GAME NOTES

About Union

Union opened 2024 in stellar fashion on New Year's Day, setting the tone for the new year with a dominating 6-0 victory at Saint Michael's. First-year Emma Fulawka scored her first career hat trick in the contest, while senior Kaitlyn Ehmann found the back of the net for her first collegiate goal. Sophomore Riley Walsh had a pair of assists in the game, becoming the first player in Union's Division I era with multiple 20-point seasons, and junior Sophie Matsoukas picked up her 20th career win in the Union net, tying Shenae Lundberg's all-time program record.

About Penn State

Penn State returns to action for the first time in the new year after almost a month off. The Nittany Lions last saw game action on December 8th and 9th, when they split a weekend series with Union's ECACH foe #13 Yale. PSU was on a six-game win streak before dropping that Saturday's contest, and come into the weekend with Union victors in 10 of their last 12.

The Matchup

The weekend set will be the 15th and 16th meetings between the two teams and the first since October 12th-13th, 2018. Penn State holds an 8-4-2 advantage in the all-time series history.

BEHIND THE GARNET

- Union rang in 2024 with a controlling 6-0 win over Saint Michael's on January 1st.
- First-year Emma Fulawka, who had just two points in her first 16 collegiate games, scored her first career hat trick in the win and now has five points (4 goals, 1 assist) on her current three-game point streak.
- Outside of Fulawka, four Garnet Chargers had multi-point games in the victory.
- Sophomore Riley Walsh's two assists brought her up to 20 points on the year. She became the second player in program history with multiple 20-point seasons.
- Union has won three in a row for the first time since they won four straight November 5th-15th, 2022.

GARNET NOTES

Milestone Watch

The 2023-24 season has seen a handful of changes to the Union record book, and a number of players are on the cusp of setting new benchmarks. Sophomore Riley Walsh has already set a new feat, becoming the first player in Union's DI history to have multiple 20-point seasons with her two assists in the win over Saint Michael's. Junior Sophie Matsoukas has tied the program's all-time wins record with 20, while senior Emily King is one assist shy of tying the program's all-time record of 37. King also needs one power-play goal to tie the program's all-time record of 10.

Happy New Year!

Union began 2024 in a big way on New Year's Day, defeating Saint Michael's by a score of 6-0 in a game where the milestones were aplenty for Union. The offense was led by first-year Emma Fulawka, who scored her first collegiate hat trick. Senior Kaitlyn Ehmann added her first collegiate goal, and first-year Megan Ognibene registered her first collegiate point. In Union's net, Sophie Matsoukas scored her 20th career win, moving her into a tie for the program record. The six goals were the team's most in 364 days, when they also notched six against Saint Michael's January 2nd, 2023.

Got Enough Hats?

Sophomore Riley Walsh and first-year Maddie Leaney each scored hat tricks against Holy Cross, with their third goals to cap off their accomplishments going down as the overtime game-winners. Walsh, who had the first hat trick, gave Union their first three-goal game in almost 10 years (Jessica Kaminsky on November 16th, 2013 at Yale), before Leaney's achievement the next night gave Union hat tricks in consecutive games for the first time in program history. First-year Emma Fulawka scored a hat trick of her own January 1st at

Saint Michael's, and the program has now had as many hat tricks this season as they had the previous 19 years combined.

On The National Stage

Head Coach Josh Sciba missed Union's trip to Yale and Brown and spent part of the holiday break with Team USA, as the Garnet Chargers leader was with the U.S. Women's National Team for the first four games of the 2023-24 Rivalry Series against Canada. Sciba, who is an Assistant Coach on Head Coach John Wroblewski's staff, has served with the Women's National Team since the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship after serving as an assistant for the 2018 Under-18 Series vs. Canada and the 2019 and 2020 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championships. The Rivalry Series resumes in February, when the two countries meet for the final three games of the 2023-24 series.

Bigger Than A Game

Union's home game against St. Lawrence was the program's Cystic Fibrosis Awareness Game. The initiative was spearheaded by junior goaltender Sophie Matsoukas, whose sister has Cystic Fibrosis, and sophomore goaltender Emily Evans, whose father, aunt, and two cousins have the disease. The program raised awareness about the lung and digestive tract disease, took donations for the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, and wore purple ribbon stickers on their helmets and used purple tape to support those in the fight against CF. The program also welcomed Matsoukas's sister Zoe, who has the cystic fibrosis, for a ceremonial puck drop. The initiative is one of two by the program this season, with the annual Pink The Rink game later in the season.

