A family meeting, of sorts, will take place at Saturday's game. Brothers Talor Battle, Penn State assistant coach and the Nittany Lions' all-time leading scorer, and Boo Buie, sophomore point guard for Northwestern, will be on opposing benches.

With nine games of 10+ points this season, junior guard Myreon Jones has 30 career double-figure scoring games. He now has 612 career points and is one shy of 100 career 3-pointers.

The Nittany Lions lead the Big Ten in offensive rebounding with a 13.3 per-game average. Senior forward John Harrar ranks 17th nationally with 3.70 offensive rebounds per game.

In the last three games, Penn State has out-rebounded all three opponents and has a +6.7 rebounding margin (PS 43.0-Opp 36.3).

Penn State has one of the toughest, if not the toughest schedule in 2020-21. According to ESPN.com, the Nittany Lions are the SOS leader and are third in the kenpom.com SOS rankings.

ON THE BOARDS IN BIG

Penn State now has three-straight games with 40 or more rebounds, and has outrebounded its last four opponents. The Nittany Lions tied their record for total rebounds in a Big Ten game with 49 against the Boilermakers (1/17/21).

The current rebounding average of 37.2 in Big Ten conference games would be No. 1 on the program's list as would the +2.7 margin. Averages from 2019-20 and 2018-19 rank in the Nittany Lions' top five.

Despite connecting on only six 3-pointers vs. Rutgers, Penn State is still averaging 9.4 3-point field goals per game, which ranks second in the Big Ten and 37th nationally. Penn State has connected for double-digit 3-point field goal totals in five games this season.

Over the last five years, the 3-point field goals made per game average has increased. The highest final team average in the Nittany Lions' Big Ten era is 8.4 (278 in 33 games) by the 2000-01 Sweet Sixteen squad.

Sophomore guard Joe Crispin exploded for a career-high 30 points (8-14 FG, 10-10 FT), scoring nearly half Penn State's points in a 65-61 win at Illinois. Crispin finished his career with six 30-point games, third on the Nittany Lions' list behind Jesse Arnette (15) and Talor Battle (7).

FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE FOR LUNDY

Sophomore Seth Lundy recorded his first career double-double vs. Rutgers Thursday night with 16 points and a career-best 10 rebounds. The sophomore from Paulsboro, New Jersey, had seven double-figure scoring games in 2019-20, including a 15-point outing in his first career start at Minnesota. His previous high rebound total was seven.

However, Harrar is now eligible for Penn State's career field goal percentage stat category with a mark of 58.5 with a minimum 200 field goal attempts for the No. 2 spot.

John Harrar collected game-high rebound totals in the last two games, at Purdue (14) and at Indiana (10 in ot). His 14 vs. the Boilermakers tied his career best and that total is currently the individual season high for the Nittany Lions.

Penn State's rebounding leader, Harrar has registered the game-high boards total in six games this season and now has five career games with double-figures in rebounds.

PENN STATE'S "SUPERMAN"

Senior forward John Harrar is Penn State men's basketball's "Superman." Since stepping into a starting role late in his freshman year for the Nittany Lions' 2018 NIT title run, he's been Mr. Consistent and also Mr. Efficient.

Harrar ranks as Penn State's most efficient player with a 123.9 kenpom rating for the 2019-20 season, the highest for a Nittany Lion player since the metric was introduced in 2002.

BUTTRICK ON THE BOARDS

With back-to-back games as the Nittany Lions' rebounding leader, senior forward Trent Buttrick recorded his career-best seven total at Michigan (12/13/20) and vs. No. 18 Illinois (12/23/20).

The Michigan game was Buttrick's first time leading the team in rebounds. His name has appeared in the leader column for blocks vs. Illinois and at Indiana.

CAREER BESTS FOR BUTTRICK

Buttrick, who was a backup for two-time first-team All-Big Ten pick Lamar Stevens, earned his first start at No. 22 Illinois Tuesday night. In the first game vs. the Illini, Buttrick tied his career high in rebounds with seven vs. No. 18 Illinois (12/23/20) and replaced four other career marks in that game. Buttrick had a game-high three blocks, tied his high mark for assists (2), attempted five 3-pointers and played 22 minutes.

NON-CON SEASON SCORING

Penn State's 2020-21 non-conference season didn't include as many games, but over the last 10 years, the scoring average is tied for second behind the 2019-20 mark. The 81.4 ppg average was best since an 84.0 team ppg average produced by the 1995-96 Nittany Lions.

CELEBRATING 25 YEARS OF THE BRYCE JORDAN CENTER IN 2021

The Nittany Lions' first practice in the Bryce Jordan Center, named for Penn State's 14th president, was held on Dec. 18, 1995. Just a few weeks later, on Jan. 11, 1996, Penn State would win its first game in the new arena, the first of a 14-game home win streak to set the school record. The 2020-21 season-opening win over VMI gave the Nittany Lions their 250th win in the BJC.

