

THE GAME: Penn State will look to continue its first winning streak of the season Sunday when New Hampshire comes to town in the third game of a four-game home stand to close out the non-conference season. The game is part of a double-header tilt with the Lady Lions tipping at 1:30 p.m. vs. NJIT. Penn State holds a 3-0 lead in the series with the Wildcats, posting a 70-50 victory in the last meeting in 2008. All of the games in the series have been held in University Park. Patrick Chambers posted a 4-1 mark vs. UNH in five meetings during his time in the America East Conference with Boston University. Penn State is closing out the non-conference season with three weekend games in the span of 21 days at home after starting the season with nine games in 30 days, with four away from the BJC.

NOTES TO KNOW:

- Pittsburgh transfer guard John Johnson (6-1, Philadelphia, Pa.) arrived on campus Friday and will begin practice immediately. He will be eligible to begin play late next December.
- Penn State posted back-to-back wins for the first time on the year with a win vs. Delaware State and has won three-straight at home going 5-1 at home on the year.
- Penn State improved to 2-0 in overtime games on the year with the 80-76 OT win over Delaware State. The Lions are 4-0 in games decided by 7 points or less on the year.
- Penn State has posted season bests in shooting (50.9% vs. Army & 49.1% vs. Delaware State) and points (78 vs. Army and 80 vs. Delaware State) in back-to-back games. The Lions are shooting 50% and scoring 79.0 ppg in the last two outings. PSU has posted four straight games shooting over 40% after shooting under 40% in the first six of the season.
- Penn State has posted season highs in assists in three-straight games posting 11, 13 and 15 respectively, helping to result in its three highest shooting percentages on the season in those games shooting 44%, 50.9% and 49.1%.
- Penn State's 80 points vs. Delaware St. marked just the third game over 80 points under Patrick Chambers and the first since posting 82 in a loss to No. 12 Indiana last January 8.
- Big Minutes: D.J. Newbill ranks second (35.6) and Jermaine Marshall third (35.4) in minutes played in the Big Ten as the pair serve as the primary ball handlers and scorers for Penn State and rarely leave the floor, Marshall playing 42 minutes last game.
- D.J. Newbill led the Lions in scoring for the third time this season and for the second straight game equaling a career high with 22 in the win vs. Delaware State. He is shooting 53.6% while scoring 20.5 ppg in his last two outings, taking just four threes.
- Jermaine Marshall posted a career high five assists vs. Delaware State to go with seven rebounds and 15 points in his best all-around game of the year.
- Newbill (7th, 15.6 ppg) and Marshall (8th, 15.1 ppg) are one of two sets of teammates
 to rank in the Top 10 in scoring in the Big Ten, both are posting 16.9 ppg since the injury to
 Tim Frazier. They form the 2nd highest scoring backcourt in the Big Ten posting 30.7 ppg,
 behind only Michigan's Trey Burke (3rd, 18.0) and Tim Hardaway Jr. (5th, 15.7), 33.7 ppg.
- Sasa Borovnjak's 14 points and 8 rebounds vs. Delaware State marked the best statistical game of his career. He is posting 8.7 ppg and 6.3 rpg in the last three outings.
- Freshman Donovon Jack had the best game of his young career posting eight points and three rebounds vs. Delaware State, while shooting 4-of-5 from the floor.
- Ross Travis has led Penn State in rebounding seven times on the year and is second in the Big Ten in rebounding (7.6 rpg) and fourth in offensive rebounding (2.7).
- D.J. Newbill has scored in double-digits in 9-of-10 games on the year and is scoring 16.9 ppg since taking over point guard duties for Tim Frazier. A natural off-guard, Newbill has taken over the bulk of point guard duties while Jermaine Marshall has also seen time at the point and the Lions have turned to Ross Travis to bring the ball up the court on occasion.
- Freshman Brandon Taylor made his first career start in the win vs. Bucknell, posting 16 points. He posted double-digit scoring in four of the last seven games since taking on a larger role in the absence of Frazier. Taylor leads PSU shooting 38% (13-34) from three. His 13 threes are second only to Jermaine Marshall's 19.

