THE GAME: Penn State will return to the road on Saturday for a late 9:00 p.m. (ET) tip at Nebraska. The Huskers, who will be playing their first game in seven days, downed the Lions 68-64 on Jan. 19 for their first ever win in State College. Lions 68-64 on Jan. 19 for their first ever win in State College. Penn State is 1-2 all-time in Lincoln, with a 65-59 victory in the second round of the 1995 NIT as the lone win. The series is now tied at 3-3. Nebraska logged a 70-58 victory last year in Lincoln and has won two of three in the series since beginning play in the Big Ten. Penn State is seeking its first conference victory of the season and will look to end a 15-game road losing skid, dating to a victory at Boston College in November of 2011, and a 13-game road losing skid to Big Ten opponents, dating to a victory at Minnesota on March 6, 2011.

NOTES TO KNOW:

Penn State took a season high 62 shots vs. Purdue to hold a 62-49 advantage in attempts. In Big Ten play, PSU has a 552-495 advantage in field goal attempts vs. opponents.
 Penn State trails Big Ten opponents 281-162 (-119) in free throw attempts in Big Ten play.

 Penn State held Purdue to 58 points, a season low for a Big Ten opponent, but fell to 12-2 under coach Patrick Chambers when holding an opponent to 59 points or less.

Penn State's seven threes at Iowa marked its most in Big Ten play to date. The Lions had seven or more threes in each of their final four non-con games while scoring 70+ points on their way to winning each game. The Lions are making 3.9 per game in Big Ten games.
 Penn State held Purdue without a three (0-10) and is now allowing just 5.5 threes per game in Big Ten play. The Lions gave up 7.9 per game in Big Ten play last year.

 D.J. Newbill posted his seventh 20-point game of the season with 20 points, six rebounds and four assists in his last road outing at lowa. His seven 20-point games are third most in the Big Ten.

• D.J. Newbill is averaging 18.0 ppg, 5.0 apg and 4.5 rpg over his last six games while getting to the foul line an average of eight times per game.

 D.J. Newbill and Jermaine Marshall have each posted double-figure scoring in 8-of-10 Big Ten games, Newbill in the last six straight. The only other Lions to score in double-figures in a Big Ten game are Brandon Taylor (11 at Purdue) and Ross Travis (14 vs. Indiana). No Lion other than Newbill or Marshall has reached double-digits in the last six games and no more than two players have recorded double-figures in the same game in the Big Ten so far.
 Newbill (8) or Marshall (9) have led the Lions in scoring in 17 of the 19 games since Tim Frazier went down with injury.

• D.J. Newbill ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 151 free throw attempts trailing only Cody Zeller (163), Aaron White (158) and Brandon Paul (153), with no other player within 25 attempts. He has gotten to the foul line at least once in 50 of 53 career games.

• Penn State is averaging 64.2 ppg at home, eclipsing 70 five times, and 53.2 ppg on the road this season, with a high of 67 in its last outing at lowa.

Jermaine Marshall posted his first career double-double (29 & 10) vs. MSU. He has double-figure scoring in 15 of his last 18 games and leads the team with 36 threes and 34 steals.
PSU has posted 16 games with double-digit offensive boards and leads the Big Ten collecting 74.1% of all defensive rebounds.

• Penn State has gotten to the line an average of 20 times in the last six games and ranks third in conference games shooting 71.0% at the line, but is being outscored 21.2-13.8 at the foul line in the last six games and trails Big Ten foes 11.5 ppg to 18.9 ppg at the foul line overall, having been outscored at the foul line in every Big Ten game so far.

Penn State has been whistled for 68 more fouls than opponents in Big Ten games.
 Newbill (6th, 15.7 ppg) and Marshall (7th, 14.7 ppg) are one of two sets of teammates to rank in the Top 10 in scoring in the Big Ten, and the 2nd highest scoring backcourt (30.4 ppg), behind Michigan's Trey Burke (2nd, 18.1) and Tim Hardaway Jr. (6th, 16.0), 34.1 ppg.
 Newbill and Marshall account for 50% of the Lions' points and steals.