Even though the Nittany Lions had been told what to expect, and they prepared all week for their last nonconference game of 2006, they could never imagine playing in a game like this one.

VMI came into the Bryce Jordan Center on December 30 as the nation's top scoring team, averaging 101 points per game. Defensively, the Keydets were every bit as intense, employing a full-court press against their opponents for the whole game.

"It's a game I won't forget," said former Nittany Lion forward Geary Claxton, who was the game's top scorer with a career-best 31 points. "I'd never played in a game like that, where the other team used a full-court press no matter what the score was. When you have that, things are going to be open. It was just a matter of how we took care of the ball and capitalized on the advantages with quickly scored layups."

The opportunities on offense translated to a record-breaking final score as Penn State topped VMI 129-111.

The Penn State coaching staff suggested to Claxton that he could have a career game. He did, and so did two of his teammates, as the frontcourt was a combined 33-45 for 76 points. Jamelle Cornley scored his career best with 25 points and Brandon Hassell had seven dunks and his first 20-point game.

Seven Nittany Lions posted double-figure scoring totals that afternoon with David Jackson with 13, Milos Bogetic with 11, and Danny Morrissey and Mike Walker with 10 each.

The preparation paid off and the Nittany Lions converted on nearly 60 percent of their field goal attempts for the game, shooting 70.3 percent in the second half.

The combined 240 points between the two teams over the two 20-minute halves averaged six points a minute.

The game set the Penn State program record for points in a single game, eclipsing the mark of 110 set by a Jesse Arnelle-led 1954 team over Colgate and Bryce Jordan Center record of 105 set

in 2000. The combined point total of 240 erased a Penn State record from 1965.

A school- and Bryce Jordan Center record 36 assists led to a BJC record for field goals (45). The Nittany Lions' 53 rebounds were also a BJC best while VMI added its name to the facility's record book with 19 3-point field goals and 54 3-point attempts.

In all, the high-scoring affair broke 16 records and produced tons of highlight moments and noteworthy team and individual stat lines. One basket near the end of the game provided another Penn State memory for Claxton. Walker, one of Claxton's classmates and roommates, delivered what Claxton called a "perfect" pass and he finished the alley-oop for his 1,000th career point in front of his teammates.

Claxton was a four-year starter who led the Nittany Lions in scoring three-straight seasons and finished his career seventh on the Penn State all-time scoring list. Following his selection to the Big Ten All-Freshman team, he helped Penn State reach 15 wins and the 2006 NIT as a sophomore. His accolades and career numbers, though, weren't important to him.

"We had one goal in mind -- we were just trying to win ball games," Claxton said. "We were ready to come out and play every game and we wanted to be the best team we could be. We really played hard that year. Our overall record may not have shown it, but we were in a lot of close games that season. We stayed together and fought every game."

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Participating in sports has been a big part of the families of six Nittany Lions who have had either parents or siblings compete at the collegiate level. Three sons followed in their fathers' footsteps on the hardwood: Izaiah Brockington (Antoine, Copin State); Myles Dread (Aaron, Millersville) and DJ Gordon (Derek Sr., Waynesburg). Derek Gordon Sr. played for coach Rudy Marisa, a former Nittany Lion and member of Penn State's 1954 NCAA Final Four and 1955 NCAA Tournament teams. Seth Lundy's older brother, Xavier, played basketball at Rider and Patrick Kelly's late father, Pat, was a member of Syracuse's 1987 undefeated football team and then played in the NFL.

Four members of Kyle McCloskey's immediate family were involved in athletics, including three Nittany Lion letterwinners. Father, Mike, was a tight end for Penn State (1979-82) and played on the 1982 national championship team before continuing his career in the NFL. Kyle's mother competed in track and field, and his sister, Megan, was also a member of the Nittany Lion track and field team. Another sister, Kiernan, was a four-year basketball letterwinner at Lehigh.

GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE ABOVE NATIONAL AVERAGE

Penn State student-athletes continue to register record-breaking graduation rates and perform well above their peers nationwide. The Nittany Lions recorded a fourth consecutive record academic performance with a 92 percent graduation success rate, according to data reported by the NCAA.

The NCAA's annual graduation rates report of Division I institutions across the nation revealed Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent to break the school's all-time record of 91, which was previously set in the 2019 NCAA report. Nittany Lion students posted a 92 percent graduation rate compared to the 88 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2010-11 through the 2013-14 academic year.

Penn State student-athletes have logged a Graduation Success Rate in the 88-92 percent range during each of the past 14 NCAA reports, improving from 88 percent in the 2015 report to a record-breaking 92 percent report in 2020.

