MINNEAPOLIS - It's the seventh-straight week facing a nationally-ranked opponent for the No. 7/6 Minnesota men's hockey team as it faces No. 18 Penn State in a Big Ten Conference road series Dec. 1-2 at Pegula Ice Arena.

Game one is set for 6 p.m. (CT) Friday night, streaming live on B1G+ before the series concludes Saturday at 5 p.m. (CT) on the Big Ten Network and Fox Sports app. Audio coverage of each contest is also available on the Gopher Radio Network 1130 KTLK-AM/103.5 FM.

CHECK OUT THE NEW DIGS

For the first time in the 30 years since 3M Arena at Mariucci opened, a major public-facing renovation project took place during the offseason. It started with the installation of a state-of-the-art ice plant and more energy-efficient refrigeration system and continued with the shrinking of the ice sheet. The ice went from an Olympic size of 200-by-100 feet, down to a hybrid size of 200-by-89 feet, which more closely resembles an NHL ice sheet. The change in dimensions also added approximately 257 seats to the arena, making the official capacity 10,257. Updates to the dasher boards and glass will enhance player safety, while fans in attendance will also notice an increase in brightness inside the arena as a modern LED system was added.

STICK TAPS FOR ATHLETIC MEDICINE MILESTONE

It will be a milestone night Friday for Minnesota's Assistant Athletic Director/Head Athletic Trainer Jeff Winslow as he will work his 500th career NCAA hockey game since joining the program in 2009-10.

TRENDING UP IN NOVEMBER

Behind a 4-1-3 record during the month of November, the Gophers remain a top-10 team after moving up one spot to No. 7 in the USCHO.com national poll and up two spots in the USA Hockey/The Rink Live poll to No. 6. Minnesota played all eight games in November against teams ranked in the top 20 and 17 different players recorded at least one point in the month for the Maroon and Gold.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE EXTRA MAN

Special teams were pivotal in Minnesota's series sweep of the Tommies as it converted 50 percent of their power-play chances (3-of-6). The Gophers were then held scoreless across its next 15 opportunities with a man advantage, spanning six games until Aaron Huglen broke the streak with a tally at Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 4. That kick-started an improving trend where the team has a power-play goal in five of its last seven games, totaling seven goals in that span. A 3-for-5 effort on the man advantage against Michigan State Nov. 26 helped raise Minnesota's success rate five points to 23.8 percent, jumping up to 14th in the nation. Bryce Brodzinski and Jaxon Nelson lead the active Gophers with 11 career power-play goals, while Jimmy Snuggerud also has reached double figures with 10.

SAME SCRIPT FOR BRODZINSKI

Bryce Brodzinski is playing some of the best hockey of his career and thanks to a five-point weekend against Michigan State, was named the Big Ten Conference First Star of the Week Nov. 28. The team's leading scorer increased his point total to 16 over the weekend behind three power-play goals and two assists. The fifth-year senior matched his career high with four points Sunday versus the Spartans, recording his second multi-goal performance this season and ninth of his career. He has posted nine points during a four-game point streak, including three multi-point outings in that stretch, and is just one point away from 100 as a Gopher. The Blaine, Minn., product is following a similar script to a season ago when he registered 16 points from Oct. 28 to Dec. 10, whereas in 2023-24 he has 14 points in a span that's two weeks shorter.

GOPHER NOTES CONTINUED

PITLICK STAR POWER

Rhett Pitlick led the Gophers with a four-point weekend in another nationally-ranked rivalry series, registering multi-point efforts in both games against No. 14 Minnesota Duluth to earn Big Ten Conference Second Star of the Week honors Nov. 7. The junior had a goal and an assist in the home win Friday before adding a two-assist night Saturday in a tie on the road. After being held off the scoresheet at Michigan, the Plymouth, Minn., native went right back to work, recording multiple points in three of the next four games as he now has 12 points across his last nine contests. After scoring his first power-play goal of the year, second of his career, Sunday against Michigan State, Pitlick extended his goal-scoring streak to four games.

