The Book on the Boilermakers

At First Glance: Purdue (13-16-1) continued its spring break swing through Florida with a Tuesday win at UCF and will play an exhibition game vs. the Dutch National Team on Wednesday before kicking off Big Ten play this weekend. The team returns 17 players from its 2013 squad which posted a 21-32 mark, an 8-14 Big Ten mark and Big Ten Tournament second round appearance. Seven position starters and three starting pitchers return, while five newcomers join the roster. Head coach Kim Schuette is in her first season with the Boilermakers after spending the last eight years as head coach at Eastern Illinois.

Last Time Out: The Boilermakers posted a 4-2 record at the Michelle Smith Spring Break Tournament in Clearwater, Fla., last weekend. Purdue topped Central Michigan (2-0), Quinnipiac (10-2), Long Island (3-2) and Green Bay (5-0), and fell to No. 12 Baylor 5-4 and Bryant 6-4. The team won its third game in a row with a 2-1 win at UCF on Tuesday.

Statistically Speaking: Outfielder Andie Varsho (.449) leads the Boilermaker bats with a .449 average, 19 runs, seven doubles and 14 stolen bases. Five other starters are batting .250 or better. Catcher Danielle Fletcher (.354), first baseman Ashley Burkhardt (.323), infielder Tori Chiodo (.292), outfielder Maia Monchek (.265) and outfielder Lindsey Rains (.261) round out the group. Burkhardt has driven in a team-best 22 RBI and boasts eight doubles and five home runs. Fletcher has added four homers and 17 RBI. Chiodo and Rains have scored 12 runs apiece and swiped six and five bases respectively. Catcher Katy McJunkin (.326), second baseman Mary Gooding (.295), shortstop Kristen Hoppman (.265) and outfielder/DP Gabi Brown (.256) are also batting above .250 with limited at-bats. As a team, the Boilers are batting .299 with 13 home runs and 39 stolen bases.

In the circle, the Purdue staff has combined for 173 strikeouts in 195 innings. Sophomore Lilly Fecho (10-8) has done the bulk of the pitching, striking out 119 batters in 111 innings, including 16 complete games. Junior Lexy Moore (1-7) has added 32 Ks in 43 innings, while junior Alex Whittemore has issued 11 Ks in 24 innings, including a complete-game no-hitter. Senior Lauren Grant has struck out 11 batters in 16 innings.

Series Information

UCF (Purdue leads the series 2-0): The Boilermakers have won both previous meetings with the Knights, a 10-2 decision on Feb. 7, 2003 at the Triple Crown Invitational in St. Augustine, Fla., and a 2-1 contest on March 13, 2005 at the Speedline Invitational in Clearwater, Fla.

Penn State (PSU leads the series 21-23-1): The Nittany Lions won the first three meetings in the series which began on April 22, 1995. Purdue won the next five games from 1995 to 1997. PSU countered with nine straight. The team split the next eight games from 2001 to 2004. Penn State took four in a row, but Purdue has won 12 of the last 16 meetings, including eight straight from 2006 to 2010. The teams also had a 0-0 eight inning tie in University Park in 2011. Purdue is 11-4 against PSU in West Lafayette and 9-18-1 in University Park. The teams are 1-1 in neutral contests.

What a Difference a Win Makes ...

- If the Boilermakers top Penn State on Friday...
- They will move to 14-16-1 on the season and 3-5-1 in away contests.
- They will have won their Big Ten opener for the 12th time in program history, including the third time in the last four years.
- It would move the team's record to 83-116-1 all-time in conference road games, including a 33-36-1 record in the last eight plus seasons.
- They will move to 258-171 all-time in the month of March, including a 7-3 mark on March 21.

News About the Nittany Lions

At First Glance: The Penn State Nittany Lions (6-15) play their home and Big Ten opener against the Boilermakers on Friday after spending five weekends on the road. The Nittany Lions return 15 letterwinners, including four starters and four pitchers, from the 2013 team that posted a 16-34 record and finished 11th in the Big Ten. Penn State is coached by Amanda Lehotak, who is in her first year with the team.

Last Time Out: PSU went 1-4 at the Michelle Smith Spring Break Tournament in Clearwater, Fla. last weekend. The Nittany Lions topped Yale (5-0), but fell to Rutgers (4-3), Central Connecticut State (1-0), Wagner (4-2) and No. 12 Baylor (8-1).

