STARTING 5

Twelve of Penn State's games have been decided by eight points or less. Seven of the losses have been by six points or less, most of any Power 5 program. The Nittany Lions' last five outings have been decided by a combined 24 points.

According to kenpom.com calculations, Penn State's current strength of schedule rating is now +20.08, second overall nationally. Of the top 10 SOS ratings, nine are held by Big Ten teams.

Penn State won at Lincoln for only the second time in the series in the teams' only meeting in 2019-20 (76-64, 2/1/2020).

The Nittany Lions connected for 11 3-point field goals for back-to-back games with double-digit treys. Penn State recorded three-straight games with at least nine treys for the first time this season (Nebraska, #4 Ohio State and at #11 Iowa).

Senior forward John Harrar leads the Big Ten in offensive rebounds per game (3.63) with 50 of his 69 total offensive rebounds since Penn State's restart (4.16 per game over last 12 games).

Penn State is averaging 8.8 3-point field goals per game, good for second in the Big Ten. Penn State has connected for at least nine 3-point field goals in 11 games this season and has seven games in double figures.

Over the last five years, the 3-point field goals made per-game average has increased. The highest final team average in the Nittany Lions' Big Ten era is 8.4 (278 in 33 games) by the 2000-01 Sweet Sixteen squad.

ON THE OFFENSIVE GLASS

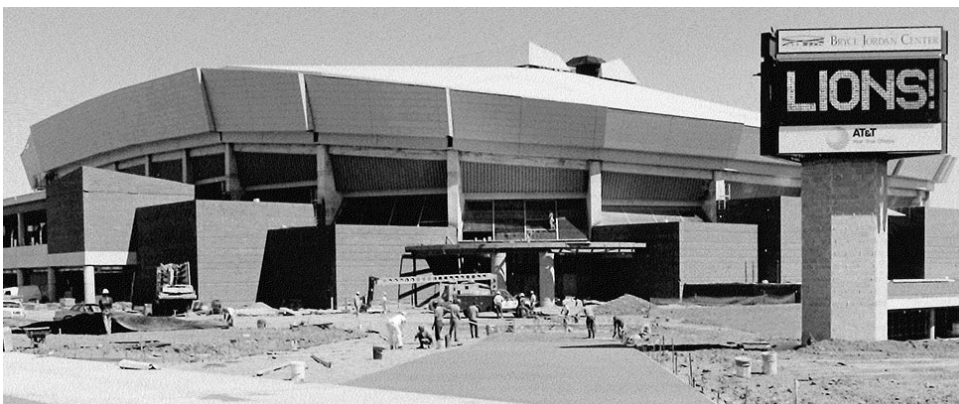

SOLID AS A BROCK

Junior guard Izaiah Brockington, Penn State's second-leading scorer at 13.5 points and 4.6 rebounds per game shared top honors in scoring at No. 11 Iowa (11 points) and was the top board-getter with seven.

From Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, his dunks have been rated as SportsCenter top-10 plays twice this season. He has led the Nittany Lions in scoring column seven times this year and has appeared three times as the leader in assists, blocks and steals. He had his career-high, which was also a game- and Penn State individual season high seven assists (with no turnovers) vs. No. 4 Ohio State.



CELEBRATING 25 YEARS OF THE BRYCE JORDAN CENTER IN 2021

The Nittany Lions' first practice in the Bryce Jordan Center, named for Penn State's 14th president, was held on Dec. 18, 1995. Just a few weeks later, on Jan. 11, 1996, Penn State would win its first game in the new arena, the first of a 14-game home win streak to set the school record. The 2020-21 season-opening win over VMI gave the Nittany Lions their 250th win in the BJC.

TOP TURNOVER TOTALS

The Nittany Lions are responsible for five of the top team turnover totals in B1G games this season, forcing 17 at No. 13 OSU (1/27) and 16 each vs. Maryland (2/5), Nebraska (2/14), at No. 11 Iowa (2/21) and at Michigan (12/13/2020).

The Nittany Lions forced then-No. 13 Ohio State into the Buckeyes' season-high turnover total with 17, No. 11 Iowa into its season high with 16 and No. 19 Wisconsin into its season-high with 15 turnovers (2/2) after a 12 turnover total, tied for its previous season high, in the first meeting (1/30). Maryland also tied a season high with 16 turnovers (2/5).

BROCKINGTON AS A STARTER

Junior guard Izaiah Brockington was the Nittany Lions' sixth man in 2019-20, known for providing a spark off the bench and some aerial artistry with his dunks. The lefty is making his mark as a starter in 2020-21. Brockington has led Penn State in scoring seven times this year, including his career-best 24 points in the win at No. 15 Virginia Tech. He had a career-high seven assists vs. No. 4 Ohio State last Thursday.

DREAD FROM DEEP

In his first start of 2020-21, junior guard Myles Dread tied two season highs with 14 points off four 3-pointers against Nebraska (2/14/21). Dread has connected on at least two treys in 11 games this year, including the last five straight. His longest stretch of games with at least one 3-pointer was 25 games.

HARRAH FOR HARRAR!

John Harrah collected game-high rebound totals in seven games since the restart. His 14 at Michigan State and Purdue tied his career best and is the Nittany Lions' individual season high.

Penn State's rebounding leader, Harrah has registered the game-high boards total in 11 games this season and has 11 career games with double-figures in rebounds. His streak of games with at least four offensive rebounds ended at six, second-longest streak in the Big Ten since records have been kept (2002-03).

HARRAR SETTLES AT NO. 3

Although senior forward John Harrah's current 56.6 season field goal percentage leads the Nittany Lions, he does not have enough attempts to qualify for the Big Ten (he'd be No. 4). Harrah is currently third on Penn State's career field goal percentage list with a mark of 57.6 with a minimum 200 field goal attempts.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Participating in sports has been a big part of the families of six Nittany Lions who have had either parents or siblings compete at the collegiate level. Three sons followed in their fathers' footsteps on the hardwood: Izaiah Brockington (Antoine, Coppin State); Myles Dread (Aaron, Millersville) and DJ Gordon (Derek Sr., Waynesburg). Derek Gordon Sr. played for coach Rudy Marisa, a former Nittany Lion and member of Penn State's 1954 NCAA Final Four and 1955 NCAA Tournament teams. Seth Lundy's older brother, Xavier, played basketball at Rider and Patrick Kelly's late father, Pat, was a member of Syracuse's 1987 undefeated football team and then played in the NFL.

