THE GAME: Riding a three-game win streak and its three highest scoring games of the season, Penn State returns from a two-day holiday break to complete a four-game home stand to close out the non-conference season when it faces Duquesne at the BJC. The teams are meeting for the third straight year and Saturday's game marks the beginning of a new four-game home-and-home series. The Dukes posted a 66-59 victory in Pittsburgh last year to end a three-game Penn State win streak in the series. The Lions won, 77-73, in the last meeting in the BJC in 2010, have won eight straight at home in the series (with the last loss coming in 1986) and own a 24-19 lead in the series that began in 1924.

OFFENSE CLICKING

• Penn State has posted its best three shooting percentages (50.9% vs. Army, 49.1% vs. Delaware State & 46.3% vs. New Hampshire), point totals (78, 80, 72) and assist totals (13, 15, 13) of the season in the last three games. The Lions are shooting 48.8% and scoring 76.7 ppg in the last three outings, an increase of nearly 20 ppg over their 58.9 ppg average over the first eight games of the year. PSU has posted five straight games shooting over 40% after shooting under 40% in the first six games of the season and scoring more than 61 points just once (65).

NOTES TO KNOW:

- Penn State has gone 5-2 in the seven games since losing leading scorer and do-everything quard Tim Frazier to a season-ending Achilles injury.
- Penn State brings a three-game win streak, it longest of the year, into Saturday and has won four-straight at home going 6-1 at home on the year.
- Penn State is 4-0 in games decided by 7 points or less on the year and 2-0 in overtime.
- Penn State's 27-point victory over New Hampshire was its largest since downing Gardner-Webb by 47 in 2009.
- Penn State eclipsed 70 points for the third straight game in the win vs. UNH and had four players reach double-figure point totals for the second time on the year.
- UNH's 45 points were a season low for the Wildcats and tied for the second lowest for a PSU opponent under coach Patrick Chambers. UNH's 22.6% shooting was the lowest for a PSU opponent in the last 15 years.
- Penn State committed a season low seven turnovers vs. UNH and held a 23-2 scoring advantage off of turnovers, grabbing eight steals.
- Big Minutes: D.J. Newbill ranks third (35.3) and Jermaine Marshall fourth (34.5) in minutes played in the Big Ten as the pair serve as the primary ball handlers and scorers for Penn State and rarely leave the floor, Marshall playing 42 minutes vs. Delaware State.
- Jermaine Marshall has posted career highs in assists (5 vs. Delaware State) and steals (5 vs. New Hampshire) in his last two games as he continues to excel in his all-around floor game while playing more minutes at point guard.
- Newbill (7th, 15.1 ppg) and Marshall (7th, 15.1 ppg) are one of two sets of teammates to rank in the Top 10 in scoring in the Big Ten. They form the 2nd highest scoring backcourt in the Big Ten posting 30.2 ppg, behind only Michigan's Trey Burke (3rd, 17.4) and Tim Hardaway Jr. (5th, 15.8), 33.2 ppg.
- Sasa Borovnjak posted 11 points vs. New Hampshire to go with his 14 vs. Delaware State for the first back-to-back double-digit scoring games of his career. He is posting 9.3 ppg and 5.8 rpg in the last four outings.
- Freshman Donovon Jack had the best game of his young career posting eight points and three rebounds vs. Delaware State, while shooting 4-of-5 from the floor. He has 14 points in the last two games and is shooting 7-of-10 on the year.
- Ross Travis has led Penn State in rebounding eight times on the year and is fourth in the Big Ten in rebounding (7.5 rpg) and fifth in offensive rebounding (2.5).

