WISCONSIN SEEKS SEVENTH-STRAIGHT WIN

- Riding a six-game win streak, No. 14 Wisconsin (9-2, 6-1 Big Ten) returns home Saturday to close out the regular season at Camp Randall Stadium against Penn State (6-5, 4-3). Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. on ESPN.
- The Badgers look to finish off their third unbeaten season at home in the last four years while honoring 26 outgoing players as part of Senior Day (see list, Page 2).

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- Saturday's game will be the latest home game in Badgers history. The latest UW has hosted a football game was 40-0 win over Northwestern on Nov. 29, 1891. The latest game played in Camp Randall Stadium was a 7-6 win over Michigan State on Nov. 28, 1918.
- Wisconsin's senior class, which will be honored in a pregame ceremony, has gone 25-2 at home over the last four seasons, including perfect 7-0 records in 2010 and 2011. The Badgers can add a third perfect home mark to that total with a win Saturday.



Over his last five full games, senior LB Chris Borland has averaged 12.2 tackles and 1.3 tackles for loss while recording three sacks and a forced fumble and recovering two fumbles.

- Over the last eight seasons (since 2006), the Badgers are 27-4 (.871) after Nov. 1, excluding bowl games. That's the best such record of any FBS team in that span.
- The Badgers seek their ninth 10-win season in school history and the fourth in five seasons.
- A victory Saturday would give Wisconsin seven Big Ten wins for the fifth time in school history. The Badgers also went 7-1 in conferece play in 1998, 1999, 2006 and 2010.
- The Badgers enter Saturday's game having held their last three Big Ten opponents without an offensive touchdown. UW ranks No. 5 nationally in scoring defense at 13.4 points per game and is one of six FBS teams allowing fewer than 300 total yards per game (278.5).
- The Badgers have allowed just three touchdowns in six home games this season, with opponents averaging just 6.0 points per game at Camp Randall Stadium.
- Wisconsin needs just 34 rushing yards to break the school record of 3,309 set last season (in 14 games) and 30 to break the 12-game mark of 3,305 set in 1999. UW is also on pace to set school records for total offense (489.3 yards per game) and rushing offense (297.8).

NUMBERS TO KNOW



NG Beau Allen, OL Ryan Groy, DE Ethan Hemer and S Dezmen Southward will play in the 53rd game of their careers on Saturday, setting a school record for most games played. Those four players have not missed a game during their four years of eligibility.

With a combined 2,656 rushing yards on the season, sophomore RB Melvin Gordon and senior RB James White need a total of 349 yards to break the NCAA's single-season record for rushing yards by teammates of 3,004 set by Nevada's Cody Fajardo and Stefphon Jefferson in 2012.

GET TO KNOW GARY

- In scoring a 45-0 win over UMass and a 48-0 victory over Tennessee Tech, Andersen became the seventh head coach since World War II to open his career at a school with backto-back shutouts (among "Power Five" conference schools), and the first since Fred Akers at Texas in 1977.
- The 10th head coach to take the reins of the UW program in the modern era, Andersen became just the second to win his Big Ten debut. With the Badgers' 41-10 victory over Purdue, he joined Dave McClain, who guided UW to a 34-7 win over Indiana in the 1978 Big Ten opener.
- Andersen became the 21st coach to win his UW debut and joined Ivy Williamson (41-0 vs. Marquette in 1949) and Milt Bruhn (41-0 vs. Marquette in 1956) as the only modern-era UW coaches to score a shutout in their first game at the helm
- Andersen, in his sixth season as a head coach, owns a career record of 39-33 (.542).
- Andersen is 25-5 (.833) in his last 30 games as a head coach, dating back to his time at Utah State. One of those losses is the 16-14 setback his Utah State team endured at the hands of the Badgers last season at Camp Randall Stadium.
- Andersen, 49, is in his first season as Wisconsin's head coach after being hired on Dec. 20, 2012. He spent the last four seasons at Utah State, leading the Aggies to a school-record 11 wins in 2012 and a No. 16 ranking in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll.
- Andersen has brought in seven new assistant coaches to join running backs coach Thomas Hammock and cornerbacks coach Ben Strickland, who were retained from the previous staff. New to the staff are offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig (QB), defensive coordinator Dave Aranda (LB) and assistants Chris Beatty (WR), Bill Busch (S), Jeff Genyk (TE), Chad Kauha'aha'a (DL) and T.J. Woods (OL).

HOME SWEET HOME

- The Badgers have gone 61-6 (.910) at Camp Randall Stadium since the start of the 2004 season, the third-best record in the nation over the last 10 years, trailing Boise State (.968) and Oklahoma (.934).
- UW has compiled a 7-0 record at Camp Randall Stadium four times (2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011) and can add a fifth with a win over Penn State.
- As usual, Wisconsin has made the most of its home-field advantage so far in 2013, going 6-0 in impressive fashion:
 - The Badgers have outscored their opponents 247-36, an average of 35.2 points per game (41.2-6.0) through their first six games at Camp Randall Stadium, which includes a pair of shutout wins.
 - UW has allowed just three touchdowns at Camp Randall, matching Alabama for the fewest allowed by an FBS team at home this season. The Badgers (6.0 points per game) are also tied with the Crimson Tide for the national lead in scoring defense in home games.

