OMORUYI WITH THE SWAT

Senior center Cliff Omoruyi had been one of the top shot blockers in the nation this season. He has 59 rejections this season, which stands third in the nation and first in the Big Ten in both total and per game (3.11 blocks per game). Omoruyi has 6 more blocks than the second-most in the league (Zach Edey, 53). Omoruyi has had multiple blocks in 15 of the 19 games this season, has eight games of at least four blocks, and two games of at least seven blocks (seven blocks versus Seton Hall and eight blocks versus Illinois). Omoruyi, who had 72 blocks last season (12th all-time at RU in a single season), is sixth all-time at RU in career blocks (187) and is currently 20th on the single-season blocks list for this year. With one more blocks, he will become the first Scarlet Knight with consecutive seasons of 60+ blocks since Hamady Ndiaye (2008-09 and 2009-10).

MAWOT MAG EXCELLING IN RETURN

Senior Mawot Mag saw his excellent 2022-23 season ended early last season, as he suffered a torn ACL in a game against Michigan State in early February. He returned this season on December 9 and has found his footing of late, with four consecutive double-digit scoring performances, including career-highs in his first ever double-double at Iowa (24 points, 10 rebounds). He's averaging a career-best 9.5 points per game.

DEREK SIMPSON STEPPING UP

Sophomore guard Derek Simpson has stepped up his game in year two 'On the Banks'. Averaging 7.1 points last season, he finished the year strong with double-figure scoring in five of the last six games. He amped up that strong scoring last season, averaging 9.4 points per game with nine double-figure scoring games through 16 contests. Simpson has twice this season reached a career-high of 23-points (Howard and at Ohio State). Simpson has shown a knack for clutch shots, hitting the game-winning three-pointer with 12 seconds remaining to defeat Stonehill and banking in a three-pointer to beat the halftime buzzer in the win over Indiana.

AUNDRE HYATT: STEADY SCORING

Senior forward Aundre Hyatt is having a breakthrough campaign in his third season as a Scarlet Knight. He has increased his scoring average each year 'On the Banks', from 4.3 ppg in 2021-22, to 8.8 ppg last season, and now as a full-time starter, playing his most ever minutes, he is leading the team at 12.4 points per game. Hyatt has scored in double-figures in a team-leading 13 of 19 games this season, has scored at least nine points in 15 of the 17 games, and has reached double-figures in his last five games. Since the season

opener, he has scored at least eight points in every game.

STRONG ON 'D'

Rutgers has continued to play the stout defense that head coach Steve Pikiell's teams have been known for. Per KenPom, RU is first nationally in non-steal turnover percentage (11.6), 11th in block percentage (15.1), 10th in adjusted defensive efficiency (93.8), and also in the top-40 in turnover percentage and effective field goal percentage. In the NCAA stats, Rutgers is 16th in blocks per game, second in the Big Ten.

KNIGHTS OF HONOR

Rutgers established "The Knights of Honor" to recognize the best Scarlet Knights men's basketball players in the program's history. Former guard Mike Dabney, forward Hollis Copeland and guard Eddie Jordan were be inducted into the inaugural class in a halftime ceremony during the Jan. 28 Purdue game.

RIP PHIL SELLERS

The Rutgers men's basketball family mourns the loss of Scarlet Knights legend Phil Sellers, who passed away at the age of 69 years old in September. Sellers is Rutgers' all-time scoring and rebounding leader with 2,399 points and 1,115 rebounds and was the leader of the 1975-76 Final Four team. The team is wearing a jersey patch reading "PS - 12" for his jersey number in his memory.

INTERNATIONAL TOUR

Rutgers men's basketball had the opportunity to take a foreign tour this summer, travelling to Senegal and Portugal. During the trip, the team had the opportunity to bond and play against international competition.

In Portugal, the team took in the sights of Lisbon, including a bike tour and kayaking tour in Algarve, and took a catamaran tour departing from Albufeira Marina and sailed from Algarve to Senhora da Rocha. In Senegal, the team went on a safari at the Bandia Reserve, rode camels on Pink Lake, hosted a local basketball clinic and visited the historic Goree Island, known for its role in the Atlantic slave trade.

PIKIELL MILESTONES

Pikiell became the sixth coach in Rutgers history to notch 100 wins at the helm of the Scarlet Knights (Tom Young: 239 wins, Frank Hill: 223 wins, Bob Wenzel: 128 wins, Bill Foster: 120 wins, Donald White: 105 wins). He is now at 127 wins in his career at Rutgers. wins in his Division I coaching career, one away from tying Wenzel.

