THE GAME: After having a four-game win streak snapped and falling to 7-14 all-time in Big Ten openers with a loss at Wisconsin, Penn State returns for two games at the Jordan Center as the spring semester begins Monday. Indiana will be the first opponent. The Hoosiers won three meetings last year, including 75-58 in the Big Ten Tournament in the last meeting and an 88-82 thriller on the strength of 16 threes in the Jordan Center. IU owns a 31-9 lead in the series, but Penn State has won six of the last 10 meetings. Penn State has lost its last eight games vs. ranked teams and is 1-11 vs. ranked squads under Patrick Chambers knocking off No. 22 Illinois in the BJC last year. A victory over No. 5 Purdue in 1998 marks the highest ranked foe ever to fall at the Jordan Center.

NOTES TO KNOW:

- Patrick Chambers posted his first win as a head coach defeating Indiana at the 2009 Puerto Rico Tip-Off while in his first season at Boston University.
- Coach Patrick Chambers named senior Nick Colella and junior Jermaine Marshall to join D.J. Newbill as team captains prior to the Lions' first Big Ten game of the season.
- Penn State's Ross Travis (2nd, 7.7) and IU's Cody Zeller (1st, 8.1) enter Monday's game as the top two rebounders in the Big Ten. Travis had 11 boards at Wisconsin Thursday.
- Jermaine Marshall led Penn State with 19 points at Wisconsin, his 6th time leading the team in scoring on the year. He leads the team with 23 threes and 26 steals.
- Penn State opened its 21st season of Big Ten play with a loss at Wisconsin, the fourth straight season opening conference play on the road. The Lions fell to 7-14 in Big Ten openers. Penn State is 8-12 in its first home Big Ten game of a season, including a 65-45 dispatching of Purdue last season for its first Big Ten win under Patrick Chambers
- Penn State went 6-2 in the eight non-con games after losing do-everything guard Tim Frazier to a season-ending Achilles injury. The Lions 8-4 record in the non-con season equaled their win total from last year (8-5), despite losing Frazier early in the fourth game of the year.
- Penn States four-game win streak to end the non-con season marked its longest in two seasons under coach Patrick Chambers.
- The Lions have won five-straight at home, going 7-1 at home on the year, and posted their four highest scoring games on the season in their last four home games.
- PSU has posted seven straight games shooting over 40% after shooting under 40% in the first six games of the season and scoring more than 61 points just once (65). The Lions are shooting 36.8% from three in the last five games after hitting 25% in their first eight.
- The second of D.J. Newbill's two tomahawk dunks over 6-10 Wisconsin forward Jared Berggren was named the No. 4 play of the day on ESPN Sportscenter's Jan. 3 countdown.
- Nick Colella is a team best 11-of-22 (50%) from three over the last four games. He leads the Lions with 9 charges taken and 44 dives on the year.
- D.J. Newbill is the only Big Ten player to rank in the Top 15 of the conference statistics in scoring (7th), assists (9th) and rebounding (13th).
- Newbill's four 20-point games on the year rank tied for third in the Big Ten and his seven career double-doubles are tied for third-most among active Big Ten players.
- Sasa Borovnjak posted double-digit scoring in three straight games to finish the non-con season, including 14 vs. Duquesne, the best stretch of his career. He is posting 9.8 ppg and 4.7 rpg in the last six outings while shooting 67.6%.
- Big Minutes: D.J. Newbill ranks second (35.5) and Jermaine Marshall fifth (34.1) in minutes played in the Big Ten as the pair serve as the primary ball handlers and scorers.
- Newbill (7th, 15.5 ppg) and Marshall (9th, 14.9 ppg) are one of two sets of teammates to rank in the Top 10 in scoring in the Big Ten, and the 2nd highest scoring backcourt (30.4 ppg), behind Michigan's Trey Burke (3rd, 18.1) and Tim Hardaway Jr. (5th, 16.2), 34.3 ppg.
- Freshman Donovon Jack has played at least 8 minutes in each of the last four games, stretching Penn State's rotation to eight.