Four members of Kyle McCloskey's immediate family were involved in athletics, including three Nittany Lion letterwinners. Father, Mike, was a tight end for Penn State (1979-82) and played on the 1982 national championship team before continuing his career in the NFL. Kyle's mother competed in track and field, and his sister, Megan, was also a member of the Nittany Lion track and field team. Another sister, Kiernan, was a four-year basketball letterwinner at Lehigh.

GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE ABOVE NATIONAL AVERAGE

Penn State student-athletes continue to register record-breaking graduation rates and perform well above their peers nationwide. The Nittany Lions recorded a fourth consecutive record academic performance with a 92 percent graduation success rate, according to data reported by the NCAA.

The NCAA's annual graduation rates report of Division I institutions across the nation revealed Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent to break the school's all-time record of 91, which was previously set in the 2019 NCAA report. Nittany Lion students posted a 92 percent graduation rate compared to the 88 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2010-11 through the 2013-14 academic year.

Penn State student-athletes have logged a Graduation Success Rate in the 88-92 percent range during each of the past 14 NCAA reports, improving from 88 percent in the 2015 report to a record-breaking 92 percent report in 2020.

Sixteen of the Nittany Lions' 27 teams (men's and women's track and field/cross country teams combined) earned a Graduation Success Rate at or above the Division I national GSR average for their respective sport. A total of 17 Penn State squads have a GSR of 90 percent or higher.

In addition, 21 programs turned in a graduation success rate at or above the overall Division I national average of 88 percent.

Men's Basketball was among the 16 Nittany Lion teams at or above the Division I sport average and one of nine squads that posted a Graduation Success Rates at least five points higher than the national average for their sport (90 to 84, +6). For the 11th consecutive year, the Penn State football (85 percent compared to 79 percent) and Nittany Lion basketball (90 to 84) teams earned four-year Graduation Success Rates higher than the national average for their respective sports.

The four-year average for University Park students was 85 percent, exceeding the 66 percent rate for all students nationwide by 19 points.

PENN STATE SPORTS NETWORK

Forty radio stations in Pennsylvania, Ohio and West Virginia will carry Nittany Lion Basketball games during the 2020-21 season. Radio announcer Steve Jones, in his 39th year with Penn State, will handle the play-by-play with USBWA Hall of Famer Dick Jerardi serving as analyst. Broadcasts begin 30 minutes prior to tip-off with the "Penn State Bookstore Pregame Show." Broadcasts conclude with the PA Propane Association Postgame Show featuring coach and player interviews, game statistics and scores from around the nation.

Broadcasts are also available on SiriusXM with channels for each game announced in game notes. A station carrying a partial schedule is denoted with an asterisk (*).

A review of Penn State's record book immediately reflects the influence of Jim Ferry, beginning his fourth season in State College. The Nittany Lions' offensive coordinator, Ferry has helped develop the program's offensive identity and the rewards have manifested not only as team and individual standards, but in the win column as well.

The 2019-20 season saw Penn State amass 21 wins overall and 11 Big Ten victories, its second-highest total since joining the league in 1992-93. The Nittany Lions tied for fifth in the conference standings headed into the conference tournament, its highest finish in its Big Ten era, and ranked third in the overall Big Ten statistical standings at 75.1 points per game.

As a team over the last three seasons, Penn State vaulted into its historical top 10 of multiple statistical categories, including points scored, scoring average, field goals and 3-point field goals. PSU claimed the top spots in 2019-20 Big Ten games in total points and field goals, and crushed the previous 3-point field goal mark. The league scoring average of 71.6 in 2019-20 ranks fifth on the Nittany Lions' chart with the 2017-18 average of 72.1 ahead at third.

Individually, two-time first-team All-Big Ten forward Lamar Stevens became one of only two Nittany Lions with at least 2,000 career points and only three to produce at least 500 points in three consecutive seasons.

Ferry's offensive mindset translated to an increase in the Nittany Lions' point production and helped rewrite the record book in 2017-18. All five starters had scoring averages in double figures through mid-February 2018 as Penn State was one of only 13 NCAA Division I teams that could make that claim. PSU won 26 games that year, its second-highest total ever, and captured its second National Invitation Tournament title.

The 2017-18 team scored 2,915 points in all games, and 1,297 in Big Ten contests, both totals earning the program's top rankings in those categories. The 46.4 field goal percentage easily ranked No. 1 in the 26 years of Big Ten play.

The 1,057 field goals smashed the previous mark, set in 2008-09, by more than 150. Records for 3-point field goals, both by the team (294) and by senior sharpshooter Shep Garner, also fell with Garner capturing both Penn State's career record (336), PSU's single-season mark (120) and the Big Ten single-season record, one that stood for 23 years previously.

From Elmont, New York, the veteran mentor brought a steadying leadership to Duquesne, rebuilding the Dukes roster and reestablishing pride in the program.

Ferry's Duquesne teams reached several milestones in his five years there, including a 17-win mark in 2015-16, a total reached only six times in the previous 43 years. The Dukes set a school record for points (2,704) that year and netted 322 three-point field goals, the third-highest total in Atlantic 10 history. During that season, Ferry celebrated his 300th career coaching win and the Dukes helped add to that total with their first post-season victory in nearly 50 years.

The Dukes posted other notable wins under Ferry, recording a victory at Atlantic 10 foe Temple in 2013, their first since 1995. An upset of 10th-ranked Saint Louis on the Billikens' home court gave Duquesne its first road win over a top-10 team in more than five decades. Victories over teams in the Atlantic Coast, Big Ten and Big 12 conferences helped the program make significant progress.

Prior to his five years at Duquesne, Ferry spent 10 seasons as head coach at LIU Brooklyn, guiding that program to unprecedented levels of success. Ferry led the Blackbirds to Northeast Conference regular-season titles and tournament championships in 2011 and 2012, including their first NCAA Championship appearance in 14 years.

Ferry engineered a turnaround at LIU Brooklyn, inheriting a team that had won only five games in the season before his arrival. He transformed the program into a winner, posting back-to-back campaigns of at least 25 wins for the first time since the 1941-42 season. The program's 2011 and 2012 NEC crowns were the first back-to-back league titles in LIU Brooklyn's history, and Ferry helped position the Blackbirds for a third-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2013.

At LIU Brooklyn, Ferry and his team achieved double-digit win totals eight times and he was selected the NEC Coach of the Year in 2005 and

2011. Recognition came also from the National Association of Basketball Coaches as he was tabbed the District 18 Coach of the Year and the NIT/Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association (MBWA) Peter A. Carlesimo Division I Coach of the Year in 2011.

