Who are the Penn State Nittany Lions?

- Fresh off a 75-55 road win at Virginia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, Penn State comes to Ann Arbor with a 3-1 overall record. The Nittany Lions season opener against Drexel was postponed due to Covid protocols.
- PSU averages 81.2 points per game paced by four double digit scoring Nittany Lions -- sophomore forward Seth Lundy (16.8), junior guard Izaiah Brockington (14.0), junior guard Sam Sessoms (12.3) and junior guard Myreon Jones (12.3).
- The Nittany Lions are shooting 44.9 percent from the field and 45 percent comes from beyond the arc as five different players have made 5+ triples this season, led by junior guard Myles Dread's team-best 10.
- Senior forward John Harrar is averaging 7.3 points and a team-best 7.8 rebounds per game. Overall, PSU is grabbing 36.8 rebounds per game as a team.
- Penn State is led by interim coach Jim Ferry, who is in his fourth season with the Nittany Lions. He replaces Patrick Chambers, who was relieved of his duties this summer.

The Series with Penn State

- Today's game will be the 51st all-time meeting between Michigan and Penn State.
- U-M leads the all-time series, 36-14. After a U-M eight-game winning streak, Penn State has won the last two games in the series.
- Michigan has nine games (6-3) against Penn State vacated by the Wolverines due to NCAA Sanctions -- giving U-M a recognized 30-11 all-time record.
- U-M holds a 21-3 record in Ann Arbor, as PSU snapped an eight-game U-M winning streak with a 72-63 win on Jan. 22, 2020. U-M holds a 13-9 record in State College, splitting the last four games (2-2). U-M is an even 2-2 record in neutral site games -- with three games at the Big Ten Tournament and one in the B1G Super Saturday match-up at MSG
- There has been one game when both Michigan and Penn State were ranked among the nation's top 25. The No. 20 Wolverines claimed a 67-66 decision in Ann Arbor over the No. 14 Nittany Lions on Jan. 21, 1996.
- There have been six games decided by three-or-fewer with U-M leading 4-2. The last time was a three-point U-M win (72-69) at Crisler Center on Jan. 4, 2017.
- There has been only one overtime game in the all-time series. U-M won, 89-87, overtime win at Crisler Center on Feb. 19, 2000.
- Longest U-M win streak: 11 games (Jan. 2, 2002 to Feb. 9, 2008).
- Longest U-M losing streak: 3 games (March 9, 2000 to March 8, 2001)
- Largest U-M Victory: +23: at U-M (79-56) on Jan. 2, 2016 and at U-M (76-53) on Feb. 18, 2004
- Largest U-M Loss: -18 (70-52) at Penn State on Jan. 2, 1999
- U-M Victories by 10+ Points: 17 | U-M Losses by 10+ Points: 6
- U-M's average margin in wins: +10.9 | U-M's average margin in losses: -8.4

- Michigan is opening its 104th season of Big Ten play and are 59-44 all-time
- In home games, the Wolverines have played 56 games (35-20) in Big Ten openers
- In road games, the Wolverines have played 48 games (24-24) in Big Ten openers
- U-M has played 10 of the 13 possible Big Ten teams in the conference opener. The Maize and Blue have yet to open the conference slate against Maryland, Nebraska and Rutgers.
- U-M has played Northwestern (19x; 15-4) and Indiana (18x; 4-14) the most in Big Ten openers

Last Time on the Hardwood

- Working inside and then outside, Michigan won its fifth non-conference game, 91-71, over Toledo at Crisler Center. The game was a quick replacement as the Rockets took the place of N.C. State, who had to postpone its game with U-M in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, due to COVID-19 related concerns within the Wolfpack program.
- Five Wolverines scored in double figures as Hunter Dickinson led the Maize and Blue with his 18 points -- his fifth straight double figure game. Isaiah Livers had 16, while Franz Wagner had 14 and Eli Brooks and Austin Davis each had 12.
- U-M shot 57.6 percent for the game and went 9-for-16 from long range (56.3%).
- With 48 points in the paint, U-M has had 40+ points down low in four of its first five games.
- For the third time this season, the Wolverines posted 20+ assists in a game, as U-M was led by Mike Smith's seven dimes.

