PENN STATE HONORS 10 SENIORS

Prior to the game on Saturday, Penn State will honor 10 seniors who have contributed countless hours in the classroom and on the field for the lacrosse program. Travis Crane, Conor Baucum, John Cugini, Eric Davidheiser, Nick Dolik, Jack Forster, Danny Henneghan, Drew Roper, David Spadacene and manager Tyler Schmitt will be a part of the pre-game introductions for PSU.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

After starting 0-3 to start the season, Towson (7-5, 3-0 CAA) has won seven of its last nine games including the last four in a row. During the fourgame winning streak, Towson won road games at UMBC (12-9) and Delaware (7-6, OT), while upsetting Hofstra (7-6) at home before beating UMass (9-5) last week.

The story of the Tigers' season has been the play of goalie Andrew Wescavage, who has earned CAA Co-Player of the Week honors the past two weeks. Wascavage ranks fourth nationally in save percentage (.625) and saves per game (14.33). Last week against UMass he saved 20 of 25 shots on goal.

On attack, which scores 8.33 goals per game, the Tigers are led by Thomas DeNapoli with 39 points on 29 goals and 10 assists. Cory Dobyns (18 goals), Andrew Hodgson (15) and Greg Cuccinello (11) are TU's other double-digit scorers. At the faceoff X, it's been by committee with five different Tigers taking attempts. As a team, Towson has won just 94 of 244 faceoffs for a winning percentage of .385. On special teams, the man-up scores 31.1 percent of the time, while the man-down unit allows a goal at 40.5 percent.

Jack Forster, who matched his career high with his 35th point, extended his goal-scoring streak to eight games, and Drew Roper notched his second marker of the season. Austin Kaut recorded 13 saves as Penn State kept Towson scoreless for a 36:46 span that included the entire second half. Penn State out-shot Towson by a 39-28 margin and collected 38 ground balls to the Tigers' 26. The Nittany Lions were 1-for-4 with the extra man and 20-for-23 on clears, while Towson finished 0-for-2 and 18-for-21, respectively.

6, in front of a Penn State Lacrosse Field record crowd of 1,007 on Saturday afternoon (April 6). Attackmen **Jack Forster** and **TJ Sanders** tallied four goals apiece and goalkeeper **Austin Kaut** saved 13 shots to beat the first-place Dragons. Holding a one-goal lead in the third quarter, Penn State exploded for seven straight goals over an 11-minute span in the second half to put away the Dragons. The Nittany Lions won their sixth straight game thanks to a quick-strike offense that out-shot Drexel 47-23 for the day.

It was a festive atmosphere in Happy Valley as Penn State honored seven decades of lacrosse alumni who came back for the 100th Season Celebration. The Nittany Lions wore special gray uniforms and commemorated the 100th season of Penn State men's lacrosse at halftime with a parade of alumni on the field.

In all, Forster tallied five points, pitching in with an assist, while fellow attackman **Shane Sturgis** posted his third three-assist game in a row. Sturgis added a goal as the starting attack recorded 13 points on nine goals and four assists. The 13-goal output by the Nittany Lions was the most since a 15-goal effort in a win over No. 9 Denver on Feb. 17. Penn State is now 4-3 against ranked opponents this year and 3-1 against higher-ranked foes.

SANDERS, FORSTER EARN CAA AWARDS

Jack Forster and TJ Sanders honored by the Colonial Athletic Association office on Monday afternoon (April 8) for their outstanding play in a 13-6 win over Drexel. The weekly honor is the third of Forster's career and the fourth of the season for Sanders.

CLIMBING UP THE LEADERBOARD

Three Nittany Lions—Jack Forster, Danny Henneghan and Austin Kaut—are heading into or already in the Penn State record books. For Henneghan, he currently ranks sixth all-time in faceoff winning percentage and picked up his 200th career ground ball against Drexel on Saturday. If he picks up two grounders against Towson he'll move into 10th all-time at PSU. In net, Kaut

ranks seventh all-time in saves with 474. He is 36 saves behind Rich Caravella for sixth place. As for Forster, he's five goals from tying 10th place (94, John Hollerbach) and six points from 10th (Bill Hess, 134).

POWER KAUT IN NET

A preseason All-American and Tewaaraton Award Watch List candidate, junior **Austin Kaut** is considered one of the best goalkeepers in college lacrosse. Following an average start to year three in Happy Valley, Kaut has stepped up his game. In the past five outings, he has posted a 4.70 GAA and a .750 save percentage, allowing just 28 goals and saving 84 shots. Kaut has stopped at least nine shots in each game and has 13 or more saves in five of those contests. Penn State started the season 2-3, but is 6-0 since. Kaut opened the season with a 9.79 GAA and .490 save percentage behind 48 saves and 50 goals allowed.

