#### **THIS WEEK**

Akron hits the road for the first time, visiting Penn State on Saturday, Sept. 6 at Noon at Beaver Stadium.

ABC (mirrored on ESPN2) will broadcast the game live online with **Mike Patrick** calling the action, **Ed Cunningham** providing color commentary, and **Jeannine Edwards** with sideline reports.

The Zips' radio broadcast will air on the Akron-IMG Sports Network [SportsRadio 1350 AM (WARF) in Akron (flagship), 1420 WHK in Cleveland, 1440 WHKZ in Warren/Youngstown] with **Steve French** calling the action, **Joe Dunn** providing analysis, and **Bill Morgan** with sideline reports. The pregame show starts at 11 a.m. ET. A free audio stream is available at SportsRadio1350.com.

Under the guidance of third-year head coach **Terry Bowden**, the Zips stand 1-0 after a 41-0 blanking of Howard on Aug. 28. The 2014 Akron squad returns 48 lettermen, including 14 starters. The Zips utilize a spread offense and a 4-3 defense.

After one game, junior QB **Kyle Pohl** (Farmersville, Ohio) is the Zips' leading rusher with 48 yards on seven carries. Junior RB **Conor Hudley** (Hamilton, Ohio), follows with 25 yards on five carries. Under center, Pohl 23-of-36 for 308 yards and four touchdowns. Redshirt freshman QB **Tommy Woodson** (Monroeville, Pa.) is 5-of-8 for 92 yards and a touchdown. Senior WR **L.T. Smith III** (Painesville, Ohio) is the top receiver with five catches for 74 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore WR **Mykel Traylor-Bennett** (Reynoldsburg, Ohio) follows with 89 yards and two touchdowns on four receptions. Defensively, senior LB **C.J. Mizell** (Tallahassee, Fla.) is the team leader with 10 tackles and a fumble recovery.

In the first national rankings of the 2014 season, Akron is ranked among the nation's Top 25 in 22 categories, including No. 1 scoring defense (0.0), No. 1 in red zone defense (0.000), No. 1 in sacks allowed (0.0), No. 1 in scoring defense (0.0). Individually, junior QB **Kyle Pohl** is No. 3 in passing touchdowns (4), No. 7 in points responsible (24.0), and No. 21 in passing efficiency (173.5). Senior LB **Justin March** (Danville, III.) is No. 3 in forced fumbles (1.00), sophomore WR **Mykel Traylor-Bennett** is No. 3 in receiving touchdowns (2), and senior LB **C.J. Mizell** in No. 4 in fumbles recovered (1).

Penn State, under the tutelage of first-year head coach **James Franklin**, stands 1-0 after a thrilling 26-24 win over UCF in Dublin, Ireland. The Nittany Lions return 14 starters to their multiple offense and multiple defense.

After one game, senior RB **Zach Zwinak** is the Lions' top rusher with 32 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. Sophomore QB **Christian Hackenberg** is 32-of-47 for 454

yards and a touchdown. Redshirt freshman WR **DaeSean Hamilton**, who is this week's Big Ten co-Freshman of the Week, as 165 yards on 11 receptions, both freshman records. Defensively, senior LB **Mike Hull** has a team-best 11 tackles.

In the NCAA stats, Penn State is ranked No. 1 in red zone offense (1.00), No. 4 in passing offense (454.0) and No. 6 in rushing defense (24.0). Individually, PK **Sam Ficken**, the Big Ten Specialist of the Week, leads the nation in field goal percentage (1.00) and ranks No. 2 in field goals per game (4.00). CB **Jordan Lucas** is No. 1 in passes defended (3.0), while QB **Christian Hackenberg** is No. 4 in passing yards (454) and No. 6 in completions (32.0).

#### **AKRON-PENN STATE CONNECTIONS**

Akron has 11 players from Pennsylvania on its roster, including three from Central Pa.—sophomore RB **Jawon Chisholm** (Harrisburg, Pa./Harrisburg HS), junior LB **Dylan Evans** (Nazareth, Pa./Pen Argyl Area HS), and senior OL **Travis Switzer** (Lancaster, Pa./Conestoga Valley HS).

Penn State has just two players from Ohio on its roster—freshman T **Chance Sorrell** (Middletown, Ohio/Middletown HS) and sophomore WR **Luke Vadas** (Hunting Valley, Ohio/University School).

