percentage, a figure that is No. 1 among active Division I coaches with at least 10 years of experience as a head coach.

THIS WEEK: A 5TH, 3RD & 1ST

Ohio State returns to the ABC/ESPN networks for a fifth consecutive week and for a third time in prime time this week with an 8 p.m. game against 4-2 Penn State at Ohio Stadium. Ohio State has already played prime time games against Wisconsin at Ohio Stadium and Northwestern at Ryan Field this year. This second prime time game under the lights

at Ohio Stadium is the first time in school history that Ohio State will play two night games in Ohio Stadium in one season.

THIRD CONSECUTIVE "RESTED" OPPONENT

Ohio State's opponent will have had an off week prior to meeting Ohio State for the third consecutive week this week. Penn State was off Oct. 12, one week after defeating Michigan in a four-overtime thriller at Beaver Stadium. Northwestern was also off prior to playing the Buckeyes as was Iowa. Ohio State had the week off prior to the Iowa game and will also have the week off prior to playing Illinois Nov. 16. Ohio State's opponent following Penn State is Purdue. The Boilermakers are off this week.

OHIO STATE LEADS SERIES, 14-13

Ohio State holds a one-game edge in wins over Penn State, 14 to 13, in a series that dates to 1912 and has had 20 Big Ten Conference showdowns. Penn State won the first four games in this series – in 1912-56-63-64 – but since then there has been only one winning streak as long as three games (Ohio State won in 2002-03-04). Ohio State won last year, 35-23, in State College behind 134 rushing yards and two touchdowns from Braxton Miller and a 17-yard interception return for a touchdown by Ryan Shazier.

HOME AND AWAY

Ohio State holds a slim, 8-7, lead in victories in games played in Columbus, including an 8-6 record vs. Penn State in Ohio Stadium. Penn State has won two of the last three meetings against Ohio State in Ohio Stadium: 13-6, in 2008 and 20-14 in 2011.

The Buckeyes are 6-5 vs. Penn State in games played in State College and have won three consecutive and four of the last five there. Penn State won the only game played on a neutral field: at the 1980 Fiesta Bowl in Tempe, Ariz.

38-20 UNDER THE LIGHTS

Ohio State is officially 38-20 in night games (those starting after 5 p.m. local time; three wins during the 2010 season were vacated). The Buckeyes have won six consecutive night games and they are 9-3 all-time in night games at Ohio Stadium.

PICKS & PICK "SIXES"

In six of the last 11 games in this series – dating to the 2002 game - an Ohio State Buckeye has intercepted a pass vs. Penn State and returned it for a touchdown. The Buckeyes have won each of those games.

2012 – Ryan Shazier sparked a 21-point third quarter with a 17-yard interception return for a score that broke a 7-all tie.

2010 – Devon Torrence and Travis Howard had fourth quarter returns for scores to clinch Ohio State's comeback, 38-14 victory. (Vacated)

2007 – Malcolm Jenkins extended a 27-10 Ohio State lead with his fourth-quarter interception return as the Buckeyes prevailed, 37-17.

2006 – Jenkins and Antonio Smith returned two interceptions a total of 116 yards for fourth quarter touchdowns in Ohio State's 28-6 win.

2004 – Tyler Everett had a first-quarter pick-six in the Buckeyes' 21-10 victory.

2002 – Trailing 7-3 in the second half, Chris Gamble's touchdown return was the game-deciding play in Ohio State's 13-7 win.

MORE FYI FROM THE RECORD PAGES

Ohio State has had a 100-yard rusher against Penn State 13 times with Braxton Miller's hitting the mark twice with 105 in 2011 as a freshman and with 134 last year. . . . David Boston set the still-standing school record of 14 receptions in a game against Penn State in 1997. . . . Tom Cousineau set the school record of 29 total tackles and Art Schlichter threw a record five interceptions in the 1978 game against Penn State at Ohio Stadium ... Ryan Shazier had a career-high 15 tackles in 2011 vs. Penn State.

HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS

Ohio State got off to fast starts in its first five wins of the season, outscoring its opponents 116-22 in the first quarter while never trailing in any of those games. The Buckeyes went 308 minutes this season without trailing until Northwestern grabbed a 7-3 lead with eight minutes to play in the first quarter. Subsequently, Northwestern and Iowa each held halftime leads against Ohio State (20-13 and 17-10, respectively) but Ohio State outscored both teams, 51-17, in the second half to win both and remain undefeated.

2013 Deficits

- Northwestern led for a total of 41 minutes 5 seconds, but Ohio State outscored the Wildcats, 27-10, in the second half, including 20-7 in the fourth quarter.
- Iowa led for 22 minutes 18 seconds, but Ohio State outscored the Hawkeyes, 24-7, in the second half and 10-0 in the decisive final quarter.

BRAXTON: 69.6 COMP. PCT.

A sharp and crisp 22-for-27 passing day vs. Iowa has improved Braxton Miller's completion percentage this season to 69.6. His two touchdown passes and no interceptions also increased his passing efficiency rating to 160.0 on the season, a figure that would rank 12th nationally this week but Miller hasn't played in 75 percent of the team's games (he needs one more game played).

TEAM NOW EIGHTH IN PASS EFF.

Ohio State has jumped to No. 8 nationally (and first in the Big Ten Conference) in passing efficiency (163.9) as its quarterbacks are completing 69.6 (Braxton Miller) and 68.4 (Kenny Guiton) percent of their passes. The duo has combined to complete 136 of 197 attempts for 1,495 yards with 21 touchdowns and only four interceptions.

RUN GAME STILL ON A ROLL

Ohio State's rushing game has powered the team to NCAA national rankings of No. 11 in rushing (279.6 ypg), seventh in scoring (45.0 ppg) and No. 20 in total offense (493.1 ypg). Ohio State's 1,957 rushing yards through the first seven games are the most in 36 years, or since the 1977 team

rushed for 2,269 yards through its first seven games on its way to the third-most yards in school history for a season: 3,694 yards.

133 STARTS AT O-LINE & TE

Ohio State's offensive line – Sr. LT Jack Mewhort, Sr. LG Andrew Norwell, Sr. C Corey Linsley, Sr. RG Marcus Hall and So. RT Taylor Decker – have combined for 116 starts. Throw in 15 and two starts at tight end for Jeff Heurman and Nick Vannett, respectively, and the total jumps to 133 starts for Ohio State's corps of key blockers.

BRAXTON TIES PETE AND JOE

Braxton Miller has 56 touchdowns responsible for in his career (rushing and passing scores) and has tied the great fullback Pete Johnson (school record 56 rushing touchdowns) and 1998 Big Ten Silver Football award winner Joe Germaine (56 passing TDs) for fourth on the school charts.

MORE BRAXTON BULLETS:

- His 222-yard passing and 102-yard rushing day prompted Dispatch columnist Bob Hunter to write "he is running like the old Miller and passing like the new one."
- Miller now has 10 100-yard rushing days.
- He has tied Jim Karsatos for sixth in school history with 36 touchdown passes.
- He needs 19 yards rushing to pass Lydell Ross (2,339 yards between 2001-04) for 15th place in career rushing yards. Miller enters the Penn State game with 2,221 yards.
- His school-record seventh 300-yard game of total offense vs. Iowa (324) moved him past Joe Germaine and Greg Frey and into fifth place on that all-time Ohio State list.

ANOTHER BIG GAME FROM HYDE

Carlos Hyde scored two rushing touchdowns against an Iowa defense that had not given up a rushing touchdown all season. The scores were part of another big game for the senior with 149 rushing yards and a 6.2 yards per carry average. Hyde had a career-high 168 yards and three touchdowns vs. Northwestern and now has taken the team lead with 443 rushing yards and a 110.8 per game average.

