STORYLINES:

- Lions coming off 72-point outing vs. No. 18 MSU, 5th 70+ game in last 7 at home.
- Newbill & Marshall form second highest scoring tandem in Big Ten, combined for 56 points in last outing vs. No. 18 MSU.
- D.J. Newbill only B1G player to rank in top 15 of scoring, assists and rebounding in conference.
- Penn State posting 66.8 ppg at home.
- Lions & Huskers looking for 1st B1G win.

THE GAME: Coming off its best scoring and shooting game thus far in Big Ten play, Penn State will look to snap a five-game losing skid and post its first conference win when Nebraska comes to the Jordan Center on Saturday. The Huskers are also riding a five-game losing skid and are winless in conference play. The teams split a pair of games last year with each posting a double-digit win on its home floor. Penn State posted a 67-51 victory in the Jordan Center behind 23 points from Tim Frazier. The Lions own a 3-2 lead in the series that began in 1980 and are 2-0 vs. the Huskers in State College.

THON HOOPS DAY: Penn State will welcome approximately 60 pediatric cancer patients and their families to Saturday's game and will donate all revenue from single-game student ticket sales to Penn State Dance Marathon (THON), the largest student-run philanthropy in the world. THON raised a record of more than \$10.6 million last year and holds its annual event with more than 700 dancers on the third weekend in February in the Jordan Center. The money that is raised is donated to The Four Diamonds Fund, a charity devoted to defeating pediatric cancer through research and caring for patients at the Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital. More than 15,000 students get involved in the event each year, organizing it and raising funds with the rallying cry, "FOR THE KIDS!"

NOTES TO KNOW:

- Penn State's 47 points against Michigan State in the second half marked a high for a half under Coach Chambers. The Lions eclipsed 70 points for the fifth time on the season and fifth in the last seven home game. The 72 points and 48% shooting marked a high in Big Ten play on the year. MSU entered the game ranked second in the Big Ten in scoring defense (57.7 ppg) and defensive shooting percentage (37.6%) and had allowed just one opponent to reach 70, a 74-70 win over Boise State.
- Penn State is averaging 66.8 ppg at home, eclipsing 70 five times, and 50.0 ppg on the road, with a high of 57, this season. D.J. Newbill is posting 17.3 ppg and 8.7 foul shots per game at home, while posting 11.0 ppg and 3.3 foul shots per game on the road.
- Four different players have led PSU in scoring in the last four games.
- Jermaine Marshall (29) and D.J. Newbill (27) both posted career high point totals and accounted for 56 of PSU's 72 points vs. MSU while combining to shoot 60% from the floor. They scored 40 of the Lions' 47 in the second half and 18 straight at one point.
- Jermaine Marshall posted his first career double-double (29 & 10) vs. MSU. He has double-figure scoring in 11 of his last 13 games and leads the team with 29 threes and 28 steals.
- D.J. Newbill is the only Big Ten player to rank in the Top 20 of the conference statistics in scoring (6th), assists (8th) and rebounding (16th). He posted his sixth 20-point game of the season (27) vs. MSU and is averaging 18.7 ppg in his last three games.
- PSU has posted 12 games with double-digit offensive boards, including 14+ in four of the last six and a season high 17 vs. Indiana.
- The Lions 73.9% at the foul line in Big Ten play ranks 2nd in the conference, but PSU has a 137-69 deficit in free throws attempted and 84-51 in free throw line scoring in Big Ten play. The Lions got to the line 27 times vs. MSU, by far their most in any Big Ten game.
- Ross Travis led Penn State in scoring for the first time in his career logging a season high equaling 14 points vs. Indiana. He ranks 4th in the Big Ten in rebounding with 7.4 rpg.
- D.J. Newbill leads Penn State with 117 free throw attempts and has gotten to the foul line at least once in 46 of 49 career games.
- Newbill (6th, 15.6 ppg) and Marshall (7th, 15.0 ppg) are one of two sets of teammates to rank in the Top 10 in scoring in the Big Ten, and the 2nd highest scoring backcourt (29.0 ppg), behind Michigan's Trey Burke (3rd, 18.0) and Tim Hardaway Jr. (5th, 16.4), 34.4 ppg.
- All-Big Ten guard Tim Frazier hit week 8 of his recovery from Achilles tendon surgery and advanced from a walking boot to a heel wedge in his shoe on Jan. 15.

