**THE GAME:** Penn State will continue a two-game road swing and play the third of three-straight games vs. ranked opponents on Wednesday when the Lions head to No. 6 Ohio State. It will be the only regular season meeting with the Buckeyes who lead the series 30-13 and 16-4 in Columbus. Penn State has lost 16-straight games to Ohio State and eight-straight in Columbus, with the last win there coming in 2001 (78-75). The Buckeyes have posted double-digit victories in six of the last seven meetings, but edged out a 69-66 victory in Columbus last year to defend its No. 2 ranking. The teams last met in the championship game of the 2011 Big Ten Tournament in Indianapolis, Penn State's first-ever appearance in the game, with the No. 1-ranked Buckeyes winning 71-60.

**FRAZIER NOW HAS 10 OVER 20:** Tim Frazier posted his Big Ten LEADING 10th game of 20 or more points with a team-high 21 in the Lions' loss at No. 11 Indiana (73-54) on Sunday. Frazier was a perfect 6-of-6 at the foul line, extending his recent run to 32-of-34 (94%) at the charity stripe in his last five games, and 7-of-18 from the floor while playing nearly all 40 minutes in the game. Frazier's 10 games of 20+ points, five in eight Big Ten games, have him ahead of **Talor Battle's** pace last year that saw the first-team All-Big Ten guard finish second in the Big Ten with 18 20-point games. Battle had nine such games and three in his first eight Big Ten games on Jan. 23 of last year.

**LEADING THE BIG TEN:** Tim Frazier now leads the Big Ten in scoring (19.4), assists (5.3) and steals (2.5) and is fourth in free throw percentage (84.0%) in conference games. **He is the only player in any of the 32 Division I conferences to rank first in scoring, assists and steals in conference play in their conference's statistics.** Frazier is posting 29% of the scoring, 58% of assists and 32% of steals for the Lions this season and has led the team in scoring 15 times, in assists 21 times and in steals 12 times.

**...AND HE'S CLUTCH TOO!:** Not only is junior guard Tim Frazier posting statistical numbers matched by very few players in the nation, he now can add "clutch" to his resume after sinking a 12-foot, game-winning floater with eight seconds to play to break a tie game and send Penn State to a 54-52 victory over No. 22/25 Illinois in the Bryce Jordan Center (1/19). Frazier stepped into the role occupied by Talor Battle over the previous four seasons and hit nothing-but-net in the first game-winning attempt of his career.

**LIONS TO HONOR PATERNO:** Penn State's players will wear a black band on their jerseys in honor of legendary Penn State football coach Joe Paterno who passed away at the age of 85 on Jan. 22 in State College. Coach Patrick Chambers and the team planned to pay their respects to Coach Paterno and his family at a public viewing on the Penn State campus shortly before their departure for Columbus on Tuesday. The winningest coach in the history of major college football (409), the legendary teacher, mentor and humanitarian had been diagnosed with lung cancer last November and recently had been hospitalized. A member of the Penn State coaching staff for 62 seasons, and the Nittany Lions' head football coach since 1966 (nearly 46 years), he was among the first three active coaches to be inducted into the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame, in 2007.

## LAST TIME OUT

### #11 Indiana 73, Penn State 54 Jan. 22 • Bloomington, Ind.

Penn State held a 29-27 lead at the half after holding the Hoosiers to 41% shooting and 2-of-7 from three in the first half, but saw Indiana hit its first four threes of the second half and use and 18-6 run in the opening seven minutes to grab a 45-35 lead. The Hoosiers would shoot 65% from the floor and 5-of-9 from three in the half with Assembly Hall roaring. Penn State would hit just 23% in the half and 4-of-17 from three for the game and would never get closer than nine the rest of the way. Tim Frazier paced PSU with 21 points and walk-on Nick Colella added a career-high 11 on 3-of-5 from three off the bench. Freshman Cody Zeller paced IU with 18 points. IU out-scored the Lions 30-16 in the paint, despite 15 PSU offensive boards, and 46-25 in the second half.

# OUTLET PASSES

■ Tim Frazier LEADS the Big Ten in scoring (19.4), assists (5.3) and steals (2.5) in conference play, the only player in 32 Division I conferences to do so. He ranks 10th in the NCAA in assists. He has raised his scoring average by 11.7 ppg from last season (6.3 to 18.0).