PENN STATE 80, DELAWARE STATE 76 OT Dec. 15, 2012 • Bryce Jordan Center

Penn State came out hot, jumped to an 18-point first half lead and then survived a gut check as Delaware sent the game to overtime and posted its first lead of the game with 3:06 left in the extra period. Jermaine Marshall and D.J. Newbill responded, Marshall hitting a big three with the Lions trailing by three with 1:07 remaining to tie the game and Newbill driving for the game winning layup with 30 seconds to play. Newbill led the Lions with a career high tying 22 points while Marshall had 15 points, seven rebounds and five assists in 42 minutes. Sasa Borovniak had his best game of the season with 14 points and a career high tying eight rebounds. The Lions shot 59% in the first half to lead 37-29 at the break, but saw the Hornets shooting 50% in the second half and tie the game for the first time on a Tyshawn Bell three with 12 seconds to play. Casey Walker led DSU with 24 points, including five threes. Penn State shot 49% for the game and had a season high 15 assists.

SCOUTING NEW HAMPSHIRE: The Wildcats (4-6) are coming off a close, 61-59, loss at Boston College on Sunday. B.C. downed the Lions, 73-61, at the Jordan Center earlier this year. UNH was led by Ferg Myck who had 21 points in the game. The 6-6, senior forward leads UNH posting 15.7 ppg and shooting 37.8% (17-45) from three on the year. He is one of four Wildcats averaging doublefigures and his 7.4 rpg are second only to 6-10 center Chris Pelcher who posts 7.6 rpg while posting 12.4 ppg and shooting 60.7% from the floor. The Wildcats are 1-5 away from home on the year, having posted a wint at Dartmouth (72-58). They also lost, 61-53, at UConn ealier this season. They are holding opponents to 62.9 ppg, 37.2% shooting overall and just 22% from three on the season. UNH posted a 13-16 mark last year and was 7-9 in the America Fast

- TIM FRAZIER was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier was named a firstteam All-Big Ten selection last year, the sixth Lion to earn first-team selection, after leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4).
- TIM FRAZIFR stands 6th on the Penn State career assist charts with 459. He posted a Penn State record 198 last year and is now 151 assists shy of breaking the all-time career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992.
- TIM FRAZIER scored 208 field goals and had 198 assists to lead the nation being involved in 58.4% of Penn State's field goals last year. Only two other players in Division I were involved in 50% or more of their teams scoring.
- TIM FRAZIER was the ONLY player in NCAA Division I to post at least 17 points and 6 rebounds a game last year.
- TIM FRAZIER had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, including 15 of 19 games vs. Big Ten op-ponents, and scored 20 or more points in 9 of his last 13
- JERMAINE MARSHALL has led the Lions in scoring in four games on the year. He has 29 career double-digit scoring games and 5 20-point games. He led the the team with 43 threes (28 in Big Ten) last year and had 13 double-digit scoring games in Big Ten play to average 11.8 ppg.
- JERMAINE MARSHALL greatly improved his defense last year and finished second on the team with 32 steam He leads the team this season with 20 already through 10
- D.J. NEWBILL posted his first career 20-point game with a team high 20 in a loss to Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off. He has scored in double-digits in nine of 10 games on the year with three 20-point outings, including career-highs of 22 vs. B.C. and Delaware State.
- D.J. NEWBILL trimmed his weight from 225 to 205 in the off-season following his red-shirt campaign after transfer-ring from Southern Mississippi. Newbill missed nearly two months of practice early last season after injuring his left shoulder in practice. He returned to full practice in January and excelled, becoming a team-leader despite not playing.
- ROSS TRAVIS has led the team in rebounding in seven of 10 games. He is second in the Big Ten posting 7.6 rpg. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year, five in Big Ten play.
- ROSS TRAVIS posted a career-best 13 rebounds vs. Bucknell and led Penn State in rebounding with 10 in a loss to Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, adding 11 points for his first career double-double. He has three double-digit rebounding games and two double-doubles on the year.
- JON GRAHAM tied a career high blocking three shots vs. Penn and leads the team with 11 on the season, blocking two or more in five games. He blocked a total of 19 shots last year to lead the team.
- JON GRAHAM equaled a career high with 10 rebounds vs. North Carolina State in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off.
- JON GRAHAM was instrumental in holding Bucknell and Penn post scorers well below average. The Bison's Mike Muscala entered the game averaging 17.7 ppg and posted 10 on 2-of-4 shooting. Penn's Fran Dougherty entered posting 18.6 ppg and posted 7 on 3-of-8.
- JON GRAHAM trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for his sophomore season and added four inches to his vertical. He maintains a team-hest 24 rens on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best. He missed five games in November and December last year with illness before coming on late in the year.
- Former walk-on NICK COLELLA was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He posted a season-best nine points on 3-of-5 from three vs. Army and had two threes for six points vs. Delaware State. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started sixstraight games in the Big Ten.
- Freshman BRANDON TAYLOR arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds, in part due to a plantar fasciitis that kept him inactive for much of the summer. He sculpted his body in the late summer and preseason and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the season.
- BRANDON TAYLOR posted 16 points in his first career start vs. Bucknell and a career best seven rebounds to go with 11 points, all in the first half, in the victory over Penn.

