FIRST PITCH

Penn State welcomes Kent State for a doubleheader at Beard Field and Nittany Lion Softball Park. First pitch is set for 3 p.m. Wednesday with a second game to follow.

ON THE HORIZON

After hosting Kent State, the Nittany Lions travel to Iowa for their final road series of the season beginning at 7 p.m. ET Friday. Penn State wraps up the regular season with a three-game set against Nebraska at Beard Field May 4-6.

A GLIMPSE OF THE GOLDEN FLASHES

Kent State has dropped just three of its last 11 outings, claiming victories in seven while tying Robert Morris April 9. The squad is coming off a two-game sweep of Western Michigan April 20-21. Kim Kirkpatrick has been the most consistent threat for the Flashes, posting a .322 average at the plate and a team-best three home runs. Abbey Ledford leads the squad with 16 RBI, followed by Lauren Grimes (14) and Shelbi Tilton (13).

Emma Johnson has claimed the bulk of the work in the circle, tossing 155.2 innings this season while posting a 16-8 record with a 1.80 ERA. Johnson has racked up 167 strikeouts while limiting opposing batters to a .192 average at the dish. Lauren McNeil has thrown 84.1 frames with a 4.23 ERA in 21 appearances in 2013.

A HISTORY OF THE SERIES

Penn State holds a 25-16 advantage in the all-time ledger. The teams have met on the diamond 12 of the last 13 seasons as the Nittany Lions accumulated an 18-5 record over that span.

THE BELL'S CHIME

Through April 21, senior outfielder Cassidy Bell ranked in the Top 15 nationally in home runs per game (5th/0.44), slugging percentage (1st/1.054), on-base percentage (3rd/.603), runs per game (7th/1.15), walks per game (9th/0.88) and batting average (11th/.464). Bell is sixth in the nation in home runs (18), just five off leader Megan Baltzell from Longwood.

With a home run in the first inning against Ohio State April 13, Bell broke the Penn State single-season record with her 17th of the season, passing Jennifer Tripken's mark of 16 from 2002. Bell hit her 18th of the season April 17 against Purdue to break her tie with Shannon Salsburg (1995-98) at the top of the career leaderboard, posting the 35th of her career. Noting her offensive capabilities, opposing

teams have opted to intentionally walk Bell 14 times this season.

CHASING HISTORY

Multiple Nittany Lions will have opportunities to leave their names in the program career record book when the season is finished. Bell is currently second in batting average (.357), first in home runs (35) and total bases (356), second in runs (133), tied for fourth in doubles (38) and RBI (107), tied for third in walks (92), sixth in hits (199) and tied for 10th in stolen bases (38).

The 2013 season has been efficient for the senior, as Bell currently holds the top spot with a .464 batting average, holds the title with 18 home runs and 43 runs scored, ranks third in total bases (118), fourth in RBI (39).

Kailyn Johnson is tied for fifth all-time in walks (87), sits in 11th in doubles (30) and is within striking distance of hits (148), home runs (15), total bases (223) and RBI (75).

BOMBS AWAY

As a team, Penn State is 49th in the nation in home runs per game (0.95). Six Lions have recorded two or more this season while the team has produced 14 of its total of 39 (36%) in the last 10 contests. The trio of Bell, Furuya and Johnson has recorded three apiece over that span while Jones has contributed a pair and Habitz, Hatfield and Yao have each hit one.

On the season, Bell leads with 18, followed by Jones (5), Furuya (4), Johnson (4), Habitz (3), Yao (2) while Abeyta, Hatfield and Presto have one apiece.

BOOKENDS

Seniors and freshmen account for 150 of the squad's 167 RBI (90%) and 254 of 298 hits (85%) this season. Of the team's eight first-year players, four (Furuya, Habitz, Jones, Knief) have started 20 or more contests. The senior trio of Bell, Johnson and Renwick has started every game they have played this season while Hutchinson and Yao have been in the starting lineup in 37 and 31 games, respectively.

Defensively, Jones has thrown 139.0 of the team's 257.1 (54%) innings from the circle. She has accounted for all but one win this season while tossing 10 complete games with a team-best 86 strikeouts.