With his offensive-minded approach, Ferry produced some of the nation's top scoring squads. LIU Brooklyn was the fourth-highest scoring team in the country in 2011 and his 2012 team ranked second, scoring at a clip of 81.4 points per game.

Ferry entered the coaching ranks as an assistant at his alma mater, Keene State College, in Keene, New Hampshire, following his graduation in 1990. He then served as an assistant coach at Bentley College for seven years where he helped the Falcons win the 1992-93 Northeast 10 regular-season championship and earn a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

In 1998-99, Plymouth State hired Ferry to guide its program and saw the first-year head coach compile 22 wins, the highest single-season total in the Panthers' history, a mark that still stands. The Panthers captured a share of the Little East Conference title and played in the ECAC New England Tournament championship game.

Ferry returned to his home state to lead Adelphi University, compiling an 82-11 record in three seasons. His 1999-2000 team advanced to the NCAA Div. II Sweet Sixteen and his 2000-01 and 2001-02 teams made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Div. II Elite Eight. The 2001 squad claimed a No. 1 ranking with 31-straight wins. He was recognized as the USBWA Basketball Times Division II Coach of the Year following 2000-01 and was the NIT/MBWA Division II Coach of the Year in 2000, 2001 and 2002.

Ferry played one year at New York Tech before transferring to Keene State, where he posted a double-digit scoring average for his career. Ferry led the Owls in scoring as a junior and was team captain as a senior. The son of a New York City transit police officer, he earned his undergraduate degree in public safety science.

NITTANY LIONS USE SECOND-HALF SURGE TO CLAIM 86-65 SEASON-OPENING WIN OVER VMI

Senior guard Jamari Wheeler paced the Nittany Lions to an 86-65 season-opening win in the Bryce Jordan Center with a career offensive night with 18 points and four 3-pointers. Wheeler also added six rebounds and his five steals pushed him into the No. 9 spot on PSU's career steals chart with 152.

Penn State poured in 11 3-pointers with 40 points coming the paint as the program posted its 250th win in the BJC since its opening in January 1996.

The Nittany Lions had five total players finish in double-figure scoring. Junior guard Izaiah Brockington finished with 15 points, eight rebounds and three steals. Sophomore Seth Lundy, junior Myreon Jones and junior Sam Sessoms each finished with 12 points.

The win was Penn State's fourth-straight season opening victory and 15th of the last 16 years. For Ferry, it was his 12th-straight win in a home opener and first at Penn State.

The Nittany Lions offense clicked on all cylinders in the second half. Penn State shot 51.4% from the field and made seven of its 11 threes while limiting the Keydets to just nine total field goals in the second half.

Wheeler scored 13 of his 18 in the second stanza, going 4-8 from the field and perfect at 2-2 from beyond the arc. Free throws by Brockington tied the game at 45 and then gave Penn State a one-point advantage at 46-45 just 5:27 into the second half. Sessoms stole the ball and set up Wheeler for a trey, then four different Nittany Lions hit field goals en route to a 13-point lead at 63-48 at the midway point.

The Nittany Lions opened the game on an 8-3 run behind two quick buckets from Brockington. The Keydets erased their early deficit with efficiency, using a 22-6 run to grab a 26-14 lead with 7:19 remaining in the opening half. Penn State struggled early from beyond the arc, shooting only 23.5 percent after starting 0-7.

Sessoms' effort off the bench sparked the Nittany Lions with five-straight points as part of a 14-1 run to claim a 28-27 lead with just under three to go in the half. Wheeler gave Penn State the halftime 37-35 lead with a deep triple at the buzzer going into the break.

Penn State added 13 more steals to Wheeler's five and tied the BJC single-game record with 18.

DREAD, LUNDY LEAD PENN STATE TO 72-69 WIN OVER VCU

Junior guard Myles Dread drained a 3-pointer at the buzzer to give the Nittany Lions a 72-69 victory and a 2-0 start to the season. The Rams tied the game at 69 with 20 seconds left before Dread's third career game-winning 3-pointer saw Penn State leave the court with the win.

With the clock winding down, senior guard Jamari Wheeler found Dread on the right wing. Dread rose up and drilled his first field goal of the contest as time expired.

The Nittany Lions and Rams battled back and forth until the final minute and scored identical 37-point totals in the second half. With 20 seconds remaining, VCU's Jamir Watkins drove to the lane and made his lone field goal of the game with a layup to tie the contest at 69.

Sophomore forward Seth Lundy turned in a career performance with 32 points on 11-19 shooting. Lundy poured in five 3-pointers while grabbing four rebounds and swatting two shots. Twenty of Lundy's 32 points came in second stanza against the Rams.

Lundy hit two free throws to give the Nittany Lions an eight-point lead at 68-60 with 3:46 left in the game. The Rams capitalized on Penn State's missed shots and turnovers as VCU's Nah'Shon Nyland hit a triple on a fast break and then a Ward layup cut the deficit to three, 68-65. Ward scored again for a one-point contest, 68-67, with 20 ticks left on the clock.

Junior guard Sam Sessoms connected on his second free throw attempt for a 69-67 score before Ward's tying basket. Sessoms scored 17 points, his Penn State best, on 6-11 shooting.

PENN STATE EDGED BY SETON HALL IN OVERTIME 98-92

Seton Hall's strong second-half surge was enough to tie the game at 84 and send the game into overtime as the Pirates edged the Nittany Lions in the extra five minutes of play, 98-82, at the Bryce Jordan Center.

Seton Hall found its rhythm in the second half, shooting 65.5 percent from the field and 5-9 from behind the arc. The Pirates used their inside presence and scored 54 points in the paint for the game to keep up with the Nittany Lions fast-paced attack.

Nittany Lion leading scorer Seth Lundy scored the first five points in the overtime period to give the PSU an 89-86 lead with 2:51 remaining. He finished with 23 on the night with a total of six Nittany Lions in double figures. Seton Hall's Sandro Mamukelashvili led all scorers with 30 points, 17 of his total coming in the second half.

Seton Hall started the overtime 3-7 from the free throw line and went 6-8 down the stretch, including its final five points of the game. The Pirates scored 23 points off 35 attempts on the night while the Nittany Lions were 15-19 and 6-9 in the second half and overtime combined.

The Pirates opened the second half without a miss, going 9-9 from the field in the first 5:29 to cut the Nittany Lion lead to three, 56-53. The physical back-and-forth battle continued and Seton Hall was able to keep pace with Penn State's effective perimeter offense.

In total, the Nittany Lions knocked down 13 triples with eight coming in the first half. The Pirates, 1-12 from the behind the three-point line in the first 20 minutes, improved with their 5-9 mark in the second half.