Rutgers is right back at Jersey Mike's Arena on Wednesday night, as the team will host a late-night meeting with Penn State (8:30 p.m., Big Ten Network). Rutgers will face Penn State, looking for their fourth straight win over Penn State.

Wednesday's game has been declared as a Stripe Out. Fans are encouraged to wear red or white based on their seat location. All fans located in an EVEN section of Jersey Mike's Arena are encouraged to wear WHITE, and all fans located in ODD sections are encouraged to wear RED.

About Rutgers

Rutgers stands at 10-9 overall and 2-6 in the league following a Sunday afternoon battle with No. 2 Purdue. The Scarlet Knights shot 50 percent in the second half (15-of-30 from the field and 4-of-8 from long-range), and outrebounded the visitors, 36-32, but were unable to overcome a 13-point halftime deficit after the team shot just 9-of-34 (26%) from the field and 0-of-8 from three-point range before the intermission. Despite reigning national Player of the Year Zach Edey posting 26 points, RU's defense did a good job, including limiting Purdue's second leading scorer, Lance Jones, to 1-of-10 shooting and holding the nation's number 7 scoring offense to their second-lowest mark of the season, along with their lowest rebounding total. RU held a 15-6 margin on the offensive boards but had a season-low one block. The Scarlet Knights took just their second home loss of the season, falling to 2-5 since the 2024 calendar year, 5-8 since the team's 5-1 start, and 4-8 against Power 6 league teams this season.

In the national rankings, Rutgers is in the top-30 in blocks (16th, 5.3 bpg), offensive rebounds (27th, 13.21) and turnover margin (30th, 3.5). The Scarlet Knights are in the top-three in the league stats in those statistical categories, along with turnovers forced (second, 15.05), field goal percentage defense (second, 40.2%), scoring defense (third, 66.6) and rebounds (third, 39.00). Per KenPom, the Scarlet Knights have the top non-steal turnover percentage in the nation (first at 11.6), and are 10th in adjusted efficiency (93.8) and 11th in block percentage (15.1).

Rutgers is 9-2 this season at home. The Scarlet Knights are 23-8 at home over the past two seasons, 33-12 at home over the past three seasons and 51-13 at home over the past four seasons.

Milestone Tracker

Cliff Omoruyi (850 career rebounds) needs 10 rebounds to tie Hollis Copeland for 6th all-time at RU and 20 rebounds to tie Roy Hinson for fifth all-time at RU.

Omoruyi (1,126) is within striking distance of Don Parsons (1,140,

30th), Steve Kaplan (1,154, 29th) and Bob Graecen (1,154, 28th) on RU's all-time scoring list.

Omoruyi has 59 blocks this season. With one more block, he moves into 19th on RU's single season list, and can move into a tie for 18th with two blocks.

With his next block, he will become the first Scarlet Knight with consecutive seasons of 60+ blocks since Hamady Ndiaye (2008-09 and 2009-10).

About Penn State

Under first-year head coach Mike Rhoades, Penn State holds a 9-11 overall record and 3-6 Big Ten record. Rhoades took the helm at PSU following a six-year stint at VCU, where he made three NCAA appearances and had a 129-60 record.

Penn State holds a ranked win (at home over Wisconsin), but that is their only win in their last five games. PSU is 2-5 since the start of the month and 5-11 since November 17. As a team, PSU leads the Big Ten in steals, turnover margin and turnovers forced.

Sophomore Kayne Clary leads the team at 18.4 points per game (fifth in the Big Ten) after scoring just 3.7 points per game as a freshman for the Nittany Lions last season. Ace Baldwin, who was a two-time all-conference pick, including the A-10 Player and Defensive Player of the Year last season for Rhoades at VCU, averaged 13.2 points and has a team-high 97 assists. Baldwin is sixth nationally with 2.75 steals per game (first in the league). Georgetown/Maryland transfer Qudus Wahab averages 9.3 points and a team-high 7.9 rebounds. Puff Johnson, a UNC transfer, is first nationally in turnover rate per KenPom.

Series Info

Penn State leads the all-time series, 44-37, against the Nittany Lions. Rutgers has won the past three games against the Nittany Lions. The 37 wins over PSU is fourth most wins for the program against any one foe, and most over any Big Ten team (behind just Lehigh, Lafayette and Princeton).