WALK THE LINE

Penn State drew 24 walks against Northwestern to account for a fifth of the team's season total of 125. Bell drew three in each game while five other players reached first on balls at least twice, including Johnson (4), Jones (3), Sovereign (2), Renwick (2) and Yao (2).

TO BE THE BEST

Bell was named a finalist for the USA Softball Player of the Year Award April 11. She is one of 11 seniors on the 25-player list.

Ten finalists will make the May 8 list before the group is narrowed to the three May 22. The winner of the award will be announced in the lead-up to the 2013 NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City May 28.

LIVE ON YOUR SCREEN

The May 5 clash with Nebraska has been added to the Big Ten Network schedule and will be aired live. The game will be the third of the season for the Nittany Lions on BTN as the team split an April 17 doubleheader with Purdue.

QUITE THE SLATE!

Ten of Penn State's 2013 opponents are listed in the April 23 ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, including top-ranked Oklahoma. Other opponents include Texas (No. 7), Michigan (No. 9), LSU (No. 12), Washington (No. 13), Texas A&M (No. 15), Nebraska (No. 20), Arizona (No. 23) and while Hofstra and North Carolina receiving votes. Nine of the 10 programs are represented in the current USA Today/NFCA rankings, plus Iowa.

OUR STORY SO FAR

Penn State played its first 23 games away from home, including 1,000-plus mile trips to New Mexico, Florida and California and a trip down the East Coast to North Carolina, before opening its home schedule with a series against Michigan March 29-30. In all, the Lions traveled more than 12,000 miles over the first five weekends of play.

NORTHWESTERN

The Nittany Lions and Wildcats waited out an hour and a half rain delay Friday before combining to score 31 runs in a three-plus hour contest Saturday afternoon, the most for a Penn State game since March 22, 2009, in an 18-15 loss to Illinois. Northwestern took all three decisions over the weekend despite five Penn Staters batting .375 or better, led by Bell's .667 mark. Sovereign (.500), Johnson (.400), Hutchinson (.400) and Hatfield (.375) all topped that clip while Furuya led the team with five RBI and a pair of home runs.

PURDUE

Penn State claimed an 8-4 in the opener of the doubleheader behind the strength of six doubles, including three in the third as Jones picked up her 10th win of the season. In the first PSU at-bat of game two, Bell launched the 35th home run of her career to set the school record before the Boilermakers chugged back to force the split with a 12-3 victory.

OHIO STATE

The Lions narrowly dropped the Friday (2-0) and Sunday (4-3) contests by close scores while dropping all three to Ohio State. Renwick was outstanding, batting .500 with five singles and a run. Bell finished .375 at the plate with a pair of runs, a HR and three walks for a .545 on-base percentage. Habitz, Johnson, Jones and Yao each hit a home run, as well. Jones threw 13.2 of the team's 17.2 innings, accumulating a 3.07 ERA while limiting Buckeye batters to a .261 clip at the dish.

SAINT FRANCIS (PA) AND PITTSBURGH

Penn State took both of its midweek contests against Saint Francis (Pa.) and Pittsburgh, topping the Red Flash at home, 4-1, Tuesday before downing the Panthers, 11-7, on the road Wednesday. Jones picked up the wins in the circle both games while Johnson set a personal-best with five RBI and three hits and runs against the Panthers.

INDIANA

Penn State grabbed its first conference win of the season after taking the middle game of the set against the Hoosiers April 5-7. The Lions tossed their second shutout of the season as Macy Jones pitched 6.2 innings of scoreless work and the trio of Alyssa Renwick, Lexi Knief and Reina Furuya accounted for the three RBI.

MICHIGAN STATE

The Nittany Lions could not derail the Spartans undefeated start to Big Ten season as they dropped a pair of contests in a Wednesday afternoon doubleheader in East Lansing, Mich., 4-1 and 7-1, respectively.

Shannon Hutchinson, Jones and Kailyn Johnson each tallied a pair of hits on the day, led by Jones' two doubles. Hutchinson and Furuya accounted for both of Penn State's RBI.

