THE GAME: After a weekend off, Penn State will return to the Jordan Center to face Michigan for the second time in 10 days on Wednesday. Michigan posted a 79-71 victory in Ann Arbor behind a season-best 29 points from Trey Burke on Feb. 17. Penn State had a season-best equaling four players score in double-figures in that game led by a career-best 17 from Sasa Borovnjak and 17 from Jermaine Marshall. Michigan leads the series 28-11 and has won the last five meetings. Penn State is 6-11 vs. Michigan in State College, last winning, 73-58, in 2009. Michigan has won in its last three trips to the BJC. Penn State is seeking its first conference win of the season.

SENIOR NIGHT: Penn State will honor senior players Sasa Borovnjak and Nick Colella as well as senior managers Ryan Hughes, Brian Grossman, Raymar McClain and John Ball. Borovnjak enters Wednesday playing the best basketball of his career, posting three-straight double-digit scoring games and back-to-back career highs (17). He has played in 76 games and scored 350 points while recording more than 200 rebounds. Colella, who joined the team as a walk-on after playing two seasons at Division III Penn State-Behrend, has started the last eight straight games and 15 on his career. He has played in 52 contests recording more than 170 points and 45 three-pointers in his three seasons (one a redshirt) at the main campus, and was named a team captain in his senior campaign.

NOTES TO KNOW:

• PSU has shot better than 43% in each of its last three games, its longest such string since doing so in four straight games Dec. 5-Dec. 23.

 PSU has tied a season high with 8 threes in two of its last three game (vs. Iowa & at Illinois). The Lions shot a season-best 47.1% (8-17) from three vs. Iowa and 42.1% (8-19) at Illinois marking just the third time over 40% from the arc on the year.

• PSU has lost it last three games by an average of 5.0 ppg and its last six by 7.8 ppg. The Lions have been outscored at the free throw line by 11.8 ppg over the last six.

• Four of PSU's last 6 opponents have attempted 35+ free throws and opponents are averaging 34 free throws per game over that stretch.

• PSU has had seven BIG opponents record 30+ attempts at the foul line and 11 record 25+. Only one (Nebraska at home) has less than 20 in a game.

• PSU's last two outing, losses at Illinois and at Michigan, are the first B1G game the Lions did not trail by double-digits in on the year.

• D.J. Newbill ranks second in assists and fourth in scoring in B1G conference games and is the ONLY Big Ten player to appear in the conference statistical rankings for Big Ten games in scoring, rebounding (18th) and assists.

• Jermaine Marshall posted his third 20-point game of the season (20) at Illinois and equaled a career-best four threes on a season-best 4-of-8 from the arc.

• Sasa Borovnjak has posted a career high 17 points in each of his last two games and a career best three-straight double-digit outings in B1G play. He is posting 16.0 ppg while shooting 74.1% from the floor in his last three games.

• Nick Colella leads PSU hitting 4-of-7 (57%) from three over the last two games while posting 7.5 ppg, 4.0 rpg & 2.5 apg over that stretch.

• Newbill (10) or Marshall (11) have led the Lions in scoring in 21 of the 23 games since Tim Frazier went down with injury.

• D.J. Newbill ranks third in the Big Ten with 172 free throw attempts trailing only Cody Zeller (194) and Aaron White (190). Brandon Paul (163) is the only other player within 25 attempts. Newbill has gotten to the foul line at least once in 53 of 56 career games.

• Newbill (4th, 15.9 ppg) and Marshall (5th, 15.4 ppg) are the 2nd highest scoring tandem in Big Ten games (31.3 ppg), tied with Indiana's Cody Zeller and Victor Oladipo (31.3) and behind Michigan's Trey Burke and Tim Hardaway Jr. (34.3)

