### **LOOKING BACK**

**TJ Sanders** matched a career-high with five goals and **Matt Sexton** produced his first multi-goal game en route to the Penn State men's lacrosse team's 9-8 win over Marist on Tuesday, the programs' first meeting.

### SAVED!

Connor Darcey has been a stalwart in the cage this season, his first season as a starter. In Penn State's game at Harvard, Darcey made 18 saves, the most for a Nittany Lion since 2012 and the highest number on the day for a Big Ten goalie. In his first collegiate start, against Vermont, Darcey made 15 saves, the most of any Big Ten goalie in action during the day en route to his first collegiate win. His efforts earned him the first-ever Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week award. Currently, Darcey leads the Big Ten with 12.83 saves per game, which ranks eighth nationally.

### **SANDERS STANDS OUT**

Since joining the Nittany Lions as a freshman in 2013, a Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year campaign, **TJ Sanders** has been one of Penn State's most reliable attackmen. He has scored in all but six games since his debut in the Blue and White, scoring multiple goals in 22 games. Sanders is currently third in the Big Ten with 2.50 goals per game, fourth with 8.00 shots per game and fifth with 3.50 points per game.

### AROUND THE HORN

To start the season, 13-or-more Nittany Lions have scored at least one goal. **TJ Sanders** leads the team with 15 goals. **Matt Florence** has netted nine and fellow middies **Nick Aponte** and **Mike Sutton** 

have six and nine goals respectively. **Pat Manley** has five goals, and **Dan Craig** has four markers, **Matt Sexton** has a trio of tallies, **Drake Kreinz**, **Kyle Baier**, and **Brian Prestreau** have recorded a pair of goals and **Ryan Guittare**, **Tripp Traynor** and **James Burke** each scored a goal.

### AND THE HOME TEAM WINS

Being the home team comes with perks, and the Nittany Lions have taken advantage. This season, Penn State is 3-0 when acting as the host, with wins against Vermont (15-8), No. 16/11 Penn (14-11) and Marist (9-8) at Babson College. As the home team, the Nittany Lions have out-scored their opponents 38-27, versus being out-scored 31-22 as the visitor.

### ON THE OFFENSE

Following a six-point performance in a 14-11 home victory over then-No. 16/11 Penn, **TJ Sanders** captured Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week accolades. This is the first-ever Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor for a Nittany Lion. Sanders scored four goals and assisted on the eventual game-winner late in the second quarter and a fourth quarter tally, helping Penn State to its first win over a ranked team this season. The contest marked the junior's 20th multi-goal game, and tied his career high for points, goals and assists. Additionally, Sanders took 12 shots, a single-game high for a Nittany Lion this season and a personal best, and picked up three ground balls against the Quakers.

### SCOUTING THE MINUTEMEN

UMass (1-4) has faced a tough test to kick off its 2015 campaign, with four of its first six opponents ranked in the top-20. The Minutemen earned their first win of the year on March 10, a convincing 18-5 effort over Quinnipiac. Peter Lindley and Nick Mariano paced the attack with five points each, and Noah Rak went 15-5 at the 'X'. Lindley and Mariano have a team-best 12 goals apiece, but Mariano's nine helpers top the squad for 21 points to lead UMass. The team's defense has been effective, ranking 14th nationally with 7.83 caused turnovers per game. Zach Oliveri has started every game in the cage, posting a 12.70 goals against average alongside a .484 save percentage.

Aponte surpassed his career high in ground balls
(7), James Burke scored the first goal of his
three-year Nittany Lion career, also recording his
first career point, junior James Chakey had career
performances for ground balls (4) and caused
turnovers (1), sophomores Tyler Chambers and
Dan Craig each caused his first turnovers while
wearing the Blue and White, junior TJ Sanders
took a career-best 12 shots and sophomore Mike
Sutton's five ground balls was a career showing.