Sixteen of the Nittany Lions' 27 teams (men's and women's track and field/cross country teams combined) earned a Graduation Success Rate at or above the Division I national GSR average for their respective sport. A total of 17 Penn State squads have a GSR of 90 percent or higher.

In addition, 21 programs turned in a graduation success rate at or above the overall Division I national average of 88 percent.

Men's Basketball was among the 16 Nittany Lion teams at or above the Division I sport average and one of nine squads that posted a Graduation Success Rates at least five points higher than the national average for their sport (90 to 84, +6). For the 11th consecutive year, the Penn State football (85 percent compared to 79 percent) and Nittany Lion basketball (90 to 84) teams earned four-year Graduation Success Rates higher than the national average for their respective sports.

The four-year average for University Park students was 85 percent, exceeding the 66 percent rate for all students nationwide by 19 points.

A review of Penn State's record book immediately reflects the influence of Jim Ferry, beginning his fourth season in State College. The Nittany Lions' offensive coordinator, Ferry has helped develop the program's offensive identity and the rewards have manifested not only as team and individual standards, but in the win column as well.

The 2019-20 season saw Penn State amass 21 wins overall and 11 Big Ten victories, its second-highest total since joining the league in 1992-93. The Nittany Lions tied for fifth in the conference standings headed into the conference tournament, its highest finish in its Big Ten era, and ranked third in the overall Big Ten statistical standings at 75.1 points per game.

As a team over the last three seasons, Penn State vaulted into its historical top 10 of multiple statistical categories, including points scored, scoring average, field goals and 3-point field goals. PSU claimed the top spots in 2019-20 Big Ten games in total points and field goals, and crushed the previous 3-point field goal mark. The league scoring average of 71.6 in 2019-20 ranks fifth on the Nittany Lions' chart with the 2017-18 average of 72.1 ahead at third.

Individually, two-time first-team All-Big Ten forward Lamar Stevens became one of only two Nittany Lions with at least 2,000 career points and only three to produce at least 500 points in three consecutive seasons.

Ferry's offensive mindset translated to an increase in the Nittany Lions' point production and helped rewrite the record book in 2017-18. All five starters had scoring averages in double figures through mid-February 2018 as Penn State was one of only 13 NCAA Division I teams that could make that claim. PSU won 26 games that year, its second-highest total ever, and captured its second National Invitation Tournament title.

The 2017-18 team scored 2,915 points in all games, and 1,297 in Big Ten contests, both totals earning the program's top rankings in those categories. The 46.4 field goal percentage easily ranked No. 1 in the 26 years of Big Ten play.

The 1,057 field goals smashed the previous mark, set in 2008-09, by more than 150. Records for 3-point field goals, both by the team (294) and by senior sharpshooter Shep Garner, also fell with Garner capturing both Penn State's career record (336), PSU's single-season mark (120) and the Big Ten single-season record, one that stood for 23 years previously.

From Elmont, New York, the veteran mentor brought a steadying leadership to Duquesne, rebuilding the Dukes roster and reinstilling pride in the program.

Ferry's Duquesne teams reached several milestones in his five years there, including a 17-win mark in 2015-16, a total reached only six times in the previous 43 years. The Dukes set a school record for points (2,704) that year and netted 322 three-point field goals, the third-highest total in Atlantic 10 history. During that season, Ferry celebrated his 300th career coaching win and the Dukes helped add to that total with their first post-season victory in nearly 50 years.

The Dukes posted other notable wins under Ferry, recording a victory at Atlantic 10 foe Temple in 2013, their first since 1995. An upset of 10th-ranked Saint Louis on the Billikens' home court gave Duquesne its first road win over a top-10 team in more than five decades. Victories over teams in the Atlantic Coast, Big Ten and Big 12 conferences helped the program make significant progress.

Prior to his five years at Duquesne, Ferry spent 10 seasons as head coach at LIU Brooklyn, guiding that program to unprecedented levels of success. Ferry led the Blackbirds to Northeast Conference regular-season titles and tournament championships in 2011 and 2012, including their first NCAA Championship appearance in 14 years.

Ferry engineered a turnaround at LIU Brooklyn, inheriting a team that had won only five games in the season before his arrival. He transformed the program into a winner, posting back-to-back campaigns of at least 25 wins for the first time since the 1941-42 season. The program's 2011 and 2012 NEC crowns were the first back-to-back league titles in LIU Brooklyn's history, and Ferry helped position the Blackbirds for a third-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2013.

At LIU Brooklyn, Ferry and his team achieved double-digit win totals eight times and he was selected the NEC Coach of the Year in 2005 and

2011. Recognition came also from the National Association of Basketball Coaches as he was tabbed the District 18 Coach of the Year and the NIT/Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association (MBWA) Peter A. Carlesimo Division I Coach of the Year in 2011.