■ Tim Frazier is 32-34 (94.1%) at the foul line in his last five games. Cam Woodyard has hit 27-of-28 (96.4%) at the line in his last 11 games. Woodyard ranks first (95%) and Frazier 4th (84%) in the Big Ten at the line in Big Ten games.

■ Patrick Chambers logged his first career victory over a Top 25 opponent with the Lions' 54-52 win over #22 Illinois (1/19). It was his 8th career game vs. a ranked foe (fourth at PSU).

■ Cam Woodyard led Penn State in scoring in 2 of the last 3 games, including a career-high 22 points vs. Minnesota (1/15).

■ 6-8 Forward Billy Oliver missed the last two games with illness and will not play at OSU. He hit a career-best 7-of-11 from three for a career-high 21 points vs. Purdue and leads the team with 34 threes on the year, taking 79% of his shots from behind the arc. He totalled 11 in 32 games last year.

■ Penn State ranks fourth in Big Ten games shooting 73.9% at the foul line. PSU shot a season-best 84% (21-25) at the foul line vs. Indiana & 82% (23-28) vs. Minnesota.

■ Opponents have shot 50% or better in 5 of the Lions' last 6 losses & better than 47% in all 6. PSU shot better than 40% in just one of the 6 losses.

■ Penn State has shot 37.5% from three and averaged 8.1 threes per game in wins, while hitting just 25% and 5.2 baskets from the arc in losses, shooting less than 32% from three in all 11 losses.

■ PSU is scoring 69.2 ppg & shooting 42% at home (8-4) on the year, while posting 54.3 ppg & shooting 34.3% in 9 games away from home (2-7).

■ Eight of Penn State's 10 primary contributors are in their first or second season of Division I play.

■ Penn State is 6-0 on the year (41-2 the last five years) when holding opponents to less than 60 points, 1-7 when they surpass 70 points & 0-7 when they shoot better than 45%. The Lions are 8-2 when scoring more than 60 & 2-9 when posting 60 or less.

■ Penn State has won the rebounding battle in 15 games and are 1st in offensive boards, 4th in total rebounding & 3rd in rebound margin in the Big Ten.

■ Matt Glover had a career-best 11 rebounds vs. Purdue and has led the team in 4 Big Ten games. He has a team-high 28 reps on the 185-pound bench, a mark that exceeds the highest posted at the NBA Pre-draft combine since 2000.

■ Tim Frazier is the **ONLY PLAYER IN NCAA DIV. I** averaging 17+ points and 6.4+ assists per game.

■ Tim Frazier has led the team in scoring 15 times and posted a Big Ten LEADING TEN 20-point games on the year.

■ Tim Frazier is one of two Big Ten players ranked in the top 15 of scoring, rebounds and assists in the conference statistics.

■ Tim Frazier is on pace to break the PSU season assist record of 189 set by Talor Battle in 2009. He moved into 10th on the Penn State career assist charts (381) and has 7 games of 9+ on the year.

■ Jermaine Marshall has scored in double-digits in 11 games, including three 20-point outings.

**SCOUTING OHIO STATE:** The Buckeyes (17-3) bring a No. 3 ranking and Big Ten leading 5-2 conference record into Sunday. The defending Big Ten regular season and tournament champions lead the conference scoring 76.7 ppg and allowing just 57.4 ppg in Big Ten play. They also lead in rebounding (37.7), steals (8.4), field goal percentage defense (39.1), scoring margin (+19.3) and rebound margin (+8.6) while standing second in shooting percentage (49.5). National Player of the Year candidate Jared Sullinger ranks third in the Big Ten in scoring (17.1) and second in rebounding (9.1) and has seven double-doubles on the year. William Buford (15.2) and DeShaun Thomas (15.0) also average double-figures and lead the team with 31 and 22 threes, respectively. Guard Aaron Craft leads the Big Ten in steals (2.5) and ranks second in assists (5.1). Indiana is 14-0 at home on the year and is riding a 36-game home winning streak, the second longest in school history.