PENN STATE PLAYERS

LAST TIME at Nebraska, L, 70-58 on Jan. 11, 2012

Penn State hung close for most of the first half despite shooting just 29 percent in the first 20 minutes, but saw Nebraska open a double-digit lead with 6:26 to play in the half and trailed 34-22 at the break. The Lions would never get the lead under 10 the rest of the way despite a career-high 30 points and six steals from Tim Frazier who shot 10-of-16 in the game. The rest of the Lions went 10-of-44 as Penn State hit just 33 percent from the floor and a season-low 3-of-24 (12.5%) from three. Nebraska shot 60 percent in the second half, including 5-of-8 from three, on its way to 55 percent shooting in the game. Bo Spencer led four Huskers in double-digits with 19 points. Penn State had just five assists to go with 13 turnovers on the night.

OUTLET PASSES (PLAYERS)

■ JERMAINE MARSHALL posted a career high 29 points & 10 rebounds vs. Michigan State. He has led the Lions in scoring in NINE games on the year. He has 38 career double-digit scoring games and 6 20-point games.

■ JERMAINE MARSHALL greatly improved his defense last year and finished second on the team with 32 steals. He leads the team this season with 33, including a career high five vs. New Hampshire, and has a team high 83 deflections.

■ D.J. NEWBILL posted his first double-double at Penn State with a career high 23 points and 12 rebounds vs. Duquesne. He has scored in double-digits in 19 of 22 games on the year, including a career high 27 vs. MSU. His six 20-point games on the year rank third in the Big Ten and his seven career double-doubles (six at Southern Miss.) are tied for fourth-most among active Big Ten players.

■ D.J. NEWBILL trimmed his weight from 225 to 205 in the off-season following his red-shirt campaign after transferring from Southern Mississippi. He missed nearly two months of practice early last season after injuring his left shoulder.

■ ROSS TRAVIS has led the team in rebounding in 12 games. He is fifth in the Big Ten posting 6.8 rpg. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year.

■ ROSS TRAVIS posted a career-best 13 rebounds vs. Bucknell, 11 at Wisconsin and led Penn State with 10 in a loss to Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, adding 11 points for his first career double-double. He has four double-digit rebounding games and two double-doubles on the year.

■ JON GRAHAM posted two blocks in three straight Big Ten games and leads the team with 22 on the season. He blocked a total of 19 shots last year to lead the team.

■ JON GRAHAM trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for his sophomore season and added four inches to his vertical. He maintains a team-best 24 reps on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best.

■ Former walk-on NICK COLELLA was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He posted a career-best 15 points on 5-of-7 from three vs. Duquesne. He went 11-of-20 from three in the last four non-con games. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started six-straight games in the Big Ten.

■ Freshman **BRANDON TAYLOR** arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds, in part due to a plantar fasciitis that kept him inactive for much of the summer. He sculpted his body in the late summer and preseason and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the season.

■ BRANDON TAYLOR posted 16 points in his first career start vs. Bucknell. He has posted double-digit scoring in six games since taking on a larger role in the absence of Frazier. The 6-7 Taylor is 28-91 (30.8%) from three, making at least one in 15 of 19 games since Tim Frazier's injury. His 28 threes are second only to Jermaine Marshall's 36.

OUTLET PASSES (TEAM)

■ Penn State is blocking 3.8 shots per game in the Big Ten (4th among conference teams), led by Jermaine Marshall (11) and Jon Graham (10) in Big Ten play.

■ After winning the rebounding battle in nine straight games, including its first three Big Ten, Penn State has been out-rebunded in six of the last seven contests.

■ Penn State has been outscored at the free throw line in every Big Ten game and by a margin of 11.5 to 18.9 per game during Big Ten play.

