COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

585	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson has 585 career wins, which leads active NCAA Division I head coaches, spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and now 19 seasons at Notre Dame. Jackson's win total ranks 10th all-time for most wins at the NCAA Division I level.
400	In game one against Michigan, Coach Jackson recorded his 400th career victory behind the Irish bench. The 6-1 win over the rival Wolverines marked the momentous occasion. Jackson now holds a 403-258-73 record with the Irish and is the winningest coach in program history.
28	Twenty-eight former Irish icers participated in NHL training camps ahead of the 2023-24 season, representing over half of the NHL franchises.
18	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson has guided his teams at Lake Superior State and Notre Dame to 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, including winning NCAA Championships with the Lakers in 1992 and 1994, while guiding the Irish to their only four Frozen Four appearances in program history: 2008, 2011, 2017 and 2018.
17	Seventeen sets of brothers have now suited up for the Irish, including current players, Trevor and Justin Janicke , Landon and Carter Slaggert (brother Graham played 2018-22), Henry and Danny Nelson , and Brady Bjork (brother Anders played 2014-17).
12	Veteran leadership: Notre Dame's roster features 12 seniors and graduate students in 2023-24. Current graduates Ryan Bischel and Trevor Janicke have spent all five years of their collegiate careers with the Fighting Irish.
10	Seven Irish alumni made NHL opening night rosters including Jake Evans (MTL), Ian Cole (VAN), Andrew Peeke (CBJ), Bryan Rust (PIT), Dennis Gilbert (CGY), Kyle Palmieri (NYI) and Anders Lee (NYI). To date this season, 10 former players have dressed in an NHL game, including Vinnie Hinostrroza (PIT), Cal Petersen's (PHI), and Spencer Stastney's (NSH) debuts in November
9	The Irish have nine draft picks on their roster in 2023-24 and have had at least one individual selected in each of the past 21 NHL Entry Level Drafts.
8	With the most recent being the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history - each under Jeff Jackson (three regular-season).
8	The freshmen class features eight new faces this season, including four NHL draft picks in Brennan Ali (DET '22), Danny Nelson (NYI '23), Cole Knuble (PHI '23) and Paul Fischer (STL '23).
4	The Irish announced four seniors and graduate students will serve as team captains this season. Landon Slaggert will wear the lone "C" while Ryan Bischel, Jake Boltmann and Trevor Janicke will serve as alternates.
2	After being named captain for the 2023-24 season, Landon Slaggert became the second Slaggert captain in program history, following his older brother Graham serving in the role in 2021-22.

QUICK HITS

- The Irish return home for alumni weekend as they play host to Penn State University January 19-20.
- The two teams previously met in the B1G season opener in State College, Pennsylvania at the start of November with each squad picking up the extra conference point in a pair of ties.
- Notre Dame most recently split with Ohio State on the road to close out their regular season series with the Buckeyes. After dropping a 3-2 decision Friday night the team bounced back to a dominating 5-2 victory Saturday to improve to 11-11-2 on the year.
- With the primary assist on Landon Slaggert's first goal Saturday night at OSU, Henry Nelson recorded his first collegiate point.
- Notre Dame closed out the 2023 calendar year and non-conference regular season play with a sweep. In the first ever meeting between the Irish and the Vikings of Augustana (SD), Notre Dame jumped out to a convincing 5-1 victory in game one of the series before an overtime battle between the two squads on Sunday in the series finale.
- Cole Knuble net the overtime game-winner in Sunday's contest against the Vikings to complete the weekend sweep and add to his career-weekend which saw him record his first collegiate hat trick the night prior. For his four goal weekend, including both game-winning tallies, Knuble was named Big Ten Conference Second Star of the Week.
- With his goal to tie it Sunday night vs. Augustana, sophomore Michael Mastrodome-nico registered his first career goal and now boasts five points on the season (1-4-5) following just one assist in his rookie season.
- Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson hit a career milestone with his 400th win behind the Irish bench in game one of the team's home series against Michigan. The team celebrated Friday night following their 6-1 victory over the Wolverines with a tribute video from current and former players congratulating Jackson on the accomplishment.
- Coaches Jackson, Pooley and Slaggert have won all 402 games as a unit while Brock Sheahan, who joined the dynamic coaching staff prior to 2023-24, was a part of win No. 1 when he was a student-athlete at Notre Dame.
- Two Irish skaters recorded their first goals with the program against Ohio State earlier this season with Patrick Moynihan and Cole Knuble each finding the back of the net in game two of that series for their first goals in an Irish sweater.
- Maddox Fleming net his first career goal against the Nittany Lions, scoring the equalizer late in the third period night one to force overtime and the eventual shootout.
- The Irish closed out their first month of contests with a weekend sweep over Mercyhurst, Oct. 26-27.
- Despite trailing to start the third period against the Lakers, the Irish came back to notch the overtime game winner off the stick of Landon Slaggert night one before storming

off to a 5-0 win the following night.