Penn State out-shot (43%-39%), out-rebounded (34-25) and made more threes (8-7) than the Illini while getting 20 points from Jermaine Marshall and a career high equaling 17 from Sasa Borovnjak but couldn't overcome a 14-point scoring deficit at the foul line (23-9) and 16 turnovers in falling, 64-59, in Champaign. The Lions were whistled for a season-high 31 fouls and Illinois held a 36-16 free throw advantage. Penn State took an early 9-2 lead and led for most of the first 10 minutes. Illinois closed the first half on a 14-5 run to lead 29-20 at the half. Penn State used a 10-2 run to start the second to get within one. Illinois stretched its lead back to eight, but the Lions would play within a four to six point margin for most of the last seven minutes, getting within three twice, the last time on a Marshall three with four seconds to play. D.J. Richardson (18) and Brandon Paul (16) led Illinois, which scored its final nine points at the foul line.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN: The No. 7-ranked Wolverines have climbed as high as the No. 1 ranking. They are coming off a 71-58 victory over Illinois in Ann Arbor Sunday and bring a 23-4 (10-4 Big Ten) mark into Wednesday. National Player of the Year candidate Trey Burke led UM with 26 points vs. Illinois and had 29 in their previous win over Penn State. His leads UM and is second in the Big Ten posting 18.9 ppg and leads the Big Ten with 6.9 assists per game. Tim Hardaway Jr., ranks fifth in the Big Ten posting 15.1 ppg and freshman Nik Stauskas (11.8) and Glenn Robinson III (11.3) also average double-figures in the starting line-up. Three UM players have 50+ threes led by Stauskas' 63. UM committs just 9.5 turnovers per game and shoots 49% from the floor.

TIME vs. Michigan in State College, L 71-65, March 4, 2012

Michigan came out hot shooting 70% from the floor and 7-of-10 from three in the first half to take as much as an 18-point lead before going to the locker room up 39-28. PSU played well early and led 17-16 when Tim Frazier picked up his second foul and went to the bench at 11:30 of the first. UM went on a 15-2 run. The Wolverines built their lead to 19 with 9:04 to play in the second, before Penn State got hot behind the play of Jermaine Marshall and used a 13-0 run to make it a game. Marshall scored nine points in the run and finished with 27 points and eight boards. PSU got within 4, 62-58, on a Marshall jumper with 2:38 to play, but no closer as UM hit 10-of-18 from three and 59% for the game led by 19 from Trey Burke and 17 from Evan Smotrycz. Ross Travis had a career-high 15 for PSU.

OUTLET PASSES (PLAYERS) JERMAINE MARSHALL posted his 7th career 20-point

game (3rd of the season) with 20 at Illinois. He had a career high 29 points & 10 rebounds vs. Michigan State, for his first career double-double. He posted his second with 14 points and career-best 10 assists vs. Iowa. He has led the Lions in scoring in 11 games on the year. He leads the team with 45 threes, 40 steals and 88 deflections and is second with 64 assists

■ D.J. NEWBILL posted his first double-double at Penn State with a career high 23 points and 12 rebounds vs. Duquesne. He has scored in double-digits in 23 of 26 games on the year, including a career high 27 vs. MSU. His EIGHT 20-point games on the year rank third in the Big Ten and his seven career double-doubles (six at Southern Miss.) are tied for fourth-most among active Big Ten players.

■ ALAN WISNIEWSKI played the first significant minutes of his career at Nebraska and the junior walk-on posted six points and eight rebounds in 17 minutes. He has seen first half action the last four games.

■ ROSS TRAVIS has led the team in rebounding in 16 games and has six double-digit rebounding games on the year, including a career-best tying 13 at Nebraska, 11 at Wisconsin and 10 at Michigan. He is fifth in the Big Ten posting 7.0 rpg. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year as a freshman.

■ ROSS TRAVIS posted his third double-double on the year with 11 points and 10 rebounds at Michigan. He led Penn State with 10 rebounds and added 11 points vs. Akron in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off for his first career double-double and had 14 points and 10 rebounds vs. Army

■ JON GRAHAM posted two blocks in three straight Big Ten games and leads the team with 23 on the season. He blocked a total of 19 shots last year to lead the team.

■ JON GRAHAM trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for the season and added four inches to his vertical He maintains a team-best 24 reps on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best

Former walk-on NICK COLELLA was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started sixstraight games in the Big Ten. He has started eight straight Big Ten games this year for 14 total career starts in Big Ten play. He posted a career-best 15 points on 5-of-7 from three vs. Duquesne.

Freshman BRANDON TAYLOR arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds. He sculpted his body in the late summer and preseason and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the season.

OUTLET PASSES (TEAM) Penn State has attempted 79 more field goals than op-

ponents in B1G games.

Penn State was whistled for 31 fouls in its loss at Illinois, the most in two seasons under coach Patrick Chambers. PSU has been whistled for 93 more fouls than opponents in Big Ten games.

