- The Lady Lions started the game with a 15-2 run and never looked back on the way to a 75-49 win over Notre Dame in the BJC on Nov. 16, 2006.
- Tyra Grant connected on 4-of-8 shots from the field and all 10 of her free throws en route to a game-high 19 points.
- Kam Gissendanner tallied 13 points, while Amanda Brown accounted for 12 points, eight rebounds, five assists and two blocked shots.
- Coquese Washington was on the Irish staff as the associate head coach that
 evening and was named to the Penn State head position just five months later.

BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

- The Lady Lions are 2-4 all-time in ACC/Big Ten Challenge games, but are 2-1 in home games.
- Penn State picked up Challenge wins over North Carolina (2011) and Duke (2007), but has suffered losses to Miami (2012), Boston College (2010), Georgia Tech (2009) and Florida State (2008).
- ACC/Big Ten Challenge has produced several high scoring affairs with the Lady Lions averaging 79.7 points per game, including a pair of 100-point outings.

HOSTING ANOTHER TOP 5 TEAM

- The Lady Lions will host their second Top 5 team of the season when the #5
 Notre Dame Fighting Irish come to town. Penn State also hosted top-ranked
 UConn Nov 17
- This is the first time since 2000-01 that Penn State has welcomed a pair of Top 5 programs to the BJC in a single season. That season, the Lady Lions met #3 Duke on Nov. 20 (L, 88-87) and #5 Purdue on Feb. 22 (W, 75-65) in the friendly confines of the Bryce Jordan Center.
- Wednesday marks the 21st time that a Top 5 team has come to Happy Valley.
- The Lady Lions are 12-8 all-time in home games against Top 5 teams.

COQUESE FACES ALMA MATER & MENTOR

- Lady Lion head coach Coquese Washington will square off for the first time against her alma mater, Notre Dame, and her mentor, Muffet McGraw.
- Washington was a four-year starting point guard for McGraw and the Irish, where she led Notre Dame to its first-ever NCAA Tournament berth.
- Washington was a two-time All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference selection and led UND to three MCC Tournament titles.
- After playing professionally, Washington returned to South Bend as an assistant coach under McGraw in 1999. She was an assistant from 1999-05 and was promoted to associate head coach from 2005-07, when she took the Penn State head coaching position.

POTTHOFF RETURNS TO ALMA MATER

- Coquese Washington is not the only person facing her alma mater in this matchup, former Lady Lion standout Angie Potthoff returns to Happy Valley with Notre Dame as the Associate Director of Operations & Technology.
- She is in her ninth season on the Notre Dame staff. She served as an assistant coach for five season before taking her current position.
- Potthoff was an Associated Press and WBCA All-America honorable metion choice and a three-time All-Big Ten first team selection as a Lady Lion.
- She currently ranks ninth in program history in scoring (1,725), sixth in rebounding (918) and second in field goal percentage (.574).

- The Lady Lions won the Freeport Division of the Junkanoo Jam with wins over Oregon State (61-56) and Illinois State (72-60).
- It is the second Junkanoo Jam title for the Lady Lions with the first coming in 2003.
- Maggie Lucas was selected as the Tournament MVP and Dara Taylor was named to the All-Tournament team.
- Lucas had 17 points and five rebounds against the Beavers and 25 points, three assists and two steals against the Redbirds.
- Taylor accounted for 10 points, six assists and three steals versus OSU and followed that up with 12 points, three assists and three steals against ISU.

LUCAS LOOKING FOR LONG RANGE RECORD

- Senior guard Maggie Lucas ranks second in Big Ten and Penn State history in three-point field goals made.
- Lucas has 306 triples in her collegiate career, trailing only Kelly Mazzante's Big Ten and Penn State record
 of 357 three-pointers.
- Lucas is just the second player in Big Ten history and 45th player in NCAA Division I history with 300 career three-pointers.
- With four triples against Fordham on Nov. 10, Lucas passed Michigan State's Lindsey Bowen (294) for second place on the Big Ten's career chart.
- Last season, Lucas tied the NCAA record for consecutive games with a made three-pointer in a season with 32.
- Lucas has made a triple in each of her last 41 contests, which is a school record.
- For her career, Lucas has connected on 42.9% of her shots from downtown, which ranks second in school history overall and first among Lady Lions with 75 or more career attempts.