**LAST TIME VS. OHIO STATE:** Penn State dropped three games to the Buckeyes last year, the last coming vs. No. 1 Ohio State in a 71-60 loss in the championship game of the Big Ten Tournament. OSU shot 51%, recorded eight blocks and committed just seven turnovers in the win as Penn State hit just 39% and 7-of-18 from three. Talor Battle had 24 and Jeff Brooks 19 for the Lions while William Buford posted 18 and Jared Sullinger 15 and 11 boards for OSU. The Lions were down, 29-23, at the half but couldn't keep pace with an OSU team that hit 64% in the second half. In the Lions' last trip to Columbus, Penn State led 61-60 following a Battle steal and lay-up with 2:53 to play, but Sullinger muscled in a pair of three-point plays on the block in the final minute to help No. 2 OSU pull out a 69-66 win. Penn State hit 55.6% and won the rebounding battle 29-17. David Jackson led PSU four Lions in double-figures with 19 while Battle added 15. In a game that was tied at 32 at the half, OSU shot 49% and got 19 points from Sullinger and 19 from Aaron Craft who hit 4-of-6 from three in front of 18,809 at Value City Arena.

**THE FRIENDLY CONFINES/ROAD CHALLENGE:** Penn State logged a season-high 82 points vs. No. 12 Indiana on Jan. 8 at the BJC and is averaging 69 ppg, 42% from the floor and 35% from three at home. Penn State has scored more than 70 points in seven of 12 home games. The Lions have struggled offensively away from the BJC averaging just 54.3 ppg, 34% from the floor and 25% from three in nine contests while going 2-7. Penn State has scored more than 60 points (62 at B.C.) just once away from the BJC. The Lions shot 34% and scored 54 points in their last road outing, a 73-54 loss at No. 11 Indiana.

**TIMES HAVE CHANGED:** Penn State graduated players that accounted for 80% of the scoring and nearly 70% of the rebounding from last year's NCAA Tournament team, including five seniors that accounted for 432 career starts and 581 career games played. Among them was all-time leading scorer Talor Battle who posted 2,213 points and led the Lions in scoring each of the past four seasons.

FRAZIER NAMED COUSY CANDIDATE: Tim Frazier was named by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame among the candidates for the 2012 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. Frazier was one of five Big Ten players named to the list. Frazier joined Big Ten players Trey Burke (Michigan), Aaron Craft (Ohio State), Lewis Jackson (Purdue) and Jordan Taylor (Wisconsin) on the list.

Frazier's total tied for the second most ever by a Lion vs. a Big Ten team behind Titus Ivory's seven against Michigan in 2001 and were the most in a Big Ten game since Travis Parker had six vs. Northwestern in 2006.

FRAZIER SERVING ASSISTS AT RECORD PACE:

Tim Frazier is on pace to break the Lions' single-season assist record of 189 set by Talor Battle in 38 games in 2008-09. Frazier's Big Ten leading 6.4 apg is above the PSU record season average of 6.1 set by Freddie Barnes (1992) and Tom Wilkinson (1978). At his current pace he would log more than 200 assists by season's end. Frazier has posted career-best assist totals in three games this year, posting at least 10 on each occasion, and has logged SEVEN games of 9+ assists. He had a career-best 11 assists vs YSU (11/23). Tim Frazier is on pace to become the first Lion ever to post a top 10 season in scoring, assists and steals in the same year. At his current pace, he could become the first Lion ever to eclipse 500 points, 150 assists and 50 steals in the same year. Currently THIRD among active career assist leaders in the Big Ten with 381 (Wisconsin's Jordan Taylor leads with 409), Frazier's 18.0 points and 6.7 assists per game have him at 378 points and 135 assists on the year. ## NINE MAN ROTATION:

Patrick Chambers has employed a nine-man rotation for most of the season and ten players are averaging 12+ minutes per game in Big Ten play. Walk-on Nick Colella has joined the rotation with the injury to Trey Lewis.

**EIGHT LINE-UPS:** Penn State has employed eight different starting line-ups on the season.

**MARSHALL NOW A SOLID SCORER:** Jermaine Marshall has established himself as a consistent scorer, posting 10 double-digit outings in the last 14 games. Marshall had posted a total of 98 points and 24 rebounds in the first 34 games of his career. Marshall has posted three 20-points games and made 25 threes, twice hitting a career-high three treys, on the year.

## MARSHALL EMERGES:

Redshirt sophomore Jermaine Marshall has emerged as a go-to scoring option for Penn State.