SAM THE SETUP MAN

Freshman Sam Rinzel continues to help drive Minnesota's offense early in his career and leads the team in assists with nine, including six over his last eight games. That includes three multiassist performances, coming against St. Thomas on opening night (Oct. 13), at Minnesota Duluth (Nov. 4), and a home overtime win over Michigan State (Nov. 26) where he setup the game winner. The Chanhassen, Minn., native is tied for fourth in the national rankings in terms of assists by a freshman defenseman and tied for ninth in the NCAA for total assists by a rookie.

CONSISTENTLY NELSON

Jaxon Nelson has been a consistent producer on the offensive end for the Gophers this season and has a point in 11 of 14 games played. Going back to the postseason a year ago, he has a point in 16 of 20 outings, including a stretch of nine-consecutive games. He set a career high by tallying three assists in his first multi-point effort this season, 10th of his career, in the series finale against Michigan State. The Magnolia, Minn., product has also won 53 percent of faceoffs taken and his 161 wins on the draw are ranked 11th nationally after he won 20-of-28 (71 percent) in Sunday's win over the Spartans.

KEEPING UP WITH KURTH

Connor Kurth averaged a point per game during the month of November with eight points in eight outings, including multi-assist performances at Michigan (Nov. 10) and against Notre Dame (Nov. 18). The sophomore scored a goal in consecutive games versus Michigan State last weekend, the second time during his career with goals in back-to-back games and first since Oct. 2-7, 2022. Kurth is currently riding a career-long, three-game point streak as he continues to showcase his skillset on the ice and is just two points shy of his freshman total of 11.

HISTORY WITH THE NITTANY LIONS

Minnesota and Penn State share a short history as the two teams first met at the inception of the Big Ten Conference in 2014. The Gophers lead the all-time series with a record of 24-17-1 (.583), but are just 10-9-1 in road games, while all 42 meetings have come with at least one team ranked in the national polls. The Maroon and Gold won both meetings of a top-10 matchup at Pegula Ice Arena in February a season ago following an early November split at 3M Arena at Mariucci.

INSIDE LOOK AT PENN STATE

The Nittany Lions enter the weekend in sixth place (eight points) in the Big Ten Conference standings

but have played two fewer games than three of the teams ahead of them. Penn State has won three straight and coming of a lopsided home sweep over Lindenwood by a 16-4 scoring margin. The offensive outburst pushed the team to the NCAA's fifth-highest scoring average at 4.1 goals per game, while they remain 35th defensively, allowing 3.1 goals per game. Freshman Aiden Fink ranks eighth nationally with 1.4 points per game, pacing the Nittany Lions in goals (9) and assists (12), including 12 points over his last four outings to earn a Big Ten Conference weekly award in two-straight weeks. Goaltenders Liam Souliere and Noah Grannan have split the starts the previous five weeks and posted goals-against averages of 3.04 and 2.52, respectively.

READY FOR THE CHALLENGE

Thanks to the rise in quality of hockey across the Big Ten Conference, the full schedule for the Maroon and Gold will again be a challenge from start to finish. After facing the nation's No. 2 strength of schedule according to USCHO last year, the 2023-24 slate will be no different as 32 of 34 games are against opponents ranked in the top 20 or receiving votes in the preseason national polls. Minnesota holds a 3-1-2 record against top-10 opponents this season and now faces its seventh-consecutive opponent that's ranked in the top 20.

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE FIRST

During a five-game stretch from Oct. 20 to Nov. 3, a Gopher scored the first goal of their collegiate career in four of those outings. Freshman Oliver Moore got things started with a goal at North Dakota (Oct. 20) and was followed by sophomore Charlie Strobel's first tally versus Wisconsin (Oct. 26). The next night it was freshman Jimmy Clark that lit the lamp against the Badgers before sophomore Cal Thomas joined the fun, scoring for the first time in 47 career games from the blue line in a home win over Minnesota Duluth (Nov. 3).