■ D.J. Newbill and Jermaine Marshall have each posted double-figure scoring in 12-of-14 B1G games, Newbill in the last 10 straight. Sasa Borovnjak joined Newbill and Marshall in double-digits vs. Iowa (2/14) for the first B1G game with more than two players in double-figures on the season. The Lions followed that game with four players in double-digits at Michigan (2/17) and have had three or more in the last three.

PSU has posted 19 games with double-digit offensive boards and is second in the B1G collecting 73.6% of all defensive rebounds

Penn State is averaging 64.7 ppg at home, eclipsing 70 six times, and 56.1 ppg on the road this season, with a high of 67 at Iowa and 71 at Michigan

Penn State held Purdue without a three (0-10) and is now allowing just 5.6 threes per game in Big Ten play. The Lions gave up 7.9 per game in Big Ten play last year

D.J. Newbill ranks second (36.1) and Jermaine Marshall seventh (34.6) in minutes played in the Big Ten.

Penn State's eight threes vs. Iowa and at Illinois tied a season high and marked the most in Big Ten play to date. The Lions have eclipsed five threes Big Ten play just four times. The Lions average 4.5 per game in B1G games.

Penn State shot a season best 47.1% (8-17) from three vs. Iowa and 42.1% (8-19) at Illinois, eclipsing 40% from three for just the third time on the season. The Lions are shooting 27.6% from the arc in conference games. The Lions have shot less than 40% from the arc in 23 games and less than 30% in 12 on the year.

Penn State is 4-3 in games decided by seven points or less on the year, including two overtime wins. The Lions went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year, having just one home loss come by more than six points.

Penn State has allowed 14 opponents to eclipse 70 points, winning three of those games, and having 11 losses on the year come to opponents scoring 70+. Penn State is 4-24 under Patrick Chambers when opponents break 70 points.

Five of Penn State's eight primary contributors (following the loss of Tim Frazier) are freshmen or sophomores, including three of the top five scorers and rebounders.

Penn State has fielded one of the nation's youngest squads the last two years. This year, two sophomores and a freshman have been in the starting line-up acounting for 72 of 125 starts on the year. Last year eight of 10 primary contributors were in their first or second season of Division I play.

NOT THAT FAR: Eight of Penn State's 14 Big Ten losses have been by single digits, including each of the last three by an average margin of 5.0 ppg. The five of the Lions last six losses have been by single digits with an average margin of 7.8 ppg. The Lions have lost just two games by 20 points or more in the Big Ten.

WARMING UP FROM THREE: Penn State has made a season-high equaling eight threes in two of its last three games and posted its two best three-point shooting percentages on the year hitting 47.1% (8-17) vs. lowa and 42.1% (8-19) at Illinois. The Lions have outscored four opponents and equaled one from the arc in the last six games

THE LAST THREE GAMES: • PSU has had three or more players score in double-figures in every game after having no more than two in the first 11 Big Ten games • PSU is scoring 67.3 ppg, well above its season average of 61.2. . The Lions are outshooting opponents 40% to 30% from three, and shooting well above their season average of 28% from the arc. • PSU is shooting 44% from the floor vs. 38.8% for the season. • PSU has posted season highs of 17 assists and 15 assists in the stretch and is posting 14.3 assists vs. 11.7 turnovers in the games compared to a 9.6 to 12.8 mark on the year. . Three Lions are posting better than 16 pts per game over the span: Jermaine Marshall (17.0), D.J. Newbill (16.3) and Sasa Borovnjak (16.0).

70+ POINTS: Penn State's three 70-point games in Big Ten play are its most since posting four in 2010. The Lions have seven 70+ point outings on the year, equaling the seven posted last year, with one in Big Ten play.

FOUL LINE DEFICIT: Penn State is being outscored 20.8 to 12.3 ppg at the foul line by Big Ten foes, having been outscored at the foul line in every Big Ten game so far. Big Ten opponents have made (291) more free throws than PSU has taken (242) and have 177 more attempts. Seven Big Ten foes have shot 30 or more free throws and 11 have attempted 25 or more.

LIONS FIND OFFENSIVE BALANCE/POST 70 IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES: Penn State posted

two of its best efforts of the season in close losses to lowa (74-72) and at No. 4 Michigan (79-71), logging 70 points in back-to-back Big Ten games for the first time since the 2006 season. The 71 points at Michigan marked the most in a Big Ten road game since an 81-70 win at Northwestern on Feb. 17, 2010. After playing the first 11 Big Ten games with no more than two players reaching double-figure scoring in a game and averaging 54.8 ppg, the Lions have had three or more reach the mark in the last three games. PSU's four at Michigan were the Lions' most since four scored in doubledigits vs. New Hampshire on Dec. 23.