■ Penn State shot a season best 40% (8-20) from three vs. Duquesne and made a season high eight threes. The Lions have made more than 5 threes in a Big Ten game once on the year (7) and are shooting 23.8% from the arc in conference games. The Lions have shot less than 40% from the arc in 21 games and less than 30% in 11.

Score tied - 0 times.

■ Penn State is 4-1 in games decided by seven points or less on the year, including two overtime wins, losing for the first time 68-64 to Nebraska in the BJC. The Lions went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year, having just one home loss come by more than six points.

Penn State has allowed 12 opponents to eclipse 70 points, winning three of those games, and having nine losses on the year come to opponents scoring 70+. Penn State is 4-22 under Patrick Chambers when opponents break 70 points.

■ Five of Penn State's eight primary contributors (following the loss of Tim Frazier) are freshmen or sophomores, including three of the top four scorers and rebounders.

■ Penn State has fielded one of the nation's youngest squads the last two years. This year, two sophomores and a freshman are in the starting line-up acounting for 61 of 100 starts on the year. Last year eight of 10 primary contributors were in their first or second season of Division I play.

FOUL TROUBLE: Three Lions fouled out of the 58-49 loss to Purdue (2/5), including both post players Sasa Borovnjak and Jon Graham. Penn State has had 14 disqualifications in Big Ten play and 22 on the year after having 13 and 19 all of last season. The hardest hit have been the Bigs with Borovnjak fouling out of three of the last five games and four in Big Ten play. Brandon Taylor has fouled out of three Big Ten games and four on the year and Graham has fouled out of two Big Ten game. Penn State is suffering a 227-159 (+68) foul disparity in Big Ten play with opponents having two disqualifications.

WHAT A COMBO !:

■ Junior Jermaine Marshall posted career highs of 29 points and 10 rebounds and sophomore **D.J. Newbill** had a career high 27 points and added six assists as Penn State's starting guards accounted for 56 of the Lions' 72 points in an 81-72 loss to No. 18 Michigan State (1/16). The tandem combined to shoot 18-30 (60%) from the floor and 17-of-23 (74%) at the foul line. Marshall hit three treys and tied a career high with 10 field goals while Newbill got to the foul line 15 times and made 11.

■ They both exploded in the second half with Marshall collecting 22 of his points and Newbill 18 of his in the second 20 minutes, accounting for 40 of the Lions 47 points in the highest scoring PSU half in coach Patrick Chambers two seasons. They accounted for 18 straight points at one point and 30 of the final 32 for the the Lions as PSU sliced a 16-point MSU lead to five with 2:06 to play.

■ Their combined 56 points were the most by two Lions in a game since Geary Claxton (31) and Jamelle Cornley (25) combined for 56 in a 129-111 victory over VMI in 2006. It marked the second time this season they both scored 20 points in a game.

Marshall (17) and Newbill (19) have combined to record 36 of the Lions 54 double-digit scoring games this season, with 18 coming from the other players on the roster.

 They have both scored in double-digits in 15 of 22 games.
 Marshall and Newbill account for 50% of the Lions points and steals and 56% of the team's free throws and free throw attempts.

■ The defense was particularly strong in holding Indiana's Cody Zeller (17.2 ppg) to a career low two points and no field goals in four attempts and Big Ten Leading scorer Deshaun Thomas (20.5 ppg) to a season low 11 of 4-of-13 shooting.

THE BIG TEN'S YOUNG HEAD COACHES: Penn State head coach Patrick Chambers and Nebraska head coach Tim Miles are two of six Big Ten head basketball coaches in their 40's. Chambers (42) was born in December of 1970 about 3 1/2 months after Purdue coach Matt Painter (42) who was born in late August of that year. Chambers is the second youngest coach in the Big Ten. Illinois' John Groce (41) was born in September of 1971 and is approximately nine months younger than Chambers. Other Big Ten coaches still in their 40's are Indiana's Tom Crean (46), Nebraska's Tim Miles (46) and Ohio State's Thad Matta (45).