DUO BLOCKING THE LANE

- Senior center Talia East and junior center Tori Waldner have made it tough for opponents to find success in the lane as the pair have moved into the Top 20 in school history in blocks.
- · East is 18th in program history with 63 career rejections.
- She needs three blocks to move into a tie for 17th place with Adrie DeVries (66; 1987-90) and four rejections to move into a tie for 16th place with Janessa Wolff (67; 2008-10).
- Waldner has 57 career blocks to sit 20th on the Lady Lions' career blocks list.
- She needs four rejections to tie Tanisha Wright (61; 2002-05) for 19th place.

DEFENSE SOLID VS. #1

- The Lady Lion defense had a solid showing against top-ranked UConn on Nov. 17.
- Penn State held the Huskies to their second-lowest post total of the season (71) and forced a season-high 17 UConn turnovers.

- Senior guard Maggie Lucas moved into sixth place on Penn State's all-time scoring chart with 1,971 points.
- With an 18-point performance against top-ranked UConn, Lucas moved past Suzie McConnell (1,897; 1985-88) for sixth place.
- Lucas needs 24 points to tie Tanisha Wright (1,995; 2002-05) for fifth place.
- Lucas needs 29 tallies to become the fifth player in school history with 2,000 points, joining Kelly Mazzante,
 Susan Robinson, Tyra Grant and Kahadeejah Herbert.
- With 33 tallies in the season opener against St. Francis (Pa.), Lucas moved into third place on Penn State's all-time 30-point games chart with her fifth career contest with 30 or more tallies.

LUCAS LOADING UP THE RECORD BOOKS

- In addition to her scoring and three-point prowess, senior guard Maggie Lucas has also etched her name on several other career charts for the Lady Lions.
- The Narberth, Pa. native sits atop the career free throw percentage list with an .896 mark.
- · Lucas is also seventh in program history in free throws made with 405 shots made from the charity stripe.
- She needs 34 makes from the free throw line to tie Tanisha Wright (439; 2002-05) for sixth place all-time.
- Lucas has also moved up the career steals list. With one steal against Bucknell on Nov. 20, Lucas moved into sole possession of 15th place, passing Annie Troyan (187; 1981-83) with 191 career thefts.
- She needs five thefts to move into a tie for 16th with Brianne O'Rourke (196; 2006-09).

BJC STREAK SNAPPED

- The Lady Lions had their 22 game home court winning streak snapped at the hands of #1 Connecticut on Nov. 17. At the time of the loss, the winning streak was tied for the third-longest active streak in NCAA Division I, behind Baylor and Tennessee-Chattanooga.
- The loss marked Penn State's first home loss since Jan. 7, 2012 to Michigan State.
- The 22 game home court win streak is tied for the fourth-longest in school history.
- Additionally, Penn State had won its last 15 non-conference home games, dating back to Dec. 28, 2010, which was tied for the second-longest string in program history.

FEELING CHARITABLE

- Senior guard Maggie Lucas tied the school record for free throw percentage in a game (min. 15 attempts) with a perfect 16-for-16 mark from the line against St. Francis (Pa.) in the home opener Nov. 8.
- She equaled the mark also held by Jess Strom (15-15; Minnesota, 1/30/05) and Brianne O'Rourke (15-15; Duke, 12/2/07).
- Lucas' 16 freebies are a Bryce Jordan Center record, breaking the record of 15 held by Strom and O'Rourke.
- Lucas made her first 21 free throws of the season and had an overall streak of 30 consecutive freebies made, dating back to last season, before missing her first free throw against UConn.

Head Coach 7th Season

PENN STATE LADY LION BASKETBALL

Coquese Washington was introduced as the fifth head coach of the Penn State women's basketball program on April 23, 2007. Washington is the first female African-American head coach in Penn State history.

The Lady Lions continued their return to the national spotlight in 2012-13 as they collected their second-straight Big Ten regular-season title and seventh overall with a 26-6 overall record and 14-2 mark in conference play. In each of Washington's first six years, Penn State has improved their Big Ten win total. The Lady Lions posted their third consecutive 25-win season, joining the 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 squads as the only teams in program history to accomplish the feat. Penn State also advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a win over Cal Poly. The Lady Lions were consistently ranked in the Top 10 for most of the season and finished eighth in the Associated Press Top 25 and 12th in the USA Today Sports Coaches'