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LAST TIME OUT

PENN STATE 51, WISCONSIN 60 Jan. 3, 2013 • Madison, Wisc.

Penn State shot 53 percent in the second half and cut a 14point deficit with 17:38 to play to one, 50-49, with 2:52 to go. Jermaine Marshall led the Lions with 19 points on 9-of-14 while D.J. Newbill added 12 points, 8 rebounds, four assists and two highlight reel dunks on 6-10 Jared Berggren. The Lions outshot the Badgers 46 percent to 38 percent and won the rebounding battle 38-32, but shot just one free throw while seeing Wisconsin hit 13-of-26 at the stripe and take advantage of a 23-7 advantage in fouls called against the teams. PSU committed 15 turnovers giving UW a 17-4 edge in points off turnovers and saw UW grab 13 offensive rebounds. The Lions led by four mid-way through the first half, but suffered a six-minute scoring drought to trail by 11, 29-18, at the half. PSU owned a 33-31 scoring advantage in the second half and used runs of 11-3 and 9-0 to slice UW leads. Marshall's jumper brought PSU within one, but UW out-scored PSU 10-2 in the final 2:30.

SCOUTING INDIANA: The Hoosiers opened Big Ten play with a 69-65 win at lowa and bring a 13-1 mark and No. 5 national ranking into Monday. IU leads the nation scoring 87.9 ppg and with a +28.3 scoring differential. They rank second in the nation in free throws made and attempted and lead the Big Ten with five players averaging 11 ppg or more. Preseason All-American and Player of the Year Cody Zeller leads IU posting 16.6 ppg and the Big Ten with 8.1 rpg. Five Hoosiers have made at least 10 threes, led by Jordan Hulls who is 36-of-70 (51%) from the arc to rank second in the Big Ten and 6-9 Christian Watford (20-46, 43%). Freshman Yogi Ferrell ranks second in the Big Ten posting 5.4 assists per game, while senior Victor Oladipo leads the league with 2.4 steals and shooting 67.3 percent on the year.

LAST TIME VS. INDIANA in the BJC - L, 88-82

Penn State withstood a near Big Ten record barrage of Indiana threes and 66.7% shooting from the arc by the Hoosiers to get within two points three times in the final minute before IU escaped with an 88-82 victory. Indiana hit 16-of-24 from three, one off the Big Ten record, and hit seven straight threes in the first half, but the Lions battled back from double-digit deficits on four occasions to cut the lead to five points or less. The Lions produced their highest scoring total in Big Ten play since 2010 getting 21 points and seven assists from Tim Frazier and 20 points from Jermaine Marshall. Jordan Hulls hit 7-of-9 from three for a career-high 28 and Matt Roth downed 5-of-6 for 22 points. Penn State trailed by five at the half and 84-82 with 21 seconds to play.

OUTLET PASSES (PLAYERS)

