LEADING OFF

• **Opening Kick:** The Fighting Illini (3-4 overall, 0-3 B1G Leaders) will look to end a three-game skid when they travel to Penn State (4-3 overall, 1-2 B1G Legends) on Saturday (Noon ET/11 a.m. CT, ESPN). Both teams are looking to bounce back from tough defeats, as the Illini fell to Michigan State 42-3 and the Nittany Lions lost to No. 4 Ohio State 63-14 last week.



• **Brown an All-America Candidate:** Senior LB and Butkus Award candidate **Jonathan Brown** leads the Big Ten and ranks 10th nationally in tackles per game (10.9). Brown, who was named to Phil Steele's midseason All-America third team, also ranks second in the conference in TFLs per game (1.14). He is the only player in the nation averaging over 10.0 tackles per game with at least 8.0 TFLs.

• **Offensive Improvement:** Even with last Saturday's offensive struggles against Michigan State's top-ranked defense, the revamped Illinois offense, directed by new offensive coordinator **Bill Cubit**, has still made huge improvements from 2012. The Illini have jumped at least 60 spots in the national rankings from last year to this year in passing efficiency, long scrimmage plays, first downs, passing offense, turnovers lost and scoring offense, with the biggest turnaround a whopping 81-place jump in team passing efficiency.

• **Scheelhaase Having Big Year:** Senior QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** has thrived in Cubit's system, ranking in the top 30 in the nation in passing efficiency (151.08, 26th) and completion percentage (65.3 percent, 27th), and standing fourth in the Big Ten in passing yards (235.6 ypg) and total offense (245.7 ypg).

• **Big Play Illini:** Scheelhaase has five pass plays of 50+ yards this season, tied for eighth-most in the nation, and wide receivers **Steve Hull** (21.6 ypr) and **Ryan Lankford** (20.5 ypr) rank eighth and 13th nationally in yards per reception, respectively.

• **Return Man:** Sophomore **V'Angelo Bentley** leads the Big Ten and ranks fourth in the nation in kick return average (30.8 ypr), including a 100-yard kickoff return for TD against Southern Illinois.

• **Ferguson an All-Purpose Threat:** Sophomore running back **Josh Ferguson** ranks second in the nation in receiving yards per game by a running back, averaging 51.6 yards per game (361 yards on 25 receptions, 14.4 ypc). He leads the Illini in both rushing (361) and receiving (361) yards, and ranks ninth in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards.

• **Tough Slate:** Illinois' first three conference games this season came against the only three teams that have played in the Big Ten Championship game. Nebraska (5-2, 2-1), Wisconsin (5-2, 3-1) and Michigan State (7-1, 4-0) are in the mix for the title game once again, with combined records of 17-5 overall and 9-2 in conference play. Illinois' five remaining opponents have combined records of 20-17 overall, 6-11 in B1G play, and that includes Ohio State (8-0, 4-0).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

• QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** needs 70 total yards to pass Kurt Kittner and move into second place on the Illinois career total offense list. Juice Williams is the UI record holder with 10,594 total yards.

• Scheelhaase needs 87 passing yards to pass Tony Eason and move into fifth place on the Illinois career passing yardage list.

• With three pass attempts on Saturday, Scheelhaase will become the fifth player in school history with 1,000 attempts, joining Kurt Kittner, Jack Trudeau, Juice Williams and Jason Verduzco.

• LB Jonathan Brown needs two tackles for loss to pass Don Thorp for fourth place on the UI career TFLs list.

PENN STATE SERIES NOTES

- This week's game marks the 21st meeting between the Fighting Illini and the Nittany Lions. PSU holds a 16-4 overall series advantage and a 7-1 edge in State College. In the teams' most recent meeting in Happy Valley, the Illini dropped a heartbreaking 10-7 game in the snow when Derek Dimke's last-second field goal attempt bounced off the right upright with snowballs sailing onto the field from the stands. That was the final game for longtime PSU head coach Joe Paterno and also featured the first measurable snowfall at an October Penn State home game. Illinois' lone victory at Penn State came by a 33-13 score in 2010.
- Illinois has won two of the last six meetings (2007 and 2010), which is an improvement compared to the rest of the all-time series. Prior to 2007, PSU had won 11 of 13 meetings, including seven in a row from 1972-2000.
- Sixth-year senior offensive lineman **Corey Lewis** (Cresco/East Stroudsburg South) is Illinois' lone Pennsylvania native on the roster. Lewis has started all seven games at right tackle in 2013 after missing two-and-a-half years following five knee surgeries. For more information on Lewis' feel-good story, see page 5. Penn State has two players on its roster from the state of Illinois: sophomore linebacker T.J. Rhattigan (Naperville, Ill./Neuqua Valley) and freshman long snapper Sean Corcoran (Bourbonnais, Ill./Bishop McNamara).

PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS AGAINST THE NITTANY LIONS

- LB **Jonathan Brown** had a huge game against the Nittany Lions in 2011, recording a team-high 11 tackles, 2.5 TFLs, one sack, two PBUs, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. He had three tackles in the 2012 contest and didn't record any statistics in 2010.
- Last year, QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** was 28-for-46 for 270 yards in the 35-7 loss to the Nittany Lions. In 2011, he rushed for 89 yards on 14 carries while completing 9-of-16 passes for 63 yards and a touchdown. In the 2010 Illini win at PSU, Scheelhaase was 15-for-19 passing for 151 yards and one touchdown while running eight times for 61 yards. For his career, Scheelhaase is 52-for-81 (64.2 percent) for 484 yards and two TDs, and has rushed for 157 yards on 33 carries (4.8 ypc).
- CB **V'Angelo Bentley** blocked a Penn State field goal just before halftime of the 2012 game, keeping the Lions off the board after Miles Osei made a touchdown-saving tackle with one second left in the second quarter on Michael Mauti's 99-yard interception return.
- WR **Ryan Lankford** has a strong game against PSU in 2012, catching seven passes for 104 yards.
- WR **Spencer Harris** caught three passes for 41 yards and a touchdown in 2012, and two passes for 24 yards and a TD in 2011.
- RB **Donovonn Young** posted 10.5 yards per carry against PSU in 2012 (6 carries, 63 yards).
- RB **Josh Ferguson** threw his first career TD pass in the 2012 game against the Lions, a 22-yard strike to Harris.
- LB **Mason Monheim** had 11 tackles and forced a fumble against PSU in 2012.
- In the 2010 game at PSU, TE **Evan Wilson** caught a four-yard touchdown pass from running back Jason Ford, Wilson's first career TD reception.

WHOSE HOUSE? SCHEEL-HOUSE

- Senior quarterback **Nathan Scheelhaase** already has blown past his 2012 season totals for passing yards, touchdown passes, 20-plus-yard pass plays, 30+ pass plays and 50+ pass plays, while improving his passing efficiency by nearly 50 points. Take a look at his seven-game 2013 numbers versus his 10-game 2012 numbers below:

- Scheelhaase has attacked opponents early in games, with nine of his 12 TDs coming in the first half. He has a first-half efficiency rating of 166.71, which ranks 14th in the nation right in front of Oregon's Marcus Mariota (165.75). He also has 16 first-half plays of 25-plus-yards, tied for seventh in FBS.
- Scheelhaase has the second-best second quarter efficiency rating in all of FBS. He has completed 45-of-60 passes (75.0 percent) for 644 yards with seven touchdowns and one interception in the second quarter this season for a 200.33 rating, which ranks second nationally behind only Florida State's Jameis Winston.
- Scheelhaase has found great success on first down, completing 71-of-96 (74.0 percent) passes on first down for 1,025 yards and six touchdowns for a 178.03 passing efficiency rating. He ranks seventh in the nation in first-down QB rating among QBs with 70 or more first-down attempts.
- Scheelhaase enters the weekend ranked third on the Illinois career total offense list with 8,811 yards (1,866 rushing, 6,945 passing). He needs 71 yards to pass Kurt Kittner (1998-2001) for second place. Juice Williams is the Illinois all-time total yardage leader with 10,594.
- Scheelhaase ranks fourth on the Illinois career passing efficiency list (129.7) and also ranks fourth in career touchdown passes (46), fourth in completions (616), fifth in attempts (997), sixth in passing yardage (6,945) and 17th in rushing yardage (1,866) – second among quarterbacks – at Illinois. See page 13 to track Scheelhaase's ascent up several UI career lists.
- Scheelhaase set a school record for TD passes in a quarter with four in the second quarter against Miami (Ohio). He tossed a career-high five TDs against the RedHawks, all in the first half, one more than he had all of last season. Those five TDs in a half tied the Illinois record shared by Dave Wilson and Tom O'Connell.
- Scheelhaase has put together streaks of 10 or more consecutive completions in three different games this season, accomplishing the feat against Southern Illinois (12), Cincinnati (10) and Miami (Ohio) (10). Prior to this season, the last time Scheelhaase had completed 10 or more passes was a string of 13 consecutive completions against Baylor in the 2010 Texas Bowl. Before the four times Scheelhaase has done it, the last Illini to complete 10 straight passes was Johnny Johnson (12) at Wisconsin on Nov. 19, 1994.
- Scheelhaase threw for a career-high 416 yards in the season-opener against Southern Illinois, the 10th-best single-game passing performance in school history and the fifth-most by an Illinois quarterback at Memorial Stadium. He had 340 of his 416 yards in the first half, marking the most ever for an Illini in the first half and the most in any half since Juice Williams totaled 347 passing yards in the second half against Minnesota on Oct. 11, 2008.
- After starting the first seven games this season, Scheelhaase now has 43 career starts under his belt, tied with Nebraska's Taylor Martinez for the third-most in the nation by a quarterback behind only Georgia's Aaron Murray (48) and Troy's Corey Robinson (44).
- Scheelhaase led Illinois to bowl victories in each his first two seasons (2010 Texas Bowl and 2011 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl), making him one of only two QBs in Big Ten history to start and lead their teams to bowl wins during both his freshman and sophomore seasons (Brooks Bollinger, Wisconsin). After missing a bowl in 2012, Scheelhaase is looking to end his UI career with a third bowl win, something no Illini QB has done previously.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

- Butkus Award candidate **Jonathan Brown** leads the Big Ten with 76 tackles and ranks 10th in the nation at 10.9 tackles per game. He is trying to become the first Illini to lead the conference in tackles since Brit Miller in 2008.
- Brown has a team-high 8.0 TFLs this season, ranking second in the Big Ten, giving him 38.5 TFLs in his career. That total ties him for fifth on the UI career TFLs list with J Leman, just 1.5 TFLs behind Don Thorp for fourth place.
- Brown forced his first fumble of the season against Michigan State, saving a touchdown by jarring the ball loose as MSU QB Connor Cook reached for the end zone.
- Brown had a monster game at Nebraska, racking up a game-high 13 tackles and tying his career high with 4.0 TFLs, tied for the third-most TFLs in a game by an FBS player this season.
- Brown is a member of preseason watch lists for the Butkus Award, Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy. Last season, he was one of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, which goes annually to the nation's top linebacker and is named after Illinois legend Dick Butkus. - Over the last two years, Brown has put up monster numbers when healthy. He was leading the Illini with 59 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks in 2012 before having his season cut short by a shoulder injury. That followed a breakout 2011 season, when he earned All-Big Ten honors with 108 tackles, 19.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He ranked sixth in the nation in TFLs per game (1.63) and led the Big Ten in TFLs per game during conference play (2.07) in 2011.