- With four goals against Mercyhurst, including two each night and the game-winner night one, Landon Slaggert led the nation in goal scoring and was named Big Ten Third Star of the Week for his performance.
- Two Irish rookies recorded first career goals when Paul Fischer and Brennan Ali helped lift the Irish to their 5-0 victory Friday night against the Lakers.
- The Irish opened their season with a split against Clarkson inside Compton Family Ice Arena.
- The first line chart of the season featured nine new faces while all 10 appeared on the ice at some point last weekend.
- The new talent made an immediate impact on the Irish team with five 2023-24 additions recording their first points in an Irish sweater over the weekend.
- Two Irish rookies net their first collegiate goals on the weekend with Jayden Davis and Danny Nelson each finding the back of the net in Sunday night’s win.
- Davis’ goal came off his first shot on goal in his NCAA debut. The goal in the second period proved to be the eventual game-winner.
- With his first win of the season, Ryan Bischel picked up his eighth career shutout behind the 3-0 victory. He stopped all 22 shots faced in the contest to improve his season save percentage to .957 through two games played.
- The Irish return 19 letterwinners from the 2022-23 season this year, including 2023 Big Ten Conference Goaltender of the Year, Ryan Bischel.
- Classmate Trevor Janicke also returned for his fifth season with the Irish, serving as alternate captain for the second time in 2023-24.
- Of those letterwinners returning, 17 saw game action last season while five appeared in all 37 games played for the Irish a season ago.
- The veteran leadership consists of four graduate seniors, including new additions to the team in Patrick Moynihan (forward; Providence) and Ryan Siedem (defenseman; Harvard), and eight seniors
- Ten new faces join the team this season, including eight freshmen. The new contributors consist of seven forwards and three defensemen.

NOTRE DAME VS. PENN STATE

- The Irish and Nittany Lions most recently split a pair of shootouts in State College earlier this season, with the Irish tying the game late on night one off the stick of Maddox Fleming for his first collegiate goal. Cole Knuble net the shootout winner in the third round to clinch the extra point for the Irish.
- Game two of the series went the way of the opposition as Penn State scored a pair of third period goals to force the extra session and eventual shootout.
- In 37 all-time meetings between the two teams, the Irish lead 22-9-6 and own a 13-5-1 record on home ice.
- Including the two overtime games earlier this year, the Irish and Nittany Lions have needed extra time on 10 occasions with each team owning two overtime victories along with six ties.

TEAM LEADERS

- The team’s leader in goals, Landon Slaggert, boasts 15 on the season and is tied for fifth nationally in the category. The senior captain lit the lamp twice in game two against Ohio State for his sixth career multi-goal game and fourth of the season.
- Boasting 13 assists this season, Ryan Siedem leads the team in the category.
- After scoring a goal on the powerplay Saturday night at Ohio State, Landon’s four powerplay goals leads the team.
- Patrick Moynihan’s eventual game-winning tally Saturday at OSU tied for the team-best with Drew Bavaro, Landon Slaggert, Cole Knuble and Justin Janicke.
- With 90 offensive zone carry-ins, Cole Knuble ranks second nationally and boasts the best average among all rookies. With Brennan Ali (6th; 81 carries) and Justin Janicke (19th; 71 carries) joining him in the top-20, the Irish are one of three teams to boast

three forwards in the top-20 of all O-Zone carry-ins. Their ability to carry the puck into the offensive zone has helped the Irish maintain possession on the attack throughout the season.