Akron head coach **Terry Bowden** has never coached a game at Beaver Stadium. However, the Zips' mentor has faced the Nittany Lions before on the gridiron. As the head coach at Auburn, Bowden and the Tigers faced Joe Paterno and the Nittany Lions in the Outback Bowl following the 1995 season. Penn State claimed a 43-14 bowl win.

Additionally, as a member of the ABC broadcasting team, Bowden provided color analysis for a game at Beaver Stadium during the 1999 season.

PSU run game coordinator/offensive line coach **Herb Hand** worked as an offensive graduate assistant (1999-2000) at Clemson under head coach **Tommy Bowden**, Terry's older brother.

#### **AKRON-PENN STATE: THE SERIES**

Saturday's game is the fifth meeting between Akron and Penn State in series history which began in 1999. The Nittany Lions hold a 4-0 record over the Zips. All four games were played at Beaver Stadium.

In the teams' last meeting in 2009, No. 8 Penn State claimed a 31-7 win in the season opener for both teams. The Lions led, 31-0, at intermission. Akron's lone score was a 40-yard pass from Chris Jacquemain to Deryn Bowser. PSU had 515 yards of total offense on the day, compared to UA's 186.

PSU and Akron are scheduled to play again at Beaver Stadium on Sept. 2, 2017.

#### **WELCOME TO THE BIG HOUSE**

The Akron seniors are members of a distinct breed: during their collegiate careers, they have played games in four of the nation's Top 5 biggest college stadiums.

As freshmen in 2011, the Zips began their careers in Columbus, falling to the Buckeyes, 42-0, before 105,001 fans. In 2012, Coach Bowden's first season at Akron, the Zips traveled to Tennessee, falling 47-26 before a crowd of 81,719.

Last season, the Zips traveled to Ann Arbor and took on No. 11 Michigan. With 107,102 screaming fans, the Zips saw a fourth-and-goal play for the win come up short as the Wolverines pulled out a 28-24 win .

#### ZIPS OUICK HITS

- Six of Akron's 2014 opponents—Marshall (Military), Pittsburgh (Little Caesars Pizza), Ohio (Beef 'O' Brady's), Ball State (GoDaddy), Bowling Green (Little Caesars Pizza), and Buffalo (Famous Idaho Potato)— participated in bowls in 2013.
- This is Akron's sixth season playing on-campus in InfoCision Stadium Summa Field. The Zips have a 10-21 record at the venue (1-0 in 2014). The stadium opened in 2009.
- Only one Zips' alum is playing in the NFL this season. LB Chase Blackburn (2001-04) enters his 10th season in the pros and second season with the Carolina Panthers.

#### **AIRING IT OUT**

Akron's returning wide receivers rank among the nation's Top 10 corps in four categories. The Zips lead the nation with the highest percentage of receptions returning with 96.6.

Enterting the season, the Zips rank No. 5 with 371 career receptions. Washington State holds the top spot with 546. In career receiving yards, UA stands No. 5 with 4,449. UCF is first with 7,164. In career receiving touchdowns, Akron is tied for eighth with 28. Washington State is first with 47.

Pohl finished the night 23-of-36 with 308 yards through the air and four touchdowns to help Akron rack up 506 yards and 24 first downs as a team. He threw touchdowns to three different receivers and tallied 48 yards rushing on seven carries.

One of Pohl's top targets, sophomore **Mykel Traylor-Bennett**, caught four passes for 89 yards and two touchdowns, his first two TDs as a Zip.

The Akron defense was stout throughout the game, holding the Bison to 216 total yards and 15 first downs. LB **C.J. Mizell** recorded 10 tackles (eight solo) and a fumble recovery to lead the defense as the unit recorded its first shutout since a 41-0 triumph over Morgan State on Sept. 12, 2009.

#### POHL NAMED MAC EAST OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior QB **Kyle Pohl** was named the Mid-American Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the East Division on Sept. 1.

In the 41-0 shutout victory over Howard, Pohl led the Zips with a career-high four touch-down passes on 23-of-36 passing for 308 yards. He threw three touchdown passes in the first six minutes of action, as each scoring drive was under 38 seconds. Pohl led all rushers with a career-high 48 yards on seven carries.

#### **PRESEASON HONORS**

Junior QB **Kyle Pohl** is one of a record-setting 182 nominees for the 2014 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. The nominee list includes 90 student-athletes from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), and 92 student-athletes from a combination of the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), Division II, Division III, and NAIA levels.