In the start in game one, Jones tossed her sixth complete game of the year, allowing three earned runs on eight hits while striking out six Spartans. In the second game, starting pitcher Christy Von Pusch went 3.2 innings for the Nittany Lions, including three scoreless frames to open

the game, before finishing with five earned runs on six hits. Jordan Wheatley closed out the game, relieving Von Pusch in the fourth. Wheatley allowed just two hits over the final 2.1 innings.

MICHIGAN

The Wolverines claimed victory in all three contests over Penn State's Big Ten and home-opening weekend. Freshman Reina Furuya led the Lions with clutch hitting, producing four RBI, a pair of runs and a home run while senior Cassidy Bell followed with three RBI with a home run and a pair of singles. Kailyn Johnson added two RBI with a double over the series. Liz Presto and Alyssa Sovereign tallied one RBI apiece.

JUDI GARMAN CLASSIC

Penn State faced its toughest competition of the season at the Judi Garman Classic in Fullerton, Calif., March 15-17, taking on four teams ranked 16th or higher nationally at the time, including top-ranked Oklahoma.

The Nittany Lions benefited from a three-RBI effort from Abeyta to escape with a 7-6 win over DePaul as Macy Jones tossed her fourth complete game of the season in the victory.

UNDER ARMOUR SHOWCASE

The team downed Loyola (Chicago) after giving up a contest to Central Michigan in the middle of the week before finishing 2-3 at the Under Armour Showcase with wins over Toledo and Maine in Clearwater, Fla.

Yao led the squad with five RBI, all against Western Michigan with a pair of doubles. Bell, Jones and Johnson added three RBI apiece.

CITRUS CLASSIC

The Blue and White battled cold conditions and strong gusts at the Citrus Classic in Orlando, Fla., the following weekend as they finished the tournament 0-4, including one-run losses to then-No. 11 LSU and Longwood.

Bell added five RBI to her season total after finishing the weekend 7-12 (.583) at the plate with two doubles and two home runs. Freshman Taylor Abeyta posted three RBI over three games, while classmate Karlie Habitz and junior Kasie Hatfield recorded two each.

CAROLINA CLASSIC

After rainy weather washed out Penn State's games with George Washington and North Dakota State on the first day of the Carolina Classic in Chapel Hill, N.C., Alyssa Renwick bombed a sacrifice fly in the bottom of the eighth to score Lauren Yao to down Iowa State, 9-8, in eight innings before falling to North Carolina, 10-2.

Bell again led the team with six RBI while going 4-7 at the plate with a pair of home runs. Senior Alyssa Renwick and freshmen Lexi Knief and Habitz each finished .429 at the plate with three hits.

TROY COX CLASSIC

At the Troy Cox Classic in Las Cruces, N.M., the Nittany Lions rebounded to take the final two contests against New Mexico State and Missouri-Kansas City after dropping decisions to Colorado State,

NMSU and Texas Tech. Cassidy Bell and Macy Jones combined to tally 18 of the team's 26 RBI at the tournament as Bell led the team with a trio of home runs and Jones tossed 14.2 innings to collect both wins on the mound.

WHAT AN HONOR

Bell earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors after a standout weekend at the Troy Cox Classic in Las Cruces, N.M., the conference office announced Monday afternoon. The award is the second of her career and first for a Penn State player since Hatfield picked it up April 16, 2012.

Bell continued her offensive excellence from the 2012 season during Penn State's opening weekend in Las Cruces, N.M., Feb. 15-17. The senior center fielder pushed her current hitting streak to 16 contests by recording at least one hit in all five games at the tournament, including three multi-hit efforts. Bell hit .600 (9-15) from the plate and slugged 1.333 with a trio of home runs to finish the weekend with nine RBI while adding four stolen bases and five runs of her own on the base paths.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

Senior Cassidy Bell earned a spot on the 2013 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Watch list, the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) of America and USA Softball announced Feb. 1. Bell is the first Nittany Lion to make the preseason Top 50 list.

In addition, Bell and Hatfield were named to the preseason All-Big Ten first-team list by College Sports Madness.

Four student-athletes will join the Penn State softball program as freshmen in the 2013-14 academic year, head coach Robin Petrini announced Dec. 17. The recruiting class hails from around the country with Kristina Brackpool (Santa Clarita, Calif.) and Samantha Shanahan (Seattle, Wash.) hailing from the West, Shelby Miller (Fort Bend, Texas) traveling from the South and Mary Ward (Greencastle, Pa.) the lone Pennsylvania native.

