SCOUTING THE BLUE HENS

Delaware (5-8, 1-3 CAA) enter Saturday night's game on a three-game winning streak, defeating Marist (8-7), Michigan (12-5) and Saint Joseph's (11-6). Of the Blue Hens' eight losses, five have been by a single goal to Bucknell (9-8), Loyola (9-8), Binghamton (9-8), Towson (7-6, OT) and Drexel (11-10). Four of UD's five wins have come on the road this season.

Delaware scores 9.23 goals per game, while giving up 9.31 goals a game. The Blue Hens rank seventh of seven teams in the CAA for man-up scoring percentage (23.3) and clear at a rate of 85.9 percent. Delaware excels at the faceoff X, led by Tyler Barbarich who has won 58 percent of his attempts. Offensively, Nick Diachenko leads the team with 29 goals and 33 points, while Eric Smith (29 points) and Connor McRoy (23) follow close behind.

The Blue Hens have split time between two goalies as Conor Peaks has received the past five starts, going 3-2 with a 7.30 GAA and .596 save percentage. Chris Herbert started in the first eight games of the year with a .541 save percentage and 10.49 GAA, going 2-6.

COMMON ENEMIES

While the Blue Hens and Nittany Lions play in the same conference, four more teams (Bucknell, Binghamton, Michigan and Saint Joseph's) have featured on each teams' schedule. In all, PSU and UD have played the same seven opponents thus far. Penn State is 7-0 in those games, outscoring its opponents 72-38, while Delaware is 2-5 and outscoring those teams 64-61.

LAST TIME VS. DELAWARE (April 14, 2012)

The Nittany Lions secured the No. 2 seed for the upcoming CAA tournament with a 13-9 victory against Delaware at the Penn State Lacrosse Field on Saturday evening. **Shane Sturgis** collected a career-high six points (4g, 2a), while classmate **Tom LaCrosse** set a career high with three goals. **Matthew Mackrides** registered his fourth straight three-goal contest and **Gavin Ahern** added a two-goal game. Penn State out-shot Delaware by a 37-24 margin and collected 29 ground balls to the Blue Hens' 22. The Nittany Lions finished 2-for-3 with the extra man and 15-for-17 on clears, while Delaware was 1-for-1 and 11-for-14, respectively.

PENN STATE CLAIMS SOLE POSSESSION OF FIRST IN WIN OVER TOWSON

Buoyed by 1,037 fans and a five-goal showing from freshman **TJ Sanders**, the 11th-ranked Nittany Lions defeated Towson, 10-8, at Penn State Lacrosse Field on Saturday afternoon. Sanders shined and **Jack Forster** pitched in with four points on a goal and three assists in a battle of first-place Colonial Athletic Association teams.

Penn State (9-3, 4-0 CAA) won its seventh-straight game thanks to a 6-1 run spanning the second and third quarters for an 8-4 lead. Despite a spirited Towson (7-6, 3-1 CAA) comeback effort, a highlight-reel goal from Forster and Sanders's fifth tally of the day staved off the Tiger attack.

Rounding out the Penn State attack was **Shane Sturgis**, who notched three points on two goals and an assist, while **Nick Dolik** had a two-point day with a goal and an assist. **Austin Kaut** won the battle of top goalkeepers, making nine saves. Towson's Andrew Wascavage had 11 stops. The two netminders came into the game third and fourth in national save percentage, respectively.

CHAMPIONSHIP HUNTING

The Nittany Lions can capture their first CAA title with by winning at Delaware on Saturday. A win assures at least a share of the conference crown and clinches the CAA Tournament's No. 1 seed. Penn State's only conference title in the NCAA Championship era (since 1974) came in 2005 when the Lions shared the ECAC title with Massachusetts. PSU has never been a No. 1 seed in any conference tournament.

SANDERS EARNS TWO MORE CAA AWARDS

Freshman attack **TJ Sanders** was named Colonial Athletic Association Co-Player and Rookie of the Week for his performance against Towson on Saturday. Sanders scored five goals to lead the Nittany Lions into sole possession of first place.

Sanders upped his conference-leading goal tally to 33 with five against the Tigers. Sanders tallied three goals in the first half against Towson before scoring once each in the third and fourth. The On-

tario native has seven hat tricks this season along with six games of four goals or more and three games with five goals scored. Nationally, Sanders ranks tied for eighth in goals per game (2.75) and leads the nation's freshmen in goals.

The weekly rookie award is the fifth for Sanders, while he shares the player of the week honor with Ben McIntosh of Drexel. The player of the week laurel is the first of his young career.

ROAD WINNING STREAK

With March 30's win at Villanova, Penn State has ticked off a school-record 10 straight true road wins. This season Penn State is 5-0 on the road after going 5-0 in 2012. The Lions' last road loss was Apr. 30, 2011 at Hofstra. Penn State has won 12 of its last 13 true road games.