LAST TIME OUT

PENN STATE 72, NEW HAMPSHIRE 45 Dec. 23, 2012 • Bryce Jordan Center

Penn State capitalized on its hot shooting and UNH's offensive struggles to jump ahead early and never look back putting together runs of 10-0, 12-0 and 10-0 in the opening minutes to seize a 34-8 lead. UNH hit 1-of-11 in the opening minutes while PSU was shooting at a clip over 60 percent. The Wildcats ended the game hitting just 22.6%, the lowest for a PSU opponent in the last 15 years, while PSU hit 55 percent in the first half and 46 percent for the game. Jermaine Marshall's 15 points led four Lions in double-figures and 10 Lions that scored. He added a career high five steals as Penn State held a 23-2 lead in points of turnovers. No UNH player reached double-figures. The Lions lead 39-14 at the half and built as much as a 34-point second half lead. The 27-point margin of victory marke the largest under coach Patrick Chambers and the most since a 47-point win over Gardner-Webb in 2009.

SCOUTING DUQUESNE: The Dukes are 1-4 on the road this year and are coming off a 91-79 loss at Louisiana Lafayette before the holiday break. Freshman guard Derrick Colter led the Dukes in that game scoring 25 points for the second straight game and leads Duquesne on the year posting 13. 2 ppg. The Dukes are replacing four of their top five scorers from last season, but are still scoring 70.0 ppg under first-year coach Jim Ferry. Six different players have led the team in scoring. The 7-6 Dukes are giving up 71.8 ppg and committing 16.1 turnovers per game but have a +4.4 rebounding margin. DU lost at Georgetown (61-55) and vs. Pittsburgh (66-45) and defeated West Virginia (60-56) in other games vs. major conference teams on the year. Their one road win so far came at Appalachian State (73-72)

LAST TIME VS. DUQUESNE - L, 66-59 in Pittsburgh, Pa.

Penn State committed a season-high 23 turnovers and gave up a 32-29 halftime lead falling at Duquesne 66-59. Penn State saw the Dukes shoot 52 percent in the second half and use a 16-3 run to go from down two, 39-37, at the 16-minute mark to an 11-point lead, 53-42, with 10:18 to play. Penn State would get no closer than five the rest of the way. The Dukes logged 11 steals and scored 22 points off turnovers. Penn State won the rebounding battle, 39-28, but hit just 4-of-16 from three. Tim Frazier posted 15 points and Jermaine Marshall 12 for the Lions. Eric Evans went 9-of-11 at the foul line and scored 15 second half points on his way to a game-high 20 for the Dukes. Penn State led for much of the first half in a game with 10 ties and nine lead changes.

OUTLET PASSES (PLAYERS)

- JERMAINE MARSHALL has led the Lions in scoring in five games on the year. He has 30 career double-digit scoring games and 5 20-point games.
- JERMAINE MARSHALL greatly improved his defense last year and finished second on the team with 32 steals. He leads the team this season with 25 already through 11 games, including a career high five vs. New Hampshire.
- D.J. NEWBILL posted his first career 20-point game with a team high 20 in a loss to Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off. He has scored in double-digits in 10 of 11 games on the year with three 20-point outings, including career-highs of 22 vs. B.C. and Delaware State.
- D.J. NEWBILL trimmed his weight from 225 to 205 in the off-season following his red-shirt campaign after transferring from Southern Mississippi. Newbill missed nearly two months of practice early last season after injuring his left shoulder in practice. He returned to full practice in January and excelled. becoming a team-leader despite not playing.
- ROSS TRAVIS has led the team in rebounding in eight of 11 games. He is fourth in the Big Ten posting 7.5 rpg. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year.
- ROSS TRAVIS posted a career-best 13 rebounds vs. Bucknell and led Penn State in rebounding with 10 in a loss to Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, adding 11 points for his first career double-double. He has three double-digit rebounding games and two double-doubles on the year.
- JON GRAHAM tied a career high with three blocks vs. Penn and leads the team with 11 on the season. He blocked a total of 19 shots last year to lead the team.
- JON GRAHAM equaled a career high with 10 rebounds vs. North Carolina State in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off.
- JON GRAHAM was instrumental in holding Bucknell and Penn post scorers well below average. The Bison's Mike Muscala entered the game averaging 17.7 ppg and posted 10 on 2-of-4 shooting. Penn's Fran Dougherty entered posting 18.6 ppg and posted 7 on 3-of-8.
- JON GRAHAM trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for his sophomore season and added four inches to his vertical. He maintains a team-best 24 reps on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best.
- Former walk-on NICK COLELLA was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He posted a season-best nine points on 3-of-5 from three vs. Army and had two threes for six points vs. Delaware State. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started sixstraight games in the Big Ten.
- Freshman BRANDON TAYLOR arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds, in part due to a plantar fascilitis that kept him inactive for much of the summer. He sculpted his body in the late summer and preseason and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the season.
- BRANDON TAYLOR posted 16 points in his first career start vs. Bucknell and a career best seven rebounds to go with 11 points, all in the first half, in the victory over Penn. He has posted double-digit scoring in five of the last eight games since taking on a larger role in the absence of Frazier. The 6-7 Taylor leads PSU shooting 38.5% (15-39) from three. His 15 threes are second only to Jermaine Marshall's 22.