A critical 3-pointer for Seton Hall from Mamukelashvili, with 1:58 left in regulation, spurred the Pirates' 8-0 run to tie the game at 84 and force overtime. Jared Rhoden snagged a defensive rebound off a Nittany Lion miss and scored on the other side for the tying basket with 44 seconds left in the second half. Two Penn State attempts fell short and a final Pirate 3-pointer was off the mark.

Early in the game, Penn State transformed a 10-8 lead with a 16-2 run and kept the tempo high throughout the first half to combat the Pirates' size. PSU's shooting from behind the arc keyed the run midway through the first half. Six different Nittany Lions drilled six treys to grab a 26-10 lead with 11:22 to play in the first half. Penn State built its lead to as high as 19 points by the 11-minute mark of the first half, 29-10.

The lead remained in double digits, but Seton Hall kept chipping away and used an 8-0 run trim the Nittany Lions lead to 40-29. Lundy scored Penn State's final five as the scored read 45-34 at the break.

PENN STATE DOWNS 15TH-RANKED HOKIES IN ACC/BIG CHALLENGE

Penn State set the tone with an active defensive effort and a career performance offensively from guard Izaiah Brockington to down the No. 15 Virginia Tech Hokies 75-55 on Tuesday night. The Nittany Lions ended Virginia Tech's 34-game non-conference home winning streak and dealt the Hokies (4-1) their first loss of the season.

The Nittany Lions led the game for nearly 39 minutes, trailing only after the first basket of the game and the victory was milestone win number 1,500 for the program. The win was also Penn State's third-straight in ACC/B1G Challenge games, sixth in its last seven appearances, and second over a ranked Virginia Tech team in the last three Challenge outings.

Brockington's efficient performance produced a career-best 24 points. The junior from Philadelphia started 7-8 from the field and finished 10-14 while tying his career-best total eight rebounds. Three other Nittany Lion junior guards had double-figures in scoring with Myreon Jones with 14, Myles Dread with 11 and Sam Sessoms with 10.

The stout Nittany Lion defense forced the Hokies to turn the ball over 14 times which led to 22 points for Penn State. Offensively, Penn State opened up the floor and drilled 12 treys, shooting a season-best 52.2 percent from behind the arc. Jones, Dread and Sessoms had nine triples combined.

Virginia Tech struck first with a triple just 30 seconds into the game, but Penn State hit back with a 17-0 run to take a lead it would never relinquish.

Brockington scored nine points during the run that spanned six minutes and used both the dribble drive and a hot jump shot to lead the Nittany Lions with 15 points at the break.

An error-free first half and 51.4 percent shooting from the field for Penn State saw it lock in on the other end as PSU forced 10 first-half turnovers for a 42-23 advantage at the break.

Penn State came out of the locker room and went 7-9 from the field to start the second half and stretched its lead to 63-34 by the 13-minute mark.

Jalen Cone led the Hokies in scoring with 11 points and Keve Aluma had a game-high 12 rebounds.

PENN STATE FIGHTS TO END IN BIG OPENER AT MICHIGAN

The Big Ten opener went down to the wire in the Crisler Center as the Nittany Lions overcame a nine-point halftime deficit, but came up just short against undefeated Michigan in the final minute, 62-58.

The Nittany Lions trailed 60-58 with 24 seconds left, and after a pair of missed free throws by Michigan, saw the Wolverines escape after a layup attempt rimmed out. Michigan added two free throws for the 62-58 final.

Penn State recovered from a tough stretch of shooting in the first half and used a furious 18-2 run over the final two minutes before the break until the 16:36 mark of second half to take its first lead of the game at 39-38. Junior guard Izaiah Brockington scored 11 of his team-best 14 points in the second half and junior guards Myreon Jones and Sam Sessoms added 10 points each for Penn State.

The Nittany Lions outscored the Wolverines 31-26 in the second half and the battle continued until the final buzzer as neither team held a lead larger than six in the final 16 minutes. Penn State came out of the gate shooting 5-8 from the field and then capitalized on Wolverine missed shots and turnovers to take a 46-45 lead on a Seth Lundy jumper at the 12:14 mark.

Michigan built a six-point lead with about five minutes remaining, but Penn State used an 8-0 run with couple of free throws and a 3-pointer from Jones and a field goal and one from Sessoms. Sessoms' free throw put the Nittany Lions up by two with 2:53 left to play.

Penn State's bench contributed 20 points in the effort with Sessoms' 10, six from Dread and four points from freshman Abdou Tsimbila.

The Wolverines' leading scorer, Hunter Dickinson, finished his night with 20 points, scoring Michigan's final two field goals for a 60-58 lead.

The Wolverines shot 52 percent from the field and had all five of their treys in the first half to take the nine-point advantage at the break. A 6-0 run to end the first period cut Michigan's lead to 36-27 after the Wolverines led by as many as 15. The Penn State defense held the Wolverines scoreless for the final 2:14 of the first half.

Nittany Lion Trent Buttrick tied for the game high with seven rebounds, a career best for the senior. Senior forward John Harrar had nine points and senior guard Jamari Wheeler had four assists and three steals for game-high totals in both categories.

PENN STATE BESTED BY NO. 18 ILLINOIS

The inside presence of No. 18 Illinois negated the strong shooting performance by Penn State for a 98-81 Illini win in the Bryce Jordan Center. Junior guards Izaiah Brockington and Myreon Jones each scored 21 points on the night, but it wasn't enough to get past 30 points from leading scorer Ayo Dosunmu and 23 from Illini teammate Kofi Cockburn's 23.

Illinois scored 58 points in the paint and converted 21 second-chance points with potent attack in the second half. Penn State matched Illinois through the 14:26 mark of the second half as junior guard Sam Sessoms tied the game at 54 points with a driving layup. The three different Illini scored to counter with an 8-0 run over the next two minutes for a 62-54 lead.

The Nittany Lions cut the lead to six twice over a five-minute span, but the Illini capitalized on Penn State's foul trouble as the Nittany Lions put Illinois in the bonus at the 13:38 mark of the second half. The Illini pulled out to and held onto a double-digit lead for the last five minutes of the game, in part due to their 19 made free throws on 24 trips to the line in the second half.

Dosunmu scored 21 of his 30 points in the second half. Cockburn's 23 points came on on 11-13 shooting after he was 8-8 in the first half.

Penn State roared to an early 19-4 lead and knocked down 10 of its first 15 shots for a 23-12 lead as Jones scored 11 quick points in the first four-and-a-half minutes of action. The Illini responded with a combination of points in the paint and 3-pointers over the next nine minutes to pull within two points of the Nittany Lions at 37-35.