Penn State head football coach Bill O'Brien (43) is also in his early 40's and is the second youngest head football coach in the Big Ten. Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald (38) is the youngest. There are seven Big Ten head football coaches in their 40's or younger.

GUARDING THE ARC: Penn State has made considerable improvement in limiting opponent's threes, including an 0-10 effort by Purdue (2/5) for the first opponent shutout from the arc since November of 2006. Penn State is giving up just 5.5 threes per game to Big Ten opponents, a big improvement over the 7.9 per game allowed last season to Big Ten foes and 8.0 per game allowed in the non-conference season this year. The Lions have held six Big Ten foes to five threes or less.

NEWBILL HITS GROOVE: Over his last six games, sophomore guard D.J. Newbill is averaging 18.0 points, 5.0 assists and 4.8 rebounds per game while shooting 45% from the floor and 35-49 (71%) from the foul line.

NEWBILL ON POINT: D.J. Newbill, a natural offguard, has taken over point guard duties since the injury to Tim Frazier in the fourth game of the season. He is logging big minutes at the position playing 36.1 per game to rank second in the Big Ten. Working through growing pains at the position, He posted his best floor game with just one turnover and six assists to go with 15 points in 39 minutes vs. Ohio State Aaron Craft (1/26). He posted 10-straight double-digit scoring games after taking over, a streak snapped vs. Indiana, and has posted double-digit points in 18 of 21 games with SEVEN 20-point outings, including a career high 27 vs. Michigan State (1/16). He has led the Lions in scoring SEVEN times since Frazier's injury, posting career highs on four occasions including a 23-point, 12-rebound effort vs. Duquesne for his first double-double at Penn State and seventh career. His seven 20-point outings on the year are third most in the Big Ten.

TIM FRAZIER INJURY: WHAT'S MISSING

■ TIM FRAZIER was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier was named a first-team All-Big Ten selection last year after leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4).

■ stands 6th on the Penn State career assist charts with 459 after posting a record 198 last year and is 151 assists shy of breaking the all-time career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992.

scored 208 field goals and had 198 assists to lead the nation being involved in 58.4% of Penn State's field goals last year. Only two other players in Division I were involved in 50% or more of their teams scoring.

■ was the ONLY player in NCAA Division I to post at least 17 points and 6 rebounds a game last year

■ had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, including 15 of 19 games vs. Big Ten oppo-nents, and scored 20 or more points in 9 of his last 13 games before his injury. Was averaging 21.7 ppg through the first three games of the season.

A NEW MARSHALL IN TOWN: Junior Jermaine Marshall has emerged as not only one of Penn State's main weapons, ranking 7th in the Big Ten scoring 14.7 ppg, but a primary ball handler, sharing duties at the point with D.J. Newbill, and a generator of turnovers, leading the team with 33 steals (7th in the Big Ten, 1.5 spg) and 83 deflections. He posted his FIRST CAREER DOUBLE-DOUBLE with career highs of 29 points and 10 rebounds vs. Michigan State (1/16) and his combined point and rebound total (39) were the most by a Nittany Lion since Talor Battle posted 28 points and 13 rebounds (41) in a 69-61 win over Michigan in 2008. He has two 20-point games on the year. He led Penn State in scoring in four straight games immediately following the injury to Tim Frazier and has led the team in points NINE times on the year. He logged a career high five assists vs. two turnovers in the win over Delaware State for his best floor game of the year and followed that with a career high five steals in the win over New Hampshire. Marshall is the Lions' leading active career scorer (discounting the injured Tim Frazier) with 729 points and three-point shooter with 85 career threes.