- JERMAINE MARSHALL has led the Lions in scoring in six games on the year. He has 31 career double-digit scoring games and 5 20-point games.
- JERMAINE MARSHALL greatly improved his defense last year and finished second on the team with 32 steals. He leads the team this season with 26, including a career high five vs. New Hampshire.
- D.J. NEWBILL posted his first double-double at Penn State with a career high 23 points and 12 rebounds vs. Duquesne. He has scored in double-digits in 12 of 13 games on the year with four 20-point outings and now has seven career double-double (six coming at Southern Miss).
- D.J. NEWBILL trimmed his weight from 225 to 205 in the off-season following his red-shirt campaign after transferring from Southern Mississippi. Newbill missed nearly two months of practice early last season after injuring his left shoulder in practice. He returned to full practice in January and excelled. becoming a team-leader despite not blaving.
- ROSS TRAVIS has led the team in rebounding in nine games. He is secon in the Big Ten posting 7.7 rpg. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year.
- ROSS TRAVIS posted a career-best 13 rebounds vs. Bucknell, 11 at Wisconsin and led Penn State with 10 in a loss to Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, adding 11 points for his first career double-double. He has four double-digit rebounding games and two double-doubles on the year.
- JON GRAHAM tied a career high with three blocks vs. Penn and leads the team with 12 on the season. He blocked a total of 19 shots last year to lead the team.
- JON GRAHAM was instrumental in holding Bucknell and Penn post scorers well below average. The Bison's Mike Muscala entered the game averaging 17.7 ppg and posted 10 on 2-of-4 shooting. Penn's Fran Dougherty entered posting 18.6 ppg and posted 7 on 3-of-8.
- JON GRAHAM trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for his sophomore season and added four inches to his vertical. He maintains a team-best 24 reps on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best
- Former walk-on NICK COLELLA was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He posted a career-best 15 points on 5-of-7 from three vs. Duquesne. He went 11-of-20 from three in the last four non-con games. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started six-straight games in the Big Ten.
- Freshman BRANDON TAYLOR arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds, in part due to a plantar fascilitis that kept him inactive for much of the summer. He sculpted his body in the late summer and preseason and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the season.
- BRANDON TAYLOR posted 16 points in his first career start vs. Bucknell and a career best seven rebounds to go with 11 points, all in the first half, in the victory over Penn. He has posted double-digit scoring in five games since taking on a larger role in the absence of Frazier. The 6-7 Taylor leads PSU shooting 93.5% (19-48) from three, making at least one in each of the last seven games. His 19 threes are second only to Jermaine Marshall's 23.
- Freshman **DONOVON JACK** had the best game of his young career posting eight points and three rebounds vs. Delaware State, while shooting 4-of-5 from the floor. He had 14 points in a two-game stretch and is 8-of-12 from the floor in the last six games.

- Following completion of the fall semester, two Nittany Lions (Kevin Montminy & Tim Frazier) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.5 GPA or higher and seven Lions posted a 3.0 GPA or higher. Montminy posted a 4.0 GPA.
- Penn State's last Big Ten road win came on March 6, 2011 at Minnesota. The Lions have lost their last 10.
- Pittsburgh transfer guard John Johnson (6-1, Philadelphia, Pa.) arrived on campus Dec. 21 and began practice immediately. He will be eligible to begin play late next December.
- Penn State is 4-0 in games decided by seven points or less on the year, including two overtime wins. The Lions went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year. Last year, the Lions had just one home loss come by more than six points while dropping four Big Ten home contests by six points or less, including games with No. 12 Indiana (88-82) and No. 13 Michigan (71-65).
- Penn State has allowed seven opponents to eclipse 70 points on the year, winning three of those games, and having all four losses on the year come to opponents scoring 70+. Penn State is 4-17 under Patrick Chambers when opponents break 70 points.
- Penn State held UNH to 45 points and 22.6% shooting. It was the lowest scoring game for a PSU opponent since holding Purdue to 45 points on Jan. 8 of last year in a 20-point win in the BJC and the lowest shooting % in 15 years.
- Penn State has fielded on of the nation's youngest squads the last two years. This year, two sophomores and a freshman are in the starting line-up acounting for 39 of 60 starts on the year. Five of eight primary contributors (following the loss of Tim Frazier) are freshmen or sophomores, including three of the top four scorers and rebounders. Last year eight of 10 primary contributors were in their first or second season of Division I play.

FILLING IN FOR FRAZIER: Since losing Tim Frazier and his 21.7 ppg to injury in the fourth game, Penn State actually improved its scoring average (58.8 ppg to 68.8 ppg) and shooting percentage (35.3% to 43.5%) over the last eight games of the non-conference season while going 6-2. Jermaine Marshall made the biggest increase since the loss of Frazier improving his scoring by 6.5 ppg (10.3 to 16.8) and his shooting percentage from 30.6% to 44.0% (22.6% to 40.5% from three) and seeing his assists rise dramatically from 0.7 apg to 3.0 apg. Freshman Brandon Taylor also increased his scoring from 4.0 ppg to 9.0 ppg (+5.0) and Sasa Borovnjak from 1.5 ppg to 7.1 ppg (+5.6).