LIONS WELCOME TRANSFER JOHNSON: University of Pittsburgh transfer guard John Johnson (6-1, Philadelphia, Pa.) arrived on campus on Dec. 21 and began practice with the team, A sophomore, he will be eligible to begin competing next December at the end of the 2013 fall semester. A three-time PIAA first team pick as well as a New Jersey All-state prep selection, Johnson scored 2,314 points in his prep career and was ranked the No. 69 recruit in the nation by Bob Gibbons. He played in all 39 games, starting two, in his freshman season at Pittsburgh, posting 4.2 ppg and shooting 38.4% from three. He is the fourth player from the Philadelphia area Patrick Chambers has

added to the roster

MARSHALL EMERGES: Junior Jermaine Marshall led Penn State in scoring in four straight games following the injury to Tim Frazier and emerged as not only one of Penn State's main weapons, scoring 15.1 ppg, but a primary ball handler as he shares duties at the point with D.J. Newbill. He logged a career high five assists vs. two turnovers in the win over Delaware State for his best floor game of the year. He is averaging 18.3 ppg and shooting 46% from the floor, 43% from three and 34-of-46 (74%) from the foul line over the last six games. Marshall is the Lions' leading active career scorer with 557 points.

BOROVNJAK BREAKS OUT: Senior Sasa Borovnjak tied a career high with eight rebounds for the second time in three games vs. Delaware State and added 14 points, one shy of a career high, on a career best 8-of-10 from the foul line for the best statistical game of his career. He also had eight points and eight rebounds at La Salle two games earlier. He is averaging 8.7 ppg, 6.3 rpg and shooting 8-of-11 (72%) from the floor and 10-of-13 from the foul line in his last three games after averaging 1.7 ppg and 2.4 rpg in his first seven games.

TRAVIS GETS AGGRESSIVE: Ross Travis has asserted himself offensively posting back-to-back double-digit scoring outings for the first time in his career with 12 points at La Salle and 14 vs. Army, one shy of his career high. Travis scored eight of the Lions first 14 points at La Salle, as he started 3-of-4 from the floor, and seven of Penn State's first nine in a 3-for-3 start vs. Army. He posted a career high in field goals (6) at La Salle and career highs in field goal attempts (11) in both games while shooting 11-of-22 (50%) combined. Travis logged his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 boards vs. Army and is averaging nearly a double-double (9.1 ppg & 8.7 rpg) in seven games since Tim Frazier went down with injury.

NEWBILL ON POINT: D.J. Newbill, a natural offguard, has taken over point guard duties since the injury to Tim Frazier in the fourth game of the season. He is logging big minutes at the position playing 35.4 per game to rank second in the Big Ten. Working through growing pains at the position, he has posted seven-straight double-digit scoring games (including two 20-point outings) since taking over and is averaging 16.9 ppg and 4.8 apg since moving to the point. The bulk of his turnovers have come in the first half as he adjusts to running the offense. He had six in the first half vs. B.C. and none in the second. On the year he has 27 first half turnovers and just nine second half.

OUTLET PASSES

■ Penn State is 4-0 in games decided by seven points or less on the year, including two overtime wins. The Lions went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year. The Lions had just one home loss come by more than six points while dropping four Big Ten home contests by six points or less, including games with No. 12 Indiana (88-82) and No. 13 Michigan (71-65).