Statistically Speaking: Infielder Shelby Miller (.400) leads a group of five starters with averages of .300 or better. Utility player Lexi Knief (.381), pitcher/outfielder Macy Jones (.339), catcher/infielder Karlie Habitz (.322) and catcher/infielder Kasie Hatfield (.305) round out the group. Habitz has driven in 19 RBI and Jones has added 17, while each has launched three home runs. Knief has scored 19 runs and recorded three triples. Hatfield has posted a team-best seven doubles. Jones and outfielder Alyssa Sovereign (.183) have each scored 13 runs. As a team, Penn State is batting .259 with seven home runs and eight stolen bases.

Freshman Marlaina Laubach (4-6) boasts a team-best 2.80 ERA with 33 strikeouts in 55 innings, including five complete games. Sophomore Christy Von Pusch (1-1) has struck out 12 in 27 innings, while junior Marissa Diescher (1-4) and Jones (0-4) have thrown 24 innings apiece. Diescher has issued 21 Ks, while Jones has been credited with 14. The staff is allowing foes to hit at a .329 clip.

In the Record Books

Junior first baseman Ashley Burkhardt tied the school record for home runs in a game with two in Game 2 against Coastal Carolina on Feb. 14. The effort marked the 22nd time a Boilermaker has achieved the feat. Burkhardt becomes the 16th individual to do so.

Senior outfielder Andie Varsho tied the school game record for hits with a 5-for-5 effort against Bryant on March 14. Two other players have recorded five hits in a game: Angi Roembke (5-for-5) vs. Indiana, 4/14/02 and Molly Garst (5-for-6) vs. Troy, 2/26/12. Varsho had four singles, a double and two RBI in the contest.

The Boilermakers posted 17 hits in the contest with Bryant, matching the second highest tally in program history. Purdue teams have posted a record 18 hits in a game six times and have managed 17 hit tallies seven other times last on April 17, 2007.

Climbing the Career Records List

A handful of records are in danger of falling in 2014 as seniors Danielle Fletcher and Andie Varsho already own spots among the career Top 5 and Lindsey Rains is approaching the Top 5 in two categories. Varsho moved into second in career steals (91) with four at the Wilson/DeMarini Classic. She claimed a spot in the Top 5 in hits with 13 at the Michelle Smith Spring Break Tournament, vaulting into third place with 240. Varsho also ranks third in career triples (11).

A Tough Slate

The Boilermakers will face tough foes in 2014, including 10 teams ranked or receiving votes in the preseason Top 25. Purdue will play eight games against the Top 25: No. 5 Michigan twice, No.

6 Alabama, No. 10 Texas, No. 15 Florida State twice, No. 18 Baylor and No. 23 Georgia. The team also will take on vote-getters in Auburn, Houston (twice), and Wisconsin (three times) boosting the tally to 15 games against ranked foes or those receiving votes.

The Boilermakers will face two opponents for the first time in program history, taking on Towson at the Coastal Carolina Kickin' Chicken Classic and Quinnipiac at the USF Invitational.

Boilers Post Win Over #10 Texas

The Boilermakers posted the eighth top 10 victory in program history when they defeated No. 10 Texas 5-4 on Feb. 9 at the Louisiana Classic in Lafayette, La.

The victory was Purdue's first over a Top 10 foe since defeating No. 10 Northwestern on April 18, 2009. The Boilermakers have faced off with 68 Top 10 ranked opponents in the program's 21 seasons.

Burkhardt Named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week

Junior first baseman Ashley Burkhardt was rewarded for her stellar offensive efforts at the Kickin' Chicken Classic as she garnered Big Ten Co-Player of the Week honors, Feb. 18.

Burkhardt, who was named to the Kickin' Chicken Classic all-tournament team, led the Boilermaker bats with a .533 average, a 1.333 slugging percentage and .500 on-base percentage, while also racking up a team-leading 12 RBI and eight runs. The junior had a hit in all five of Purdue's games, including multi-hit efforts in both games against Coastal Carolina and also against Virginia. The Fort Wayne, Ind., native racked up eight hits, including six for extra bases.

Burkhardt had two of the team's four hits in Game 1 vs. Coastal Carolina and came up big in Game 2 with a Purdue game-record tying two home runs, with five RBI and three runs scored, including the game winning RBI and score. Against Virginia, she went 2-for-3 with four RBI and two runs, including the game winner. In Game 1 with Towson, Burkhardt came through with one of Purdue's three hits. The first baseman wrapped up the weekend with a home run, three runs and three RBI in the finale against Towson.

Whittemore Throws No-Hitter vs. Mississippi Valley State

Junior pitcher Alex Whittemore tossed the 16th no-hitter in program history and first since 2010 in a 12-0 victory over Mississippi Valley State on Feb. 23. Whittemore issued four strikeouts in the contest and allowed just one walk. A throwing error accounted for MVSU's only other base runner in the game.