BENCH PRODUCTION: After getting 6.7 ppg from its bench over the first seven games, Penn State's bench produced double-digit scoring in each of the last five non-con games, including season highs of 20 points vs. New Hampshire and 25 vs. Duquesne to average 16.6 ppg over the last five outings, much due to increased production from senior Nick Colella and freshman Donovon Jack

OFFENSE CLICKS WITH FOUR STRAIGHT 70-POINT GAMES TO CLOSE NON-CON: Penn

State posted its four best point (78, 80, 72 & 84) and assist totals (13, 15, 13 & 12) of the season in the last four non-conference games and three of its top for shooting games. The Lions shot 47% and scored 78.5 ppg in the last four non-con outings, an increase of nearly 20 ppg over their 58.9 ppg average over the first eight games of the year. The Lions' streak of four straight games of 70+ points was their longest since posting seven in November and December of 2008 and their 84-point outing vs. Duquesne in the final non-con game was their most since 2009.

THREE-POINT DEFENSE TIGHTENS: Penn State has allowed its last three opponents to shoot just 17-of-69 (24.6%) from three and 33% from the floor overall while posting 59.7 ppg. This after ranking at the bottom of the Big Ten for much of the first part of the season in three-point percentage defense.

MARSHALL EMERGES: Junior Jermaine Marshall has emerged as not only one of Penn State's main weapons, scoring 14.9 ppg, but a primary ball handler, sharing duties at the point with D.J. Newbill, and a generator of turnovers, leading the team with 26 steals (4th in the Big Ten, 2.0 spg). He led Penn State in scoring in four straight games immediately following the injury to Tim Frazier and has led the team in points five times on the year, including 19 on 9-of-14 shooting in the Big Ten opener at Wisconsin. He logged a career high five assists vs. two turnovers in the win over Delaware State for his best floor game of the year and followed that with a career high five steals in the win over New Hampshire. Marshall is the Lions' leading active career scorer (discounting the injured Tim Frazier) with 600 points and three-point shooter with 71 career threes.

NEWBILL ON POINT: D.J. Newbill, a natural offguard, has taken over point guard duties since the injury to Tim Frazier in the fourth game of the season. He is logging big minutes at the position playing 35.5 per game to rank second in the Big Ten. He is the only Big Ten player to rank in the Top 15 of the conference statistics in scoring (7th, 15.5), assists (9th, 3.9) and rebounding (13th, 6.3). Working through growing pains at the position, he has posted 10-straight double-digit scoring games (including three 20-point outings) since taking over and is averaging 4.6 apg with a 1.3 assist-to-turnover ratio since moving to the point. He has led the Lions in scoring four times since Frazier's injury, posting career highs on three occasions including a 23-point. 12-rebound effort vs. Duquesne for his first doubledouble at Penn State and seventh of his career. His four 20-point outings on the year are tied for the third-most in the Big Ten.

BOROVNJAK BREAKING OUT IN FINAL CAM-

PAIGN: Senior Sasa Borovnjak, who is in his fourth year in the program but redshirted the 2010-11 campaign due to a knee injury suffered prior to the season and is eligible for a fifth season of eligibility, has made the decision to make this his final season of of collegiate competition and plans to graduate in May. Since discussing the decision with coach Patrick Chambers, he has played the best basketball of his career. He posted three-straight double-digit scoring games in the final three non-conference out-

- TIM FRAZIER was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier was named a first-team All-Big Ten selection last year after leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4).
- stands 6th on the Penn State career assist charts with 459 after posting a record 198 last year and is 151 assists shy of breaking the all-time career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992.
- scored 208 field goals and had 198 assists to lead the nation being involved in 58.4% of Penn State's field goals last year. Only two other players in Division I were involved in 50% or more of their teams scoring.