LINEBACKER U: NOT WHERE YOU THINK IT IS

- Like many Illini teams over the years, the 2013 Illini defense is led by its linebacking corps. This year, senior **Jonathan Brown**, a 2012 Butkus Award semifinalist, and sophomore **Mason Monheim**, a 2012 Freshman All-American key the attack. Brown has piled up 243 tackles, 37.0 TFLs and 11 sacks over the last two-plus seasons, while Monheim became the first true-freshman ever to lead the Illini in tackles and led all Big Ten freshmen with 86 stops last season. Not surprisingly, the duo is 1-2 on the team in tackles so far this season as Brown is averaging a Big Ten-best 10.9 stops per game, 10th-best in FBS, and Monheim ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 54th nationally with 8.7 tackles per game.
- Illinois' history at the linebacker position is up there with any program in the nation. It begins with football legend **Ray Nitschke**, who donned the Orange and Blue from 1955-57, and the greatest linebacker in football history, **Dick Butkus**, who was a two-time All-American and led the Fighting Illini to a 1964 Rose Bowl win over Washington. The Orange and Blue boast two Butkus Award winners, **Dana Howard** in 1994 and **Kevin Hardy** in 1995, and several first-team All-Americans like **Darrick Brownlow** (1990), **Simeon Rice** (1994 & '95) and **J Leman** (2007), in addition to Butkus, Howard and Hardy. Illinois linebacker lore also includes multi-year NFL players **Scott Studwell**, **Danny Clark**, **Martez Wilson** and **Nate Bussey**.

FERGUSON A DUAL THREAT

- Sophomore running back **Josh Ferguson** is having a breakout season for the Illini. He ranks second in the nation in average receiving yards by a running back (51.6 ypg) and also leads the Illini in rushing yards (361).
- Ferguson is averaging 103.1 scrimmage yards per game (51.6 rushing, 51.6 receiving), which ranks 43rd nationally and eighth in the Big Ten (fifth among running backs behind only Nebraska's Ameer Abdullah, Wisconsin's Melvin Gordon and James White, and Indiana's Tevin Coleman).
- Ferguson has three career 100-yard games, two rushing and one receiving. He ran for 114 yards on 19 carries (6.0 ypc) at Nebraska on Oct. 5 and also ran for 101 yards at Arizona State on Sept. 8, 2012. His 100-yard receiving game came in the 2013 season opener against Southern Illinois, when he had four catches for 103 yards.
- In 2012, Ferguson led all Big Ten freshmen in all-purpose yards per game (90.7).

FORMER ILLINI IN SPACE

- Former Illini defensive back and current NASA astronaut **Mike Hopkins** is in the middle of his first space flight. Hopkins and crewmates Oleg Kotov and Sergey Ryazanskiy launched from Baikonur, Kazakhstan, at 3:58 p.m. CT on Sept. 25, and arrived at the International Space Station six hours later. Hopkins will remain on board as a flight engineer on Expedition 37/Expedition 38, which is scheduled to end with the Soyuz landing in March 2014. During its time on the station, the crew will conduct science experiments and maintenance.
- Hopkins played for coach John Mackovic at Illinois, helping the Fighting Illini reach four straight bowl games from 1988-91. He started his career as a walk-on and by the time he was a senior, he was a team captain. He graduated from Illinois in 1991 with a degree in aerospace engineering and earned a master's degree in aerospace engineering from Stanford in 1992. A colonel in the U.S. Air Force, Hopkins was selected in July 2009 as one of 14 members of the 20th NASA astronaut class. COREY LEWIS: THE COMEBACK KID

Senior OT **Corey Lewis** is one the feel-good stories in college football. After missing more than two-and-half years (34 games) recovering from three ACL tears and five different knee surgeries, Lewis saw his first game action in over 1,000 days at Ohio State on Nov. 3, 2012, and played in the season's final four games. With a bachelor's degree in communication already in hand and a sixth year of NCAA eligibility granted, Lewis made his first career start in the 2013 season-opener against Southern Illinois, more than five years after first setting foot on campus, and has started every game since, playing a huge role in Illinois' offensive resurgence.