POWERS INTO RUSHING TOP 20

Carlos Hyde has powered his way into Ohio State's Top 20 all-time rushers with 2,120 career yards. He has the second-fewest rushing attempts of any Buckeye who has reached 2,000 career rushing yards: 387. Don Clark rushed for 2,116 yards off 385 attempts from 1956-58.

MORE ON NO. 34

- Carlos has not lost a yard rushing this season.
- He has nine career 100-yard games.
- His 27 rushing touchdowns are only nine shy of a Top 5 place in Ohio State history.
- He ranks second in the Big Ten in rushing (134.0) in conference games and third with 5 TDs.
- Carlos has rushed for at least 100 yards in the second half in each of the last two games vs. Northwestern (112) and Iowa (106).

20-0 SINCE 2005 WITH PUNT BLOCK

Urban Meyer's teams are now 20-0 since the 2005 season when blocking a punt. Bradley Roby's second career blocked punt (vs. Northwestern) was the most recent. Doran Grant also has a blocked punt this season vs. FAMU.

59 BLOCKED KICKS

The Buckeyes have won 17 consecutive games that Braxton Miller has started, making the junior from Huber Heights (near Dayton, Ohio) 21-6 as a starting quarterback at Ohio State. His next win will tie him for seventh with Jim Karsatos, who went 22-6 from 1983-86.

NOTING THE WIN VS. IOWA

- Ohio State holds the nation's longest winning streak at 19 games, tied for the second-longest in school history (2005-06, 2002-03). The longest is 22 games from 1967-69.
- Urban Meyer's teams are 35-2 overall with more than a week to prepare for an opponent.
- Corey Brown's 58-yard touchdown reception from Braxton Miller in the second quarter marked the longest catch of his career.
- Carlos Hyde's 1-yard touchdown run in the third quarter was the first rushing touchdown allowed by Iowa this season.
- Devin Smith's 14-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter marked the 16th of his career, tying him for eighth on the Ohio State career list.
- Smith tied his career high with seven receptions against the Hawkeyes, totaling 72 yards.
- Hyde's 149-yard rushing performance marked the eighth 100-yard game of his career and his second in a row after rushing for 168 vs. Northwestern.

- Jeff Heurman caught a career-high five passes against the Hawkeyes.
- Miller tallied 324 yards of total offense against Iowa. The game marked his Ohio State record seventh time tallying over 300 yards of total offense in a game. Miller was tied with Joe Germaine for first in program history heading into the game.
- Miller connected on 22 of 27 pass attempts for 222 yards, a career high for completions in a game. Miller now has back-to-back 200-plus yard throwing games.
- Miller, already Ohio State's record leader for 100-yard rushing games by a quarterback, had the 10th 100-yard rushing game of his career after finishing the game with 102 yards on 18 carries.
- Hyde and Miller each rushed for more than 100 yards, the first time Ohio State had two backs with 100 yard games since last year vs. Indiana. The same duo combined to each rush for 100 yards against both Nebraska and Indiana last year. All-time, 39 tandems have rushed for 100 yards each in a game (six times since 2000).
- Ohio State did not punt vs. the Hawkeyes, the first time the team did not punt in a game since Aug. 30, 2008 vs. Youngstown State.
- Miller moved into fifth place on the Ohio State career total offense list with 6,350 yards, passing Joe Germaine (6,094) and Greg Frey (6,098). Steve Bellisari is next (6,496) in fourth place.
- Ohio State is yet to allow a 100-yard rusher.
- Ryan Shazier led the Buckeyes with nine total tackles, followed by Curtis Grant with eight. Armani Reeves had a career-best six tackles, passing the five he had vs. SDSU earlier this year.
- The Buckeyes have scored 30 or more points in each game this year. The squad entered the year sixth in the NCAA averaging 46.8 points a game.

BUCKEYES HOLD BIG TEN RUSHING ATTACKS IN CHECK

In Big Ten play Ohio State has shut down the run. The Buckeyes held No. 23 Wisconsin to 104 rushing yards -- 245 yards below its season average. The very next week Ohio State held No. 15 Northwestern to 155 yards below its average of 249 per game. Then vs. Iowa, Ohio State held the Hawkeyes to 130 yards on the ground, 77 yards below its season average.

UNFORTUNATE NEWS FOR BRYANT

Three-year starting safety and team leader Christian Bryant suffered a broken ankle at the end of the Wisconsin game and has been lost for the season. Voted to be one of the team's eight game captains prior to the start of the season, Bryant had played in 36 Ohio State games and had made 27 starts in the secondary. He recorded 171 tackles in his career with two interceptions, 23 pass break-ups, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

Ohio State is officially 32 of 35 in the red zone this season with 27 TDs and five field goals.

The Buckeyes were 1 of 1 in the red zone vs. Buffalo, 3 of 3 vs. San Diego State, 6 of 6 at California, 11 of 12 vs. FAMU, 1 of 2 vs. Wisconsin, 5 of 6 at Northwestern and 5 of 5 vs. Iowa. The only times Ohio State did not score in the red zone were after an interception in the end zone vs. FAMU (Ohio State would force and recover a fumble on that same play and score the very next play), when Ohio State took a knee to run out the clock vs. Wisconsin and after a fumble inside the 5-yard line at Northwestern.

The Buckeyes have 13 scoring plays of at least 20 yards so far this season, 10 through the air and three rushing.

MOVING THE CHAINS

The Ohio State offense has converted on 51.0 percent of its third downs, good for 12th in the NCAA, and ranks 16th with a 68.8 conversion rate on fourth down. As a result, the Buckeyes lead the Big Ten and are 14th in the NCAA with 182 first downs (108 rushing, 65 passing and nine on penalties). They also rank fourth in percentage of drives ending with a touchdown:

FAST STARTS AND POINTS SCORED

Ohio State has outscored its opponents 129-38 in the first quarter this season on its way to 315 points scored for an average of 45.0 points per game -- good for seventh in the NCAA.

THE SILVER BULLET DEFENSE

Ohio State has featured a Top 20 scoring defense in nine of the past 10 seasons, including a top 6 in six of the last eight.

Ohio State recorded its first shutout since 2011 with the 76-0 win over FAMU Sept. 21. The

Buckeyes also are one of six FBS teams who have not allowed a 100-yard rusher and the longest run allowed by Ohio State was a 17-yarder vs. Wisconsin. In that meeting with the Badgers, Ohio State's defense held Wisconsin to a season-low 104 yards rushing after the Badgers came into the game averaging 349.5 yards per game on the ground.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

Ryan Shazier, arguably, was the top linebacker in the Big Ten at season's end last year. He was among the conference's Top 10 in five categories, including leading the league with 17 tackles-for-loss, ranking second with 115 tackles and eighth with 12 passes defended. He was named first-team all-Big Ten.

Through six games in 2013, Shazier leads the Buckeyes with 56.0 tackles, 38 of those solo. He has 8.0 TFL, 1.0 sack, 1 PBU, 2 FFs and 1 QBH.

FIRST TIME SINCE 1917

This year Ohio State opened the season with four consecutive 40-plus point games for the first time since 1917 when Ohio State opened with wins over Case (49-0), Ohio Wesleyan (53-0), Northwestern (40-0) and Denison (67-0).

With 76 points Sept. 21 vs. FAMU, it marked the first time since 2005 that a Buckeye team has scored at least 40 points in four consecutive games overall.

