University of Iowa women's soccer takes on No. 5 Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament Semifinals. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. (CT) on Thursday at Lower.com Field in Columbus, Ohio.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

- Penn State is ranked fifth in the United Soccer Coaches Poll and is the Big Ten Tournament fourth-seed.
- The Nittany Lions downed No. 19 Indiana, 3-0, in the first round. Penn State finished 6-1-3 in conference play. A loss to No. 21 Wisconsin in the regular season finale thwarted dreams of a 21st regular season Big Ten Championship in Happy Valley.
- Coach Dambach has led Penn State to 11 Big Ten regular season titles, four Big Ten Tournament titles,
 15 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and, in 2015, the program's first NCAA Championship.
- Penn State leads the Big Ten defensively, averaging just 0.50 goals against this season.
- Goalkeeper Katherine Asman leads the league in goals against average (0.48) and save percentage (.895). Asman's save percentage ranks fifth nationally.
- Forward Kaitlyn McBean leads Penn State with 14 points on six goals and two assists; three other Nittany Lions have scored at least 11 points this season.
- Penn State is lowa's highest-ranked opponent in 2023; the Hawkeyes are 1-1-1 against ranked competition this season.

SERIES HISTORY - PENN STATE

lowa is 3-26-1 against Penn State in the all-time series. One of those victories came in the 2020-21 Big Ten Tournament Semifinals, when lowa knocked off fourth-ranked Penn State, 1-0, for the highest-ranked win in program history. The Hawkeyes went on to win the first conference tournament championship in program history. lowa and 24th-ranked Penn State tied, 2-2, last season at the lowa Soccer Complex.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- lowa stands at 10-4-4 overall. The Hawkeyes opened the year with a 6-0-1 non-conference record and finished eighth in the Big Ten Conference standings at 3-4-3 (12 points).
- The Big Ten Tournament bid is the sixth under Head Coach **Dave Dilanni** and 14th in program history.
 The Hawkeyes earned their first conference championship in the 2020-21 season.
- Coach Dilanni is in his 10th season at the helm of the lowa women's soccer program. lowa is led by
 eight players with at least three years of collegiate experience, including seventh-year player Josie

 Durr and fifth-year Samantha Cary, who was a captain last fall. Cary, a lockdown defender, leads
 lowa position players in minutes (1,620) this season. Cary has made 92 starts as a Hawkeye. Durr's five
 goals and 12 points tie for lowa-bests this season.
- Many of Iowa's veterans played during the Cinderella-run in the 2020-21 postseason which saw a twowin regular season result in the first Big Ten Tournament Championship and NCAA Tournament win in







Dave Dilanni is in his 10th season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 316-91-40 career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history. In his 10th season at lowa, Dilanni has an 95-73-22 record. He has guided the program to two NCAA Tournament appearences and the first Big Ten title (2020-21) in program history.

In 2022, lowa finished 5-6-7 overall with a 2-3-5 mark in Big Ten play. Hailey Rydberg earned All-Big Ten Third Team recognition, leading the Hawkeyes with 14 offensive points on five goals and four assists. Rydberg tied Caroline Halonen with a team-best five goals, while Elle Otto led the way in assists (5).

The Hawkeyes were once again stout defensively, led by senior captains Samantha Cary and Sara Wheaton. Iowa allowed just one goal per game on average en route to six clean sheets. In goal, Iowa was led by Monica Wilhelm and Macy Enneking, who together ended tied for seventh in Iowa history for career shutouts (9).

lowa upset No. 13 Northwestern, 2-1, on the road for the fifth top-15 victory in program history. Iowa also defeated Nebraska, 4-0, to improve to 4-1-1 against the Huskers in the last six meetings; that represents a corner turned in the rivalry, as the Hawkeyes were 0-10-0 against the Cornhuskers prior to 2017.

In the classroom, Iowa had 16 Academic All-Big Ten selections; four Hawkeyes (Hailey Rydberg, Jenny Cape, Samantha Cary and Addie Bundy) earned CSC Academic All-District recognition. Cape was one of two Hawkeye athletes selected to receive the Big Ten Postgraduate Scholarship, awarded primarily for academic excellence.

- school history.
- lowa has pitched 10 shutouts, the program's most since Dilanni's first season in 2014 when the
 Hawkeyes earned a school record 12 clean sheets. lowa's .556 shutout percentage ties Penn State
 for 28th nationally and second in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes have allowed 14 goals against this
 season, which ranks fourth in the conference (0.78 goals against average).
- Along with Durr, standout juniors Kenzie Roling and Elle Otto lead the team offensively. Otto's
 12 points and five goals match team-bests, while Roling is fourth in points (11) and leads the assist
 column (5).
- Senior Macy Enneking returns for her fourth season in goal. Enneking ties for fourth in program
 history for career wins (23) alongside Britta Vogele '04. Enneking ranks third in program history for
 career shutouts (19). Enneking's nine shutouts this season tie for second among Big Ten keepers.
- lowa welcomes 16 newcomers, including 13 freshmen and three transfers. Senior transfer-student
 Kelli McGroarty matches a team-high 12 points on four goals and four assists.
- Cary, Enneking and redshirt junior Meike Ingles earned Big Ten Preseason Honors. Cary has
 earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week awards this season on Sept. 5, Sept. 12 and Oct. 3.
 Enneking was named Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week on Oct. 3.
- Cary, Enneking, and senior **Maggie Johnston** were voted team captains for the 2023 season.

