

#### THE SERIES

This weekend, Michigan and Penn State finish off their regular-season series with a pair of games at Pegula Ice Arena. Through 44 all-time meetings, U-M leads PSU by a 27-16-1 margin but the series is tied in State College (9-9-1) through 19 games. Back in November, the teams split when Michigan won 6-4 on Friday night at Yost before falling 5-3 on Saturday.

#### **WOLVERINE BITES**

• Michigan enters at 14-11-3 after losing to Michigan State twice. U-M was down 3-1 on Friday before MSU added a pair of ENG to win 5-1. On Saturday, the Spartans held on to win 3-2 at Little Caesars Arena and snap Michigan's long run with the Iron "D" trophy. • Head Coach Brandon Naurato is in his second season behind the bench. Naurato, a 2009 Michigan grad, posted the most wins (26) of any first-year Michigan HC last season. • The forward corps is led by a highly-skilled group of returners including the recentlynamed Hockey Commissioners Association Player of the Month for January, Rutger McGroarty (10G, 26A), who leads the way with 36 points. In just six games last month, Rutger had 16 points (2.67 pt/gm) to lead college hockey and earn his second such honor of the year from the HCA. Gavin Brindley (17G, 18A) is right behind McGroarty with 32 points while the trio of Dylan Duke (17G, 17A), Frank Nazar III (13G, 21A), and TJ Hughes (14G, 20A) are next with 34 points apiece. Freshmen Garrett Schifsky (13G, 11A) and Nick Moldenhauer (7G, 11A) have also both been impactful as first-year collegiate players. • Star blueliner Seamus Casey (5G, 29A) has dazzled through 28 games with 34 points to be tied as the second-highest scoring NCAA defender. Casey's former NTDP partner, Tyler Duke (2G, 12A), has also chipped in 14 points along with a +14 rating. The reigning B1G Third Star of the Week, Jake Barczewski, has gone 12-10-3 as a

Wolverine after he surpassed a pair of major milestones earlier in the season with his 100th collegiate start and 3,000th career save. The goaltender has accrued 707 saves on the season while posting a .910 save percentage and 2.83 goals against average. • U-M's top-ranked power-play unit is operating at 36.1% and has scored three or more PPG on five occasions through 28 games. The team has been outstanding in the faceoff dot with a 53.5% win rate while the PK unit (78.4%) has been vastly improved of late.

#### SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

• PSU's forward group is led by freshman Aiden Fink (15G, 17A) with 32 points through his first 28 games. Fellow first-year Matt DiMarsico (6G, 18A) is second with 24 points while upperclassmen Ryan Kirwan (12G, 11A) and Jacques Bouquot (10G, 13A) have 23 points.

The conference foes have faced off 44 times since the Big Ten began in the 2013-14 season. Over that span, Michigan holds a 27-16-1 edge over Penn State. Michigan's power-play unit is converting on 36.1% (39 of 108) of its chances to lead the nation. The Wolverines are averaging 1.39 PPG/gm. Alternate captain Dylan Duke scored his 45th career goal on Saturday vs. MSU by notching his team-leading 10th powerplay goal of the year.

On the blue line, transfer Tanner Palocsik (1G, 13A) leads the way with 14 points while Dylan Gratton (2G, 9A) has 11 points and leads the Nittany Lions with 46 blocked shots.
In net, Liam Souliere has received the bulk of the workload while posting a 9-9-1 record. The veteran posted a 3.48 goals against average with a .867 save percentage.

#### SHOWTIME

Starting with the final match-up of the year against Penn State (12-13-3) on Saturday, the team's final five games will all be broadcast nationally on Big Ten Network.

#### OUTDUELED

Michigan's long tenure as holders of the Iron "D" trophy came to an end last week when Michigan State won the Duel in the D at Little Caesars Arena, 3-2. The win for the Spartans marked their first victory in the annual rivalry game since 2016 and snapped a seven-year, six-game win streak for the Wolverines. U-M made a ferocious push in the latter portion of the third period, but failed to pot a game-tying goal.

#### PLAYER OF THE MONTH: TAKE TWO

After being named Co-Player of the Month by the Hockey Commissioners Association for the month of October, sophomore standout Rutger McGroarty added a second honor by being named the lone recipient of January's Player of the Month award. Playing in just six games (compared to many competitors playing eight), McGroarty scored three goals and notched 13 assists to lead college hockey with 16 points. As it stands, he's fifth in college hockey in points per game with 1.55 pt/gm.