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

Penn State finished a stretch of five games from Feb. 9-March 16 against USILA ranked opponents as PSU went 2-3. After a March 26 win at Bucknell, Penn State's record improved to 3-3, including 2-1 against top 10 teams. This past week, Penn State downed 12th-ranked Drexel to improve to 4-3 in games against ranked foes. This week's foe, Towson, is receiving votes in the poll, while Hofstra (April 27) is ranked 20th this week.

MIDFIELD SCORING EMERGES

Through the first five games, Penn State's attack carried the offensive load scoring 42 of the team's 52 goals (77.7%). Meanwhile, in the last five games, PSU's midfield has shined, scoring 26 of the team's 58 goals (44.8%). Leading the midfield scoring this season is **Tom LaCrosse** with 17 goals. Nick Dolik, **Kyle VanThof** and **Kyle Zittel** each have five goals. **Gavin Ahern (3), Erik Myers** (2) and **Michael Richards** (1) round out the midfield scoring. PSU has one goal from the defense (Jack Donnelly vs. St. Joe's).

DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

Penn State's offense has improved mightily in 2013 with the attacking trio of **Jack Forster** (37 points) **TJ Sanders** (31), and **Shane Sturgis** (31). Penn State is averaging over 10 goals per game this season with a shooting percentage of .288. Last season, the Nittany Lions scored just 8.73 goals per game and post a percentage of .258. Also, assists, points, shots and ground balls per game are up from 2012.

Previously, Penn State lacrosse was televised on Feb. 17 against Denver at Jacksonville, Fla. by NBC Sports Network and March 9 vs. Lehigh in Chester, Pa. on ESPN3.com and the WatchESPN app for mobile devices.

Penn State's appearance on NBC Sports Network is believed to be the first nationally televised men's lacrosse game in program history. The BTN broadcast will be the second. The last time Penn State was on television before this season was in 2010 vs. Towson on WMAR in Baltimore.

ROAD WINNING STREAK

With Saturday's win at Villanova, Penn State has ticked off a school-record 10 straight true road wins. This season Penn State is 5-0 on the road after going 5-0 in 2012. The Lions' last road loss was Apr. 30, 2011 at Hofstra. Penn State has won 12 of its last 13 true road games.

Of the 14 regular-season contests, Penn State will be home for just five of them, making the Nittany Lions one of the most road tested teams in the country. In total, seven games are true road contests along with two neutral site games. Penn State will look to improve to 7-1 away from Happy Valley on Apr. 20 at Delaware.

KAUT TABBED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Behind a 30-save week and two wins. Austin Kaut was named Colonial Athletic Association Co-Player of the Week on Monday, April 1 by the league office. Kaut has been outstanding over the past five games for the Nittany Lions, winning each decision as Penn State is 7-3 on the season, 2-0 in CAA play. Against Bucknell on Tuesday, Kaut made 11 of 14 stops in the first half en route to an 11-3 trouncing of Bucknell in Lewisburg, Pa. Penn State has two wins over top 10 foes this season. On Saturday, Kaut loomed large for the Villanova offense, saving 16 Wildcat shots in preserving a 7-6 victory. Kaut made eight saves in each half at Villanova.

NITTANY LIONS FEND OFF WILDCATS

No. 16 Penn State used a four-goal second quarter and 16 saves from Austin Kaut in a 7-6 win at Villanova on Saturday, March 30 in front of 2,578 fans. Junior midfielder Tom LaCrosse tallied his second hat trick in as many games to lead Penn State to its fifth straight win and 10th straight true road contest. Penn State has held each opponent to seven of fewer goals during the winning streak. Penn State (7-3, 2-0 CAA) out-scored Villanova (2-6, 1-0 Big East) 4-2 in the second quarter, including the last three goals of the frame to take a 5-3 lead. Fueling the three-goal spurt was Jack Forster and LaCrosse, two scored twice. Shane Sturgis assisted on Forster's tally and LaCrosse's first marker. The second LaCrosse goal was a dash down the middle of the field as the junior was hit with 15 seconds left in the half.

PSU extended the run to four goals and a 6-3 lead as Forster's second goal of the game was assisted by Sturgis just 3:13 into the third period. Sturgis fed Forster from behind the cage with the timer on for Penn State's largest lead of the game. Midfielder Kyle VanThof scored the eventual game winner with 9:34 to go on a curl around the cage as he bounced it in for a 7-5 lead. The gamewinner was VanThof's second of the year.