Dickinson Named Big Ten's Freshman of the Week

- Providing a much-needed spark off the bench, Hunter Dickinson earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors after back-to-back double-figure performances. He averaged 13.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and one block per game while shooting 73.3 percent (11-for-15) against Ball State and Central Florida.
- Dickinson recorded his first career double-double (12 points, career-best 11 rebounds) against Ball State and followed that with 14 points (6-for-6 shooting, 2-for-2 on free throws) and seven boards against UCF. In that game, he helped the Wolverines to a come-from-behind win that featured the U-M second team scoring 49 of the team's 80 points.

Who are the Michigan Wolverines?

- Michigan is led by second year head coach Juwan Howard. After spending 25 years in the NBA -- 19 as a player and six as an assistant (all with the Miami Heat), Howard embarked on his first stint as a head coach -- on any level -- with his alma mater Michigan.
- For the second straight season, associate head coach Phil Martelli (2nd year) and assistants Saddi Washington (fifth-year) and Howard Eisley (2nd year) will help Juwan Howard on the sidelines.
- Michigan has a 17-player roster, with a rotation that could reach as deep as 10 or 11. However, the Maize and Blue rely on a main and steady rotation of nine players. Additionally, the Wolverines do have one unused scholarship.
- Juwan Howard wants the Wolverines to be a "solution based" and "player led" team. He continues to give a voice to his players allowing them freedom to express opinions in huddles and on the floor during games and especially in practice.
- A big believer in culture -- from his Miami Heat days -- Juwan Howard runs his program by six values -- Discipline, Family, All-In, Accountability, Trust and Sacrifice.
- Overall, the Wolverines are looking to play at a fast-paced, "read-and-react" offense with several ball screen actions as the primary mainstay in their offensive sets. However, U-M constantly adjusts to its personnel with more cutting, downhill attacks and taking the open shot at a much higher level.
- Defensively, U-M primarily runs a man-to-man defense, however, they do have some zone packages they can employ.
- Some would say, the Wolverines have developed into a "positionless" team with several players playing multiple spots during a game -- i.e. Isaiah Livers, Franz Wagner, Chaundee Brown, Jr. and Brandon Johns, Jr. have played up to two to three different positions giving U-M the ability to play a big or go smaller.

What You Need to Know

- Michigan has continued to live its "mini-bubble" life and are tested for the coronavirus six days a week under the Big Ten's protocols. Almost all the Wolverines classes have been done remotely.
- Due to the pandemic, the Wolverines are playing a reduced schedule of 25 regular season games -- five non-conference (5-0) and 20 Big Ten games. All five non-conference games were played in Ann Arbor.
- The Wolverines do not make their first road trip until a Christmas Day game at Nebraska. In fact, U-M also ushers in 2021 with a New Year's Eve game at Maryland.

Game Notes

- On March 4, 2020, U-M coach Juwan Howard approached Austin Davis before practice and let him know that if he wanted he had a spot for him for his fifth year in 2020-21. Davis was so excited he dropped the basketball and bear-hugged Howard. This preseason, Davis was named one of two captains, along with Isaiah Livers.
- Austin Davis continues to love the outdoors and is an avid hunter and fisherman. Each year he makes his own jerky and took all the U-M big men on a fishing trip on his grandfather's land in Onsted.
- Isaiah Livers and Franz Wagner explored the NBA Draft, however, both elected to return to Ann Arbor.
- Franz Wagner is the younger brother of former All-Big Ten Wolverine Moritz Wagner, who led U-M to the 2018 Final Four, was a first round NBA Draft pick (L.A. Lakers) and is currently playing with the Washington Wizards.
- Mike Smith, a native of Burr Ridge, Ill., continues to be mentored by former Chicago Bulls G/F Jimmy Butler, now a member of the Miami Heat.
- Jace Howard is the son of head coach Juwan Howard. Coach Howard's other son, Jett, is a top 50 recruit in the Class of 2022 and currently plays at IMG Academy.
- Two of Michigan's four freshman are lefties -- Hunter Dickinson and Zeb Jackson. In all, U-M has three lefty shooters on the roster with Luke Wilson.