OFFENSIVE TEAM NOTES

- Illinois has shown a great ability to sustain drives this season. Through seven games, the Illini have 17 drives of 10-plus plays, including four 14-play drives. Twelve of the 17 drives ended with scores and resulted in a total of 64 points. Last year, Illinois managed only 11 scoring drives of 10 or more plays for the entire season.
- Conversely, the Illini also have shown quick-strike capability, with five scoring drives of zero, one or two plays. **V'Angelo Bentley's** 100-yard kickoff return against Southern Illinois doesn't even register in the game's drive chart, and the Illini had a one-play scoring drive against Washington (Lankford 72-yard TD reception from Scheelhaase) and two-play scoring drives against SIU, Cincinnati and Miami (Ohio).
- The Orange and Blue's 31 passing plays of 20-plus yards rank 26th nationally and their five passing plays of 50-plus yards are tied for the Big Ten lead and rank 11th nationally.
- Illinois racked up 319 passing yards against Wisconsin, eclipsing the 300-yard passing mark for the fourth time in first six games. It also marked UI's first 300-plus-yard passing game against a Big Ten opponent in 17 conference games, since notching 391 passing yards against Northwestern on Oct. 1, 2011.
- Illinois' 32 points against the Badgers equaled the most points scored against Wisconsin this season.
- Illini tight ends had a day to remember against Miami (Ohio), as **Matt LaCosse, Evan Wilson and Jon Davis** combined to catch four touchdowns, an Illinois single-game record by tight ends and one more than Illinois' tight ends caught all of last season (Eddie Viliunas had two and Jon Davis one in 2012).
- The Miami (Ohio) game also marked the first time that three different tight ends caught at least one touchdown in a game, as LaCosse had two, and Davis and Wilson each caught one score. Davis also caught a two-point conversion pass from tight end/holder **Tim Russell** in the game.
- Illinois scored a school-record 161 points over its first four games, eclipsing the previous record of 158 points in the first four games of 1914, when the Illini won Big Ten and national titles.
- Against Miami (Ohio), the Illini tied a school record with 36 first downs and piled up 601 yards of total offense, surpassing 600 yards for the first time since 2007. Illinois racked up 394 total yards of offense in the first half against the RedHawks, marking the fourth-highest total ever in a half and third-most in a first half for Illinois.
- The Illini didn't allow a sack against Cincinnati, marking the first time in 13 games that an Illini opponent didn't record one. The last time UI protected that well was against Western Michigan on Sept. 1, 2012.
- Against Cincinnati, Illinois matched its longest drive in school history, covering 99 yards on 12 plays over 5:07. It marked the fifth time since 1971 that the Illini have recorded a 99-yard drive, and the first since Oct. 21, 2009, against Michigan. The Illini also had a 94-yard TD drive (seven plays in 1:15) and an 88-yard TD drive (7 plays in 3:16) in the season-opener against SIU.
- The Illini had six scrimmage plays go for 30+ yards in the season-opener against SIU, equaling the team's total for the entire 2012 season in one game. Only Oregon (7) had more plays of 30+ yards in week one.

OFFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior **Steve Hull** had a career game against Wisconsin, hauling in a career-high six passes for a career-high 105 yards, including his fourth 50-plus-yard reception this season. It marked the first 100-yard receiving game of Hull's career. Hull spent his redshirt season as a receiver before switching to safety prior to the 2010 season and making 15 starts there from 2010-2012. He switched back to WR this season and has 13 catches for 281 yards for a whopping 21.6 ypc average on the season, eighth-best in the nation.
- QB **Aaron Bailey** earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors on 9/30 after rushing for a career-high 56 yards on six carries and a TD against Miami (Ohio). On the season, Bailey has converted 72 percent of his carries into first downs or TDs (10 first downs, three TDs on 18 carries). He threw his first career TD pass against Wisconsin, a one-yard pass to Matt LaCosse in the second quarter.
- Senior wide receiver **Ryan Lankford** ranks 13th in the nation in yards per reception, averaging a healthy 20.5 yards per catch (15 receptions, 308 yards, one TD). Lankford has a pair of 100-yard games already this season (career-high 115 against SIU and an even 100 against Washington), giving him three career 100-yard receiving games.
- The starters on the Illini offensive line are massive, as all five are listed at at least 300 pounds and have an average weight of 309 pounds (**Simon Cvijanovic** - 310, **Michael Heitz** - 305, **Alex Hill** - 310, **Ted Karras** - 300, **Corey Lewis** - 315).
- Junior TE **Matt LaCosse** caught his first two career touchdowns against Miami (Ohio), with a two-yard TD grab in the first quarter and a career-long 45-yard TD catch in the second quarter. He finished with career highs for receiving yards (68) and receptions (3), and also recovered an on-side kick for the Illini against the RedHawks. He caught his third touchdown of the season against Wisconsin, a one-yard pass from Aaron Bailey.
- RB **Donovonn Young** is a perfect counterpart to Ferguson in the backfield. Young, the power back, has run for 281 yards and a team-high three touchdowns, while the speedy Ferguson has 361 yards and two scores. The junior from Texas has 1,303 yards career rushing yards, which ranks 27th in school history.

DEFENSIVE TEAM NOTES

- Illinois ranks 12th in FBS and second in the Big Ten in fourth-down conversion defense, allowing just two first downs in seven opponent attempts (.286).
- The Illini recorded a safety in the second quarter at Nebraska when LEO **Houston Bates** tackled Husker RB Imani Cross in the end zone. It marked the team's first safety since blocking a punt in the end zone against Indiana and having the Hoosiers recover on Oct. 23, 2010.
- The defense returned only four starters from 2012: DE **Tim Kynard**, LB **Jonathan Brown**, LB **Mason Monheim** and safety **Earnest Thomas III**.
- The entire defensive three-deep includes only two seniors (LB **Jonathan Brown** and DL **Tim Kynard**). In fact, the three-deep lists only 10 players with junior or senior eligibility, two less than the number of true- and redshirt-freshmen listed.

DEFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Sophomore LB **Mason Monheim** had a game-high 14 tackles against Michigan State and has 61 tackles on the season – which ranks second on the team and fourth in the Big Ten – 4.5 TFLs and a sack in 2013, a solid start after a stellar freshman season that saw him earn second-team freshman All-America honors by Phil Steele. Monheim started the final 10 games of the season and led all Big Ten freshmen with 86 tackles. He was the first Illini true-freshman ever to lead the team in tackles.
- Junior defensive back **Zane Petty** led the Illini with a career-high 14 tackles against Wisconsin, his first career start. He followed that up with eight tackles against Michigan State.
- Junior safety **Earnest Thomas III** tied his career high with 11 tackles against Wisconsin. He ranks third on the team and seventh in the Big Ten with 50 tackles (8.1 tpg) in 2013 after a breakout 2012, where he was fourth on the team with 69 stops and ranked fourth in the Big Ten with three forced fumbles.
- Junior DT **Austin Teitsma** had a career-high eight tackles against Wisconsin and has 34 on the season (4.9 per game), which ranks second in the Big Ten among defensive linemen behind only Penn State's DaQuan Jones (6.5 tpg).
- Senior DE **Tim Kynard** (6.0 TFLs) and junior LEO **Houston Bates** (6.0 TFLs) have made a habit of getting in the backfield this season. Kynard forced his first career fumble against SIU, while Bates forced a fumble against Washington and registered a safety with a TFL in the end zone at Nebraska.
- Sophomore **Eaton Spence** reached double-digit tackles for the first time in his career with 14 stops against Washington, equaling the second-most tackles by an Illinois player in a game this year (behind only Jonathan Brown's 15 tackles against Washington). For the season, Spence ranks fourth on the team in tackles (5.4 tpg).
- Redshirt-freshman safety **Taylor Barton** notched his first career interception in the Cincinnati game in his second career start. It marks the only Illini interception through seven games this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS TEAM NOTES

- Illinois has streaks of 56 games and 158 attempts without missing a PAT kick, which both rank as the third-longest streaks in the nation. The last time the Fighting Illini did not convert a PAT kick was on Sept. 5, 2009, against Missouri.
- As a team, the Illini rank 31st in FBS in punt returns (11.71 ypr), up 87 spots from 2012, when they averaged 1.56 ypr to rank 118th. Illinois already has its most punt return yards as a team since 2007, with 164 (27.3 yards per game). The 2007 Illini squad had 177 in 13 games (13.6 ypg).
- The Illini also have made a huge improvement in kick return average, ranking 54th in the nation (21.9 ypr) this season after ranking 107th in 2012 (18.83 ypr).
- Illinois did not punt against Miami (Ohio), marking the first time since Sept. 14, 2002, a 59-7 win over Arkansas State, that the Fighting Illini did not have at least one punt in a game. In 11 total drives against the RedHawks, the Illini scored seven touchdowns, missed a field goal, had two drives end with interceptions and finished the game, and the final drive, by taking a knee.
- Illinois executed its first successful on-side kick since 2010 when it recovered **Taylor Zalewski's** on-side attempt in the second quarter against Miami (Ohio). On the play, Zalewski popped up the kick, Miles Osei tapped it backward and Matt LaCosse grabbed it out of the air. The last time the Illini had recovered an on-side kick was another surprise attempt against Purdue on Oct. 30, 2010, when Derek Dimke kicked the ball off a player on Purdue's front line and Nate Bussey recovered it.

SPECIAL TEAMS INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- **V'Angelo Bentley** ranks fourth in the nation and leads the Big Ten in average kick return yardage with 30.8 yards per return this season (308 yards on 10 returns).
- Bentley's 100-yard kickoff return for touchdown against SIU was the longest by a single player in school history and equaled the longest touchdown in Illinois history. It matched the record set by Travis Williams and Eugene Wilson, who combined for 100 yards on a kick return lateral play, against Purdue on Oct. 12, 2002. It also marked Illinois' first kick return TD since A.J. Jenkins (96 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 18, 2008.
- Bentley had a 50-yard punt return against Miami (Ohio), the longest for an Illini since Eugene Wilson's 70-yarder at Southern Miss on Sept. 7, 2002. For the season, Bentley is averaging 15.8 yards per return. His 95 punt return yards this season are the most by an Illini since Arrelious Benn had 114 in 2008.
- Junior **Justin DuVernois**, a 2013 Ray Guy Award candidate, earned Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors on Sept. 16 following a stellar performance against Washington at Soldier Field. DuVernois punted five times for an average of 45.2 yards, pinning the Huskies inside the 20 three times and inside the 10 twice. He also had a career-high three punts over 50 yards. For the season, he is averaging 40.8 yards per kick.
- Sophomore kicker **Taylor Zalewski** has hit 7-of-10 field goals and 22-of-22 extra points to lead the Illini in scoring with 43 points. In 2012, he nailed a 54-yard field goal against Purdue, the third-longest field goal in school history and the longest in the Big Ten that season. Zalewski also handles kickoff duties, booting 21 touchbacks in 39 kickoffs this season and averaging 63.2 yards per kickoff as 32 of his 39 kickoffs have reached the end zone.
- Senior TE/holder **Tim Russell** converted his fifth career two-point conversion (fourth passing) with a toss to TE Jon Davis in the fourth quarter against Wisconsin. It was Russell's third two-pointer of the season, as he connected with TE Matt LaCosse in the season opener against SIU and with Davis against Miami (Ohio). His other two conversions came at Ohio State in 2012 (one rush, one pass).
- In 2012, **V'Angelo Bentley** blocked a goal attempt against Penn State, marking the first blocked FG for an Illini since Derek Walker at Michigan on Oct. 4, 2008, and the first blocked kick of any kind for an Illini since Clay Nurse swatted away a PAT at Fresno State on Dec. 3, 2010.
- With the loss of three-year long-snapper Zak Pedersen to graduation at the end of 2012, the Illini turned to redshirt-freshman **Zach Hirth** for long-snapping duties this season. Hirth was ranked the No. 2 long-snapper in the nation by ESPN coming out of high school. He has handled his duties in the first six games of 2013 without any issues.
- Redshirt freshman kicker **Ryan Frain** made his Illini debut against Miami (Ohio), nailing two second-half extra points in his first collegiate action.