Newbill on pace to finish the 2012-13 campaign with around 800 career points each, they could give the Lions three 1,000-point games on the floor during the 2014 Big Ten season. What will be a combination of two seniors and a junior with more than 250 games played and 170 career starts under their belts prior to the 2013-14 campaign, they could bring combined career totals of more than 3,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 800 assists to the floor during the 2014 Big Ten season.

D0 IT ALL D.J.: Sophomore D.J. Newbill was selected a team captain before he ever played a game for Penn State after he excelled in a redshirt season upon transferring from Southern Mississippi. With the loss of Tim Frazier to injury in the fourth game, he was thrust into point guard duties and in that role has produced in a major way in virtually every category for Penn State:

He leads the team in scoring, assists, minutes, free throws and free throw attempts.

■ He ranks second in rebounding and steals and is the team's top defender often assigned to corral an opponent's top threat, including match-ups such as guarding 6-8 lowa forward Aaron White.

He is a strong and vocal leader on and off the floor

TIM FRAZIER INJURY: WHAT'S MISSING

■ TIM FRAZIER was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier was named a first-team All-Big Ten selection last year after leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4).

■ stands 6th on the Penn State career assist charts with 459 after posting a record 198 last year and is 151 assists shy of breaking the all-time career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992.

■ scored 208 field goals and had 198 assists to lead the nation being involved in 58.4% of Penn State's field goals last year. Only two other players in Division I were involved in 50% or more of their teams scoring.

■ was the ONLY player in NCAA Division I to post at least 17 points and 6 rebounds a game last year.

■ had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, including 15 of 19 games vs. Big Ten opponents, and scored 20 or more points in 9 of his last 13 games before his injury. Was averaging 21.7 ppg through the first three games of the season.

WALK-ON MINUTES: Three players that joined Penn State as walk-ons have seen significant action in Big Ten play. Nick Colella (now on scholarship), Kevin Montminy and Alan Wisniewski all have played first half minutes in the last FOUR games, and in fact were all on the floor at once in the first half at No. 4 Michigan, and are part of the Lions' nine man rotation. Colella has started eight straight games and is averaging 25.2 mpg while posting 3.9 ppg and 2.5 rpg while playing in every Big Ten game. Montminy has seen action in 12 Big Ten games while playing 3.0 mpg, including a career high 12 vs. Northwestern and first half minutes in NINE games. Wisniewski joined the rotation at Nebraska (2/9) and posted six points and eight rebounds. He has played first half minutes in each of the last four games.

NEWBILL LONE PLAYER TO APPEAR IN THREE

BIG TEN RANKINGS: D.J. Newbill has tied a career best posting double-digit scoring in the last 10 straight games and now stands second in Big Ten games posting 4.1 assists per game. He stands fourth in Big Ten games in scoring (15.9) and 18th in rebounding (5.1) making him THE ONLY BIG TEN PLAYER to appear in the rankings of those three categories in conference play. During his 10-game double-digit scoring run he has three of his eight 20-point games on the year during the stretch (including season highs of 27 points vs. Michigan State and 26 vs. lowa) and posted a career-best 3-of-5 (60%) from three vs. lowa.

NEWBILL ON POINT: D.J. Newbill, a natural offguard, has taken over point guard duties since the injury to Tim Frazier in the fourth game of the season. He is logging big minutes at the position playing 36.1 per game to rank second in the Big Ten.

• He posted his best floor game with just one turnover and six assists to go with 15 points in 39 minutes vs. Ohio State's Aaron Craft (1/26).

 He has posted double-digit points in 23 of 26 games, including a current career-best equaling string of 10 straight, with EIGHT 20-point outings, including a career high 27 vs. Michigan State (1/16) and 26 vs. Iowa (2/14).

• He has led the Lions in scoring 10 times since Frazier's injury with career highs on four occasions, 23 points and 12 rebounds vs. Duquesne for his first double-double at PSU and seventh career.