In the last meeting, coming at the end of February last season at the Bryce Jordan Center, Rutgers men's basketball pulled off one of the biggest comebacks in school history on Sunday night in Happy Valley. Propelled by a career-high 16 points from freshman guard Derek Simpson, RU had a 19-point comeback to beat Penn State 59-56. The victory marked the biggest comeback win at RU since 1996. RU is 4-3 in the last seven games against Penn State and 7-8 against PSU as conference foes since joining the Big Ten in 2015.

With A Win

- Head coach Steve Pikiell would earn his 128th win as the head coach of Rutgers, tying Bob Wenzel for the third most wins of any Rutgers' men's basketball head coach.
- Improving to 10-2 this season at home, 24-8 over the past two seasons, 33-12 over the past here seasons and 52-13 over the past four seasons.
- Four straight wins against PSU.
- 38 wins all-time against Penn State and 5-3 in the last eight games against the Nittany Lions.

Up Next

Following the two-game home swing, Rutgers' returns to the road for the first time since January 21 with two straight games away from the friendly confines of Jersey Mike's Arena. RU plays next at Michigan (Saturday February 3, 4 pm at the Crisler Center) and Maryland (Tuesday, February 6, 6:30 p.m. at the XFINITY Center).

BIG CLIFF: SHOT BLOCKER

Cliff Omoruyi has made his presence felt on the defensive end as one of the nation's top shot blockers.

Big Cliff had a highly decorated season in 2022-23, when he was selected to First-Team All-Big Ten Defensive Team and to the Second-Team All-Big Ten (media). Omoruyi 2.1 blocks last season, and his 72 blocks on the year were good for 15th in the nation and third in the Big Ten. This season, he has continued to improve on the defensive end and put up even gaudier numbers as he has announced himself as one of the premier shot blockers in the nation.

Since Steve Pikiell has taken the helm of the Scarlet Knights program, the team has 15 wins over ranked foes. He has defeated four top-10 teams in that span, and twice has defeated the nation's top ranked squad, No. 1 Purdue, both home and on the road.

Dating back to the availability of rankings in 1974, Rutgers has 48 lifetime ranked wins. Between 2005 and 2015, Rutgers had just nine ranked wins before Pikiell earned 15 in a six-season span.

ACE BAILEY

The 6-foot-8 185-pound forward is ranked as high as the No. 2 player in the entire 2024 high school class and is set to go down as the highest recruit in the University's history. Bailey is the best player in the 2024 class out of the state of Georgia. Bailey is the highest-ranked recruit in the Pikiell era and officially tops Mike Rosario (No. 16) as the top recruit in school history. Current Scarlet Knights guard Jamichael Davis goes back to childhood with Bailey and the two played together alongside each other in high school at McEachern and AAU at Athletes of Tomorrow. Their McEachern High School team finished 23-7 last season and 8-0 in their region, which was good for first place and was one of the best teams in the state. Bailey's decision to join RU was a top-12 that consisted of Tennessee, Auburn, Georgia, Kentucky, Alabama, Memphis, Oregon, Arkansas, Kansas, West Virginia, and South Carolina before choosing Rutgers.

BRYCE DORTCH

Dortch is a 6-foot-8, 190-pound forward from Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts. Dortch is ranked 144th nationally by 24/7Sports and the 32nd-best forward in the nation. On3.com ranks Dortch as the 52nd-best forward and the 6th-best player out of Massachusetts. Rivals ranked Dortch as 41st at his position.

DYLAN GRANT

Grant is a 6-foot-7, 205-pound forward from Mississauga, Canada. Grant moved to Warren, Michigan to compete at the high school level. Grant quickly became one of the best players in the state of Michigan at Michigan Collegiate High School and is currently ranked as the No. 1 player in all of Michigan in the class according to On3.com.

He is ranked as high as No. 87 nationally in the country by ESPN and is ranked the No. 3 player in Illinois by 247Sports. ESPN ranks Sommerville as the tenth-best center in the nation. He is ranked a top-115 player in the nation.

FUTURE KNIGHTS SHINE AT THE BATTLE

A pair of future Scarlet Knights showed out at Jersey Mike's Arena in front of a RU-crowd.

Center Lathan Sommerville (Richwoods High School) and forward Ace Bailey (MacEachern High School) combined for 68 points, 29 rebounds and two victories in Piscataway in their respective games in The Battle for New Jersey Showcase.