**No. 18 MICHIGAN STATE 81, PENN STATE 72
Jan. 16, 2013 • West Lafayette, Ind.**

Penn State posted its best shooting and scoring game in Big Ten play to date on the season and got career high scoring games from guards Jermaine Marshall (29) and D.J. Newbill (27) but couldn't over come an MSU team that shot 53 percent in the second half and got a career high 20 points in just 17 minutes of action from Adreian Payne who joined Branden Dawson in sitting out the first half due to a pre-game incident. PSU held MSU to just 29 first half points on 40% shooting, but saw the Spartans explode for 52 in the second half. The Lions led 36-35 with 15:16 to play when Payne took over scoring 16 points in six minutes to give MSU a 54-44 lead with 9:11 to go. Marshall scored 22 and Newbill 18 in the second half as PSU cut a 16-point MSU lead to five, 71-66, with 2:06 to play but could get no closer. The two PSU guards combined to shoot 18-of-30 (60%) and score 56 points as the Lions shot 48% for the game and 19-of-27 at the foul line.

SCOUTING NEBRASKA: The Huskers bring a five-game losing streak to the Jordan Center and are winless in conference play after falling 65-56 to Purdue in Lincoln on Wednesday. NU has played the last two games without 6-10 senior Brandon Ubel who fractured an elbow in a 62-47 loss at Michigan and may miss the remainder of the season. He was leading the team posting 6.8 rpg and was the third leading scorer at 12.1 ppg. Dylan Talley leads the Huskers in scoring (13.2) and assists (2.5) and now rebounding (5.6) in the absence of Ubel. Guard Ray Gallegos is fifth in the Big Ten making 2.3 threes per game. The Huskers rank last in the Big Ten scoring 58.1 ppg and field goal percentage defense (43.0) and second to last in field goal percentage (41.1) and three-point percentage (29.6).

Penn State nearly got a triple-double from Tim Frazier as the 6-1 guard posted 23 points, 10 rebounds, nine assists and three steals in a dominating 16-point win over the Huskers. The Lions used a 10-0 run with 8:33 to play in the first half to break-open an 18-17 game and take a 28-17 lead with 6:05 to play. Three different Lions scored in the run as PSU went on to shoot 58% in the first half and 5-of-8 from three to take a 36-26 halftime lead. PSU held the margin over double-digits the entire second half and led by as many as 20 as the Lions shot 52% for the game. Cam Woodyard posted 14 points on a career-best equaling four threes and Jermaine Marshall added 12. Dylan Talley led NU with 12 points as the Huskers shot 39%, 6-of-20 from three, and were out rebounded 30-21.

- **JERMAINE MARSHALL** posted a career high 29 points & 10 rebounds vs. Michigan State. He has led the Lions in scoring in seven games on the year. He has 34 career double-digit scoring games and 6 20-point games.
- **JERMAINE MARSHALL** greatly improved his defense last year and finished second on the team with 32 steals. He leads the team this season with 28, including a career high five vs. New Hampshire.
- **D.J. NEWBILL** posted his first double-double at Penn State with a career high 23 points and 12 rebounds vs. Duquesne. He has scored in double-digits in 14 of 17 games on the year, including a career high 27 vs. MSU. His six 20-point games on the year rank third in the Big Ten and his seven career double-doubles (six at Southern Miss.) are tied for fourth-most among active Big Ten players.
- **D.J. NEWBILL** trimmed his weight from 225 to 205 in the off-season following his red-shirt campaign after transferring from Southern Mississippi. He missed nearly two months of practice early last season after injuring his left shoulder.
- **ROSS TRAVIS** has led the team in rebounding in 11 games. He is fourth in the Big Ten posting 7.4 rpg. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year.
- **ROSS TRAVIS** posted a career-best 13 rebounds vs. Bucknell, 11 at Wisconsin and led Penn State with 10 in a loss to Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, adding 11 points for his first career double-double. He has four double-digit rebounding games and two double-doubles on the year.
- **JON GRAHAM** tied a career high with three blocks vs. Penn and leads the team with 16 on the season. He blocked a total of 19 shots last year to lead the team.
- **JON GRAHAM** was instrumental in holding Bucknell and Penn post scorers well below average. The Bison's Mike Muscala entered the game averaging 17.7 ppg and posted 10 on 2-of-4 shooting. Penn's Fran Dougherty entered posting 18.6 ppg and posted 7 on 3-of-8.
- **JON GRAHAM** trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for his sophomore season and added four inches to his vertical. He maintains a team-best 24 reps on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best.
- Former walk-on **NICK COLELLA** was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He posted a career-best 15 points on 5-of-7 from three vs. Duquesne. He went 11-of-20 from three in the last four non-con games. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started six-straight games in the Big Ten.
- Freshman **BRANDON TAYLOR** arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds, in part due to a plantar fasciitis that kept him inactive for much of the summer. He sculpted his body in the late summer and pre-season and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the season.
- **BRANDON TAYLOR** posted 16 points in his first career start vs. Bucknell. He has posted double-digit scoring in six games since taking on a larger role in the absence of Frazier. The 6-7 Taylor leads PSU shooting 35.4% (23-65) from three, making at least one in 11 of 14 games since Tim Frazier's injury. His 23 threes are second only to Jermaine Marshall's 29.
- Freshman **DONOVON JACK** had the best game of his young career posting eight points and three rebounds vs. Delaware State, while shooting 4-of-5 from the floor. He is 9-16 (56%) from the floor on the year and made his first career three vs. Indiana (1/7).

■ Penn State went 6-2 in the eight non-con games after losing do-everything guard Tim Frazier to a season-ending Achilles injury. The Lions 8-4 record in the non-con season equaled their win total from last year (8-5), despite losing Frazier early in the fourth game of the year.

■ Following completion of the fall semester, two Nittany Lions (Kevin Montminy & Tim Frazier) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.5 GPA or higher and seven Lions posted a 3.0 GPA or higher. Montminy posted a 4.0 GPA.

■ Coach Patrick Chambers named senior Nick Colella and junior Jermaine Marshall to join D.J. Newbill as team captains prior to the Lions' first Big Ten game of the season.

■ Penn State shot a season best 40% (8-20) from three vs. Duquesne and made a season high eight threes. The Lions have shot less than 40% from the arc in 16 games and less than 30% in seven.

■ Penn State is 4-0 in games decided by seven points or less on the year, including two overtime wins. The Lions went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year, having just one home loss come by more than six points.

■ Penn State has allowed 10 opponents to eclipse 70 points on the year, winning three of those games, and having seven losses on the year come to opponents scoring 70+. Penn State is 4-20 under Patrick Chambers when opponents break 70 points.

■ Five of Penn State's eight primary contributors (following the loss of Tim Frazier) are freshmen or sophomores, including three of the top four scorers and rebounders.

■ Penn State has fielded one of the nation's youngest squads the last two years. This year, two sophomores and a freshman are in the starting line-up accounting for 45 of 70 starts on the year. Last year eight of 10 primary contributors were in their first or second season of Division I play.

WHAT A COMBO! Junior Jermaine Marshall posted career highs of 29 points and 10 rebounds and sophomore **D.J. Newbill** had a career high 27 points and added six assists as Penn State's starting guard accounted for 56 of the Lions' 72 points in an 81-72 loss to No. 18 Michigan State (1/16). The tandem combined to shoot 18-30 (60%) from the floor and 17-of-23 (74%) at the foul line. Marshall hit three threes and tied a career high with 10 field goals while Newbill got to the foul line 15 times and made 11. They both exploded in the second half with Marshall collecting 22 of his points and Newbill 18 of his in the second 20 minutes, accounting for 40 of the Lions 47 points in the highest scoring PSU half in coach Patrick Chambers two seasons. They accounted for 18 straight points at one point and 30 of the final 32 for the the Lions as PSU sliced a 16-point MSU lead to five with 2:06 to play. **Their combined 56 points were the most by two Lions in a game since Geary Claxton (31) and Janelle Cornley (25) combined for 56 in a 129-111 victory over VMI in 2006. It marked the second time this season they both scored 20 points in a game.**

72 VS. MSU ENDS BIG TEN SCORING DROUGHT: Penn State's 47 points against Michigan State in the second half marked a high for a half in two seasons under Coach Chambers. The Lions eclipsed 70 points for the fifth time on the season and fifth in the last seven home games. The 72 points and 48% shooting marked a PSU high in Big Ten play on the year. MSU entered the game ranked second in the Big Ten in scoring defense (57.7 ppg) and defensive shooting percentage (37.6%) and had allowed just one opponent to reach 70, a 74-70 win over Boise State. PSU posted 78.5 ppg in its final four non-conference games, but failed to eclipse 54 points in its first four Big Ten games, posting 49.5 ppg over that stretch. The Lions had logged three straight games with season lows in shooting (31.7% vs. Indiana, 31.6% vs. Northwestern in the Jordan Center and 25.9% (the lowest mark under Patrick Chambers) at Purdue) prior to the MSU game. The Lions 42 points in the loss at Purdue marked the fewest scored in two seasons under head coach Patrick Chambers.

TIM FRAZIER INJURY: WHAT'S MISSING

■ **TIM FRAZIER** was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier was named a first-team All-Big Ten selection last year after leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4).

■ stands 6th on the Penn State career assist charts with 459 after posting a record 198 last year and is 151 assists shy of breaking the all-time career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992.

■ scored 208 field goals and had 198 assists to lead the nation being involved in 58.4% of Penn State's field goals last year. Only two other players in Division I were involved in 50% or more of their teams scoring.

■ was the ONLY player in NCAA Division I to post at least 17 points and 6 rebounds a game last year.

■ had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, including 15 of 19 games vs. Big Ten opponents, and scored 20 or more points in 9 of his last 13 games before his injury. Was averaging 21.7 ppg through the first three games of the season.

Chambers was ranked among the Top 25 most followed Division I basketball coaches, and fourth among Big Ten coaches, in a preseason survey by the basketball blog runthefloor.com. He has gained more than 1,000 followers since that survey.

GREAT GUARDS: Penn State's high scoring guard trio will all return for the 2013-14 season. With Jermaine Marshall and D.J. Newbill on pace to finish the 2012-13 campaign with nearly 800 career points each, they could give the Lions three 1,000-point scorers on the floor during the 2014 Big Ten season.

A NEW MARSHALL IN TOWN: Junior Jermaine Marshall has emerged as not only one of Penn State's main weapons, ranking 7th in the Big Ten scoring 15.0 ppg, but a primary ball handler, sharing duties at the point with D.J. Newbill, and a generator of turnovers, leading the team with 28 steals (7th in the Big Ten, 1.6 spg). He posted his **FIRST CAREER DOUBLE-DOUBLE** with career highs of 29 points and 10 rebounds vs. Michigan State (1/16) and his combined point and rebound total (39) were the most by a Nittany Lion since Talor Battle posted 28 points and 13 rebounds (41) in a 69-61 win over Michigan in 2008. He has two 20-point games on the year. He led Penn State in scoring in four straight games immediately following the injury to Tim Frazier and has led the team in points seven times on the year. He logged a career high five assists vs. two turnovers in the win over Delaware State for his best floor game of the year and followed that with a career high five steals in the win over New Hampshire. Marshall is the Lions' leading active career scorer (discounting the injured Tim Frazier) with 591 points and three-point shooter with 72 career threes.

NEWBILL ON POINT: D.J. Newbill, a natural off-guard, has taken over point guard duties since the injury to Tim Frazier in the fourth game of the season. He is logging big minutes at the position playing 35.8 per game to rank second in the Big Ten. He is the only Big Ten player to rank in the Top 20 of the conference statistics in scoring (6th, 15.6), assists (8th, 3.9) and rebounding (16th, 5.9). Working through growing pains at the position, he posted 10-straight double-digit scoring games after taking over, a streak snapped vs. Indiana, and has posted double-digit points in 14 of 17 games with

six 20-point outings, including a career high 27 vs. Michigan State (1/16). He has led the Lions in scoring five times since Frazier's injury, posting career highs on four occasions including a 23-point, 12-rebound effort vs. Duquesne for his first double-double at Penn State and seventh career. His six 20-point outings on the year are third most in the Big Ten.

BOROVNJAK BREAKING OUT IN FINAL CAMPAIGN: Senior Sasa Borovnjak, who is in his fourth year in the program but redshirted the 2010-11 campaign due to a knee injury suffered prior to the season and is eligible for a fifth season of eligibility, has made the decision to make this his final season of collegiate competition and plans to graduate in May. Since discussing the decision with coach Patrick Chambers, he has played the best basketball of his career and started nine straight games. He posted three-straight double-digit scoring games in the final three non-conference outings culminating with 14, one shy of a career high, vs. Duquesne on 7-of-9 shooting. He tied a career high with eight rebounds for the second time in three games vs. Delaware State and added 14 points on a career best 8-of-10 from the foul line for the best statistical game of his career. He followed with 11 points and four boards vs. New Hampshire for the first back-to-back double-digit scoring games of his career. After averaging 1.7 ppg and 2.4 rpg in his first seven games, he has raised his averages to 5.4 ppg and 3.4 rpg.

TRAVIS GETS AGGRESSIVE: Ross Travis has staked a claim as one of the top rebounders in the Big Ten posting four double-digit rebounding games on the season, including 11 in the Big Ten opener at Wisconsin, to rank **FOURTH** in the Big Ten posting 7.4 rpg. Having worked hard on his jump shot in the off-season, he has also asserted himself offensively posting back-to-back double-digit scoring outings for the first time in his career (12 at La Salle and 14 vs. Army) and has five double-digit scoring games on the year (he had five all of last season). He led Penn State in scoring for the first time on his career with 14 points vs. Indiana while taking a career high 17 field goal attempts. Travis scored eight of the Lions first 14 points at La Salle and seven of Penn State's first nine vs. Army and shot 11-of-22 (50%) combined in the games. He logged his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 boards vs. Army.

TAYLOR LEADING THREE-POINT SHOOTER/LIMITED BY FOUL TROUBLE:

Freshman Brandon Taylor has proven to be an efficient offensive performer early in his career when he can avoid early foul trouble that limits his minutes. A pick and pop, stretch four, he led Penn State in scoring for the first time on his career with 11 at Purdue (1/13). He leads the team shooting 35.4 percent (23-65) from three and has made at least one three in 11 of 14 games since taking on a larger role following Tim Frazier's injury. His 23 threes rank second on the team. He posted back-to-back double-digit outings vs. Akron and Bucknell (hitting 62.5% (6-12) from three). Taylor's 14 points vs. Army and 10 vs. New Hampshire gave him five double-digit scoring outings on the year.

COLELLA CLOSES NON-CON ON TEAR; LEADS LIONS IN CHARGES TAKEN & DIVES:

After a rough start to the season that saw him shoot 5-of-27 from three in the first eight games, senior Nick Colella found his shot in the final four non-conference games going a team-best 11-of-20 (55%) from three to average 9.0 ppg. Included in that effort was a career high 15 points on a career-best 5-of-7 from three and a career-best four boards in the win vs. Duquesne. His five threes marked the most by a PSU player on the season. He is now third on the team with 19 threes on the year and has raised his three-point percentage to 33% for the season, second on the team. Among the team leaders in "Attitude Points" he leads the team with 11 charges taken and 49 dives on the year.

FRAZIER HITS 8-WEEK MILESTONE:

Tim Frazier had successful surgery to repair his ruptured left Achilles tendon on Nov. 20. He hit the eight-week milestone since the surgery on Jan. 15 and marked the day by no longer requiring use of a walking boot. He will now wear a wedge under his left heel for the next 2-3 weeks as he continues to stretch the tendon. He is currently walking in a pool and undergoing rehab to stretch the tendon and remove scar tissue. He is expected to begin walking on a weight suspended treadmill at the 10-week mark post surgery and to begin jumping rope in weeks 14 to 18. Frazier was in a cast for about three weeks before moving to a walking boot that gradually flattened his foot as the tendon stretched. He is expected to have about a six-month recovery period and, at the completion of the 2012-13 campaign, will apply for an NCAA Hardship Waiver to return for the 2013-14 season.

BOARDIN:

Penn State has won the rebounding battle in nine of the last 11 games and in 11 of 17 on the year. The Lions have had 14 or more offensive rebounds in four of their last six games.

WHAT ARE THE CHANCES?:

On January 13, Nittany Lion freshman Brandon Taylor and Lady Lion senior Alex Bentley made half court shots just prior to halftime on the same day, approximately two hours apart. Taylor tossed in a 50-foot bomb at the halftime buzzer for the last of his 11 points in a road loss at Purdue. Meanwhile, two hours later at the Bryce Jordan Center Bentley tossed one in from the Nittany Lion logo to give Penn State a 40-27 halftime lead in an eventual victory over Nebraska.

FILLING IN FOR FRAZIER:

Since losing Tim Frazier and his 21.7 ppg to injury in the fourth game, Penn State actually improved its scoring average (58.8 ppg to 68.8 ppg) and shooting percentage (35.3% to 43.5%) over the last eight games of the non-conference season while going 6-2. Jermaine Marshall made the biggest increase in the non-con since the loss of Frazier improving his scoring by 6.5 ppg (10.3 to 16.8) and his shooting percentage from 30.6% to 44.0% (22.6% to 40.5% from three) and seeing his assists rise dramatically from 0.7 apg to 3.0 apg. Freshman Brandon Taylor also increased his scoring from 4.0 ppg to 9.0 ppg (+5.0) and Sasa Borovnjak from 1.5 ppg to 7.1 ppg (+5.6).

OFFENSE CLICKS WITH FOUR STRAIGHT 70-POINT GAMES TO CLOSE NON-CON: PENN

State posted its four best point (78, 80, 72 & 84) and assist totals (13, 15, 13 & 12) of the season in the last four non-conference games and three of its top for shooting games. The Lions shot 47% and scored 78.5 ppg in the last four non-con outings, an increase of nearly 20 ppg over their 58.9 ppg average over the first eight games of the year. The Lions' streak of four straight games of 70+ points was their longest since posting seven in November and December of 2008 and their 84-point outing vs. Duquesne in the final non-con game was their most since 2009.

STARTING LINE-UPS:

4 on the year;

42 of 65 starts on the year by freshmen or sophomores.

Penn State employed 14 different starting line-ups on the 2011-12 season, nine in Big Ten play.



NOTES FROM LOSS TO NO. 18 MICHIGAN STATE:

- Penn State shot 55.6% in the second half to score 47 points, the most in a half under coach Patrick Chambers. The Lions shot 48% for the game and their 72 points marked a high in Big Ten play and were the most scored on the year against Michigan State, which entered the game ranked second in the Big Ten in scoring defense and shooting percentage.
- Jeremaine Marshall posted career highs of 29 points and 10 rebounds for his first career double. He scored 22 points in the second half. His combined point and rebound total (39) were the most by a Nittany Lion since Talor Battle posted 28 points and 13 rebounds (41) in a 69-61 win over Michigan in 2008.
- D.J. Newbill scored a career high 27 points and added six assists.
- Marshall (29) and Newbill (27) combined to score 56 points and shoot 18-of-30 (60%) from the floor. It marked the second time on the year they both went for 20 points. Their 56 points were the most by a Lion duo in a game since Geary Claxton (31) and Jamelle Cornley (25) logged 56 in a 129-11 victory over VMI in 2006.
- Penn State tied a season low with eight turnovers. MSU had seven and none in the second half.

NOTES FROM LOSS AT PURDUE:

- Penn State shot just 25.9%, the lowest mark under Coach Patrick Chambers and Penn State's lowest since shooting 20.6% in a loss to Maryland in December of 2010.
- Despite the poor shooting, Penn State trailed by just six with 14:05 to play on the road.
- Brandon Taylor led PSU in scoring for the first time on his career logging all 11 of his points in the first half, three coming on a half court shot just before the halftime buzzer.
- PSU leading scorers D.J. Newbill and Jermaine Marshall combined to shoot 6-of-25 and Newbill didn't score until 7:19 left to play.

LIONS HIT OFFENSIVE & REBOUNDING HIGH VS. DUQUESNE: Penn State shot a season-best 40% from three (8-20) making a season high eight and eclipsed 70 points for the fourth straight game in the win vs. Duquesne. Its 84 points marked the Lions most since posting 104 vs. Gardner-Webb in 2009. Penn State out-rebounded Duquesne 50-28 (+22), posting its most rebounds since logging 52 vs. UMBC in 2009. The Lions 16 offensive boards produced a 23-7 advantage in second chance points. Penn State got a season high 25 points off the bench vs. Duquesne, led by a career-best 15 from Nick Colella on a career-best 5-of-7 from three. D.J. Newbill posted a career high 23 points vs. Duquesne and added 12 rebounds and five assists for his first double-double at Penn State and seventh of his career. Sasa Borovnjak posted double-digit scoring in three straight games, including 14 vs. Duquesne, the best stretch of his career.

GOING FOR 80: Penn State posted 80 points vs. Delaware State and 84 vs. Duquesne in a span of three games, marking just the third and fourth games over 80 points under coach Patrick Chambers and the first since posting 82 in a loss to No. 12 Indiana on January 8, 2012. The 84 points in the win over the Dukes marked the most by a Penn State team since scoring 104 in a victory over Gardner-Webb in 2009.

WE CAN RELATE: Penn State coach Patrick Chambers can relate to star guard Tim Frazier's recent injury, in fact Frazier is using the exact same motorized scooter Chambers used this summer after he underwent arthroplastic surgery to repair the knee joint on his left leg and was limited to riding the scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and the use of crutches for two months. Chambers has said the insertion of a wedge and six screws to re-align his knee joint was one of the toughest things he's had to deal with and will use the recent experience to help guide Frazier through his rehabilitation. Frazier's sister, Krystal, also suffered a ruptured Achilles, during a standout basketball career at Rice that saw her earn All-Conference USA honors. She returned from the injury to post 10 ppg in her senior season.

FRAZIER REMAINS ACTIVE LEADER: Since his season-ending Achilles injury, Tim Frazier has remained a vocal and active presence on the team attending every practice and shouting instructions and pulling teammates aside during breaks in the action. He is a virtual assistant coach in games, even delivering the pre-game scout in the locker room prior to the win over Delaware State. He has been particularly active in helping to guide D.J. Newbill in his transition to the point guard position.

FRAZIER SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY: Senior guard Tim Frazier, a pre-season candidate for both the Wooden and Naismith national player of the year awards, will miss the remainder of the 2012-13 season due to an injury suffered in the Nittany Lions' third game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in Bayamon, Puerto Rico. Frazier had played in every game (101) the last three plus seasons. He suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon in his left leg and the 2012 first-team All-Big Ten guard underwent surgery to repair the injury on Nov. 20. A pre-season All-Big Ten selection, Frazier was leading Penn State with 21.7 ppg and 5.0 apg per game and was second with 6.0 rebounds per game through three games. He suffered the injury in the Nittany Lions' fourth game, a Nov. 18 contest vs. Akron in Puerto Rico, leaving the floor at the 14:30 mark of the first half. Frazier, a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection on schedule to graduate in May with a degree in Supply Chain and Information Systems from the Smeal College of Business, is eligible to apply for an NCAA medical Hardship Waiver after the completion of the 2012-13 campaign. He had posted 25 straight double-digit scoring game, 14 of which were 20+ point outings, and had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, scoring 20+ points in nine of his last 13, prior to the Akron game.

LIONS RALLY TO GET OT WIN OVER PROVIDENCE/FIRST UNDER CHAMBERS:

Penn State played and won its first overtime game under head coach Patrick Chambers in its second game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off downing Providence 55-52 in OT. Penn State came back from 10 points down in the second half to claim the victory. Tim Frazier scored nine straight points during a key second half stretch. Frazier led Penn State in scoring (19), rebounds (9), assists (7), and steals (4) while playing all 45 minutes (a career most). Chambers improved to 4-0 in overtime games as a head coach (2-0 at BU) when the Lions downed Delaware State (80-76) a month later.

FRAZIER NAMED TO WOODEN TOP 50: Tim Frazier was named to the Wooden Award Men's Preseason Top 50. He is the second Nittany Lion in the last three years to be named to the preseason list joining Talor Battle who was named prior to the 2010-11 season. Frazier was among nine Big Ten players named to the list.

FRAZIER PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN: Senior guard Tim Frazier was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was joined on the preseason team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was also named the preseason POY.

BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

TIM FRAZIER: Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine bests...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State.

JOHN GRAHAM: Added four inches to his vertical leap...added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20...increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

ROSS TRAVIS: In the past year, Travis has increased his bench press max from 245 to 310 and his reps on the 185-pound bench from 10 to 22. He increased his leg press max from 325 to 615 and added 2.5 inches to his vertical (31.5). He increased his weight from 203 to 220 while maintaining his body fat and can touch a team-best 16 inches above the rim.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Cut his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent...Improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

CHAMBERS HAS AN EVENTFUL OFF-SEASON: It was an eventful off-season for head coach Patrick Chambers as he and wife, Courtney, welcomed their third child, Caitlin, to the family on March 23, he underwent reconstructive knee surgery on his left leg on May 11 and his father, John "Rube", passed away on June 11 after a long battle with Alzheimers. Chambers underwent arthroplastic surgery, which involved resetting the top of the tibia below the knee to change the angle of the joint. The energetic coach was limited to riding a scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and was on crutches for two months. He began walking short distances without crutches on July 6 and after months of rehab returned to normal mobility in August.

CHAMBERS & THE POST-SEASON: Coach Patrick Chambers missed having a team play in the post-season for the first time in his collegiate coaching career last season and has been a part of the post-season in seven of his eight seasons as a collegiate coach. In his previous five seasons as a member of the Villanova coaching staff and two as head coach at Boston University, all of his teams reached post-season play including six NCAA Tournament appearances and one CBI appearance. Chambers has been a part of 17 NCAA Tournament games, helping Villanova advance to the tournament every year and make four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and reach the 2009 NCAA Final Four. In his first season at BU, he guided the Terriers to their first post-season win since 1959 with a victory in the CBI and the following year led BU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2002.

STAFF TIES: Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Uργο also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Uργο worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

GET ON THE FLOOR: Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices and games to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points" during every practice and game and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor, screen assists, shot contests, tap backs, deflections, etc.

GREAT GRAD RATE

Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent, 24 percent higher than the national average (68%), according to statistical information released by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). The NCAA's annual study of institutions nationwide revealed that Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a GSR of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2002-03 through 2005-06. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (97) and Illinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park student-athletes was 78 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.

CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State, now embarking on its 18th year, when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

- CVC-Penn State has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 17 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.

- The organization raised a record \$215,000 in 2011-12, eclipsing \$200,000 for the third straight year, and has raised more than \$175,000 each of the last six years ranking it among the top 10 CVC organizations in the nation.

- CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a year-round schedule of seven events, which includes the the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk and State College Brew Expo.

- CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last five years and more than \$225,000 total. Funds are also donated directly to the American Cancer Society.

LIONS PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY: All four senior starters from Penn State's 2011 NCAA Tournament team are currently playing professionally in Europe or South America. Penn State currently has 13 former players active in pro leagues around the world, nine of which have graduated in the last five years.

Penn State posted its best shooting and scoring game in Big Ten play to date on the season and got career high scoring games from guards Jermaine Marshall (29) and D.J. Newbill (27) but couldn't over come an MSU team that shot 53 percent in the second half and got a career high 20 points in just 17 minutes of action from Adreian Payne who joined Branden Dawson in sitting out the first half due to a pre-game incident. PSU held MSU to just 29 first half points on 40% shooting, but saw the Spartans explode for 52 in the second half. The Lions led 36-35 with 15:16 to play when Payne took over scoring 16 points in six minutes to give MSU a 54-44 lead with 9:11 to go. Marshall scored 22 and Newbill 18 in the second half as PSU cut a 16-point MSU lead to five, 71-66, with 2:06 to play but could get no closer. The two PSU guards combined to shoot 18-of-30 (60%) and score 56 points as the Lions shot 48% for the game and 19-of-27 at the foul line.