- Posted his third 20-point game of the year with 20 points in an 88-82 loss to No. 12 Indiana (1/8).
- Posted six-straight double-figure scoring outings, with two 20-point games to close out the non-conference season.
- Second on the team scoring 9.8 ppg and getting to the foul line 62 times on the year.
- 11 double-digit scoring outings on the year, had one entering the season.
- Led Penn State with 20 points and a career-high 9 rebounds in a loss to Lafayette (12/7) at the BJC. Hit a career-best 9-of-11 at the foul line in the game.
- Made first career start vs. Ole Miss (12/4).
- Scored 15 first half points, including the Lions' last 10 of the half, on his way to a career-high 22 points and eight rebounds in Penn State's win at Boston College (11/30). Marshall hit 8-of-16 from the floor and a career-best 3-of-6 from three in the game.

**WOODYARD GONE WILD:** Senior Cammeron Woodyard led Penn State in scoring for the second-straight game posting 17 points on 3-of-4 from three and 6-of-10 from the floor in a victory over No. 22 Illinois (1/19). He had never led the team in scoring in his previous 93 career games. That was on the heels of a career-high 22-point game vs. Minnesota. Woodyard shot 50% from the floor, 41% from three (5-12) and 10-of-10 at the line over the two games. He has performed well at home averaging 11.9 ppg and posting nine of his 10 double-digit scoring games on the year in the BJC. He is shooting 47.8% from the floor and 43.8% (21-48) from three in home games. **Woodyard leads the team shooting 87.8% (36-41) from the foul line on the year and has missed just one free throw (27-28) in 11 games since Dec. 7.**



**WOODYARD'S CAREER NIGHT:** Senior Cammeron Woodyard posted a career-best 22 points on a career-best 8-of-8 from the foul line and 6-of-14 from the floor in a loss to Minnesota (1/15). Woodyard passed his previous career-best (14 points twice on the year) with 15 points and all eight free throws in the first half of the game.

**WOODYARD'S SENIOR SUCCESS:** Penn State's lone senior, Cammeron Woodyard, spent his first three seasons playing an average of just 8.7 minutes per game (including a high of 10.4 mpg last year) and never averaged more than the 2.2 ppg he posted in 24 contests as a freshman.

- Performing well at home averaging 11.9 ppg and posting 9 of his 10 double-digit scoring games on the year in the BJC. He had one double-digit game on his career entering the season.
- Led Penn State in scoring for the second straight game logging 17 points on 3-of-4 from three in a 54-52 upset of No. 22 Illinois (1/19).

**OLIVER MISSING TIME; LEADS LIONS WITH 34 THREES/CAREER-BEST 7 VS. PURDUE:**

After missing his first two seasons as a Nittany Lion due to concussions and chronic exercise induced headaches and taking a total of 76 shots last year, his first full healthy season, junior Billy Oliver has seen a much more integral offensive role in his fourth season in the program.

• Sick during the Minnesota game, experiencing vomiting at halftime. Missed the last two games with illness and will not play at Ohio State. Has undergone a battery of tests during the week to determine cause. Doctors have cleared him to potentially return vs. Wisconsin on Jan. 31.

• **Oliver leads the Lions with 34 threes on the year & 96 attempts** and has taken 79% of his shots from behind the arc.

• 16-of-28 (57%) from three in six games prior to going 1-of-8 at Nebraska (1/11).

• Hit 3-of-5 from three vs. No. 12 Indiana.

• Scored a **career-high 21 points** on a career-best 7-of-10 from three in the Lions' victory over Purdue. **His seven threes tied for the second-best single game total in Penn State history.**

• Had 13 points and three blocks in just 20 minutes of win over Mt. St. Mary's (12/18).

• Oliver made a then career-best four threes for 12 points while taking 13 shots (10 from three) in the Lions' loss at St. Joe's (11/26).

• Hit two clutch threes late in the second half to finish with nine points and a career-high 10 rebounds in PSU's win over LIU (11/16).

• **Entered the season as a career 23.9 percent shooter from three having hit 11-of-46 career three-point attempts.**

• An Academic All-Big Ten honoree who carries over a 3.2 grade-point average in finance in Penn State's Smeal College of Business.

**TRAVIS HITTING THE BOARDS:**

Freshman Ross Travis has been referred to by coach Patrick Chambers as his "junkyard dog" for the energy level he brings to the court and his willingness to mix it up and sacrifice his body.