- With 39 wins since the start of the 2010 season, Wisconsin's senior class can match the school record for most wins in a fouryear span (40) with a victory over Penn State on Saturday. The Badgers' 2007 and 2012 senior classes hold the record.
- The Badgers' seniors have also won 23 Big Ten games over the last four years to match the school record in that category and can break the mark (set from 1997-2000) with a win Saturday.
- UW's seniors have defended their home turf well, going 25-2 at Camp Randall Stadium over the last four seasons.
- In addition, this year's senior class won three consecutive Big Ten championships, claimed victories in each of the first two league title games and went 6-0 in rivalry games vs. Iowa and Minnesota.

WINNING WAYS

- The Badgers seek their first seven-game win streak since closing out the 2010 regular season with seven consecutive victories en route to a share of the Big Ten title.
- Dating back to the Badgers' 37-26 win over UTEP on Sept. 22, 2012, each of Wisconsin's last 15 victories have come by a double-digit margin. The last time UW won a game by single digits was a 16-14 triumph over Gary Andersen's Utah State team on Sept. 15, 2012.
- The Badgers are 49-16 (.753) since the start of the 2009 season. That matches Florida State for the 10th-best record in the nation over that five-year span. Alabama (60-5, .923) has the nation's best record in that timeframe. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State (52-10, .839) has a better record than UW over the last five years.

- Wisconsin is 35-12 in its last 47 games (.745), with 23 of those wins coming by at least 20 points and all 12 losses coming by seven points or less.
- At 9-2 overall, Gary Andersen's first season has been among the most successful by a first-year head coach this season in the FBS. Of the 31 coaches that took over a new program in 2013, only five have posted at least nine wins:

- Andersen has won 17 of his last 20 conference games, dating back to his tenure at Utah State.
- At 6-1 in league play, the Badgers have six Big Ten wins for the third time in the last four seasons. The Badgers, Michigan State and Ohio State are the only teams that can make that claim.

BEST OF BOTH WORLDS

Few teams have been able to combine as effective units on both offense and defense this season than Wisconsin. The Badgers rank fifth nationally in scoring defense (13.4) while ranking 23rd in scoring offense (36.8). That average scoring margin of +23.4 points is seventh-best among FBS teams:

- As good as it has been all season, the Badgers' defense continues to improve. Over its last four games, UW's defense has allowed just two touchdowns and held its opponents to 7.3 points per game.
- On average, the Badgers have held FBS opponents 16.7 points below their scoring average in their other 10 games:

- Of Wisconsin's 11 opponents, 7 have been held to their lowest scoring output of the season by the Badgers.
- Wisconsin held a Minnesota offense averaging 366.4 total yards and 30.7 points per game to 185 yards and zero offensive points last Saturday.
- Indiana entered its game vs. UW ranked among the nation's top 10 in both scoring offense (43.1 points per game) and total offense (527.1 yards per game). The Badgers held IU to 3 points and 224 yards (42.5% of its season average).
- On its way to ranking sixth nationally in total defense (278.5 yards per game), the Badgers have held 6 of their 11 opponents under 250 offensive yards: UMass (212), Tennessee Tech (113), Purdue (180), Northwestern (241), Indiana (224) and Minnesota (185). Only Michigan State (7) has kept more opponents under 250 total yards this season.
- The Badgers (1,090 rushing and 1,973 passing) are one of just four teams that have allowed less than 1,100 rushing yards and less than 2,000 passing yards this season, joining Michigan State, Louisville and Alabama.
- Wisconsin has limited opponents to an average of just 4.25 yards per play, the fourth-best average of any FBS defense. That trails only Michigan State (3.82), Florida State (4.02) and Louisville (4.14).
- The Badgers have allowed just 28 plays of 20 yards or longer, tying them with Notre Dame for the third-fewest given up by an FBS team. Florida State and Oregon lead the nation with 27 plays of 20-plus yards allowed.
- Wisconsin also ranks among the nation's top five in fewest plays allowed of 30-plus yards (T-4th, 11), 40-plus yards (T-2nd, 4) and 50-plus yards (T-1st, 1).
- For the season, UW has forced three-andouts on 45.5% of its opponents' drives