ATTENDANCE CONTINUES TO RISE

According to data compiled by College Hockey Inc., attendance in NCAA Division I men's hockey was up 15 percent nationwide from 2021-22 to 2022-23. The 'U' had the second-highest home attendance of any college hockey team last year, averaging 9,156 patrons per game and that number has only increased at the start of 2023-24, jumping up to 9,699 through eight contests thanks to three sellouts inside the renovated arena, including the second-highest attendance in 3M Arena at Mariucci history (10,739) against Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 3. All five true road games for the Maroon and Gold have come in front of a sellout crowd, while the neutral-site contest against St. Thomas brought more than 11,000 patrons to the venue.

MILESTONE WATCH FOR BRODZINSKI

Fifth-year senior Bryce Brodzinski entered his final season of college hockey as the NCAA's active leader in career games played (146) and career goals (46). He is coming off his best year for the Maroon and Gold when he posted 19 goals and 12 assists for 31 points in 2022-23 and was named to the All-Tournament Team at the NCAA Fargo Regional as its Most Outstanding Player behind a hat trick and four-point performance against Canisius. Brodzinski caught fire down the stretch and tallied 10 goals over the final 15 games a year ago. The Blaine, Minn., native recently joined an elite company in Minnesota's historic program as the 61st player to reach the 50-goal milestone when he scored twice in a home win over Minnesota





Duluth on Nov. 3. He is the first Gopher to hit the scoring mark since Tyler Sheehy did so on Dec. 8, 2018, and is one of five to score 50 goals since 2010. Brodzinski is now chasing the all-time games played record, which currently stands at 182 by Larry Olimb (1988-92), while he sits one point away from reaching 100 in his career.

LAMB SCORES SECOND STAR Brody Lamb paced the offense during a road series victory over the No. 8/9 Wolverines as he totaled four points in the two games, which helped him gain distinction as the Big Ten Conference's Second Star of the Week on Nov. 14. The sophomore recorded the first three-point performance of his career Friday night with a goal and two assists, including the game winner with 3:28 remaining in regulation. He followed that effort by adding a power-play goal Saturday, his first goal on a man advantage this year, that tied the game during the second period. Lamb has already surpassed his point total from a season ago when he finished with four goals and four assists for eight points as a freshman and is currently tied for fourth in the Gophers' scoring race with 11 points in 14 games this season.

TWO STEPS CLOSER FOR THE STAR

Behind a brilliant weekend between the pipes for Minnesota, goaltender Justen Close was named the B1G First Star of the Week Oct. 24. The graduate student made 25 saves in a road win at No. 5 North Dakota for his second-straight shutout before his streak was snapped at 153:58 in the second period Oct. 21. He turned away 57-of-59 shots faced against the Fighting Hawks for a 1.01 goals-against average and a .966 save percentage. The Kindersley, Saskatchewan, native's shutout Friday was the 11th of his Gophers' career, and he sits two shy of the program record held by Kellen Briggs and Adam Wilcox. Close has come up clutch for Minnesota over the last six outings by making at least 37 saves in four of those games, including a career-high 41 saves in an overtime win against Michigan State Nov. 26.

STARRING "SNUGGY SNIPES"

Jimmy Snuggerud put on a show during the Gophers' opening weekend sweep of St. Thomas, totaling five points on four goals and one assist and was named B1G First Star of the Week for his efforts. The sophomore scored twice in each contest, including the game winner both nights, and recorded the sixth, three-point performance of

his career in the season opener Oct. 13. It was the first time he registered back-to-back, multi-goal games for the Maroon and Gold. He continues to be tied for the team lead by lighting the lamp eight times in 14 games, tying for 18th in the NCAA.