• Led team in rebounding in 3 of the last 5 games and in six games total on the year.

• Team's 3rd leading rebounder (4.1)

• Equaled a career-high with 8 rebounds vs. Minnesota (1/15).

• Posted career highs of 12 points and 8 rebounds vs. Lafayette (12/7).

• Scored all of a then career high point total in the second half vs. Kentucky, hitting a pair of threes on his way to 10 points and eight rebounds.

**BOROVNJAK GOES FOR CAREER HIGH:**

Redshirt sophomore Sasa Borovnjak is developing into a solid low-post scoring threat for Penn State after missing last season with an ACL injury.

• Shooting a team-high 57.5 percent from the floor on the year.

• Posted three perfect shooting games from the floor with four or more field goals on the year, the last coming with a 4-for-4 night for eight points in a win over Purdue (1/5).

• Came off the bench to go a perfect 7-of-7 from the floor for a career-high 15 points in a loss to Ole Miss (12/4).

• Posted 10 points on 5-of-5 shooting in a win over Mt. St. Mary's (12/18).

• Tore the ACL in his right knee in Penn State's first pre-season practice of 2010-11.

**LEWIS MISSING TIME WITH BACK INJURY:**

Freshman Trey Lewis, the runner-up for Ohio's "Mr. Basketball" award in 2011, proved to be an effective three-point threat for the Lions early in the year, but has missed time with an ankle injury and now a lower back injury that threatens to cost him at least several weeks if not the remainder of the season. Lewis has a stress fracture of the L5 vertebrae which was discovered Jan. 13.

• Missed **LAST THREE** games with a lower back injury.

• Hit a **CAREER-BEST** 4-of-6 from three for 13 points in win over Cornell (12/21)

• Outstanding in his first collegiate game leading Penn State to a season-opening victory with a team-high 17 points on 3-of-6 from three. Scored 14 of his 17 points in the second half as Penn State pushed a 10-point halftime lead to as much as 26. He scored 10-straight points, hitting a pair of treys.

• Led Penn State with 26 points on 8-of-11 shooting and a career-high 11 assists in a victory over Youngstown State (11/23).

• Posted back-to-back double-doubles, 20-point games and career-best assist totals in two outings vs. Radford and LIU.

• The first PSU player to post back-to-back double-doubles since Geary Claxton posted three straight in January of 2008.

**FRAZIER'S FOUR DOUBLE-DOUBLES:**

Tim Frazier has posted four double-doubles on the season, **TIED FOR FOURTH MOST IN THE BIG TEN.** Three came with points and assists and one with points and rebounds.

• **His four double-doubles are the most for a Nittany Lion in a season since Jamelle Cornley had four in 2008-09.**

• Has **FIVE** career double-doubles posting one last year (10 points & 10 rebounds) at Northwestern. His five career double-doubles are one shy of the most ever for a Penn State guard set by Tabor Battle with six between 2008-2011.

• Posted double-double No. 4 on the year with a team-high 17 points and career-best equaling 11 rebounds while adding six assists in a win over Cornell (12/21).

• Led Penn State with 26 points on 8-of-11 shooting and a career-high 11 assists in a victory over Youngstown State (11/23).

• Posted back-to-back double-doubles, 20-point games and career-best assist totals in two outings vs. Radford and LIU.

• The first PSU player to post back-to-back double-doubles since Geary Claxton posted three straight in January of 2008.

## 20th BIG TEN SEASON

Penn State opened its 20th season of Big Ten Conference play with a pair of road games at Michigan (Dec. 29) and at Northwestern (Jan. 1). It marked the second straight season Penn State opened the Big Ten with a pair of road games and the third straight season opening the Big Ten with a road game. Penn State posted a 9-9 mark during the Big Ten regular season last year to finish in a tie for fourth place. The nine wins marked the fifth time Penn State posted a .500 or better record in Big Ten play and tied for Penn State's third best Big Ten record ever. It marked the second time in the last three seasons Penn State finished fourth in the Big Ten regular season. Penn State's best Big Ten finish came in 1996 as the Lions went 12-6 to finish second in the conference.