Maddie's Month

Following an impressive first month of her collegiate hockey career, first-year Maddie Leaney was honored as the ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Month for the end of September/month of October. Leaney led all ECACH first-years with five goals and eight points through the first month plus, which was good for second and third, respectively, on the team. Leaney's start to her time in garnet was highlighted by her three-goal performance that included the overtime winner October 7th against Holy Cross. The Maple Ridge, British Columbia native was also selected as a Hockey Commissioners Association (HCA) runner-up for their National Rookie of the Month.

Let's Get It Started In Here

Union kicked off their ECAC Hockey schedule in a big way, returning to Schenectady from their conference-opening road trip with four and a half points, the most they've ever picked up on conference opening weekend. The Garnet Chargers defeated Harvard on Friday, 4-3, to win their ECAC Opener for the first time since 2017, on the backs of sophomore Amanda Quan, who picked up her first two points of the season on a goal and assist, and first-year Maddie Leaney, who recorded her second game-winner of the year with her first period power play goal. Senior Emily King's third period goal on Saturday at Dartmouth would make it a 1-1 game, and the two teams would play to a tie of that score to finish off a successful weekend for the Garnet Chargers.

Season Of Firsts

Union has seen a number of players achieve their first collegiate milestones in 2023-24. First-years Kendal Davidson, Emma Fulawka, Maddie Leaney, Iliana Smith, and Megan Ognibene have all registered their first collegiate points, while Fulawka and Leaney have also registered their first collegiate goals and hat tricks. Sophomore Riley Walsh also got her first career hat trick, and first-year Monja Wagner notched her first win. Also getting their first goals this season are Davidson, Iliana Smith, Allison Smith, and Kaitlyn Ehmann.

It's Her Honor

After scoring her first collegiate goal and picking up an assist in Union's 5-2 home-opening victory over Robert Morris on 9/29, first-year Kendal Davidson was named the ECAC Hockey Defensive Player of the Week for the week ending on October 1, 2023. The award is Davidson's first selection of her career. Davidson's nomination makes her the first Garnet Charger to be named Defensive Player of the Week since d-partner Stephanie Bourque was tabbed October 4th, 2022.

First-year Maddie Leaney was honored the next week, as the first-year picked up ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Week honors after her hat trick that included the overtime winner in that Saturday's win over Holy Cross. The award is Leaney's first selection of her career and Union's first Rookie of the Week selection since now-sophomore Stephanie Bourque was selected this past January 5th.

Junior Sophie Matsoukas was the next Garnet Charger to pick up a weekly award, after Leaney also garnered ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Month honors to wrap up October, being selected as the ECAC Hockey MAC Goaltending Goaltender of the Week December 12th. The selection followed Matsoukas' 53-save weekend in Union's weekend sweep of crosstown rival Rensselaer, her third career Goalie of the Week honor.

100/50 = 13

In Union's 9/30 contest with Robert Morris, senior Emily King played in her 100th collegiate game. The captain celebrated the milestone in eloquent fashion, scoring a goal and going 20-29 from the faceoff dot in her landmark contest. Later in the season, King picked up the 50th point of her career with an assist on first-year Maddie Leaney's goal on 10/27 against Cornell.

Have A (Career) Night

Riley Walsh picked up where she left off after one of the best seasons in program history in 2022-23. After scoring Union's first goal of the season for the second straight year in the season opener at St. Cloud State, the sophomore put up a career-

high four points off a goal and three assists in the home-opener against Robert Morris. Walsh also had a team-high six shots and finished the game tied for a team-best +2 rating.

Scouting the Nittany Lions

After a challenging start to the season that saw Penn State (11-8-1) open the season with just one win in their first eight games- six of those games coming against top-10 teams- and lose their spot in the national rankings, the Nittany Lions have won 10 of their last 12 and have reentered the top-15 heading into 2024.

Reigning HCA National Rookie of the Year and Team USA representative Tessa Janekce is 10th in the nation with 27 points and fifth in the nation with 19 assists. Eight teammates join her with double-digit points in 23-24, led by freshman Stella Retrum, the HCA National Rookie of the Month for November, with 14 points. All 18 of Penn State's skaters have appeared in at least 10 games this season, and each one has registered a point.

Penn State's all-time goaltending wins and shutouts recordholder Josie Bothun maintains her control of the Penn State net, posting a .910 save percentage and 2.40 goals against average in her 19 starts so far this season. Defensewoman Lyndie Lobdell is the leading returning defense corps point getter this season with 10 points, and four of her five goals have come on the power play, tops on the team.

On Garnet Alert

2023-24 is set to be a year that provides many changes to the Garnet Chargers record books. Senior Emily King already has her fingerprints all over it, and will look to continue to rise up the ranks. Junior Sophie Matsoukas and senior Celeste Beaudoin also see their name in the books, and sophomore Riley Walsh is set to enter her name in multiple categories.

Leading The Way

The winningest coach in Union Women's Hockey program history, Josh Sciba, returns for his eighth season behind the Garnet Chargers bench in 2023-24. Union will look to build off their 11 wins from 2022-23, the most in the program's Division 1 history.

Here To Assist

Joining Sciba behind the bench are Assistant Coaches Chris Ardito, Olivia Soares, and Lora Ardoin. Ardito commences his third season with the program in 2023-24, while the current campaign will be Soares's second with Union. Ardoin joins the staff for her first season with the program.

New Blood

For the third straight year, Sciba and his staff have brought in eight student-athletes as their recruiting class. The Class of 2027 traverses three countries, three Canadian provinces, and four states, and includes four forwards, three blueliners, and one goaltender.

O-Zone Experience

Union returns 19 players from a season ago, including their seven highest leading point scorers. Sophomore Riley Walsh tallied team-highs with 15 goals and 22 points in her first year at Union, good for third- and seventh-most in a single season in program history, while senior Emily King, who's 41 points are good for 10th most in Union's Division 1 era, returns for one last ride.

Anchoring the Blueline

Also apart of those 19 returnees are four blueliners that appeared in every game a season ago- Stephanie Bourque, Emma Hebert, Meredith Killian, and Allison Smith- and Union's starting- and second-winningest all-time- goaltender, Sophie Matsoukas.

Charging Forward

Union's teams will be playing with a new name this season, as the College rebranded to the Garnet Chargers in August. The Garnet Chargers nickname was selected from a field of over 400 names submitted, and references the school's official color of over 150 years, Garnet, and Schenectady's legacy as a hub for electrical innovation and

invention. Union also added a new "U" logo as part of the rebrand.

Captaining the Ship

2022-23 Captain Emily King returns for her second season wearing the "C" for the Garnet Chargers, and her three Assistant Captains a season ago- Celeste Beaudoin, Meredith Killian, and Allison Smith- have all been elevated to Captain for 2023-24.

Shock Warning

Union was picked to finish 12th in the ECAC Hockey preseason coaches poll after their finish in that position last year. The Garnet Chargers will look to build off their 11 wins from last season to surprise in 2023-24.

WE'VE MET BEFORE

- The weekend set between Union and Penn State will be the two sides 15th and 16th meetings, and first since October 12th-13th, 2018.
- Union won the first three matchups, but Penn State has had success recently in the series, and holds an 8-4-2 advantage.
- Union is 3-4-1 at Messa Rink, while Penn State is 4-1-1 as the hosts.
- The two teams met in Schenectady in Penn State's first season as a Division I program, with Union sweeping the January 11th and 12th, 2013 weekend set.
- Union would take the first game in Happy Valley that October before PSU clinched a weekend draw.
- Penn State would go on to win four of the next five, with a tie between the two being Union's best result in that stretch, before Union got back in the win column in October 2016.
- Penn State would get back to their winning ways a year later before another tie would be Union's best effort after two PSU wins in October 2018 brought the series to it's current point.
- This weekend's series will be the first outside the month of October since their first ever meetings in January 2013- the 12 since all came in the six Octobers following.
- Outside their eight goal output October 7th, 2016, Penn State holds a narrow 28-19 goal advantage in the all-time series.

COACHING STAFF

HEAD COACH JOSH SCIBA



Josh Sciba enters his seventh season as the Head Coach at Union College in 2023-24, looking to continue to build off the foundation he has laid in his six previous seasons and the program's best season in their Division I history a year ago.

Sciba guided the program to 11 wins in 2022-23, the most wins by the program in 20 years, their last season in Division III. With Union's 3-1 victory over Harvard University on January 21st, Sciba became the program's all-time winnigest coach with his 37th victory.

In addition to his time at Union, Sciba has gained valuable experience coaching at the international level. He served as an assistant coach on the USA Under-18 Team at the 2019 and 2020 IIHF World U-18 Championships, helping to lead Team USA to a gold and silver medal. Last August, Sciba moved up to serve as an assistant coach with Team USA at the 2022 IIHF Women's Hockey World Championships in Denmark, and was back with Team USA in April of 2023, when Team USA captured Gold at the 2023 IIHF Women's World Championship.

Before coming to Union, Sciba served as the assistant coach at Colgate University from 2012-16. In his final season, Sciba helped lead the Raiders to a program-record 22 wins and a No. 8 ranking in the final USCHO.com national poll. He also constructed and managed Colgate's power play, which finished the year ranked seventh in the nation (21.0 percent). As the recruiting coordinator for the Raiders, Sciba recruited and committed five Hockey Canada Under-18 players, one USA Hockey Under-18 player, one Czech Republic Under-18 player and one Swiss National Team player, all of which were firsts in program history.

Sciba earned his Bachelor's degree from Notre Dame in 2007, where he compiled 72 points in 141 career games for the Fighting Irish.

ASSISTANT COACH CHRIS ARDITO



Chris Ardito returns for his third season as an assistant coach with the Union women's hockey program in 2023-24.

In his second season on the bench, Union had one of the best seasons in program history in 2022-23, posting the most wins in a single season at the Division I level with an 11-22-1 record. The team had one of its best stretches in the month of November, winning three games in overtime as part of a four-game winning streak and five-game unbeaten streak, both the longest-ever in the program's Division I history. Union also earned its first win over a nationally ranked opponent with a 4-1 victory over #15 Princeton University and won the season series with Harvard University (1-0-1) for the first time ever.

Before coming to Union, Ardito spent three years at Vermont Academy as the head girl's hockey coach. In his role, he guided players through the college placement process, fostered team building and leadership training, implemented a training program, and handled all aspects of hockey operations. Prior to his time in Vermont, he spent eight years as a partner and head instructor at Connecticut Crease, working with goaltenders of all ages and abilities.

Ardito also spent six years with the Yale University women's hockey team, first as a volunteer assistant, and then as their goal and analytics coach. While at Yale, he worked in scouting, video analysis, and implemented a shot quality-based stats system to aide in developing defensive and offensive systems.

At the professional level, Ardito served as the General Manager of the Connecticut Whale of the National Women's Hockey League (now Premier Hockey Federation) and also worked with the St. Louis Blues in analytics within their goalie department. Using analytics on professional goaltenders, he was able to breakdown data and goaltender tendencies, while also creating a stat-based evaluation on top prospects.

ASSISTANT COACH OLIVIA SOARES



Olivia Soares begins her second season as an assistant coach with the program in 2023-24.

Soares is one of only two black female coaches in NCAA Division I hockey, joining Nina Rodgers at fellow ECAC Hockey institution Dartmouth College.

Soares comes to Union after serving as an assistant coach at Colby College, where she helped to lead the Mules to the best season in program history in her first year. Colby set a program record for wins with a 16-6-1 record and earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament, finishing the season eighth in the USCHO.com national rankings.

Prior to joining the collegiate coaching ranks, Soares was a four-year member of the women's hockey team at The Ohio State University from 2016-20, playing in 142 games for the Buckeyes over her career. She served as an assistant captain as a junior and moved into the captain's role as a senior, leading the team to the program's first WCHA Tournament championship before the NCAA Tournament was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A WCHA Scholar-Athlete honoree in 2018 and was a three-time conference All-Academic Team selection, Soares graduated from Ohio State in 2020 with a degree in education and earned her master's degree in sports management from OSU in 2021.

ASSISTANT COACH LORA ARDOIN



Lora Ardoin begins her first season as an Assistant Coach with the Union College women's hockey program in 2023-24.

Ardoin comes to Union after spending two seasons as an Assistant Coach at Stevenson University, where she was responsible for recruiting, practice planning, and video breakdown.

Prior to her time with the Mustangs, Ardoin spent two seasons at Elmira College serving as a Graduate Assistant in women's hockey operations, handling all video coordination in addition to other administrative tasks. The Soaring Eagles went a combined 35-5-2 in her two seasons and won a pair of United Collegiate Hockey Conference (UCHC) championships during Ardoin's time with the program. Ardoin also served as the Intramural and Recreation Coordinator and as a Volunteer Women's Lacrosse Coach during her time at EC.

Ardoin played collegiately at SUNY Canton from 2014-17, where she was a four-year captain of the Roos and helped guide Canton to their first Colonial Hockey Conference Tournament victory and semifinal appearance in program history in her senior season. Ardoin skated in 85 games throughout her collegiate career, tallying 13 goals and 12 assists for 25 points. She also lettered in lacrosse all four years in Canton, and was President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) in her senior year.

Ardoin holds additional experience working with the USA Hockey National Camp, USA Hockey Coaching Education Program, and the Knoxville Ice Bears, a member of the SPHL. She graduated from SUNY Canton with a degree in Sports Management in 2017 and completed her Master's in Management at Elmira College in the spring of 2021.