Varsho Dubbed Senior CLASS Award Candidate

Senior outfielder Andie Varsho was named as one of 30 candidates nationally for the Senior CLASS Award, which honors softball student-athletes who excel both on and off the field. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be a senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

A third team Academic All-America honoree in 2013, Varsho boasts a 3.86 in her organizational leadership and supervision major. A two-time Academic All-Big Ten and 2013 Academic All-District honoree, Varsho has her sights on a career in project management or marketing. In the spring of 2013, Varsho was inducted in Mortar Board, a nationwide organization whose members are selected for superior scholarship, dedicated service to the university community and outstanding and constant leadership.

The list of 30 candidates will be narrowed down to 10 finalists midway through the regular season. A ballot will then be distributed to media, coaches and fans for a nationwide vote. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the 2014 NCAA Women's College World Series.

Varsho is the most recent Senior CLASS candidate for Purdue softball, following Molly Garst in 2012 and Liane Horiuchi in 2010.

Varsho Named to USA Softball Player of the Year Watchlist

Senior outfielder Varsho was named as one of the Top 50 selections on the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List in January.

Varsho boasts a career .394 batting average with 112 runs, 102 RBI and a .532 slugging percentage with 51 extra-base hits, including 11 triples, which rank third all-time among Boilermakers. The senior owns a career on-base percentage of .460 and has also swiped 88 bases, a tally which ranks second all-time at Purdue. Defensively, she has compiled a .994 fielding percentage.

In 2013, Varsho garnered first team All-Mideast Region and first team All-Big Ten honors after batting .415, an average that ranked 41st nationally. She also ranked 42nd nationally in stolen bases per game (0.53) and 49th in on-base percentage (.500). The outfielder led the Big Ten in stolen bases (29) and tied the Purdue game record for stolen bases (3) and runs (4). Varsho also excelled in the classroom, earning third team Academic All-America and Academic All-Big Ten honors.

Varsho also was named to the College Sports Madness Preseason All-America fourth team and to the CSM Big Ten Preseason All-Conference first team.

Tournament Honors

Senior Maia Monchek and junior Ashley Burkhardt were named to the all-tournament team at the Louisiana Classic. Burkhardt and senior Andie Varsho garnered all-tournament nods at the Kickin' Chicken Classic. Sophomore pitcher Lilly Fecho and sophomore designated player Mary Gooding earned all-tournament team mention at the Easton Crimson Classic.

In The National Statistics

In the 2013 NCAA softball statistical rankings, the Boilermakers boasted a spot among the Top 50 as a team. Purdue swiped 2.18 stolen bases per game, ranking fourth nationally.

Individually, junior outfielder Andie Varsho ranked 41st in batting average (.415), 42nd in stolen bases per game (0.53) and 49th in on-base percentage (.500). Junior outfielder Lindsey Rains ranked 63rd in stolen bases per game (0.45) and 65th in hit by pitch per game (0.24). Freshman Lilly Fecho ranked 66th in walks allowed per seven innings (1.61) and 72nd in saves (2).

Program Celebrated 20th Season

The Boilermaker softball program played its 20th season in 2013. In 20 years, Purdue has compiled a 620-508-6 record, including 17 .500 or better seasons and 14 30-win campaigns. The Boilermakers posted a .500 or better records for 14 straight seasons from 1999 to 2012, while Purdue squads have reached the 30-win milestone 11 of the last 13 years. Purdue has made two NCAA Regional appearances (2008 and 2009) and taken on ranked foes in 187 games in program lore.

One hundred thirty-seven student-athletes have donned the Old Gold and Black in a game. Purdue softball has featured one All-American, 32 All-Mideast Region and 41 All-Big Ten selections. The Boilermakers have had at least one All-Big Ten honoree each of the last six seasons including Andie Varsho and Maia Monchek in 2013.

Academics also have been a huge part of Purdue softball. The program boasts six Academic All-Americans and 129 Academic All-Big Ten selections. At least four Boilers have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors every year since 1995, including a record 11 in 2013.

For The Record

Pitcher/outfielder Erika Petruzzi tied the school record for stolen bases in a game with three against Hampton on Feb. 8. Outfielder Andie Varsho also reached the feat, swiping three bases against Texas A&M - Corpus Christi on March 2. Ten players have registered a three-steal effort, marking 23 occurrences.

