### QUICK HITTERS

• Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware**, an All-Big Ten Second Team selection by the conference's voting media members, leads the Hoosiers in points per game (16.1), rebounds (9.8), and blocked shots (1.9). He is one of five major conference players this season to average at least 15.0 points, 9.0 rebounds, and 1.5 blocked shots per game. Ware was also named to the league's All-Defensive Team.

• Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako**, the B1G Co-Freshman of the Year, is one of seven major conference freshmen this season to average at least 12.0 points per game and make 45 3-pointers. The Hoosiers are the first team since Michigan State in 2017-18 to earn Freshman of the Year in consecutive seasons in the Big Ten.

• Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** earned All-Big Ten Honorable Mention status by both the coaches and media of the Big Ten. He has upped his scoring average from 6.1 points per game to 15.7 (9.6-point increase) from his freshman to sophomore campaigns.

• Senior guard **Trey Galloway** leads the Hoosiers in assists (143) and steals (36) this season.

**COACH BOB KNIGHT PASSES AWAY AT 83**

Bob Knight, one of the most successful and influential figures in the history college basketball, passed away on Nov. 1, 2023 surrounded by family and friends. He was 83 years old.

Knight's coaching accomplishments are legendary. He went 902-371 during a 42-year head coaching career that included stops at Army (1966-71), Indiana (1972-2000), and Texas Tech (2002-08). Those 902 wins ranked No. 1 all-time when he retired in 2008, and currently ranks sixth. He was a four-time National Coach of the Year, a five-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, and was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame (1991), the College Basketball Hall of Fame (2006), and the IU Athletics Hall of Fame (2009).

While he enjoyed tremendous success at each of his three head coaching stops, he became a larger-than-life figure in the sport thanks to his accomplishments in Bloomington. Hired by IU at the age of 30 in 1971, he led the program to three NCAA titles (1976, 1981, 1987), five Final Fours (1973, 1976, 1981, 1987, 1992), and 11 Big Ten Regular Season Championships (1973-76, 1980-81, 1983, 1987, 1989, 1991, 1993) in his 29 years as head coach. Knight's 1976 team, which went 32-0 on its way to the NCAA title, remains the most recent to go undefeated on its way to an NCAA title. His 1975 and 1976 teams, meanwhile, each went undefeated (18-0) in Big Ten play, and no Big Ten team has gone undefeated in a single season in league play since. Indiana's 37 consecutive Big Ten wins during that period also established a new conference standard that has never been seriously threatened.

Knight's dominance at IU stretched through all three decades that he coached in Bloomington. The 1970s included four Big Ten titles, two Final Fours, and one of the greatest teams in college basketball history with the undefeated 1976 national champions. As great as the 1970s were, the 1980s were even better. College basketball's most successful team during the decade, Knight's teams captured two NCAA titles and five Big Ten championships. In the 1990s, the Hoosiers won two more league crowns, advanced to another Final Four, earned 10 NCAA tourney bids, and four straight Sweet 16 trips. The 1990s also featured one of Knight's greatest teams to not win an NCAA title, as the 1993 team went 17-1 in the Big Ten, was the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, and featured four players that would eventually be first-round NBA Draft picks.

In addition to his accomplishments representing Indiana University, Knight also enjoyed similar success on the international level. He assembled and coached arguably the greatest amateur men's basketball team in history, as he led the 1984 U.S. Olympic team to a gold medal in Los Angeles, and guided the U.S. team to the 1979 Pan American Games gold as well.

While his teams excelled on the court, Knight's student-athletes also embodied what it meant to be a student-athlete. During his IU coaching career, 98 percent of his four-year players earned their degrees.

Besides being one of the sport's most successful coaches, Knight was also one of the most innovative. He revolutionized and popularized the 'motion offense,' an offensive style originally credited to one of Knight's mentors, Henry Iba. Unlike traditional 'set' offensive plays, the motion offense relied on player movement, proper spacing, passing, cutting, and screening to create scoring opportunities. It's a style of play that became synonymous with Knight and his IU teams, and it remains very much a staple of many of the game's most successful coaches to this day. Defensively, Knight was equally committed to a single style, as he had a deeply-rooted belief in the merits of the man-to-man defense.

The successes of both styles were enormous throughout his IU tenure, as his Hoosier teams were traditionally one of the Big Ten's most efficient offensively and one of the most difficult to score against defensively. As a result, Indiana won 73.5 percent of its games during Knight's tenure, the best among all Big Ten programs during that period. IU also earned 24 invitations to the NCAA Tournament during his 29 years, going 42-21 (.667) in those games. Overall, 28 of Knight's 29 IU teams earned postseason invitations.

While Knight's system and his unwavering belief in those coaching philosophies were a big part of his success at IU, an even more important component of his success was the abundance of exceptional student-athletes that he attracted to and developed in Bloomington.

In all, Knight coached nine Big Ten MVPs and 27 All-Americans at IU. His first Big Ten MVP was Steve Downing, who earned the honor in 1973 after leading Knight's second Hoosier team to the program's first Big Ten title in six years and its first Final Four trip in 20 seasons. The next to win the award was Scott May, the Big Ten's MVP in both 1975 and 1976 who also became Knight's first National Player of the Year in 1976. Calbert Cheaney became Knight's second National Player of the Year in 1993 after guiding IU to a Big Ten title, an Elite Eight berth, and becoming the Big Ten's all-time leading scorer with 2,613 points, a mark that stands to this day.

The list of Knight's legendary IU players doesn't end there. Far from it. Quinn Buckner was a two-time All-American, a three-time Big Ten champion, an Olympic gold medalist, and a future NBA champion whom Knight often referenced as the greatest leader in program history. Isiah Thomas was a 1981 All-American who guided IU to the NCAA title that same season before going on to a Hall of Fame and championship professional career with the NBA's Detroit Pistons. Steve Alford was a Big Ten MVP and two-time All-American who led the 1987 team to an NCAA title. And current IU coach Mike Woodson was a two-time All-American and 1980 Big Ten MVP who was Knight's first IU player to score 2,000 career points.

Knight was born on Oct. 25, 1940, in Orrville, Ohio. A multi-sport standout at Orrville H.S., Knight played basketball at Ohio State for Hall of Fame Coach Fred Taylor from 1958-62. A key reserve on those Buckeye teams, Knight played alongside future Hall of Famers John Havlicek and Jerry Lucas and helped OSU to the 1960 NCAA title and NCAA runner-up finishes in both 1961 and 1962.

After graduating from Ohio State in 1962, Knight spent one year coaching high school basketball at Cuyahoga Falls (Ohio) H.S. before enlisting in the Army in 1963. While in the Army, Knight accepted an assistant coaching position with the men's basketball team, and two years later was promoted to head coach at the age of 24. He went 102-50 in six years with the program and earned four NIT invitations before IU Athletic Director Bill Orwig announced his hiring as IU's new head coach on March 27, 1971.

Well, I don't know that we will ever see another coach like him again. I think it's important for people to realize that. It was a special opportunity to have been coached by him, and an equally special opportunity to have him as a friend. Because as great a coach as he was, he was an infinitely better friend. He's a big part of who we are, and we were very fortunate to have had him in our lives."

His influence will continue to be felt through them for generations to come. I want to extend my deepest condolences to Karen, Tim, Pat, and the entire Knight family. The world of basketball lost a great one today. There won't be another one like him."

"I will always cherish the time we spent together after I played for him. His fierce loyalty to his former players never wavered. I am grateful that he was able to come to our practices after I came back. His presence meant so much to me, our staff, and our players."



# NOTABLES

## OPENING TIP

Indiana University will open play in the 2024 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament on Thursday, March 14, against the 11-seeded Penn State Nittany Lions. Tip is tentatively set for 8 p.m. CT from the Target Center in Minneapolis. The game will carry a BTN broadcast.

- Indiana head coach **Mike Woodson** has led the Hoosiers to the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament in each of his first two trips to the postseason event. Woodson holds a record of 3-2 in the Big Ten Tournament.

## SERIES HISTORY

- Indiana holds a 42-17 series lead over Penn State State. The two sides met in the semifinals round of the 2023 Big Ten Championship. PSU advanced on the strength of a 77-73 result.

- The Nittany Lions, led by head coach Mike Rhoades, swept the season series with an 85-71 victory at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall in Bloomington on Feb. 3, and an 83-74 result at the Bryce Jordan Center in University Park on Feb. 24.

- PSU guard Ace Baldwin Jr. averaged 22.5 points, 8.5 assists, and 3.0 steals in the two games. The sophomore tandem up front of **Malik Reneau** and **Kel'el Ware** averaged 42.0 points, 15.0 rebounds, and shot 63.8% (30-of-47) from the floor.

## LAST TIME OUT

- The Hoosiers jumped out to a commanding 20-5 lead on Michigan State in the first seven minutes before holding on for a 65-64 to close the regular season on a four-game winning streak on March 10.

- Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** racked up his second 25-point, 10-rebound game in as many outings with a team-high 28 points, 11 rebounds, and two blocked shots. He hit the go-ahead free throw with 17 seconds left.

- Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** (16 points) and freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** (13) combined to tally 29 points, 11 rebounds, and six assists.

## BIG MAN TRANSFORMATION

- Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware**, a transfer from Oregon, has upped his scoring (from 6.6 points to 16.1), rebounds (4.1 to 9.8), assists (0.5 to 1.5), and field goal percentage (45.7% to 59.9%) in his second season. He leads the Hoosiers in points, rebounds, and blocks in 32 minutes per game.

- The North Little Rock, Ark., native was voted All-Big Ten Second Team by the conference media, All-Big Ten Third Team by the coaches, and selected to the All-Big Ten Defensive Team.

- Ware has scored at least 10 points in 23 games this year after producing just eight such games as a rookie. The 7-footer has ripped down at least 10 boards 15 times this season, including four games over 15 boards.

- In 18 conference games, Ware is averaging a team-best 16.9 points on 63.2% (127-of-201) shooting from the floor and 50.0% (12-of-24) from the 3-point line. He is also averaging 10.6 rebounds and 2.0 blocks per night. He finished the season as one of two players (Zach Edey, Purdue) to average a double-double in B1G play.

- Against Northwestern, Ware posted 22 points, 16 rebounds, and four blocked shots. He is one of seven players across Division I hoops this season to produce a line with at least 20 points, 15 rebounds, and four blocks.

- Ware tallied 27 points, 11 rebounds, and a career-high five blocked shots against Wisconsin on Feb. 27 to become just the second Division I player to post a 25-point, 10-rebound, 5-block game this season. He made 11-of-12 shots in the contest.

## MACK ATTACK

- Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako**, the Co-Freshman of the Year in the Big Ten, has made a team-high 49 3-pointers on 34.3% shooting this season. Over the last seven games he is averaging 16.4 points on .459/.409/.704 shooting splits.

- The consensus top-10 recruit is averaging 13.6 points and 3.9 rebounds per game in Big Ten play, both figures rank third on the Hoosiers. He has reached double figures in the scoring column in 22 of the last 25 games and scored at least 20 points in three of his last seven starts.

- The Roselle Catholic graduate scored 20 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the floor against Northwestern (Feb. 18). Three days later against Nebraska (Feb. 21), Mgbako posted 22 points to go along with seven rebounds. He posted his first career double-double with 12 points and a career-high 12 rebounds at No. 10/11 Illinois (Jan. 27). Mgbako added a career-best 24 points at Maryland (March 3) on 4-of-8 shooting from the 3-point line.

- Among freshmen in the Big Ten, Mgbako closed the regular season first in total points (377), points per game (12.2), 20-point games (3), and free throws made (82), second in made 3-pointers (49), and third in total rebounds (123).

## FOLLOW THE GALLO-WAY

- Senior guard **Trey Galloway** finished the regular season as one of seven players in the Big Ten to average at least 10.0 points, 4.5 assists, and 1.0 steal per game. He joins A.J. Hoggard (Michigan State), Braden Smith (Purdue), Boo Buie (Northwestern), Ace Baldwin Jr. (Penn State), Tony Perkins (Iowa), and Dug McDaniel (Michigan) on the exclusive list.

- Galloway has dished out 105 total assists (5.3 per game) in Big Ten play to go against just 44 turnovers (2.39 assist-to-turnover ratio). He tied for second (Bobby Wilkerson, 1975-76) on the IU single-season Big Ten assists list with 105, and finished behind only Quinn Buckner (106) from the 1974-75 season.

- He handed out a career-high 12 helpers against Northwestern (Feb. 18) and Wisconsin (Feb. 27) to become the first Hoosier since Hall of Famer Isiah Thomas (1980-81) to dish out 12-plus assists in multiple games in a single season. For his career, the Hoosiers are 15-6 in the 21 games 'Gallo' has handed out at least five dimes.

- He is averaging a career-best 10.6 points per game, including a career-high 28 points against No. 2/2 Kansas (Dec. 16). He converted 12-of-17 shots in the contest. He scored a Big Ten career-high 25 points (19 in the second half) at Ohio State (Feb. 6) while leading IU to an 18-point comeback victory.

- Galloway announced his intentions to utilize his COVID season and return to the Indiana basketball program during his Senior Night speech to Hoosier Nation.

## SOPHOMORE JUMP FOR RENEAU

- Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** has posted double digits in the scoring column in 25 games this season, including 17 efforts of at least 15 points and seven 20-point nights. He notched a career-high 34 points against Kennesaw State (Dec. 29) and a Big Ten career-high of 28 points at No. 11/8 Wisconsin (Jan. 19).

- Reneau is averaging 15.7 points per game to go along with 5.9 rebounds and 2.7 assists in 29 minutes per game. He is shooting 57.0% (191-of-335) from the floor and 66.9% (91-of-136) from the free throw line.

- He was named to the All-Big Ten Honorable Mention Team by both the coaches and the voting media members of the conference.

- The Miami native has posted double figure scoring outputs in 12-of-14 games played away from Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall this season.

## THE LEAL DEAL

- Senior guard **Anthony Leal** provided his best game as a Hoosier in Indiana's 74-68 victory over the Iowa Hawkeyes on Jan. 30 at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. He set or matched career highs in points (13), rebounds (7), blocks (1), made field goals (4), made 3-pointers (3), and made free throws (2).

- Leal stole the spotlight at Ohio State on Feb. 6 when he scored the final five points of the game in IU's 76-73 victory. He drilled a baseline triple with 22 seconds left to give the Hoosiers a one-point lead before knocking down two game-sealing free throws with 2 seconds left.

- Like Galloway, Leal announced his intentions to utilize his COVID season and return to the Indiana basketball program during his Senior Night speech to Hoosier Nation.

## RETURN OF THE X-FACTOR

- Sixth-year senior guard **Xavier Johnson** returned to the lineup to play 15 minutes off the bench against Wisconsin on Feb. 27. The 24-year old missed the previous six games with an elbow injury. He missed the final 24 games of the 2022-23 season with a foot injury.

- The Hoosiers hold a record of 8-2 when Johnson scores at least five points and plays 15-plus minutes this season. IU has won five-straight games with 'X' in the lineup.

## WARE DOMINATES IN SEASON FINALE

- Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** posted his second-straight 25-point, 10-rebound game in a 65-64 Senior Night victory over Michigan State on March 10. The Oregon transfer finished with team highs in points (28), rebounds (11), and blocks (2).

- The Hoosier defense held the Spartans to 25-of-65 (38.5%) shooting from the floor and 8-of-25 (32.0%) shooting from behind the arc. IU also out-rebounded MSU 39-33.

## DOUBLE-DOUBLES CARRY IU IN THE TWIN CITIES

- Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** (26 points, 11 rebounds) and senior guard **Trey Galloway** (13 points, 11 assists) each produced double-doubles in IU's 70-58 victory over Minnesota on March 6.

- The Hoosiers handed out 28 assists on 30 made field goals. The assist total marked the most by a Hoosier team on the road since posting 29 at Western Illinois on Nov. 26, 2005. The last B1G program to chart at least 28 assists in a road conference game was Purdue at Ohio State on Feb. 7, 1998.

## IU COMES BACK TO BEAT MARYLAND IN COLLEGE PARK

- Indiana, who trailed 43-33 at the half, hit 12-of-14 shots to open the second stanza and outscored the Terps 50-35 over the final 20 minutes to collect an 83-78 win at Maryland on March 3.

- Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** scored a career-best 24 points on 4-of-8 shooting from the 3-point line. He scored 18 in the second half. Sixth-year senior guard **Xavier Johnson** posted 13 points, six assists, and three rebounds in 31 minutes off the bench.

## WARE, GALLOWAY LEAD INDIANA OVER WISCONSIN

- Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** provided the Hoosiers with 27 points, 11 rebounds, and a career-best five blocked shots in a 74-70 triumph over Wisconsin in Bloomington on Feb. 27.

- Senior guard **Trey Galloway** became the second Hoosier (Isiah Thomas, 1980-81) in the last 45 seasons to dish out at least 12 assists in multiple games during a single season with a game-high 12 dimes, six of which result in points from Ware.

## FRONTCOURT SHOWS OUT IN ROAD LOSS AT PSU

- The frontline of sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** and sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** combined for 43 points and 14 rebounds in an 83-74 setback at Penn State on Feb. 24. IU outscored the Nittany Lions 50-28 in paint points.

- Reneau charted a game-high 27 points and six rebounds, while Ware compiled 16 points, eight rebounds, and two blocked shots.

• Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** produced a career high for the second-straight game with 22 points in an 85-70 loss against Nebraska on Feb. 21. He also added seven boards.

• Indiana dropped a 79-59 contest at No. 2/2 Purdue on Feb. 10. Three Hoosier starters reached double figures in freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** (12 points), sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** (11), and senior guard **Trey Galloway** (10).

• Sophomore guard **CJ Gunn** scored a career-high 13 points on 3-of-4 shooting from behind the arc. He also dished out three assists in 20 minutes off the bench. Gunn and fifth-year senior forward **Anthony Walker** combined for 19 points on 7-of-13 shooting from the floor. The duo helped IU's bench outscore the Boilers, 20-15.

## GALLOWAY, RENEAU ERASE 18-POINT LEAD AT OSU

• Senior guard **Trey Galloway** scored a Big Ten career-high 25 points and six rebounds in IU's come-from-behind victory at Ohio State on Feb. 6. • Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** became the first IU freshman since Trayce Jackson-Davis (March 1, 2020) to secure a double-double in a Big Ten road game. Mgbako notched 12 points and a career-high 12 rebounds.

## HOOSIER COMEBACK FALLS SHORT IN MADISON

• Indiana scored 53 second-half points at Wisconsin on Jan. 19, but it was not enough to overcome a 13-point halftime deficit. The Hoosiers fell by a final score of 91-79. IU scored a Big Ten season-high 1.22 points per possession.

• Sixth-year senior guard **Xavier Johnson** posted 18 points, three rebounds, and three assists, while sophomore guard **CJ Gunn** added 10 points and a steal off the bench.

• As a team, IU knocked down a season-high 12 3-pointers on 24 attempts. Reneau (4), freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** (2), and senior guard **Trey Galloway** (2) all hit multiple 3-point attempts.

## LATE PUSH LEADS INDIANA OVER MOREHEAD STATE

• Indiana erased a 15-point deficit in just under nine minutes on the strength of a 20-4 run to close the game to secure a 69-68 win over Morehead State on Dec. 19. Fifth-year senior **Anthony Walker** charted 18 points and nine rebounds off the bench.

• Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** blocked Morehead State's game-winning shot attempt at time expired.

## INDIANA TAKES KANSAS DOWN TO THE WIRE

• The Hoosiers led the second-ranked Kansas Jayhawks for the first 35 minutes of the game before falling by a score of 75-71 on Dec. 16 in front of a striped-out crowd at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

• Senior guard **Trey Galloway** posted a career night with 28 points on 12-of-17 shooting from the floor. Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** tallied an 11-point, 15-rebound double-double.

• Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** added 14 points and five rebounds, while sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** scored 13 points. The quartet scored 93.0% (66-of-71) of the IU points.

## HOOSIERS FALL IN HOLIDAY HOOPSGIVING EVENT

• IU lost to Auburn, 104-76, in the 10th annual Holiday Hoopsgiving event. Indiana shot out to an early 22-10 lead and led for the first 11 minutes of the game before a 42-12 extended Tiger run over the final 13 minutes of the first half flipped the momentum.

• The game marked the first time Indiana's defense had surrendered 100-plus points in regulation since falling to No. 3 North Carolina by a score of 101-86 in the Sweet Sixteen of the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

## GUNN, BENCH LEAD INDIANA AT MICHIGAN

• Sophomore guard **CJ Gunn** produced a season-best eight points on 2-of-3 shooting from behind the arc to go along with a career-high-tying three steals in a 78-75 win over Michigan on Dec. 5.

• The second unit provided 28 points in the game. Gunn and fifth-year senior **Anthony Walker** each tallied eight points, while junior forward **Payton Sparks** and sophomore forward **Kaleb Banks** scored six points each. The quartet added eight rebounds and five steals, collectively.

## IU MOURNS THE LOSS GEORGE MCGINNIS

The Indiana men's basketball program is saddened by the loss of Indiana University Athletics Hall of Famer **George McGinnis** (1950-2023). He was 73 years old.

"I loved George McGinnis," Indiana men's basketball head coach **Mike Woodson** said. "He meant so much not only to IU and the state of Indiana, but to the entire basketball world."

"I looked up to George growing up in Indianapolis. He meant so much to me as a player and more importantly as a man. George was a Hall of Famer on and off the court, and I am going to miss him so much. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the McGinnis family, his friends, and his teammates. Rest easy Big Mac."

In his one year of varsity basketball at Indiana, McGinnis led the Big Ten in both scoring (29.9 points per game) and rebounds (14.7) to become the first sophomore in league history to lead the Big Ten in both categories. He was named to the Associated Press All-America Third Team and added to the All-Big Ten First Team before bypassing his final two seasons of eligibility as a hardship case. He was inducted to the IU Athletics Hall of Fame on Sept. 22, 2023.

During that time, he's called more than 2,000 games and four NCAA Men's Basketball Championship games. Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Jan. 2.

The Gladstone, N.J., native averaged 13.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, and 2.3 assists on 6-of-16 (37.5%) shooting from the 3-point line in a trio of non-conference games against Morehead State (Dec. 19), North Alabama (Dec. 21), and Kennesaw State (Dec. 29).

He was the first Hoosier to earn a Big Ten weekly honor this season and first IU freshman to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week since Jalen Hood-Schifino on Feb. 27. JHS claimed the award four times last season before being drafted No. 17 overall by the Los Angeles Lakers.

**MGBAKO EARNS SECOND BIG TEN HONOR**

Indiana freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Feb. 26.

Mgbako averaged 14.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists, and 1.0 steal per game for the Hoosiers. The former McDonald's All American was one of four major conference freshmen to post at least 14.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 2.0 assists in conference play during the week.

The Gladstone, N.J., native secured a career-high 22 points to go along with seven rebounds and one steal against Nebraska on Feb. 21. He tallied seven points, three assists, and one steal at Penn State on Feb. 24.

The honor is the second of his debut season with the Hoosiers. He joins **Cody Zeller** (seven honors), **Noah Vonleh** (seven), **Trayce Jackson-Davis** (five), **Jalen Hood-Schifino** (four), **Romeo Langford** (three), **Kevin "Yogi" Ferrell** (two), **James Blackmon Jr.** (two), and **Thomas Bryant** (two) as Indiana players to earn multiple Big Ten Freshman of the Week selections in a season since the award was first distributed during the 2010-11 season.

# MIKE WOODSON

**Third Year at Indiana • Third Year as College Head Coach**  
**Record at Indiana: 62-39 Overall, Third Year**

Indiana University Vice President and Director of Athletics Scott Dolson named former Hoosier All-American and Indianapolis native Mike Woodson as the 30th head coach in the men's basketball program's history on March 28, 2021.

Under his tutelage, the Hoosiers have posted a 44-26 mark and seen the program make back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since 2015 and 2016. IU also advanced to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals for the second straight year.

In 2022-23, the Hoosiers finished the season ranked in the top 25 in both major polls. IU was 23-12 overall and finished tied for second in the Big Ten with a 12-8 mark. The year included a road win at Xavier and season sweeps over Purdue, Michigan and Illinois, a group of teams that prior to Woodson's arrival had a combined 20-0 record recently against the Hoosiers. Under Woodson, IU is 9-3 against those three teams with victories included in West Lafayette, Ann Arbor, and Champaign.

The Cream and Crimson led the Big Ten in field goal percentage (48.7%) and finished second in the conference in field goal percentage defense in both the league's overall and conference games only ledgers. The Hoosiers also tied for the most wins in the Big Ten against Top 25 programs (5) and had the best winning percentage versus ranked foes (62.5%) in the conference.

He saw senior forward Trayce Jackson-Davis earn consensus first-team All-American honors, a first for a Hoosier player in 10 years, and win the Karl Malone Award given annually to the best power forward in college basketball. The Greenwood native finished his career at IU ranked third in career scoring and double-doubles, while finishing as the school's all-time leader in rebounds and blocked shots. He was a unanimous first team All-Big Ten selection and the league leader in blocked shots also was a member of the league's All-Defensive team.

In addition, freshman Jalen Hood-Schifino was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year, was named second and third team All-Big Ten and earned All-Freshman accolades.

In his first year, Woodson guided the team to a nine-win improvement, an NCAA Tournament win, built the top-rated defense in the Big Ten according to KenPom (22nd, nationally). IU also led the Big Ten in field goal percentage defense at 39.6% and finished second in blocked shots at 4.83 a game. In Big Ten games, the Hoosiers also led the league in field goal percentage defense at 41.3%.

He led the Hoosiers to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals for the first time since 2003 and helped three players earn All-Big Ten status including Trayce Jackson-Davis, Race Thompson, and Xavier Johnson. His team also ended nine-game losing streaks to Purdue and Michigan and his staff landed the 10th-best recruiting class in the country according to 247Sports.

Woodson returned to the Bloomington campus in the spring of 2021 with a vast experiences and knowledge after playing in the NBA for 11 seasons beginning in 1980 and serving as a coach in the league beginning in 1996 for seven NBA franchises, including nine years combined as a head coach with the Atlanta Hawks and New York Knicks. He was currently serving as an assistant coach with the Knicks.

Woodson was the 1980 Big Ten Player of the Year and NABC All-American as a senior in leading the Hoosiers to a conference title and a berth in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen. Despite undergoing back surgery in December and missing seven weeks, he was honored as the Chicago Tribune's Silver Basketball Award Winner following the season.

As head coach of the Knicks, Woodson guided his 2012-13 Atlantic Division Champions to their first appearance in the Eastern Conference semifinals since 2000 and finished his tenure as New York's coach with a record of 109-79 (.680). As an NBA head coach with Atlanta (2004-2010) and New York (2011-2014), Woodson saw his teams compile two 50-plus win seasons including a personal high of 54 victories during the 2012-13 season with the Knicks. Woodson joined the Knicks staff following six seasons as head coach of the Hawks, where he guided the Hawks to the NBA Playoffs in each of his last three seasons (including 2007-08, ending Atlanta's eight-year Playoff drought), and into the Eastern Conference Semifinals in his last two seasons. In the Playoffs, he piloted the Hawks to back-to-back Game 7 wins in the first round over Miami in 2009 and Milwaukee in 2010.

Before joining the Hawks, Woodson served for one season (2003-04) as an assistant coach with the Detroit Pistons, where he earned an NBA Championship ring as one of the chief architects behind Detroit's suffocating defense that helped lift the Pistons to the 2004 NBA title. Prior to his six years at the helm of the Hawks, Woodson logged eight seasons as an assistant coach with Milwaukee (1996-97 through 1998-99), Cleveland (1999-2000 through 2000-01), Philadelphia (2001-02 through 2002-03) and Detroit (2003-04).

Among the All-Stars he's mentored are Ray Allen (Milwaukee Bucks), Kenny Anderson (Atlanta Hawks), Carmelo Anthony (New York Knicks), Chauncey Billups (Detroit Pistons), Sam Cassell (Milwaukee Bucks), Derrick Coleman (Philadelphia 76ers), Baron Davis (New York Knicks), Blake Griffin (Los Angeles Clippers), Richard Hamilton (Detroit Pistons), Al Horford (Atlanta Hawks), Allen Iverson (Philadelphia 76ers), Joe Johnson (Atlanta Hawks), DeAndre Jordan (Los Angeles Clippers), Shawn Kemp (Cleveland Cavaliers), Jason Kidd (New York Knicks), Kenyon Martin (New York Knicks), Dikembe Mutombo (Philadelphia 76ers), Chris Paul (Los Angeles Clippers), Paul Pierce (Los Angeles Clippers), Julius Randle (New York Knicks), Glenn Robinson (Milwaukee Bucks), Derrick Rose (New York Knicks), Amar'e Stoudemire (New York Knicks), Antoine Walker (Atlanta Hawks), Ben Wallace (Detroit Pistons) and Rasheed Wallace (Detroit Pistons, New York Knicks).

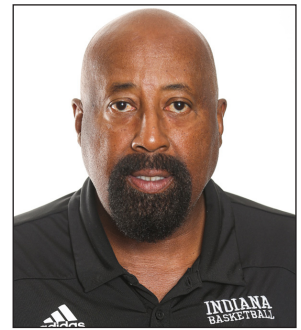
As an assistant, he has worked for greats such as Chris Ford (Bucks), George Karl (Bucks), Larry Brown (76ers and Pistons), Mike D'Antoni (Knicks), Doc Rivers (Clippers), and Tom Thibodeau (Knicks).

The Knicks selected Woodson with the 12th pick of the 1980 NBA Draft and he enjoyed an 11-year NBA playing career, averaging 14.0 points over 786 games for the Knicks (1980-81), New Jersey (1981-82), Kansas City/Sacramento (1981-82 through 1985-86), the LA Clippers (1986-87 through 1987-88), Houston (1988-89 through 1990-91) and Cleveland (1990-91). He scored a career-high 18.2 ppg with Kansas City in 1982-83. He also averaged 12.2 points in 13 career Playoff games over five post-seasons. Woodson's NBA playing career began in 1980-81, when he averaged 4.7 points over 11.7 minutes in 81 contests with the Knicks.

He had the honor of playing for some of the most decorated coaches in league history including Red Holzman (Knicks) Larry Brown (Nets) Cotton Fitzsimmons (Kings); Gene Shue (Clippers), Don Chaney (Clippers and Rockets).

Woodson played 104 games for the Hoosiers after graduating in 1976 from Broad Ripple High School and is the fifth all-time leading scorer with 2,061 points and his 19.8 points per game average is tied (Calbert Cheaney) for the second highest by a Hoosier who played four seasons in college. He averaged 21.0 points during his junior season and helped lead Indiana to an NIT Championship. Woodson captained the USA's Pan American Games team to a gold medal during the summer prior to his senior year and was all set to have a perfect season with the Hoosiers who were ranked No. 1 in the preseason of the 1979-80 campaign. After five games, Woodson suffered a herniated disc in his back and had to undergo surgery. Upon losing Woodson, the Hoosiers went 7-5 in the Big Ten until he returned to spark Indiana back into action. IU finished the conference season with six straight victories and won the Big Ten title. Woodson was the MVP after playing in only six league games that season.

The 65-year-old was born on March 24, 1958 in Indianapolis. At Broad Ripple High School in Indianapolis, he averaged 28.6 points as a senior, scored 1,154 points in his career, and earned All-State honors while being a member of the Indiana All-Stars. He was inducted into the IU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1992 and the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010. Mike and his wife, Terri, have two daughters, Alexis and Mariah, who were volleyball players at Georgia Tech. Alexis also played one season at IU.