- Penn State opens ist 21st season in the Big Ten on Jan. 3. The conference leads the nation with six top-20 ranked teams, four in the top 15, and leads in the RPI.
- Pittsburgh transfer guard John Johnson (6-1, Philadelphia, Pa.) arrived on campus Dec. 21 and began practice immediately. He will be eligible to begin play late next December.
- Penn State is 4-0 in games decided by seven points or less on the year, including two overtime wins. The Lions went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year. Last year, the Lions had just one home loss come by more than six points while dropping four Big Ten home contests by six points or less, including games with No. 12 Indiana (88-82) and No. 13 Michigan (71-65).
- Penn State has allowed six opponents to eclipse 70 points on the year, winning two of those games, and having all four losses on the year come to opponents scoring 70+. Penn State is 3-17 under Patrick Chambers when opponents break 70 points.
- Penn State held UNH to 45 points and 22.6% shooting. It was the lowest scoring game for a PSU opponent since holding Purdue to 45 points on Jan. 8 of last year in a 20-point win in the BJC and the lowest shooting % in 15 years.
- Penn State made 28-of-32 free throws (87.5%) in its season opening win vs. St. Francis and 14-of-17 (82.4%) vs. N.C. State
- Penn State has fielded on of the nation's youngest squads the last two years. This year two sophomores and a freshman are in the starting line-up acounting for 34 of 50 starts on the year. Five of eight primary contributors (following the loss of Tim Frazier) are freshmen or sophomores, including

FILLING IN FOR FRAZIER: Since losing Tim Frazier and his 21.7 ppg to injury in the fourth game of the season, Penn State has actually improved its scoring average (58.8 ppg to 66.6 ppg) and shooting percentage (35.3% to 43.6%) over the last seven games. Jermaine Marshall has made the biggest increase since the loss of Frazier improving his scoring average by 7.6 ppg (10.3 to 17.9) and his shooting percentage from 30.6% to 46.9% (22.6% to 45.5% from three) and seeing his assists rise dramatically from 0.7 apg to 2.8 apg. Freshman Brandon Taylor also has increased his scoring from 4.0 ppg to 9.1 ppg (+5.1) and Sasa Borovnjak from 1.5 ppg to 6.1 ppg (+4.6).

MARSHALL EMERGES: Junior Jermaine Marshall led Penn State in scoring in four straight games following the injury to Tim Frazier and emerged as not only one of Penn State's main weapons, scoring 15.1 ppg, but a primary ball handler, sharing duties at the point with D.J. Newbill, and generator of turnovers, leading the team with 25 steals. He logged a career high five assists vs.

two turnovers in the win over Delaware State for his best floor game of the year and followed that with a career high five steals in the win over New Hampshire. He is averaging 17.9 ppg and shooting 47% from the floor, 45% from three and 34-of-46 (74%) from the foul line over the last seven games. Marshall is the Lions' leading active career scorer with 572 points.