Pohl has been one of the most active members of the Akron football team, while coordinating and participating in a number of community service events. He consistently coordinates events that allow our student-athletes to participate in community service, mainly through hospital and school visits. He has been a major part in the Zips' visitation program at Akron Children's Hospital, as well as donating his free time in order to spend time with kids of all ages.

The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

For the second consecutive year, junior P **Zach Paul** has been named one of 25 preseason candidates for the 2014 Ray Guy Award which honors the nation's top collegiate punter.

Last year, Paul was named third-team All-Mid-American Conference after averaging 42.9 yards per punt (65 punts), including 15 punts of 50-plus yards. He finished the season ranked sixth in the MAC and 30th nationally in punting average (42.9 ypp), while helping the Zips finish second in the MAC and 31st nationally in net punting as a team (38.18 ypp).

Paul also earned MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week on October 14 after averaging 45.7 yards per punt (nine punts) at Northern Illinois (October 12). He recorded one 60-yard punt, two touchbacks and two punts inside the NIU 20-yard line.

#### **HIGH EXPECTATIONS**

Akron was selected to finish second in the Mid-American Conference East Division this fall by the media behind Bowling Green. Following the Falcons and Zips were Ohio, Buffalo, Kent State, Miami (Ohio), and Massachusetts.

In the West Division, Toledo was selected as the favorite by a slim four-point margin over Northern Illinois.



Backing up Pohl are senior **Nick Hirschman** (Los Gatos, Calif.) and redshirt freshman **Tommy Woodson** (Monroeville, Pa.). Hirschman played in three games last fall before suffering a season-ending injury. Woodson redshirted.

In the win over Howard, Woodson saw his first game action. He went 5-of-8 for 92 yards and a 40-yard touchdown pass to Austin Wolf.

#### **BORN TO RUN**

Senior RB **Jawon Chisholm** (Harrisburg, Pa.) is ready to cap off his senior season. As a junior last fall, the 6-1 back earned All-MAC honors and was the team's Offensive MVP after rushing for 869 yards and eight touchdowns while recording 12 career 100-yard rushing performances.

In the win over Howard, Chisholm rushed nine times for 21 yards and a touchdown.

Junior RB **Conor Hundley** had 25 yards on five carries in the win over Howard.

#### **RECEIVERS ARE TOPS**

Akron's receiving corps return the top unit in the country (see extended note on p. 5). The top two from last season-- junior **Zach D'Orazio** and sophomore **Fransohn Bickley**-return to the starting line-up. D'Orazio had 42 receptions for 567 yards and four touchdowns a year ago, while Bickley followed with 39 receptions for 407 yards and two TDs.

Senior WR **L.T. Smith** led the Zips in the win over Howard. He had five receptions for 74 yards and a 57-yard TD catch.

In the win over Howard, sophomore **Mykel Traylor-Bennett** scored the first two touchdowns of his career. He had four receptions for 82 yards.

#### **OUR FIRST LINE OF DEFENSE**

Anchored by four-year starter **Travis Switzer** at center, Akron's offensive line brings back experience, combining for 53 starting appearances. Switzer has started the last 25 games for the Zips at center.

At left tackle, junior **Quaison Osborne** (Hudson, Ohio) made his first collegiate start in the win over Howard. At left guard, junior **Dylan Brumbaugh** (Green, Ohio) started all 12 games at right guard in 2013.

At right guard, senior **Joe McNamara** (Pembroke Pines, Fla.), who transferred from Wisconsin after receiving his degree, saw action in all 12 games last year with six starts at left guard. At right tackle, redshirt junior **Isaiah Williams** (Cleveland, Ohio), who redshirted last season, had three starts on the defensive line in 2012. Junior transfer **Tommy Brown** (Akron, Ohio), who is still awaiting official word from the NCAA, is expected to start at right tackle once able.

In the 41-0 win over Howard, the O-line gave up no sacks.

## YOUNG & HUNGRY

Akron offensive coordinator/QB coach **A.J. Milwee** (age 26, born Jan. 19, 1986) is the second-youngest offensive in the Football Bowl Subdivision behind Utah offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Brian Johnson, who is 25. Milwee had a record-setting career as a quarterback at Division-II North Alabama.

## Defense

#### **LINEBACKER U**

Akron's top three players are Sam, Mike, and Will; also known as senior **Justin March**, senior **C.J. Mizell**, and junior **Jatavis Brown**-- UA's starting linebackers.