A 3-pointer by Frazier gave the Illini their first lead at 38-37 with 3:52 in the first half, but the two teams would exchanged leads until knotting the score at 43-43 going into the locker room.

The opening 20 minutes saw Penn State shoot 61.3 percent from the field and Illinois at 56.7 percent. The Nittany Lions were hot to start the second half, going 5-8, but cooled to a 47.1 mark for the period. Both teams were above 50 percent for the game and made the same number of field goals with PSU at 53.8 percent (35-65) and Illinois at 55.6 (35-63).

COMEBACK BID FALLS SHORT IN OVERTIME AT INDIANA

Penn State overcame a 12-point deficit at Indiana in the waning minutes of regulation to force overtime, but the Nittany Lions eventually dropped a tough road contest, 87-85 at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

The Nittany Lions had a pair of chances on the last possession to send the game to a second overtime, but were unable to convert. Indiana's Rob Phinisee made an extremely tough, contested jumper to give the Hoosiers the two-point lead that ended up standing as the game-winning basket. Trayce Jackson-Davis finished the night with a game-high 21 points.

Myreon Jones scored 14 of his team-best 20 points in the first half and combined with Jamari Wheeler's basket for Penn State's five overtime points. Sam Sessoms tied his Penn State best with 17 points and scored seven-straight points to give Penn State an 80-79 lead with 28 seconds left. Jackson-Davis drew a foul and went to the line, making the first free throw, but missing the second to leave the score tied at 80 at the end of regulation.

Four Nittany Lions finished the night with double-figure scoring. Izaiah Brockington had 15 and Seth Lundy scored 10, all 10 coming in the second half off 4-6 shooting from the field.

Jackson-Davis' field goal and foul shot put the Hoosiers up 85-83 with 1:03 left to play in the extra period, but Jones knotted the game at 85 with two made free throws with just 43 seconds left on the clock. For Jones, it was his second-straight 20-plus point game and eighth of his career.

After an Indiana timeout, Phinisee's shot gave the Hoosiers an 87-85 lead and the final tally after a Penn State 30-second timeout and missed attempt.

IU extended its lead to 66-54 with 9:58 to play in regulation. A Sessoms 3-pointer spurred a 10-2 run to the cut the deficit to four. John Harrar scored six-straight points to keep Penn State within striking distance and Jones and Sessoms drilled treys to cut the lead to one.

Following a pair of free throws by Indiana, Sessoms made his final two shots to give the PSU its first lead at 80-79. Indiana tied the game with a free throw and Sessoms' final shot was contested and went off the mark to send the game to overtime.

The Penn State defense kept Indiana at bay in the first half, helping Penn State keep stay close after a slow start offensively.

After going 3-11 from the field to start the game, the Nittany Lions found their stroke over the final 11:30 of the opening stanza. Penn State went 10-16 to finish the half as Indiana held a 38-33 lead going into the locker room.

PURDUE HOLDS OFF LATE NITTANY LION RALLY, 80-72

Penn State's first game of 2021 came down to the final minutes, but couldn't pull off the comeback and fell at Purdue 80-72. Myreon Jones scored a game- and career-best 23 points and John Harrar had a career-best 14, but all five Boilermaker starters finished the afternoon in double figures.

The Nittany Lions battled for all 40 minutes, whittling the score to a single-digit deficit, 68-61, with 2:37 left to play. Jones was an offensive force late in the game, scoring 12 of his 14 of his second-half points in the final 2:37.

After a back-and-forth battle in the first half, the Boilermakers looked to put the game out of reach, shooting at 67 percent clip from the field during the first six minutes of the second stanza. Purdue used an 18-5 run to take a 51-37 lead, but a pair of triples by forward Trent Buttrick ended the hot start.

With 9:11 remaining, Harrar scored seven of the Nittany Lions' next nine points to cut the deficit to eight. He had two field goals in less than a minute and added another layup at the 5:03 mark.

Harrar's gritty performance also ended with the second double-double of his career as he finished with 14 points and 14 rebounds, 10 on the offensive end. Izaiah Brockington collected a career-best in rebounds with nine to go along with 12 points. Jamari Wheeler, who nailed a key 3-pointer in the first half, had a game-high four steals.

The Boilermakers made 12 free throws over the final 2:18 to secure the win and had 33 trips to the line compared to Penn State's 13. The Nittany Lions had the edge on the boards 49-47, but Purdue's hot second-half shooting (54.2) compared to PSU's 27.7 allowed the Purdue to hold onto the lead.

Both teams struggled from the field to begin the first half, which included a combined 0-14 mark from beyond the arc. Midway through the period, Purdue led Penn State 18-9 following a pair of free throws.

Brockington scored on the next three possessions to trim the Purdue lead to five and sparked Penn State's offense as it finished with a 67 percent mark (10-15) from the field after starting the game 4 for 20.

An 8-0 run by the Nittany Lions erased an early 22-15 Purdue lead with the first three of the game by Jones at 5

FIRST-HALF DEFICIT TOO MUCH FOR PENN STATE AT #22 ILLINOIS
Penn State had double-digit scoring efforts from Myreon Jones and Seth Lundy, but the Nittany Lions could not overcome several scoring bursts from No. 22 Illinois in a 79-65 loss at the State Farm Center.

Jones led the Nittany Lions with 20 points on 6-13 shooting, extending his streak of 20-plus point scoring efforts to four-straight games. Lundy chipped in 13 points off the bench with two three-pointers and a 5-5 mark from the free throw line.

Illinois pieced together several scoring runs throughout the night and received a strong individual performance from Kofi Cockburn, who scored a game-high 21, to hold Penn State at bay. John Harrar had a team-best nine rebounds for the Nittany Lions while freshman forward Abdou Tsimbila had a career-best seven boards to go along with four points and two steals.

Illinois built on its lead early in the second half and used a stretch of perfect 6-6 shooting from the field over 3:30 to extend the lead to 22 points. Over the next seven minutes, the Illini failed to score a basket while the Nittany Lions had five-straight field goals for a 68-53 score.

The Nittany Lions battled back with a pair of baskets from Jamari Wheeler and Tsimbila, but Illinois held a double-digit margin through the final period.

The 42-28 first-half lead proved to be enough for the Illini to secure the win. A red-hot start for the Illini, shooting 67 percent from the field, propelled the home team to a 13-5 lead through the first four minutes of play.

The Nittany Lions drilled four treys to tie the game at 17-17 at the 12:55 mark. The Illini responded with a 10-0 run to push the lead to 27-17 during a four-minute span. A 6-2 run for the Nittany Lions trimmed deficit to six at 29-23 following a Myles Dread triple and a free throw by Jones.

