MORE THAN JUST IN-STATE FOES

The lacrosse community is tight-knit, but Penn State's 101-year relationship with Penn has produced even more connections. In 1913, the Nittany Lions' first collegiate game was a 4-3 win over the Quakers. Redshirt sophomore **Drake Kreinz** is playing against his younger brother Austin, a sophomore at Penn, for the first time in their careers. Penn's volunteer assistant Austin Kaut is one of the most decorated goalies in Penn State history, the program's only three-time All-American.

AROUND THE HORN

To start the season, nine-or-more Nittany Lions have scored at least one goal. TJ Sanders and Nick Aponte have netted six goals. Middies Matt Florence and Mike Sutton are posting four tallies, Pat Manley has a trio of markers, Kyle Baier recorded a pair of goals against Vermont and Tripp Traynor, Matt Sexton and Brian Prestreau each scored a goal.

CONN MAN

Connor Darcey wasted no time making a statement in the cage this season, his first as a starter. The redshirt sophomore's 42 saves in the opening three games of the season are the most to kick off a Penn State campaign since 2006. His 14.00 saves per game are the most in the Big Ten and rank eighth in the nation, while his 0.609 save percentage is the 11th-best in the NCAA. In his first collegiate start, against Vermont, Darcey made 15 saves, the most of any Big Ten goalie in action during the day en route to his first collegiate win. His efforts earned him the first-ever Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week award.

SWEET FLO

Matt Florence has made an immediate impact since transferring to Penn State this year. In the season opener, Florence scored a hat trick and added two assists, the first three-goal performance in a Penn State debut since 2002. He also scored the game's first goal at Loyola and added assists against the Greyhounds and at Villanova.

CLEAR VISIBILITY

For the first year of Big Ten Lacrosse, the Nittany Lions will be available to more people than ever before. All of Penn State's Big Ten games will be broadcast live on television. The Ohio State and Johns Hopkins games will air on ESPNU, and the Maryland, Rutgers and Michigan games are slated for the Big Ten Network. The Big Ten Network will also show every contest of the Big Ten Men's Lacrosse Tournament.

ROAD WARRIORS

For the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, the Nittany Lions will be faced with a huge test. Just four of Penn State's games will be played in Happy Valley, the fewest of any Big Ten team. Penn State also plays a pair of neutral site games against Marist (at Babson College) and Denver (at Hofstra), alongside seven true road games.

PENN STATE OPENS 2015 WITH 15-8 WIN

Two Nittany Lions recorded hat tricks and **Connor Darcey** earned the first win in the first start of his collegiate career, leading the No. 14/17 Penn State men's lacrosse team to a season-opening 15-8 win over Vermont on Feb. 7. Penn State's offensive output was evenly distributed throughout the game. In both the third and fourth quarters, the Blue and

GAMEDAY CENTRAL

SCOUTING THE QUAKERS

No. 16/11 Penn comes to Happy Valley after an 11-7 loss to No. 11 Maryland on Tuesday. Against the Terps, the Quakers were 3-for-6 with the extra man, with the goals netted by Joe McCallion, who leads the team with eight tallies this season. Penn's two wins to open the season have been nail-biters, with the team out-scoring its opponent 21-18 in those victories. In all of the Quakers' 2015 contests, Jimmy Sestilio started the game and John Lopes played the final 30 minutes. The duo has a combined 9.25 goals against average and .500 save percentage.

SERIES HISTORY vs. PENN

The Nittany Lions and the Quakers face each other for the 37th time with Penn State holding a 22-13-1 series record. The teams haven't battled since May 7, 1977, when Penn State fell to Penn, 24-10. The Nittany Lions' first game in program history was against Penn on May 24, 1913, a 4-3 Nittany Lion win.

PSU VOTED THIRD IN BIG TEN POLL

Penn State has been picked to finish third in the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse by the conference's coaches, as announced in the preseason poll. Additionally, 2014 Academic All-Big Ten honorees JP Burnside, Drake Kreinz and TJ Sanders were named Penn State's Players to Watch. Sitting atop the preseason list was preseason No. 5 Johns Hopkins, which made its record 42nd NCAA Tournament appearance in 2014. Earning berths to the second-most NCAA postseasons at 37, preseason No. 8 Maryland came in second. Ohio State, Rutgers and Michigan rounded out the poll.

RICHARDS DRAFTED IN MLL

Senior **Michael Richards** was tabbed 45th overall in the 2015 Major League Lacrosse (MLL) Collegiate Draft by the Denver Outlaws on Jan. 23 in Baltimore. Richards joins Shane Sturgis (New York Lizards) and Tom LaCrosse (Ohio Machine), both of whom exhausted eligibility in 2014 and were picked in the 2015 Supplemental Draft, as selections by one of the MLL's eight teams in the U.S.A. and Canada. Richards appeared in all of the Nittany Lions' contests last season, making 10 starts in the midfield. The 2014 Academic All-Big Ten honoree recorded six points, collected 20 ground balls and caused four turnovers.