Sommerville, the six-foot-nine center kicked off the day for Richwoods High School with 28 points, eight rebounds, four blocks, and three assists in the 81-71 victory over College Achieve (Asbury Park, N.J.). Sommerville had both of his parents, some future teammates from the 2023-24 Rutgers men's basketball squad, and more in attendance.

"It meant a lot," Sommerville said. "It felt amazing to play in front of my family and some future teammates. Just to get out there and play with my team meant a lot."

Sommerville shot 10-15 from the field, made three of five three-point attempts, and flashed some elite ball-handling for a 225-pound player in transition. The Peoria, Ill. native broke down a defender on a crossover and finished at the basket for a highlight reel play.

"I shot the ball well, especially in the first half and then I slowed down a little bit," Sommerville said. "I got a little frustrated with the calls, but then once I started moving on, it got better. The shots started falling again, and we ended up winning the game."

Bailey followed up that elite performance with one of his own. The Chattanooga, Tenn. native scored a game-high 40 points and collected 21 rebounds in MacEachern's blowout victory over Camden.

Bailey's performance led to the crowd of over 4,000 chanting "R-U" and he received a standing ovation as he stood at midcourt. "It felt great to have them watching me," Bailey said. "Just me coming out here and doing what I'm doing and feeling their energy. Playing with Lathan Sommerville and the rest of that crew will be dope. It's going to be crazy, we're going to try to bring us a national championship."

Bailey didn't waste any time getting acquainted with his future home. The 6-foot-10 forward rushed to the hoop and his first basketball was an emphatic slam dunk.

"I thought my first basketball was going to be a three," Bailey laughed. "But when I got there, I knew it would be a good night. I made that going to the hole and then I knew it was going to be a good night."

It was a good night indeed and Bailey flashed phenomenal rebounding-ability, long-range shooting from the Jersey Mike's Arena logo, and energy that ignited all of the crowd in attendance.

Bailey said it meant the world to him to put on a show for Rutgers Nation and was especially excited to play in front of his childhood friend and high school teammate, Jamichael Davis, current point guard for RU. Bailey had his entire family at the game, his AAU coaches, and even former Rutgers great Ron Harper Jr. in attendance.

"Since I saw I was playing in Jersey, I just knew I had to put on a show for the people man," Bailey said. "I had to. It's a blessing just to come out here and play in front of a crowd like this. J-Mike coming to watch me play and me coming to watch him tomorrow just feels great man it's a family thing."

Both Bailey and Sommerville signed their National Letters of Intent during the early signing period and join forward Dylan Grant and forward Bryce Dortch as official members of the 2024-25 class.

- Selected to First-Team All-Big Ten Defensive Team and to the Second-Team All-Big Ten (media)
- Named First Team All-MET
- Honored as a 2021-22 Big Ten Honorable Mention and was selected to the 2021-22 Big Ten's Sportsmanship Team.

MAWOT MAG

- Forward played in 40 games in first two seasons as a Scarlet Knight, making two starts.
- Has battled through injuries, both in high school and college
- In starting lineup for first 23 games last season, averaging 7.3 points and 5.3 rebounds with a steal-per game.
- Suffered torn ACL vs. Michigan State in February of 2023 and was out for the remainder of the season - returned on Dec. 9 vs. Seton Hall

- During his last full season in 2021-22, Fernandes averaged a team-high 14.9 points and 5.3 assists for the Minutemen, while shooting 43.5 percent from the field.
- Prior to RU, scored 738 points and has 275 assists in his college basketball career and shot 37.3 percent from three-point range and 46.6 percent from the field in his four-year career.

GAVIN GRIFFITHS

- 6-foot-8, 193-pound wing who joins the Knighthood for his first season in Piscataway as a true freshman.
- Griffiths was ranked the No. 20 recruit in the country (247 Sports), marking the highest-ranked player landed in the Steve Pikiell-era and the second-highest recruit to attend RU in the modern era.
- Only former Rutgers guard Mike Rosario was ranked higher at the time of his recruitment (2008).

EMMANUEL OGBOLE

- 6-foot-10, 260-pound center from Aune-Adoka, Nigeria who joins RU following one season at the junior college level with Monroe College.

- At Monroe College, played in 24 games, averaged 12.3 points per game and 8.2 rebounds per game.

- Shot 69.3 percent from the field last season (124-179) to lead team.
- His field goal percentage last season was good for sixth in the nation in junior college.