With his offensive-minded approach, Ferry produced some of the nation's top scoring squads. LIU Brooklyn was the fourth-highest scoring team in the country in 2011 and his 2012 team ranked second, scoring at a clip of 81.4 points per game.

Ferry entered the coaching ranks as an assistant at his alma mater, Keene State College, in Keene, New Hampshire, following his graduation in 1990. He then served as an assistant coach at Bentley College for seven years where he helped the Falcons win the 1992-93 Northeast 10 regular-season championship and earn a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

In 1998-99, Plymouth State hired Ferry to guide its program and saw the first-year head coach compile 22 wins, the highest single-season total in the Panthers' history, a mark that still stands. The Panthers captured a share of the Little East Conference title and played in the ECAC New England Tournament championship game.

Ferry returned to his home state to lead Adelphi University, compiling an 82-11 record in three seasons. His 1999-2000 team advanced to the NCAA Div. II Sweet Sixteen and his 2000-01 and 2001-02 teams made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Div. II Elite Eight. The 2001 squad claimed a No. 1 ranking with 31-straight wins. He was recognized as the USBWA Basketball Times Division II Coach of the Year following 2000-01 and was the NIT/MBWA Division II Coach of the Year in 2000, 2001 and 2002.

Ferry played one year at New York Tech before transferring to Keene State, where he posted a double-digit scoring average for his career. Ferry led the Owls in scoring as a junior and was team captain as a senior. The son of a New York City transit police officer, he earned his undergraduate degree in public safety science.

NITTANY LIONS USE SECOND-HALF SURGE TO CLAIM 86-65 SEASON-OPENING WIN OVER VMI

Senior guard Jamari Wheeler paced the Nittany Lions to an 86-65 season-opening win in the Bryce Jordan Center with a career offensive night with 18 points and four 3-pointers. Wheeler also added six rebounds and his five steals pushed him into the No. 9 spot on PSU's career steals chart with 152.

Penn State poured in 11 3-pointers with 40 points coming the paint as the program posted its 250th win in the BJC since its opening in January 1996.

The Nittany Lions had five total players finish in double-figure scoring. Junior guard Izaiah Brockington finished with 15 points, eight rebounds and three steals. Sophomore Seth Lundy, junior Myreon Jones and junior Sam Sessoms each finished with 12 points.

The win was Penn State's fourth-straight season opening victory and 15th of the last 16 years. For Ferry, it was his 12th-straight win in a home opener and first at Penn State.

The Nittany Lions offense clicked on all cylinders in the second half. Penn State shot 51.4% from the field and made seven of its 11 threes while limiting the Keydets to just nine total field goals in the second half.

Wheeler scored 13 of his 18 in the second stanza, going 4-8 from the field and perfect at 2-2 from beyond the arc. Free throws by Brockington tied the game at 45 and then gave Penn State a one-point advantage at 46-45 just 5:27 into the second half. Sessoms stole the ball and set up Wheeler for a trey, then four different Nittany Lions hit field goals en route to a 13-point lead at 63-48 at the midway point.

The Nittany Lions opened the game on an 8-3 run behind two quick buckets from Brockington. The Keydets erased their early deficit with efficiency, using a 22-6 run to grab a 26-14 lead with 7:19 remaining in the opening half. Penn State struggled early from beyond the arc, shooting only 23.5 percent after starting 0-7.

Sessoms' effort off the bench sparked the Nittany Lions with five-straight points as part of a 14-1 run to claim a 28-27 lead with just under three to go in the half. Wheeler gave Penn State the halftime 37-35 lead with a deep triple at the buzzer going into the break.

Penn State added 13 more steals to Wheeler's five and tied the BJC single-game record with 18.

Junior guard Myles Dread drained a 3-pointer at the buzzer to give the Nittany Lions a 72-69 victory and a 2-0 start to the season. The Rams tied the game at 69 with 20 seconds left before Dread's third career game-winning 3-pointer saw Penn State leave the court with the win.

With the clock winding down, senior guard Jamari Wheeler found Dread on the right wing. Dread rose up and drilled his first field goal of the contest as time expired.

The Nittany Lions and Rams battled back and forth until the final minute and scored identical 37-point totals in the second half. With 20 seconds remaining, VCU's Jamir Watkins drove to the lane and made his lone field goal of the game with a layup to tie the contest at 69.

Sophomore forward Seth Lundy turned in a career performance with 32 points on 11-19 shooting. Lundy poured in five 3-pointers while grabbing four rebounds and swatting two shots. Twenty of Lundy's 32 points came in second stanza against the Rams.

Lundy hit two free throws to give the Nittany Lions an eight-point lead at 68-60 with 3:46 left in the game. The Rams capitalized on Penn State's missed shots and turnovers as VCU's Nah'Shon Nyland hit a triple on a fast break and then a Ward layup cut the deficit to three, 68-65. Ward scored again for a one-point contest, 68-67, with 20 ticks left on the clock.