ings culminating with 14, one shy of a career high, vs. Duquesne on 7-of-9 shooting. He tied a career high with eight rebounds for the second time in three games vs. Delaware State and added 14 points on a career best 8-of-10 from the foul line for the best statistical game of his career. He followed with 11 points and four boards vs. New Hampshire for the first back-to-back double-digit scoring games of his career. He is averaging 9.8 ppg, 4.7 rpg and shooting 23-of-34 (67.6%) from the floor and 13-of-18 from the foul line in his last six games after averaging 1.7 ppg and 2.4 rpg in his first seven games.

TRAVIS GETS AGGRESSIVE: Ross Travis has staked a claim as one of the top rebounders in the Big Ten posting four double-digit rebounding games on the season, including 11 in the Big Ten opener at Wisconsin, to rank second in the Big Ten posting 7.7 rpg. Having worked hard on his jump shot in the off-season, he asserted himself offensively posting back-to-back double-digit scoring outings for the first time in his career with 12 points at La Salle and 14 vs. Army, one shy of his career high. Travis scored eight of the Lions first 14 points at La Salle, as he started 3-of-4 from the floor, and seven of Penn State's first nine in a 3-for-3 start vs. Army. He posted a career high in field goals (6) at La Salle and career highs in field goal attempts (11) in both games while shooting 11-of-22 (50%) combined. Travis logged his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 boards vs. Army.

TAYLOR LEADING THREE-POINT SHOOTER:

Freshman Brandon Taylor has proven to be an efficient offensive performer early in his career. He led Penn State shooting 58.3 percent (7-12) to average 5.3 ppg in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off and is now leading the team shooting 39.6 percent (19-48) from three and is second hitting 44.2 percent overall. His 19 threes rank second on the team. He posted back-to-back double-digit outings vs. Akron and Bucknell (hitting 62.5 percent (6-12 from three) while averaging 13.0 ppg). Taylor's 14 points vs. Army and 10 vs. New Hampshire gave him five double-digit scoring outings on the year.

CHARGES TAKEN & DIVES: After a rough start to the season that saw him shoot 5-of-27 from three in the first eight games, senior Nick Colella found his shot in the final four non-conference games going a team-best 11-of-20 (55%) from three to average 9.0 ppg. Included in that effort was a career high 15 points on a career-best 5-of-7 from three and a career-best four boards in the win vs. Duquesne. His five threes marked the most by a PSU player on the season. He is now third on the team with 16 threes on the year and has raised his three-point percentage to 32.7% for the season, second only to Brandon Tayor (39%). Among the team leaders in "Attitude Points" he leads the team with nine charges taken and 44 dives on the year.

COLELLA CLOSES NON-CON ON TEAR; LEADS LIONS IN

LIONS WELCOME TRANSFER JOHNSON: University of Pittsburgh transfer guard John Johnson (6-1, Philadelphia, Pa.) arrived on campus on Dec. 21 and began practice with the team. A sophomore, he will be eligible to begin competing next December at the end of the 2013 fall semester. A three-time PIAA first team pick as well as a New Jersey All-state prep selection, Johnson scored 2,314 points in his prep career and was ranked the No. 69 recruit in the nation by Bob Gibbons. He played in all 39 games, starting two, in his freshman season at Pittsburgh, posting 4.2 ppg and shooting 38.4% from three. He is the fourth player from the Philadelphia area Patrick Chambers has added to the roster.

GOING FOR 80:

Penn State posted 80 points vs. Delaware State and 84 vs. Duquesne in a span of three games, marking just the third and fourth games over 80 points under coach Patrick Chambers and the first since posting 82 in a loss to No. 12 Indiana on January 8, 2012. The 84 points in the win over the Dukes marked the most by a Penn State team since scoring 104 in a victory over Gardner-Webb in 2009.