HYDE, ROBY, BOSA CLAIM B1G AWARDS

Determined and exceptional efforts by the Ohio State Buckeyes in the 40-30 comeback victory over No. 15 Northwestern Oct. 5 earned three individuals Big Ten Conference weekly honors: Carlos Hyde shared the conference's offensive player of the week award with Nebraska running back Ameer Abdullah;

All-American cornerback Bradley Roby was the special teams player of the week; and defensive lineman Joey Bosa earned the Big Ten's freshman of the week award.

- Hyde, from Naples, Fla., rushed for a career-high 168 yards with three second-half touchdowns to power Ohio State back from a 23-13 third-quarter deficit. He also caught four passes for 38 yards for a total of 206 all-purpose yards.
- Hyde's fine game included amassing 15 first downs; 12 rushing and three receiving. He scored on a 4-yard run late in the third quarter to close a 10-point Northwestern lead to three, 23-20. He added a 2-yard TD run early in the fourth to give Ohio State its first lead in over 32 minutes, 27-23. And after Northwestern regained the lead, Hyde capped an 81-yard drive with a 7-yard run for a 34-30 Buckeye lead with 5:22 left to play.
- Roby, a fourth-year junior from Suwanee, Ga., blocked a Northwestern punt and recovered the ball in the end zone for Ohio State's only touchdown of the first half. He also had two special team tackles among his seven tackles for the game.
- Roby now has four career touchdowns; he has scored off a fumbled punt vs. Miami in 2012; he recovered a blocked punt vs. Indiana in 2012; he had a "pick-six" vs. Nebraska in 2012; and his recovery of his own blocked punt in the end zone vs. Northwestern Saturday.
- Bosa, from Fort Lauderdale, Fla., had five tackles, including two sacks, and he recovered a fumble in the end zone on the final play of the game. He tied his personal best with four solo tackles and with his two tackles-for-loss.

KENNY 'G' STARTS & STARS

Fifth-year senior Kenny Guiton threw a school-record six touchdown passes – all in the first half – to lead Ohio State to a 55-0 halftime lead over Florida A&M and to an eventual 76-0 win Sept. 21 at Ohio Stadium. In just his second career start, Guiton connected on 24 of 34 throws for 215 yards and one interception. He and the Buckeyes did not attempt a pass in the second half. Guiton threw four of his touchdown passes in the first quarter. He tied Bobby Hoying's (1994 vs. Purdue; 1995 vs. Pitt) and John Borton's (1952 vs. Washington State) record for touchdown passes in a game when he connected with Chris Fields on a 15-yarder. He then broke the record with 13 seconds to play in the half, hitting Evan Spencer with a 15-yard completion.

STARRED IN FIRST START, TOO

Kenny Guiton had back-to-back record-setting starts vs. Cal and FAMU. Making his first career start at California Sept. 14, he threw for three touchdowns in the first six minutes of the game to spark Ohio State to a quick 21-0 lead and finished with 368 yards of total offense and four touchdowns in a 52-34 win at Cal's Memorial Stadium. Guiton connected with Devin Smith on a school-record 90-yard touchdown pass – the longest play from scrimmage in school history – on his second throw of the game and later hit Smith on a 47-yard touchdown pass,

Chris Fields on a 1-yarder and Corey Brown on a 6-yard play to give Ohio State a 45-20 lead in the third quarter. When he wasn't handing off to Jordan Hall, who carried 30 times for 168 yards and three touchdowns, Guiton was rushing it himself for 92 total yards. He led a Buckeye offense to a three-year high 608 yards of offense, the most ever for an Urban Meyer coached Ohio State team.

BIG DAY FOR CAMERON JOHNSTON

At the end of the Wisconsin game when one looked at the final score and the final stats, it was the numbers dropped by freshman punter Cameron Johnston that had as much of an outcome on the game as any. Johnston punted six times against the Badgers Sept. 28 and landed all six inside the 20 yard line, and even more impressive, he dropped five punts on or inside the 10 yard line. The Badgers' starting field position after each of his punts was their own 10, 9, 5, 8, 16 and 10. His final punt was most impressive: a 55-yarder downed at the 10 with 1:29 left to play in a one-score ball game. The Big Ten Conference named Johnston its special team's player of the week for his efforts.

EZEKIEL ELLIOTT EASES FOR 162 & 2 TDS

Freshman running back Ezekiel Elliott took advantage of a playing time opportunity against Florida A&M by rushing for 162 yards in the second half of the game and scoring twice. He had a 16-yard run early in the third quarter and a 13-yard TD run to cap a 90-yard drive late in the third. He averaged 11.6 yards per carry (14 attempts) with a long of 57 yards.

ABOUT 76 POINTS SCORED

The 76 points Ohio State scored against FAMU represented the most points ever for an Urban Meyer-coached team and the sixth-most points scored in a game in school history. It was the most points in 63 years, or since the 1950 team scored 83 vs. Iowa.

MORE SCORING NUMBERS

Some notes about the offensive explosion by the Buckeyes against Florida A&M, keyed by a 55-point first half that was keyed by a 34-point first quarter:

- The 55-point half is the second-most points scored in a half in modern history (since 1950), trailing only the 56 scored vs. Iowa in 1996 and tied with the 55 scored vs. Iowa in 1950;
- The 34 points in the first quarter is second-most in a quarter since 1950 (35 in the first vs. Iowa);
- The 11 touchdowns scored is fourth-most in school history;
- The six passing touchdowns is the second-most in school history, trailing only seven vs. Pitt in 1995; and
- The 76-point margin of victory is tied for fifth-largest in school history, and it is the largest since defeating Drake, 85-7, in 1935.

NO BETTER THREE-GAME TD RUN

Kenny Guiton threw 12 touchdown passes in his three-game stretch vs. SDSU, Cal and FAMU. No Ohio State quarterback has ever thrown for as many touchdowns in one three-game stretch.

GUITON NAMED WALTER CAMP PLAYER OF THE WEEK SEPT. 16

Kenny Guiton, who completed 21 of 32 passes for 276 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions (or sacks) and rushed for 92 yards in the win at Cal, was named the Walter Camp Football Foundation's offensive player of the week Sept. 16. Guiton became the eighth Buckeye to earn national player of the week honor from the prestigious Walter Camp Football Foundation, joining LB Bobby Carpenter (10/16/05), LB A.J. Hawk (11/13/05), LB James Laurinaitis (9/10/06 and 11/4/07), QB Troy Smith (11/19/06), DT Cameron Heyward (11/8/09) and DB Chimdi Chekwa (9/12/10).

SMITH, GUITON COMBINE FOR LONGEST PLAY

Speedy junior receiver Devin Smith caught a strike in stride from Kenny Guiton at about midfield Sept. 14 at Cal and then cruised untouched into the end zone to complete the longest play from scrimmage in Ohio State history: 90 yards. Minutes later he caught a 47-yard touchdown pass from Guiton for the fourth multi-touchdown of his career.

BACK-TO-BACK 300-YARD GAMES

Ohio State's offensive line powered the offense to back-to-back games of 332 rushing yards vs. Cal and then 388 rushing yards vs. Florida A&M. The line had plenty of help vs. FAMU as Coach Meyer substituted liberally after the first quarter and

second-team guys like Pat Elflein, Jacoby Boren and Darryl Baldwin each played more than half the game and fifth-year senior Ivon Blackman seeing his most action from the line of scrimmage as well.

388 RUSH YARDS AN 18-YEAR HIGH

Ohio State did not throw a pass in the second half vs. FAMU Sept. 21. As a result, the team rushed for 277 of its 388 yards in the third and fourth quarters (Ezekiel Elliott had 121 yards himself in the third). The 388 yards is an 18-year high for Ohio State or the most since the 1995 team had 409 vs. Illinois.