Junior guard Sam Sessoms connected on his second free throw attempt for a 69-67 score before Ward's tying basket. Sessoms scored 17 points, his Penn State best, on 6-11 shooting. Senior forward John Harrar and Wheeler tied the game-high total in rebounds with eight.

The Nittany Lions used a 12-3 run to take a 19-11 lead with 9:42 to play in the half after the two teams were nearly even through the first five minutes. VCU had an 8-7 lead before Penn State grabbed it back at 12-11. A 7-0 run put PSU at 19-11, but the Rams used an 8-0 of their own over 2:40 to take a 27-26 lead.

Penn State outscored VCU 9-5 in the final 3:16 of the first half to go up 25-32 at the break.

Forward Levi Stockard III led VCU in scoring with 13 points.

PENN STATE DOWNS 15TH-RANKED HOKIES IN ACC/BIG CHALLENGE

Penn State set the tone with an active defensive effort and a career performance offensively from guard Izaiah Brockington to down the No. 15 Virginia Tech Hokies 75-55 on Tuesday night. The Nittany Lions ended Virginia Tech's 34-game non-conference home winning streak and dealt the Hokies (4-1) their first loss of the season.

The Nittany Lions led the game for nearly 39 minutes, trailing only after the first basket of the game and the victory was milestone win number 1,500 for the program. The win was also Penn State's third-straight in ACC/B1G Challenge games, sixth in its last seven appearances, and second over a ranked Virginia Tech team in the last three Challenge outings.

Brockington's efficient performance produced a career-best 24 points. The junior from Philadelphia started 7-8 from the field and finished 10-14 while tying his career-best total eight rebounds. Three other Nittany Lion junior guards had double-figures in scoring with Myreon Jones with 14, Myles Dread with 11 and Sam Sessoms with 10.

The stout Nittany Lion defense forced the Hokies to turn the ball over 14 times which led to 22 points for Penn State. Offensively, Penn State opened up the floor and drilled 12 treys, shooting a season-best 52.2 percent from behind the arc. Jones, Dread and Sessoms had nine triples combined.

Virginia Tech struck first with a triple just 30 seconds into the game, but Penn State hit back with a 17-0 run to take a lead it would never relinquish.

Brockington scored nine points during the run that spanned six minutes and used both the dribble drive and a hot jump shot to lead the Nittany Lions with 15 points at the break.

An error-free first half and 51.4 percent shooting from the field for Penn State saw it lock in on the other end as PSU forced 10 first-half turnovers for a 42-23 advantage at the break.

Penn State came out of the locker room and went 7-9 from the field to start the second half and stretched its lead to 63-34 by the 13-minute mark.

Jalen Cone led the Hokies in scoring with 11 points and Keve Aluma had a game-high 12 rebounds.

PENN STATE EDGED BY SETON HALL IN OVERTIME 98-92

Seton Hall's strong second-half surge was enough to tie the game at 84 and send the game into overtime as the Pirates edged the Nittany Lions in the extra five minutes of play, 98-82, at the Bryce Jordan Center.

Seton Hall found its rhythm in the second half, shooting 65.5 percent from the field and 5-9 from behind the arc. The Pirates used their inside presence and scored 54 points in the paint for the game to keep up with the Nittany Lions fast-paced attack.

Nittany Lion leading scorer Seth Lundy scored the first five points in the overtime period to give the PSU an 89-86 lead with 2:51 remaining. He finished with 23 on the night with a total of six Nittany Lions in double figures. Seton Hall's Sandro Mamukelashvili led all scorers with 30 points, 17 of his total coming in the second half.

Seton Hall started the overtime 3-7 from the free throw line and went 6-8 down the stretch, including its final five points of the game. The Pirates scored 23 points off 35 attempts on the night while the Nittany Lions were 15-19 and 6-9 in the second half and overtime combined.

The Pirates opened the second half without a miss, going 9-9 from the field in the first 5:29 to cut the Nittany Lion lead to three, 56-53. The physical back-and-forth battle continued and Seton Hall was able to keep pace with Penn State's effective perimeter offense.

In total, the Nittany Lions knocked down 13 triples with eight coming in the first half. The Pirates, 1-12 from the behind the three-point line in the first 20 minutes, improved with their 5-9 mark in the second half.

A critical 3-pointer for Seton Hall from Mamukelashvili, with 1:58 left in regulation, spurred the Pirates' 8-0 run to tie the game at 84 and force overtime. Jared Rhoden snagged a defensive rebound off a Nittany Lion miss and scored on the other side for the tying basket with 44 seconds left in the second half. Two Penn State attempts fell short and a final Pirate 3-pointer was off the mark.