- On the defensive side of the puck, Ryan Siedem ranks among the best defensemen at breaking out pucks, gathering the second most dump-ins and boasting a volume/success ratio that leads the nation. As a distributor, he ranks second in assists and leads the team in stretch passes.
- A distributor of the puck, Drew Bavaro ranks fourth nationally among carry-outs of the defensive zone and generates the most one-man breakouts. He has the second highest success rate among breakouts of defensemen this season heading into the weekend.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- The 2022-23 Big Ten Goaltender of the Year was one of two unanimous selections for 2023-24 Preseason All-Big Ten Teams. He was selected to the All-Big Ten First Team ahead of the coming season. Bischel was also a Mike Richter Award semifinalist and a Hobey Baker nominee a season ago.
- Drew Bavaro made an immediate impact at the blueline last season after joining the Irish and will look to continue that success this season as a senior. He was selected to the All-Big Ten Second Team for the preseason. Landon Slaggert also picked up preseason honors from the Big Ten when he was named an Honorable Mention heading into the season.
- Following his performance against Mercyhurst, which included a nation's best four goals on the weekend, Landon Slaggert was named the Big Ten's Third Star of the Week October 31.
- Two Irish were recognized for their play in the weekend sweep of Ohio State to open conference play at home. Bischel picked up First Star of the Week honors with a .984 save percentage in two games played. The graduate netminder stopped 60 of 61 shots faced and earned his 10th career shutout. With his third blanking of the season, Bischel leads the nation in blankings.
- Landon Slaggert also picked up conference honors following the weekend against OSU, being tabbed Third Star of the Week by the Big Ten behind a goal and three assists.
- After a weekend split against then-No. 13/12, Ryan Bischel was named Big Ten Third Star of the Week for his .953 save percentage and 1.50 goals against average.
- Following a four goal weekend which included the team's first hat trick performance in nearly two years, freshman Cole Knuble was named Big Ten Second Star of the Week. The honor came as Knuble's first of his career and it was the fifth weekly award for the Irish this season.
- On Wednesday, January 17, Bischel was named a nominee for the Hockey Humanitarian Award as announced by the award's foundation. A graduate student seeking a degree in non-profit administration, Bischel serves as alternate captain for the team this season and is heavily involved in the local community.

- So far this season, 10 Irish alumni have laced up their skates on the national stage.
- Seven Irish alums were highlighted on NHL opening night rosters for 2023-24, including Jake Evans (MTL), Andrew Peeke (CBJ), Ian Cole (VAN), Bryan Rust (PIT), Dennis Gilbert (CGY), Anders Lee (NYI) and Kyle Palmieri (NYI).
- Bryan Rust scored the first Penguins' goal of the 2023-24 season at the 7:04 mark of the first period.
- Jake Evans net the Canadiens' first goal of the season just 3:01 in Montreal's season.
- Vinnie Hinostroza (PIT) and Cal Petersen (PHI) made their season debuts for their respective clubs on Nov. 4.
- In his first game of the season, Hinostroza scored a goal and an assist in the Penguins' 10-2 win over San Jose.
- Spencer Stastney was called up to the Nashville Predators on Nov. 14 and made his season debut with the NHL club on Nov. 18, becoming the 10th Irish alum to appear in a game this season.
- Twenty-eight alums laced up their skates at development camps.
- The Irish were represented at just over half of all NHL clubs as alumni competed at 18 different camps with hopes of making the opening night rosters.
- New additions to NHL development camps this September include three recent Irish graduates in Ben Brinkman (MIN), Nick Leivermann (WAS) and Ryder Rolston (CHI).
- The Minnesota Wild and New York Islanders both had the most Irish alumni present as six alumni competed at the two camps, with three at each.

FAMILY TIES

- The 2023-24 Notre Dame roster features quite a few family connections to the program and hockey world.
- Three sets of brothers are currently on the roster, including Justin and Trevor Janicke, Landon and Carter Slaggert, and Henry and Danny Nelson.
- With the addition of the Nelsons this season, the Irish have had 17 sets of brothers lace up their skates together for the Irish.
- Carter Slaggert also joins the Irish in 2023-24, becoming the third Slaggert brother to appear in a game for the Irish and joins his older brother Landon, who is a senior. Oldest brother Graham currently plays in the Buffalo Sabres organization and skated two years alongside Landon before graduating.
- Senior forward Brady Bjork is the younger brother of former Irish All-American and current Chicago Blackhawk Anders Bjork.
- Brady's father, Kirt, played for the Irish from 1979-83 where he appeared in 141 and tallied 161 career points (76-85). When older brother Anders played for the Irish, they became the fourth set of father-son combinations within Notre Dame hockey.
- Both Kirt and Anders were named All-American during their time at Notre Dame.
- The Slaggerts are part of the fifth set of father-son combinations to suit up for the Irish, joining their father and associate head coach Andy Slaggert.
- Justin and Trevor Janicke are the sons of Curtis Janicke, who played for the Irish from 1989-93, appearing in 125 games while scoring 46 goals and adding 98 assists for 144 points.
- Justin, Trevor and Curtis represent the sixth father-son duo to play for the Irish.
- Freshman Paul Fischer is the nephew of Mike Gearan, a member of the first varsity hockey team at Notre Dame. Fischer will honor his uncle by wearing his number during his career with the Irish, No. 16.
- Freshman forward Cole Knuble is the son of former NHLer Mike Knuble, who spent