NOTES FROM WISCONSIN LOSS:

- Penn State shot 53% in the second half to close an 11-point halftime deficit to one with 2:52 to play.
- Jermaine Marshall led the Lions with 19 points on 9-of-14 shooting, his sixth time leading PSU in scoring on the year.
- Penn State out-shot UW 46% to 38% and won the rebounding battle 38-32
- Ross Travis posted a game-high 11 rebounds, his fourth double-digit rebounding game of the year.
- · Penn State shot just one free throw in the game and has a 26-1 disadvantage in attempts and 13-0 in free throw makes.
- Penn State committed 15 turnovers (10 in the first half) and UW held a 17-4 advantage in points off turnovers.

NOTES FROM DUQUESNE WIN:

- Penn State shot a season-best 40% from three (8-20) making a season high 8 vs. Duguesne.
- Penn State eclipsed 70 points for the fourth straight game in the win vs. Duquesne and its 84 points marked the Lions most since posting 104 vs. Gardner-Webb in 2009.
- Penn State out-rebounded Duquesne 50-28 (+22), posting its most rebounds since logging 52 vs. UMBC in 2009. The Lions season-high equaling 16 offensive boards produced a 23-7 advantage in second chance points.
- Penn State got a season high 25 points off the bench vs. Duquesne, led by a career-best 15 from Nick Colella on a careerbest 5-of-7 from three.
- D.J. Newbill posted a career high 23 points vs. Duquesne and added 12 rebounds and five assists for his first double-double at Penn State and seventh of his career.
- · Sasa Borovnjak posted double-digit scoring in three straight games, including 14 vs. Duquesne, the best stretch of his career.

- Penn State eclipsed 70 points for the third straight game and had four players reach double-figure point totals for the second time on the year.
- UNH's 45 points were a season low for the Wildcats and tied for the second lowest for a PSU opponent under coach Patrick Chambers. UNH's 22.6% shooting was the lowest for a PSU opponent in the last 15 years.

eight steals.

- Jermaine Marshall posted a career high five steals.
- Sasa Borovnjak posted 11 points vs. New Hampshire for the first back-to-back doubledigit scoring games of his career.

FRAZIER SURGERY SUCCESSFUL: Tim Frazier had successful surgery to repair his ruptured left Achilles tendon on Nov. 20. He will be in a cast for about three weeks before moving to a series of boots that will gradually flatten his foot as the tendon stretches. He is expected to have about a six month recovery period and, at the completion of the 2012-13 campaign, can apply for an NCAA Hardship Waiver to return for the 2013-14 season.

WE CAN RELATE: Penn State coach Patrick Chambers can relate to star guard Tim Frazier's recent injury, in fact Frazier is using the exact same motorized scooter Chambers used this summer after he underwent arthroplastic surgery to repair the knee joint on his left leg and was limited to riding the scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and the use of crutches for two months. Chambers has said the insertion of a wedge and six screws to re-align his knee joint was one of the toughest things he's had to deal with and will use the recent experience to help guide Frazier through his re-habilitation. Frazier's sister, Krystal, also suffered a ruptured Achilles, during a standout basketball career at Rice that saw her earn All-Conference USA honors. She returned from the injury to post 10 ppg in her senior season.

FRAZIER REMAINS ACTIVE LEADER: Since his season-ending Achilles injury, Tim Frazier has remained a vocal and active presence on the team attending every practice and shouting instructions and pulling teammates aside during breaks in the action. He is a virtual assistant coach in games, even delivering the pre-game scout in the locker room prior to the win over Delaware State. He has been particularly active in helping to guide D.J. Newbill in his transition to the point guard position.