A Blistering Pace

- As a team U-M is shooting 52.6 percent from the field, which is 20th nationally and fourth in the Big Ten.
- Michigan shot over 54 percent in three of the five games this season, with a season best 57.6 percent against Toledo (Dec. 9)
- The Wolverines are led by big men Austin Davis (75.0; 12-for-116) and Hunter Dickinson (70.7; 29-for-41).
- Overall U-M has six players shooting over 50 percent through five games of the season.
- Isaiah Livers is shooting 56.6 percent (30-for-53) from the field, while Franz Wagner is at a 51.4 percent (18-for-35), Chaundee Brown, Jr. is at 51.1 percent (23-for-45) and Brandon Johns, Jr. is at 61.5 percent (8-for-13).

Just a Little Bit of Statistics

- Michigan is averaging 86.4 points per game after posting 80+ point in all five games this season, including two 90+ point games with a season-high 96 against Bowling Green (Nov. 25).
- U-M has posted four of its five games with 40+ rebounds, are averaging 41.8 per game and out-rebounding its opponents by +11.4, which is 26th nationally and third in the Big Ten.
- U-M has recorded four of its five games with 40+ points in the paint -- with three games at 42 and a season-high 48 against Toledo. U-M is +18.6 so far against its opponents down low.
- Michigan has three of its five games with 20+ assists -- Bowling Green (23), Oakland (24) and Toledo (20) -- averaging 19.4 per game. Last season, U-M had four 20+ assist games and five in 2018-19.
- The Maize and Blue have four double-figure scorers -- Isaiah Livers (16.2), Hunter Dickinson (14.8) and Chaundee Brown Jr. (12.0) and Franz Wagner (10.2)
- Dickinson has scored in double figures in all five games with a career-best 19 against Oakland.
- Dickinson leads U-M with 7.4 rebounds, while Wagner is close behind at 7.0 per game. The duo are the only Wolverines to hit for double figures -- Wagner 13 (Oakland) and Dickinson 11 (Ball State).
- Mike Smith (26; 5.2 apg) and Eli Brooks (20; 4.0 apg) have combined to post 46 of U-M's 97 assists (47.4 percent).
- Livers leads U-M with 13 3-pointers (48.1 percent), while Brown, Jr., has 12 (46.2 percent).

Some Maize and Blue Quick Hitters

- Starting against Oakland (Nov. 29), Eli Brooks (103) became the 73rd Wolverine to play 100 games.
- Starting against Central Florida (Dec. 6), Isaiah Livers (101) became the 74th Wolverine to play 100 games.

- Franz Wagner every game in his career (32). It should be noted he missed the first four games of his first season with the Wolverines while recovering from a fractured wrist.

The DMV Boys

- It is a friendship that started in an 8-and-under AAU league. Hunter Dickinson played with one DC Assault team while Terrance Williams II was on the other DC Assault team.
- As the friendship grew throughout the years they finally started playing together in the sixth grade with ETU Select, before the team transferred over to Team Takeover.
- As they each headed to rival high schools with Dickinson (DeMatha Catholic) and Williams (Gonzaga College) in the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC), they battled for the league title for four seasons -- each winning two titles. Dickinson claimed the 2018 and 2020, while Williams got the 2017 and 2019.
- After Dickinson committed to the Maize and Blue on Dec. 19, 2019, Williams eventually ended up joining him on Jan. 1, 2020. Williams had originally committed to Georgetown, however, reopened his recruitment (Dec. 5, 2019).
- As the duo headed to Ann Arbor, Juwan Howard referred to them the "DMV Boys" for being from the District of Columbia, Maryland and Virginia area. It has stuck.
- With the DMV familiarity, Dickinson and Williams were instrumental in rallying the Wolverines against Oakland. Williams hustle saw him grab a key rebound, a key steal and two assists to Dickinson, who had all 19 of his points in the second/OT periods as the Wolverines claimed an 81-71 victory.
- The DMV duo did it again against Central Florida. As part of U-M's second unit, Dickinson's 14 points and Williams' 10 helped the Wolverines overcome a 12-point deficit and go on for the lopsided 80-58 victory.