CHAMBERS DONATES \$14,200 TO THON: Penn State coach Patrick Chambers presented a check for \$14,200 at Penn State Dance Marathon 2013 shortly before the team departed to take on No. 4 Michigan in February. Chambers had pledged to donate \$10 for every Penn State student that attended a Feb. 14 home contest with Iowa. THON 2013 was held Feb. 15-17 in the Jordan Center with over 700 dancers and thousands of student volunteers taking part in the 46-hour event. The world's largest student run philanthropy, THON raised a record of more than \$12.3 million this year and has raised more than \$100 million since its inception in 1977 to support the Four Diamonds Fund at Penn State Hershev Children's Hospital.

A NEW MARSHALL IN TOWN: Junior Jermaine Marshall has emerged as not only one of Penn State's main offensive weapons, ranking 5th in Big Ten games scoring 15.4 ppg, but a primary ball handler, sharing duties at the point with D.J. Newbill, and a generator of turnovers, leading the team with 40 steals (6th in the Big Ten, 1.5 spg) and 88 deflections.

· Posted his third 20-point game of the year with 20 at Illinois on a season-best 4-of-8 from three. The four three tied a career high. · He has led Penn State is scoring 11 times on the year while posting 21 double-digit outings.

· Averaging 1.7 ppg and 2.4 rpg in the first seven games of the season prior to declaring this his final season, he has raised his averages to 8.4 ppg and 3.1 rpg in Big Ten games. · He has posted the best stretch of his career over the last three games posting a careerbest equaling three straight-double digit outings and back-to-back career-best 17-point outings. He is shooting 74% (20-27) from the floor while scoring 16.0 ppg over the stretch of games vs. Iowa and at Michigan and Illinois.

• Tied a career high with 17 points on 7-of-10 (70%) shooting at Illinois, including scoring the Lions first six points of the game.

WHAT A WONDERFUL WIZ HE WAS: Junior walk-on Alan Wisniewski (6-9) saw the first significant action of his career at Nebraska (2/9) and delivered with six points and eight rebounds in 17 minutes of play. It marked his first career points and rebounds in a game for the Michigan native who is an Industrial Engineering major and holds a job making sandwiches at a downtown Quiznos. Wisniewski is the fourth current or former walk-on to play first half minutes for Penn State this season joining Nick Colella, Kevin Montminy and Kevin Onyeaka.

GET HIM A CUT MAN: Sophomore walk-on **Kevin Montminy** has earned a reputation as one of the toughest and hardest working Nittany Lions with a history of playing with all out abandon in practice and in games. Twice this season he has required stitches following a diving play in practice. He suffered a two-inch gash in his his right shin after flying into the arena stands in mid-January. He played in a game two days after the injury and still wears a wrap on the leg to protect the injury. In practice on Feb. 13 he again went flying and suffered a cut to his head that required stitches. The following day in a game vs. Iowa (Feb. 14) he suffered a cut above his eye which was glued together. • Montminy has played first half minutes in NINE Big Ten games this season.

- He posted a career day vs. Iowa scoring five points on 2-of-2 shooting (one three).
- He has scored in five Big Ten games, making a three in three of them.
 He played a career high 12 minutes vs. Northwestern and six at No. 4 Michigan.

• Montminy grew up and went to school in Penns Valley, just 20 minutes from the Bryce Jordan Center. He was valedictorian (4.0) at Penns Valley HS and the schoo's all-time leding scorer (1,498).

DEFENDING THE THREE: Penn State has made considerable improvement in limiting opponent's threes, including an 0-10 effort by Purdue (2/5) for the first opponent shutout from the arc since November of 2006. Penn State is giving up just 5.6 threes per game to Big Ten opponents, a big improvement over the 7.9 per game allowed last season to Big Ten foes and 8.0 per game allowed in the non-conference season this year. The Lions have held seven Big Ten foes to five threes or less.

OFFENSE CLICKS VS IOWA: For the first time in a Big Ten game, Penn State had three players reach double-figure scoring in a close 74-72 loss to Iowa. D.J. Newbill (26), Jermaine Marshall (14) and Sasa Borovnjak (14) carried the scoring as Penn State posted a season-best 47.1% from three and equaled a season-high with eight threes, led by a career best three from Newbill. The Lions' 17 assists, led by a career high 10 from Marshall, marked the most ever recorded in two seasons under coach Patrick Chambers, and more than in the previous two games combined.