Petruzzi matched the school record for home runs in a game with two in the team's April 12 game at Indiana. The two longball effort was the third of Petruzzi's career and marked the 21st time a Boilermaker player had launched two home runs in a game. Fifteen players are tied for the record. Petruzzi and Katie Mitchell (2006-2009) are the only two to have achieved the feat three times.

Varsho tallied the 10th triple of her Purdue career against North Texas, March 2, moving her into a tie for fourth on the career triples list. Five other players have been credited with 10 triples. With a pair of steals against Indiana, Varsho moved into a tie for fourth on the career stolen bases list with 73, matching Shahara "Skeeter" Nixon (1997-2000). She is now tied with Angi Roembke (2000-03) for third place on the all-time list (76).

The Boilermakers racked up a school record-tying 18 hits and 16 RBI in Game 2 of their April 3 doubleheader with IUPUI. The hits mark had been achieved in five previous contests, while the RBI tally had been posted in three prior games. A 2011 contest with IUPUI also featured both marks. Purdue has posted 18 hits in a game in three consecutive seasons (also vs. Troy in 2012). The team's 18 runs vs. the Jaguars, tie for the second most in program history.

Catcher Danielle Fletcher joined the career top five for home runs, matching Candace Curtis (2006-09)'s tally of 19 with a homer in Game 1 vs. Penn State, April 17.

Fletcher Joins Elite Group with Grand Slam

Catcher Danielle Fletcher launched a grand slam in the team's March 3, 2013, contest against Texas State, marking the second of her career and just the 22nd in program history. Eighteen different players have lifted a grand slam, but just four, including Fletcher, have done so more than once.

On The Honor Roll

Junior outfielder Andie Varsho and sophomore second baseman Ashley Burkhardt were named to the NFCA All-Mideast Region first team. Varsho also garnered first team All-Big Ten accolades, while senior outfielder Maia Monchek was selected to the All-Big Ten second team.

Varsho boasted a team-leading .411 average with a team-best 36 RBI, 32 runs and 16 extra-base hits. The junior reached base via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 45 of 53 games, including a pair of nine-game hitting streaks. The Chili, Wis., native made good on all but one defensive opportunity. She led all conference players in stolen bases (28), while ranking second in hits, sixth in batting average, eighth in triples and ninth in on-base percentage. In Big Ten play, she managed a .361 mark with 16 RBI, 13 runs and 11 steals, which ranked third in the league. Varsho also ranked ninth in walks (16) and 10th in hits (26) during conference play.

Monchek batted .300 on the season with 14 RBI, nine runs and one home run. She started 50 games in left field, making good on all but one defensive opportunity. She reached base via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 41 of 52 games, including a nine-game hitting streak, a six game and a final five game stretch. The San Mateo, Calif., native ranked fifth in the Big Ten in hit by pitches with 11 and also ranked fifth in HBPs in league play with five. In Big Ten play, Monchek posted a .343 average with six RBI, five runs, five walks and five hit by pitches.

Burkhardt batted .320 with a team-best 40 runs, while reaching base in 48 of the team's 55 games, and posting a team-best 16-game hitting streak, the second longest in program history. The sophomore also swiped 20 bases, ranking fifth in the Big Ten, and ranked eighth in triples (2). In conference play, she ranked fourth in steals and ninth in runs (18).

Freshman Lilly Fecho was honored as Big Ten Pitcher of the Week on April 15 for her efforts against Indiana. The accolade was the first of Fecho's career and the first for a Boilermaker hurler since Lexy Moore was honored on April 2, 2012.

Varsho, an organizational leadership and supervision major, garnered third team Academic All-America honors in 2013 after being named to the Academic All-District V first team. The Academic All-America honor was the first for a Boilermaker softball player since 2006. Senior designated player Erika Petruzzi, a human services major, was named as a second team all-district selection.

The pair, along with nine other Boilermakers, also received Academic All-Big Ten honors. Tori Chiodo, Ashley Courtney, Danielle Fletcher, Alyssa Koorsen, Maia Monchek, Lexy Moore, Kristin Morgan, MaryBeth Pavlick and Lindsey Rains also were honored.

Boilermakers in the Coaching Ranks

Several Boilermaker players have turned their love of softball into careers by moving into the coaching ranks. Brooke Baker-Runyon (2004-07), Jesse Jones (2000-03), Kelly Miller (2006-09) and Suzie Rzegocki (2008-2011) are among that group.

Baker-Runyon is the head coach at Andean High School in Merrillville, Ind., and the travel softball general manager at the Bulls/Sox Academy. Jones was named as an assistant coach at SIU-Edwardsville