## SEASON SUPERLATIVES

- Posted seventh-straight season opening win a victory over Hartford.
- Posted fourth 3-0 start in the last 12 years and eighth since joining the Big Ten in 1993. The Lions have reached the post-season following each of their previous 3-0 starts since joining the Big Ten.
- Posted fourth Big Ten/ACC Challenge win in last five Challenges and third-straight in a Challenge road game.
- Logged eight non-conference wins surpassing the total of seven posted by last year's NCAA Tournament team.
- Debuted gray third-color uniforms for the first time in program history on Jan. 19 with a defeat of No. 22 Illinois in the Jordan Center.
- Posted the first victory over a ranked opponent in coach Patrick Chambers three-year career on Jan. 19 with a defeat of No. 22 Illinois (54-52) in the Jordan Center.

- Frazier was spectacular in the Lions' win over Long Island (11/16) posting a then career-high 26 points on 9-of-18 shooting and logging a career-best 10 assists for the second-straight game.
- Frazier went for 20 points, 10 assists, six rebounds and three steals in the Lions previous victory vs. Radford (11/14).

## TEAM NOTES:

**GOING GRAY:** Penn State debuted third-color gray uniforms for the first time in program history on Jan. 19 at the Jordan Center and promptly posted a 54-52 upset of No. 22/25 Illinois. Penn State students participated in the "Grayout" as over 2,000 filled the Nittany Nation student section wearing gray t-shirts.

## LIONS DOWN NO. 22 ILLINI FOR CHAMBERS' FIRST TOP 25 VICTORY:

One game after No. 22 Illinois knocked off No. 6 Ohio State in Champaign, Penn State held the Illini to 34 percent shooting and 18 points below their season scoring average to deliver the first victory over a team ranked in the Top 25 in coach Patrick Chambers' three-year head coaching career. In just his eighth-ever meeting vs. a team ranked in the Top 25 and fourth as Penn State coach, Chambers delivered a 54-52 victory to a boisterous home crowd of more than 2,000 students. Senior Cam Woodyard led the way with 17 points and Tim Frazier added 12 points, nine assists and a game-winning 12-foot floater with eight seconds to play. Chambers joined Jerry Dunn (1996-2003) and John Egli (1955-68) as the only coaches in Penn State history to defeat a ranked team in their first season at the helm. Dunn & Egli both did it in their second game vs. a ranked foe.

**OFFENSIVE OUTBURST:** Penn State's 82 points in an 88-82 loss to No. 12 Indiana on Jan. 8 marked just the fourth 80+ point game vs. a Big Ten opponent for the Lions in the last 10 years and Penn State's highest scoring output in the Big Ten since upsetting No. 7 Michigan State, 85-76, in the Jordan Center on Feb. 2, 2008. It was Penn State's first 80-point game in the Big Ten since posting an 81-70 victory at Northwestern on Feb. 28, 2010. Penn State's other 80-point Big Ten game in the last 10 years also came vs. Northwestern (83-57) in 2007. The 82 points equaled Penn State's season high posted in an 82-71 win vs. Youngstown State.

**LIONS CHALLENGE NO. 12 HOOSIERS:** Penn State was within two points of the lead three times in the final minute, and four times cut a double-digit lead to five or less in an 88-82 loss to No. 12-ranked Indiana on Jan. 8 in the BJC. Penn State took the nation's top three-point shooting team's

best punch as the Hoosiers shot 66.7 percent from three and came within one of the Big Ten team record for a game hitting 16-of-24 in the game, including a run of 7-straight from the arc in the first half.

## LIONS THUMP PURDUE FOR CHAMBERS' FIRST BIG TEN WIN:

Penn State posted its most lopsided Big Ten win in six seasons with its 65-45 defeat of Purdue on Thursday, gaining the first Big Ten Conference win of the Patrick Chambers era in the Lions first home Big Ten appearance under Chambers. It was Penn State's largest Big Ten victory since downing Northwestern, 83-57, on Jan. 3, 2007 and the largest over Purdue since beating the Boilers, 74-54, at the Jordan Center on Jan. 18, 2006. Penn State held a double-digit lead for more than 24 minutes in the game and led by as many as 22. The Lions held Purdue to a season-low 45 points (previous low 56) and a Lion season opponent low of 31.9% shooting. Billy Oliver posted a career high 21 points on a career-best 7-of-11 (63.6%) from three, while Matt Glover posted



career highs of 11 rebounds and five assists and Tim Frazier had 15 points and nine assists.