PENN STATE RIPS BUCKNELL

No. 16 Penn State crushed No. 7 Bucknell, 11-3, on Tuesday night (March 26) at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Field behind a punishing defense, 14 saves from Austin Kaut and four goals from TJ Sanders. The Nittany Lions ended the game on an 8-0 run in front of 1,250 fans.

Attackman **Shane Sturgis** boasted a game-high five points on two goals and three assists, while midfielder Tom LaCrosse pitched in with a hat trick. Kyle VanThof tallied his first multi-point game of the season on a goal and an assist. Seven Nittany Lions tallied a point in all. Penn State won its second game over a top-10 foe this season after defeating No. 9 Denver on Feb. 17 in Jacksonville Fla

The Penn State defense was even better than its offense on the night, causing 14 of Bucknell's 17 turnovers in the game. Leading the way was Michael Richards with three caused turnovers, while Steven Bogert, Tyler Travis and James Burke each caused two. Faceoff specialist Danny Henneghan set the tone on offense winning 10-of-17 faceoffs, including all four in the third period that set off the 8-0 burst. Henneghan had a game-high five ground balls.

LIONS BREEZE PAST SAINT JOSEPH'S

The 17th-ranked Nittany Lions scored the game's first nine goals en route to a dominating 9-2 win over CAA rival Saint Joseph's on Saturday (March 23) afternoon at Penn State Lacrosse Field. Junior goalkeeper Austin Kaut saved nine shots, his third straight game with nine or more saves, as PSU held an opponent to a season-low two

The Nittany Lions (5-3, 2-0 CAA) received twogoal games from Jack Forster, Tom LaCrosse and Shane Sturgis. Forster led the Penn State offense with four points, pitching in with two assists. In all, Penn State had six different scorers on the afternoon with TJ Sanders, Erik Myers and Jack Donnelly, who scored his first career goal, reaching the back of the net.

Penn State jumped all over Saint Joseph's (4-5, 0-1 CAA) early, opening five-goal lead in the opening 13 minutes. Penn State received two goals from Forster and LaCrosse in the initial onslaught, while Sanders scored his 20th of the season as he connected with Forster with 2:13 left in the opening period. PSU would lead 9-0 midway through the third period as Kaut pitched a shutout for the game's opening 38 minutes.

KAUT NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For the sixth time in his career, goalie Austin Kaut earned a CAA weekly laurel on Monday, March 18. Kaut was named CAA Player of the Week for his 16-save performance against the Minutemen. Kaut thrice won CAA Rookie of the Week in 2011 en route to CAA Rookie of the Year and this is his third CAA Player of the Week award.

NITTANY LIONS FEND OFF BEARCATS

A 6-0 second-period run gave No. 17 Penn State a seven-goal lead as the Nittany Lions downed host Binghamton, 11-7, at Bearcats Sports Complex on Tuesday (March 19). Junior goalie **Austin Kaut**, the reigning CAA Player of the Week, posted his second straight 16-save game, while **Nick Dolik** second-quarter hat trick paced the offense.

Penn State (4-3, 1-0 CAA) took a commanding 9-2 lead near the end of the second quarter only to see Binghamton (3-4, 0-0 America East) tally off five straight goals, setting up a nervous fourth quarter. The Nittany Lion defense, anchored by Kaut, buckled down the Bearcats momentum and outscored Binghamton 2-0 in the final quarter to emerge victorious. Kaut has made 32 saves and allowed just 11 goals in his past two games.

Aside from Dolik's three-goal performance, PSU received a three-point effort from **Shane Sturgis** on a pair of goals and an assist. **Jack Forster** had a goal and an assist and **Tom LaCrosse** notched a two-goal game as well.

PENN STATE WINS CAA OPENER AT UMASS

Behind a four-goal performance from **Jack For-ster** and 16 saves from **Austin Kaut**, Penn State defeated Massachusetts, 7-5, in comeback fashion. Down 5-4, Forster tied the game in the third, **Kyle VanThof** put the Nittany Lions ahead in the fourth and Forster sealed the game with an insurance goal a few minutes later. Joining VanThof and Forster on the scoring ledger was **Nick Dolik** and **Kyle Zittel**. Midfielder **Tom LaCrosse** added two assists and **Gavin Ahern** assisted on VanThof's game-winner. The win was Penn State's second straight at UMass.