5 300-YARD RUSHING GAMES

Ohio State has had five 300-plus yard rushing games in Urban Meyer's 19 games as coach. Prior to Meyer's arrival, Ohio State had just seven 300-yard rushing games in the past 15 years and covering 176 games.

Ohio State ranks first among all NCAA Div. I programs with 87 consecutive seasons since last posting back-to-back losing records. The Buckeyes have not been under .500 for two or more consecutive seasons since 1922-24. Tennessee had been first until back-to-back losing seasons in 2010 and 2011 snapped a 98-year streak (since 1909-11).

Urban Meyer's coaching staff is one of 10 BCS schools and one of four Big Ten schools keeping its coaching staff intact from 2012 to 2013.

BUCKEYES IN THE POLLS

The No. 2 preseason AP ranking was Ohio State's highest preseason ranking since 2010 when it started at No. 2 and its highest overall ranking since Oct. 10, 2010 when it was ranked No. 1. The Buckeyes, who have been ranked by the AP more times (813) than any other school, appeared in the AP preseason poll for the 25th consecutive season, the longest such streak in the nation. It also marked the 46th consecutive season Ohio State has appeared in the AP poll, tying Alabama for the longest active streak.

Since the start of the 2002 season, Ohio State has been ranked in the AP Top 10 more times than any other school (136). Oklahoma is second with 123.

BLACK STRIPE PROGRAM

The Ohio State freshmen were watched closely this fall. Coach Urban Meyer had a black stripe taped on each of their helmets at the beginning of camp. Getting the black stripe removed is a signal that a freshman is ready to become a full-fledged Buckeye.

Each freshman is assigned a big brother, a leader on the team, who helps the younger player get through the rigors of fall camp while teaching what it takes to be an Ohio State Buckeye. It is a program that Meyer has implemented throughout his head coaching career, beginning in 2001 at BGSU.

35 CONSECUTIVE HOME OPENING WINS

With its victory over Buffalo Aug. 31, Ohio State has now won 35 consecutive home-opening games with the last loss happening 36 years ago – Sept. 16, 1978 – when Joe Paterno's No. 5 Penn State team defeated No. 6 Ohio State, 19-0, to open what would ultimately be Woody Hayes' final season as head coach. A few more home game notes:

- Ohio State has an all-time opening game record of 108-12-4. The Buckeyes' last season-opening loss came against the Miami Hurricanes in the 1999 Kickoff Classic in East Rutherford, N.J.
- All-time, the Buckeyes are 112-8-4 in home openers since 1890.

124TH YEAR OF FOOTBALL IN COLUMBUS

The 2013 college football season represents the 124th season of football for The Ohio State University Buckeyes. It also represents Ohio State's 101st season in the Big Ten Conference. The Buckeyes have an all-time record of 844-316-53 to rank among the top five winningest programs in NCAA history.

101st BIG TEN SEASON

The 2013 season is Ohio State's 101st season of play in the Big Ten Conference. Ohio State joined the former Western Conference during the 1912-13 academic year, but it could not compete in the conference in football until 1913. Ohio State ranks second in all-time Big Ten wins with a record of 468-171-24. Ohio State also ranks second with 34 outright or shared Big Ten championships.

91st YEAR IN OHIO STADIUM

Ohio Stadium, grand and venerable and registered on the National Register of Historic Places, is hosting its 91st football season in 2013. Ohio Stadium is endearingly nicknamed the "Horseshoe" or the "Shoe" because of its open south end. It is also referred to as the "House that Harley Built" after Chic Harley, Ohio State's first three-time All-American who fans flocked to see at Ohio Field in 1916-17-19. Just one year after Harley's career at Ohio State was over, things were in motion for a new stadium for the Buckeyes.

OHIO STADIUM STATS

Ohio State has an all-time record of 409-109-20 in Ohio Stadium and the stadium has an official capacity of 102,329. The Buckeyes have not played before fewer than 100,000 fans in the last 92 games, or since the completion of a three-year renovation project in 2001 that restored and improved the stadium but also boosted attendance from an 88,000-plus capacity to over 100,000. Ohio State has played before more than 105,000 fans 47 times with a record crowd of 106,102 vs. Nebraska on Oct. 6, 2012.

Ohio State's crowd of 105,826 vs. Wisconsin Sept. 28, 2013 was the third-largest crowd in school history.

PACE NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HOF

Orlando Pace, one of the all-time greats at Ohio State as well as in college and professional football, was named a member of the 2013 College Football Hall of Fame Class by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) in May. Pace is the 24th Buckeye player to be so honored by the NFF.

Pace and the rest of the 2013 Hall of Fame Class will be inducted at the 56th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on December 10, 2013, at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City. They will be honored guests at the National Hall of Fame Salute at the Allstate Sugar Bowl in New Orleans on January 2, 2014 and officially enshrined in the summer of 2014.

In 1995 he became the first sophomore to win the Lombardi Award and in 1996 he became the first to ever win the Lombardi Award twice. Pace was a first-team consensus All-American in 1995 and 1996 and first-team all-Big Ten Conference in 1995 and 1996. In 1996 he was the first offensive lineman since Ohio State's John Hicks in 1972 to finish among the Top 4 vote getters for the Heisman Trophy. In 1997 Pace was the first pick of the 1997 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams.

POLL EXPLANATION & ABOUT THE BCS:

The Harris Interactive Poll, USA Today Coaches Poll and computer rankings each comprise one-third of the BCS Standings. To derive the percentages, each team's total points in the Harris and USA Today polls are divided by the maximum possible points (2,625 for Harris and 1,550 for USA Today). The computer rankings percentage is calculated by dropping the highest and lowest ranking for each team and then dividing the remaining total by 100 (the maximum possible points). The BCS Average is calculated by averaging the percentage totals of the Harris Interactive Poll, USA Today Poll, and computer rankings. The teams' BCS Averages are ranked to produce the BCS Standings. The six computer ranking providers are Anderson & Hester, Richard Billingsley, Wes Colley, Kenneth Massey, Jeff Sagarin and Peter Wolfe. Each computer ranking provider accounts for schedule strength within its formula.

The BCS is a five-game arrangement for post-season college football that is managed by the 10 Football Bowl Subdivision conferences and institutions. Its purpose is to match the top two teams in a bowl game and to create exciting matchups in four other games.

The No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the Dec. 8 BCS standings will play in the Vizio BCS National Championship Game on Jan. 6 2014 in Pasadena, Calif. Urban Meyer made history in his first season as Ohio State coach in 2012, guiding the Scarlet and Gray to only the sixth undefeated and untied season in school history with a 12-0 record and also to a Big Ten Conference Leaders Division championship. He was awarded the Woody Hayes Trophy as national Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. He was also a finalist for four additional national Coach of the Year Awards - the FWAA's Eddie Robinson Award, the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year, the Paul "Bear" Bryant and the Bobby Bowden Coach of the Year awards - for his (and his staff's) efforts to turn a team that had no chance at a post-season into an Associated Press Top 3 team.

Meyer and staff built this unbeaten team that led the Big Ten in scoring and ranked second in rushing by convincing the players the most important thing they could do was win the next game; practice hard, prepare well and simply find ways to win, and by winning the team would realize its 2012 rewards. And by winning it would honor a senior class that included 13 scholarship players who could have left and played for any bowl-eligible team in the country. And by winning it would reinforce Meyer's abilities to build a championship-caliber team, of which he has done multiple times before, even after taking a year off from coaching.