As a sophomore last fall, Brown led UA's defense with 107 tackles, including 6.5 TFL and two sacks. March followed with 80 tackles, 4.5 TFL, and three interceptions. Mizell racked up 41 tackles, a teambest 7.5 TFL, and team-best 5.5 sacks.

In the 41-0 victory over Howard, Mizell tied his career-high with 10 tackles, including a career-best eight solo stops. He



also recorded the first fumble recovery of his career with a six-yard return inside the red zone, setting up UA's second TD.

March had five tackles and a forced fumble in the win over Howard.

Brown had five tackles, a TFL, and a break-up in the win over Howard.

#### DON'T MESS WITH CODY

Junior DL **Cody Grice** (Akron, Ohio) has started every game of his collegiate career at nose guard for Akron (25 and counting). The 5-11, 283-lb. defender, who switched from full back to nose guard after redshirting his freshman season, has shaved his head this fall. Well, half of his head. The right side is clean-shaven; the left side is mean and unruly -- the way Grice plays.

Grice had two solo stops and a sack in the win over Howard.

## **SECONDARY TO NONE**

Thanks to graduation, UA's secondary may pose the most questions this fall with three new starters. Seniors **Bre' Ford** (Bethel Park, Pa.) and **Devonte Morgan** (Cleveland Ohio) took over the starting nods at safety in the win over Howard.

Juniors **John Senter** (Huber Heights, Ohio) and **DeAndre Scott** (Frederick, Md.) handled corner duties. The defense held Howard scoreless. The shutout was UA's first since a 41-0 blanking of Morgan State (Sept. 12, 2009).

#### **BATTLE OF THE LEGS**

Junior K **Robert Stein** (Cincinnati, Ohio) returns for the Zips, but freshman **Tom O'Leary** (Tucker, Ga.) is listed ahead of him on the depth chart. The team's leading scorer in 2013, he had nine field goals and went 29-of-30 in PAT for 56 points.

O'Leary had a workout in his collegiate debut. In the 41-0 win over Howard, the frosh converted five (of six) extra points (one was blocked). He attempted a 25-yard field goal.

## WHAT IS A ZIP?

One of the unique nicknames in collegiate athletics belongs to The University of Akron. Originally Zippers, athletic director Kenneth "Red" Cochrane officially shortened the nickname to the Zips in 1950. Twenty-five years earlier a campus-wide contest had been conducted to choose a nickname for the University's athletics teams.

Suggestions submitted by students, faculty, and alumni included Golden Blue Devils, Tip Toppers, Rubbernecks, Hillbillies, Kangaroos and Cheveliers.

The winner, freshman Margaret Hamlin, received a prize of \$10 for Zippers, a \$6 pair of rubber overshoes and a brand name of the BF Goodrich Company.

The evolution of Zippy, UA's mascot, began 40 years ago when the student council decided the University needed a mascot.

# **Did You Know** . . .

- **Zippy** is just one of five female-gendered college mascots in Division I athletics. Do you know the other four? (YoUDee, the Delaware Blue Hen; Mrs. Wuf of N.C. State; Lucy Lobo of New Mexico; and Wilma Wildcat of Arizona)
- Akron was the first school to jump from Division I-AA football (now called FCS) to I-A (now called FBS). The Zips made the move in 1987.
- Hall of Fame coach John Heisman coached football from 1893-94 for Buchtel College (Akron's original name). The Cleveland native went on to take Georgia Tech to the national championship in 1917. The Heisman Trophy, given to the nation's most outstanding college player, is named in his honor.
- One player in school history has had his number retired- #89 Chris Angeloff. The
  junior tight end collapsed and died of cardiac arrest during UA's 20-8 victory over
  Marshall on Sept. 6, 1975. The Chris Angeloff Scholarship was created in his honor.
- Four players and two teams are members of Akron's Ring of Honor: Jim Dennison, Chris Angeloff, 1968 team, and the 1976 team (all inducted in 2003); Jason Taylor (2004); and Gordon Larson (2005).





# TERRY BOWDEN HEAD COACH

Third Season at Akron 21st Season Overall West Virginia '78

Terry Bowden is in his third season at the helm of the UA program. He was named the Zips' 27th all-time head coach on Dec. 22, 2011, but is just the seventh person to hold the position since 1960.

Last season, Bowden led UA to its highest win total since 2008 by going 5-7 overall and 4-4 against the MAC, as well as ending the year by winning three straight and four of its last five games. The Zips went 3-3 at home, including a 31-29 win over Toledo in the season finale and a 16-7 victory over neighborhood rival Kent State to regain possession of the coveted wooden Wagon Wheel.