- Wisconsin ranks No. 3 nationally in opponent third-down conversion percentage at 29.3%. Louisville leads the nation at a rate of just 26.4%, followed by Michigan State at 27.3%.
- After allowing its last two opponents (Indiana and Minnesota) just one red-zone trip each, Wisconsin has allowed opponents past its 20 yard line just 25 times in 11 games. That ranks in a tie for the sixthfewest red-zone trips allowed by an FBS team. Alabama and Michigan State have allowed the fewest at 20.
- The Badgers have allowed a total of six opponent drives to enter the red zone in their six home games this season, with only one resulting in a touchdown.
- Wisconsin leads the nation in touchdown percentage in the red zone, allowing TDs on just 36.0% of opponents' red-zone trips (9 of 25). The Badgers' nine red-zone TDs allowed this season match Alabama for the fewest by an FBS team.
- This is the second-consecutive season a Dave Aranda-led defense has led the nation in red-zone TD percentage. Utah State allowed opponents to score TDs on just 29.6% of their red-zone trips in 2012.
- Wisconsin was one of the nation's leaders in keeping opponents out of the red zone in 2012, as well, but the Badgers' ability to keep foes out of the end zone has been a major improvement over last season:

The Badgers have surrendered just one touchdown in their opponents' last eight red-zone trips, with Iowa going 0-for-4, BYU 1-for-2, Indiana 0-for-1 and Minnesota 0-for-1 in scoring TDs.

ONE-WAY TRAFFIC

- Not only has Wisconsin been one of the nation's best at running the ball this season, the Badgers have been among the best at stopping the run, as well:
- Wisconsin and Ohio State are the only FBS teams to average at least 290 rushing yards per game while allowing fewer than 100 rushing yards on defense.
- Wisconsin has held each of its 11 opponents under their rushing average for the season. On average, the Badgers have limited their opponents to just 52% of their per-game rushing output.
- UW has allowed opponents an average of just 3.10 yards per rushing attempt, the 10th-best mark of any FBS team. Michigan State leads the nation at 2.18 yards allowed per rushing attempt.
- The Badgers have held 9 of their 11 opponents to less than 3.5 rushing yards per attempt.
- Of the 352 rushing attempts by UW opponents this season, just 3 (0.9%) have gone for 20 or more yards.
- Wisconsin has allowed just three runs of 20-plus yards on the season, tied with Alabama for the fewest allowed by an FBS defense.
- The Badgers held a Northwestern offense that entered the game averaging 218.4 rushing yards per game to just 44 yards on Oct. 12. It was the Wildcats' lowest rushing output since Sept. 22, 2007.
- Wisconsin limited Ohio State to a seasonlow 192 rushing yards and 0 rushing touchdowns. The Buckeyes have averaged 327.0 yards and 3.6 rushing TDs in their other 10 games.
- UW has held five of its 11 opponents to 100 rushing yards or fewer — and three to less than 50 yards: UMass (100), Tennessee Tech (44), Purdue (45), Northwestern (44), Illinois (72).
- Through 11 games, Wisconsin's offense has produced 18 100-yard rushing performances — a school record for 100-yard games. Conversely, UW's defense has not allowed a 100-yard rusher in 2013.
- The Badgers are one of four FBS teams to not allow a 100-yard rusher this season, joining Memphis, Ohio State and Syracuse.
- Since the beginning of the 2012 season (25 games), the Badgers have allowed only three 100-yard rushing performances while racking up 34 100-yard games of their own.

NO PASSING ZONE

- UW ranks No. 3 nationally and second in the Big Ten in pass efficiency defense at 96.77. Florida State leads the nation at 90.65.
- The Badgers also rank third in the FBS in yards allowed per passing attempt at 5.3. Only Michigan State (5.1) and Florida State (5.2) are allowing fewer yards per attempt.
- Wisconsin has allowed 8 touchdown passes in 11 games, matching Louisville for the third-fewest surrendered by an FBS team. Florida leads the nation with 6 TD passes allowed, while Alabama ranks No. 2 with 7 passing TDs allowed.
- The Badgers held an Indiana team that entered its game with UW with a pass efficiency rating of 151.86 and a yards per attempt average of 8.5 to a rating of 67.49 and an average of 4.1 yards per throw.
- Overall, the Hoosiers' passing attack was held to season lows in completions (12), completion percentage (40.0) and yards (122) and was held without a passing touchdown for the first time this season.
- The Badgers have been the nation's best defense against the pass on third down, leading the FBS in pass effiency defense (67.03), completion percentage defense (37.7%) and yards allowed per attempt (3.57) on third down. UW is the only team allowing fewer than 4 yards per attempt on third down.
- Opponents have converted just 23.6% of their third-down attempts (25 of 106) through the air against UW's defense, the best mark of any FBS team. Utah State ranks No. 2 nationally at 24.8%.

- True freshman CB Sojourn Shelton is tied for second in the Big Ten in interceptions with four. Nationally, the only freshmen with more interceptions this season are Virginia Tech teammates Brandon Facyson (5) and Kendall Fuller (5).
- Shelton's four INTs are the second-most ever by a UW freshman (Jamar Fletcher had 7 as a redshirt freshman in 1998) and the most by a true freshman in school history.