FRAZIER SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY: Senior guard Tim Frazier, a preseason candidate for both the Wooden and Naismith national player of the year awards, will miss the remainder of the 2012-13 season due to an injury suffered in the Nittany Lions' third game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in Bayamon, Puerto Rico. Frazier had played in every game (101) the last three plus seasons. He suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon in his left leg and the 2012 first-team All-Big Ten guard underwent surgery to repair the injury on Nov. 20. A preseason All-Big Ten selection, Frazier was leading Penn State with 21.7 ppg and 5.0 apg per game and was second with 6.0 rebounds per game through three games. He suffered the injury in the Nittany Lions' fourth game, a Nov. 18 contest vs. Akron in Puerto Rico, leaving the floor at the 14:30 mark of the first half. Frazier, a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection on schedule to graduate in May with a degree in Supply Chain and Information Systems from the Smeal College of Business, is eligible to apply for an NCAA medical Hardship Waiver after the completion of the 2012-13 campaign. He had posted 25 straight double-digit scoring game, 14 of which were 20+ point outings, and had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, scoring 20+ points in nine of his last 13, prior to the Akron game.

LIONS RALLY TO GET OT WIN OVER PROVIDENCE/FIRST UNDER CHAMBERS:

Penn State played and won its first overtime game under head coach Patrick Chambers in its second game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off downing Providence 55-52 in OT. Penn State came back from 10 points down in the second half to claim the victory. The overtime win was the first for Penn State since a 77-73 victory over George Mason in the first round of the 2009 NIT and the Lions' first overtime game since a 79-71 loss at No. 18 Wisconsin in 2010. Tim Frazier scored nine straight points during a key second half stretch in which Penn State went from down four, 35-31, with 7:24 to play to up three, 40-37, with 2:23 left. Frazier led Penn State in scoring (19), rebounds (9), assists (7), and steals (4) while playing all 45 minutes (a career most) of the overtime game. Chambers improved to 4-0 in overtime games as a head coach (2-0 at BU) when the Lions downed Delaware State (80-76) a month later.

FRAZIER CRACKS 1,000/24TH IN CAREER SCORING: With 23 points in Penn State's 72-55 loss to N.C. State in its first game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, Tim Frazier became the 30th 1,000-point scorer in Penn State history. He posted 19 in a second round win over Providence and now has 1,035 career points which is good for 24th place all-time on the scoring charts.

FRAZIER NAMED TO WOODEN TOP 50: Tim Frazier was named to the Wooden Award Men's Preseason Top 50. He is the second Nittany Lion in the last three years to be named to the preseason list joining Talor Battle who was named prior to the 2010-11 season. The Preseason Top 50 was chosen by a poll of national college basketball media members. Frazier was among nine Big Ten players named to the list, which led all conferences. The Wooden Award All American Team, consisting of the nation's top 10 players, will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament.

FRAZIER PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN: Senior guard Tim Frazier was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was joined on the preseason team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was also named the preseason POY.

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BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

TIM FRAZIER: Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine bests...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State. **JON GRAHAM:** Added four inches to his vertical leap...added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20..increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

ROSS TRAVIS: In the past year, Travis has increased his bench press max from 245 to 310 and his reps on the 185-pound bench from 10 to 22. He increased his leg press max from 325 to 615 and added 2.5 inches to his vertical (31.5). He increased his weight from 203 to 220 while maintaining his body fat and can touch a team-best 16 inches above the rim.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Cut his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent... Improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

CHAMBERS HAS AN EVENTFUL OFF-SEASON: It was an eventful off-season for head coach Patrick Chambers as he and wife, Courtney, welcomed their third child, Caitlin, to the family on March 23, he underwent reconstructive knee surgery on his left leg on May 11 and his father, John "Rube", passed away on June 11 after a long battle with Alzheimers. Chambers underwent arthroplastic surgery, which involved resetting the top of the tibia below the knee to change the angle of the joint. The energetic coach was limited to riding a scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and was on crutches for two months. He began walking short distances without crutches on July 6 and after months of rehab returned to normal mobility in August.

CHAMBERS & THE POST-SEASON: Coach Patrick Chambers missed having a team play in the post-season for the first time in his collegiate coaching career last season and has been a part of the post-season in seven of his eight seasons as a collegiate coach. In his previous five seasons as a member of the Villanova coaching staff and two as head coach at Boston University, all of his teams reached post-season play including six NCAA Tournament appearances and one CBI appearance. Chambers has been a part of 17 NCAA Tournament games, helping Villanova advance to the tournament every year and make four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and reach the 2009 NCAA Final Four. In his first season at BU, he guided the Terriers to their first post-season win since 1959 with a victory in the CBI and the following year led BU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2002.

117 YEARS OF HOOPS: Penn State embarked on its 117th season of playing basketball in the 2012-13 campaign, having begun play in 1897. Penn State has made 12 post-season appearances in the last 24 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT) and a total of 19 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT) overall. Since 2009, Penn State has won the program's first national tournament title (2009 NIT), made the program's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament Championship game (2011) and played in the NCAA Tournament (2011).

STAFF TIES: Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

GET ON THE FLOOR: Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices and games to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points" during every practice and game and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor, screen assists, shot contests, tap backs, deflections, etc.

GREAT GRAD RATE

Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent, 24 percent higher than the national average (68%), according to statistical information released by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). The NCAA's annual study of institutions nationwide revealed that Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a GSR of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2002-03 through 2005-06. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (97) and Illinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park studentathletes was 78 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.

CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State, now embarking on its 18th year, when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

- CVC-Penn State has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 17 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.
- The organization raised over \$200,000 for the thirdstraight year in 2011-12 and has raised more than \$175,000 each of the last six years ranking it among the top 10 CVC organizations in the nation.
- CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a year-round schedule of seven events, which includes the the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk and State College Brew Expo.
- CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last five years and more than \$225,000 total. Funds are also donated directly to the American Cancer Society.

PENN STATE GREAT TITUS IVORY SUFFERS STROKE; IN MIDST OF 6-12 MONTH RECOVERY:

One of the most beloved players in Penn State history and the emotional leader of Penn State's 2001 NCAA Sweet 16 team, Titus Ivory, suffered a stroke on Oct. 11, 2012 while on a football field supervising workouts with the members of his Hickory Grove Christian High School (Charlotte, N.C.) team. A blood clot in his left common carotid artery, put Ivory in the ICU for three days waiting minute by minute as his family and friends stood nearby awaiting a miracle to happen. His inoperable blood clot remained dormant. With the help of a tremendous medical team and a touch of grace, Titus was given a second chance. Titus is back on his feet, but the father of three, with the help of his wife (Nikki), now begins a 6-12 month journey on the road to recovery. His current mission in helping at risk youth simply exemplifies Titus's mission to share his blessings with those less fortunate.



PSU kept it close in the first half trailing by just six after a Marshall three with 4:33 left in the half before going to the locker room down 35-26. N.C. State used a 10-0 run early in the second to open up a 47-30 lead as the Lions had one field goal in the first five minutes of the half. N.C. State led by as many as 25 before PSU closed within 14 late.

Penn State capitalized on its hot shooting and UNH's offensive struggles to jump ahead early and never look back putting together runs of 10-0, 12-0 and 10-0 in the opening minutes to seize a 34-8 lead. UNH hit 1-of-11 in the opening minutes while PSU was shooting at a clip over 60 percent. The Wildcats ended the game hitting just 22.6%, the lowest for a PSU opponent in the last 15 years, while PSU hit 55 percent in the first half and 46 percent for the game. Jermaine Marshall's 15 points led four Lions in double-figures and 10 Lions that scored. He added a career high five steals as Penn State held a 23-2 lead in points of turnovers. No UNH player reached double-figures. The Lions lead 39-14 at the half and built as much as a 34-point second half lead. The 27-point margin of victory marke the largest under coach Patrick Chambers and the most since a 47-point win over Gardner-Webb in 2009.