AUSTIN WILLIAMS

- A New Jersey native, guard Austin Williams joins Rutgers for his final season of collegiate basketball. He has previously played at FIU (2022-23), Hartford (2019-22) and Marist (2017-19).
- In his career, he has played in 111 games, starting 54, and averaged 9.8 points, 4.0 rebounds and 1.8 assists. He has scored over 1,000 points for his collegiate career.
- Last year, he joined Florida International University (FIU) for the 2022-23 season, but sat out due to a knee injury
- Most recently was a two-time all-league selection at Hartford, averaging 15.1 points per game over the two seasons

JEREMIAH WILLIAMS

- A 6-foot-4, 177-pound guard from Chicago, Illinois, he is joining the Knighthood for the 2023-24 season.
- Williams will enter his fourth collegiate season, following two seasons (2020-21 and 2021-22) at Temple and spending the 2022-23 season on the roster of Iowa State.
- The Chicago native will need to receive a waiver from the NCAA to play this season as a second-time undergrad transfer.

AIDEN TERRY

- Fourth-season preferred walk-on who runs the scout team in practices and specializes in mimicking the opponent's best guard.
- Made first career three-pointer against Minnesota in 2022-23 season on his birthday.

JACOB MORALES

- Joined the Knighthood as a walk-on during the 2022-23 season.
- A 6-foot-4, 205-pound guard from Montvale, N.J., he joined the Scarlet Knights after a successful season at Springfield College where he started 17 games and averaged 11.8 points and 5.5 rebounds per game.

DANIEL VESSEY

- Vessey, a 6-foot-3, 190-pound guard, joins team as a freshman walk-on after graduating from The Hun School of Princeton in Princeton, N.J.
- Forgoed scholarship offer from Army to join hometown Scarlet Knights as a preferred walk-on.
- Was named Trentonian Prep Player of the Year by the Times of Trenton after scoring 1,253 points in his high school career.

ZACH HAYN

- 5-foot-10, 195-pound guard joins the Scarlet Knights as a graduate student following a three-season career at Hartwick College.
- Son of Rutgers men's basketball Chief of Staff Steve Hayn, who has been on Steve Pikiell's coaching staff for the last seven seasons.
- Played three seasons at Division III Hartwick College where he saw action in 39 games, scoring 64 points on 33.3% shooting and added 47 rebounds, 28 assists and 14 steals.



STEVE PIKIELL

Head Coach • Eighth Season at Rutgers, 19th Season Overall

A father of four who has led the resurgence of Rutgers Basketball, both on and off the court, Steve Pikiell enters his eighth season as head coach of the Scarlet Knights in 2023-24. Under Pikiell's leadership, the team returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2021, making its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1991. The Scarlet Knights returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2022, marking the first time RU has made the big dance in consecutive seasons since 1976. In 2022, Pikiell surpassed Tom Young with the most ranked

wins in school history (15). In 2023, the Scarlet Knights became the first team in RU history to reach postseason play in three consecutive seasons. Alongside, the fourth straight season with double-digit victories in conference play.

With over 30 years of coaching experience, the Bristol, Conn. native is under contract to remain courtside at the RAC through 2030-31 under a recently signed contract extension. The 19th head coach in the history of Rutgers men's basketball, Pikiell has been instrumental in turnarounds throughout his playing and coaching career that has resulted in conference championships and NCAA berths. Pikiell received his 100th career victory at Rutgers and 300th career victory during the 2022-23 season.

The 2022-23 Season

- Led RU to 14th-ranked victory with a 63- 48 win over No. 8 Indiana in the first Big Ten game of the season.
- Defeated No. 1 Purdue on the road 65-64 for second- straight win over No. 1 in 2 seasons and RU's best 15 ranked wins.
- Picked up his 100th career victory at Rutgers and 300th career victory overall during the 2022-23 season.
- Led RU to three straight postseason berths for the first time in school history.
- Had all five starters get Big Ten Postseason Award recognition for the second- straight season.
- Had his second Lefty Driesell National Defensive Player of the Year in Caleb McConnell and McConnell went on to win the ESPN National Defensive Player of the Year.
- Signed No. 20 ranked (247 Sports) Gavin Griffiths, the highest-ranked recruit in his tenure as head coach at Rutgers.