72 VS. MSU ENDS BIG TEN SCORING DROUGHT: Penn State's 47 points against Michigan State in the second half marked a high for a half in two seasons under Coach Chambers. The Lions eclipsed 70 points for the fifth time on the season and fifth in a stretch of seven home game. The 72 points and 48% shooting marked a PSU high in Big Ten play on the year. MSU entered the game ranked second in the Big Ten in scoring defense (57.7 ppg) and defensive shooting percentage (37.6%) and had allowed just one opponent to reach 70, a 74-70 win over Boise State. PSU posted 78.5 ppg in its final four non-conference games, but failed to eclipse 54 points in its first four Big Ten games, posting 49.5 ppg over that stretch. The Lions had logged three straight games with season lows in shooting (31.7% vs. Indiana, 31.6% vs. Northwestern in the Jordan Center and 25.9% (the lowest mark under Patrick Chambers) at Purdue) prior to the MSU game. The Lions 42 points in the loss at Purdue marked the fewest scored in two seasons under head coach Patrick Chambers.

FOUR STRAIGHT 70-POINT GAMES TO CLOSE NON-CON: Penn State posted its four best point (78, 80, 72 & 84) and assist totals (13, 15, 13 & 12) of the season in the last four non-conference games and three of its top for shooting games. The Lions shot 47% and scored 78.5 ppg in the last four non-con outings, an increase of nearly 20 ppg over their 58.9 ppg average over the first eight games of the year. The Lions' streak of four straight games of 70+ points was their longest since posting seven in November and December of 2008 and their 84-point outing vs. Duquesne in the final non-con game was their most since 2009.

■ Penn State went 6-2 in the eight non-con games after losing do-everything guard Tim Frazier to a season-ending Achilles injury. The Lions 8-4 record in the non-con season equaled their win total from last year (8-5), despite losing Frazier early in the fourth game of the year.

FRAZIER REHAB GOING VERY WELL 12 WEEKS IN: Tim Frazier had successful surgery to repair his ruptured left Achilles tendon on Nov. 20. and has since focused on two-week incremental goals set by team trainer Jon Salazer. He hit the eight-week milestone since the surgery on Jan. 15 and marked the day by no longer requiring use of a walking boot. He will wear a wedge under his left heel for the next month as he continues to stretch the tendon. Now in week 12, he is currently running in a pool two days a week and continuing rehab to stretch the tendon and remove scar tissue. He began working on an elliptical machine the week of Feb. 11 and is expected to begin walking on a weight suspended treadmill (Ultra G) this week. He will begin jumping rope in weeks 14 to 18 post surgery. Frazier was in a cast for about three weeks before moving to a walking boot that gradually flattened his foot as the tendon stretched. He is expected to have about a six-month recovery period and, at the completion of the 2012-13 campaign, will apply for an NCAA Hardship Waiver to return for the 2013-14 season.

CHAMBERS & THE POST-SEASON: Coach Patrick Chambers missed having a team play in the post-season for the first time in his collegiate coaching career last season and has been a part of the post-season in seven of his eight seasons as a collegiate coach. In his previous five seasons as a member of the Villanova coaching staff and two as head coach at Boston University, all of his teams reached post-season play including six NCAA Tournament appearances and one CBI appearance. Chambers has been a part of 17 NCAA Tournament games, helping Villanova advance to the tournament every year and make four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and reach the 2009 NCAA Final Four. In his first season at BU, he guided the Terriers to their first post-season win since 1959 with a victory in the CBI and the following year led BU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2002.

WE CAN RELATE: Penn State coach Patrick Chambers can relate to star guard Tim Frazier's recent injury, in fact Frazier is using the exact same motorized scooter Chambers used this summer after he underwent arthroplastic surgery to repair the knee joint on his left leg and was limited to riding the scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and the use of crutches for two months. Chambers has said the insertion of a wedge and six screws to re-align his knee joint was one of the toughest things he's had to deal with and will use the recent experience to help guide Frazier through his rehabilitation. Frazier's sister, Krystal, also suffered a ruptured Achilles, during a standout basketball career at Rice that saw her earn All-Conference USA honors. She returned from the injury to post 10 ppg in her senior season.

FRAZIER REMAINS ACTIVE LEADER: Since his season-ending Achilles injury, Tim Frazier has remained a vocal and active presence on the team attending every practice and shouting instructions and pulling teammates aside during breaks in the action. He is a virtual assistant coach in games, even delivering the pre-game scout in the locker room prior to the win over Delaware State. He has been particularly active in helping to guide D.J. Newbill in his transition to the point guard position. The pair room together on road trips and often watch film of previous games against the upcoming opponent the night before the game in their room, with Frazier helping to point out tendencies and opportunities for Newbill to attack.