#### BACK TO BARZO

Coming off a sweep of Ohio State, Jake Barczewski was rewarded by the Big Ten by finishing off an all-goaltender trio as the Third Star of the Week. In a pair of road wins, Barzo allowed just three goals on 69 shots that he faced to move to 3-0-1 all-time against OSU with a .957 sv% and 1.48 GAA. The weekly honor was his third of the year after banking a pair of Second Star performances in October and November.

#### **GUESS WHO'S BACK?**

Sophomore Tyler Duke returned to play at Ohio State two weeks ago for the first time since transferring to U-M. The blueliner embraced the moment, recording a new career-best performance with three points off one goal and a pair of assists after opening the scoring with a patient dart through traffic for the weekend's first goal.

#### **RISING TIDES LIFT ALL BOATS**

Six Wolverines have already recorded more than 30 points this season; the sextet are all producing above one point-per-game. In the last 25 years, no Michigan team has finished the season with more than four Wolverines at one point-per-game.

#### CRACKED THE CODE

Wisconsin entered the series in Ann Arbor three weeks ago as the nation's topranked defensive team in addition to boasting the #1 penalty kill. In 24 games, UW had only allowed 39 goals, and the team had never allowed five or more goals in a single game. U-M proceeded to do it twice, scoring 10 goals in the series. Through 28 games, Michigan has scored 15 of 52 goals (28.8%) that the Badgers have allowed.

#### **GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES**

Sophomore forwards from Michigan were honored as the Big Ten's "First Star of the Week" on three-straight occasions, as Frank Nazar III, Rutger McGroarty, and Gavin Brindley took turns keeping the honor inside Yost for three weeks in a row. • Two weeks ago, Nazar captured First Star of the Week honors from the Big Ten after notching a pair of multi-point performances. In the split vs. UW, he scored three goals and added a pair of assists while putting seven shots on goal.

Rutger McGroarty starred in the home-and-home versus Michigan State three weeks ago, recording back-to-back four-point games for the first time in his career.
A third sophomore, Brindley, started the second half by earning B1G First Star of the Week following a seven-point weekend against Stonehill College. He began the series with his first-career four-goal game to propel the team to a dozen-goal eruption. The next night, Brindley scored once and added a pair of assists to finish off his seven-point series.

#### DUKE THE ELDER

Alternate captain Dylan Duke saw his career-long 13-game point streak come to an end at OSU. He leads the team with 17 goals as well as four game-winning goals, and his 10 power-play goals lead the Big Ten in addition to being fifth-most nationwide.

NOTES

#### **NO NEW FRIENDS**

The team concluded non-conference play with a sweep over Stonehill to start the second half. U-M will finish the campaign with a 7-2-1 mark against opponents from outside the Big Ten, and the squad's final six games are all Big Ten contests.

#### CHEAPER BY THE DOZEN

In the first game against Stonehill, Michigan resumed D1 play by scoring at will in a dominant 12-4 win. The 12-spot was the first time U-M potted one dozen goals since Jan. 10, 1997, when a loaded team beat Alaska-Fairbanks, 13-1.

#### **GOLD MEDAL GUYS**

Over the holiday break, a quartet of Wolverine sophomores won gold medals while representing USA Hockey at the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship in Sweden:

• Rutger McGroarty served as Team Captain, the second-consecutive Michigan product to don the "C" after Luke Hughes captained the 2023 outfit. McGroarty was named Player of the Game against Slovakia and finished the tournament with five goals and four assists for nine points. McGroarty closed out his WJC experience with 16 points, the second most by a Wolverine over a WJC career.

• Gavin Brindley, an alternate captain, was one of three honored by USA Hockey as a Top Player for the tournament after posting six goals and four assists for 10 points. Brindley was also named Player of the Game in the Americans' big win over Norway. His 10 points are second-most by a Wolverine behind only Mike Cammalleri's 11 for Canada in 2002.

• Frank Nazar III led the Wolverine foursome with eight assists and paced the group at +9. His eight assists is a record for most in a tournament by a Michigan player all-time.

• Defenseman Seamus Casey missed a game due to illness, but saw a ton of ice time while posting six assists and being relied upon defensively when he returned to the lineup.

