LOOKING BACK

Billy Lombardi had a career game for Penn State going 14-22 at the face-off 'X' and scoring his first collegiate goal, but the Nittany Lions were unable to overcome a five-goal third quarter for UMass and fell to the Minutemen, 12-8.

CAREER CLOUT

With their smallest senior class since 2012, the younger members of the 2015 Nittany Lions are stepping up. TJ Sanders' assist total is a personal best. In his first year as a starter, Connor Darcey has set career marks in all goalie categories. Nick **Aponte** has career highs in goals, assists, points, shots on goal and ground balls. **James Chakey** and Tyler Chambers have both recorded career best marks in ground balls and caused turnovers. Ryan Guittare's goal, point, ground ball and caused turnover marks are career highs. Drake Kreinz has career bests in shots and caused turnovers. Matt Sexton's goals, shots and ground balls totals are the best of his career, as are Mike Sutton's ground ball, assist and shot marks. Peter Triolo and Dan Craig also have bests in caused turnovers.

SAVED!

Connor Darcey has been a stalwart in the cage this season, his first as a starter. In Penn State's game at Harvard, Darcey made 18 saves, the most for a Nittany Lion since 2012 and the highest number on the day for a Big Ten goalie. In his first collegiate start, against Vermont, Darcey made 15 saves, the most of any Big Ten goalie in action during the day en route to his first collegiate win. His efforts earned him the first-ever Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week award. Currently, Darcey ranks

second in the Big Ten with 12.29 saves per game, which ranks 12th nationally.

SANDERS STANDS OUT

Since joining the Nittany Lions as a freshman in 2013, a Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year campaign, **TJ Sanders** has been one of Penn State's most reliable attackmen. He has scored in all but six games since his debut in the Blue and White, scoring multiple goals in 23 games. Sanders is currently third in the Big Ten with 2.43 goals per game and fourth with 3.43 points per game.

AROUND THE HORN

To start the season, 15 Nittany Lions have scored at least one goal. TJ Sanders leads the team with 17 goals. Mike Sutton has 10, and fellow middies Matt Florence and Nick Aponte have nine and seven goals respectively. Pat Manley and Dan Craig each have five goals, Matt Sexton and Drake Kreinz have a trio of tallies a piece, Kyle Baier and Brian Prestreau have recorded a pair of goals and Ryan Guittare, Tripp Traynor, Billy Lombardi, Tanner Peck and James Burke each scored a goal.

AND THE HOME TEAM WINS

Being the home team comes with perks, and the Nittany Lions have taken advantage. This season, Penn State is 3-0 when acting as the host, with wins against Vermont (15-8), No. 16/11 Penn (14-11) and Marist (9-8) at Babson College. As the home team, the Nittany Lions have out-scored their opponents 38-27, versus being out-scored 43-30 as the visitor.

SCOUTING THE PIONEERS

After being top-ranked to start the season, a pair of losses to No. 4 North Carolina and unranked Ohio State haven't dropped the Pioneers (5-2) drastically in the national rankings, who are now No. 5. In its most recent contest on March 17, Denver used a 10-1 run starting in the second quarter to top Lehigh, 10-4. For the season, sophomore transfer Connor Cannizzaro has lit up the scoring ledger for Denver, with his 4.57 points per game ranking 13th nationally. Freshman Trevor Baptiste has been dominant at the 'X', winning 68.1 percent of his face-offs for the fourth best mark in the nation and helping the Pioneers to their 67.5 percent winning percentage at the 'X', which is second in Division I.

SERIES HISTORY vs. DENVER

Denver leads the teams' all-time series, 4-2. Last season, the Nittany Lions couldn't keep pace with Denver's offense and fell to the Pioneers, 15-11.

ON THE OFFENSE

Following a six-point performance in a 14-11 home victory over then-No. 16/11 Penn, **TJ Sanders** captured Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week accolades. This is the first-ever Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor for a Nittany Lion. Sanders scored four goals and assisted on the eventual game-winner late in the second quarter and a fourth quarter tally, helping Penn State to its first win over a ranked team this season. The contest marked the junior's 20th multi-goal game, and tied his career high for points, goals and assists.

A GAME OF FIRSTS

The Nittany Lions' 14-11 win over then-No. 16/11 Penn was more than just the team's first win over a ranked opponent this year. Sophomore **Nick Aponte** surpassed his career high in ground balls (7), **James Burke** scored the first goal of his three-year Nittany Lion career, also recording his first career point, junior **James Chakey** had career performances for ground balls (4) and caused turnovers (1), sophomores **Tyler Chambers** and **Dan Craig** each caused his first turnovers while wearing the Blue and White, junior **TJ Sanders** took a career-best 12 shots and sophomore **Mike Sutton's** five ground balls was a career showing.

SWEET FLO

Matt Florence has made an immediate impact since transferring to Penn State this year. He has scored 1.8 goals per game and recorded 3.25 points per game, which put him eighth and ninth in the Big Ten, and his 0.409 shot percentage ranks third in the conference. He had a four-goal outing against Penn and scored a hat trick and added two assists in the season opener against Vermont, the first three-goal performance in a Penn State debut since 2002. He also scored the game's first goal at Loyola and added additional assists against the Greyhounds and at Villanova.

CLEAR VISIBILITY

For the first year of Big Ten Lacrosse, the Nittany Lions will be available to more people than ever before. All of Penn State's Big Ten games will be broadcast live on television. The Ohio State and Johns Hopkins games will air on ESPNU, and the Maryland, Rutgers and Michigan games are slated for the Big Ten Network. The Big Ten Network will also show every contest of the Big Ten Men's Lacrosse Tournament.