Game Notes

Most Impressive Start

- Hunter Dickinson came in highly-touted and he has shown that in his four games averaging 14.8 points and a team-best 7.4 rebounds in 22.6 minutes off the bench.
- Dickinson has five straight double figure scoring games Bowling Green (11), Oakland (19; all in the second/OT), Ball State (12), Central Florida (14) and Toledo (18).
- Dickinson's second half spark against Oakland, helped the Wolverines rally from a six-point deficit, to go on to a 10-point overtime win. In fact, Dickinson scored or was part of 26 of U-M's final 35 points.
- He is shooting 29-for-41 (70.7 percent from the field), leading the Wolverines.
- With a career-best 11 rebounds against Ball State, Dickinson posted his first career 10+ board game as well as recording his first career double-double (12 points).
- Dickinson has already earned his first Big Ten Freshman of the Week accolade (Dec. 7).

The Headband Factor?

- Terrance Williams II dawned a headband for the first time this season against Central Florida and posted his first career double figure game with 10 points.
- Williams is coming off the bench and been a spark with 4.2 points and 3.6 rebounds.
- So far, Williams has grabbed 2+ rebounds in every game this season.
- One half of the DMV Boys, Williams' energy has been infectious with the other Wolverines as he has sparked rallies against Oakland and UCF as the Wolverines remain undefeated.

Livers Read for Final Campaign

- Isaiah Livers has opened his final season scoring in double figures in four of the five games with two 20+ point -- Oakland (22) and Ball State (21).
- En route to those numbers, Livers is shooting 56.6 percent from the field as he has balanced his inside and outside scoring games. He also leads U-M shooting 48.1 percent from long range with this team-best 13 3-pointers. He is 8-for-9 on free throws.
- Livers drained a career-best-tying five 3-pointers against Oakland. He has 127 in his career and needs 62 more to crack the all-time top 10 -- LaVell Blanchard (2000-03; 189)
- In addition to his shooting, Livers set a career-best with four blocks against Oakland
- Livers has 10 assists (2.0 apg), which is nearly half of his prior season best (25) as a sophomore.
- Last season, Livers missed 10 Big Ten games from injuries -- nine due to a groin/hip (left) and one due to an ankle sprain. After recovering this offseason, exploring the NBA Draft, he is ready to return for one final run with the Wolverines.
- Last season, Livers led U-M with a 12.9 scoring average despite the games lost to injury. He scored in double figures in 14 games including three 20+ point scoring outings, with a career-best 24 against Houston Baptist (Nov. 22, 2019).
- It's hard to believe with as hard as he plays, Livers has only two career double-doubles -- both of which are against Nebraska. First, he recoded 12 points and 10 rebounds against the Cornhuskers on Feb. 28, 2019. He followed with an 18 points, 10 rebound performance against Nebraska on March 5, 2020.

Mr. Smith Comes to Ann Arbor

- Mike Smith has brought quite a resume with him from Columbia to Michigan.
- Scoring in double figures in 80 games including 43 20+ point games and seven 30+ games, Smith tallied 1,653 points with the Lions. He opened his U-M career with 16 points and eight assists against Bowling Green.
- For the season, Smith is averaging 7.8 points per game with two double figure games.
- He leads with 5.2 assists per game as he has had 3+ assists in each game and a season-best eight against Bowling Green and another seven against Toledo.
- Despite shooting 2-for-12 from deep, Smith is 11-for-18 on 2-point field goals (61.2 percent).

