THE GAME: Penn State and Akron will face each other for the sixth time. Penn State holds a 4-1 lead in the series and has won the last four meetings. The teams last met in 1994 with Penn State claiming an 80-45 victory in State College. Akron's lone victory in the series came with a 29-19 win in Akron in 1937. Penn State holds a 27-11 record all-time vs. MAC schools.

FRAZIER CRACKS 1,000/24TH IN CAREER SCORING: With 23 points in Penn State's 72-55 loss to N.C. State in its first game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, Tim Frazier became the 30th 1,000-point scorer in Penn State history. He posted 19 in a second round win over Providence and now has 1,035 career points which is good for 24th place all-time on the scoring charts. His 19 points marked his 25th straight double-digit scoring game, 14 of which have been 20+ point outings. He has led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 34 games and scored 20+ points in nine of the last 13.

NOTES FROM THE PROVIDENCE GAME:

- Penn State played and won its first overtime game under coach Patrick Chambers.It was Chambers' third career overtime game as a head coach (2-0 at BU) and he is now 3-0.
- The overtime win was the first for Penn State since a 77-73 victory over George Mason in the first round of the 2009 NIT and the Lions first overtime game since a 79-71 loss at No. 18 Wisconsin in 2010.
- With 19 points, Tim Frazier recorded his 25th straight double-digit scoring game and led PSU in scoringfor the 28th time in the last 35 games.
- Frazier scored nine straight points during a key second half stretch in which Penn State went from down four, 35-31, with 7:24 to play to up three, 40-37, with 2:23 left.
- Frazier led Penn State in scoring (19), rebounds (9), assists (7), and steals (4) while playing all 45 minutes (a career most) of the overtime game. After leading Penn State in all four categories last year, he currently leads the Lions in points, assists and steals on the year and is second in rebounding (6.0) to Jermaine Marshall (6.3).
- Tim Frazier is now 33-of-39 (84%) at the line on the year, getting to the line an average of 13 times per game. He is 110-of-122 (90%) at the line over his last 19 games.
- Penn State got 41 of its 55 points from its staring backcourt of Frazier, Marshall (13) and D.J. Newbill (9) and has gotten 80% (88 of 110) of its points from them in the Tip-Off and 78% (136 of 175) on the year.
- Penn State grabbed a season high 16 offensive rebounds and has had 13 or more in every game this year for an average of 14.3 per game.
- Penn State had a season high 11 steals and forced 21 Providence turnovers. Penn State has 19 steals in the tournament and is averaging 8.3 spg on the year.
- Penn State scored 12 points on 4-of-6 shooting in overtime after scoring 14 points on 6-of-23 in the first half.
- Penn State continued to struggle shooting hitting 4-of-21 (19%) from three and is now 7-of-40 (17.5%) from the arc for the tournament and 10-of-64 (15.6%) on the year.

SCOUTING AKRON: The Zips posted an 82-63 win over UNC Ashevill on Friday hitting 12-of-24 from three and 49 percent from the floor. Senior forward Chauncey Gilliam (6-5) hit 5-of-6 from three for 22 points in the game while Bayamon, PR native Alex Abreu had 12 points and nine assists. He is one of two Zip players from Puerto Rico. Akron is 2-2 on the year and is posting 78.5 ppg with four players averaging in double figures led by Abreu's 12.8 ppg. Senior, 7-0 center Zeke Marshall leads the team with 8.8 rebounds per game. Akron posted a 22-12 record last season and won the MAC with a 13-3 record. They return four juniors and two seniors from that team.

PENN STATE 55, PROVIDENCE 52 OT Nov. 16, 2012 • Puerto Rico Tip-Off

Despite struggling shooting and trailing for most of the game, Penn State found a way to win behind team highs of 19 points, nine rebounds, seven assists and four steals from Tim Frazier and late clutch shooting from Jermaine Marshall (13) for its first overtime victory under coach Patrick Chambers. Both teams struggled in the first half that saw Providence leading 16-14 at the break with the teams a combined 11-of-42 from the floor. Penn State warmed up to shoot 42 percent in the second half and 4-of-6 in overtime and grabbed 11 steals while forcing 21 Friar turnovers using a 1-2-2 press in the second half. Trailing by 10, 30-20, with 12:28 to play, Frazier scored 13 of the Lions' 20 points, and nine straight at one point, in a 20-7 run that saw Penn State take a 40-37 lead with 2:23 left. A Marshall three gave PSU a 43-41 lead, but two Kadeem Batts free throws sent it to overtime. A D.J. Newbill jumper and another Marshall three gave PSU the lead for good in overtime.

Newbill, in his first action at Penn State, posted 16 points and seven rebounds and a career-best 9-of-10 at the foul line. Ross Travis added 10 points and a career-best tying nine boards. The Lions shot 29 percent in the first hald and 36 percent for the game, including a 3-of-24 (.125) effort from three, but outscored St. Francis 28-9 at the foul line to overcome 17 turnovers. Penn State led by 10 in the first half, but saw that trimmed to 26-20 at the half. SFU hit three straight threes to take a one-point lead in the second half behind 19 points from Ollie Jackson. Penn State could not find its shooting touch in the first game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off starting 2-of-10 and going on to shoot 31.7 percent from the floor and 3-of-19 (15.8%) in a 72-55 loss to No. 6 N.C. State. Tim Frazier led the way with 23 points on 10-of-11 at the foul line and 6-of-20 from the floor. D.J. Newbill added 13 points, Jermaine Marshall 11 points and eight boards and Jon Graham a career-best equaling 10 rebounds. N.C. State was paced by 22 points and eight boards from freshman T.J. Warren off the bench as the Wolfpack hit 8-of-16 from three and shot 50 percent for the game. PSU kept it close in the first half trailing by just six after a Marshall three with 4:33 left in the half before going to the locker room down 35-26. N.C. State used a 10-0 run early in the second to open up a 47-30 lead as the Lions had one field goal in the first five minutes of the half. N.C. State led by as many as 25 before PSU closed within 14 late.

Despite struggling shooting and trailing for most of the game, Penn State found a way to win behind team highs of 19 points, nine rebounds, seven assists and four steals from Tim Frazier and late clutch shooting from Jermaine Marshall (13) for its first overtime victory under coach Patrick Chambers. Both teams struggled in the first half that saw Providence leading 16-14 at the break with the teams a combined 11-of-42 from the floor. Penn State warmed up to shoot 42 percent in the second half and 4-of-6 in overtime and grabbed 11 steals while forcing 21 Friar turnovers using a 1-2-2 press in the second half. Trailing by 10, 30-20, with 12:28 to play, Frazier scored 13 of the Lions' 20 points, and nine straight at one point, in a 20-7 run that saw Penn State take a 40-37 lead with 2:23 left. A Marshall three gave PSU a 43-41 lead, but two Kadeem Batts free throws sent it to overtime. A D.J. Newbill jumper and another Marshall three gave PSU