**YOUNG LIONS:** Senior Cammeron Woodyard and junior Tim Frazier are the only Lions that have seen more than one season of competition prior to this year as eight major contributors are in their first or second season of Division I ball. Three freshmen and three sophomores are averaging at least 15 minutes per game for Penn State and have made a total of 32 starts. True-freshmen Trey Lewis (5) and Ross Travis (9) have combined for 14 starts. The Lions have four upperclassmen playing more than nine minutes per game. Among those, Billy Oliver is a junior who sat out his first two years with concussions and migraines and is seeing just his second season of actual competition on the floor and Nick Colella is a junior transfer from Division III Penn State Behrend in his second season with the Lions, but first playing.

**BENCH PRODUCTION:** The PSU bench has produced TEN games of 20+ points, including 27 vs. Minnesota (1/15), and has out-scored the opponent's bench 14 times. Penn State's bench in averaging 20.3 ppg. Penn State averaged 6.0 ppg from its bench last year led by 75 points from Billy Oliver. The last time the Lion bench produced better than 20 ppg was in 2007-08 (20.3). Led by four threes and 13 points from freshman Trey Lewis, the Penn State bench posted a season-high 30 points for the second time on the year in its victory over Cornell (12/21). Cam Woodyard's career-high equaling 14 points led Penn State's bench which produced 29 points in the previous game vs. Mount St. Mary's.

**D'ING UP:** Penn State has held TEN opponents to less than 40 percent shooting on the year and SEVEN to 55 points or less.

**BOARDIN':** Penn State leads the Big Ten posting 13.8 offensive rebounds per game and is fourth pulling 35.8 boards per game overall and third with a +4.7 rebound margin. **The Lions have won the rebounding battle in 15 games, going 9-6 in those games.** The Lions posted season highs of 20 offensive boards vs. Lafayette and 18 vs. Kentucky. The 20 offensive boards were the Lions most since posting 20 vs. Maryland in 2010. The Lions have surpassed 40 boards in a game three times on the season. Penn State posted a season-high 47 rebounds vs. Lafayette. It was their highest total since logging 52 rebounds in a win over UMBC in December of 2009. Penn State out-rebounded the Leopards 47-26.

**GET PAST 60:** Penn State is 8-2 when surpassing 60 points on the year with two of the losses coming in two of the Lions' most well played games of the year, close losses to Mississippi (72-70) and No. 12 Indiana (88-82). Penn State has failed to score more than 60 points in 11 games on the year going 2-9 in those contests with victories over No. 22 Illinois (54-52) and South Florida (53-49).

**FORCING TURNOVERS:** Penn State grabbed 11 steals and forced 17 turnovers vs. Minnesota (1/15), the Lions' 13th game of the year with seven or more steals and fifth straight. **Tim Frazier is leading the way with 48 steals on the year and leading the Big Ten grabbing 2.5 spg in conference games.** Frazier had a career-high six steals at Nebraska (1/11) as the Lions forced the Huskers into 17 turnovers.

**SHOOTING STRUGGLES:** Penn State has shot less than 45% from the floor in 16 games on the year going 7-9 in those contests. Penn State is shooting a combined 35% from the floor and 25% from three in its 11 losses on the year, shooting 30% or less three games and less than 32% from three in all 11. The Lions are shooting 42% from the floor and 37% from three in TEN wins.

## WHAT THEY ARE SAYING ABOUT PENN STATE

"The first thing that comes to my mind is if you don't practice hard, and you don't practice with toughness, you're not going to beat **Penn State**. They're going to beat teams; there's no question about it. The other night, that didn't look like a fluke to me. They play extremely hard. They battle. They go after it. He's (Coach Chambers) taken some good players that were here and made them a lot better. He took Tim Frazier – a guy that was one of the better point guards in our league at finding people with his quickness and speed – and is making him a complete guard, a complete player. He's got Billy Oliver thinking he's Dirk Nowitzki, and you know what? He is."

"Defensively, we did not want to allow **Tim (Frazier)** to pick us apart versus pressure, but it's a lot easier said than done. He is one of the undervalued and underrated players nationally. I don't think in the Big Ten. I hope they're not underrating him, that's a mistake if they are. I think around the country, he's one of the more underrated and undervalued guys, no question."