BORLAND BEARS DOWN

Senior ILB Chris Borland, a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award and semifinalist for the Bednarik Award, Butkus Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy, was named the Big Ten's midseason defensive MVP by ESPN.com and a first-team midseason All-American by both ESPN.com and Sporting News.

TWO DECADES OF SUCCESS

In 1990, Barry Alvarez took over a Wisconsin football program that was struggling both competitively and financially. The Badgers had managed a winning record in just five of the previous 20 seasons and hadn't won the Big Ten since 1962.

Just three years later, however, Alvarez's 1993 team changed the game in Madison. Three seasons after a 1-10 mark in Alvarez's 1990 debut, the Badgers went 10-1-1, hoisted the Big Ten trophy and scored UW's first-ever Rose Bowl win.

Over the 20 seasons that have followed that magical season, UW has become one of the Big Ten's most consistent winners:

- Only Ohio State (10) has claimed a share of more Big Ten titles over the past 20 years than the six won by UW. The Buckeyes are also the only team to boast more wins (211) and a better winning percentage (.804) in that span than the Badgers, who have gone 184-78-4 (.699).
- Wisconsin claimed the first two Western Conference titles in 1896 and 1897. Over the next 95 seasons, however, UW won or shared just six conference championships. The Badgers have matched that output in just 20 seasons by winning at least a share of six Big Ten crowns since 1993, including the last three in a row.
- Borland has forced 14 fumbles in his career, matching the most in Big Ten history and the second-most by an FBS player. He has also recovered eight fumbles, tying him for second on UW's all-time list in that category.
- After missing most of UW's game vs. Illinois and entire contest vs. Iowa with an injury, Borland has posted three-straight double-digit tackle games vs. BYU, Indiana and Minnesota. He posted a game-high 13 stops and matched his career high with two sacks vs. BYU (he also had a QB hurry that resulted in another sack). Borland then added 10 tackles and 1.5 TFLs vs. Indiana.
- Borland made just shy of one-fourth of the Badgers' stops at Minnesota. He finished with 12 of the team's 49 tackles (UW's next-leading tackler had four), 1.0 TFL, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.
- In his last five full games, Borland has averaged 12.2 tackles and 1.3 tackles for loss and recorded three sacks. He has posted double-digit tackles in all five games.
- Borland's 16 tackles vs. Ohio State are the second-most stops by a Big Ten player in a game this season (OSU's Ryan Shazier had 20 tackles vs. Indiana on Nov. 23).
- Borland has had 10-plus tackles six times this season and 18 times in his career. That is the most double-digit tackle games of any UW player since 2000. Mike Taylor ranks No. 2 in that span with 12.
- Borland had a career-high 10 solo tackles at Ohio State and added another 8 solo stops vs. Northwestern.
- Borland ranks sixth all-time in tackles at UW with 400 for his career. He needs 28 stops to pass Dave Lokanc (1970-72) and Dave Crossen (1975-78) for fourth (427).

FOR STARTERS: OFFENSE

- UW has racked up more than 500 yards of total offense in five of its 11 games and is averaging 489.3 total yards per game.
 Wisconsin's school record for total offense is 469.9 yards per game, set in 2011.
- Wisconsin (3,276/2,106) is one of just four FBS teams with 3,000 rushing yards and 2,000 passing yards this season, joining Ohio State (3,462/2,378), Northern Illinois (3,402/2,642) and Oregon (3,057/3,251).
- Wisconsin's efficient offense has averaged 7.10 yards per play this season, the eighthbest average in the nation and the secondbest by a Big Ten team. Baylor leads all FBS teams at 8.18 yards per play, while Ohio State leads the Big Ten (and ranks No. 5 nationally) at 7.24.
- The Badgers have tallied 15 offensive plays of 50-plus yards, which ranks No. 2 nationally and trails only Baylor's nationleading total of 19.
- Of Wisconsin's 15 plays of 50-plus yards, 10 have gone for touchdowns. Wisconsin tied for second nationally last season with 15 offensive plays of at least 50 yards (trailing only Utah State's 18).
- The Badgers also rank second nationally in plays of 60-plus yards (11) and are tied for the national lead in plays of 70-plus yards (6) and 80-plus yards (3).
- Despite its ability to quickly move the ball with big plays, Wisconsin has still managed to keep the ball away from its opponents and ranks No. 3 nationally in time of possession at an average of 34:12 per game. Michigan State leads the nation in time of possession at 34:39.

- The Badgers are one of just 14 programs to have won at least 70 percent of their games during the BCS era. Among Big Ten programs, only Ohio State has more wins (160) and a better winning percentage (.800) since the start of the 1998 season.

Wisconsin's five Rose Bowl trips in the BCS era match USC for the most appearances in Pasadena by any team since 1998. No other Big Ten team has played in more than three Rose Bowls in that span. age that trails only Ohio State (314.7) among Big Ten teams.