ROAD WARRIORS

four of Penn State's games will be played in Happy Valley, the fewest of any Big Ten team. Penn State also plays a pair of neutral site games against Marist (at Babson College) and Denver (at Hofstra), alongside seven true road games.

PENN STATE OPENS 2015 WITH 15-8 WIN

Two Nittany Lions recorded hat tricks and **Connor Darcey** earned the first win in the first start of his collegiate career, leading the No. 14/17 Penn State men's lacrosse team to a season-opening 15-8 win over Vermont on Feb. 7. Penn State's offensive output was evenly distributed throughout the game. In both the third and fourth quarters, the Blue and White scored four goals, and put five past the Catamounts in the opening 15 minutes.

RICHARDS DRAFTED IN MLL

Senior **Michael Richards** was tabbed 45th overall in the 2015 Major League Lacrosse (MLL) Collegiate Draft by the Denver Outlaws on Jan. 23 in Baltimore. Richards joins Shane Sturgis (New York Lizards) and Tom LaCrosse (Ohio Machine), both of whom exhausted eligibility in 2014 and were picked in the 2015 Supplemental Draft, as selections by one of the MLL's eight teams in the U.S.A. and Canada. Richards appeared in all of the Nittany Lions' contests last season, making 10 starts in the midfield. The 2014 Academic All-Big Ten honoree recorded six points, collected 20 ground balls and caused four turnovers.

TAMBRONI IN HIS FIFTH SEASON

Guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni is in his fifth season as Penn State's head coach in 2015. With a 35-24 record, Tambroni has guided his Nittany Lion teams to .500-or-better records in each of his four seasons at the helm.

Guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni is in his fifth season as Penn State's head coach in 2015.

In 2014, Tambroni led Penn State to its fourth consecutive above-.500 season. His student-athletes earned the eighth USILA All-American and third Scholar All-America honors of Tambroni's Penn State career. He also coached goalkeeper Austin Kaut to his school record third All-America honor and conference-best All-CAA First Team award.

Penn State's 2013 campaign saw Tambroni lead Penn State to one of the greatest seasons in program history while celebrating its 100th season. The Nittany Lions set new records for wins (12) and earned the program's first outright regular season conference title by sweeping the CAA with a 6-0 record. PSU rattled off 10 straight wins during the months of March, April and May to earn the school's third NCAA bid and first chance to host an NCAA game.

Tambroni was named CAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2011), while goalkeeper Austin Kaut (under Tambroni's tutelage) was named Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalie. Also, Kaut was CAA Player and Defensive Player of the Year. Freshman TJ Sanders was named Rookie of the Year and the Nittany Lions placed six on the All-CAA First Team.

During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a second-place CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees.

Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.

During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.

Men's Lacrosse Drops 12-8 Decision to UMass

AMHERST, Mass.; March 14, 2015 - Billy Lombardi (Rochester, N.Y.) had a career game for the Penn State men's lacrosse team going 14-22 at the face-off 'X' and scoring his first collegiate goal, but the Nittany Lions were unable to overcome a five-goal third quarter for Massachusetts and fell to the Minutemen, 12-8.

TJ Sanders (Orillia, Ontario) scored a pair of goals, while **Dan Craig** (Shelburne, Ontario), **Nick Aponte** (West Islip, N.Y.), **Mike Sutton** (Sewell, N.J.), **Tanner Peck** (Lincoln University, Pa.),Lombardi and **Drake Kreinz** (Delafield, Wis.) each added tallies for the Nittany Lions (3-4).

UMass (2-5) out-shot Penn State, 31-28, taking 14 shots in the third quarter alone. The Nittany Lions were led by Sutton's five shots. In the cage, both Zach Oliveri and **Connor Darcey** (Wellesley, Mass.) made nine saves. Penn State dominated at the face-off 'X', posting a 15-8 mark. Penn State was 2-for-3 on the man-up, and UMass went 1-for-4.

Penn State got off to a hot start, taking a 4-0 lead just 7:02 into the first quarter.

Kreinz won the game's opening face-off on a UMass violation. He drove down the field and sent an overhand shot from 10 yards out into the cage to put Penn State up 1-0 three seconds into the contest. The tally was his second off of the face-off in as many games.

Two minutes later, the Nittany Lions were able to build on its lead. **JP Burnside** (Garden City, N.Y.) sent the ball to Sanders, whose overhand shot from five yards out made the score 2-0. Sanders added another goal 33 seconds later on the man-up to give Penn State a 3-0 cushion.

The Blue and White pulled away with a 4-0 lead four-and-a-half minutes later, thanks to Craig's highlight reel goal. With the extra man, he retrieved a pass from Sanders in front of the crease, spun around and got off the shot through traffic.

But the Minutemen scored four unanswered goals to tie the game five minutes into the second quarter.

Sutton was able to regain the Nittany Lions' lead as time was winding down in the first half. Sutton pushed through traffic and went high to give the Blue and White a 5-4 lead.

UMass opened the second half on a tear, however, and did not trail the Nittany Lions again in the game from 9:49 into the third quarter on.

Penn State was able to knot the score twice more in the quarter, with an Aponte low sidearm shot at 11:38 of the third and Lombardi's first career goal. The sophomore, seeing the most action of his collegiate career, won the face-off and ran down the field, taking a low backhand shot that bounced past Oliveri for the 7-7 score.

Peck would add his first collegiate goal, a low sidearm shot from the front of the cage, for the final 12-8 score.