The 2021-22 Season

- NCAA Tournament appearance for second straight season

The 2020-21 Season

- Recipient of the Peter A. Carlesimo Award, presented by the Met Basketball Writers Association to the top coach in the Metropolitan Area. Pikiell earned the accolade for the second straight season and became the first coach to win the accolade from the MBWA four times in his career.
- Led the program to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1991.
- Guided the Scarlet Knights to an opening round victory over No. 7 seed Clemson that marked RU's first NCAA Tournament win since 1983.
- The Scarlet Knights' win over No. 7 seed Clemson in the opening round marked the highest seeded team defeated in the NCAA Tournament since 1979, before falling to an eventual Final Four team in No. 2 seed Houston.
- While facing a strength of schedule ranked as the second toughest in the nation by ESPN.com, Rutgers went 16-12 overall, ensuring back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in 29 years.
- Under Pikiell's leadership, Rutgers won 10 Big Ten Conference games, and has earned 21 Big Ten wins over the past two seasons. RU finished tied for sixth in the nation's top-rated conference.
- The team spent 11 weeks nationally ranked or receiving votes in the AP Poll, peaking at No. 11 in the nation.
- In the regular season, RU earned wins over five teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament - No. 1 seed Illinois, No. 4 seed Purdue, No. 10 seed Maryland, No. 11 seed Michigan State and No. 11 seed Syracuse.

The 2019-20 Season

- Recipient of the 2019-20 Jim Phelan Award, presented annually to the nation's top Division I coach, and Peter A. Carlesimo Award, presented by the Met Basketball Writers Association to the top coach in the Metropolitan Area
- Was one of 15 coaches on the Naismith Coach of the Year Late 2020 Season Watch List.
- Rutgers joined the rankings for the first time in 41 years, since the final 1978-79 AP Poll (No. 18).
- The Scarlet Knights were No. 24/25 & No. 25/25 in the Jan. 20 & 27 polls, respectively. RU was ranked or receiving votes for eight weeks. -
- RU captured its first 20-win regular season in 37 years, since 1982-83, and first 20-win season overall since 2003-04 and had first winning season in 14 years, since 2005-06 (19-14).
- Led Scarlet Knights to most conference victories (11) in 29 years, since 1990-91 (14-4; A-10), while also posting its first winning league record in 29 years
- Secured the most home regular season wins in the nation (18) and set a program record for home wins in a season.
- Tied for fifth in the Big Ten Conference, the nation's top-rated league per Ken Pomeroy, after being selected 12th in the preseason media poll.

- Has welcomed four-star signees from New Jersey in three consecutive

- Has welcomed four-star classes, with Cliff Omoruyi (2020) joining Paul Mulcahy (2019) and Ron Harper, Jr. (2018) in electing to stay home.

The 2018-19 Season

- Rutgers was recognized as the nation's Most Improved Team by Sports Illustrated. The Scarlet Knights improved 70 positions in the KenPom.com rankings, best among all Power conference programs.
- Led Rutgers to seven league victories, its most in conference play in 13 years, while competing with a roster ranked 330th in experience. Projected to finish 14th in the preseason, Rutgers tied for 10th in the Big Ten standings.
- Rutgers' schedule ranked 31st nationally in difficulty per Ken Pom, toughest among all New York Metro programs. 61 percent (19/31) of games were against opponents that earned 2019 NCAA Championship (15) or National Invitation Tournament (4) berths.
- Rutgers concluded its season 75th in the KenPom ratings, the program's best rank since concluding its 2005-06 campaign at No. 71.
- With wins over No. 16 Ohio State and at No. 22 Iowa, the Scarlet Knights earned victories over two ranked league opponents for the first time since 2007-08.
- Rutgers had five sell-outs at the RAC, its most since 2004-05 (7) and average attendance improved 31.1%.
- Welcomed a four-recruit signing class that included multiple four-star players for the first time at Rutgers since 2008.