LIONS TABBED IN PRESEASON POLLS

The Nittany Lions earned a No. 14 ranking in the 2015 United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) Division I Preseason Coaches Poll after being picked 15th in the Nike/Lacrosse Magazine Preseason Top-20. The inaugural season of Big Ten lacrosse features six regular season opponents listed in the top-20. Both of Penn State's preseason scrimmages were against top-20 teams, No. 20 Army and No. 18 Lehigh. In the Nike/Lacrosse Magazine Preseason Top-20, the Nittany Lions held the third-highest ranking among Big Ten teams. In total, four of the conference's six squads appeared on the list. The Blue and White will face eight teams ranked in the Top-20: topranked Denver, No. 5 Johns Hopkins, No. 8 Maryland, No. 9 Loyola (Md.), No. 11 Penn, No. 12 Harvard, No. 14 Lehigh and No. 20 Ohio State.

ZITTEL NAMED TEAM CAPTAIN

Senior Kyle Zittel was named the 2015 Penn State men's lacrosse team captain, the program's first solo team captain since 1978. "He has assumed the lead role immediately after the season ended last spring and has, in doing so, earned the respect of his teammates and our staff," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "Kyle's effort, selflessness, integrity and character made him an obvious choice." A defensive midfielder. Zittel played in all 13 games for the Nittany Lions, picking up a career-best 11 ground balls and causing four turnovers. Zittel also excels in the classroom. The science major has a cumulative 3.5 grade point average and earned a 4.0 grade point average during the fall 2013 semester.

11TH-RANKED CLASS JOINS PSU

The Penn State men's lacrosse team finalized its roster for the 2014-15 academic year as head coach Jeff Tambroni announced 11 newcomers. The recruiting class is ranked 11th by Inside Lacrosse. The 11-member class features a transfer from Virginia, Matt Florence as well as three Under Armour All-Americans: Ryan Keenan, Tanner Peck and Will Schreiner. Keenan, Peck and Schreiner were ranked 6th, 36th and 47th, respectively by Inside Lacrosse in their freshman rankings. Joining them on that list are **Mike Aronow** at No. 66 and **Tyler Butler** at No. 96. **Chris** Isenberg, Hunter Pearl, Tripp Traynor, Josh Wellman and Chris Young complete Tambroni's incoming crew.

TAMBRONI IN HIS FIFTH SEASON

Guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni is in his fifth season as Penn State's head coach in 2015. With a 35-24 record, Tambroni has guided his Nittany Lion teams to .500-or-better records in each of his four seasons at the helm.

Guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni is in his fifth season as Penn State's head coach in 2015.

In 2014, Tambroni led Penn State to its fourth consecutive above-.500 season. His student-athletes earned the eighth USILA All-American and third Scholar All-America honors of Tambroni's Penn State career. He also coached goalkeeper Austin Kaut to his school record third All-America honor and conference-best All-CAA First Team award.

Penn State's 2013 campaign saw Tambroni lead Penn State to one of the greatest seasons in program history while celebrating its 100th season. The Nittany Lions set new records for wins (12) and earned the program's first outright regular season conference title by sweeping the CAA with a 6-0 record. PSU rattled off 10 straight wins during the months of March, April and May to earn the school's third NCAA bid and first chance to host an NCAA game.

Tambroni was named CAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2011), while goalkeeper Austin Kaut (under Tambroni's tutelage) was named Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalie. Also, Kaut was CAA Player and Defensive Player of the Year. Freshman TJ Sanders was named Rookie of the Year and the Nittany Lions placed six on the All-CAA First Team.

During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a second-place CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees.

Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.

During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.

Penn State (1-2) won the ground ball battle, collecting 26 to Villanova's 22. The Nittany Lions also dominated at the 'X', with **Drake Kreinz** (Delafield, Wisc.) winning 14 of 21 attempts. Penn State went 1-for-4 on the man-up, while the Wildcats were 2-for-4.

Villanova out-shot the Nittany Lions, 44-29. Sanders led Penn State with eight shots, and Aponte took seven shots, a career best. **Connor Darcey** (Wellesley, Mass.) recorded 13 saves, while Greg Stamatov and Dan Willis combined for nine saves

The Wildcats (1-1) dominated in the first 20 minutes of the game, taking a 6-1 advantage midway through the second quarter. The Nittany Lions' lone goal of the first came 3:25 into the game, when Sanders let loose a quick shot off of a Keenan pass from behind the net for the 2-1 score.

With 7:33 left in the second quarter, the momentum swung in Penn State's direction, and the Blue and White caged the Wildcats for almost 13 minutes. Aponte was able to break away from the Villanova defense and ripped in his first of the contest. Sutton matched the tally less than two minutes later, when he picked up the ball following a **Pat Manley** (Arnold, Md.) blocked shot and scored from a distance, cutting the lead to 6-3.

Villanova was able to score only once again in the third quarter, 1:23 into the frame. The Nittany Lions responded with Aponte's second of the game after sending in a sidearm shot from the front of the net to keep the game within three.

The Wildcats regained control and rallied for a four-goal fourth quarter, despite a pair of goals from Aponte and a Sanders' marker on the man-up for the final 11-7 score.