SHOOTOUT WOES

The Gophers have gone into three shootouts in 2023-24, and they've failed to convert any of their eight chances in a shootout this season, suffering losses to Minnesota Duluth (Nov. 4), Michigan (Nov. 11), and Michigan State (Nov. 26). Minnesota's all-time record stands at 4-17 in shootouts dating back to 1988, which includes a 2-13 mark against Rig Ten engagenets. Big Ten opponents.

TRYING TO AVOID THE PENALTY BOX

The Gophers were the third-least penalized team in the NCAA a season ago, averaging just 7.5 penalty minutes per contest. That number dropped slightly to begin 2023-24 as Minnesota was called for double-digit penalty minutes in three-straight games but is now back on track after sitting in the box for eight minutes or less in eight of the the box for eight minutes or less in eight of the previous nine outings. The Gophers are now sixth nationally, averaging 8.1 penalty minutes per game. Despite holding the opposition scoreless on all 16 power-play chances across the opening four contests, that switched drastically over a sixgame stretch from Oct. 26 to Nov. 11 where the team erased only 9-of-16 penalties, a rate of 56.2 percent, and currently ranks 34th in the country at 80.0 percent 80.0 percent.

PICKED FOR A THREE PEAT

The Gophers are trying to do something only they have done in the 10-year history of college hockey in the Big Ten Conference and that is to win three-straight regular season titles. SHOWCASING THE STATE OF HOCKEY
With five of the six members of the Gophers freshman class hailing from the State of Hockey as well as graduate transfer Nick Michel, the 2023-24 roster now features nearly 90 percent homegrown talent. Of the 26 players on the team, 23 grew up and played youth hockey inside the state lines, including all 22 skaters. Even more impressive is the fact that 17 of the Minnesotans on the team are from within 40 miles the Minnesotans on the team are from within 40 miles of campus. In total, 233 student-athletes on NCAA rosters are from the Land of 10,000 Lakes, nearly 100 more than any other state in the country.

OUTSOURCED NETMINDERS

The only three players not from the state of Minnesota are all goaltenders as Justen Close returns for his fifth campaign, while fellow netminder Nathan Airey fifth campaign, while tellow netminder Nathan Airey joins the team for his freshman season. Both players have come to campus from Canadian cities within 250 miles of Calgary as Close is originally from Kindersley, Saskatchewan and Airey from Cochrane, Alberta. Close was the SJHL Goaltender of the Year in 2017-18 and 2018-19 with the Kindersley Klippers before Airey was awarded the Michael Garteig Trophy as the BCHL's top goaltender in 2022-23 playing for the Cranbrook Bucks. The Gophers officially added a fourth goalie to the roster when Matt Bryant, a native of La Crosse, Wis joined mid-season from Minnesota's club team Wis., joined mid-season from Minnesota's club team.

FRESH FACES ON THE BLUE LINE
Following the departure of three defenseman to NHL contracts, the blue line will undergo a drastic overhaul for the 2023-24 campaign. The Gophers turn to a youthful backend featuring three sophomores and three freshmen that will be mentored by a pair of seniors in Mike Koster and Carl Fish. Ryan Chesley, Luke Mittelstadt and Cal Thomas return to the roster after getting a full year of college hockey experience as each skater played at least 36 games. They will help bring newcomers Axel Begley, Sam Rinzel and Max Rud up to speed entering their Minnesota careers.

SIZING UP

The three additions to the Gophers blue line all check in to the program at 6-feet, 2-inches or taller, adding a significant height increase for the roster. It brings the average height of the defensemen up to 6-1.5, led by Sam Rinzel's 6-4 frame along with Carl Fish and Max Rud at 6-3.

DRAFT SPOTLIGHT FOR 13

Thirteen of Minnesota's 25 rostered players have heard their names called in the NHL Entry Draft since 2019, including a pair of first-round selections that are part of this year's freshmen class. The Gophers have had the most all-time draft selections (239) by any NCAA men's backer program after adding four over the men's hockey program after adding four over the summer. At least one Gopher has been drafted in 49 of the last 50 NHL Entry Drafts dating back to 1974, with 2001 being the only exception. Boston College and Boston University are the only teams in the nation that have more draft picks (14) on their NCAA rosters for the 2023-24 season than Minnesota.