#### NTD-FEATED

Michigan restarted play with a quick trip up M-14 to Plymouth's USA Hockey Arena to face the USNTDP U-18 team. The four WJC gold medalists were honored pregame, and the night continued to go in U-M's favor en route to a 5-1 win. Returning D Ethan Edwards scored a pair of goals to lead the Wolverines, who conceded a last-minute goal to spoil the shutout.
In 21 all-time meetings, Michigan is 17-4 and currently boasts a three-game win streak following a pair of losses in 2018 & 2020. Four NTDP alumni suited up in the game: Dylan & Tyler Duke, Marshall Warren, and Jacob Truscott.

#### **FOOTBALL FRIENDS**

By defeating Washington in this month's CFP National Championship, the U-M football program won its 12th national championship. Seven of those titles have come since the varsity hockey program was established. In the last century, on-ice success for the hockey team has seemed to correlate with its counterparts on the gridiron:

• Just under a year after Dr. Joseph Barss helped establish the varsity hockey program, Coach Fielding Yost's 1923 footballers won the program's sixth national title by going 8-0.

• Fritz Crisler guided U-M to a 10-0 record and a national championship in 1947, his final season as coach. The following year, ex-letterwinner Bennie Oosterbaan coached Michigan to a 9-0 mark and a second-straight championship. Between those title-winning campaigns was the 1948 national hockey championship, the first of its kind, won at the Broadmoor Hotel in Colorado Springs by legendary coach Vic Heyliger's icers.

• In 1997, Lloyd Carr's group reached the mountaintop for the first time in nearly 50 years. Sandwiching that football championship was a pair of hockey titles won by Head Coach Red Berenson and his teams in 1996 & 1998.

#### **RED LIGHT STAYS LIT**

The Wolverines are scoring an average of 4.43 goals per game, ranking second nationally in scoring offense behind Denver. The Maize and Blue have 124 goals in 28 games; the record for most goals in a season is from 1976-77 when the team tallied 260.

#### SHOTPUTTERS

Michigan is seventh in college hockey with 1,005 shots on goal. U-M has outshot or tied the opposition in shots on goal in 18 of 28 games, and the team is scoring on 12.3% of the team's shots on goal, fifth-best in the country.

NOTES

#### DOMINANCE IN THE DOT

• Michigan's staff has placed an emphasis on faceoffs, and the effort is paying off through 28 games as the team's 53.4% win rate is 12th-highest in men's Division 1 hockey. So far, U-M has won or tied the faceoff battle in 19 of 28 contests.

• A pair of sophomores, TJ Hughes and Frank Nazar III, lead U-M in the dot. Hughes paces the team at 59.8% (288 of 482) while his classmate Nazar is winning at a 55% (290 of 527) clip. Junior Mark Estapa has also been strong at 55.7% (141 of 253).

#### **EXTRA SPECIAL**

• Michigan is first in college hockey with 39 power-play goals and a 36.1% success rate.

• U-M buried six power-play goals on nine chances in the second contest against Lindenwood to sweep the Lions. The six-spot was the team's first in a game since Dec. 31, 1996 when the Wolverines went 6-for-10 against Ferris State in a big win at the Great Lakes Invitational.

• The most successful PP in program history was the 1979-80 team that finished the year at a 35.8% clip (power-play tracking began in 1970-71).

#### **IT'S BEEN AWHILE**

Gavin Brindley scored on a penalty shot against PSU. The tally, his 10th of the season, was the first successful penalty shot for a Wolverine since Alex Guptill against BU on Oct. 25, 2013.

#### **HEY, SHORTIE**

• Michigan notched its first two shorthanded goals of the season in the nine-goal win over Lindenwood when Gavin Brindley and Jackson Hallum lit the lamp twice in a 62-second span. The last time Michigan scored two shorties in a game was Feb. 12, 2022 vs. MSU when Jimmy Lambert and Thomas Bordeleau each scored to win the Duel in the D.

• Last season, the team scored three SHG in 41 games; Garrett Schifsky notched the third shortie before Kienan Draper tallied his first-career SHG in the big win at Michigan State.

#### **OUT THE GATES**

Michigan has scored the first goal in 22 of 28 games (78.6%) this season. In those contests where the Wolverines jump out to a 1-0 lead, the team has gone 13-7-2.

#### STEADY SCORING

The Wolverines have scored in 63 of 84 periods thus far, with 36 multi-goal periods through 28 games. The high-water mark thus far was a seven-goal stanza against Lindenwood.