TEAM NOTES

- Illinois has received the opening kickoff in all seven games this season and in nine straight games dating back to last season, the fourth-longest active streak in the nation of starting a game with the ball.
- The Fighting Illini wore all orange uniforms against Wisconsin, marking the first time they wore orange helmets, jerseys and pants together since Sept. 25, 2004, against Purdue.
- With the victory over Miami (Ohio), Illinois snapped a 10-game losing streak when coming off a bye. Prior to this season, the Illini's last win after a bye week was on Oct. 26, 2002, when they topped Indiana, 45-14.
- The Aug. 31 win over Southern Illinois was the Illini's 16th consecutive home-opening victory, the fourth-

longest streak in the Big Ten behind Ohio State (35), Nebraska (28) and Wisconsin (18). Illinois is 86-33-5 all-time in home-openers.

- The Illini are 13-0 all-time against FCS opponents (formerly I-AA). All but two of those wins have been by at least 21 points. Four of UI's 13 FCS wins have come against Southern Illinois, including the only two that were close games, a 28-25 win over the Salukies in 1985 and this year's 42-34 season-opening victory.
- Illinois is 14-0 all-time against the other public universities in the state. The Fighting Illini are 4-0 against Northern Illinois, 4-0 against Southern Illinois and Illinois State, 2-0 against Eastern Illinois and 1-0 against Western Illinois. The combined score of those meetings is 553-224 in favor of the Illini.
- Illinois is looking to reach a bowl game for the third time in the last four years in 2013, something that hasn't been done at Illinois since playing in three bowl games from 1991-94.

NEW FACES TAKE THE FIELD

Illinois has had 27 players make their Illini debuts this far in 2013: 10 true-freshmen (**Aaron Bailey, Dillan Cazley, Jarrod Clements, Caleb Day, Jaylen Dunlap, Darius Mosely, Austin Schmidt, Dawuane Smoot, Dionte Taylor, Tyler White**), 11 redshirt-freshmen (**Robbie Bain, Taylor Barton, B.J. Bello, Devin Church, Cedric Doxy, Ryan Frain, Zach Hirth, Jevaris Little, T.J. Neal, Joe Spencer, LaKeith Walls**), two sophomores (**Tim Clary, Chris O'Connor**) and four transfers (**Martize Barr, Abe Cajuste, Eric Finney, Zane Petty**).

SHOW ME THE MONEY - FOUR ILLINI EARN SCHOLARSHIPS

Coach Beckman awarded scholarships to four Fighting Illini walk-ons for the 2013 campaign. Senior safety **Ben Mathis**, redshirt-freshman long snapper **Zach Hirth**, tight end/holder **Tim Russell** and kicker **Taylor Zaleski**, all walk-ons in 2012, are now on full scholarship for 2013.

ILLINI ARE ALL OVER THE NFL

- Illinois currently has 24 former players on 2013 NFL active rosters, plus two on practice squads, fifth-most among Big Ten teams behind Ohio State (31), Iowa (26), Penn State (25) and Wisconsin (25), and ahead of Michigan (23), Nebraska (23), Purdue (18), Michigan State (15), Northwestern (7), Indiana (5) and Minnesota (4).
- Illinois led all Big Ten schools with four players selected in the 2013 NFL Draft: OL **Hugh Thornton** (third round, Colts), DT **Akeem Spence** (fourth round, Buccaneers), CB **Terry Hawthorne** (fifth round, Steelers) and DE **Michael Buchanan** (seventh round, Patriots).
- Illinois has had four players chosen in each of the last four drafts (2010-2013).
- At least three Illini have been drafted in each of the last five drafts (2009-2013).
- Sixteen Illini have been drafted since 2010, including 10 in the first three rounds (most in the Big Ten).
- Despite not having a first-rounder in 2013, Illinois has had five first-round draft picks since 2008, which is the most of any Big Ten team.
- **Akeem Spence** was the eighth Illini in the last six years to enter the draft with eligibility remaining. All eight were taken in the first four rounds, including four first-rounders.
- Four Illini DL have been drafted in the last three years – **Corey Liuget** (first round, 2011), **Whitney Mercilus** (first round, 2012), **Akeem Spence** (fourth round, 2013) and **Michael Buchanan** (seventh round, 2013).

SWEET HOME CHICAGO

- Illinois played its second-ever game at Soldier Field on Sept 14, a 34-24 loss to No. 19/23 Washington in front of 47,312 fans. More than 10,000 tickets were sold in the final week leading up to the game. The only other time the Illini have played in Soldier Field was a 10-9 loss to Washington State on Sept. 1, 1994, in front of 39,472.
- The game against Washington was Illinois' first in the city of Chicago since the 48-27 victory over Northwestern at Wrigley Field on Nov. 20, 2010.