Early in the game, Penn State transformed a 10-8 lead with a 16-2 run and kept the tempo high throughout the first half to

PENN STATE FIGHTS TO END IN BIG OPENER AT MICHIGAN

The Big Ten opener went down to the wire in the Crisler Center as the Nittany Lions overcame a nine-point halftime deficit, but came up just short against undefeated Michigan in the final minute, 62-58.

The Nittany Lions trailed 60-58 with 24 seconds left, and after a pair of missed free throws by Michigan, saw the Wolverines escape after a layup attempt rimmed out. Michigan added two free throws for the 62-58 final.

Penn State recovered from a tough stretch of shooting in the first half and used a furious 18-2 run over the final two minutes before the break until the 16:36 mark of second half to take its first lead of the game at 39-38. Junior guard Izaiah Brockington scored 11 of his team-best 14 points in the second half and junior guards Myreon Jones and Sam Sessoms added 10 points each for Penn State.

The Nittany Lions outscored the Wolverines 31-26 in the second half and the battle continued until the final buzzer as neither team held a lead larger than six in the final 16 minutes. Penn State came out of the gate shooting 5-8 from the field and then capitalized on Wolverine missed shots and turnovers to take a 46-45 lead on a Seth Lundy jumper at the 12:14 mark.

Michigan built a six-point lead with about five minutes remaining, but Penn State used an 8-0 run with couple of free throws and a 3-pointer from Jones and a field goal and one from Sessoms. Sessoms' free throw put the Nittany Lions up by two with 2:53 left to play.

Penn State's bench contributed 20 points in the effort with Sessoms' 10, six from Dread and four points from freshman Abdou Tsimbila.

The Wolverines' leading scorer, Hunter Dickinson, finished his night with 20 points, scoring Michigan's final two field goals for a 60-58 lead.

The Wolverines shot 52 percent from the field and had all five of their treys in the first half to take the nine-point advantage at the break. A 6-0 run to end the first period cut Michigan's lead to 36-27 after the Wolverines led by as many as 15. The Penn State defense held the Wolverines scoreless for the final 2:14 of the first half.

Nittany Lion Trent Buttrick tied for the game high with seven rebounds, a career best for the senior. Senior forward John Harrar had nine points and senior guard Jamari Wheeler had four assists and three steals for game-high totals in both categories.

PENN STATE BESTED BY NO. 18 ILLINOIS

The inside presence of No. 18 Illinois negated the strong shooting performance by Penn State for a 98-81 Illini win in the Bryce Jordan Center. Junior guards Izaiah Brockington and Myreon Jones each scored 21 points on the night, but it wasn't enough to get past 30 points from leading scorer Ayo Dosunmu and 23 from Illini teammate Kofi Cockburn's 23.

Illinois scored 58 points in the paint and converted 21 second-chance points with potent attack in the second half. Penn State matched Illinois through the 14:26 mark of the second half as junior guard Sam Sessoms tied the game at 54 points with a driving layup. The three different Illini scored to counter with an 8-0 run over the next two minutes for a 62-54 lead.

The Nittany Lions cut the lead to six twice over a five-minute span, but the Illini capitalized on Penn State's foul trouble as the Nittany Lions put Illinois in the bonus at the 13:38 mark of the second half. The Illini pulled out to and held onto a double-digit lead for the last five minutes of the game, in part due to their 19 made free throws on 24 trips to the line in the second half.

Dosunmu scored 21 of his 30 points in the second half. Cockburn's 23 points came on on 11-13 shooting after he was 8-8 in the first half.

Penn State roared to an early 19-4 lead and knocked down 10 of its first 15 shots for a 23-12 lead as Jones scored 11 quick points in the first four-and-a-half minutes of action. The Illini responded with a combination of points in the paint and 3-pointers over the next nine minutes to pull within two points of the Nittany Lions at 37-35.

A 3-pointer by Frazier gave the Illini their first lead at 38-37 with 3:52 in the first half, but the two teams would exchanged leads until knotting the score at 43-43 going into the locker room.

The opening 20 minutes saw Penn State shoot 61.3 percent from the field and Illinois at 56.7 percent. The Nittany Lions were hot to start the second half, going 5-8, but cooled to a 47.1 mark for the period. Both teams were above 50 percent for the game and made the same number of field goals with PSU at 53.8 percent (35-65) and Illinois at 55.6 (35-63).

COMEBACK BID FALLS SHORT IN OVERTIME AT INDIANA

Penn State overcame a 12-point deficit at Indiana in the waning minutes of regulation to force overtime, but the Nittany Lions eventually dropped a tough road contest, 87-85 at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

The Nittany Lions had a pair of chances on the last possession to send the game to a second overtime, but were unable to convert. Indiana's Rob Phinisee made an extremely tough, contested jumper to give the Hoosiers the two-point lead that ended up standing as the game-winning basket. Trayce Jackson-Davis finished the night with a game-high 21 points.