TAYLOR LEADING THREE-POINT SHOOTER:

Freshman Brandon Taylor has proven to be an efficient offensive performer early in his career. He led Penn State shooting 58.3 percent (7-12) to average 5.3 ppg in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off and is now leading the team shooting 38.2 percent (13-34) from three and is second hitting 45.5 percent overall. He posted back-to-back double-digit outings vs. Akron and Bucknell (hitting 62.5 percent (6-12 from three) while averaging 13.0 ppg) before running into foul trouble and having his minutes limited in a three-point outing vs. Boston College. Taylor's 14 points vs. Army gave him four double-digit scoring outings on the year.

COLELLA COMING ON: After a rough start to the season that saw him shoot 5-of-27 from three in the first eight games, senior Nick Colella has found his shot in the last two games going 5-of-8 (62.5%) from the arc to average 7.5 ppg in wins over Army and Delaware State. He has played 31 minutes per game in those two outings.

Penn State employed 14 different starting line-ups on the 2011-12 season, nine in Big Ten play.

FRAZIER SURGERY SUCCESSFUL: Tim Frazier had successful surgery to repair his ruptured left Achilles tendon on Nov. 20. He will be in a cast for about three weeks before moving to a series of boots that will gradually flatten his foot as the tendon stretches. He is expected to have about a six month recovery period and, at the completion of the 2012-13 campaign, can apply for an NCAA Hardship Waiver to return for the 2013-14 season.

WE CAN RELATE: Penn State coach Patrick Chambers can relate to star guard Tim Frazier's recent injury, in fact Frazier is using the exact same motorized scooter Chambers used this summer after he underwent arthroplastic surgery to repair the knee joint on his left leg and was limited to riding the scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and the use of crutches for two months. Chambers has said the insertion of a wedge and six screws to re-align his knee joint was one of the toughest things he's had to deal with and will use the recent experience to help guide Frazier through his rehabilitation. Frazier's sister, Krystal, also suffered a ruptured Achilles, during a standout basketball career at Rice that saw her earn All-Conference USA honors.

FRAZIER REMAINS ACTIVE LEADER: Since his seasonending Achilles injury, Tim Frazier has remained a vocal and active presence on the team attending every practice and shouting instructions and pulling teammates aside during breaks in the action. He is a virtual assistant coach in games, even delivering the pre-game scout in the locker room prior to the win over Delaware State. He has been particularly active in helping to guide D.J. Newbill in his transition to the point guard position.

NEWBILL HITS HIS STRIDE: D.J. Newbill averaged 14.0 ppg (tied with Tim Frazier for the team lead) and 5.0 rpg while shooting 50 percent (17-34) from the field in the Puerto Rico Tipoff. Newbill played 35 minutes per game in the tournament and added nine assists and four steals. Newbill also handled some point guard duties in the first two games of the tournament before taking over entirely in the third game after the loss of Tim Frazier.

NOTES FROM THE BUCKNELL WIN:

- Freshman Brandon Taylor made his first career start in the win vs. Bucknell and hit 4-of-8 from three for a career high 16 points in just 20 minutes. Taylor's two-straight threes sparked Penn State in the second half vs. Bucknell.
- Penn State followed a 16-point first half on 16% shooting vs. Bucknell by hitting 5-of-6 from three and shooting 65% in the second half to score 44 points, its best offensive half of the season. The Lions hit 14 of their first 18 shots (77%) through the first 14:30 of the half to take a 50-43 lead.
- Jermaine Marshall hit 7-of-11 at the foul line to lead Penn State with 17 points, 15 in the second half, vs. Bucknell. It was his first time leading the Lions in scoring on the year and the fourth time on his career.
- Marshall led Penn State with four steals.
- Ross Travis led Penn State in rebounding for the third time on the year with eight vs. Bucknell.
- D.J. Newbill posted a career-best seven assists playing 37 minutes at point guard vs.
 Bucknell. He added 10 points and seven rebounds.
- Penn State used combinations of 1-3-1, 2-3 and man-to-man defense to limit Bucknell's Mike Muscala to just four field goal attempts and 10 points. He entered the game scoring 17.7 ppg.
- Penn State posted 14 offensive rebounds vs. Bucknell and allowed just 3.
- Penn State outscored Bucknell 21-15 at the three-point line, the first time this season
 Penn State has outscored an opponent from the arc.