Another double-digit run by Illinois gave it a 41-23 lead with 2:20 to play in the first half. Lundy took advantage of his opportunities at the charity stripe, with five-straight made free throws to pull Penn State within 13, 41-28.

Foul trouble put the Nittany Lions at a disadvantage early, putting Illinois in the bonus midway through the first half. Kyle McCloskey played valuable minutes, with a career-best five points and a steal in 10 minutes of action.

The Nittany Lions outrebounded the Illini 40-35 after being down in that category 21-16 at halftime. Penn State forced Illinois into 15 turnovers, the Illini's highest total in Big Ten play, while the Nittany Lions had 10 steals, their highest total in a Big Ten game this year.

PENN STATE EARNS 75-67 BIG TEN WIN OVER RUTGERS

Penn State absorbed a late surge by Rutgers to pick up its first Big Ten win with a 75-67 final. Led by 17 points each from Myreon Jones and Izaiah Brockington, the Nittany Lions were buoyed by the efforts of Seth Lundy, who recorded his first career double-double with 16 points and a career-best 10 rebounds.

Penn State never trailed in the game, getting out to a quick start by shooting 53.3 percent from the field in the first half. Rutgers used a 51.3 percent shooting in the second half, including 6-6 mark over four minutes midway through the period, to make its run and cut the lead down to four points.

The Scarlet Knights countered Nittany Lion baskets with their own, but couldn't get closer than four points down the stretch. With about a minute to play and down by four, Rutgers was forced to foul and send the Nittany Lions to the line. Rutgers couldn't convert its final two field goal attempts and Jones canned two more free throws with four seconds left for the final.

Jones caught fire in the second half, scoring all 17 of his points in that period, including the first six points after the break to extend the Nittany Lions' lead to 40-25. Rutgers clawed back into the game with its 11-0 run with field goals from five different Scarlet Knights. Four-straight free throws by Penn State halt the run and put the Nittany Lions back up by double-digits, 58-47.

With the Nittany Lions leading by four with 1:57 to play, Jones showed his tenacity. He finished 5-6 from the foul line to secure the win prior to the Nittany Lions' matchup with Northwestern on Saturday.

The Nittany Lions were the aggressors to open the game, jumping out to an early 15-4 lead in the first seven minutes of play. Sam Sessoms had nine first-half points off the bench to pace the Nittany Lions with Lundy and Brockington close behind with eight each.

Rutgers used a 5-0 run to pull within six before Sessoms drilled the Nittany Lions' first trey of the game. Jamari Wheeler followed up by picking the pocket of a Rutgers' ball handler. Wheeler finished the play with an easy layup on the other end of the floor for a 20-9 lead.

NO. 13 OHIO STATE SQUEAKS OUT 83-79 WIN OVER NITTANY LIONS

No. 13 Ohio State edged the Penn State 83-79 after a back-and-forth battle in the second half. Seth Lundy led PSU with a game-high 26 points as four Nittany Lions scored in double figures.

Lundy's trey with 2:07 remaining gave Penn State a 79-77 lead. OSU tied the game at 79 with two free throws and in the final minute, made a pair of free throws to take a two-point lead. A Nittany Lion triple was just off the mark and the Buckeyes were able to pull down the defensive rebound.

On the following Ohio State possession, fantastic defense by senior Jamari Wheeler forced the Buckeyes to turn the ball over on a shot-clock violation. With another chance to tie the game, a runner in the lane was off the mark for the Nittany Lions as the Buckeyes corralled the rebound. Another pair of Buckeye free throws produced the 83-79 final score.

John Harrar finished with the third double-double of his career with 15 points and 10 rebounds. Izaiah Brockington had 18 points and Myreon Jones 10.

The Nittany Lions defense forced the Buckeyes into a season-high 17 turnovers. Out of the halftime break, PSU went on a 10-3 run to take its first lead of the game at 49-46 following a Jones' three-pointer.

After ties at 49, 51 and 53, the score tipped in Penn State's favor, going up by six, 61-55 midway through the second period. The Nittany Lions made four of their next five field goals to go up by eight, 70-62. Ohio State put together an 10-2 run to take a 74-73 lead with 3:12 left in the game.

Three-pointers by junior guard Myles Dread and Lundy put Penn State up by two, 79-77, but the Buckeyes knotted the game at 79 with two free throws with 1:37 remaining.

Ohio State grabbed an 11-2 lead as the Nittany Lions struggled to find their mark at first media timeout, going 1-9 from the field. The Nittany Lions finished the half shooting 11-17 to cut into the Buckeyes' lead. After a Lundy triple with 3:24 to play in the half, the OSU went on a 7-0 run to push the lead back to 11.

In the half's final two minutes, Penn State outscored Ohio State 9-2 to bring the score to 43-39 headed into the locker room after Wheeler had back-to-back steals and layups in the final 20 seconds.

Ohio State's EJ Liddell finished with 22 points, 14 coming in the first half, and led the Buckyes with seven rebounds.

PSU HOLDS OFF WILDCATS FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT BIG WIN

Penn State came out on top with an 81-78 victory over Northwestern in the Bryce Jordan Center. Led by Izaiah Brockington's game-high 21 points, and three other Nittany Lions in double figures, Penn State picked up its second-straight Big Ten Conference win.

Brockington finished his perfect night at the foul line with two free throws with seven seconds to play for an 81-78 Penn State lead. Northwestern's 3-point attempt from the right wing at the buzzer was long.

The Nittany Lions withstood a furious second-half shooting performance from Northwestern. The Wildcats shot 70 percent (14-20) from the field through the first 13:18 of the period, but Penn State's defense anchored down and held the Wildcats to a 1-7 mark in the final 4:02.

The Nittany Lions swung the momentum back in their favor. Down 73-69 with 4:24 to play, Penn State used a 10-0 run to snatch a 79-73 lead. Northwestern cut the lead to one with 12 seconds left in the game. Brockington calmly made his final two free throws to seal the win for the Nittany Lions.

Seth Lundy had 16 points, and Myreon Jones and Sam Sessoms had 15 and 12, respectively. John Harrar had a game-best 10 rebounds, his second-straight double-figure rebounding game and fourth of the last five.

The game saw 18 lead changes and nine ties. Northwestern opened the second half with a miss, but strung together five-straight field goals, including two treys, to take a 45-44 lead by 16:49. Penn State made five of its next seven to pull out to 57-51 at the midway point.