Myreon Jones scored 14 of his team-best 20 points in the first half and combined with Jamari Wheeler's basket for Penn State's five overtime points. Sam Sessoms tied his Penn State best with 17 points and scored seven-straight points to give Penn State an 80-79 lead with 28 seconds left. Jackson-Davis drew a foul and went to the line, making the first free throw, but missing the second to leave the score tied at 80 at the end of regulation.

Four Nittany Lions finished the night with double-figure scoring. Izaiah Brockington had 15 and Seth Lundy scored 10, all 10 coming in the second half off 4-6 shooting from the field.

Jackson-Davis' field goal and foul shot put the Hoosiers up 85-83 with 1:03 left to play in the extra period, but Jones knotted the game at 85 with two made free throws with just 43 seconds left on the clock. For Jones, it was his second-straight 20-plus point game and eighth of his career.

After an Indiana timeout, Phinisee's shot gave the Hoosiers an 87-85 lead and the final tally after a Penn State 30-second timeout and missed attempt.

IU extended its lead to 66-54 with 9:58 to play in regulation. A Sessoms 3-pointer spurred a 10-2 run to the cut the deficit to four. John Harrar scored six-straight points to keep Penn State within striking distance and Jones and Sessoms drilled treys to cut the lead to one.

Following a pair of free throws by Indiana, Sessoms made his final two shots to give the PSU its first lead at 80-79. Indiana tied the game with a free throw and Sessoms' final shot was contested and went off the mark to send the game to overtime.

The Penn State defense kept Indiana at bay in the first half, helping Penn State keep stay close after a slow start offensively.

After going 3-11 from the field to start the game, the Nittany Lions found their stroke over the final 11:30 of the opening stanza. Penn State went 10-16 to finish the half as Indiana held a 38-33 lead going into the locker room.

PURDUE HOLDS OFF LATE NITTANY LION RALLY, 80-72

Penn State's first game of 2021 came down to the final minutes, but couldn't pull off the comeback and fell at Purdue 80-72. Myreon Jones scored a game- and career-best 23 points and John Harrar had a career-best 14, but all five Boilermaker starters finished the afternoon in double figures.

The Nittany Lions battled for all 40 minutes, whittling the score to a single-digit deficit, 68-61, with 2:37 left to play. Jones was an offensive force late in the game, scoring 12 of his 14 of his second-half points in the final 2:37.

After a back-and-forth battle in the first half, the Boilermakers looked to put the game out of reach, shooting at 67 percent clip from the field during the first six minutes of the second stanza. Purdue used an 18-5 run to take a 51-37 lead, but a pair of triples by forward Trent Buttrick ended the hot start.

With 9:11 remaining, Harrar scored seven of the Nittany Lions' next nine points to cut the deficit to eight. He had two field goals in less than a minute and added another layup at the 5:03 mark.

Harrar's gritty performance also ended with the second double-double of his career as he finished with 14 points and 14 rebounds, 10 on the offensive end. Izaiah Brockington collected a career-best in rebounds with nine to go along with 12 points. Jamari Wheeler, who nailed a key 3-pointer in the first half, had a game-high four steals.

The Boilermakers made 12 free throws over the final 2:18 to secure the win and had 33 trips to the line compared to Penn State's 13. The Nittany Lions had the edge on the boards 49-47, but Purdue's hot second-half shooting (54.2) compared to PSU's 27.7 allowed the Purdue to hold onto the lead.

Both teams struggled from the field to begin the first half, which included a combined 0-14 mark from beyond the arc. Midway through the period, Purdue led Penn State 18-9 following a pair of free throws.

Brockington scored on the next three possessions to trim the Purdue lead to five and sparked Penn State's offense as it finished with a 67 percent mark (10-15) from the field after starting the game 4 for 20.

An 8-0 run by the Nittany Lions erased an early 22-15 Purdue lead with the first three of the game by Jones at 5:58. Both teams traded scores for the final four minutes of the first half and Harrar's slam dunk on a fast break put Penn State up 32-30. A corner trey by Mason Gillis with one second left on the clock sent the Boilermakers into the half leading 33-32.

Trevion Williams had a double-double for Purdue with 13 points and 11 rebounds while Sasha Stefanovic led the team with 15 points.

FIRST-HALF DEFICIT TOO MUCH FOR PENN STATE AT #22 ILLINOIS
 Penn State had double-digit scoring efforts from Myreon Jones and Seth Lundy, but the Nittany Lions could not overcome several scoring bursts from No. 22 Illinois in a 79-65 loss at the State Farm Center.

Jones led the Nittany Lions with 20 points on 6-13 shooting, extending his streak of 20-plus point scoring efforts to four-straight games. Lundy chipped in 13 points off the bench with two three-pointers and a 5-5 mark from the free throw line.