#### NOT TOP 10

U-M is ranked No. 14 in the national polls; this current stint outside the top-10 marks the first time that Michigan has fallen out of that select company in the rankings since Nov. 15, 2020.

#### **BACK-TO-BACK NINE-SPOTS**

The offensive outpouring against Lindenwood saw the Wolverines score 9+ goals in backto-back games for the first time since January 1996. That dominant stretch from nearly 28 years ago saw U-M score nine or more goals in four-straight contests: wins over Ferris State (10-3), Miami (13-0), and the now-defunct llinois-Chicago Flames (9-3, 9-1).

#### **CASEY'S CRUISING**

• Seamus Casey continues to excel while embracing the role of the next great in a long line of stalwart, two-way defensemen at the University of Michigan. Casey (5G, 29A) is the nation's second-highest scoring defenseman with 34 points and a +14 rating in 28 games.

• In 65 career games, Casey has 13 goals + 50 assists for 63 points. In an exhibition last season, the shorthanded Wolverines slotted Casey in at center and the dynamic skater proceeded to put up four points against the US NTDP U-18 team. With 34 points in his sophomore campaign, the blueliner has already surpassed his 37-game freshman year total of 29 points.

Yost Ice Arena. Seamus Casey netted the shootout winner to clinch the extra point for U-M in the team's first shootout win in over three years. Before Casey sent the people home happy, Michigan's last SO win had come on Feb. 28, 2020, also against Minnesota.

#### **GRIZZLED GOALTENDER**

Netminder Jake Barczewski joined the Wolverines as the NCAA's active career leader in saves (2,719) following a four-year run at Canisius. After making his 100th career start against OSU, he's now added 707 saves in 25 games as a Wolverine to build upon his lead. Barczewski, a graduate student at U-M, eclipsed the 3,000th career save mark against Penn State before notching his 50th career win on the road at St. Cloud State.

#### MAN OF THE MONTH

Rutger McGroarty was named the Hockey Commissioners Association co-Player of the Month for October. McGroarty led the nation in scoring during the month, finishing with 15 points in eight games, scoring five goals and 10 assists. He had at least one point in seven games, including the first five of the season, that extended his point-scoring streak to a career-high 13 games. In the eight games he played, he had multiple points in five. He netted two game-winning goals and two power-play goals and led the team in shots with 33. In January, Rut earned a second POTM honor by racking up a D1-best 16 points in just six games.

#### FIRST "FIRST STAR" HONORS

Rutger McGroarty was honored as the Big Ten's First Star of the Week following the first weekend. Rut turned in his first collegiate four-point effort with one goal and three assists to lead U-M to a win on Sunday after tallying a single assist in Saturday's loss.

#### **RIGHTFUL RECOGNITION**

TJ Hughes had a career weekend against Lindenwood, and was rewarded for his impressive effort by receiving recognition as the Big Ten's Second Star of the Week. The sophomore pivot turned in three points on Friday before re-writing his personal record book with a five-point performance off two goals and a trio of assists on Saturday.

#### SECOND STARZO FOR BARZO

Goaltender Jake Barczewski has twice earned the Big Ten's Second Star of the Week. His first came on Oct. 24 after his first career Big Ten series. He had a win and a tie against Ohio State, making 67 saves in 125 minutes of work while allowing three goals against. He earned the weekly honor again on Nov. 28, after an outstanding two-game performance in non-conference action. Barzo notched his first shutout in Maize & Blue at St. Cloud State with a 30-save performance on Friday. The following day, he was at the top of his game once again as he turned aside 36 of 39 shots to earn a tie for the Wolverines. Most recently, he won Third Star of the Week on Feb. 6.

#### EARLY APTITUDE

By splitting with Providence, the Wolverines have now gone nine seasons without beginning 0-2. The last group to drop their first two games was the 2014-15 team captained by Andrew Copp (C), Zach Hyman (A), and JT Compher (A).

#### SEVEN EXTRA LETTERS

The captaincy resides on Michigan's blue line after a year in the forward corps. Over the summer, senior defenseman Jacob Truscott was named the 105th captain in Michigan hockey history. Before the first game, graduate transfer Marshall Warren, senior Philippe Lapointe, and juniors Dylan Duke/Ethan Edwards were named alternate captains, while Rutger McGroarty and Gavin Brindley officially joined the leadership group in advance of the second half.