- Wisconsin's 554 rushing yards vs. Indiana marked the second-highest total in school history (trailing only the school-record 564 yards UW racked up vs. Indiana in 2012) and the highest rushing output by an FBS team this season.
- The Badgers rank No. 2 nationally in average yards per carry at 6.77 yards per rush. Ohio State (6.91) leads the FBS. Wisconsin's school record is 5.52 yards per carry, a mark set in 1996.
- No team has featured a more explosive running game than Wisconsin's in 2013. The Badgers lead the nation (or are tied for the national lead) in runs of 30-plus yards (21), 40-plus yards (14), 50-plus yards (9), 60-plus yards (7), 70-plus yards (6) and 80-plus yards (2).
- The Badgers racked up seven runs of at least 30 yards vs. Indiana. That's more runs of 30-plus yards than 58 FBS teams have recorded this SEASON.
- Wisconsin's total of 36 rushing touchdowns ranks No. 2 in the Big Ten and ninth nationally. Navy and Georgia Tech lead the nation with 43 rushing TDs, while Ohio State paces the Big Ten with 36.
- Over the last four years (since the start of the 2010 season), the Badgers have rushed for 169 touchdowns, matching Oregon (169) for the most of any team in the nation in that span.
- With 3,276 yards through 11 games, the Badgers are on pace to smash the school record for rushing yards in a season and need just 34 over their remaining two games to top the mark of 3,309 set last year (in 14 games). The Badgers need just 30 to top the 12-game school record of 3,305 from 1999:

rusher for the ninth-consecutive year and 19th time in the last 21 seasons.

- After rushing for 1,052 yards as a freshman in 2010 and 1,281 already this year, White is the eighth player in UW history to have multiple 1,000-yard seasons. He went over the 1,000-yard mark on the first play of the Badgers' win over Indiana, a 93-yard touchdown run.
- This year marks just the second season in which the Badgers have boasted a pair of 1,000-yard rushers. White and RB John Clay (1,012) acheived the feat in 2010, with RB Montee Ball also finishing that season with 996 rushing yards.
- UW's run of nine consecutive seasons with at least one 1,000-yard rusher is the longest such streak in the nation. Penn State (8), Oklahoma State (6) and Oregon (6) have the next-longest active streaks and have yet to produce a 1,000-yard rusher in 2013.
- The Badgers have totaled 18 100-yard rushing performances in 10 games (James White - 8, Melvin Gordon - 7, Corey Clement - 3) — the most in school history and the most of any FBS team this season. Auburn ranks second nationally with 12.

TWO BETTER THAN ONE

- With sophomore RB Melvin Gordon (1,375) and senior RB James White (1,281), Wisconsin is the nation's lone team to boast a pair of 1,000-yard rushers in 2013.
- With a combined 2,656 rushing yards, Gordon and White need a total of 349 yards over UW's final two games to break the NCAA's single-season record for rushing yards by two players on the same team. Nevada's Stefphon Jefferson (1,883) and Cody Fajardo (1,121) set the mark of 3,004 yards in 2012.
- In Gordon (125.0) and White (116.5), UW is the nation's lone team with two players averaging 100.0 rushing yards per game.
- Gordon, who ranks No. 8 nationally at 125.0 yards per game, and White (14th,

116.5) rank second and third in the Big Ten in rushing. Nebraska's Ameer Abdullah (134.8) leads the league.

- With a combined 25 rushing touchdowns, White (13) and Gordon (12) are the most prolific scoring duo of running backs in the country.
- Gordon and White are the only running back tandem in the nation to have each scored double-digit touchdowns.
- After doing so against Indiana, Gordon and White have each rushed for 100 yards in the same game six times, including five times this season.
- Despite the fact that Gordon has just 250 carries, White and Gordon are one of two FBS running back tandems to combine for 5,000 career rushing yards:

WHITE HOT

- Senior RB James White is tied with Arizona RB Ka'Deem Carey for the FBS active career lead in rushing touchdowns with 45, which is the third-best total in UW history (see list, page 12). White also ranks No. 2 among active FBS players with 48 total touchdowns, behind Carey (49) and West Virginia RB Charles Sims (49).
- White has scored multiple rushing touchdowns in a game 13 times in his career. That's the most of any active FBS player, with Tulane's Orleans Darkwa (11) ranking second.
- Wisconsin is 25-2 in games in which White has scored a TD (rushing or receiving).
- White ranks third among active FBS running backs with 3,852 career rushing yards despite the fact that he has made just 10 starts at running back in his career. Arizona RB Ka'Deem Carey leads active FBS running backs at 3,913 career rushing yards, while Buffalo RB Branden Oliver is second with 3,889.
- White is sixth in UW history with 3,852 career rushing yards and needs 91 yards to pass P.J. Hill (3,942 - 2006-08) for fourth all-time.
- White broke UW's 50-year-old school record with a 93-yard touchdown run on the Badgers' first play from scrimmage vs. Indiana. The longest run in school history had been a 91-yard TD run by Tom Brigham vs. Western Michigan on Sept. 21, 1963. White's run is the second-longest by an FBS player this season.
- White's school-record average of 6.23 rushing yards per attempt leads all active FBS running backs with at least 400 career

carries. It is easily the best mark in UW history and ranks No. 5 all-time among Big Ten players.