BOROVNJAK STRONG IN FINAL CAMPAIGN:

Senior Sasa Borovnjak, who is in his fourth year in the program but redshirted the 2010-11 campaign due to a knee injury suffered prior to the season and is eligible for a fifth season of eligibility, has made the decision to make this his final season of of collegiate competition and plans to graduate in May. Since discussing the decision with coach Patrick Chambers, he has played the best basketball of his career and started 14 straight games. His nine points vs. No. 14 Ohio State marked his most ever in a Big Ten game and he has posted seven or more in each of the last three. He posted three-straight double-digit scoring games to close out the non-conference season culminating with 14 vs. Duguesne on 7-of-9 shooting. He tied a career high with eight rebounds for the second time in three games vs. Delaware State and added 14 points for the best statistical game of his career. He followed with 11 points vs. New Hampshire for his first back-to-back double-digit scoring games. NOTES FROM RECENT OUTINGS

NOTES FROM LOSS TO PURDUE:

• D.J. Newbill led Penn State with 17 points and a career high tying seven assists while playing all 40 minutes.

Penn State's nine point lead, 21-12, at 5:46 of the first half marked its largest so far in Big Ten play.
Penn State held Purdue without a three-pointer (0-10), the first time a PSU

opponent did not make a three since Stony Brook (0-8) in 2006. • Purdue's 58 points marked the fewest by a Big Ten opponent on the season. PSU fell to 5-1 on the year and 12-2 under Patrick Chambers when

holding an opponent to 59 points or less.

Penn State took a season high 62 field goal attempts

• The Lions led at the half for the first time in Big Ten play and fell to 13-5 under Patrick Chambers when leading at the half.

NOTES FROM LOSS AT IOWA:

Penn State led 10-3 when it suffered a five-minute scoreless drought and saw lowa go on a 14-0 run.

D.J. Newbill posted his seventh 20-point game of the year (20) and led Penn State in scoring for the seventh time on the season.
Newbill and Jermaine Marshall (15) both reached double-figures for the

fifth straight game. • Penn State committed 26 fouls and saw lowa hit 31-of-39 at the foul line, a season high in attempts for an opponent. The Lions had a 23-point deficit in scorino at the foul line.

 Penn State committed 18 turnovers, its third game with 18 or more in Big Ten play.

• Penn State fell at lowa for the 10th straight time and has not won at lowa since 2001. The Lions fell to 0-5 in road games on the year and have now lost 15 straight on the road.

TRAVIS GETS AGGRESSIVE: Ross Travis has staked a claim as one of the top rebounders in the Big Ten posting four doubledigit rebounding games on the season, including 11 in the Big Ten opener at Wisconsin, to rank FIFTH in the Big Ten posting 6.8 rpg. Having worked hard on his jump shot in the off-season, he has also asserted himself offensively posting back-to-back double-digit scoring outings for the first time in his career (12 at La Salle and 14 vs. Army) and has five double-digit scoring games on the year. He led Penn State in scoring for the first time on his career with 14 points vs. Indiana while taking a career high 17 field goal attempts and posted eight points and eight rebounds vs. Purdue. Travis scored eight of the Lions first 14 points at La Salle and seven of Penn State's first nine vs. Army while shooting 11-of-22 (50%) combined in the games. He logged his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 boards vs. Army.

TAYLOR A THREE-POINT THREAT: Freshman Brandon Taylor has proven to be an effective offensive performer early in his career when he can avoid early foul trouble that limits his minutes. A pick and pop, stretch four, he led Penn State in scoring for the first time on his career with 11 at Purdue (1/13). He shot a team-best 37.8% from the arc during the non-conference season, but has seen that dip to 23.9% (11-46) in conference play. He has made at least one three in 15 of 19 games since taking on a larger role following Tim Frazier's injury. His 28 threes rank second on the team. He posted back-to-back double-digit outings vs. Akron and Bucknell (hitting 62.5% (6-12) from three). Taylor's 14 points vs. Army and 10 vs. New Hampshire gave him five double-digit scoring outings on the year.