#### NHL FACTORY

• A new U-M hockey record was set this year with 25 Michigan alums on opening night rosters, while Josh Norris and Max Pacioretty began the year on Injured Reserve. Overall, 20 of 32 teams claim at least one representative of the Maize and Blue family.

Pacioretty's recent return from injury for Washington and Brendan Brisson's debut makes it 28 Wolverines that have been featured on NHL rosters this season, the most of any NCAA program.
Of the six captains in the NHL that played college hockey, half went to Michigan, with Dylan Larkin (DET), Quinn Hughes (VAN) and Jacob Trouba (NYR) all wearing a "C"

• Brendan Brisson (VGK), Johnny Beecher (BOS), Mackie Samoskevich (FLA), and Adam Fantilli (CBJ) made National Hockey League debuts this year to bring U-M's total count of NHLers to 114.

#### NOTES

• Michigan had a pair of alumni honored as 2024 NHL All-Stars: Quinn Hughes & Kyle Connor.

• The NHL's highest-scoring defenseman, Hughes, won the NHL's First Star of the Week in NOV. QH43 has 12 goals & 54 assists for 66 points. He holds the honor of being the highest-scoring college hockey alum in the league.

#### WE PUT THE "BLUE" IN BLUE JACKETS

At the 2023 NHL Draft, the Columbus Blue Jackets added to their wellestablished ties to the University of Michigan by drafting Adam Fantilli (#3) and Gavin Brindley (#34). Fantilli signed an entry-level contract to join a trio of recent Wolverines (Zach Werenski, Nick Blankenburg, and Kent Johnson) in the lineup while Brindley returns for his second year as the team's third-highest drafted skater (McGroarty/Nazar).

#### MICHIGAN'S OWN HOBEY HAT TRICK

• Following a record-breaking freshman campaign, forward Adam Fantilli was awarded the Hobey Baker Memorial Award in Tampa. Fantilli joined Kevin Porter (2008) and Brendan Morrison (1997) in rarified air by winning NCAA hockey's most prestigious honor.

• Fantilli's designation as a Hobey Baker finalist was the 25th such nod for a U-M skater. In total, 21 separate Wolverines have been finalists for the prestigious award since it was first established and handed out in 1981.

#### SMALL BUT MIGHTY

• This year's class of four freshmen is Michigan's smallest since 2004-05 when a class of two (Kevin Porter and Chad Kolarik) reached campus to be impact players from the jump. The quartet is the fourthsmallest group in the nation this year; only St. Thomas, Miami, and Omaha brought in fewer first-year skaters.

• Despite a small freshman class, U-M is tied with MN and UND as the ninth-youngest team. As of Oct. 1, U-M's average age was 21.5 years.

#### ALL-B1G PREDICTIONS

Five Wolverines were among the 18 skaters selected by the league's coaches to the Big Ten's preseason all-conference teams: Gavin Brindley & Seamus Casey (1st Team), Rutger McGroarty & Frank Nazar III (2nd Team), and Dylan Duke (Honorable Mention).

#### PRESEASON ALL-CHN

Doubling last year's number, U-M had two skaters named to College Hockey News' preseason All-CHN teams. Sophomore D Seamus Casey made the first team while recent NHL pick and longtime friend of Casey, Gavin Brindley, was named to the second team.

#### **GENUINE DRAFT**

Michigan has a pair of first-round draft picks on this year's team (McGroarty/Nazar), two of just 14 in all of college hockey. In total, 11 of Michigan's 26 rostered players have been selected in the NHL Draft and 10 NHL organizations have prospects on the team. U-M's 11 total draft picks are tied for the seventh-most in the NCAA.

#### BACK-TO-BACK B1G BOSSES

• After finishing in second-place in the regular season for the secondstraight year, the Wolverines repeated as Big Ten Tournament Champions by beating Minnesota on their home ice. It was deja vu, as a secondseeded Michigan team clad in navy skated into a jam-packed Mariucci Arena to knock off the top-seeded Gophers in a fantastic 4-3 game.

• Adam Fantilli was named Most Outstanding Player in addition to headlining the All-Tournament team. The trio of Rutger McGroarty, Seamus Casey, and Luke Hughes also made the All-Star team.

• Michigan leads the B1G with three tournament titles (2016, 2022, 2023).