Win is what Meyer's Ohio State team did. It won dominantly: 63-38 over Legends Division champion Nebraska; 52-22 over Illinois and 56-10 over Miami. It won close: 17-16 at No. 20 Michigan State. It won by effort, will and desire: 29-22 in overtime over Purdue behind backup quarterback Kenny Guiton. And it won the big one ... three of them, in fact: 35-23 at Penn State; 21-14 in overtime at Wisconsin; and 26-21 over Michigan.

Winning games and winning championships is what Meyer, 49, came home to do. Born in Toledo, raised in Ashtabula and with degrees from Cincinnati and Ohio State, Meyer made it clear from the day he took the Ohio State position - Nov. 28, 2011 - what his intentions are: "We're going to make the great state of Ohio proud with everything we do." Ohio is proud today and Meyer has the proven deeds to keep the state beaming for years to come. Consider:

- Ohio State's 12-0 record was the second undefeated season for Meyer, who also went 12-0 at Utah in 2004;
- In his 12th season as a head coach, Meyer has the 10th-best winning percentage (.842) in college football history, and second-best among current coaches, with a 123-23 record;
- He has won two national championships;
- He has won 13 games three times, the first to accomplish the feat, in addition to his two 12-win seasons;
- He is believed to be the only collegiate coach to have three winning streaks of at least 20 games (20 at Florida/Ohio State, 22 at Florida, 20 with Utah/Florida), and he has five winning streaks of 10-or-more games;
- He won more games his first 10 years - 104 - than all but two coaches in college football history; and
- He reached 100 wins faster than all but one coach in the last 55 years - Bud Wilkinson - and faster than all but five coaches all-time.

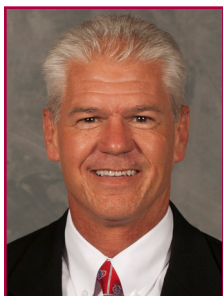

Buckeyes Remain Undefeated, Down Penn State 35-23

Defense holds Penn State to 32 rushing yards; Miller rushes for 134 and two TDs

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. -- Braxton Miller ran for 134 yards and accounted for three touchdowns, leading the Buckeyes to a 35-23 victory against Penn State.

Ryan Shazier returned an interception 17 yards for a score early in the third quarter that gave the Buckeyes (9-0, 5-0 Big Ten) the lead for good, and the Nittany Lions (5-3, 3-1) and coach Bill O'Brien had their five-game winning streak snapped.

Miller reached 100 yards rushing for the sixth time this season, carrying 25 times, and only avoiding contact when it was convenient. He also was 7 for 19 for 143 yards passing.

"I was so excited I missed a lot of throws," he said. "I was so excited to come back on the field from my injury. The crowd was energetic."

He added to his highlight reel with his first touchdown run in the second half.

Miller pulled the ball back just as teammate Carlos Hyde was engulfed by Penn State's Sean Stanley, did a two-step -- one forward and jump back -- to allude a defender, and then dived past another into the end zone. Officially, the play covered a yard, and it made the score 21-10 Ohio State with 3:30 left in the third quarter.

The Buckeyes proved their mettle at maybe the toughest place to play in the Big Ten.

Miller's second 1-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter put Ohio State up 28-10.

McGloin and Penn State then rolled to an 18-play touchdown drive he finished with a 2-yard pass to Matt Lehman to make it 28-16 with 9:49 left in the fourth quarter. The 2-point conversion try was stopped.

McGloin finished 27 for 45 for a career-high 327 yards.

With plenty of time to pull off a comeback, the Penn State crowd roared and waved pom-poms as Ohio State started its next drive backed up to its 8.

A couple of tough runs by Miller got the Buckeyes off the goal line. Then on third-and-3 from the 28, Miller hit Jake Stoneburner in stride over the middle, and the wide receiver was gone. The 72-yard touchdown made it 35-16.

The Nittany Lions added one more touchdown, almost as a thank you to all of the fans -- and there were plenty in the crowd of 107,818 -- who stayed to the end.

The Big Ten will give the Buckeyes a trophy if they win the Leaders Division, a race which they have firmly under control.

Other than that, all Ohio State can do is win 'em all and hope for the best when the final AP poll of the season comes out in January. Though an idle December would make it easier for Miller to attend the Heisman Trophy ceremony.

"I just think he's an excellent player," O'Brien said. "One of the top five players in the country."

Two of the better offenses in the Big Ten traded punts for most of the first half.

Penn State turned one of those punts into points.

Mike Hull cut through the Ohio State protection and blocked Ben Buchanan's kick a couple of yards away from the goal line. Michael Yancich recovered for a 7-0 lead with 6:15 left in the half.

Penn State forced another punt, but a holding penalty on the Nittany Lions converted the fourth down for Ohio State and Miller took advantage. His 33-yard keeper got the Buckeyes a first-and-goal at the 6, and Hyde scored from a yard out to make it 7-all.

Ohio State Doubles Up Buffalo, 40-20

Jordan Hall records a then career-high 159 rushing yards and two touchdowns

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Braxton Miller threw two touchdown passes and Jordan Hall ran for two more scores to lead the Buckeyes to a 40-20 victory over Buffalo.

The Buckeyes led 23-0 after the first quarter before the Bulls made things interesting. Joe Licata threw two TD passes and linebacker Kahlil Mack returned a Miller interception 45 yards to make it 30-20 in the third quarter.

Miller was sidelined a second time with cramps and sub Kenny Guiton promptly tossed a 21-yard TD pass to Chris Fields.

Hall had a career-high 159 yards rushing, scoring on runs of 37 and 49 yards.

Miller was 15 of 22 passing for 178 yards with TDs of 47 yards to Devin Smith and 7 yards to Chris Fields. He also ran for 77 yards on 17 attempts, although he twice went to the sideline with cramps.

Licata completed 19 of 32 passes for 185 yards and two scores with one interception, with Branden Oliver gaining 73 yards on 26 carries for the Bulls, who were playing Ohio State for the first time ever.

Ohio State was in control after its first three possessions. Miller hit Devin Smith on a 47-yard scoring pass on the fourth offensive play of the season. Then Miller found Fields on a 7-yard scoring pass.

The only surprise was that the Buckeyes lined up in an unbalanced line on both conversion tries, with only three players close to the ball. Guiton, the holder, kept on the first two-point try and then hit Hall for the second conversion behind a mass of blockers at left end.

An audible groan could be heard from the crowd of 103,980 when Meyer elected to have Drew Basil score on a more conventional point-after kick after Hall burst untouched through a gaping hole off left tackle.

As good as that first 15 minutes was - 216 yards of offense, a big lead and Buffalo looking thoroughly defeated - the next two quarters showed that the Bulls were far from dead.

After Ron Tanner picked off a tipped Licata pass for Ohio State, speedy freshman tailback Dontre Wilson gave it right back on the next play when he was hit by linebacker Blake Bean and Buffalo's Derek Brim recovered.

Licata needed just three plays to cover the 44 yards, hitting three consecutive passes with help on a late hit against Ohio State cornerback Armani Reeves. Licata flipped a pass over the middle to tight end Matt Weiser, who rumbled into the end zone from 16 yards out.

Four plays later, Buffalo quieted the crowd when Miller tossed a short pass directly to the Bulls' Mack, considered one of the top linebackers in the nation, and he outran intended receiver Wilson into the end zone. Two cracks at the two-point conversion, thanks to a defensive interference penalty, failed and the Bulls had cut the gap to 23-13.