Well Hello Mr. Brooks

- Eli Brook averaged 10.6 points per game a year ago. Before that mark his prior best was 2.5 per game as a sophomore. So far he has opened the 2020-21 season with three double figure scoring games, including a season-high 12 against Toledo. He is fifth on U-M with 9.2 ppg.
- Brooks has 16 career double figure scoring games, including four 20+ point games -- 24 against Appalachian State (Nov. 5, 2019) and vs. No. 6 North Carolina (Nov. 28, 2019, Battle 4 Atlantis), a career-best 25 at Iowa (Jan. 17, 2020) and another 20 at Nebraska (Jan. 28, 2020).
- Last season, Brooks led U-M with 52 3-pointers. That total is more than two and a half times his previous single season best set last season (14). It also more than doubled his first two seasons combined (24).
- A total of 52.4 percent of Brooks' offensive shots came via the 3-point line (254 of 485).

What Brown Can Do For You

- With the biggest exhale, Chaundee Brown, Jr. was finally able to relax after being granted his NCAA waiver this October (30th) after transferring from Wake Forest.
- In his first game with U-M, Brown scored 18 of his team-best 19 points in the second half as he drained five 3-pointers to guide the Wolverines to the season opening win over Bowling Green.
- In his fourth game, Brown came off the bench midway through the first half against Central Florida and was instrumental in U-M's rally as he scored 11 of his team-best 18 points in the first half as he drained three of his four triples in the first half.

- Through five games off the bench, he is averaging 12.0 points and 3.4 rebounds. He is slowly becoming U-M's top defensive stopper along with Eli Brooks.
- Brown has made at least one 3-pointer in each game this season with a season-best five against Bowling Green and another four against Central Florida. He is second with 12.
- In three seasons at Wake Forest, he averaged 10.4 points and 4.7 rebounds while starting 74 or 84 games. He scored in double figures in 42 games with 13 20+ point games, including a career-high 26 points against No. 23 Xavier (Dec. 14, 2019), going 11-for-16 from the field. He added five double-doubles

No Rookie Tab for Wagner Any More

- Franz Wagner has started all 32 games of his young two year career.
- Wagner grew another inch and is just shy of a 6-10 reading on the tape measure. He also added 20+ pounds over the last year and a half thanks to the Camp Sanderson program.
- Wagner is second on U-M with 7.0 rebounds per game thanks to 13 against Oakland -- missing his career best by a single board. He has 5+ boards in all five games this season.
- Last season, Wagner was second with 41 3-pointers. He had a career-best four, 3x -- Oregon (Dec. 14, 2019), at Minnesota (Jan. 12, 2020) and at Ohio State (March 1, 2020).
- Despite shooting 3-for-10 from deep, Wagner is 15-for-25 on 2-point field goals (60.0 percent).

Big Minutes for Big Country

- Last season Austin Davis has come off the bench and proven to be a much need presence down-low. This season, Davis has started all five games in 12.4 minutes.
- Davis started his first ever collegiate game against Bowling Green (Nov. 25) in the season opener. Prior to that nod, he had played 65 games off the bench.
- In 2019-20, Davis averaged 10.7 minutes per game, with 4.9 points and 2.6 rebounds, while shooting a team-best 69.3 percent (52-for-75) from the field. How does that compare to his prior best? Well, before last season he had a best of 3.7 minutes (2018-19), 1.2 points and 1.4 rebounds (2017-18).
- Davis' 52 total field goals a year ago more than doubled his previous two seasons combined (21).

Quietly a Big Factor

- Brandon Johns, Jr. has continued to be productive off the bench for the Wolverines.
- He is averaging 4.6 points and 3.2 rebounds per game, but it is the effort areas where he is making key contributions -- diving on the floor, taking charges, getting that one needed rebound.
- Additionally, he is shooting 61.5 percent (8-for-13) from the field and is 5-for-5 on free throws.