LOVE IS IN THE AIR

This past July, Illini QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** married his high-school sweetheart, Morgan Miller, with several of his Fighting Illini teammates by his side. WR **Miles Osei** served as Scheelhaase's best man, while QB **Reilly O'Toole**, WR **Ryan Lankford** and WR **Steve Hull** served as groomsmen. And Scheelhaase isn't the only Illini with wedding bells on his mind. Redshirt-junior offensive lineman **Alex Hill** is engaged to Mariah Smith, a thrower on the Illinois track and field team, with a winter 2014 wedding planned.

ILLINI SHOWING ON NEW DAKTRONICS VIDEO BOARD

Fighting Illini fans at Memorial Stadium this season will see and hear a new \$7.2 million Daktronics video display and state-of-the-art sound system. The south end zone features a new HD video display measuring 36 feet tall by 96 feet wide, nearly four times larger than the previous display. In addition, a new supplemental ribbon display hangs below the video display in the south end that measures over 50 feet wide, and two LED ribbon displays measuring more than 420 feet in length are attached to the fascia between the seating decks on each side of the field. Additional video displays measuring 17 feet by 10 feet are mounted to the northeast and southeast towers.

NIKE REBRAND IN THE WORKS

Illinois athletics is in the midst of a large-scale, 18-month brand evaluation program with Nike. The collaboration began in January 2013 and will result in an updated brand identity for 2014, including logos, marks, uniforms and equipment for all 19 Fighting Illini sports. In the meantime, the football team will be wearing a new primary orange helmet for the 2013 season. This year's orange helmet features a navy blue Block I logo on the sides in place of the slant ILLINOIS wordmark, along with navy facemasks and the traditional blue-white-blue center striping. The 2013 secondary helmet will remain the navy blue matte finish with orange Block I logo and no stripes that was introduced during the 2012 season.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

The football team once again excelled in the classroom during the 2013 spring semester, with 51 players earning at least a 3.0 grade-point average, 12 more than Spring 2012 and nine more than fall 2013. As a team, the Illini posted a 2.87 cumulative GPA, up from a 2.70 in fall 2012 and 2.71 posted in spring 2012. In addition, 16 Fighting Illini football players earned degrees in 2013, 18 earned Academic All-Big Ten status, and four were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars – DL **Houston Bates**, OL **Corey Lewis**, OL **Tyler Sands** and QB **Nathan Scheelhaase**.

TIM BECKMAN WEEKLY RADIO SHOW

The Tim Beckman radio show airs live from Houlihan's at the I Hotel in Champaign every Monday evening of a game week from 6:30-7:30 p.m. on the Illini Sports Network (tape delayed in Chicago and St. Louis at 8 p.m.). Hosted by Fighting Illini football play-by-play voice Brian Barnhart, the live show allows University of Illinois students and the Champaign-Urbana community the opportunity to meet Coach Beckman and ask questions about the Illinois football program.

- With today's win, the Illini have won 16 consecutive home openers, including the first two season openers under head coach Tim Beckman. Illinois is now 4-0 all-time against SIU, 13-0 all-time against FCS teams and 14-0 against the other public universities in the state.
- Illinois scored its first two touchdowns of the season in the span of 29 seconds in the second quarter (Josh Ferguson 53-yard TD reception, forced fumble and Donovan Young 2-yard rushing TD).
- Illinois had two 100-yard receivers (Lankford - 115, Ferguson - 103) for the first time since A.J. Jenkins (148) and Darius Millines (119) against Arkansas State on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Nathan Scheelhaase turned in a career-high 416 passing yards, which ranks as the 10th-best single-game total in school history and surpasses his previous personal best of 391 yards. His 416 yards also rank as the fifth-most ever by an Illinois quarterback at Memorial Stadium and the first 400-yard game since Juice Williams broke the Memorial Stadium record with 462 passing yards against Minnesota on Oct. 11, 2008.
- Sophomore V'Angelo Bentley notched the longest kickoff return by a single player in school history and equaled the longest touchdown in Illinois history with his 100-yard kickoff return, matching the record set by Travis Williams and Eugene Wilson, who combined for 100 yards on a lateral play, against Purdue on Oct. 12, 2002. It also marked Illinois' first kick return TD since A.J. Jenkins (96 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 18, 2008.