- Cole Knuble's brother, Cam, is a senior at Western Michigan University.
- Ryan Siedem's brother is a freshman at the University of New Hampshire.
- Jayden Davis' brother Matthew is a junior on the Denver Pioneers' hockey team.
- Maddox Fleming's sister Delaney is a freshman on the Ohio State University women's hockey team.

CURRENT IRISH IN THE NHL DRAFT

- The 2023-24 roster features nine NHL draftees, including Jake Boltmann (CGY '20), Justin Janicke (SEA '21), Danny Nelson (NYI '23), Brennan Ali (DET '22), Paul Fischer (STL '23), Patrick Moynihan (NJD '19), Landon Slaggert (CHI '20), Cole Knuble (PHI '23) and Trevor Janicke (ANA '19).
- The 2023 NHL draft saw three Irish rookies selected, the most since 2020, and 15th time in program history that at least three Irish icers were selected in a single draft class.
- The trio of skaters selected in 2023, Danny Nelson (2nd Rd., 49 overall), Cole Knuble (4th Rd., 103 overall) and Paul Fischer (5th Rd., 138 overall) join fellow rookie Brennan Ali (DET '22) as draftees in the ND freshmen class.
- When Nelson was selected in the second round of this year's Draft, Notre Dame extended its streak of players drafted to 21 years (2004-present).

IRISH HEADED HOME

- The University of Notre Dame, in conjunction with The Odyssey Trust, announced the Irish would participate in the 2024 rendition of the Friendship Four men's college ice hockey tournament.
- The annual tournament is set to be played in Belfast, Ireland, next November (2024) with the Irish joining Harvard, Merrimack and Boston University as participants competing for the coveted Belpot Trophy.
- The tournament was last played in 2022 with Quinnipiac reigning victorious that fall before winning the national championship at the conclusion of the 2022-23 season.
- The tournament first began in 2015 and is designed to promote education, social welfare, and community interaction.
- Over the course of six previous tournaments, 24 games have been played dating back to the inaugural games in 2015.
- Northern Ireland remains the only destination outside of the United States to host consequential NCAA Division I ice hockey games.

A POSITION ENDOWED

- On Wednesday, October 25, it was announced that the head coaching position at Notre Dame would be named the Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach.

- The 2023–24 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson’s 19th season behind the Irish bench. During his first 18 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success, including four trips to the Frozen Four and eight conference championships.
- Jackson has over 30 years of coaching experience and led Notre Dame to back-to-back Big Ten tournament championship seasons in 2018 and 2019 while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 15 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is one of only two coaches to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 17 seasons.
- Jackson’s Notre Dame teams have made 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 18-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation’s top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006–07 and 2008–09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team’s first season in the Big Ten (2017–18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018–19).
- Jackson’s success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson’s arrival, the Irish have had 47 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft, including three first round selections.
- In that same span, 39 players from USA Hockey’s National Team Developmental Program have matriculated to Notre Dame.

- During Jackson’s tenure, the Irish have had nine players garner All-America honors — Ryan Bischel in 2023, Bobby Nardella in 2019, Cale Morris in 2018, Anders Bjork in 2017, Robbie Russo in 2015, Anders Lee in 2013, Ian Cole and Erik Condra in 2009 and David Brown in 2007.
- In addition, 27 of Jackson’s Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2023–24 season with a 23-year collegiate record of 574–297–96 for a .645 winning percentage, the third-highest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2023–24).
- Entering the 2023–24 season, Jackson’s 574 career wins rank 11th all-time in Division I and leads all active NCAA Division I coaches.
