HISTORIC NIGHT IN HAPPY VALLEY

- When the puck drops at Greenberg Ice Pavilion Friday night, it will officially open Penn State's first NCAA Division I season.
- It will also mark the first varsity men's hockey game since March 3, 1947. On that day, the Nittany Lions fell to Georgetown, 11-4.
- Penn State fielded a varsity hockey team for five seasons in the 1940s (1940-44, 1946-47) before the sport was dropped due to limited facilities.

NCAA DIVISION I HOCKEY

- With the addition of Penn State to the NCAA Division I ranks, there are now 59 schools that sponsor NCAA Division I men's hockey.
- The last school to establish NCAA Division I hockey was Robert Morris in 2004-05.

SCOUTING AIC

- In 2011-12, head coach Gary Wright led the Yellow Jackets to an 8-26-3 overall record and a 6-18-3 conference mark.
- The Yellow Jackets return seven of their top 10 leading scorers, including senior forward Adam Pleskach, who

- Five players -- Max Gardiner (Minnesota), Taylor Holstrom (Mercyhurst), Nate Jensen (Mercyhurst), Bryce Johnson (St. Cloud State), Justin Kirchhevel (Alaska Anchorage) -- on Penn State's 27-man roster have previous NCAA Division I experience.
- All five student-athletes played for their respective teams during the 2010-11 season.
- · Holstrom was named Atlantic Hockey Rookie of the Year that season.

- Tommy Olczyk's father, Eddie, and Nate Jensen's father, David, lived together while playing for Team USA in the 1984 Olympics.
- Tommy and Nate are roommates at Penn State.

NHL HOPEFUL

- Sophomore forward **Max Gardiner** was chosen by the St. Louis Blues in the third round (74th overall) of the 2010 NHL Entry Draft.
- Gardiner will be the first NHL draft choice to skate for Penn State.

TWO OF A KIND

• Junior forward **Justin Kirchhevel** is one of two South Dakota-born student-athletes to play NCAA Division I hockey.

FOR ALL TO SEE

- All of Penn State's games during the 2012-13 season will air on The Penn State Sports Network and GoPSUsports.com.
- The Nittany Lions will also have two contests on The Big Ten Network --Jan. 26 against Michigan State and Feb. 25 against Wisconsin.

GADOWSKY NAMED HEAD COACH

- Twelve-year NCAA coaching veteran Guy Gadowsky was named Penn State's first NCAA Division I coach on April 24, 2011.
- Gadowsky served as head coach at both Princeton (2004-11) and Alaska (1999-2004) before coming to Penn State.
- He helped Princeton to two NCAA tournament appearances (2008, 2009) and the 2009 ECAC Hockey championship.
- Gadowsky left Princeton with the highest winning percentage among all Tigers' head coaches since 1934.
- In 2001-02, he led Alaska to its only 20-win season since it joined the CCHA in 1994-95.

GADOWSKY VS. AIC

• Gadowsky is 1-0 all-time against AIC, having led Princeton to a 4-2 victory against the Yellow Jackets on Jan. 4, 2005.

FIRST FOUR MEMBERS JOIN

• Forwards **Taylor Holstrom**, **Bryce Johnson**, and **Justin Kirchhevel** and defenseman **Nate Jensen** were announced as the first four members of Penn State's first NCAA team Sept. 5, 2011.

FIRST RECRUITING CLASS

- Head coach Guy Gadowsky wrapped up his first-ever recruiting class with the additions of Max Gardiner and Joseph Lordo April 26.
- The pair join nine players -- forwards Casey Bailey, Kenny Brooks, David Glen, Curtis Loik and Jonathan Milley; defensemen Luke Juha, Connor Varley and Mark Yanis; and goaltender Matthew Skoff -- who signed NLIs Nov. 21.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The roster breakdown includes six seniors, six juniors, five sophomores and 10 freshmen.
- The average height is just over 6-foot-0 and the average weight is 192.
- Nine players played in the United States Hockey League in the season prior their arrivals at Penn State.
- The Nittany Lions represent 17 different states and Canadian provinces.

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

- The Nittany Lions will play games against teams from all five NCAA Division I conferences — Atlantic Hockey, CCHA, ECAC Hockey, Hockey East, WCHA — and fellow independent Alabama Huntsville.
- At least three teams that participated in the 2012 NCAA tournament appear on Penn State's schedule. The Nittany Lions will host Air Force (Nov. 9-10) and will visit Michigan State (Jan. 25-26) and Frozen Four participant Union (Nov. 24-25).

FRIENDLY CONFINES

• Greenberg Ice Pavilion, which opened in January 1981, will serve as Penn State's home for the 2012-13 season.

GADOWSKY HIGHLIGHTS

 Named Penn State's first NCAA Division I head coach on April 24, 2011

AT ALASKA

- In 2001-02, led Alaska to its only 20-win season since
 it joined the CCHA in 1994-95
- Named CCHA Coach of the Year and named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given to college hockey's top coach, in 2001-02
- Set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance

AT PRINCETON

- Led team to two NCAA tournament appearances (2008, 2009) and the 2009 ECAC Hockey championship
- Guided Princeton to two of its three NCAA tournaments since the NCAA began sponsoring hockey in 1947-48
- Captured a program-record 21 wins in 2007-08 and guided the Tigers to their first NCAA tournament since 1997-98
- In 2007-08, won Princeton's first outright Ivy League title
- Set a new standard for program wins, leading Princeton to 22 victories, in 2008-09
- Named the 2009 ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award
 - Coached 65 ECAC Hockey All-Academic Team members
 - Produced four All-Americans and two Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalists
- Coached a Rhodes Scholar (Landis Stankievech), a Hockey Humanitarian Award winner (Eric Leroux) and a Stanley Cup champion (Kevin Westgarth)
- Left Princeton with highest winning percentage among all Princeton head coaches since 1934

HOME SWEET (ALMOST) HOME

- Construction is underway for the future home of Penn State Hockey, Pegula Ice Arena, near the corner of University Drive and Curtin Road.
- The \$90-million facility will feature two rinks, including a main rink with a 6,000-seat capacity and 1,000-seat student section.
- The facility is scheduled to be completed by September 2013.

BIG TEN ON THE HORIZON

- With the addition of Penn State to NCAA hockey world, the Big Ten created a new hockey conference that will begin competition for the 2013-14 season.
- Penn State will join Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State and Wisconsin in the league.
- The first four Big Ten tournaments will be held in NHL arenas -- Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul (2014, 2016) and Detroit's Joe Louis Arena (2015, 2017).

NCAA HOCKEY COMES TO PSU

- On Sept. 17, 2010, it was announced that Penn State alumnus
 Terry Pegula, along with his wife, Kim,
 donated \$88 million to fund a stateof-the-art multi-purpose facility and
 to establish NCAA Division I men's
 hockey.
- Since that time, the Pegulas have contributed \$102 to the program.
- The \$88 million donation was the largest in University history.