On a 7-0 run, the Wildcats took back the lead and building it to four with a 73-69 score with 4:24 to play. A Lundy triple brought Penn State within one, 73-72, and he followed with two free throws for a 74-73 lead.

Brockington's layup and a trey by Jamari Wheeler put Penn State up by six, 79-73, but Pete Nance's counter-three with 36 seconds to go kept NU alive at 79-76. Miller Kopp had two free throws to bring the Wildcats within one 79-78, before Brockington added his two free throws for the final margin.

Kopp led Northwestern in scoring with 19 points on 5-11 shooting while Pete Nance had the Wildcats' top rebound total with seven.

A slow start for both teams saw PSU with an early 4-0 lead.

Over nearly five minutes, 12 of the game's 18 lead changes took place as the two teams traded scores. Both teams had 7-0 runs, but during the final minute of the half, the Nittany Lions outscored the Wildcats 7-3, including five points by Jones on a triple and buzzer-beating runner, to grab a 38-33 lead going into the break.

BADGERS USE HOT SECOND-HALF START IN WIN OVER PSU

Following an evenly matched first half, the Badgers used a 19-4 run after the break and relied on a hot second-half start to build a double-digit lead and win 72-56 in the second-straight game between the two teams.

Wisconsin went 4-7 from the field over the first four minutes of the second half for an 11-0 run and a 42-31 lead. Slowing the pace of the game down significantly, Wisconsin shot above the 50 percent mark before cooling down for a final 48.4 percent from the field. The Nittany Lions couldn't get into an offensive groove and didn't land their first 3-pointer of the half until 10:48.

After a layup by Izaiah Brockington, Myreon Jones and John Harrar combined for the next 14 points. Jones finished the night with a team-best 14 while Harrar had 10, grabbed five rebounds, had a pair of assists and two steals. Harrar was a perfect 3-3 from the field and 4-4 from the foul line.

Penn State forced the Badgers into a season-high total 15 turnovers and converted them into 16 points, but gave 10 points back off 13 turnovers on the night. The first half

Wisconsin's Jonathan Davis led all scorers with 17 points. Micah Potter had a game-high eight rebounds.

The Badgers and Nittany Lions ended the first half with nearly an identical halftime score as their Saturday matchup.

Jones and Seth Lundy each scored six to pace the Nittany Lions in the first half. Trent Buttrick, Izaiah Brockington, Harrar and Sam Sessoms each added four in the half.

The Badgers and Nittany Lions were locked in a tight matchup throughout much of the first half. Wisconsin pushed its lead to 25-18 with just under eight minutes to play in the opening period.

A 7-0 run by Penn State tied the game at 25 following a Lundy trey with 4:38 remaining. Five straight free throws by Wisconsin extended the Badgers lead to 30-25. Sam Sessoms had his hand in the next three baskets for Penn State. Sessoms scored a pair of layups and assisted on a Buttrick basket to give the Nittany Lions their first lead since the 18:22 mark of the half.

The Nittany Lions clawed back into the contest by holding Wisconsin without a field goal for the last 7:58 of the first period until the Wisconsin triple before the buzzer gave the Badgers a 33-31 lead at the break.

NITTANY LIONS WIN BIG DEFENSIVE BATTLE AGAINST MARYLAND

Penn State remained composed and held off a late Maryland rally for a 55-50 win. Jamari Wheeler made two free throws with 23 seconds left for the final margin after the Nittany Lions kept Maryland without a field goal for the final 7:32.

Wheeler tied his Big Ten career best with three 3-pointers and he hit a corner triple just before the shot clock expired at 11:33 of the second half to break a tie at 36. His triple sparked a Nittany Lion 7-0 run for their largest lead of the night, to that point, at 43-36.

Maryland cut the Nittany Lions' lead to one at 45-44 with 7:32 to play after an Eric Ayala layup, the Terps' last basket of the night. Maryland's final six points came from the free throw line and the Terps stole the ball with nine seconds left.

Penn State free throw shooting proved to be the deciding factor, as the Nittany Lions went 16-18 from the charity stripe, with all attempts in the second half. PSU dominated on the boards in the second half as well, with a 25-11 advantage. Senior forward John Harrar, with a game-best 12 rebounds, pulled down nine in the final 20 minutes and second seven of his nine points in the second half as well.

Junior guard Izaiah Brockington led Penn State in scoring with 13 points and Wheeler accompanied him in double figures with 11. Maryland's Ayala led all scorers with 23 points.

The game was tied for 7:36, but Penn State never relinquished the lead after Wheeler's 3-pointer for the 39-36 Nittany Lion advantage.

The Nittany Lions and Terrapins defensive struggle was evident from the opening tip and the half ended with tie at 23. Neither team shot well from the get-go with the Terps' first basket coming 6:12 into the game and Penn State starting 3-10 from the field.

Maryland was hampered by a slew of early turnovers, finishing the half with 11. Penn State scored 10 points off the Maryland miscues

Maryland built its largest lead of the game, using a 12-0 run to take a 23-14 lead with 2:47 to play in the first half. The Nittany Lions finished the half on a 9-0 run to tie the game as Brockington drilled a jumper with 25 seconds remaining in the half to tie it at 23-23.

NITTANY LIONS' SECOND-HALF COMEBACK FALLS SHORT

Penn State fought back in the second half, but three 3-point attempts missed the mark and Michigan State escaped with a 60-58 win. PSU erased a double-digit lead and went up by four with 3:16 left, but came up short in the final 49 seconds.

Michigan State took back lead and went ahead by two, 60-58, after a second-chance layup and four free throws with 1:18 left in the game. A PSU 3-pointer with 49 seconds left missed its mark and after a MSU timeout, the tenacious Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover and Penn State brought the ball into the frontcourt. Following a Penn State timeout, a second 3-pointer bounced off the inside iron of the rim.

Forced to foul, Penn State sent the Spartans to the free throw line with a missed front end of a 1-and-1 to give Penn State one final chance. The last-second 3-point attempt was long and the Nittany Lions were out of time.

John Harrar led Penn State in three stat categories, finishing with his fourth career double-double (17 points, 14 rebounds) to tie career bests, and getting a career-high four assists.

Trailing by as many as 12 points in the second half, Penn State would not go quietly. Beginning at 16:17 mark in the second half, the Nittany Lions used a 13-3 run fueled by five points from Harrar and a pair of treys by Sam Sessoms. The PSU tied the game at 41 with 11:53 to play before Michigan State extended its lead back to eight at 50-42 with 9:16 on the clock.