Illinois pieced together several scoring runs throughout the night and received a strong individual performance from Kofi Cockburn, who scored a game-high 21, to hold Penn State at bay. John Harrar had a team-best nine rebounds for the Nittany Lions while freshman forward Abdou Tsimbila had a career-best seven boards to go along with four points and two steals.

Illinois built on its lead early in the second half and used a stretch of perfect 6-6 shooting from the field over 3:30 to extend the lead to 22 points. Over the next seven minutes, the Illini failed to score a basket while the Nittany Lions had five-straight field goals for a 68-53 score.

The Nittany Lions battled back with a pair of baskets from Jamari Wheeler and Tsimbila, but Illinois held a double-digit margin through the final period.

The 42-28 first-half lead proved to be enough for the Illini to secure the win. A red-hot start for the Illini, shooting 67 percent from the field, propelled the home team to a 13-5 lead through the first four minutes of play.

The Nittany Lions drilled four treys to tie the game at 17-17 at the 12:55 mark. The Illini responded with a 10-0 run to push the lead to 27-17 during a four-minute span. A 6-2 run for the Nittany Lions trimmed deficit to six at 29-23 following a Myles Dread triple and a free throw by Jones.

Another double-digit run by Illinois gave it a 41-23 lead with 2:20 to play in the first half. Lundy took advantage of his opportunities at the charity stripe, with five-straight made free throws to pull Penn State within 13, 41-28.

Foul trouble put the Nittany Lions at a disadvantage early, putting Illinois in the bonus midway through the first half. Kyle McCloskey played valuable minutes, with a career-best five points and a steal in 10 minutes of action.

The Nittany Lions outrebounded the Illini 40-35 after being down in that category 21-16 at halftime. Penn State forced Illinois into 15 turnovers, the Illini's highest total in Big Ten play, while the Nittany Lions had 10 steals, their highest total in a Big Ten game this year.

PENN STATE EARNS 75-67 BIG TEN WIN OVER RUTGERS

Penn State absorbed a late surge by Rutgers to pick up its first Big Ten win with a 75-67 final. Led by 17 points each from Myreon Jones and Izaiah Brockington, the Nittany Lions were buoyed by the efforts of Seth Lundy, who recorded his first career double-double with 16 points and a career-best 10 rebounds.

Penn State never trailed in the game, getting out to a quick start by shooting 53.3 percent from the field in the first half. Rutgers used a 51.3 percent shooting in the second half, including 6-6 mark over four minutes midway through the period, to make its run and cut the lead down to four points.

The Scarlet Knights countered Nittany Lion baskets with their own, but couldn't get closer than four points down the stretch. With about a minute to play and down by four, Rutgers was forced to foul and send the Nittany Lions to the line. Rutgers couldn't convert its final two field goal attempts and Jones canned two more free throws with four seconds left for the final.

Jones caught fire in the second half, scoring all 17 of his points in that period, including the first six points after the break to extend the Nittany Lions' lead to 40-25. Rutgers clawed back into the game with its 11-0 run with field goals from five different Scarlet Knights. Four-straight free throws by Penn State halt the run and put the Nittany Lions back up by double-digits, 58-47.

With the Nittany Lions leading by four with 1:57 to play, Jones showed his tenacity. He finished 5-6 from the foul line to secure the win prior to the Nittany Lions' matchup with Northwestern on Saturday.

The Nittany Lions were the aggressors to open the game, jumping out to an early 15-4 lead in the first seven minutes of play. Sam Sessoms had nine first-half points off the bench to pace the Nittany Lions with Lundy and Brockington close behind with eight each.

Rutgers used a 5-0 run to pull within six before Sessoms drilled the Nittany Lions' first trey of the game. Jamari Wheeler followed up by picking the pocket of a Rutgers' ball handler. Wheeler finished the play with an easy layup on the other end of the floor for a 20-9 lead.

Lundy scored Penn State's next six points, finishing with eight for the half, and the Nittany Lions went up 26-14 with 7:13 before the break. Harrar and Sessoms combined for the last eight points for a 34-24 cushion at halftime.

Rutgers' Ron Harper Jr. led all scorers with 18 points while Myles Johnson had seven rebounds to lead the Scarlet Knights.

Penn State had the advantage on the boards 40-27, had 10 steals and had 14 of its 15 made free throws in the second half.

- Ranks as team's second leading scorer and rebounder at 14.1 points and 4.9 rebounds per contest.
- Tied for share of team-high 17 points in win over Rutgers. Added 3 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals to his stat line.

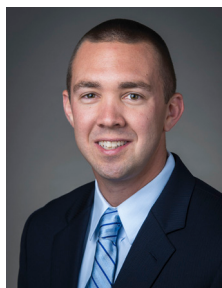