COLELLA LEADS LIONS IN CHARGES TAKEN & DIVES:

Among the team leaders in overall "Attitude Points" on the season, senior Nick Colella leads the team with 13 charges taken and 56 dives on the year emblematic of the grit and hustle of a former walk-on. After a rough start to the season that saw him shoot 5-of-27 from three in the first eight games, he found his shot in the final four non-conference games going a team-best 11-of-20 (55%) from three to average 9.0 ppg. Included in that effort was a career high 15 points on a career-best 5-of-7 from three and a career-best four boards in the win vs. Duquesne. His five threes marked the most by a PSU player on the season. He is now third on the team with 23 threes on the year and has a team-leading three-point percentage of 32.4%. The senior captain has started the last four games. He made six straight starts in Big Ten play last year.

FRAZIER HITS 8-WEEK MILESTONE: Tim Frazier had successful surgery to repair his ruptured left Achilles tendon on Nov. 20. He hit the eight-week milestone since the surgery on Jan. 15 and marked the day by no longer requiring use of a walking boot. He will wear a wedge under his left heel for the next 2-3 weeks as he continues to stretch the tendon. He is currently walking in a pool and undergoing rehab to stretch the tendon and remove scar tissue. He is expected to begin walking on a weight sus-

pended treadmill at the 10-week mark post surgery and to begin jumping rope in weeks 14 to 18. Frazier was in a cast for about three weeks before moving to a walking boot that gradually flattened his foot as the tendon stretched. He is expected to have about a six-month recovery period and, at the completion of the 2012-13 campaign, will apply for an NCAA Hardship Waiver to return for the 2013-14 season.

72 VS. MSU ENDS BIG TEN SCORING DROUGHT: Penn State's 47 points against Michigan State in the second half marked a high for a half in two seasons under Coach Chambers. The Lions eclipsed 70 points for the fifth time on the season and fifth in a stretch of seven home game. The 72 points and 48% shooting marked a PSU high in Big Ten play on the year. MSU entered the game ranked second in the Big Ten in scoring defense (57.7 ppg) and defensive shooting percentage (37.6%) and had allowed just one opponent to reach 70, a 74-70 win over Boise State. PSU posted 78.5 ppg in its final four non-conference games, but failed to eclipse 54 points in its first four Big Ten games, posting 49.5 ppg over that stretch. The Lions had logged three straight games with season lows in shooting (31.7% vs. Indiana, 31.6% vs. Northwestern in the Jordan Center and 25.9% (the lowest mark under Patrick Chambers) at Purdue) prior to the MSU game. The Lions 42 points in the loss at Purdue marked the fewest scored in two seasons under head coach Patrick Chambers.

FOUR STRAIGHT 70-POINT GAMES TO CLOSE NON-CON: Penn State posted its four best point (78, 80, 72 & 84) and assist totals (13, 15, 13 & 12) of the season in the last four non-conference games and three of its top for shooting games. The Lions shot 47% and scored 78.5 ppg in the last four non-con outings, an increase of nearly 20 ppg over their 58.9 ppg average over the first eight games of the year. The Lions' streak of four straight games of 70+ points was their longest since posting seven in November and December of 2008 and their 84-point outing vs. Duquesne in the final non-con game was their most since 2009.

■ Penn State went 6-2 in the eight non-con games after losing do-everything guard Tim Frazier to a season-ending Achilles injury. The Lions 8-4 record in the non-con season equaled their win total from last year (8-5), despite losing Frazier early in the fourth game of the year.

WE CAN RELATE: Penn State coach Patrick Chambers can relate to star guard Tim Frazier's recent injury, in fact Frazier is using the exact same motorized scooter Chambers used this summer after he underwent arthroplastic surgery to repair the knee joint on his left leg and was limited to riding the scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and the use of crutches for two months. Chambers has said the insertion of a wedge and six screws to re-align his knee joint was one of the toughest things he's had to deal with and will use the recent experience to help guide Frazier through his re-habilitation. Frazier's sister, Krystal, also suffered a ruptured Achilles, during a standout basketball career at Rice that saw her earn All-Conference USA honors. She returned from the injury to post 10 ppg in her senior season.