LIONS WELCOME TRANSFER JOHNSON: University of Pittsburgh transfer guard John Johnson (6-1, Philadelphia, Pa.) arrived on campus on Dec. 21 and began practice with the team. A sophomore, he will be eligible to begin competing next December at the end of the 2013 fall semester. A three-time PIAA first team pick as well as a New Jersey All-state prep selection, Johnson scored 2,314 points in his prep career and was ranked the No. 69 recruit in the nation by Bob Gibbons. He played in all 39 games, starting two, in his freshman season the Pittsburgh, posting 4.2 ppg and shooting 38.4% from three. He is the fourth player from the Philadelphia area Patrick Chambers has added to the roster.

BOROVNJAK BREAKING OUT IN FINAL CAM-

PAIGN: Senior Sasa Borovnjak, who is in his fourth year in the program but has two years of eligibility remaining after redshirting the 2010-11 campaign with a knee injury, has made the decision to make this his final season of competition for the Nittany Lions and plans to graduate in May.

Since discussing the decision with coach Patrick Chambers, he has played the best basketball of his career. He tied a career high with eight rebounds for the second time in three games vs. Delaware State and added 14 points, one shy of a career high, on a career best 8-of-10 from the foul line for the best statistical game of his career. He followed with 11 points and four boards vs. New Hampshire for the first back-to-back double-digit scoring games of his career. He also had eight points and eight rebounds at La Salle three games earlier. He is averaging 9.3 ppg, 5.8 rpg and shooting 12-of-18 (66.7%) from the floor and 13-of-17 from the foul line in his last four games after averaging 1.7 ppg and 2.4 rpg in his first seven games.

TRAVIS GETS AGGRESSIVE: Ross Travis has asserted himself offensively posting back-to-back double-digit scoring outings for the first time in his career with 12 points at La Salle and 14 vs. Army, one shy of his career high. Travis scored eight of the Lions first 14 points at La Salle, as he started 3-of-4 from the floor, and seven of Penn State's first nine in a 3-for-3 start vs. Army. He posted a career high in field goals (6) at La Salle and career highs in field goal attempts (11) in both games while shooting 11-of-22 (50%) combined. Travis logged his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 boards vs. Army and is averaging nearly a double-double (8.1 ppg & 8.1 ppg) in seven games since Tim Frazier went down with injury.

NEWBILL ON POINT: D.J. Newbill, a natural offguard, has taken over point guard duties since the injury to Tim Frazier in the fourth game of the season. He is logging big minutes at the position playing 35.3 per game to rank third in the Big Ten. Working through growing pains at the position, he has posted eight-straight double-digit scoring games (including two 20-point outings) since taking over and is averaging 15.4 ppg and 4.6 apg since moving to the

TAYLOR LEADING THREE-POINT SHOOTER:

Freshman Brandon Taylor has proven to be an efficient offensive performer early in his career. He led Penn State shooting 58.3 percent (7-12) to average 5.3 ppg in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off and is now leading the team shooting 38.5 percent (15-39) from three and is second hitting 45.3 percent overall. He posted back-to-back double-digit outings vs. Akron and Bucknell (hitting 62.5 percent (6-12 from three) while averaging 13.0 ppg) before running into foul trouble and having his minutes limited in a three-point outing vs. Boston College. Taylor's 14 points vs. Army and 10 vs. New Hampshire gave him five double-digit scoring outings on the year.

COLELLA COMING ON: After a rough start to the season that saw him shoot 5-of-27 from three in the first eight games, senior Nick Colella found his shot going 5-of-8 (62.5%) from the arc to average 7.5 ppg in wins over Army and Delaware State. He played 31 minutes per game in those two outings. He is third on the team with 11 threes on the year.