Myreon Jones scored 11 of Penn State's next 17 points. His layup at the 6:16 mark gave the Nittany Lions a 52-51 lead, their first since the 16:21 mark of the first half. The two teams tied at 52 and again at 54 before Jones converted a layup and two free throws for a 58-54 PSU lead with 3:16 remaining.

The Spartans scored on their next possession to cut the lead to two and made four free throws for a 60-58 lead and final score.

Jones finished with 15 points, with 11 in the second half. Jamari Wheeler collected his 300th career assist, 16th on Penn State's career list.

After an early 6-5 lead, a 12-0 Spartan run allowed MSU to jump out to a 17-6 advantage. Dread hit a jumper off the glass to end the run and start a 6-0 Penn State run. Harrar scored Penn State's next five points to keep the Nittany Lions within striking distance.

Dread hit Penn State's first 3-pointer of the half with 1:10 remaining and trimmed the Spartan lead to 29-22. Trailing by 10, Sessoms connected for a jumper to send the Nittany Lions into the locker room behind 32-24.

BUCKEYES' SECOND-HALF SCORING RUN BESTS NITTANY LIONS

A scoring run for fourth-ranked Ohio State midway through the second period was just enough to lift it past a tenacious Penn State squad, 92-82. The Nittany Lions gave the Buckeyes all they could handle, but Ohio State used a 15-0 run in the second half to pull ahead and take the win.

Trailing 47-43, four different Nittany Lions scored coming out of the break to spark an 18-7 run to take a 61-54 lead with 14:04 to play in the game. Ohio State struggled to the 16-minute mark, going 1-6 from field which allowed Penn State go up by one, 50-49. Two triples by Lundy and baskets by Trent Buttrick and Sam Sessoms got them to 61.

Down 61-54, the Buckeyes responded with a 15-0 run without leading scorer E.J. Liddell who was on the bench with foul trouble in the second half.

Ohio State got back on track with a layup and 3-pointer before John Harrar picked up his third foul at 12:56. The Buckeyes tied the game at 61 with 12:32 to go and then forged ahead to take a 69-61 lead after Harrar left the game after being called for his fourth foul. Five free throws over the next two minutes put the Penn State back in the scoring column at 72-66 and then added two more by Jones for a 74-68 score.

A charge taken by Myles Dread and two baskets by Izaiah Brockington brought PSU within four, 76-72. Back-to-back 3-pointers by Jones and Dread kept the Nittany Lions within two possessions, but a Duane Washington Jr. layup and free throw pushed the Buckeye lead to nine, 88-79.

Fouls by the Nittany Lions put Ohio State back on the line and the Nittany Lions tried to take advantage of quick offensive possessions after Buckeye misses in the final 45 seconds.

Penn State was limited to just four field goals in the game's final six minutes, but trimmed the Ohio State lead to five following a Myreon Jones 3-pointer with 3:24 to play.

Liddell finished with a game-high 23 points and Jones finished with a team-high 18 points for Penn State.

A red-hot shooting performance from both teams lit up the Bryce Jordan Center scoreboard in the first half with the Buckeyes at 65.4 percent from the field with six treys and Penn State at 53.6 percent from the field with seven 3-pointers. With 7:35 to play in the first half and Ohio State leading by nine, the Nittany Lions connected on three treys to tie the game at 31-31.

The seesaw scoring continued to the final first half horn. The Buckeyes hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to take a 47-43 lead into the locker rooms. Senior guard Jamari Wheeler led Penn State with 11 points at the half.

STRONG SECOND HALF LIFTS NO. 11 IOWA OVER NITTANY LIONS

No. 11 Iowa overcame its second-half scoring drought to lift the Hawkeyes to a 74-68 win over Penn State. Penn State's swarming defense held Iowa 13 points below its scoring average and forced 16 turnovers, a season high for the Hawkeyes, during the Big Ten battle.

Scoring droughts for both teams marked the second half with Iowa going without a field goal for two four-minute spans and Penn State unable to make a shot for seven minutes. With the game tied at 54 at 12:10, neither team could make a basket until Hawkeye center Luka Garza ended the Iowa stretch with a layup at the 8:18 mark for a 56-54 score.

After the under-eight-minute timeout, the Hawkeyes put together a 14-4 run to take a 70-61 lead with 4:05 left in the game. Despite struggling with its shooting over a stretch of seven minutes, Penn State scored eight points, all from the free throw line, and made defensive plays that kept it in the game.

A trey by Myreon Jones at the 4:58 mark kept Penn State in the hunt, down by only six, 67-61.

The last two free throws, by Jones, pulled the Nittany Lions within five points, 70-65. A Seth Lundy triple found the bottom of the net as Iowa finished the game with a couple of free throws and a layup for the 74-68 final.

The Nittany Lions held a five-point lead at the break, 41-36, and John Harrar extended it to seven with two quick free throws to start the second period. Iowa's Joe Wieskamp scored eight-straight points in the first 2:04 to pull the Hawkeyes within one, 43-42.

Jamari Wheeler countered with two 3-pointers to put the Nittany Lions up 49-42 at 17:10 before both teams had scoring droughts of four minutes.

Iowa made two field goals to take a 51-49 lead before Izaiah Brockington, who shared the team scoring lead with Jones, hit a jumper to tie the game at 51. Hawkeye Patrick McCaffery and Jones traded 3-pointers for a deadlock at 54 near the 12-minute mark.

Iowa extended its lead to 11 at 67-56 with five minutes remaining but a 9-3 Penn State run cut the deficit to five with 1:19 to play.

Jones and Brockington led the Nittany Lions with 11 points. Brockington had the high rebound total with seven while Harrar had six. Senior forward Luka Garza led all scorers with 23 points and he and Wieskamp had a game-high tying 11 rebounds. Garza became Iowa's all-time leading scorer in the second half of Sunday's matchup.

Wieskamp and Luka Garza combined for 22 of the Hawkeyes' 38 second-half points with 11 each.

The Hawkeyes came out of the gate firing, as CJ Fredrick knocked down a pair of triples in the game's first five minutes and added another bucket to give Iowa an early 13-4 advantage. Trailing by 13 with 13:40 to play, the Nittany Lions hit their next six shots to pull within one after a Myles Dread 3-pointer.

Iowa pushed its lead back to four, but a 5-0 run led by a Trent Buttrick triple gave Penn State its first lead of the game at 26-25. With Iowa leading 33-30, Dread

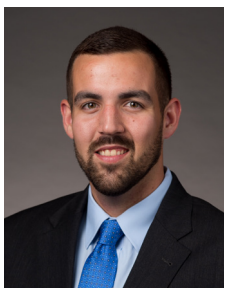