FRAZIER REMAINS ACTIVE LEADER: Since his season-ending Achilles injury, Tim Frazier has remained a vocal and active presence on the team attending every practice and shouting instructions and pulling teammates aside during breaks in the action. He is a virtual assistant coach in games, even delivering the pre-game scout in the locker room prior to the win over Delaware State. He has been particularly active in helping to guide D.J. Newbill in his transition to the point guard position.

FRAZIER SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY: Senior guard Tim Frazier, a preseason candidate for both the Wooden and Naismith national player of the year awards. will miss the remainder of the 2012-13 season due to an injury suffered in the Nittany Lions' third game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in Bayamon, Puerto Rico. Frazier had played in every game (101) the last three plus seasons. He suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon in his left leg and the 2012 first-team All-Big Ten guard underwent surgery to repair the injury on Nov. 20. A preseason All-Big Ten selection, Frazier was leading Penn State with 21.7 ppg and 5.0 apg per game and was second with 6.0 rebounds per game through three games. He suffered the injury in the Nittany Lions' fourth game, a Nov. 18 contest vs. Akron in Puerto Rico, leaving the floor at the 14:30 mark of the first half. Frazier, a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection on schedule to graduate in May with a degree in Supply Chain and Information Systems from the Smeal College of Business, is eligible to apply for an NCAA medical Hardship Waiver after the completion of the 2012-13 campaign. He had posted 25 straight double-digit scoring game, 14 of which were 20+ point outings, and had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, scoring 20+ points in nine of his last 13, prior to the Akron game.

LIONS HIT OFFENSIVE & REBOUNDING HIGH VS. DUQUESNE: Penn State shot a season-best 40% from three (8-20) making a season high eight and eclipsed 70 points for the fourth straight game in the win vs. Duquesne. Its 84 points marked the Lions most since posting 104 vs. Gardner-Webb in 2009. Penn State out-rebounded Duquesne 50-28 (+22), posting its most rebounds since logging 52 vs. UMBC in 2009. The Lions 16 offensive boards produced a 23-7 advantage in second chance points. Penn State got a season high 25 points off the bench vs. Duquesne, led by a career-best 15 from Nick Colella on a career-best 5-of-7 from three. D.J. Newbill posted a career high 23 points vs. Duquesne and added 12 rebounds and five assists for his first double-double at Penn State and seventh of his career. Sasa Borovnjak posted double-digit scoring in three straight games, including 14 vs. Duquesne, the best stretch of his career.

GAME NOTES

LIONS RALLY TO GET OT WIN OVER PROVIDENCE/FIRST UNDER CHAMBERS:

Penn State played and won its first overtime game under head coach Patrick Chambers in its second game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off downing Providence 55-52 in OT. Penn State came back from 10 points down in the second half to claim the victory. Tim Frazier scored nine straight points during a key second half stretch. Frazier led Penn State in scoring (19), rebounds (9), assists (7), and steals (4) while playing all 45 minutes (a career most). Chambers improved to 4-0 in overtime games as a head coach (2-0 at BU) when the Lions downed Delaware State (80-76) a month later.

FRAZIER NAMED TO WOODEN TOP 50: Tim Frazier was named to the Wooden Award Men's Preseason Top 50. He is the second Nittany Lion in the last three years to be named to the preseason list joining Talor Battle who was named prior to the 2010-11 season. Frazier was among nine Big Ten players named to the list.

FRAZIER PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN: Senior guard Tim Frazier was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was joined on the preseason team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was also named the preseason POY.

BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

TIM FRAZIER: Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine bests...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State. **JON GRAHAM:** Added four inches to his vertical leap...added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20..increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

ROSS TRAVIS: In the past year, Travis has increased his bench press max from 245 to 310 and his reps on the 185-pound bench from 10 to 22. He increased his leg press max from 325 to 615 and added 2.5 inches to his vertical (31.5). He increased his weight from 203 to 220 while maintaining his body fat and can touch a team-best 16 inches above the rim.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Cut his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent... Improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

CHAMBERS HAS AN EVENTFUL OFF-SEASON: It was an eventful off-season for head coach Patrick Chambers as he and wife, Courtney, welcomed their third child, Caitlin, to the family on March 23, he underwent reconstructive knee surgery on his left leg on May 11 and his father, John "Rube", passed away on June 11 after a long battle with Alzheimers. Chambers underwent arthroplastic surgery, which involved resetting the top of the tibia below the knee to change the angle of the joint. The energetic coach was limited to riding a scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and was on crutches for two months. He began walking short distances without crutches on July 6 and after months of rehab returned to normal mobility in August.

CHAMBERS & THE POST-SEASON: Coach Patrick Chambers missed having a team play in the post-season for the first time in his collegiate coaching career last season and has been a part of the post-season in seven of his eight seasons as a collegiate coach. In his previous five seasons as a member of the Villanova coaching staff and two as head coach at Boston University, all of his teams reached post-season play including six NCAA Tournament appearances and one CBI appearance. Chambers has been a part of 17 NCAA Tournament games, helping Villanova advance to the tournament every year and make four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and reach the 2009 NCAA Final Four. In his first season at BU, he guided the Terriers to their first post-season win since 1959 with a victory in the CBI and the following year led BU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance sonce 2002.

STAFF TIES: Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

GET ON THE FLOOR: Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices and games to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points" during every practice and game and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor, screen assists, shot contests, tap backs, deflections, etc.

PENN STATE ATHLETICS EXCELLS IN FALL SEMESTER: Another superlative fall sports season has boosted Penn State into eighth place in the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup standings. The Nittany Lions are in the Top 10 on the strength of the women's volleyball team's fifth NCAA semifinal or championship match appearance in the past six years and the women's soccer team advancing to the NCAA College Cup championship match. Penn State won five Big Ten Championships this fall in field hockey (regular season and tournament), men's soccer, women's soccer and women's volleyball. Five Penn State coaches were selected Big Ten Coach of the Year, including first-year football coach Bill O'Brien.

21st BIG TEN SEASON

Penn State opened its 21st season of Big Ten Conference play with a road game at Wisconsin (Jan. 3). It marked the fourth straight season Penn State opened the Big Ten with a road game. Penn State posted a 4-14 mark during the Big Ten regular season in 2011-12 to finish in a tie for 11th place. Penn State hast posted a .500 or better record in Big Ten play five times. Penn State hast finished fourth in the Big Ten regular season twice in the last four seasons. Penn State's best Big Ten finish came in 1996 as the Lions went 12-6 to finish second in the conference.

GREAT GRAD RATE

Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent, 24 percent higher than the national average (68%), according to statistical information released by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). The NCAA's annual study of institutions nationwide revealed that Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a GSR of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2002-03 through 2005-06. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (97) and IIlinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park student-athletes was 78 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.

■ Following completion of the fall semester, two Nittany Lions (Kevin Montminy & Tim Frazier) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.5 GPA or higher and seven Lions posted a 3.0 GPA or higher. Montminy posted a 4.0 GPA.

CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State, now embarking on its 18th year, when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

• CVC-Penn State has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 17 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.

• The organization raised a record \$215,000 in 2011-12, eclipsing \$200,000 for the third straight year, and ranks among the top 10 CVC organizations in the nation.

 CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a yearround schedule of seven events, which includes the the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk and State College Brew Expo.

 CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last five years and more than \$225,000 total. Funds are also donated to the American Cancer Society.