But just as quickly, the Buckeyes regrouped and took

Wilson redeemed himself for the turnover by taking the kickoff back 51 yards. On first down, Hall bolted through another massive hole at left tackle and there was nobody on the second level to stop him as he raced 37 yards.

Buffalo threatened again in the third quarter, with Licata hitting Alex Neutz on a 10-yard scoring pass, cutting the lead to 30-20.

On the next drive, Miller went to the sideline again and Guiton tossed the scoring pass to Fields to push the lead to 17 points. Basil had a field goal for the only points of the fourth quarter.

Hall, making just the seventh start of his five years at Ohio State, rushed for 126 yards on 12 carries in the opening half.

The game was played in high humidity and temperatures in the mid-80s. Ryan Shazier, the only returning starter among the front seven on defense for Ohio State, also missed more than a quarter with leg cramps.

Ohio State stretched the nation's longest win streak to 13 in a row.

Guiton Leads Ohio State to a 42-7 win over SDSU

Senior backup QB throws for two touchdowns, runs for another in the victory

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) – Kenny Guiton took over when Braxton Miller left with a sprained left knee, running for one touchdown and passing for two on Saturday while leading No. 3 Ohio State to a 42-7 victory over San Diego State.

Miller watched the last three quarters from the sideline after being sandwiched between two tacklers on the Buckeyes' seventh offensive play.

Guiton, who helped save Ohio State's 12-0 season a year ago, had the most playing time he's ever had in a game. He set career bests with 19 of 28 passing for 152 yards and 83 rushing yards.

Guiton came in having completed 14 of 25 passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns with two interceptions in his 16 career games. He had totaled 59 yards rushing on 14 attempts.

Ohio State dominated from the outset, but a crowd of 104,984 at Ohio Stadium sat in stunned silence when Miller was injured on Ohio State's first offensive series.

On fourth-and-1 at the Aztecs 12, Miller carried to the right side and then cut back. He was trying to squirm for an extra yard or two when he was hit by defensive back King Holder while going backwards, with middle linebacker Jake Fely then hitting him and knocking his helmet off.

In came Guiton, who on the very next play handed to freshman Dontre Wilson, who sprinted around end for a 7-yard score.

The senior from Texas also tossed a 27-yard scoring pass to Corey Brown and then handed off to Jordan Hall for a 4-yard score with 3 seconds left in the first quarter. During the lull before the ensuing kickoff, Miller received a loud ovation as he jogged across the field from the ramp leading to the locker room to the Ohio State sideline.

Miller, wearing a large knee brace, remained on the sideline the rest of the game, never putting on a helmet but occasionally speaking to coach Urban Meyer and his teammates.

Meanwhile, Guiton was large and in charge.

Just like they did a week ago in rolling to a 23-0 lead, the Buckeyes got off to a big early lead. This time, however, they didn't allow the opponent to get back in the game as Buffalo did in Ohio State's 40-20 victory.

Guiton kept around the left side on a 44-yard scoring run. Rod Smith, coming off a one-game suspension for an unspecified violation of team rules, tacked on a 1-yard touchdown to make it 35-0 at the half.

It wasn't the first time in which Guiton came on in relief of Miller and grabbed the spotlight.

Guiton had taken over for an injured Miller late in last season's eighth game, against Purdue. Trailing by eight points with 47 seconds left at his own 35-yard line he led the Buckeyes to an improbable touchdown and then threw a 2-point conversion pass to force overtime. The Buckeyes won 29-22 on the way to the sixth unbeaten, untied season at the school.



Kenny Guiton threw for 152 yards and two TDs and also ran for 83 yards, including this 44-yard TD run.

Guiton hit a leaping Brown on a 24-yard scoring pass in the third quarter.

His only mistake was a second-quarter interception by cornerback Damontae Kazee -- leaping, twisting, one-handed grab that will probably end up on a few highlight reels.

San Diego State, which went 9-4 a year ago and played in a bowl game for the third season in a row, didn't get on the board until late in the third quarter. Backup quarterback Quinn Kaehler flipped a 2-yard scoring pass to Chad Young to make it 42-7. Kaehler, who completed 22 of 36 passes for 216 yards and a touchdown with one interception, took over for starter Adam Dingwell after he was intercepted by Doran Grant on the Aztecs' second possession. Dingwell finished 0 for 5 passing with the pick.

Fast Start Propels Buckeyes to 52-34 Win at California

Kenny Guiton accounts for 368 yards, throws for four TDs in the win

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) - Kenny Guiton waited until his fifth year at Ohio State to get his first start. Two plays into the game, he was already in the Buckeyes' record book.

Guiton threw three of his four touchdown passes in the first six minutes, including a school-record 90-yarder to start the onslaught, and No. 4 Ohio State rolled to its 15th straight victory, 52-34 over California on Saturday night.

Guiton got the start in place of injured Braxton Miller, and there was no drop-off in performance for the Buckeyes (3-0). He connected with Devin Smith on the deep ball on Ohio State's second offensive play -- the longest from scrimmage in school history.

He added a 47-yard touchdown to Smith and a 1-yarder to Chris Fields on fourth-and-goal as Ohio State jumped out to a 21-0 lead over the Golden Bears (1-2) less than halfway through the first quarter.

Guiton completed 21 of 32 passes for 276 yards and added 92 yards rushing to lead the Buckeyes.

Jordan Hall added 168 yards on the ground and three touchdowns as Ohio State extended the longest winning streak in major college football by outgunning the Bears in a high-paced offensive game.

With both teams running no-huddle offenses for much of the game, the defenses were scrambling as the teams combined for 86 points, 11 touchdowns and 1,111 total yards on 177 plays.

Cal's freshman quarterback Jared Goff just missed his third straight 400-yard game to begin his career, going 31 for 53 for 371 yards with three touchdowns.

But he also lost a fumble and threw an interception in the first quarter to put the Bears in an early hole they could never escape.

Goff got little help from the running game or defense. Brendan Bigelow, who rushed for 160 yards and two touchdowns on four carries last year against Ohio State was held to 39 yards on 11 carries in the rematch.

Cal's injury-ravaged defense has allowed at least 500 yards every game this season under first-year coach Sonny Dykes and even the opportunity to face a backup quarterback in Guiton couldn't change that pattern.

Guiton had thrown just 26 career passes before stepping in during the first quarter last week against San Diego State when Miller left with a sprained left knee. Miller practiced sparingly this week but was unable to play in the game, giving Guiton his long-awaited shot as a starter.

He was ready, and on his second play found Smith behind safety Damariay Drew for the 90-yard play that delighted the thousands of scarlet-clad fans who made up nearly half of the crowd at Memorial Stadium.

That started an action-packed opening quarter that featured 38 points, three turnovers and 445 yards of offense between the two teams.

Despite that fast start, the Buckeyes only led 31-20 at the half as Goff threw a pair of TD passes and Dykes pulled out all the stops.



Devin Smith hauled in this 90-yard TD pass on Ohio State's second play from scrimmage. It was Ohio State's longest play from scrimmage in school history. Smith finished with a career-high 149 yards receiving and 2 TDs.

On fourth-and-8 late in the half, Dykes appeared to send the punting unit out. But Goff, who wears the same number as punter Cole Leininger, lined up in punt formation and threw an 11-yard pass to Stefan McClure that set up Vincenzo D'Amato's 43-yard field goal on the final play of the half.

No. 4/3 Buckeyes Dominate Rattlers, 76-0

Kenny Guiton throws a school-record six TD passes in the win

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) – After a 76-0 victory over outmanned and overmatched Florida A&M, Urban Meyer couldn't say for certain that his Ohio State team got a lot out of its meek non-conference schedule.