The 2017-18 Season

- Rutgers advanced to the Big Ten Conference quarterfinals at Madison Square Garden via wins over Minnesota and five-time national champion Indiana. It marked the first time RU won two conference tournament games since 1998.
- Despite playing the 2nd toughest conference schedule in the Big Ten according to Ken Pom analysis for the second straight year, Rutgers ranked 17th nationally in both scoring defense (64.8) and offensive rebounding (13.15), while placing 27th in 3-point FG% defense (27.0).
- The Scarlet Knights ranked among the top three in the Big Ten in eight statistical categories, including leading the league in offensive rebounding and 3-point FG% defense. RU accomplished these improvements while playing 10 games against programs that advanced to the round of 32 in the NCAA Tournament.
- Defeated No. 15 Seton Hall 71-65 before 8,318 fans at the RAC on Dec. 16, 2017 in the annual Garden State Hardwood Classic. Rutgers was honored as the NABC D-I National Team of the Week for its win over the Pirates.
- Rutgers enjoyed multiple home sell-outs at the RAC in the same season for the first time since 2011. The 8,325 attendance vs. Purdue (Feb. 3, 2108) was the largest at the RAC in 15 years.

The 2016-17 Season

- Began tenure with a 9-1 start, the best head-coaching debut in Rutgers men's basketball history.
- The Scarlet Knights more than doubled their overall win total, while tripling their conference victory total.
- Rutgers achieved a plus-117 rank improvement in RPI, as well as major NCAA ranking improvements in rebound margin (+299), scoring defense (+272), three point FG defense (+247), offensive rebounds (+244), rebounds (+232), field goal percentage defense (+226) and blocks (+114).
- The Scarlet Knights ranked among the top 100 in 10 NCAA statistical categories, including among the top 50 in seven, after ranking among the top 150 in just two statistical categories in 2015-16.
- Posted an undefeated home mark in non-conference play and jumped-out to a 6-0 record, the sixth-best undefeated start in the 110-year history of the program.
- Played 17 games, 52% of its schedule, against programs that earned NCAA (13) or NIT (4) bids.
- Rutgers out-rebounded opponents in 11 of 18 conference games, after winning the boards in just three league contests the prior year.
- Ten Big Ten games were decided in single digits after suffering 15 conference losses by double digits in 2015-16.

In the Classroom and Community

- The program earned a 3.537 GPA in the spring semester, highest ever
- The team GPA for the 2019-20 academic year was 3.237
- 100% of the roster earned a 3.0 in the 2020 spring semester, with nine posting a 3.5 or better, and 11 student-athletes holding a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better.
- In the NCAA Graduate Success Rate (GSR) report, the team achieved a score of 80. The score ranked seventh among Big Ten Conference programs and was 60 points ahead of the national average.
- The team's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score was 984, which ranked fifth among Big Ten programs.
- Program has maintained 100% team participation in Rutgers Leadership Development community service initiatives during his tenure.
- The team has sponsored charity exhibitions, hosted youth clinics, volunteered at Elijah's Promise Soup Kitchen in New Brunswick, participated in the SAAC Holiday Toy Giveaway, visited children at RWJBarnabas Health facilities around the state and participates annually in the Tunnel to Towers 5K Run.

Prior to Rutgers:

- Led Stony Brook to six postseason appearances over seven years and was the 2016 America East Conference Coach of the Year.
- During his tenure, the Seawolves won four America East regular season championships, achieved 22 or more victories on six occasions and captured five conference player of the year awards.
- A four-time America East Coach of the Year, compiled a 119-48 (.713) record over his final five seasons at Stony Brook.
- Served as an assistant at George Washington under Karl Hobbs from 2001-05. In 2004-05, the Colonials earned 22 wins, their most since 1997-98 and the second most in 50 years, en route to a top 20 ranking. The team won its first Atlantic 10 title, earning an automatic NCAA Tournament bid.
- Prior to GW, served as an assistant at Central Connecticut State (1997-01) which, before his arrival, had never posted a winning season at the Division I level. During his tenure at CCSU, the Blue Devils notched an 81-63 (.563) record, including a 25-6 mark in 1999-2000 and a bid to the 2000 NCAA tournament. It marked the school's first NCAA berth.
- After one season with the New Haven Skyhawks of the USBL (1992), spent three years as an assistant at Yale (1992-95). Moved on to take over as interim head coach at Wesleyan, a Division III school in Middletown, Conn. for one year.
- Began his coaching career at UConn in 1991-92 with a roster that featured future NBA players Donyell Marshall, Chris Smith, Scott Burrell, Donny Marshall and Kevin Ollie.

- Brooke played college basketball at Northwestern.
- Olivia currently plays college women's lacrosse at North Carolina.
- John Patrick plans on graduating with his master's degree from Rutgers University this year.
- Kevin is a high school basketball player and has already received D-1 offers.
- A 1990 graduate of Connecticut with a bachelor's degree in finance, one of nine children who grew up with three brothers and five sisters.