#### NAURATO NAMED NUMBER 10

Head Coach Brandon Naurato had the "interim" tag removed last year when he was named the University of Michigan ice hockey program's 10th head coach. As the interim bench boss, Naurato led U-M through a campaign of adversity to a Big Ten tournament championship, a #1 seed in the NCAA tournament, a Frozen Four bid, and a 26-12-3 (.671) record.
The team's 26 wins were the most under a first-year head coach in program history. In total, Coach Naurato's record behind the bench is 40-23-6 (.623) through 69 games.

The first-year head coach led Michigan to a 3-0 start after getting the top job in the offseason. Naurato is the first U-M head coach to start with three straight wins since Joseph Barss and the inaugural 1922-23 team debuted with three wins in their first three games vs. Wisconsin.
Through the first eight games of the Naurato era, the team went 7-1. That mark is the best-ever start to a Michigan hockey coach's career (through eight games), comfortably besting the previous recordholder, Dan Farrell, whose team started 5-2-1 in 1973-74.

#### NEW STAFF, WHO DIS?

Head Coach Brandon Naurato and Associate Coach Rob Rassey return for their second season at the helm in Ann Arbor. Over the summer, a pair of assistant coaches were added to the staff:

• Matt Deschamps is an '05 UMaine alum who played 111 games on defense for the Black Bears, with four-straight NCAA tournament appearances and a pair of Frozen Fours. For the past three years, Deschamps has excelled as an assistant with the USHL's Chicago Steel, where he coached 30 players who were selected in the NHL Draft. A noted defensive specialist, Coach Deschamps will mainly focus on the team defense & penalty kill.

• Kevin Reiter played goalie for the University of Alaska-Anchorage, graduating in 2004. After a seven-year run in professional hockey, he began his coaching career overseas, serving in various roles across the junior, professional, and national ranks. Reiter has been with the US National Team Development Program in Plymouth since 2013, acting as the NTDP's goaltending coach before being promoted to Director of Player Personnel in 2017. In total, Coach Reiter won seven gold medals with Team USA in addition to a number of other medals.

#### DOUBLE DUKE

• Tyler Duke's transfer from Ohio State to Michigan has reunited the Duke brothers. Like the elder Duke, Dylan, Tyler played his final two years of junior hockey with the US National Team Development Program, where he played alongside defense partner Seamus Casey as well as forwards Rutger McGroarty/Frank Nazar III.

• U-M has a history of brothers playing together, including Luca & Adam Fantilli, Nick & Michael Pastujov, and many more going all the way back to Gib & Eldon James in the 30s.

#### THE CATHEDRAL OF COLLEGE HOCKEY

Yost is tied with Hobey Baker Rink (Princeton) as the 2nd-oldest arena in college hockey, trailing only Northeastern's Matthews Arena. \*Yost did not serve as a rink until 1973

#### WEST JERSEY

New Jersey is the only NHL organization with multiple draft picks on the roster; their two prospects (Ethan Edwards/Seamus Casey) will look to follow the pipeline that was recently traveled by All-American defenseman Luke Hughes.

#### **B1G TOURNEY TIME**

• Through 24 games in the modern Big Ten conference tournament, Michigan is 17-7 and has claimed a trio of championships (2016, 2022,

2023). In addition to owning the record for most overall Big Ten Tournament wins, U-M is 10-0 all-time when seeded second.

• Michigan's most common opponent in Big Ten tournament history is Minnesota, with last year's Championship being the seventh overall meeting between the two schools.

#### **U-M HOCKEY TURNED 100**

• Last season, Michigan hockey celebrated the 100th anniversary of its first game (Jan. 12, 1923 vs. Wisconsin) under inaugural Head Coach Joseph Barss. Over the past century of intercollegiate competition, the program has gone 1791-1144-175 (.604) in 3,110 all-time games.

• Michigan is tied for the most national championships (9) in college hockey as well as the most NCAA tournament appearances (40). The Wolverines stand along with the most Frozen Four appearances (27) of any program in college hockey, including the past two seasons.

 $\cdot$  U-M made 22 consecutive NCAA tournaments under Red Berenson from 1991-2012, a record that looks to last, as no other program has reached more than 15 consecutive tournaments.

• As a WIHL, MCHL, WCHA, CCHA, and B1G conference member, U-M has won 19 regularseason championships and 12 tournament titles for 31 overall conference crowns.