"Obviously, at midnight next week, we'll know," the coach of No. 4 Ohio State said, referring to the Big Ten opener on Saturday against No. 24 Wisconsin. "Are we prepared? I like to think we are."

There's no doubt that Kenny Guiton is.

For the third game in a row, the perennial backup starred in place of the injured Braxton Miller. Guiton set a school record with six touchdown passes - all in the first half - in a blow-out of historic proportions.

FAMU, which picked up the sport in 1899, had never lost by so many points. It was the most lopsided Ohio State win since an 85-7 victory over Drake in 1935.

"We don't want a pity party," said Rattlers coach Earl Holmes, who made a point of saying the Buckeyes didn't run up the score on his team. "I don't have a problem with that. I don't expect the coach to kneel. You play the game. You play for 60 minutes."

At least it was decided relatively quickly. The Buckeyes (4-0) needed a total of four offensive plays and 46 seconds to go up 21-0 in the opening 6 minutes and never looked back. Guiton, who completed 24 of 34 passes for 215 yards, tossed four TD passes in the first quarter.

"I had all day," Guiton said. "The coaches wanted to come out throwing the ball around and I thank them for the trust they had in me to be able to do that."

FAMU (1-3) was behind 48-0 when it picked up its initial first down in the second quarter.

The Rattlers' biggest previous margin of defeat was 73-6 to Tuskegee in 1926. They lost to Oklahoma 69-13 a year ago and South Florida 70-17 in 2011.

The stats were as lopsided as the score. Ohio State had a 34-2 edge in first downs and a 603-80 differential in yards.

"I wouldn't say we're unsatisfied," tight end Jeff Heurman said. "There's always room for improvement. We're not perfect."

Miller, the Big Ten's offensive player of the year last season and a Heisman Trophy hopeful this year, missed his second game in a row with a sprained medial-collateral ligament in his left knee.

Meyer had said Miller was probable to play against the Rattlers, but he never put on his uniform.

It didn't take long for this game to get out of control, with or without him.

After a short punt ended the Rattlers' first possession, Ohio State took over at the FAMU 30. On third down from the 3, Guiton's pass into the end zone was picked off by Patrick Aiken. Aiken, however, elected to try to run the ball out. He got to the 3 before being hit by running back Jordan Hall and fumbling the ball away.

On the next play, Hall scored the first of his two touchdowns.

After a 65-yard punt return by Corey Brown put the ball at the 11, one play later Guiton flipped an 11-yard TD pass to Heurman. That made it 13-0 - the

Buckeyes inexplicably went for two but failed - with the touchdowns coming on two plays totaling 10 seconds.

Doran Grant blocked the next FAMU punt and the Buckeyes were right back in business at the 25. It took two more passes to make it 20-0, with Guiton hitting Evan Spencer for the final eight yards and the score.

Carlos Hyde, who had been suspended for the first three games after an alleged altercation with a female in a bar this summer, took a shovel pass the final yard late in the quarter. After the ensuing kickoff, Bradley Roby intercepted a pass by Damien Fleming and returned it to the 5. It was 34-0 after Guiton hit Devin Smith for the score.

Guiton eclipsed the mark that had been held by John Borton in 1952 and Bobby Hoying (who did it in 1994 and again in 1995) with his second TD pass to Spencer in the final seconds of the half.

With the Buckeyes up 55-0 at the half, Meyer took his foot off the gas and filled the field with subs. Fifth-team tailback Ezekiel Elliott ran for 162 yards on 14 carries and two touchdowns and third-string quarterback Cardale Jones ran for one.

"You come to Ohio State to compete for the Big Ten championship," Meyer said. "That actually started in a meeting just a minute ago."

Buckeyes Top Badgers in Leaders Division Clash

Braxton Miller throws for four TDs in his first game back from injury

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) -- Braxton Miller matched a career-high with four touchdown passes in his first game in three weeks and No. 4 Ohio State ran the nation's longest winning streak to 17 games with a 31-24 victory over No. 23 Wisconsin.

Miller missed the last two games with a sprained left knee, but didn't show the slightest bit of rust. The junior threw three touchdown passes in the first half, including a 40-yarder to Corey Brown with 1 second left that put Ohio State (5-0, 1-0 Big Ten) up 24-14.

"I've been working really hard this last couple weeks because I've been hurt, fundamental-wise," Miller said. "I felt pretty good. My leg felt good, energy-wise. I wasn't out of shape."

Joel Stave and Jared Abbrederis kept the Badgers (3-2, 1-1) in it. Stave threw for 295 yards and two TDs. Abbrederis caught 10 passes for a career-best 207 yards and a score, winning most of his one-on-one matchups with star cornerback Bradley Roby.

James White ran 17 yards for a touchdown with 13:47 left in the fourth quarter to cut Ohio State's lead to 31-21.

Wisconsin got within 31-24 on a 42-yard field goal by Kyle French with 2:05 left in the fourth, and got the ball back at its own 10 with 1:29 left but Ohio State didn't even give up a first down.

The Buckeyes' first big game of the season was big enough to bring Ohio native LeBron James to the Horseshoe and turn Ohio Stadium into the most-scarlet place on earth. Just about everyone in the crowd of 105,826 - third-largest in Ohio State history - was donning the Buckeyes' shade of red.

The Buckeyes had been off the radar for the first four weeks of the season, beating up on overmatched foes and dropping a couple of spots in the polls.

The only news from Columbus was Miller's injury early in the second game of the season, though the Buckeyes didn't miss a beat without him. Kenny Guiton stepped in, led Ohio State to three blowout victories and won consecutive Big Ten offensive player of the week honors.

Guiton was so good some Buckeyes fans wondered aloud whether he should keep playing even if Miller was ready to play.

Miller said he wasn't paying any attention.

"I'm proud of Kenny, the way he stepped in," said Miller, who passed for 198 yards and ran for 83. "I look at him as a big brother."

And coach Urban Meyer said there was never a question Miller would start if he could.

"No, not if he's healthy," Meyer said.

Miller started as expected and on his first series fired a 25-yard touchdown pass to Evan Spencer.

The question for Wisconsin coming in was how well Stave could compliment the Badgers' powerful running game. The sophomore ended up carrying the offense and was never better than when he hit Abbrederis with a perfectly thrown deep ball for a 36-yard score to make it 7-7.

"No. 4, he's got my vote for All-Big Ten," Meyer said

of Abbrederis.

Miller came right back and hooked up with Devin Smith with a 26-yard touchdown pass to make it 14-7.

After Drew Basil booted a 45-yard field goal with 4:33 left in the second quarter for Ohio State, Stave found Sam Arneson for an 11-yard touchdown to make it 17-14 with 1:30 left.

Too much time.

Miller drove the Buckeyes to the 40 and underthrew a deep pass on third-and-7 that hit Wisconsin cornerback Sojourn Shelton in the hands, but the freshman dropped the interception.

Brown got behind the Wisconsin secondary by a step and Miller threw a dart that hit his receiver in the chest for a 40-yard touchdown with a second left in the half.

Miller gave the touchdown signal, a couple of claps and a clumsy hip bump with a teammate. Ohio State went to the locker room up 24-14 on the three-time defending Big Ten champions.

The Buckeyes took a big step toward taking that crown from the Badgers, though they lost starting safety Christian Bryant to a broken ankle, Meyer said.

The Buckeyes struggled to stop the Badgers and got some help from Wisconsin in the second quarter when two penalties on the same series wiped out a third-down conversion (holding) and a muffed punt by Ohio State (illegal formation).