- White owns 17 career 100-yard games, which ranks in a tie for the seventh-most in school history.
- Of White's 17 career 100-yard games, 14 have come in games in which the Badgers boasted multiple 100-yard rushers. That includes all four games in school history in which three running backs topped the century mark — all four of which have come in UW's last 13 games.
- The Badgers are 17-0 when White rushes for 100 yards in a game.
- Also a reliable receiver, White has 628 receiving yards in his career. He needs just 31 more to break Joe Armentrout's (1983-86) school record for receiving yards by a running back (658).

GORDON GOES ... AND GOES

- Sophomore RB Melvin Gordon ranks eighth nationally and second in the Big Ten in rushing at 130.6 yards per game and has scored 11 rushing TDs.
- Gordon has been named one of 16 semifinalist for the Maxwell Award, presented annually to the nation's top player. He is the lone Big Ten player among the semifinalists. Gordon is also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award, presented annually to the nation's top running back. Badgers RB Montee Ball won the Doak Walker Award last season.
- After leading all FBS players by averaging 10.0 yards per carry last season, Gordon is averaging a nation-leading 8.2 yards per attempt in 2013 (min. 120 carries). Indiana's Tevin Coleman ranks No. 2 nationally at 7.3 yards per carry among players with at least 120 attempts.
- For his career, Gordon is the FBS's active career leader in yards per rushing attempt at 8.5.
- Gordon has rushed for at least 140 yards in 7 of Wisconsin's 11 games this season. That trails only Boston College's Andre Williams (8) for the most games of 140plus rushing yards by an FBS player.
- Gordon leads the nation (or is tied for the lead) in runs of 60-plus (4), 70-plus (3) and 80-plus (1) yards.
- Gordon also ranks in the top five nationally in runs of 30-plus (T-2nd, 9), 40-plus (T-3rd, 6) and 50-plus (T-3rd, 4) yards.
- For his career, 60 of Gordon's 238 carries have gone for 10-plus yards (25.2 percent).
- Gordon owns more runs of 20-plus yards (21) than negative yards (17) for his career.
- Gordon's 17 career rushing touchdowns have covered an average of 29.8 yards.
- Gordon reached the 1,000-yard plateau for his career faster than anyone in UW history, hitting 1,003 career yards on his 104th carry, a 7-yard tote in the second quarter vs. Tennesee Tech. James White

BADGERS IN THE DRAFT

- Wisconsin had three players taken in the 2013 NFL Draft, including C Travis Frederick, who was selected by Dallas in the first round. RB Montee Ball was a second-round pick of the Denver Broncos, while OL Rick Wagner went in the fifth round to the Baltimore Ravens.
- With the selection of Frederick and Wagner, the Badgers have had seven offensive linemen selected over the past three NFL drafts, easily the highest total of any college program. Alabama and Georgia rank in a tie for second in that span, with each producing four draft picks on the offensive line.
- Among its 14 NFL draft picks over the past three years, UW has produced nine top-75 selections, matching North Carolina for the third-highest total of any team. Only Alabama (13) and LSU (12) have produced more top-75 picks in that span.
- Wisconsin's nine top-75 picks represent one-third of the Big Ten's total over the past three years. The Badgers have had as many top-75 picks over that span as Michigan, Nebraska, Ohio State and Penn State COMBINED:

previously held UW's school record for the fewest carries to reach 1,000 career yards with 138 attempts.

Gordon also set UW's school record for the fastest to 1,000 yards in a season by doing so on his 105th carry of the year. James White previously held the record by reaching 1,000 yards on the 138th attempt of his freshman season in 2010.

HOLD ON TIGHT

Since the start of the 2010 season, no team has valued possession of the ball better than the Badgers. UW leads all FBS programs with just 43 turnovers over the course of the last four seasons:

- The Badgers have gone without losing a fumble in 35 of their 52 games since the start of the 2010 season.
- Melvin Gordon has never lost a fumble, spanning his 250 career rushing attempts, 3 career receptions and 8 career kickoff returns (261 total touches).
- James White has lost just two fumbles in his career, which includes 719 total touches (618 rushing attempts, 64 receptions and 37 kickoff returns). That's an average of one lost fumble every 359.5 touches (or every 309.0 rushing attempts).
- The first of White's lost fumbles came in his second career game (vs. San Jose State on Sept. 11, 2010). The second came as a sophomore vs. Penn State on Nov. 26, 2011. White has amassed 344 total touches since the last lost fumble (306 rushing attempts, 32 receptions, 6 kickoff returns).