FRAZIER SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY: Senior guard Tim Frazier, a preseason candidate for both the Wooden and Naismith national player of the year awards, will miss the remainder of the 2012-13 season due to an injury suffered in the Nittany Lions' third game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in Bayamon, Puerto Rico. Frazier had played in every game (101) the last three plus seasons. He suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon in his left leg and the 2012 first-team All-Big Ten guard underwent surgery to repair the injury on Nov. 20. A preseason All-Big Ten selection, Frazier was leading Penn State with 21.7 ppg and 5.0 apg per game and was second with 6.0 rebounds per game through three games. He suffered the injury in the Nittany Lions' fourth game, a Nov. 18 contest vs. Akron in Puerto Rico, leaving the floor at the 14:30 mark of the first half. Frazier, a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection on schedule to graduate in May with a degree in Supply Chain and Information Systems from the Smeal College of Business; is eligible to apply for an NCAA medical Hardship Waiver after the completion of the 2012-13 campaign. He had posted 25 straight double-digit scoring game, 14 of which were 20+ point outings, and had led Penn State in scoring in 28 of the last 35 games, scoring 20+ points in nine of his last 13, prior to the Akron game.

FRAZIER NAMED TO WOODEN TOP 50: Tim Frazier was named to the Wooden Award Men's Preseason Top 50. He is the second Nittany Lion in the last three years to be named to the preseason list joining Talor Battle who was named prior to the 2010-11 season. Frazier was among nine Big Ten players named to the list.

FRAZIER PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN: Senior guard Tim Frazier was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. Frazier, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was joined on the preseason team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was also named the preseason POY.

BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

TIM FRAZIER: Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine bests...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State.

JON GRAHAM: Added four inches to his vertical leap...added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20..increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

ROSS TRAVIS: In the past year, Travis has increased his bench press max from 245 to 310 and his reps on the 185-pound bench from 10 to 22. He increased his leg press max from 325 to 615 and added 2.5 inches to his vertical (31.5). He increased his weight from 203 to 220 while maintaining his body fat and can touch a team-best 16 inches above the rim.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Cut his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent...Improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

CHAMBERS HAS AN EVENTFUL OFF-SEASON: It was an eventful off-season for head coach Patrick Chambers as he and wife, Courtney, welcomed their third child, Caitlin, to the family on March 23, he underwent reconstructive knee surgery on his left leg on May 11 and his father, John "Rube", passed away on June 11 after a long battle with Alzheimers. Chambers underwent arthroplastic surgery, which involved resetting the top of the tibla below the knee to change the angle of the joint. The energetic coach was limited to riding a scooter and non-weight bearing crutches for six weeks and was on crutches for two months. He began walking short distances without crutches on July 6 and after months of rehab returned to normal mobility in August.

STAFF TIES: Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's. Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

GET ON THE FLOOR: Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices and games to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points" during every practice and game and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor, screen assists, shot contests, tap backs, deflections, etc.

GAME NOTES

CHAMBERS A VERY ACTIVE & VISIBLE PRESENCE IN THE COMMUNITY:

Since arriving on campus in June of 2011, Penn State coach Patrick Chambers has made a tremendous effort to form a bond with the Penn State community and has been a very active and visible presence throughout his two seasons leading the Nittany Lion program. Some of the hildplights:

■ Donated \$14,200 to THON 2013 after pleding \$10 for every Penn State student that attended the Nittany Lions game with Iowa on Feb. 14, 2013. Presented the check to a packed Jordan Center prior to event kickoff.

■ Went behind the counter to serve 200 free Big Macs, at a personal cost of \$800, at a downtown State College Mc-Donald's after a Lions 67-51 home victory over Nebraska in 2012 in which PSU held the ball instead of shoot in the final minutes. A Penn State promotion promises free Big Macs to all ticket holders when the Lions score 70.

■ Kicked off the "No Hair, Don't Care" fund raising effort in support of THON 2013, by being the first to shave his head after being e-mailed by a Penn State freshman student.

Paid for several student's season tickets on the spot during several appearances at the student union during a week-long student season basketball ticket sale prior to the 2012-13 season.

Dressed as standout out Nittany Lion linebacker Michael Mauti and made a flying tackle of a tackling dumby to kickoff a 2012 Rally In The Valley event in Rec Hall prior to Penn State's clash with Ohio State. Also addressed Penn State's Nittanyville student section outside the gates of Beaver Stadium dressed in football gear and eye black just prior to the Lions 2011 clash with Alabama. He regularly delivers pizzas to Nittanyville during football season.