### **SWEET FLO**

Matt Florence has made an immediate impact since transferring to Penn State this year. He has scored 1.8 goals per game and recorded 3.25 points per game, which put him eighth and ninth in the Big Ten, and his 0.409 shot percentage ranks third in the conference. He had a four-goal outing against Penn and scored a hat trick and added two assists in the season opener against Vermont, the first three-goal performance in a Penn State debut since 2002. He also scored the game's first goal at Loyola and added additional assists against the Greyhounds and at Villanova.

### **CLEAR VISIBILITY**

For the first year of Big Ten Lacrosse, the Nittany Lions will be available to more people than ever before. All of Penn State's Big Ten games will be broadcast live on television. The Ohio State and Johns Hopkins games will air on ESPNU, and the Maryland, Rutgers and Michigan games are slated for the Big Ten Network. The Big Ten Network will also show every contest of the Big Ten Men's Lacrosse Tournament.

### **ROAD WARRIORS**

For the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, the Nittany Lions will be faced with a huge test. Just four of Penn State's games will be played in Happy Valley, the fewest of any Big Ten team. Penn State also plays a pair of neutral site games against Marist (at Babson College) and Denver (at Hofstra), alongside seven true road games.

### PENN STATE OPENS 2015 WITH 15-8 WIN

Two Nittany Lions recorded hat tricks and **Connor Darcey** earned the first win in the first start of his collegiate career, leading the No. 14/17 Penn State men's lacrosse team to a season-opening 15-8 win over Vermont on Feb. 7. Penn State's offensive output was evenly distributed throughout the game. In both the third and fourth quarters, the Blue and White scored four goals, and put five past the Catamounts in the opening 15 minutes.

## **PSU VOTED THIRD IN BIG TEN POLL**Penn State has been picked to finish third

Academic All-Big Ten honorees **JP Burnside, Drake Kreinz** and **TJ Sanders** were named
Penn State's Players to Watch. Sitting atop the preseason list was preseason No. 5
Johns Hopkins, which made its record 42nd
NCAA Tournament appearance in 2014.
Earning berths to the second-most NCAA
postseasons at 37, preseason No. 8 Maryland came in second. Ohio State, Rutgers and
Michigan rounded out the poll.

### **RICHARDS DRAFTED IN MLL**

Senior **Michael Richards** was tabbed 45th overall in the 2015 Major League Lacrosse (MLL) Collegiate Draft by the Denver Outlaws on Jan. 23 in Baltimore. Richards joins Shane Sturgis (New York Lizards) and Tom LaCrosse (Ohio Machine), both of whom exhausted eligibility in 2014 and were picked in the 2015 Supplemental Draft, as selections by one of the MLL's eight teams in the U.S.A. and Canada. Richards appeared in all of the Nittany Lions' contests last season, making 10 starts in the midfield. The 2014 Academic All-Big Ten honoree recorded six points, collected 20 ground balls and caused four turnovers.

### TAMBRONI IN HIS FIFTH SEASON

Guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni is in his fifth season as Penn State's head coach in 2015. With a 35-24 record, Tambroni has guided his Nittany Lion teams to .500-or-better records in each of his four seasons at the helm.

Guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni is in his fifth season as Penn State's head coach in 2015.

In 2014, Tambroni led Penn State to its fourth consecutive above-.500 season. His student-athletes earned the eighth USILA All-American and third Scholar All-America honors of Tambroni's Penn State career. He also coached goalkeeper Austin Kaut to his school record third All-America honor and conference-best All-CAA First Team award.

Penn State's 2013 campaign saw Tambroni lead Penn State to one of the greatest seasons in program history while celebrating its 100th season. The Nittany Lions set new records for wins (12) and earned the program's first outright regular season conference title by sweeping the CAA with a 6-0 record. PSU rattled off 10 straight wins during the months of March, April and May to earn the school's third NCAA bid and first chance to host an NCAA game.

Tambroni was named CAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2011), while goalkeeper Austin Kaut (under Tambroni's tutelage) was named Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalie. Also, Kaut was CAA Player and Defensive Player of the Year. Freshman TJ Sanders was named Rookie of the Year and the Nittany Lions placed six on the All-CAA First Team.

During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a second-place CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees.

Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.

During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.