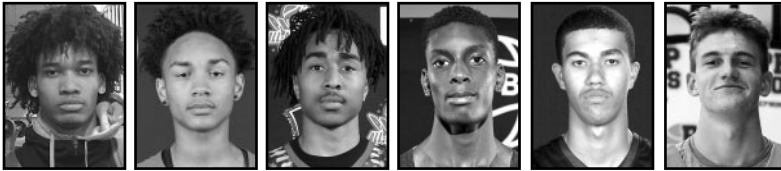
Wait ... How Many New Faces Are There?

- Michigan welcomed seven new faces including three transfers and four freshmen.
- After taking a medical year (2018-19), Mike Smith (Columbia) transferred and had immediate eligibility as the Ivy League does not allow for athletes to have a fifth-year. Brown (Wake Forest) declared the NBA Draft and following the firing of head coach Danny Manning decided to transfer, choosing the Wolverines. After a long summer and fall of waiting, the NCAA granted Brown his wavier making him eligible for the season.
- U-M added Ann Arbor native Brandon Wade (Duquesne) in January. Wade will have to continue to sit out the first semester before he will be fully eligible to dress for games.
- Finally, the Wolverines welcome four freshmen to Ann Arbor -- 7-1 center Hunter Dickinson, 6-7 forward Jace Howard, 6-5 guard Zeb Jackson and 6-7 forward Terrance Williams II.
- With seven new faces, what did Michigan lose? Seniors Zavier Simpson (L.A. Lakers FA signee) and Jon Teske (Orlando Magic FA signee) graduated, while three other Wolverines transferred -- David DeJulius (Cincinnati), Colin Castleton (Florida) and Cole Bajema (Washington). All three received NCAA waivers for immediate eligibility.

Wolverines Filling NBA Rosters

- As the NBA season starts back up with training camps, Michigan has 14 former players suiting up.
- Recently, Nik Stauskas, who played in Spain before suffering a knee injury last season, signed a one-year deal with Milwaukee. Five other Wolverines reached recent deals including Glenn Robinson III (Sacramento), Derrick Walton Jr. (Philadelphia), Charles Matthews (Cleveland), Zavier Simpson (L.A. Lakers) and Jon Teske (Orlando).
- With those six signees it helps U-M have 14 players in the league as they join:

 - Trey Burke & Tim Hardaway Jr. (Dallas)
 - Moritz Wagner (Washington)
 - D.J. Wilson (Milwaukee)

PHIL MARTELLI Associate Head Coach



With over 44 years of coaching, legendary coach Phil Martelli joins the University of Michigan basketball program as an assistant coach following a 34 year tenure at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia.

Starting his career at Saint Joseph's as an assistant coach for 10 years, Martelli spent his final 24 seasons as the head coach building the Saint Joseph's program into one of the most consistent in the Atlantic 10, becoming a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. He earned his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and is one of the most respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 444-328. He set the school record for most wins in a season (30) in 2004 and recorded nine 20-plus win seasons -- the most for any Hawks' coach. His Atlantic 10 record of 218-176 ranks second all-time in the league history and trailed only Temple's John Chaney. He won six Atlantic 10 regular season/divisional titles (1997, 2001, '02, '03, '04 and '05) and guided the Hawks to three A-10 Tournament championships (1997, 2014 and '16).

Martelli had 13 postseason appearances (7 NCAA, 6 NIT) advancing to two NCAA Sweet 16s (1997 and 2004) and the school's third Elite Eight appearance in 2004. He guided the Hawks to NIT runner-up finishes in his first season at the helm of the Hawks in 1996 and again in 2005. His 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in Saint Joseph's history.

Prior to his arrival at Saint Joseph's, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School in the Philadelphia Catholic League, which became Kennedy Kenrick Catholic High School, and is now closed. He compiled a 112-85 record and reached the Catholic League title game in 1980. Current Hall of Fame UConn women's basketball coach Geno Auriemma served as an assistant under Martelli from 1979-81.