Additionally in 2013, seven players were named All-Mid-American Conference, highlighted by first-team selection sophomore linebacker Jatavis Brown – the first Zip named to the first team since Bryan Wagner in 2011. Last year's squad also landed defensive lineman Nico Caponi, sophomore quarterback Kyle Pohl and sophomore kicker Robert Stein on the Academic All-MAC Team – the most for the program since 2006. Eight other student-athletes were awarded academic honorable mention.

In 2012, Bowden, serving as offensive coordinator, ushered in a spread offense that resulted in an aerial attack responsible for a school-record and MAC season-high 30 passing touchdowns. The offense, which was conducted in a hurry-up no-huddle style, was led by fifth-year senior transfer quarterback Dalton Williams, who set the program's single-season record for touchdown passes (25) and pass completions (326-for-522), while compiling the third most passing yards (3,387) in a season in school history.

Williams' arm was complimented by sophomore running back Jawon Chisholm's 953 yards rushing on the strength of 180 carries and senior receiver Marquelo Suel's team-high 820 receiving yards off 76 catches. Suel's receptions were the second most in a single season in program history and earned him a place on the All-MAC Team.

The UA offense finished 2012 ranked first in the MAC and 16th nationally in passing (312.8 ypg), and sixth in the league and 45th in the country in total offense (427.2 ypg). Akron's 5,126 yards of total offense ranked sixth in the MAC and 61st nationally, and was the second most in a season in program history, behind the 2003 squad's 5,643.

Other highlights of the 2012 season include redshirt freshman kicker Robert Stein being one of 38 student-athletes named to the Academic All-MAC Team. Additionally, 11 Zips earned academic honorable mention from the league. Fifth-year senior transfer linebacker Kurt Mangum was selected to compete in the NFL Players Association Collegiate Bowl after he led the squad with 110 tackles.

Bowden, who served as a studio analyst and color commentator with ABC Sports' college football for 10 years, was the head coach at Auburn from 1993-98 and spent the three seasons prior to coming to Akron at Division II North Alabama.

In his time at North Alabama, Bowden led the Lions to a 29-9 record and three consecutive playoff appearances. In 2011, the squad went 9-3 and advanced to the second round of the playoffs. He was named Gulf South Conference Co-Coach of the Year in 2009 when the team went 11-2 and

won the GSC championship and advanced to the quarterfinals of the playoffs. He followed that in 2010 by guiding the Lions to a 9-4 record and another trip to the playoffs.

As head coach of Auburn, he went 47-17-1 (73.4 winning pct.) and posted the best opening five-year run of any head football coach i-n school history. Also during his time with the Tigers, Bowden became the first collegiate coach in 50 years to win his 100th career game by his 40th birthday.

In his first season at AU, he became the first coach in Division I-A (now FBS) history to have an undefeated and untied season in his inaugural year at that level.

Prior to his stint at Auburn, Bowden built two programs from the ground up as head coach at Salem College (W.Va.) and Samford University (Ala.). When he took the job at Salem in 1983 he became the nation's youngest head coach in college football at age 26.

Inheriting a Samford program which had won just six games in three years prior to his arrival, Bowden led the Bulldogs to a 9-1 record his first year, tying the record for the best season in school history. The squad led the nation in total offense (523 yards per game) and scoring offense (51.7 points per game), both national Division III records. The team's 40 touchdown passes were also a national single-season record.

AKRON, Ohio – Behind an offensive attack led by junior QB Kyle Pohl, Akron had no trouble handling Howard in its season opener, cruising to a 41-0 victory at InfoCision Stadium – Summa Field.

The decisive win was Akron's first in a season-opening contest since 2007, when the Zips defeated Army 22-14.

Pohl finished the night 23-of-36 with 308 yards through the air and four touchdowns to help Akron rack up 506 yards and 24 first downs as a team. He threw touchdowns to three different receivers and tallied 48 yards rushing on seven carries.

One of Pohl's top targets, sophomore Mykel Traylor-Bennett, caught four passes for 89 yards and his two touchdowns, his first two TDs as a Zip.

C.J. Mizell recorded 10 tackles (eight solo) and a fumble recovery to lead the defense as the unit recorded its first shutout since a 41-0 triumph over Morgan State on Sept. 12, 2009.