"If we could have someone to play as hard at **Matt Glover**; he clearly played harder than anyone who attempted to guard him. He did little things. He gets 11 rebounds, 5 assists, two steals. They came in and contributed and helped **Penn State** win."

**YOUNG STAFF:** Penn State head coach Patrick Chambers turned 41 on Dec. 13 and is the youngest head coach in the Big Ten. No member of the Penn State coaching staff is older than 41 and the average age of Penn State's head coach, associate head coach, two assistants and director of operations is 36.

**CHAMBERS ERA BEGINS:** Patrick Chambers was introduced as the 12th head coach in Nittany Lion basketball history on Monday, June 6, shortly after the departure of Penn State alumnus and eight-year head coach Ed DeChellis for the Navy head job in late May. Chambers introduction took place in front of more than 300 fans and supporters described a "less an introduction than a passionate call to arms," by local media. Chambers wasted little time connecting with the Penn State fan base far and wide. He ordered a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the Penn State campus distributing t-shirts and his infectious energy. He visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, classes, threw out the first pitch for the State College Spikes and even donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Paternoville" student campout prior to the clash of Joe Paterno's football team with Alabama. He was seemingly everywhere in his first four months.

**CHAMBERS HITS THE GROUND RUNNING:** Coach Chambers wasted no time in getting to know his first Penn State team as **HE LOGGED 10,500 MILES IN HIS FIRST EIGHT DAYS ON THE JOB** traveling from coast-to-coast to visit current Penn State players and incoming freshmen and their families. Chambers traveled from Massachusetts to California, Minnesota to Texas as he met with every player except Sasa Borovnjak who was at home in Serbia.

**GET ON THE FLOOR:** Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. The Nittany Lions achieved that goal in their very first exhibition game recording 18 "dives," 13 of which came in the second half. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points" during every practice and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor.



## 2011 EARLY SIGNEE

Penn State signed one player in the 2011 NCAA Early Signing Period that began Nov. 9

### BRANDON TAYLOR 6-8, 235, F, Tabernacle, N.J., Trenton Catholic Academy (N.J.)

Taylor helped lead his AAU squad, Team Philly, to several tournament titles over the summer and saw his stock rise as he diversified his game and excelled in several head-to-head battles with other high Division I recruits. His size and strength on the block as well as his ability to stretch defenses on the perimeter and score off the dribble or from the three-point line were on display. He is described as a "prototypical mismatch problem" with "the physical tools and basketball skills to score both inside and out" by ESPN.com. Dave Telep of ESPN.com added, "Penn State has itself a legitimate scoring option on its way to Happy Valley." Taylor helped Trenton Catholic Academy (N.J.) to a 2010 New Jersey Non-Public B State Championship with a victory over perennial powerhouse St. Anthony and an eventual championship crown in the NJSIAA (all classes) Tournament of Champions as a sophomore. He averaged 11.7 points per game last year as a junior at Trenton Catholic as he helped lead the team to a 19-6 record.

#### CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

- CVC-Penn State has raised more than \$1.7 million in the last 15 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.
- The organization raised over \$200,000 for the second-straight year in 2010-11 and has raised more than \$175,000 each of the last five years ranking it among the top six CVC organizations in the nation.
- CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a year-round schedule of seven events, which includes the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk, Brewer's Expo and Bestwick Foundation Bike For Life.
- CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last four years and more than \$190,000 total. Funds are also donated directly to the American Cancer Society.

**CVC "BAND TOGETHER" DAY FEB. 11:** The event, which raised more than \$23,000 last year, is slated for a 1:00 p.m Saturday tip vs. Nebraska. It is a bringing together of survivors and their families, fans, Penn State coaches and players and cancer fighting organizations from around the community. Penn State donates \$3 from every single-game ticket sold to the contest.

**STAFF TIES:** Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

**LIONS PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY:** All four senior starters from Penn State's 2011 NCAA Tournament team are currently playing professionally in Europe or South America. Penn State currently has 11 former players active in pro leagues around the world, six of which have graduated in the last three years.

**GREAT GRAD RATE:** Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions have ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. Penn State student-athletes also earned a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2001-02 through 2004-05. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (96) and Illinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with their 90 percent GSR score. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park student-athletes was 79 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.