With another stellar campaign, the accolades continued to roll in for the Lady Lions. Washington was selected as

the Big Ten Coach of the Year by the media for the secondstraight season and became just the fifth mentor in Big Ten history to win back-to-back Coach of the Year accolades. She was also the WBCA Region 6 Coach of the Year and a finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year for the secondstraight season. The awards also piled up for Penn State's dynamic backcourt of Maggie Lucas and Alex Bentley. Lucas was selected as the Big Ten Player of the Year, was a Wade Trophy Finalist and was an All-America choice by four outlets, including the WBCA (honorable mention). Associated Press (second team), USBWA (first team) and Full Court (second team). She is just the third Lady Lion in program history to win Big Ten Player of the Year honors, joining Helen Darling and Kelly Mazzante. Bentley earned her third-straight first team All-Big Ten award and honorable mention All-America bids from the WBCA and Associated Press. She was also selected as the 2013 recipient of the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award, which is presented to the nation's outstanding female collegian 5-8 and under. Bentley is the third Lady Lion to win the honor, joining Darling and Suzie McConnell. Nikki Greene also capped a stellar career for the Lady Lions with third team All-Big Ten accolades. She also became the first player in school history to accumulate 1.000 points, 900 rebounds and 200 blocks.

Both Bentley and Greene heard their names called on WNBA Draft night. Bentley was selected with the 13th overall pick by the Atlanta Dream to become the highest draft pick for the Lady Lions since Tanisha Wright (12th) in 2005. Greene was the 26th overall selection by the Phoenix Mercury to give Penn State two draft picks for the first time since 2004 (Mazzante, Jess Brungo).

With five graduating seniors in 2012-13, Penn State was stout on the recruiting trail, bringing in a seven-member class that was ranked 14th by ESPN/HoopGurlz. The Lady Lions also added transfer Sierra Moore from Duke to complete the eight-player class. The addition of Moore gives the Lady Lions four McDonald's All-Americans on the roster heading into the 2013-14 campaign, joining Dara Taylor (2009), Lucas (2010) and Candice Agee (2012).

Washington returned the Lady Lions to Big Ten prominence in her fifth season as she guided Penn State to the Big Ten regular-season title with a 13-3 record in conference play. Additionally, the Lady Lions advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen with wins over UTEP and LSU en route to a 26-7 overall record. The Lady Lions posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 2002-03 and 2003-04. It was also the first Big Ten crown and Sweet Sixteen berth for the Lady Lions since 2003-04. The Lady Lions were ranked throughout the season and finished ninth in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and 11th in the Associated Press Top 25.

For her efforts in rebuilding the Penn State program, Washington was honored as the Big Ten Coach of the Year and the WBCA Region 6 Coach of the Year, making her a finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year. The accolades were not just limited to Washington; all five Lady

Lion starters earned All-Big Ten recognition, including first team bids for Bentley and Lucas. Both Bentley and Lucas also garnered honorable mention All-America honors from the WBCA and Associated Press, respectively. Bentley became the 33rd player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau and just the 15th junior to reach the milestone. Lucas also joined the 1,000-point club in 2011-12, becoming just the third sophomore in program history to accomplish the feat.

On the recruiting trail, the Lady Lions' 2012 class earned a Top 20 class from Dan Olson's Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. The class included transfer Taylor, who sat out the 2011-12 season due to NCAA transfer rules, and McDonald's High School All-American Agee from California. Additionally, Agee earned a gold medal with the USA Basketball U18 National Team Trials at the 2012 FIBA Americas Championship in August.

Washington came to Happy Valley after eight seasons as an associate head coach and assistant coach under Muffet McGraw at Notre Dame, her alma mater During Washington's eight years on the bench, Notre Dame amassed a 188-69 record with eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including four Sweet Sixteen runs and a National Championship in 2001.

Washington was a four-year starting point guard for Notre Dame under McGraw and was the team captain on Notre Dame's first-ever NCAA Tournament team. She was a two-time All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference (MCC) selection and led Notre Dame to three MCC Tournament titles.

The epitome of a student-athlete, Washington graduated from Notre Dame in 1992, a full year ahead of schedule, with a bachelor's degree in history. She went on to attain "Double Domer" status in 1997 after earning her Juris Doctorate from the Notre Dame Law School.

A native of Flint, Mich., Washington and her husband, Raynell Brown, have a son, Quenton (8), and a daughter, Rhaiyna (4). They reside in Port Matilda, Pa.