- With today's win over the Bearcats, Illinois improved to 1-1 all-time against Cincinnati and started the year 2-0 for the second time in the past three seasons (UI began the 2011 season 6-0).
- Following Illinois' goal-line stand that forced a turnover on downs with 7:55 left in the third quarter, the Illini out-scored the Bearcats 24-7, including scoring the game's final 17 points.
- The Illini converted 9-of-15 third downs, while holding Cincinnati to 3-of-13 on third down conversions and 0-of-2 on fourth down, including the game-changing goal-line stop in the third quarter. Illinois averaged 11.8 yards on its nine third-down conversions, with seven of the nine going for nine yards or more.
- The Orange and Blue held the Cincinnati offense under 20 points for only the second time in the past 18 games, dating back to Nov. 26, 2011. The only other team to achieve the feat was Rutgers in a 10-3 Scarlet Knight victory on Nov. 17, 2012.
- Illinois registered 40-plus points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2010 when they topped Purdue 44-10 on Oct. 30 and fell to Michigan 67-65 on Nov. 6.
- The Illini racked up 522 yards of total offense, marking their first 500-yard game since Oct. 8, 2011, at Indiana. They also notched 210 yards on the ground, their first 200-yard rushing game since Sept. 8, 2012, at Arizona State.
- Senior quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase finished 26-of-37 with 312 yards, marking the first time he has passed for 300 yards in back-to-back games in his career. - Illinois played its second-ever game at Soldier Field today in front of 47,312 fans. More than 10,000 tickets were sold in the final week leading up to the game. The only other time that the Illini have played in Soldier Field was a 10-9 loss to Washington State on Sept. 1, 1994.
- Senior quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase earned his first rushing touchdown of the year and passed for his seventh touchdown, marking his third consecutive game with multiple TDs. He now has eight career games with at least one passing and rushing touchdown.
- Senior wide receiver Ryan Lankford caught a career-long 72-yard touchdown from Scheelhaase, equalling the ninth-longest touchdown pass in school history. It is the longest touchdown reception since the 77-yard TD catch by A.J. Jenkins on Oct. 8, 2011, at Indiana.
- Lankford finished with three catches for 100 yards, marking his second 100-yard receiving game this year and the third of his career.
- Freshman Aaron Bailey recorded his second career touchdown on a career-long 10-yard rush. On the season, he has four first downs and two touchdowns on seven carries.
- Senior Miles Osei threw a career-long 35-yard pass to junior Matt LaCosse for his first pass completion of the season and fifth of his career. The play also marked a career-long reception for LaCosse.
- Senior linebacker Jonathan Brown led the Illini for the third-straight game with a season-high 15 tackles, including his first full sack and 1.5 TFLs. It marked his most tackles since posting 17 against Ohio State on Oct. 15, 2011.
- Sophomore Eaton Spence reached double-digit tackles for the first time in his career with 14 tonight, which equaled the second-most tackles by an Illini this year.

Tim Beckman is now in his second season leading the University of Illinois football program. He was named the 23rd Fighting Illini head football coach by director of athletics Mike Thomas on Dec. 9, 2011.

Beckman's first Fighting Illini team produced four 2013 NFL Draft picks – OL Hugh Thornton (third round, Colts), DT Akeem Spence (fourth round, Buccaneers), DB Terry Hawthorne (fifth round, Steelers) and DE Michael Buchanan (seventh round, Patriots) – the most by any Big Ten team.

The Illini also have excelled in the classroom under Beckman's leadership. Sixteen players earned their degrees in 2013, after 15 did so in 2012. And a record number of football student-athletes posted at least a 3.0 grade-point-average in three consecutive semesters: 39 in spring 2012, 42 in fall 2012 and 51 in spring 2013. The Illini also have been active in the community, hosting free weekly youth clinics during the season and making regular visits to local schools and hospitals throughout the year.

Prior to Illinois, Beckman spent three years as head coach at Toledo, where he led the Rockets to two bowl appearances and a Mid-American Conference West Division co-championship.

Beckman engineered an impressive turnaround at Toledo in his three years at the helm after inheriting a team that went 3-9 in 2008. The Rockets improved to 5-7 in 2009 before going 8-5 with a 7-1 record in the MAC and a berth in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl in 2010. Toledo posted an 8-4 record in 2011, including another 7-1 MAC record, a share of the MAC West Division title and a berth in the Military Bowl. In the last two seasons, Beckman compiled a 14-2 record in MAC games, second best in the conference over that span.

He has learned under some of the finest coaches in America, including Pat Dye, Urban Meyer, Mike Gundy and Jim Tressel. When he guided the Rockets to an 8-4 regular-season record and a bowl appearance in 2010, it was UT's first bowl since 2005. In addition, his last two recruiting classes at Toledo have been widely praised, earning a No. 1 ranking among MAC teams by Rivals.com in both seasons after landing two of the three four-star prospects signed by conference schools.

Beckman sent a pair of Toledo players to the NFL in defensive back Barry Church and receiver Stephen Williams in 2010. Three players earned first-team All-MAC honors in 2011, including Eric Page, who

earned first-team honors as a receiver, kick returner and punt returner.

Before accepting Toledo's head coaching position, Beckman had 21 years of experience as an assistant coach. He served as the defensive coordinator at Oklahoma State (2007-08), the cornerbacks coach at Ohio State (2005-06), the defensive coordinator/assistant head coach at Bowling Green (1998-2004), the defensive coordinator at Elon (1996-97), the secondary coach/recruiting coordinator at Western Carolina (1990-95) and a graduate assistant at Auburn (1988-89).

Beckman's two seasons as the defensive coordinator at Oklahoma State were successful, as the Cowboys posted a 16-10 record, including a 9-4 mark in 2008 and an appearance in the Holiday Bowl. In 2007, the Cowboys went 7-6, including a win over Indiana in the Insight Bowl.

At Ohio State, Beckman mentored the Buckeye cornerbacks. During his stay at Ohio State, the Buckeyes were 22-3 and played in two BCS bowl games. Along

the way, he coached six All-Big Ten defensive backs and five future NFL players. His final game as a coach with Ohio State was the 2007 BCS National Championship Game against Florida, where Beckman faced his former boss from his days at Bowling Green, Urban Meyer.

At Bowling Green, Beckman was a three-time nominee for the Frank Broyles Award, presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2001, and *College Football News* named him one of the country's top defensive coordinators. During his stay at Bowling Green, the Falcons won two bowl games, a MAC East division title and finished ranked in the national polls in 2003.

Beckman began his coaching career in 1988 as a graduate assistant at Auburn, where he earned his master's degree in education. His first full-time coaching job came at Western Carolina, where he coached the secondary and served as recruiting coordinator from 1990-95. Beckman then served as the defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator
