THE GAME: Penn State returns to the Jordan Center for Coaches vs. Cancer "Band Together" Day Saturday vs. Nebraska. The Lions will look to end a five-game losing skid, their longest of the season, as they begin a final regular season schedule that features four of six games at home. The Huskers claimed a 70-58 victory in Lincoln in January. It will be Nebraska's first trip to State College since a 60-58 Penn State victory in Rec Hall in December of 1981 and their first as a member of the Big Ten. The series is tied at 2-2, with Penn State holding a 1-0 lead in State College.

CVC "BAND TOGETHER" DAY SATURDAY: The event, which raised more than \$27,000 last year for Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State, is slated for a 1:00 p.m. Saturday tip vs. Nebraska on Feb. 11. It is a bringing together of survivors and their families, fans, Penn State coaches and players and cancer fighting organizations from around the Centre Region. Penn State will donate \$3 from every single game ticket sold and fans can purchase \$3 "Band Together" Rally Towels at the game as well as participate in a silent auction of sports memorabilia. Penn State invites all cancer survivors and their families to use up to four FREE tickets to the game by contacting Nathan Leopard (Nathan.Leopard@cancer.org, 814-234-1023) of the American Cancer Society (ACS). Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 16 years and now sponsors a year-round schedule of seven events to raise funds and awareness.

FAVORABLE FINISH: Penn State will finish the regular season with four of its final six games at home where the Lions are shooting and scoring considerably better on the year. After facing five ranked foes in their last six games and playing seven games vs. teams in the top half of the Big Ten in their first 12 conference games, the Lions will play four teams in the bottom half (three at home) in their final six.

FRAZIER APPROACHING FIRST-EVER 500, 150, 50 SEASON AT PSU:

Tim Frazier led Penn State with 23 points and five assists in a loss at Iowa, Feb. 4, and became just the THIRD Lion ever to eclipse 400 points and 150 assists in a season – joining Talar Battle (635 points & 189 assists in 2009) and Joe Crispin (649 points & 178 assists in 2000). Frazier enters the weekend with 457 points, 158 assists (8th all-time) and 53 steals (9th all-time) on the year – just 43 points shy of becoming the FIRST LION EVER to eclipse 500 points, 150 assists and 50 steals in the same year. He needs to reach 520 points (63 more) to become the FIRST LION EVER to post a top 10 season in scoring, assists and steals in the same year. He is currently THIRD among active career assist leaders in the Big Ten with 404 (Wisconsin's Jordan Taylor leads with 422).

GOING GRAY: Penn State will wear alternate-color gray uniforms for the second time this season Saturday vs. Nebraska. The Lions wore gray for the first time in program history on Jan. 19 at the Jordan Center and promptly posted a 54-52 upset of No. 22/25 Illinois. Penn State students participated in the "Grayout" as over 2,000 filled the Nittany Nation student section wearing gray t-shirts.

STRONG IN THE 2ND: Penn State has shot better than 53% from the floor in the second half of each of its last two games, combining to shoot 53.3%, 12-of-24 from three and average 41.5 points per half in contests at Iowa and at Michigan State.

LAST TIME OUT

Michigan State 77, Penn State 57
Feb. 8 • East Lansing, Mich.

Penn State started 0-8 from the floor and didn't score until a Nick Colella three at the 12:20 mark, but trailed just 9-3 in East Lansing. PSU remained cold shooting just 21% in the first half as an MSU team that shot just 27% and made 10 turnovers took a 33-19 lead at the half. MSU pushed its lead to 22 points early in the second half before the Lions got hot and shot 77% over the first 13 minutes of the half to close within five, 52-47, with 9:18 to play after scoring 10-straight points and following that with 17-5 run. PSU shot 53% in the half, but MSU hit at a 65% clip and reestablished control holding a double-digit lead over the final 6:30. Tim Frazier posted 19 points and six assists for PSU while Draymond Green had 23 points and 12 boards for MSU which dominated the boards, 44-25.

OUTLET PASSES

■ Tim Frazier's 158 assists rank 8th on the PSU season charts (his 2nd top 10 season). He needs 1 to move into 7th and 7 to reach 6th. Frazier is on pace to break the PSU season assist record of 189 set by Talor Battle in 2009. He stands 9th on the Penn State career assist charts (404) and has 7 games of 9+ on the year.

■ Jermaine Marshall has scored in double-digits in four-straight games and 15 on the year, including three 20-point outings. He leads the team with 17 threes in Big Ten play and has 8 double-digit games in Big Ten play.

■ Tim Frazier is one of **THREE PLAYERS IN NCAA DIV. I** averaging 17+ points and 6.0+ assists per game.

■ Tim Frazier has led the team in scoring 19 times and posted a Big Ten LEADING 12 20-point games (4th among Big Six Conference players).

■ Walk-on Nick Colella posted his second double-digit scoring game (11) in Big Ten play at Iowa (2/4) and is averaging 19.1 mpg in Big Ten play, including a career-best 37 at MSU (2/8). He has been given a scholarship for the spring semester.

■ In its four games without Billy Oliver in the lineup, Penn State scored 54 points or less in four-straight games and posted 52.0 ppg while shooting 35% from the floor and 28% from three during that stretch. The Lions had been posting 67.8 ppg in the four games prior.

■ PSU is scoring 69.2 ppg & shooting 42% at home (8-4) on the year, while posting 55 ppg & shooting 34% in 11 games away from home (2-9).

■ Posting 18.3 ppg and 6.3 apg, Tim Frazier is involved in producing at least 30 ppg, nearly half of the Lions' 61.6 ppg average on the year.

■ Tim Frazier has raised his scoring average by 12.0 ppg from last year (6.3 -18.3), the most in the Big Ten this season and 2nd-most since 1996-97.

■ Tim Frazier is 48-53 (90%) at the foul line in his last nine games. Frazier ranks 4th (84.1%) and Cam Woodyard 5th (82.1%) in the Big Ten at the line in Big Ten games.

■ Cam Woodyard led Penn State in scoring in 2 of the last 3 home games, including a career-high 22 points vs. Minnesota (1/15). He is scoring 11.3 ppg and shooting 45.8% from the field and 42.9% from three in home games on the year.

■ 6-8 Forward Billy Oliver missed four games (Jan. 19-31), but returned at Iowa (2/4). He hit a career-best 7-of-11 from three for a career-high 21 points vs. Purdue (1/5) and leads the team with 35 threes, taking 80% of his shots from behind the arc.

■ Penn State has shot 37.5% from three and averaged 8.1 threes per game in wins, while hitting just 26% and 5.4 baskets from the arc in losses, shooting less than 32% from three in 14 of those games.

■ Eight of Penn State's 10 primary contributors are in their first or second season of Division I play.

■ PSU is 6-1 on the year (41-3 the last five years) when holding opponents to less than 60 points, falling for the first time 52-46 to No. 19 Wisconsin. PSU is 1-10 when opponents surpass 70 points & 0-10 when they shoot better than 45%, including 8 Big Ten losses. The Lions are 8-3 when scoring 60+ & 2-12 when posting 60 or less.

■ PSU has won the rebounding battle in 16 games, is 1st in offensive boards, 3rd in overall boards & 3rd in offensive & defensive rebound % in the Big Ten.

■ Matt Glover has a team-high 28 reps on the 185-pound bench, a mark that exceeds the highest posted at the NBA Pre-draft combine since 2000.

SCOUTING NEBRASKA: The Huskers (11-12) bring a three-game losing skid into Saturday after posting 15 first half points on their way to a 62-46 loss to Michigan in Lincoln on Wednesday. Bo Spencer led NU with 13 points in that game and leads the Huskers on the year with 15.3 ppg and 41 threes. Spencer had 19 vs. the Lions in the first meeting this year while Toney McCray had 13, three above his 10.3 ppg averaged which ranks second on the Huskers. NU is 3-9 in the Big Ten and 1-4 in conference road games, winning 79-73 at Iowa. They also have a home victory over Indiana (70-69). The Huskers rank last in the Big Ten in scoring (61.9 ppg) and 11th in field goal percentage (42.8), but lead the conference shooting 75.8% at the foul line.

LAST TIME VS. NU: Penn State shot just 29% in the first half and trailed 34-22 at halftime in Lincoln. Penn State collected nine steals and forced 17 Husker turnovers to help play an even, 36-36, second half despite Nebraska shooting 60% in the half and 55% for the game. Penn State managed just 33% shooting and 3-of-24 from thee and sent the Huskers to the foul line 29 times where they made 19. Tim Frazier led the Lions with 30 points and six rebounds in 40 minutes, the only Lion in double-figures. Bo Spencer posted 19 to lead four Huskers in double-digits.

FRAZIER FANTASTIC VS. NU: Tim Frazier posted career highs of 30 points (on 10-of-16 shooting and 9-of-9 at the foul line) and six steals at Nebraska (1/11) while also logging a season-high 40 "Attitude Points" (dives, deflections, offensive boards, charges taken, hustle plays) in 40 minutes of action. It marked just the 77th 30+ point game in 116 years of Penn State basketball as Frazier became the 40th Penn State player to reach the mark. His six steals tied for the 6th best game total in Penn State history and tied for the second most ever by a Lion vs. a Big Ten team.

COLELLA GETS START: Walk-on Nick Colella made his first career start at Michigan State on Feb. 8 and responded hitting a career-best equaling three threes for nine points in a career-high 37 minutes of action.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES/ROAD CHALLENGE: Penn State logged a season-high 82 points vs. No. 12 Indiana on Jan. 8 at the BJC and is averaging 67.5 ppg, 42% from the floor and 35% from three at home. Penn State has scored more than 70 points in seven of 13 home games. The Lions have struggled offensively away from the BJC averaging just 55 ppg, 35% from the floor and 26% from three in 12 contests while going 2-10. Penn State has scored more than 60 points just twice away from the BJC. (62 at B.C. & 64 at Iowa). The Lions shot 21% from the floor and 2-of-12 from three for 19 first half points in their last road game at MSU (2/8).

TIMES HAVE CHANGED: Penn State graduated players that accounted for 80% of the scoring and nearly 70% of the rebounding from last year's NCAA Tournament team, including five seniors that accounted for 432 career starts and 581 career games played. Among them was all-time leading scorer Talor Battle who posted 2,213 points and led the Lions in scoring each of the past four seasons.

NATION'S BEST FOUR RANKED IN A ROW:

Penn State became the first team in the NCAA this season to play four-straight ranked foes when it fell to Wisconsin, 52-46, on Jan. 31 in the Jordan Center. Penn State went 1-3 during the stretch, with a 54-52 victory over No. 22 Illinois (1/19) at the BJC. It marked the third time since 2005-06 the Lions played four or more ranked opponents in succession. The Lions faced a program-record five-straight ranked foes (and 7 in 8 games) at the beginning of January last season, a string that marked the longest in the Big Ten last year. Penn State went 2-3 in last year's string with wins over No. 18 Michigan State and No. 16 Illinois at the Jordan Center.

HONORING PATERNO: Penn State players will wear a black "JVP" patch on their jerseys for the remainder of the season in honor of legendary Penn State football coach Joseph Vincent Paterno who passed away at the age of 85 on Jan. 22 in State College. The winningest coach in the history of major college football (409), the legendary teacher, mentor and humanitarian had been diagnosed with lung cancer in November. A member of the Penn State coaching staff for 62 seasons, and the Nittany Lions' head football coach since 1966 (nearly 46 years), he was among the first three active coaches to be inducted into the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame, in 2007.

...AND HE'S CLUTCH TOO!: Not only is junior guard Tim Frazier posting statistical numbers matched by very few players in the nation, he now can add "clutch" to his resume after sinking a 12-foot, game-winning floater with eight seconds to play to break a tie game and send Penn State to a 54-52 victory over No. 22/25 Illinois in the Bryce Jordan Center (1/19). Frazier stepped into the role occupied by Talor Battle over the previous four seasons and hit nothing-but-net in the first game-winning attempt of his career.

FRAZIER HAS 12 OVER 20: Tim Frazier has increased his Big Ten LEADING 20-point game total to 12 with 20-point outings in 3 of his last 5 games, including a team-high 21 in the Lions' loss to No. 19 Wisconsin (1/31) and team-high 23 in a loss at Iowa (2/4). Frazier scored 17 of the Lions 23 second half points as Penn State pulled within two vs. Wisconsin. He scored 15 of his 23 points in the second half at Iowa. Frazier's 12 games of 20+ points, SEVEN in 12 Big Ten games, have him matching Talor Battle's pace last year that saw the first-team All-Big Ten guard finish second in the Big Ten with 18 20-point games.

FRAZIER ASSISTS AT RECORD PACE: Tim Frazier is on pace to break the Lions' single-season assist record of 189 set by Talor Battle in 38 games in 2008-09. Frazier's Big Ten leading 6.3 apg is above the PSU record season average of 6.1 set by Freddie Barnes (1992) and Tom Wilkinson (1978). He currently has 158 assists, good for the 8th-best season total. Frazier has posted career-best assist totals in three games this year, posting at least 10 on each occasion, and has logged SEVEN games of 9+ assists. He had a career-best 11 assists vs YSU (11/23). Frazier's 173 assists last year rank as the fifth best season mark in PSU history. He ranks 9th on the PSU career assist chart.

MARSHALL NOW A SOLID 2ND SCORER:

Jermaine Marshall has posted double-figure scoring in four-straight games and has established himself as a consistent scorer, posting 14 double-digit outings and 220 points (12.2 ppg) in his last 18 games. Marshall had posted a total of two double-digit outings and 98 points (2.9 ppg) in the first 34 games of his career. Marshall has posted three 20-point games (including a career-best 22 in a win at Boston College) and made 31 threes, three times hitting a career-high three treys including at Iowa (2/4), on the year. He had six threes in 28 games last year.

MARSHALL EMERGES:

- Redshirt sophomore Jermaine Marshall has emerged as a go-to scoring option for Penn State.
- 15 double-digit scoring outings on the year (8 in the Big Ten), including four-straight. He had one entering the season.
 - Second on the team scoring 10.3 ppg and getting to the foul line 71 times on the year.
 - Posted his third 20-point game of the year with 20 points in an 88-82 loss to No. 12 Indiana (1/8).
 - Posted six-straight double-figure scoring outings, with two 20-point games to close out the non-conference season.
 - Led Penn State with 20 points and a career-high 9 rebounds in a loss to Lafayette (12/7) at the BJC. Hit a career-best 9-of-11 at the foul line in the game.
 - Made first career start vs. Ole Miss (12/4).
 - Scored 15 first half points, including the Lions' last 10 of the



half, on his way to a career-high 22 points and eight rebounds in Penn State's win at Boston College (11/30). Marshall hit 8-of-16 from the floor and a career-best 3-of-6 from three in the game.

WOODYARD GONE WILD: Senior Cammeron Woodyard led Penn State in scoring for the second-straight game posting 17 points on 3-of-4 from three and 6-of-10 from the floor in a victory over No. 22 Illinois (1/19). He had never led the team in scoring in his previous 93 career games. That was on the heels of a career-high 22-point game vs. Minnesota. Woodyard shot 50% from the floor, 41% from three (5-12) and 10-of-10 at the line over the two games.

WOODYARD'S CAREER NIGHT: Senior Cammeron Woodyard posted a career-best 22 points on a career-best 8-of-8 from the foul line and 6-of-14 from the floor in a loss to Minnesota (1/15). Woodyard passed his previous career-best (14 points twice on the year) with 15 points and all eight free throws in the first half of the game.

WOODYARD'S SENIOR SUCCESS: Penn State's lone senior, Cammeron Woodyard, spent his first three seasons playing an average of just 8.7 minutes per game (including a high of 10.4 mpg last year) and never averaged more than the 2.2 ppg he posted in 24 contests as a freshman.

- Fifth in the Big Ten shooting 82.0% at the foul line in conference games.
- Leads the team shooting 81.6% (40-49) from the foul line on the year.

GLOVER EFFECTS GAME: The fifth junior college transfer in the last decade for Penn State, Matt Glover has been a strong presence on the floor despite posting just 3.2 ppg.

- Has led the Lions in rebounding seven times on the year (five in Big Ten play), despite standing 6-4.
- 7-points & team-high 7-rebounds in 36 minutes of 54-52 upset of No. 22 Illinois (1/19).
- Leads the team with 28 reps on the 185-pound bench, a mark that exceeds the highest recorded since 2000 at the NBA Pre-draft Combine (27).
- Second on the team in assists (33) & rebounding (4.4) & third in steals (20).
- Second on team in "Attitude Points" (dives, deflections, tap backs, steals, etc.).
- Often assigned to guard opposing team's best offensive player.
- 8 points, 5 rebounds, 3 assists & 3 steals in 88-82 loss to No. 12 Indiana (1/8).
- Posted a career-best 11 rebounds and 5 assists to go with 2 steals and just one turnover in a victory over Purdue (1/5).
- Has seen spot action at point-guard allowing Tim Frazier to play off the ball.
- Hit his first three three-point attempts of the second half on his way to nine points, all in the second half, vs. Kentucky.

OLIVER MISSING TIME; LEADS LIONS WITH 35 THREES: After missing his first two seasons as a Nittany Lion due to concussions and chronic exercise induced headaches and taking a total of 76 shots last year, his first full healthy season, junior Billy Oliver has seen a much more integral offensive role in his fourth season in the program.

- Missed four games (Jan. 19-31) and returned to the court for the first time at Iowa (2/4). Sick during the Minnesota game, experiencing vomiting at halftime. Returned to practice on Thursday, Feb. 2.
- **Oliver leads the Lions with 35 threes on the year & 103 attempts** and has taken 80% of his shots from behind the arc.
- 16-of-28 (57%) from three in six games prior to going 1-of-8 at Nebraska (1/11).
- Hit 3-of-5 from three vs. No. 12 Indiana.
- Scored a **career-high 21 points** on a career-best 7-of-10 from three in the Lions' victory over Purdue. **His seven threes tied for the second-best single game total in Penn State history.**
- Had 13 points and three blocks in just 20 minutes of win over Mt. St. Mary's (12/18).
- Made a then career-best four threes for 12 points in the Lions' loss at St. Joe's (11/26).
- Hit two clutch threes late in the second half to finish with nine points and a career-high 10 rebounds in PSU's win over LIU (11/16).
- **Entered the season as a career 23.9 percent shooter from three having hit 11-of-46 career three-point attempts.**
- An Academic All-Big Ten honoree who carries over a 3.2 grade-point average in finance in Penn State's Smeal College of Business.

TRAVIS HITTING THE BOARDS:

Freshman Ross Travis has been referred to by coach Patrick Chambers as his "junkyard dog" for the energy level he brings to the court and his willingness to mix it up and sacrifice his body.

- Led team in rebounding in seven games on the year.
- Equaled a career-high with 8 rebounds vs. Minnesota (1/15) & at Ohio State (1/25).
- Posted career highs of 12 points and 8 rebounds vs. Lafayette (12/7).
- Scored all of a then career high point total in the second half vs. Kentucky, hitting a pair of threes on his way to 10 points and eight rebounds.

BOROVNJAK GOES FOR CAREER HIGH:

Redshirt sophomore Sasa Borovnjak is developing into a solid low-post scoring threat for Penn State after missing last season with an ACL injury.

- Shooting a team-high 57 percent from the floor on the year.
- Posted three perfect shooting games from the floor with four or more field goals on the year, the last coming with a 4-for-4 night for eight points in a win over Purdue (1/5).
- Came off the bench to go a perfect 7-of-7 from the floor for a career-high 15 points in a loss to Ole Miss (12/4).
- Posted 10 points on 5-of-5 shooting in a win over Mt. St. Mary's (12/18).
- Tore the ACL in his right knee in Penn State's first pre-season practice of 2010-11.

FRAZIER'S FOUR DOUBLE-DOUBLES: Tim Frazier has posted four double-doubles on the season, **TIED FOR FOURTH MOST IN THE BIG TEN.** Three came with points and assists and one with points and rebounds.

- **His four double-doubles are the most for a Nittany Lion in a season since Jamelle Cornley had four in 2008-09.**
- Has FIVE career double-doubles, one shy of the most ever for a Penn State guard set by Talor Battle with six between 2008-2011.
- Posted double-double No. 4 on the year with a team-high 17 points and career-best equaling 11 rebounds while adding six assists in a win over Cornell (12/21).
- Led Penn State with 26 points and 11 assists vs. Youngstown State (11/23).
- Posted back-to-back double-doubles, 20-point games and career-best assist totals in outings vs. Radford and LIU.
- The first PSU player to post back-to-back double-doubles since Geary Claxton posted three straight in January of 2008.
- Frazier was spectacular in the Lions' win over Long Island (11/16) posting a then career-high 26 points on 9-of-18 shooting and logging a career-best 10 assists.
- Frazier went for 20 points, 10 assists, six rebounds and three steals in the Lions previous victory vs. Radford (11/14).

20th BIG TEN SEASON

Penn State opened its 20th season of Big Ten Conference play with a pair of road games at Michigan (Dec. 29) and at Northwestern (Jan. 1). It marked the second straight season Penn State opened the Big Ten with a pair of road games and the third straight season opening the Big Ten with a road game. Penn State posted a 9-9 mark during the Big Ten regular season last year to finish in a tie for fourth place. The nine wins marked the fifth time Penn State posted a .500 or better record in Big Ten play and tied for Penn State's third best Big Ten record ever. It marked the second time in the last three seasons Penn State finished fourth in the Big Ten regular season. Penn State's best Big Ten finish came in 1996 as the Lions went 12-6 to finish second in the conference.

SEASON SUPERLATIVES

- Posted seventh-straight season opening win a victory over Hartford.
- Posted fourth 3-0 start in the last 12 years and eighth since joining the Big Ten in 1993. The Lions have reached the post-season following each of their previous 3-0 starts since joining the Big Ten.
- Posted fourth Big Ten/ACC Challenge win in last five Challenges and third-straight in a Challenge road game.
- Logged eight non-conference wins surpassing the total of seven posted by last year's NCAA Tournament team.
- Debuted gray third-color uniforms for the first time in program history on Jan. 19 with a defeat of No. 22 Illinois in the Jordan Center.
- Posted the first victory over a ranked opponent in coach Patrick Chambers three-year career on Jan. 19 with a defeat of No. 22 Illinois (54-52) in the Jordan Center.

TEAM NOTES:

LIONS DOWN NO. 22 ILLINI FOR CHAMBERS' FIRST TOP 25 VICTORY:

One game after No. 22 Illinois knocked off No. 6 Ohio State in Champaign, Penn State held the Illini to 34 percent shooting and 18 points below their season scoring average to deliver the first victory over a team ranked in the Top 25 in coach Patrick Chambers' three-year head coaching career. In just his eighth-ever meeting vs. a team ranked in the Top 25 and fourth as Penn State coach, Chambers delivered a 54-52 victory to a boisterous home crowd of more than 2,000 students. Senior Cam Woodyard led the way with 17 points and Tim Frazier added 12 points, nine assists and a game-winning 12-foot floater with eight seconds to play. Chambers joined Jerry Dunn (1996-2003) and John Egli (1955-68) as the only coaches in Penn State history to defeat a ranked team in their first season at the helm. Dunn & Egli both did it in their second game vs. a ranked foe.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST: Penn State's 82 points in an 88-82 loss to No. 12 Indiana on Jan. 8 marked just the fourth 80+ point game vs. a Big Ten opponent for the Lions in the last 10 years and Penn State's highest scoring output in the Big Ten since upsetting No. 7 Michigan State, 85-76, in the Jordan Center on Feb. 2, 2008. It was Penn State's first 80-point game in the Big Ten since posting an 81-70 victory at Northwestern on Feb. 28, 2010.

LIONS THUMP PURDUE FOR CHAMBERS' FIRST BIG TEN WIN:

Penn State posted its most lopsided Big Ten win in six seasons with a 65-45 defeat of Purdue (1/5), gaining the first Big Ten Conference win of the Patrick Chambers era in the Lions first home Big Ten appearance under Chambers. It was Penn State's largest Big Ten victory since downing Northwestern, 83-57, on Jan. 3, 2007 and the largest over Purdue since beating the Boilers, 74-54, at the Jordan Center on Jan. 18, 2006. Penn State held a double-digit lead for more than 24 minutes in the game and led by as many as 22. The Lions held Purdue to a season-low 45 points (previous low 56) and a Lion season opponent low of 31.9% shooting. Billy Oliver posted a career high 21 points on a career-best 7-of-11 (63.6%) from three, while Matt Glover posted career highs of 11 rebounds and five assists and Tim Frazier had 15 points and nine assists.

YOUNG LIONS: Senior Cammeron Woodyard and junior Tim Frazier are the only Lions that have seen more than one season of competition prior to this year as eight major contributors are in their first or second season of Division I ball. Three freshmen and three sophomores are averaging at least 15 minutes per game for Penn State and have made a total of 63 starts. True-freshmen Trey Lewis (5)

and Ross Travis (9) have combined for 14 starts. The Lions have four upperclassmen playing more than nine minutes per game. Among those, Billy Oliver is a junior who sat out his first two years with concussions and migraines and is seeing just his second season of actual competition on the floor and Nick Colella is a junior transfer from Division III Penn State Behrend in his second season with the Lions, but first playing.

BENCH PRODUCTION: The PSU bench has produced ELEVEN games of 20+ points, including 27 vs. Minnesota (1/15), and has out-scored the opponent's bench 16 times. Penn State's bench in averaging 19 ppg. Penn State averaged 6.0 ppg from its bench last year led by 75 points from Billy Oliver. The last time the Lion bench produced better than 20 ppg was in 2007-08 (20.3). Led by four threes and 13 points from freshman Trey Lewis, the Penn State bench posted a season-high 30 points for the second time on the year in its victory over Cornell (12/21). Cam Woodyard's career-high equaling 14 points led Penn State's bench which produced 29 points in the previous game vs. Mount St. Mary's.

D'ING UP: Penn State has held ELEVEN opponents to less than 40 percent shooting on the year and EIGHT to 55 points or less.



WHAT THEY ARE SAYING ABOUT PENN STATE

BOARDIN': Penn State leads the Big Ten posting 13.2 offensive rebounds per game and is third pulling 35.2 boards per game overall. **The Lions have won the rebounding battle in 16 games, going 9-7 in those games.** The Lions posted season highs of 20 offensive boards vs. Lafayette and 18 vs. Kentucky. The 20 offensive boards were the Lions most since posting 20 vs. Maryland in 2010. The Lions have surpassed 40 boards in a game three times on the season. Penn State posted a season-high 47 rebounds vs. Lafayette. It was their highest total since logging 52 rebounds in a win over UMBC in December of 2009. Penn State out-rebounded the Leopards 47-26.

GET PAST 60: Penn State is 8-3 when surpassing 60 points on the year with two of the losses coming in two of the Lions' most well played games of the year, close losses to Mississippi (72-70) and No. 12 Indiana (88-82). Penn State has failed to score more than 60 points in 14 games on the year going 2-12 in those contests with victories over No. 22 Illinois (54-52) and South Florida (53-49). In 12 games away from home, the Lions have scored 60 points just twice, once in Big Ten play (64 pts at Iowa).

FORCING TURNOVERS: Penn State grabbed 11 steals and forced 17 turnovers vs. Minnesota (1/15), the Lions' 13th game of the year with seven or more steals and fifth straight. **Tim Frazier is leading the way with 51 steals on the year and is second in the Big Ten grabbing 2.1 spg.** Frazier had a career-high six steals at Nebraska (1/11) as the Lions forced the Huskers into 17 turnovers.

SHOOTING STRUGGLES: Penn State has shot less than 45% from the floor in 20 games on the year going 7-13 in those contests. Penn State is shooting a combined 35% from the floor and 25% from three in its 15 losses on the year, shooting 30% or less in three games and less than 32% from three in 14. The Lions are shooting 42% from the floor and 37% from three in TEN wins.

SLOW ROAD STARTS: Penn State has scored 22 points or less in the first half of EIGHT away games and shot 30% or less in the first half of EIGHT. For the year, Penn State is shooting 27% from the floor and 17% from three in the first halves of 12 games away from the BJC and being outscored 31.8 to 21.3 by opponents – leading at the half of just three road games (at Duquesne, Northwestern and Indiana). The Lions have shot better than 40% twice (at Duquesne and Indiana) and scored more than 30 first half points just once in an away game this season (32 at Duquesne). The Lions are averaging 55 ppg, 35% shooting and 26% from three in road games on the year.

YOUNG STAFF: Penn State head coach Patrick Chambers turned 41 on Dec. 13 and is the youngest head coach in the Big Ten. No member of the Penn State coaching staff is older than 41 and the average age of Penn State's head coach, associate head coach, two assistants and director of operations is 36.

CHAMBERS ERA BEGINS: Patrick Chambers was introduced as the 12th head coach in Nittany Lion basketball history on Monday, June 6, shortly after the departure of Penn State alumnus and eight-year head coach Ed DeChellis for the Navy head job in late May. Chambers introduction took place in front of more than 300 fans and supporters described a "less an introduction than a passionate call to arms," by local media. Chambers wasted little time connecting with the Penn State fan base far and wide. He ordered a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the Penn State campus distributing t-shirts and his infectious energy. He visited amusement parks, pep rallies,

student groups, classes, threw out the first pitch for the State College Spikes and even donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Paternoville" student campout prior to the clash of Joe Paterno's football team with Alabama. He was seemingly everywhere in his first four months.

CHAMBERS HITS THE GROUND RUNNING: Coach Chambers wasted no time in getting to know his first Penn State team as HE LOGGED 10,500 MILES IN HIS FIRST EIGHT DAYS ON THE JOB traveling from coast-to-coast to visit current Penn State players and incoming freshmen and their families. Chambers traveled from Massachusetts to California, Minnesota to Texas as he met with every player except Sasa Borovnjak who was at home in Serbia.

GET ON THE FLOOR: Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. The Nittany Lions achieved that goal in their very first exhibition game recording 18 "dives," 13 of which came in the second half. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points" during every practice and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor.

Penn State signed one player in the 2011 NCAA Early Signing Period that began Nov. 9

BRANDON TAYLOR

6-8, 235, F, Tabernacle, N.J., Trenton Catholic Academy (N.J.)

Taylor helped lead his AAU squad, Team Philly, to several tournament titles over the summer and saw his stock rise as he diversified his game and excelled in several head-to-head battles with other high Division I recruits. His size and strength on the block as well as his ability to stretch defenses on the perimeter and score off the dribble or from the three-point line were on display. He is described as a "prototypical mismatch problem" with "the physical tools and basketball skills to score both inside and out" by ESPN.com. Dave Telep of ESPN.com added, "Penn State has itself a legitimate scoring option on its way to Happy Valley." Taylor helped Trenton Catholic Academy (N.J.) to a 2010 New Jersey Non-Public B State Championship with a victory over perennial powerhouse St. Anthony and an eventual championship crown in the NJSIAA (all classes) Tournament of Champions as a sophomore. He averaged 11.7 points per game last year as a junior at Trenton Catholic as he helped lead the team to a 19-6 record.

CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

- CVC-Penn State has raised more than \$1.7 million in the last 15 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.
- The organization raised over \$200,000 for the second-straight year in 2010-11 and has raised more than \$175,000 each of the last five years ranking it among the top six CVC organizations in the nation.
- CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a year-round schedule of seven events, which includes the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk, Brewer's Expo and Bestwick Foundation Bike For Life.
- CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last four years and more than \$190,000 total. Funds are also donated directly to the American Cancer Society.

CVC "BAND TOGETHER" DAY FEB. 11: The event, which raised nearly \$27,000 last year, is slated for a 1:00 p.m. Saturday tip vs. Nebraska. It is a bringing together of survivors and their families, fans, Penn State coaches and players and cancer fighting organizations from around the community. Penn State donates \$3 from every single-game ticket sold to the contest.

STAFF TIES: Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

LIONS PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY: All four senior starters from Penn State's 2011 NCAA Tournament team are currently playing professionally in Europe or South America. Penn State currently has 11 former players active in pro leagues around the world, six of which have graduated in the last three years.

GREAT GRAD RATE: Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions have ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. Penn State student-athletes also earned a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2001-02 through 2004-05. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (96) and Illinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with their 90 percent GSR score. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park student-athletes was 79 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.