Melvin Gordon, the nation's leading rusher, was held under 100 yards for the first time this season. He had 74 yards on 15 carries before limping off with an apparent leg injury early in the fourth quarter.

Hyde Leads Ohio State to 40-30 Victory over Northwestern

Senior running back rushes for a career-high 168 yards and three TDs

EVANSTON, Ill. (AP) -- No. 4 Ohio State took Northwestern's best shot on a wet and raucous night at Ryan Field, and the Buckeyes' perfect record is still standing.

They can thank Carlos Hyde for that.

Hyde ran for a career-high 168 yards and three touchdowns, and Ohio State rallied to beat No. 16 Northwestern 40-30 and extend the nation's longest win streak to 18 games.

The Buckeyes (6-0, 2-0 Big Ten) remained undefeated since Urban Meyer took over as coach last year.

On a rain-soaked field and with a prime-time audience watching, they rallied from 10 down in the third quarter to take out a team aiming to show it could beat the best in the conference.

Hyde prevented that. He scored on a 4-yard run late in the third and added two more touchdowns in the final quarter to lift the Buckeyes.

He was credited with a 2-yard touchdown after a replay review early in the fourth to put Ohio State ahead 26-23. Then, after Northwestern's Trevor Siemian connected with Cameron Dickerson on a 12-yard score, Hyde ran it in from the 7 with 5:22 left in the game. That made it 34-30.

The Wildcats' Kain Colter got stopped on fourth-and-1 at the Ohio State 34 with 2:43 left after he picked up his own fumble, wiping out a late threat. The game ended with Northwestern (4-1, 0-1) lateralling and the Buckeyes recovering the loose ball in the end zone.

Hyde came up big with Jordan Hall nursing a knee injury, and Ohio State pulled this one out even though Braxton Miller wasn't at his best. He threw for 203 yards but had an interception and fumbled twice after matching a career-high with four touchdown passes against Wisconsin last week. He also ran for 68 yards.

Corey Brown added a career-high 127 yards receiving, and the defense delivered five sacks, sending the Buckeyes to their 29th win in their past 30 games with the Wildcats.

Northwestern hasn't beaten a Top 5 team since it opened the 1959 season with wins over No. 2 Oklahoma and No. 5 Iowa.

Siemian threw 245 yards and two touchdowns against a defense missing one of its leaders in safety Christian Bryant. He broke his left ankle late in last week's game and is expected to miss the rest of the regular season.

Colter completed all 12 passes for 98 yards and had a touchdown catch early in the game.

Rashad Lawrence had 149 yards receiving.

Venric Mark ran for 60 yards after missing three games with a lower body injury, but instead of a signature victory, Northwestern came away with a tight loss.

Northwestern was leading 23-20 early in the fourth when Doran Grant stepped in front of Lawrence to pick off a pass by Siemian at the 23. He returned it 7 yards to the Northwestern 16, and on third-and-goal at the 2, Hyde reached across the goal line and was credited

with the touchdown after a replay review.

That delighted the Buckeyes fans, but the Northwestern crowd had plenty to cheer moments later.

Siemian connected with Lawrence on a 67-yard slant to the 7. Then, with the ball at the 12, a scrambling Siemian found Dickerson in the end zone on third down. Just like that, the Wildcats were back on top, 30-27, but in the end, it was Ohio State's night.

Buckeyes Control Second Half, Top Hawkeyes 34-24

Urban Meyer wins 20th straight game for third time in his career

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) -- No. 4 Ohio State found a way to keep its winning streak alive just in time.

Carlos Hyde ran for 149 yards, including 106 yards and two touchdowns in the second half, to lead the Buckeyes to a 34-24 victory over Iowa on Saturday.

It was the Buckeyes' 19th consecutive victory, the most in the nation and tying the second-best streak in school history.

The Hawkeyes (4-3, 1-2 Big Ten) played well offensively in the first half and led 21-14 at the break behind the passing of Jake Rudock and running of Mark Weisman and Damon Bullock.

But Hyde tied it with the first rushing TD against Iowa this season on Ohio State's first drive of the third quarter, and the Buckeyes took over.

Braxton Miller completed 22 of 27 passes for 222 yards and two touchdowns and added 102 yards rushing for the Buckeyes (7-0, 3-0), who haven't lost in Urban Meyer's two years as head coach.

Rudock threw for three touchdowns, completing 19 of 34 passes for 245 yards with one interception.

After watching Iowa's offense control the first half, the Buckeyes outgained the Hawkeyes 306-153 in the last two quarters. They piled up a 23:05-6:55 edge in time of possession.

Ohio State's All-Big Ten cornerback, Bradley Roby, was ejected from the game for a hit to the head of a receiver in the first quarter.

Teams had run 204 times this season against Iowa's defense before the Buckeyes finally scored against the Hawkeyes. Hyde barely got the nose of the ball across the goal line from a yard out to tie the game at 17 on the first series of the second half.

The teams traded touchdowns - Miller hitting Devin Smith on a 14-yard scoring pass before Iowa evened it on the next snap on Rudock's 85-yard TD pass to Jake Duzey - before Hyde scored again early in the fourth quarter to put Ohio State ahead for keeps.

The TD was set up by an acrobatic play by Miller. He stepped back on third and 7 at the Iowa 28, rolling right when the pocket collapsed. He scampered all the way to the right side, then reversed field and picked up blockers - tackle Jack Mewhort leveled a defender near the end - to gain nine yards and the first down.

On the next play, Hyde took a handoff and bounced off right tackle. He muscled his way to the 7-yard line, where he was hit hard by free safety Tanner Miller, the blow knocking him off balance. He had retreated all the way to the 11 by the time he regained his bearings and turned up the right sideline. Hyde ran to the 3 before vaulting just inside the corner post for the touchdown.

Ohio State's defense finally held and forced a punt, with the Buckeyes adding Drew Basil's field goal to make it a 10-point lead that they maintained the rest of the way.

Tyvis Powell then ended the Hawkeyes' next drive when he intercepted Rudock's pass at midfield.

Roby was ejected late in the first quarter when Rudock tossed a short pass over the middle to tight end C.J. Fiedorowicz. Roby hit him high after an 11-yard gain.

Rudock completed all five passes, including a 2-yarder to Fiedorowicz for the touchdown, after taking the opening kick. Rudock completed passes for 24 and 15 yards, and Bullock, who led Iowa with 56 yards on 10 carries, added 16 more.

After the Buckeyes countered on Basil's 27-yard field goal - the drive stalling when Miller's pass on third and 5 at the 11 was batted down by tackle Louis Trinca-Pasat - Iowa again drove from its 23 to the Ohio State 10 before Mike Meyer's 28-yard field goal.

The Buckeyes needed just four plays to cover 74 yards after the kickoff, with Miller finding Corey Brown alone in the secondary on a 58-yard scoring pass. Brown outran cornerback B.J. Lowery to the end zone.

The Hawkeyes got the ball again and moved almost effortlessly through Ohio State's defense, which is without safety Christian Bryant (broken ankle) but regained Noah Spence and Adolphus Washington, two important injured linemen.

With Weisman, who had 52 yards on 10 carries, going for 21 yards, and Rudock completing 4 of 7 passes, they moved to a third-and-5 situation at the 6. Rudock then lofted a pass to the left corner of the end zone, where Kevonte Martin-Manley had slipped past Armani Reeves - who had come in to replace Roby - to catch the TD pass.

Reeves was also victimized on Duzey's long touchdown catch and run that tied it at 24 late in the third quarter.

Duzey had six catches for 138 yards.