DOWNTOWN ABBY

- Senior WR Jared Abbrederis who has accepted an invitiation to play in the Senior Bowl — ranks fifth in the Big Ten in receiving yards per game (83.3) and fourth in receptions per game (5.5) despite not having a catch in the Badgers' game vs. Indiana.
- While he went without a reception vs. Indiana, Abbrederis had three carries for a career-high 86 rushing yards and the first two rushing touchdowns of his career.
- Also an accomplished returner, Abbrederis ranks seventh all-time at UW with 4,655 all-purpose yards.
- With 916 receiving yards this season, Abbrederis is the first player in UW history to record at least 800 yards in three seasons. He also had 933 as a sophomore (2011) and 837 as a junior (2012).
- Abbrederis ranks second among active FBS players in yards per reception (min. 150 receptions) at 16.1 yards per catch. Baylor WR Tevin Reese (16.8) is the leader.

- Abbrederis had 10 receptions for 207 yards at Ohio State (Sept. 28), both career highs. He became UW's first 200-yard receiver since Lee Evans had a school-record 258 yards vs. Michigan State in 2003.
- A former walk-on QB, Abbrederis ranks second in school history with 2,975 career receiving yards, in a tie for second with 23 receiving touchdowns and second with 185 career receptions.
- Abbrederis has nine 100-yard receiving games in his career, six of which have come over the last two seasons in games in which QB Joel Stave has started.

PEDERSEN PULLS 'EM IN

- Senior TE Jacob Pedersen who has accepted an invitational to play in the East-West Shrine Game — ranks third among active FBS tight ends with 17 career touchdown receptions. Marshall's Gator Hoskins leads active tight ends with 25 TD receptions, with Washington's Austin Seferian-Jenkins ranking second with 19 TD grabs.
- Pedersen's 17 career TD grabs are the most by a tight end in Wisconsin history and rank him No. 7 overall on UW's alltime receiving touchdowns list.
- Pedersen also ranks second among active tight ends, averaging 13.2 yards per reception for his career, and trails only North Carolina TE Eric Ebron (16.1).

STAVE STEPS UP

- Sophomore QB Joel Stave ranks third in the Big Ten in passing efficiency at 141.6 (Ohio State QB Braxton Miller leads at 165.8) and third in completion percentage at 63.0% (Miller leads at 67.7%).
- Stave has shined in the red zone, completing 62.3% percent of his passes for 189 yards, 12 touchdowns and no interceptions. His pass efficiency rating of 166.9 in the red zone ranks ninth nationally (min. 50 attempts). East Carolina QB Shane Carden (209.4) leads the nation in red zone pass efficiency.
- Stave has completed 63.0% of his passes this season, which ranks as the sixth-best single-season mark in UW history. Scott Tolzien set the Badgers' single-season record at 72.9% in 2010.
- For his career, Stave ranks No. 3 in UW history in passing efficiency at 143.7, trailing only Russell Wilson (191.8, 2011) and Tolzien (153.2, 2008-10).
- Stave's career completion percentage of 61.7% also ranks No. 3 all-time and trails only Wilson (72.8%) and Tolzien (68.1%).
- With 23 touchdown passes for his career, Stave ranks ninth all-time at UW and needs just two to pass Mike Samuel (1995-97) for eighth (24).
- With 3,179 passing yards for his career, Stave became the 14th Badgers QB to throw for 3,000 yards at UW, doing so in just 16 career starts.



LAST MEETING PENN STATE 24, WISCONSIN 21 (OT)

Nov. 24, 2013 | Beaver Stadium | University Park, Pa.

Montee Ball became the NCAA's all-time touchdowns leader in the first quarter, but that was the last time history would be on Wisconsin's side.

Despite another fantastic game-tying rally in the fourth quarter, the Badgers once again saw their efforts fall just short in heartbreaking fashion, this time a 24-21 loss to Penn State in their regular-season finale at Beaver Stadium.

Wisconsin (7-5, 4-4) fought back from second-half struggles offensively to force thet extra period, but saw its hopes of completing the comeback end when Kyle French's 44-yard field goal attempt hooked wide left.

A 37-yarder that sneaked just inside the same left upright minutes earlier was the difference for Penn State (8-4, 6-2), which used a kick from Sam Ficken to provide the winning margin in OT.

It was the Badgers' third loss in overtime of the season

Ball broke Travis Prentice's record with the 79th touchdown of his career on a 17-yard rushing score in the first quarter, a tote that staked the Badgers to a 14-7 lead.

Ball led the way on the ground for the Badgers with 111 yards -- the 24th 100-yard game of his career -- and the 73rd rushing score of his career to tie Prentice's NCAA record in that category.