Penn State employed 14 different starting line-ups on the 2011-12 season, nine in Big Ten play. LIONS DROP CHALLENGE GAME TO B.C.: Penn State dropped its ACC/Big Ten Challenge contest 73-61 to Boston College on Nov. 28 to fall to 5-7 in Challenge games, having won four of the last six. The leagues tied at six wins each in the 14th Challenge, the first ever tie, as the Big Ten retained the Commissioners Cup after having won the last three Challenges. The Big Ten has three Challenge wins while the ACC has won 10 of the 14 Challenges.

FRAZIER SURGERY SUCCESSFUL: Tim Frazier had successful surgery to repair his ruptured left Achilles tendon on Nov. 20. He will be in a cast for about three weeks before moving to a series of boots that will gradually flatten his foot as the tendon stretches. He is expected to have about a six month recovery period and, at the completion of the 2012-13 campaign, can apply for an NCAA Hardship Waiver to return for the 2013-14 season.

WE CAN RELATE: Penn State coach Patrick Chambers can relate to star guard Tim Frazier's recent injury, in fact Frazier is using the exact same motorized scooter Chambers used this summer after he underwent arthroplastic surgery to repair the knee joint on his left leg and was limited to riding the scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and the use of crutches for two months. Chambers has said the insertion of a wedge and six screws to re-align his knee joint was one of the toughest things he's had to deal with and will use the recent experience to help guide Frazier through his rehabilitation. Frazier's sister, Krystal, also suffered a ruptured Achilles, during a standout basketball career at Rice that saw her earn All-Conference USA honors. She returned from the injury to post 10 ppg in her senior season.

FRAZIER REMAINS ACTIVE LEADER: Since his seasonending Achilles injury, Tim Frazier has remained a vocal and active presence on the team attending every practice and shouting instructions and pulling teammates aside during breaks in the action. He is a virtual assistant coach in games, even delivering the pre-game scout in the locker room prior to the win over Delaware State. He has been particularly active in helping to guide D.J. Newbill in his transition to the point guard position. **NEWBILL HITS HIS STRIDE:** D.J. Newbill averaged 14.0 ppg (tied with Tim Frazier for the team lead) and 5.0 rpg while shooting 50 percent (17-34) from the field in the Puerto Rico Tipoff. Newbill played 35 minutes per game in the tournament and added nine assists and four steals. Newbill also handled some point guard duties in the first two games of the tournament before taking over entirely in the third game after the loss of Tim Frazier.

MARSHALL & TAYLOR LEAD LIONS OVER BUCKNELL:

- Freshman Brandon Taylor made his first career start in the win vs. Bucknell and hit 4-of-8 from three for a career high 16 points in just 20 minutes. Taylor's two-straight threes sparked Penn State in the second half vs. Bucknell.
- Penn State followed a 16-point first half on 16% shooting vs. Bucknell by hitting 5-of-6 from three and shooting 65% in the second half to score 44 points, its best offensive half of the season. The Lions hit 14 of their first 18 shots (77%) through the first 14:30 of the half to take a 50-43 lead.
- Jermaine Marshall hit 7-of-11 at the foul line to lead Penn State with 17 points, 15 in the second half, vs. Bucknell. It was his first time leading the Lions in scoring on the year and the fourth time on his career.
- D.J. Newbill posted a career-best seven assists playing 37 minutes at point guard vs.
 Bucknell. He added 10 points and seven rebounds.
- Penn State used combinations of 1-3-1, 2-3 and man-to-man defense to limit Bucknell's Mike Muscala to just four field goal attempts and 10 points. He entered the game scoring 17.7 ppg.
- Penn State posted 14 offensive rebounds vs. Bucknell and allowed just 3.
- Penn State outscored Bucknell 21-15 at the three-point line, the first time this season Penn State has outscored an opponent from the arc.