EXPERIENCED LEADERSHIP CREW

The guys wearing a letter on the front of their redesigned Gophers jersey in 2023-24 bring together nearly 500 career games of college hockey experience as all four have skated in more than 100 contests.

Mike Koster and Jaxon Nelson were named captains for the tam, while Bryce Brodzinski and Mason Newers. the team, while Bryce Brodzinski and Mason Nevers were chosen as alternate captains heading into

the season. In the history of Minnesota hockey, 169 different players have served in a captain's role and remain in good hands with this year's crew.

RESTORING THE PRIDE ON ICE

Minnesota hockey has enjoyed a resurgence over the past three seasons, reaching the NCAA Tournament each year, including consecutive trips to the NCAA Frozen Four. The rising success has been showcased by holding a 6-3 record at the national tournament where the Gophers have outscored opponents 36-22 in those contests, increasing their all-time NCAA win total to 61, the most of any college hockey program. The Gophers have pushed their win total from 24 in a shortened 2020-21 to 26 in 2021-22 up to 29 a season ago. In five of the six seasons with Coach Motzko at the helm, Minnesota has been ranked in the top five of the national polls at some point.

MIX OF YOUNG AND OLD

As of opening night (Oct. 13), the average age of each player on the Minnesota roster will be 21 years and 177 days old (21.48 years), making it one of the youngest rosters in the nation. The Gophers are tied for ninth in average age (per stats from College Hockey Inc.) with fellow Big Ten members Michigan and Notre Dame. Justen Close, Carl Fish and Nick Michel were all born before 2000, while four players have 2004 birth years. before 2000, while four players have 2004 birth years. Oliver Moore is the only player born in 2005 and checks in as the youngest player in the lineup for the Maroon and Gold this season.

BROUGHT BACK THE GOALS

The Gophers closed 2022-23 as the nation's highestscoring offense after averaging 4.2 goals per game. Thanks to the return of five players that reached double-digit goals a season ago, Minnesota begins the new year as the nation's leader in returning offense, bringing back 108 total goals from 13 different bringing back 108 total goals from 13 different players. Jimmy Snuggerud paces the group of Gophers and is the second-highest returning scorer to college hockey following a 21-goal freshman campaign. Bryce Brodzinski's career-best 19 goals last season showcased his ability to light the lamp, while Rhett Pitlick (11), Jaxon Nelson (10) and Mason Nevers (10) joined the double-digit scorers and will look to power the offense again in 2023-24.

YEAR SIX FOR COACH MOTZKO

The 2023 Spencer Penrose Coach of the Year award winner, Minnesota head coach Bob Motzko recently received a two-year contract extension to remain with the Maroon and Gold through 2027-27. He currently owns a 120-64-15 record after leading the Gophers to back-to-back trips to the NCAA Frozen Four and three-straight, 24-plus-win campaigns. He is the seventh coach in program history to reach the 100-win milestone and has earned the title of B1G Coach of the Year three times in the last four seasons. His all-time record as a head coach stands at 396-256-64 in 19 seasons and is a seven-time conference coach of the year honoree during his illustrious tenure.

GOPHER PIPELINE TO THE NHL

After seeing 33 players take part in National Hockey League training camps, 21 former Golden Gophers League training camps, 21 former Golden Gophers men's hockey players earned an opening-night roster spot for the 2023-24 season, while Ryan Johnson, Vinni Lettieri, and Sammy Walker have been early-season call ups. Minnesota had an NCAA-best 26 former skaters in the NHL last season, increasing the all-time number of Gophers in the NHL to an NCAA-best 123 before Logan Cooley and Johnson made their debuts as No. 124 and 125, respectively. This year the Maroon and Gold has begun the campaign as one of two NCAA programs with 20 or more players with a lineup spot programs with 20 or more players with a lineup spot in the NHL.