FRAZIER SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY: Senior guard Tim Frazier, a preseason candidate for both the Wooden and Naismith national player of the year awards, will miss the remainder of the 2012-13 season due to an injury suffered in the Nittany Lions' third game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in Bayamon, Puerto Rico. Frazier had played in every game (101) the last three plus seasons. He suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon in his left leg and the 2012 first-team All-Big Ten guard underwent surgery to repair the injury on Nov. 20. A preseason All-Big Ten selection, Frazier was leading Penn State with 21.7 ppg and 5.0 apg per game and was second with 6.0 rebounds per game through three games. He suffered the injury in the Nittany Lions' fourth game, a Nov. 18 contest vs. Akron in Puerto Rico, leaving the floor at the 14:30 mark of the first half. Frazier, a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection on schedule to graduate in May with a degree in Supply Chain and Information Systems from the Smeal College of Business, is eligible to apply for an NCAA medical Hardship Waiver after the completion of the 2012-13 campaign. He had posted 25 straight double-digit scoring game, 14 of which were 20+ point outings, and had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, scoring 20+ points in nine of his last 13, prior to the Akron game.

LIONS RALLY TO GET OT WIN OVER PROVIDENCE/FIRST UNDER CHAMBERS:

Penn State played and won its first overtime game under head coach Patrick Chambers in its second game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off downing Providence 55-52 in OT. Penn State came back from 10 points down in the second half to claim the victory. It was Chambers' third career overtime game as a head coach (2-0 at BU) and he improved to 3-0. The overtime win was the first for Penn State since a 77-73 victory over George Mason in the first round of the 2009 NIT and the Lions' first overtime game since a 79-71 loss at No. 18 Wisconsin in 2010. Tim Frazier scored nine straight points during a key second half stretch in which Penn State went from down four, 35-31, with 7:24 to play to up three, 40-37, with 2:23 left. Frazier led Penn State in scoring (19), rebounds (9), assists (7), and steals (4) while playing all 45 minutes (a career most) of the overtime game.

BIG BACKCOURT: The focus of attention all preseason, the backcourt tandem of Tim Frazier and D.J. Newbill delivered in the season opener combining for 39 points, 11 rebounds, seven assists and three steals in a 65-58 victory, delivering 60% of the team's scoring. The pair were deadly at the foul line combining to go 26-of-28 at the foul stripe on a night when the Lions shot 28-of-32 as a team. Frazier led the Lions with 23 points and six assists, and, after three-straight SFU threes gave them a 31-30 lead, he took over posting a steal and five points in under a minute to regain a Penn State advantage. Newbill had 16 points and seven rebounds. Both played 35 minutes or more.

FRAZIER CRACKS 1,000/24TH IN CAREER SCORING: With 23 points in Penn State's 72-55 loss to N.C. State in its first game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, Tim Frazier became the 30th 1,000-point scorer in Penn State history. He posted 19 in a second round win over Providence and now has 1,035 career points which is good for 24th place all-time on the scoring charts.

FRAZIER NAMED TO WOODEN TOP 50: Tim Frazier was named to the Wooden Award Men's Preseason Top 50. He is the second Nittany Lion in the last three years to be named to the preseason list joining Talor Battle who was named prior to the 2010-11 season. The Preseason Top 50 was chosen by a poll of national college basketball media members. Frazier was among nine Big Ten players named to the list, which led all conferences. The Wooden Award All American Team, consisting of the nation's top 10 players, will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament.

FRAZIER PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN: Senior guard Tim Frazier was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was joined on the preseason team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was also named the preseason POY.

FRAZIER ON PACE FOR ASSIST RECORD/TOP 5 SCORING, ASSISTS & STEALS: After a Penn State season record 198 assists last year, Tim Frazier is on pace to finish his career among the top five in Nittany Lion history in scoring, assists and steals. He stands sixth all-time in assists (459), needing 142 to eclipse the career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992. He ranks eighth in steals with 143 and stands 24th in scoring with 1.035 points.

BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

TIM FRAZIER: Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine bests...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State. **JON GRAHAM:** Added four inches to his vertical leap...added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20..increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

ROSS TRAVIS: In the past year, Travis has increased his bench press max from 245 to 310 and his reps on the 185-pound bench from 10 to 22. He increased his leg press max from 325 to 615 and added 2.5 inches to his vertical (31.5). He increased his weight from 203 to 220 while maintaining his body fat and can touch a team-best 16 inches above the rim.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Cut his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent... Improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

CHAMBERS & THE POST-SEASON: Coach Patrick Chambers missed having a team play in the post-season for the first time in his collegiate coaching career last season and has been a part of the post-season in seven of his eight seasons as a collegiate coach. In his previous five seasons as a member of the Villanova coaching staff and two as head coach at Boston University, all of his teams reached post-season play including six NCAA Tournament appearances and one CBI appearance. Chambers has been a part of 17 NCAA Tournament games, helping Villanova advance to the tournament every year and make four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and reach the 2009 NCAA Final Four. In his first season at BU, he guided the Terriers to their first post-season win since 1959 with a victory in the CBI and the following year led BU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2002.



117 YEARS OF HOOPS: Penn State embarked on its 117th season of playing basketball in the 2012-13 campaign, having begun play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule this year for the first time since 2006. Penn State has made 12 post-season appearances in the last 24 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT) and a total of 19 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT) overall. Since 2009, Penn State has won the program's first national tournament title (2009 NIT), made the program's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament Championship game (2011) and played in the NCAA Tournament (2011).

STAFF TIES: Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

GET ON THE FLOOR: Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices and games to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points' during every practice and game and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor, screen assists, shot contests, tap backs, deflections, etc.

PENN STATE GREAT TITUS IVORY SUFFERS STROKE; IN MIDST OF 6-12 MONTH RECOVERY:

One of the most beloved players in Penn State history and the emotional leader of Penn State's 2001 NCAA Sweet 16 team, Titus Ivory, suffered a stroke on Oct. 11, 2012 while on a football field supervising workouts with the members of his Hickory Grove Christian High School (Charlotte, N.C.) team. A blood clot in his left common carotid artery, put Ivory in the ICU for three days waiting minute by minute as his family and friends stood nearby awaiting a miracle to happen. His inoperable blood clot remained dormant. With the help of a tremendous medical team and a touch of grace, Titus was given a second chance. Titus is back on his feet, but the father of three, with the help of his wife (Nikki), now begins a 6-12 month journey on the road to recovery. His current mission in helping at risk youth simply exemplifies Titus's mission to share his blessings with those less fortunate.

His family, friends and former teammates have created a crowd sourcing website to help raise funds to support the Ivory family during this time with a goal of raising \$50,000 so that the Ivory family can focus on recovery and not on the medical bills or the financial stress that we have all faced. The NCAA's annual study of institutions nationwide revealed that Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a GSR of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2002-03 through 2005-06. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (97) and Illinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park studentathletes was 78 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.

CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State, now embarking on its 18th year, when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

- CVC-Penn State has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 17 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.
- The organization raised over \$200,000 for the thirdstraight year in 2011-12 and has raised more than \$175,000 each of the last six years ranking it among the top 10 CVC organizations in the nation.
- CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a yearround schedule of seven events, which includes the the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk and State College Brew Expo.
- CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last four years and more than \$190,000 total. Funds are also donated directly to the American Cancer Society.

Newbill responded, Marshall hitting a big three with the Lions trailing by three with 1:07 remaining to tie the game and Newbill driving for the game winning layup with 30 seconds to play. Newbill led the Lions with a career high tying 22 points while Marshall had 15 points, seven rebounds and five assists in 42 minutes. Sasa Borovnjak had his best game of the season with 14 points and a career high tying eight rebounds. The Lions shot 59% in the first half to lead 37-29 at the break, but saw the Hornets shooting 50% in the second half and tie the game for the first time on a Tyshawn Bell three with 12 seconds to play. Casey Walker led DSU with 24 points, including five threes. Penn State shot 49% for the game and had a season high 15 assists.