FRAZIER SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY: Senior guard Tim Frazier, a preseason candidate for both the Wooden and Naismith national player of the year awards, will miss the remainder of the 2012-13 season due to an injury suffered in the Nittany Lions' third game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in Bayamon, Puerto Rico. Frazier had played in every game (101) the last three plus seasons. He suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon in his left leg and the 2012 first-team All-Big Ten guard underwent surgery to repair the injury on Nov. 20. A preseason All-Big Ten selection, Frazier was leading Penn State with 21.7 ppg and 5.0 apg per game and was second with 6.0 rebounds per game through three games. He suffered the injury in the Nittany Lions' fourth game, a Nov. 18 contest vs. Akron in Puerto Rico, leaving the floor at the 14:30 mark of the first half. Frazier, a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection on schedule to graduate in May with a degree in Supply Chain and Information Systems from the Smeal College of Business, is eligible

to apply for an NCAA medical Hardship Waiver after the completion of the 2012-13 campaign. He had posted 25 straight double-digit scoring game, 14 of which were 20+point outings, and had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, scoring 20+points in nine of his last 13, prior to the Akron game.

LIONS RALLY TO GET OT WIN OVER PROVIDENCE/FIRST UNDER CHAMBERS:

Penn State played and won its first overtime game under head coach Patrick Chambers in its second game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off downing Providence 55-52 in OT. Penn State came back from 10 points down in the second half to claim the victory. It was Chambers' third career overtime game as a head coach (2-0 at BU) and he improved to 3-0. The overtime win was the first for Penn State since a 77-73 victory over George Mason in the first round of the 2009 NIT and the Lions' first overtime game since a 79-71 loss at No. 18 Wisconsin in 2010. Tim Frazier scored nine straight points during a key second half stretch in which Penn State went from down four, 35-31, with 7:24 to play to up three, 40-37, with 2:23 left. Frazier led Penn State in scoring (19), rebounds (9), assists (7), and steals (4) while playing all 45 minutes (a career most) of the overtime game.

BIG BACKCOURT: The focus of attention all preseason, the backcourt tandem of Tim Frazier and D.J. Newbill delivered in the season opener combining for 39 points, 11 rebounds, seven assists and three steals in a 65-58 victory, delivering 60% of the team's scoring. The pair were deadly at the foul line combining to go 26-of-28 at the foul stripe on a night when the Lions shot 28-of-32 as a team. Frazier led the Lions with 23 points and six assists. Newbill had 16 points and seven rebounds. Both played 35+ minutes.

FRAZIER CRACKS 1,000/24TH IN CAREER SCORING: With 23 points in Penn State's 72-55 loss to N.C. State in its first game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, Tim Frazier became the 30th 1,000-point scorer in Penn State history. He posted 19 in a second round win over Providence and now has 1,035 career points which is good for 24th place all-time on the scoring charts.

FRAZIER NAMED TO WOODEN TOP 50: Tim Frazier was named to the Wooden Award Men's Preseason Top 50. He is the second Nittany Lion in the last three years to be named to the preseason list joining Talor Battle who was named prior to the 2010-11 season. The Preseason Top 50 was chosen by a poll of national college basketball media members. Frazier was among nine Big Ten players named to the list, which led all conferences. The Wooden Award All American Team, consisting of the nation's top 10 players, will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament.

FRAZIER PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN: Senior guard Tim Frazier was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was joined on the preseason team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was also named the preseason POY.

FRAZIER ON PACE FOR ASSIST RECORD/TOP 5 SCORING, ASSISTS & STEALS: After a Penn State season record 198 assists last year, Tim Frazier is on pace to finish his career among the top five in Nittany Lion history in scoring, assists and steals. He stands sixth all-time in assists (459), needing 142 to eclipse the career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992. He ranks eighth in steals with 143 and stands 24th in scoring with 1.035 points.

BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

TIM FRAZIER: Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine bests...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State. **JON GRAHAM:** Added four inches to his vertical leap...added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20..increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

ROSS TRAVIS: In the past year, Travis has increased his bench press max from 245 to 310 and his reps on the 185-pound bench from 10 to 22. He increased his leg press max from 325 to 615 and added 2.5 inches to his vertical (31.5). He increased his weight from 203 to 220 while maintaining his body fat and can touch a team-best 16 inches above the rim.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Cut his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent... Improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

CHAMBERS & THE POST-SEASON: Coach Patrick Chambers missed having a team play in the post-season for the first time in his collegiate coaching career last season and has been a part of the post-season in seven of his eight seasons as a collegiate coach. In his previous five seasons as a member of the Villanova coaching staff and two as head coach at Boston University, all of his teams reached post-season play including six NCAA Tournament appearances and one CBI appearance. Chambers has been a part of 17 NCAA Tournament games, helping Villanova advance to the tournament every year and make four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and reach the 2009 NCAA Final Four. In his first season at BU, he guided the Terriers to their first post-season win since 1959 with a victory in the CBI and the following year led BU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2002.

117 YEARS OF HOOPS: Penn State embarked on its 117th season of playing basketball in the 2012-13 campaign, having begun play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule this year for the first time since 2006. Penn State has made 12 post-season appearances in the last 24 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT) and a total of 19 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT) overall. Since 2009, Penn State has won the program's first national tournament title (2009 NIT), made the program's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament Championship game (2011) and played in the NCAA Tournament (2011).

STAFF TIES: Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

GET ON THE FLOOR: Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices and games to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points' during every practice and game and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor, screen assists, shot contests, tap backs, deflections, etc.

PENN STATE GREAT TITUS IVORY SUFFERS STROKE; IN MIDST OF 6-12 MONTH RECOVERY:

One of the most beloved players in Penn State history and the emotional leader of Penn State's 2001 NCAA Sweet 16 team, Titus Ivory, suffered a stroke on Oct. 11, 2012 while on a football field supervising workouts with the members of his Hickory Grove Christian High School (Charlotte, N.C.) team. A blood clot in his left common carotid artery, put Ivory in the ICU for three days waiting minute by minute as his family and friends stood nearby awaiting a miracle to happen. His inoperable blood clot remained dormant. With the help of a tremendous medical team and a touch of grace, Titus was given a second chance. Titus is back on his feet, but the father of three, with the help of his wife (Nikki), now begins a 6-12 month journey on the road to recovery. His current mission in helping at risk youth simply exemplifies Titus's mission to share his blessings with those less fortunate.

His family, friends and former teammates have created a crowd sourcing website to help raise funds to support the Ivory family during this time with a goal of raising \$50,000 so that the Ivory family can focus on recovery and not on the medical bills or the financial stress that we have all faced. GREAT GRAD RATE

Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent, 24 percent higher than the national average (68%), according to statistical information released by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). The NCAA's annual study of institutions nationwide revealed that Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a GSR of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2002-03 through 2005-06. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (97) and Illinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park studentathletes was 78 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.

CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State, now embarking on its 18th year, when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

- CVC-Penn State has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 17 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.
- The organization raised over \$200,000 for the thirdstraight year in 2011-12 and has raised more than \$175,000 each of the last six years ranking it among the top 10 CVC organizations in the nation.
- CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a year-round schedule of seven events, which includes the the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk and State College Brew Expo.
- CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last four years and more than \$190,000 total. Funds are also donated directly to the American Cancer Society.



Penn State capitalized on its hot shooting and UNH's offensive struggles to jump ahead early and never look back putting together runs of 10-0, 12-0 and 10-0 in the opening minutes to seize a 34-8 lead. UNH hit 1-of-11 in the opening minutes while PSU was shooting at a clip over 60 percent. The Wildcats ended the game hitting just 22.6%, the lowest for a PSU opponent in the last 15 years, while PSU hit 55 percent in the first half and 46 percent for the game. Jermaine Marshall's 15 points led four Lions in double-figures and 10 Lions that scored. He added a career high five steals as Penn State held a 23-2 lead in points of turnovers. No UNH player reached double-figures. The Lions lead 39-14 at the half and built as much as a 34-point second half lead. The 27-point margin of victory marke the largest under coach Patrick Chambers and the most since a 47-point win over Gardner-Webb in 2009.