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater Widener College in 1977 under C. Alan Rowe, helping the Pioneers reach to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four and title game. That Widener team set the program record with 26 wins (26-5) -- a mark still held today -- and was inducted into the Widener Athletics Hall of Fame in 2018 as it remains one of only three programs to reach an NCAA title game along with football and polo.

SADDI WASHINGTON Assistant Coach



With almost two decades of college coaching experience, Saddi Washington enters his fifth season as an assistant coach with the University of Michigan men's basketball program.

In his four seasons with Michigan, Washington has helped the Wolverines win 108 games (27.0 per season) including a program record 33 wins during the 2017-18 campaign and follow with a second 30 win season in 2018-19. During his tenure, U-M has won two Big Ten Tournament titles, advance to three straight NCAA Sweet 16s and the Final Four and national title game in 2018.

In his first season with the Maize and Blue, and after a well-documented plane crash, U-M won four games in four days to claim the 2017 Big Ten Tournament title. The following year, the Wolverines repeated their efforts with four straight wins to win back-to-back conference tournament titles. In 2019, U-M made it three straight trips to the championship game, setting the tournament record with 10 straight wins, before falling in the final.

Using the successes in the Big Ten Tournament, the Wolverines made three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament reaching the Sweet 16 in each of the those seasons as well as the national title game in 2018. After defeating Cinderella Loyola-Chicago in the national semifinal, the Wolverines fell to Villanova in the 2018 national title game.

Responsible for coaching U-M's big men, Washington was instrumental in the development of Moritz Wagner, who earned All-Big Ten honors for two straight years and went on to become the 25th overall selection in the NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. It was the second U-M big man drafter under Washington tutelage after D.J. Wilson was selected with the 17th overall pick by the Milwaukee Bucks in 2017.

Washington came to Ann Arbor after spending a decade as a member of the Oakland coaching staff (2006-16). During his tenure, Washington helped the Golden Grizzlies to 198 wins, including five 20-plus win seasons, two straight Summit League regular season and conference tournament titles, and back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament (2010, '11).

At Oakland, Washington developed some of the top mid-major players in the country, including five who led the NCAA in a statistical category.

HOWARD EISLEY Assistant Coach



Following a successful nine years working and coaching in the NBA, Howard Eisley returned to his native state of Michigan and begins his second season as an assistant coach with the University of Michigan basketball program.

Despite his first season with the Wolverines coming to an early end due to the global coronavirus pandemic, Eisley was instrumental in working with the Maize and Blue guards and offensive sets. Before the cancellation of the postseason, U-M had reached a 19-12 record, won the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament following wins over No. 6 North Carolina and No. 8 Gonzaga and finished with a 10-10 mark in Big Ten play.

Prior to moving to the NCAA ranks and Michigan, Eisley spent a near decade moving up the ranks in the NBA starting as a player development assistant with the Los Angeles Clippers to an assistant coach with the Washington Wizards (2014-16) and New York Knicks (2016-19).

Chosen with the 30th overall selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves in the 1994 NBA Draft, Eisley played 12 seasons in the NBA, making stops with eight teams -- Minnesota, San Antonio, Utah, Dallas, New York, Phoenix, the Clippers and Denver. He played in 786 NBA games and recorded 5,116 career points, 2,748 assists, 540 steals and 516 3-point field goals. His career was highlighted by playing five seasons with the Utah Jazz and was developed behind Hall of Fame point guard John Stockton, contributing to two Western Conference titles in 1997 and 1998.

A four-year starter at Boston College (1991-94), Eisley helped guide the Eagles to the 1994 NCAA East Regional Final, where he earned all-regional tournament honors. He added All-Big East second team honors as a junior (1993) and senior (1994).

Prior to his collegiate career, Eisley was a prep standout at Detroit's Southwestern High School, where he was teammates with future NBA players Jalen Rose and Voshon Lenard.