Served as co-chairman of the 2012 Toys For Tots campaign and participated with Penn State players in wrapping gifts during the holiday season.

Has served as honorary starter/host for numerous events around State College including: The Resolution 5K (New Year's eve), Alzheimer's Walk, Autism Speaks 5K and CVC 5K among many.

Traveled with five players to visit the Hershey Cancer Institute, a two-hour drive from State College, and deliver presents and encouragement to both adult and pediatric cancer patients.

Ordered two Nittany Lion Basketball golf carts and makes regular spur-of-the-moment trips on campus distributing Tshirts and his infectious energy.

Has kept a full calendar speaking to numerous Penn State classes and student organizations as well as community leaders and business groups and alumni groups and Nittany Lion clubs around the state.

■ Distributes "Attitude" wrist bands to students and supporters he meets around campus and in the community.

■ Hosts a year-round slate of Coaches vs. Cancer events in the community as the chairman of CVC-Penn State.

21st BIG TEN SEASON

Penn State opened its 21st season of Big Ten Conference play with a road game at Wisconsin (Jan. 3). It marked the fourth straight season Penn State opened the Big Ten with a road game. Penn State posted a 4-14 mark during the Big Ten regular season in 2011-12 to finish in a tie for 11th place. Penn State hast posted a .500 or better record in Big Ten play five times. Penn State has finished fourth in the Big Ten regular season twice in the last four seasons. Penn State's best Big Ten finish came in 1996 as the Lions went 12-6 to finish second in the conference.

GREAT GRAD RATE

Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent, 24 percent higher than the national average (68%), according to statistical information released by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). The NCAA's annual study of institutions nationwide revealed that Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a GSR of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2002-03 through 2005-06. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (97) and IIlinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park student-athletes was 78 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.

■ Following completion of the fall semester, two Nittany Lions (Kevin Montminy & Tim Frazier) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.5 GPA or higher and seven Lions posted a 3.0 GPA or higher. Montminy posted a 4.0 GPA.

CHAMBERS LEADS COACHES VS CANCER:

Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State, now embarking on its 18th year, when he took over the Nittany Lion program.

• CVC-Penn State has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 17 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease.

• The organization raised a record \$215,000 in 2011-12, eclipsing \$200,000 for the third straight year, and ranks among the top 10 CVC organizations in the nation.

• CVC-Penn State has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a yearround schedule of seven events, which includes the the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk and State College Brew Expo.

 CVC-Penn State keeps a portion of the money raised in the Centre Region to provide direct assistance through the Bob Perks Fund (BPF). CVC has donated more than \$35,000 to BPF each of the last five years and more than \$225,000 total. Funds are also donated to the American Cancer Society.

Penn State came out hot, jumped to an 18-point first half lead and then survived a gut check as Delaware sent the game to overtime and posted its first lead of the game with 3:06 left in the extra period. Jermaine Marshall and D.J. Newbill responded, Marshall hitting a big three with the Lions trailing by three with 1:07 remaining to tie the game and Newbill driving for the game winning layup with 30 seconds to play. Newbill led the Lions with a career high tying 22 points while Marshall had 15 points, seven rebounds and five assists in 42 minutes. Sasa Borovnjak had his best game of the season with 14 points and a career high tying eight rebounds. The Lions shot 59% in the first half to lead 37-29 at the break, but saw the Hornets shooting 50% in the second half and tie the game for the first time on a Tyshawn Bell three with 12 seconds to play. Penn State shot 53 percent in the second half and cut a 14- point deficit with 17:38 to play to one, 50-49, with 2:52 to go. Jermaine Marshall led the Lions with 19 points on 9-of-14 while D.J. Newbill added 12 points, 8 rebounds, four assists and two highlight reel dunks on 6-10 Jared Berggren. The Lions out-shot the Badgers 46 percent to 38 percent and won the rebounding battle 38-32, but shot just one free throw while seeing Wisconsin hit 13-of-26 at the stripe and take advantage of a 23-7 advantage in fouls called against the teams. PSU committed 15 turnovers giving UW a 17-4 edge in points off turnovers and saw UW grab 13 offensive rebounds. The Lions led by four mid-way through the first half, but suffered a six-minute scoring drought to trail by 11, 29-18, at the half.