Of the 14 regular-season contests, Penn State will be home for just five of them, making the Nittany Lions one of the most road tested teams in the country. In total, seven games are true road contests along with two neutral site games. Penn State will look to improve to 7-1 away from Happy Valley on Apr. 20 at Delaware.

CLIMBING UP THE LEADERBOARD

Three Nittany Lions—**Jack Forster**, **Danny Hennehan** and **Austin Kaut**—are heading into or already in the Penn State record books. For Hennehan, he currently ranks sixth all-time in faceoff winning percentage (.530) and sits on 200 career ground balls. If he picks up two grounders against Delaware he'll move into 10th all-time at PSU. In net, Kaut ranks seventh all-time in saves with 483. He is 27 saves behind Rich Caravella for sixth place. As for Forster, he's four goals from tying 10th place (94, John Hollerbach) and two points from 10th (Bill Hess, 134).

POWER KAUT IN NET

A preseason All-American and Tewaaraton Award Watch List candidate, junior **Austin Kaut** is considered one of the best goalkeepers in college lacrosse. Following an average start to year three in Happy Valley, Kaut has stepped up his game. In the past five outings, he has posted a 5.18

GAA and a .721 save percentage, allowing just 36 goals and saving 93 shots. Kaut has stopped at least nine shots in each game and has 13 or more saves in five of those contests. Penn State started the season 2-3, but is 7-0 since. Kaut opened the season with a 9.79 GAA and .490 save percentage behind 48 saves and 50 goals allowed.

DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

Penn State's offense has improved mightily in 2013 with the attacking trio of **Jack Forster** (41 points) **TJ Sanders** (36), and **Shane Sturgis** (34). Penn State is averaging over 10 goals per game this season with a shooting percentage of .289. Last season, the Nittany Lions scored just 8.73 goals per game and post a percentage of .258. Also, assists, points, shots and ground balls per game are up from 2012.

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

Penn State finished a stretch of five games from Feb. 9-March 16 against USILA ranked opponents as PSU went 2-3. After a March 26 win at Bucknell, Penn State's record improved to 3-3, including 2-1 against top 10 teams. This past week, Penn State downed 12th-ranked Drexel to improve to 4-3 in games against ranked foes. Last week's foe, Towson, received votes in the poll, while Hofstra (April 27) is ranked 20th this week.

NIITTANY LIONS ON TV

On Thursday, March 21 it was announced that Penn State's regular season home finale vs. Towson would be aired live by Big Ten Network. The TV broadcast was Penn State's third this season. Previously, Penn State lacrosse was televised on Feb. 17 against Denver at Jacksonville, Fla. by NBC Sports Network and March 9 vs. Lehigh in Chester, Pa. on ESPN3.com and the WatchESPN app for mobile devices.

Penn State's appearance on NBC Sports Network is believed to be the first nationally televised men's lacrosse game in program history. The BTN broadcast was the second as the Nittany Lions went 2-0 in nationally televised games. The last time Penn State was on television before this season was in 2010 vs. Towson on WMAR in Baltimore.

SANDERS, FORSTER EARN CAA AWARDS

Jack Forster and **TJ Sanders** honored by the Colonial Athletic Association office on Monday afternoon (April 8) for their outstanding play in a 13-6 win over Drexel. The weekly honor is the third of Forster's career and the fourth of the season for Sanders.

LIONS ROAR PAST DREXEL

The 13th-ranked Nittany Lions employed a 7-0 second-half run to knock off No. 12 Drexel, 13-6, in front of a Penn State Lacrosse Field record crowd of 1,007 on Saturday afternoon (April 6). Attackmen **Jack Forster** and **TJ Sanders** tallied four goals apiece and goalkeeper **Austin Kaut** saved 13 shots to beat the first-place Dragons. Holding a one-goal lead in the third quarter, Penn State exploded for seven straight goals over an 11-minute span in the second half to put away the Dragons. The Nittany Lions won their sixth straight game thanks to a quick-strike offense that out-shot Drexel 47-23 for the day.

It was a festive atmosphere in Happy Valley as Penn State honored seven decades of lacrosse alumni who came back for the 100th Season Celebration. The Nittany Lions wore special gray uniforms and commemorated the 100th season of Penn State men's lacrosse at halftime with a parade of alumni on the field.

In all, Forster tallied five points, pitching in with an assist, while fellow attackman **Shane Sturgis** posted his third three-assist game in a row. Sturgis added a goal as the starting attack recorded 13

points on nine goals and four assists. The 13-goal output by the Nittany Lions was the most since a 15-goal effort in a win over No. 9 Denver on Feb. 17. Penn State is now 4-3 against ranked opponents this year and 3-1 against higher-ranked foes.

KAUT TABBED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Behind a 30-save week and two wins, **Austin Kaut** was named Colonial Athletic Association Co-Player of the Week on Monday, April 1 by the league office. Kaut has been outstanding over the past five games for the Nittany Lions, winning each decision as Penn State is 7-3 on the season, 2-0 in CAA play. Against Bucknell on Tuesday, Kaut made 11 of 14 stops in the first half en route to an 11-3 trouncing of Bucknell in Lewisburg, Pa. Penn State has two wins over top 10 foes this season. On Saturday, Kaut loomed large for the Villanova offense, saving 16 Wildcat shots in preserving a 7-6 victory. Kaut made eight saves in each half at Villanova.

NIITTANY LIONS FEND OFF WILDCATS

No. 16 Penn State used a four-goal second quarter and 16 saves from **Austin Kaut** in a 7-6 win at Villanova on Saturday, March 30 in front of 2,578 fans. Junior midfielder **Tom LaCrosse** tallied his second hat trick in as many games to lead Penn State to its fifth straight win and 10th straight true road contest. Penn State has held each opponent to seven or fewer goals during the winning streak. Penn State (7-3, 2-0 CAA) out-scored Villanova (2-6, 1-0 Big East) 4-2 in the second quarter, including the last three goals of the frame to take a 5-3 lead. Fueling the three-goal spurt was **Jack Forster** and LaCrosse, two scored twice. **Shane Sturgis** assisted on Forster's tally and LaCrosse's first marker. The second LaCrosse goal was a dash down the middle of the field as the junior was hit with 15 seconds left in the half.

PSU extended the run to four goals and a 6-3 lead as Forster's second goal of the game was assisted by Sturgis just 3:13 into the third period. Sturgis fed Forster from behind the cage with the timer on for Penn State's largest lead of the game. Midfielder **Kyle VanThof** scored the eventual game winner with 9:34 to go on a curl around the cage as he bounced it in for a 7-5 lead. The game-winner was VanThof's second of the year.

PENN STATE RIPS BUCKNELL

No. 16 Penn State crushed No. 7 Bucknell, 11-3, on Tuesday night (March 26) at Christy Mathews-on-Memorial Field behind a punishing defense, 14 saves from **Austin Kaut** and four goals from **TJ Sanders**. The Nittany Lions ended the game on an 8-0 run in front of 1,250 fans.

Attackman **Shane Sturgis** boasted a game-high five points on two goals and three assists, while midfielder **Tom LaCrosse** pitched in with a hat trick. **Kyle VanThof** tallied his first multi-point game of the season on a goal and an assist. Seven Nittany Lions tallied a point in all. Penn State won its second game over a top-10 foe this season after defeating No. 9 Denver on Feb. 17 in Jacksonville, Fla.

The Penn State defense was even better than its offense on the night, causing 14 of Bucknell's 17 turnovers in the game. Leading the way was **Michael Richards** with three caused turnovers,

while **Steven Bogert**, **Tyler Travis** and **James Burke** each caused two. Faceoff specialist **Danny Henneghan** set the tone on offense winning 10-of-17 faceoffs, including all four in the third period that set off the 8-0 burst. Henneghan had a game-high five ground balls.

LIONS BREEZE PAST SAINT JOSEPH'S

The 17th-ranked Nittany Lions scored the game's first nine goals en route to a dominating 9-2 win over CAA rival Saint Joseph's on Saturday (March 23) afternoon at Penn State Lacrosse Field. Junior goalkeeper **Austin Kaut** saved nine shots, his third straight game with nine or more saves, as PSU held an opponent to a season-low two goals.

The Nittany Lions (5-3, 2-0 CAA) received two-goal games from **Jack Forster**, **Tom LaCrosse** and **Shane Sturgis**. Forster led the Penn State offense with four points, pitching in with two assists. In all, Penn State had six different scorers on the afternoon with **TJ Sanders**, **Erik Myers** and **Jack Donnelly**, who scored his first career goal, reaching the back of the net.

Penn State jumped all over Saint Joseph's (4-5, 0-1 CAA) early, opening five-goal lead in the opening 13 minutes. Penn State received two goals from Forster and LaCrosse in the initial onslaught, while Sanders scored his 20th of the season as he connected with Forster with 2:13 left in the opening period. PSU would lead 9-0 midway through the third period as Kaut pitched a shutout for the game's opening 38 minutes.

KAUT NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For the sixth time in his career, goalie **Austin Kaut** earned a CAA weekly laurel on Monday, March 18. Kaut was named CAA Player of the Week for his 16-save performance against the Minutemen. Kaut thrice won CAA Rookie of the Week in 2011 en route to CAA Rookie of the Year and this is his third CAA Player of the Week award.

NITTANY LIONS STAVE OFF BEARCATS

A 6-0 second-period run gave No. 17 Penn State a seven-goal lead as the Nittany Lions downed host Binghamton, 11-7, at Bearcats Sports Complex on Tuesday (March 19). Junior goalie **Austin Kaut**, the reigning CAA Player of the Week, posted his second straight 16-save game, while **Nick Dolik** second-quarter hat trick paced the offense.

Penn State (4-3, 1-0 CAA) took a commanding 9-2 lead near the end of the second quarter only to see Binghamton (3-4, 0-0 America East) tally off five straight goals, setting up a nervous fourth quarter. The Nittany Lion defense, anchored by Kaut, buckled down the Bearcats momentum and outscored Binghamton 2-0 in the final quarter to emerge victorious. Kaut has made 32 saves and allowed just 11 goals in his past two games.

ter Farley. Since then, the Nittany Lions have won 476 games in program history. Penn State will hold its 100th season celebration on April 6 vs. Drexel, where alumni of all teams are welcomed back to Happy Valley to honor the proud history of Penn State lacrosse.

NITTANY LIONS TABBED SECOND IN CAA

Penn State was voted second in the preseason Colonial Athletic Association poll and earned four student-athletes on the preseason All-CAA team on Friday, Feb. 1. The voting was conducted by each of the league's head coaches.

Penn State earned 31 votes, second most to defending champion Massachusetts (35). The Nittany Lions garnered two first-place votes, while the Minutemen earned the other five. Drexel and Hofstra were voted third, while Delaware, Towson and Saint Joseph's rounded out the seven-team conference.

Four Nittany Lions - **Jack Forster**, **Nick Dolik**, **Kessler Brown** and **Austin Kaut** - were named to the 2013 Preseason All-CAA Team. Kaut is a two-time All-CAA First Team honoree, while Forster and Dolik each have made appearances in the postseason awards list for the CAA.

KAUT A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

On Dec. 4, junior **Austin Kaut** was named to the Inside Lacrosse Preseason All-America Second Team. A 2012 second-team USILA All-American honoree is a two-time All-CAA First Team goaltender.

RETURNING SCORERS

Penn State went 9-6 last season and returns the core of its team with just three starters graduating and 31 letterwinners returning for the 2013 season. The 2013 team will see 77 percent of its scoring from a year ago back on the field led by senior **Jack Forster**, who earned an extra year of eligibility from the NCAA for two knee injuries. Forster, who tallied 40 points last year, sits nine points shy of 100 for his career entering the 2013 campaign.

Aiding Forster's offensive capabilities are **Shane Sturgis**, **Nick Dolik** and **Gavin Ahern** who all scored double digit goals in 2012. Sturgis found the back of the net 19 times, Dolik had 18 markers and Ahern scored 13 goals.

VETERAN LEADERSHIP

On Dec. 5, 2013, head coach **Jeff Tambroni** announced that senior leaders **Travis Crane** and **Jack Forster** earned the distinction of captains. Crane, a fifth-year senior in his second season in Happy Valley, is a midfielder out of Parkville, Md, while Forster of Jenkintown, Pa. is at Penn State for his sixth year.

"Our coaching staff and team are very confident that they will do a wonderful job as we make our way through the spring season," Tambroni said. "Both of [these] guys have been around for a long time, one a fifth-year (Crane) the other a sixth-year senior (Forster), and have fought through a lot of adversity in their own right. I think their experience is going to be great for this team at the time that Penn State lacrosse is in its history, and hopefully going to give us an opportunity to turn the page."

COACH TAMBRONI IN YEAR THREE

Head coach **Jeff Tambroni** is in his third year on the Penn State sidelines, winning 16 games in the past two years after a 2-11 season in 2010 before his arrival. Last year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions one win shy of their first 10-win season since 2009 and on the cusp of the CAA Championship. Penn State cracked the top 10 in the USILA poll for the first time since 1996 on March 5 after wins over Notre dame nad Ohio State. Tambroni has also led Penn State to back-to-back second-place finishes in the CAA and has a 9-3 regular-season record in the conference.

PSU WELCOMES 14 NEWCOMERS

Fourteen new Penn State student-athletes joined the lacrosse team this season. The Nittany Lions welcomed two attackmen, five midfielders, five defenders and two goalies in the class.

NEXT TIME OUT

Penn State wraps up its regular season at Hofstra with a 7 p.m. opening faceoff next Saturday, April 27.

Jeff Tambroni is currently in his third season as head coach of the Penn State men's lacrosse team. During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a second-place CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees. Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Final Four appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/ NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.

During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.