ROBIN PETRINI

Head Coach • 17th Year
UTAH STATE '83

Seventeen years after arriving in Happy Valley, fans and foes alike know that Penn State head coach Robin Petrini has brought the Nittany Lions to a new level. Petrini's vision of taking a below average Big Ten team and building it into a force that expects a run to the NCAA Tournament every year. In the past 12 years alone, Petrini has guided the Nittany Lions to eight appearances in the NCAA Tournament, while her overall record stands at 455-371-2. Petrini owns the all-time mark for career wins by a Penn State coach and has the longest tenure of any PSU skipper.

With a quality coaching résumé, top-notch Division I playing credentials and unbridled ambition, Petrini and her staff have rebuilt a program that hadn't been to an NCAA Tournament since 1985 when she took the 2000 Lion squad to the national tournament.

"We've established a standard and our expectation is that we get to NCAAs every year. Now we're looking to improve upon that," stated Petrini. "We've been to the NCAAs eight times. It doesn't get any easier to accomplish that goal, but now we want to take it to the next level. We want to get to the next round of the NCAAs and move forward with our expectations of this program."

Since taking over in 1997, Petrini has upgraded the program to become nationally competitive. She brought on board an excellent coaching staff with competitive experience at the collegiate ranks and upgraded the schedule to include nationally prominent teams year in and year out. In 1999, she led the Nittany Lions to their first 30-win season since 1988 and earned Big Ten Co-Coach of the Year en route to a Big Ten Tournament bid. Since then, Petrini's teams have recorded seven more 30-win seasons, including 2006's 39-17 NCAA Tournament campaign, which set the school record for wins in a season.

More recently, Petrini overcame a three-year drought from the NCAA Tournament by taking the 2011 club not only to the event, but by hosting the NCAA Regionals at brand new Nittany Lion Softball Park and Beard Field. Petrini was instrumental in the building of the \$10.2 million, softball-only complex on Penn State's campus. In less than a year's time, the new facility has hosted the NCAA Tournament and all four levels of the PIAA Softball Championship.

Before Penn State

Petrini spent eight seasons at Northwestern University prior to her tenure at PSU. Named associate head coach in 1995-96, Petrini served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats from 1988-95. The primary

Northwestern recruiter, she was instrumental in assembling the 1997 class, regarded as one of the top-two in the nation.

During Petrini's appointment, Northwestern produced 12 All-Big Ten selections, as well as an All-American and several GTE Academic All-Americans. The Wildcats compiled 30-win seasons in four of her last five years, and finished fourth or better in the conference race five times during her eight seasons.

"I am a firm believer in the student-athlete concept," confided Petrini. "I am committed to making sure that our athletes are given the opportunity to be successful academically and athletically. I believe our athletes have the opportunity to get a quality education and play some of the finest softball in the country."

She continues that excellence with her Penn State teams, as well. While in Happy Valley, she has produced 33 All-Big Ten performers, 94 academic all-conference, 16 Academic All-District honorees, six overall Academic All-Americans, multiple National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Americans as well as three Academic All-American First Teamers including current assistant coach Jen McIntyre.

Prior to her position at Northwestern, Petrini spent five years at Brigham Young University, where she received her master's degree in physical education. After one season as the Cougars' assistant coach, she was promoted to head coach. Working without the aid of scholarships, she developed a nationally competitive program that beat a pair of top 20 teams in 1988.

A native of South San Francisco, Calif., Petrini is a 1983 graduate of Utah State University with bachelor's degrees in political science and physical education. She enjoyed a successful playing career as a four-year letterwinner and starting shortstop for the Aggies' 1980 and 1981 AIAW national championship squads. In September 2011, Petrini and her teammates from those national championship teams were inducted into the Utah State Athletics Hall of Fame. A three-time all-conference selection, she was also an All-America nominee. In the summer of 2003, she was inducted into the San Mateo County Sports Hall of Fame, which also includes the likes of Tom Brady and John Madden.