LAST WEEK

The Hawkeyes downed No. 12 Michigan State, 2-1, on Oct. 29 at DeMartin Soccer Complex in round one of the Big Ten Tournament. The Spartans were the top overall seed in the tournament.

- lowa avenged a 3-0 defeat at the hands of Michigan State in the regular season finale on Oct. 22.
- The Spartans struck first in the rematch, stuffing a score in the 42nd minute to take the lead and momentum into halftime. It was all lowa after the break, however, as the Hawkeyes charged out to nine shots in the second half; the second shot connected, as fifth-year **Samantha Cary** lofted a pass to senior **Kelli McGroarty** in the box for a header to even the score.
- Five minutes later, the Hawkeyes struck again. This time, Cary sent a corner in to McGroarty, who
 advanced the ball to true freshman Sofia Bush. The All-Big Ten Freshman Team honoree rifled in a
 close-range score to grab the, 2-1, lead.

B1G BRACKET

Eighth-seed Iowa faces fourth-seed Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament Semifinals. The other side of the bracket squares off first, with third-seed Wisconsin battling second-seed Nebraska at 4 p.m. (CT).

B1G VENUE

Opened in 2021, Lower.com Field is the home of the Columbus Crew MLS club. The stadium has hosted international matches for the USMNT and USWNT and was home to the 2022 Big Ten Tournament championship weekend.

B1G HISTORY

lowa is a Big Ten Tournament qualifier for the 14th time in program history (since 1997) and the sixth time under **Coach Dilanni** (10th season). The Hawkeyes earned their first conference tournament championship in the 2020-21 season.

lowa turned around a two-win regular season during the unorthodox 2021 spring season. The regular season schedule was moved and shortened due to the COVID-19 pandemic, resulting in an expanded postseason format. The Hawkeyes downed Illinois and Minnesota in the Big Ten Regional Weekend stage to qualify for tournament play. Then, Iowa upset No. 4 Penn State (United Soccer Coaches Poll) in the semifinals for the highest-ranked win in program history. The Hawkeyes beat Wisconsin, 1-0, in the championship game on a golden goal from Jenny Cape '22.

B1G RECOGNITION

- Fifth-year Samantha Cary has earned three Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors this season, including back-to-back recognition on Sept. 5 and Sept. 12. Cary also won the award on Oct. 3.
- Goalkeeper Macy Enneking won Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week on Oct. 3, her first conference weekly recognition since being named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on March 22, 2021.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Along with midfielder **Josie Durr** (7th-Year) and defender **Samantha Cary** (5th-Year), the senior class includes **Macy Enneking** (GK), **Rielee Fetty** (M), **Kelli McGroarty** (F/M) and **Maggie Johnston** (M).





- Redshirt juniors Meike Ingles (F) and Zoë Bessert (F) are also entering their fourth seasons.
- Together, the group of eight players with at least three years' experience total 331 career starts for the Hawkeyes. Six more juniors round out the lowa upper class.

FRESH FACES

The Hawkeyes welcome 16 newcomers, including 13 incoming freshmen and three transfers.

- The following freshmen have seen the pitch for lowa this season: Millie Greer (18 games played, 18 starts), Sofia Bush (18-11), Eva Pattison (15-10), Abby Skiff (15-2), Sophie Kincaid (9-0), Keira Smyser (3-0), Sonya Mehta (3-0) and Kearstyn Gladden (2-0).
- lowa also welcomes three transfers in junior goalkeeper Taylor Kane, sophomore forward Shae
 Doherty and senior midfielder Kelli McGroarty.
- In 2022, McGroarty led La Salle in points (17), goals (6), assists (5), shots (42) and SOG (21).
- This season, McGroarty has four goals and four assists to match a team-best 12 points. McGroarty's 40 shots lead the team.
- Kane (Pomona-Pitzer) and Doherty (Belmont) combined for 21 starts and 35 games played at their previous stops. Doherty has four points this season for lowa.

90 TRACKER

Nine Hawkeyes have played the entirety of at least one game, including fifth-year **Samantha Cary** (13), freshman **Millie Greer** (13), senior **Maggie Johnston** (5), senior **Rielee Fetty** (4), freshman **Eva Pattison** (4), freshman **Sofia Bush**, seventh-year **Josie Durr**, sophomore **Kellen Fife** and junior **Kenzie Roling**.

SHARING THE WEALTH

Fourteen Hawkeyes have combined for 30 goals this season.

- Elle Otto (5), Josie Durr (5), Kelli McGroarty (4), Kenzie Roling (3), Sofia Bush (3), Maggie Johnston (2) are the six lowa players to register multiple goals this season.
- lowa is 42-1-3 in its last 46 games when scoring two goals or more, which dates back to October of 2017. The lone defeat during that span came this season against Nebraska on Oct. 7.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Hawkeye defense has allowed 14 goals this season, ranking fourth in the Big Ten in goals against average (0.78). Iowa's 10 clean sheets tie for second in the conference in shutout percentage (.556).

- The Hawkeyes have outscored opponents 30-14 this season. lowa has nearly doubled its opponents in shots (251-129) and shots on goal (125-62).
- Senior Macy Enneking ties Britta Vogele '04 at fourth in the Hawkeye record book with 23 career victories (.663 win percentage). Enneking's 19 career shutouts rank third in program history.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Big Ten Tournament championship match will be played on Nov. 5 at Lower.com Field in Columbus, Ohio. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. (CT). The game will air live on Big Ten Network.