LIONS RALLY, FALL TO LEHIGH

Penn State dug itself a four-goal halftime deficit, went on a big 8-2 run, but eventually lost to Lehigh, 12-10, on Saturday night (Mar. 9) in front of 5,212 at PPL Park. **TJ Sanders** scored five goals during the 8-2 spurt to take a 9-7 lead. Lehigh used a 5-0 run to win their second straight contest over the Nittany Lions. **Jack Forster** and **Shane Sturgis** had matching score lines of two goals and an assist.

Down 5-1 after two periods, Penn State outscored Lehigh 5-1 in the third period and stretched the run to 8-2, giving Penn State a 9-7 lead. Nevertheless, Lehigh shot back with five straight goals en route to the 12-10 win. Dante Fantoni and Patrick Corbett each had hat tricks for the Mountain Hawks.

SANDERS NAMED IL ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Following a six-point showing aganist Lehigh, freshman **TJ Sanders** was named Cascade/Inside Lacrosse Rookie of the week on March 13. Sanders was also named No. 2 on Inside Lacrosse's first Freshman Rankings.

For the third time this season, Penn State men's lacrosse freshman **TJ Sanders** was named Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week on March 11. Penn State's **TJ Sanders** scored five first-half goals to help the Lions stake an 8-2 halftime lead. Ohio State closed the game on an 8-1 run. **Jack Forster** pitched in with a four point day behind a goal and three assists. **Shane Sturgis** netted two points, scoring the game-tying goal in the fourth quarter.

SANDERS AGAIN NAMED CAA TOP ROOK-IE

Freshman **TJ Sanders** was named Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week on Monday, March 4. Sanders has been named CAA Rookie of the Week in two of the four award cycles this season. The five goals scored were a career high, topping his four-goal effort against Michigan in his first collegiate game on Feb. 9.

CREATOR'S TROPHY SERIES

Conor Doyle scored his third of the game to tie the game at eight with 24 seconds left and O'Connor scored immediately after winning the faceoff six seconds later as UND looked assured of the comeback victory. Penn State's **Danny Henneghan** won the faceoff as **Kessler Brown** collected the ground ball, scooped it to **Michael Richards** and flipped it to LaCrosse. LaCrosse dashed to his left and fired a shot to the lower left part of the net past UND netminder John Kemp (10 saves) to knot the game with less than a second left.

NITTANY LIONS THWART DENVER

No. 15 Penn State took down No. 9 Denver, 15-12, at EverBank Field in the Moe's Southwest Grill Classic on Sunday (Feb. 17) afternoon. **Shane Sturgis** and **Jack Forster** each tallied four goals in the Penn State (2-0) victory.

Fueled by a 7-3 surge in the third period, Penn State extended a two-goal halftime margin into a six-goal lead after three periods. **TJ Sanders** added three goals and **Kyle Zittel** posted his first multi-goal game of his career to help pace the Nittany Lion offense. **Austin Kaut** had a sluggish start, but made some key saves down the stretch, finishing with 10 stops on the day.

STURGIS IS CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

On Dec. 5, 2013, head coach **Jeff Tambroni** announced that senior leaders **Travis Crane** and **Jack Forster** earned the distinction of captains. Crane, a fifth-year senior in his secon season in Happy Valley, is a midfielder out of Parkville, Md, while Forster of Jenkintown, Pa. is at Penn State for his sixth year.

"Our coaching staff and team are very confident that they will do a wonderful job as we make our way through the spring season," Tambroni said. "Both of [these] guys have been around for a long time, one a fifth-year (Crane) the other a sixth-year senior (Forster), and have fought through a lot of adversity in their own right. I think their experience is going to be great for this team at the time that Penn State lacrosse is in its history, and hopefully going to give us an opportunity to turn the page."

COACH TAMBRONI IN YEAR THREE

Head coach **Jeff Tambroni** is in his third year on the Penn State sidelines, winning 16 games in the past two years after a 2-11 season in 2010 before his arrival. Last year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions one win shy of their first 10-win season since 2009 and on the cusp of the CAA Championship. Penn State cracked the top 10 in the USILA poll for the first time since 1996 on March 5 after wins over Notre dame nad Ohio State. Tambroni has also led Penn State to back-to-back second-place finishes in the CAA and has a 9-3 regular-season record in the conference.

PSU WELCOMES NEWCOMERS

Fourteen new Penn State student-athletes joined the lacrosse team this season. The Nittany Lions welcomed two attakmen, five midfielders, five defenders and two goalies in the class.

32009 USILA DIVISION I COACH OF THE YEAR 2011 CAA CO-COACH OF THE YEAR

Jeff Tamboni will enter his third season as head coach of the Penn State men's lacrosse team in 2012-13. During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a second-place CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees. Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Final Four appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010. During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national champion-ship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.