ABOUT THE MATCHUP

- Saturday's game will be the final Leaders Division game for both Wisconsin and Penn State. The three-year old divisional format gives way to new East and West divisions when Maryland and Rutgers join the Big Ten next season.
- Wisconsin and Penn State have split their last eight meetings, dating back to 2003, with each team claiming four wins in that span.
- The Badgers have won three of the teams' last four meetings at Camp Randall Stadium, including a 45-7 victory in Penn State's last trip to Madison in 2011. That win clinched a share of the first Leaders Division title and secured UW's spot in the inaugural Big Ten Football Championship Game.
- All-time, the Badgers own a 6-3 lead in games played in Madison, including a 4-3 edge since Penn State joined the Big Ten Conference.
- Last year's 24-21 win by Penn State marked the closest final score in the series since a 34-31 Nittany Lions win in 2003. In all, 11 of the teams' 16 all-time meetings have been decided by a double-digit margin.
- Seven of Wisconsin's nine all-time wins vs. Penn State have come by at least 10 points.

CAMP RANDALL STADIUM

- One of the nation's most historic college football venues, Camp Randall Stadium also happens to be one of the intimidating for opposing teams, and Wisconsin has made the most of the home-field advantage that the raucous atmosphere provides.
- Since the start of the 2004 season, the Badgers have compiled a 61-6 record (.910) at Camp Randall Stadium. That is the best home record in the Big Ten over that span and the third-best in the country (behind only Boise State and Oklahoma).
- Including its 31-18 win over Ohio State in 2010
 Wisconsin owns a 4-5 record all-time against No. 1 teams in Camp Randall Stadium.
- Including its unblemished home records in 2010 and 2011, UW has compiled a 7-0 record at Camp Randall Stadium four times (2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011).
- Wisconsin won 21 consecutive games at Camp Randall Stadium from Oct. 31, 2009 to Oct. 27, 2012. That is the second-longest home winning streak in school history, trailing only the 25 in a row the Badgers won from 1900-03.
- The Badgers have allowed 10 or fewer points at home on 22 occasions over the last 10 seasons.
- Wisconsin's six shutouts since 1999 (65-0 vs. Temple in 2005, 14-0 vs. San Diego State in 2006, 37-0 vs. Purdue in 2009, 35-0 vs. Oregon State in 2011 and 45-0 vs. UMass and 48-0 vs. Tennessee Tech in 2013) have occurred at Camp Randall Stadium.
- Camp Randall Stadium, which opened in 1917, is the fourth-oldest Bowl Subdivision stadium in the nation. The only older on-campus facilities are: Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1914) and Cincinnati (1916).
- The Camp Randall grounds were used as a Civil War training site. It also held Confederate soldiers, many of whom died and were laid to rest on the west side of Madison. The area known as "soldiers rest" is the northernmost Confederate cemetery in the United States.
- Camp Randall Stadium served as a living quarters for students and military personnel during the 1940s. Dormitories were built underneath the east-side stands. Approximately 150 men lived there. In addition, there was a rifle range, as well as boxing and wrestling rooms.
- Though it has only been a tradition at Camp Randall Stadium since 1998, "Jump Around" is now a defining part of UW game day. Between the third and fourth quarters, "Jump Around" by House of Pain is played

HEAD COACH GARY ANDERSEN

Gary Andersen was introduced as the 29th head coach in Wisconsin football history on Dec. 20, 2012. He comes to Madison after four seasons as the head coach at Utah State, where he led a program that had just six wins in the previous three seasons to a 26-24 record in his four years at the helm and was named 2012 Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Aggies to the WAC championship and a win in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

- Andersen guided Utah State to its most successful season in history in 2012. The Aggies won a school-record 11 games, went undefeated in the WAC and captured their first outright league title since 1936. To cap the season, USU defeated Toledo, 41-15, to win the 2012 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.
- For guiding Utah State to double-digit victories for the first time in history, Andersen was named WAC Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year award.
- In addition to their first bowl win since 1993, the Aggies defeated three teams that finished the season with at least nine wins, with all of those victories coming away from home. That included a win at No. 20 Louisiana Tech, the first road win over a ranked team in in the program's history. Utah State also defeated in-state rival Utah for the first time since 1997.
- With consecutive appearances in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Utah State was bowl eligible in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1960-61.
- Utah State finished the season ranked No. 16 in the Associated Press Top 25 and was ranked in the AP poll in the each of the last three weeks of the regular season. The Aggies also made their first-ever appearance in the BCS standings, checking in at No. 22 in the final edition of the season.
- In the three seasons preceding Andersen's hire (2006-08), Utah State went a combined 6-30 (.167). The Aggies had not finished above .500 since 1996. He led USU to back-to-back winning seasons and a 26-24 mark in four years (.520).
- Utah State ranked eighth in the country in scoring defense in 2012, allowing just 15.4 points per game. In 2008, the year before Andersen took over at USU, the Aggies allowed an average of 34.7 points per game and ranked 106th nationally.
- During five seasons as an assistant coach at Utah (2004-08), Andersen was a part of two undefeated campaigns, both of which culminated in BCS bowl victories. He was the Utes' defensive coordinator in 2008 as they went 13-0 and defeated Alabama, 31-17, in the Sugar Bowl to end the season ranked No. 2 in the country.
- His defense ranked 11th nationally against the run, No. 12 in total defense and No. 20 in pass efficiency defense, and Andersen was named a finalist for the Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach.
